"A Flying Start"

Couples From "Bride and Groom" Never Seem to Mind When Jack McElroy, an "Air Man" in Every Sense of The Word, Starts Out With Them on Their Honeymoon

GETTING the honeymooners off to a flying start is one of the advantages which that most-marrying of programs, ABC's "Bride and Groom," makes sure of for the middle-aislers they've taken under their wing.

The three "Johns" who own and present "Bride and Groom," Messrs. Masterson, Reddy and Nelson, realized at the start that this part of the festivities, the honeymoon flight, had to be an absolutely safe proposition. Not only would it be the worst thing possible to mar early marital happiness by a wild, frightening flight through the sky, but just one

near-accident would finish all the flights for good. No subsequent bride and groom would enjoy being winged to their destination, even with the prospect of an expense-free week at a resort in the offing.

A "storybook" story would have had the three Johns scurry out and stage a hunt for the perfect pilot to handle their precious cargo. Fortunately for them, however, time was saved and the best in pilot qualification fulfilled by having Jack McElroy in their midst.

Most listeners know the name McElroy as being attached to the jovial 245-pounder who announces "Bride and Groom," and who each day sings the favorite song of the newlyweds. A lesser-known fact about this jolly

Since his initial interest in flying, in 1935, Jack has earned his private, his commercial, and his instructor's licenses. He had flown solely for pleasure until the war broke out, then took a refresher course and signed up to teach Army cadets. At one time Jack was the chief flight instructor for the Civil Aeronautics Administration in Tulsa. During his wartime flying, Jack also doubled as an entertainer in U.S.O. shows for members of the armed forces.

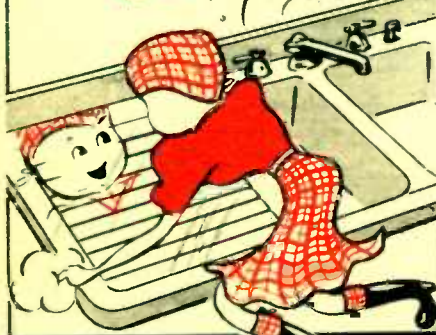

A Man Who Should Know Terms Today's Hits Just as Good as Those Memory-Laden Tunes We Love to Hear Revived

I DON'T agree with the enthusiasts who claim the old tunes are the best." Those words express one of the firmest theories of Les Brown, handsome young maestro whose clarinet and baton back the Bob Hope Tuesday-night nonsense. Les is in a position to know what he's talking about, certainly, for his own first band work was in the early thirties. Brown's later "pied-piping" has five times lured so many people into the Hollywood Palladium that they should

have hung out the "standing room only" sign. The capacity crowds which came to listen left no space for dancing. We know—we were there!

Les further maintains, "Nostalgia attends revivals, and that gives them a good deal of popularity. But if you take any group of old tunes from a certain period, say three or six months in length, during the late twenties or early thirties, and compare these with a group of today's tunes from a similar period of time, I bet you'll find an equal number of good recent songs."

"Let's Pretend"

It just wouldn't be radio without

Nila Mack's "Let's Pretend" children's show. Heard on KNX, Saturday mornings at 8:05, this well-known and well-honored program is still presenting the quality versions of beloved tales that it has for many years.

It is one juvenile series that boasts performances on a par with top dramatic shows. The young actors featured manage to capture the subtle line between good acting and the delightful "pretending" of children. Leading lady Patricia Ryan and "prince charming" Albert Aley are usually featured, with Miriam Wolfe, Marilyn Erskine, Gwen Davies among those in the company.

"Uncle Bill" Adams is one announcer who is able to whip the young audience into enthusiastic pleasure without sounding nauseating to the happen-chance adult listener.

His ability to conduct the bouncing audience in reading commercials rates our good will, too—it doubtless keeps them quiet during the rest of the show.

Music, especially the engaging theme song, is enchanting — this to the credit of Maurice Brown. The scoring plays a large part in the charm of the whole production. Songs are often included, and in the case of the recent "Alice in Wonderland" and "Through the Looking-Glass," the program is practically a capsule musical comedy.

Originator - producer - writer Nila Mack, however, gets the lion's share of the credit in keeping "Let's Pretend" ever delightful. Her adaptations never stray too far from the original, she manages to keep much of the

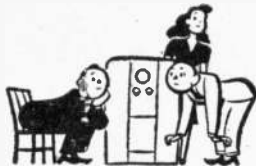

radio know-how covers announcing, vocalizing and acting on a Kansas high-school stage, for a Missouri radio station and with an Oklahoma road show to production, writing and emceeing in and around Tulsa. One of Jack's rivals in Tulsa radio was a tall, dark-eyed girl named Nancy Hurd, one of the first women staff announcers. Jack disposed of Nancy as a threat by promptly marrying her. Now instead of talking kilocycles he and the pretty Mrs. McElroy discuss the problems set up by Jack, Jr., and daughter Paula Jean.

When Jack came to Hollywood and joined the staff of the Masterson-Reddy-Nelson productions, the thought of giving up the flying he's so fond of was unbearable. Stinson and Aeronca welcomed the happy pilot as their Hollywood demonstration and distribution agent with as much pleasure as Jack himself welcomed the continued air hours.

Thus it is, when the strains of the wedding march have finished, the kissing and congratulations are completed, and the other gifts have been showered, that the newly-married twosome are placed in Jack's capable hands.

Off to Vail Field they go, with the one hundred pounds of luggage allowed, to be flown to the resort of their choice.

"Most of the eastern couples who apply to the show prefer the western resorts, and the desert is a big favorite. We try to send them to a place that fits their hobbies, as revealed by those application blanks," Jack explained.

"The longer flights the program has provided, such as the New York visits, the around-the-world-by-air honeymoon, and the flights north, are made in an airline's ships. watch for . . . they can come up in a split second. Luckily I've had to turn back only once. We made the flight next day.

"You know, it's a funny thing, but with these couples some of the most technical things interest them most. Girls who haven't flown before rather expect a plane to be a heap of metal, so when they see the ship they're pretty impressed. They march around the plane asking me questions that really keep me on my toes, like 'Why is it spinproof?' Half the time their little wedding hats fly off their heads in the field's wind, but they just jam them back on and keep on asking," he laughed.

We ourselves were pretty impressed when the near 165-horsepower Stinson rolled out. The four-passenger gray and maroon interior is as comfortable as your own front porch, complete with ash-trays, radio, concealed baggage compartment and footrests.

The thoroughgoing Jack secured his radio operator's license that permits talking to the fields, tuning in regular AM programs, and checking weather far and wide. Each couple is treated, en route, not only to the fun of hearing a complete playhack of the day's "Bride and Groom" show on which they appeared a scant hour before, but to all the technical back-talk that goes on between pilot and field. Probably as a hangover from his instructor's days, Jack would be perfectly happy to share flight tech-

nicalities with his passengers, but as he patiently explained, romance holds sway.

"You'd think there would be hundreds of anecdotes attached to flights of this sort, but the minute we're up and the kids start hearing that playback of the show, I'm the forgotten man. They're usually pretty engrossed in each other, too, having been married all of an hour or so.

"One day I did get a couple to show some real attention to what they were seeing. As we go along, I try to point out places of interest, but it wasn't until we went over the little towns the Benny show made famous that the passengers climbed over each other to peer out the windows. They just had to see Anaheim, Azusa and Cucamonga!

"That's going to the resort, though," Jack grinned. "On the way back it's a different story. By the end of the week, when I fly up to get the couple and bring them back, they're 'old married people,' and the groom always wants to sit up in front with me, in hopes of flying the plane!"



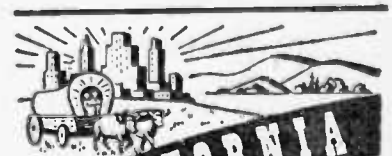
NONCHALANT

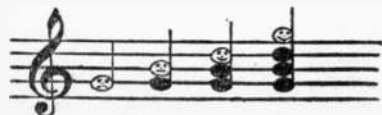

Men of Music: Les Brown

"It takes three or four years to find out what's really going to live in the way of song, anyway. The bands may have stopped playing them, the song pluggers touting them, and then wham! five years, ten, or even twenty years later they're revived. Everyone listens, remembers the school years or romantic times connected with the song, sighs, and says 'The old tunes are the best!'"

He must mean it, for Les himself has plenty of happy memories attached to the tunes of almost twenty years ago.

It was at that time he left the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, high school to begin fulfilling his musical ambitions by enrollment at the Ithaca Conservatory of Music in New York.

Classical Tastes

After Ithaca Les returned to academics, first re-entering high school to pick up college-entrance credits, then enrolling at Duke University, in North Carolina. Once more arose a period with tunes that should sway Les in their favor if any could. It was during the years 1934 through 1936 that he led the famous "Duke Blue Devils."

When the band broke up, Les returned to New York to free-lance as an arranger and to dream of the day he'd have his own band. The dreaming lasted two years, then the band became a reality.

"Our first couple of years' success was completely 'unspectacular.' It wasn't until 'Joe, Joe, DiMaggio,' our first hit, and the later 'Leap Frog' and 'Mexican Hat Dance' that we really hit.

An astounding number of listeners can immediately recognize the combined "Leap Frog" and "Sentimental Journey" as Les's theme song. The latter popular ballad was co-written by Les, and record sale of his platter of the melody was such a big seller that Mr. Brown couldn't avoid identification with it if he were to try.

But "Leap Frog," a novelty jump Les first used as his theme, seems to be played by only two bands, Les Brown and Louis Armstrong. Les isn't one to copy any other band, even the "King," with his music, and we wondered how he happened across the highly suitable tune.

"The sheet music for 'Leap Frog' was sent to me a long, long time ago, by Joe Garland, the fellow who wrote it. He was Louis's featured tenor man for years. I carted the music around in my case for over a half year before I got the band going on it one day. It seemed like a natural right away. Glenn Miller thought another tune the same fellow wrote was a natural, too." Les laughed. "The other was 'In the Mood!'"

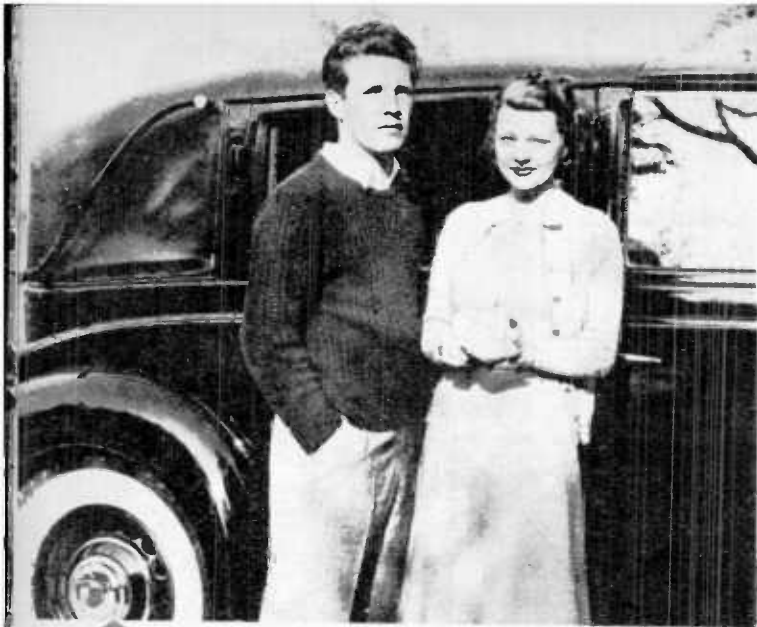

No Disarmament Here!

Armed Forces Radio Service Now Airing More Shows Than in War

▼ **"COMMAND PERFORMANCE" LAST CHRISTMAS** starred a galaxy of Hollywood names, among them Jack Benny, Lina Romay, and Graucho Marx.



WE HEARD a lot about Armed Forces Radio Service during the war. Since cessation of hostilities, we've heard little. This has mistakenly led many persons to the conclusion that AFRS was rusting away on some forgotten scrap pile. Quite the contrary. Over at Armed Forces headquarters on Santa Monica Boulevard, they're beaming thirty-four hours of decommercialized shows from the four networks every week and sixteen hours of original programs during the same span. *This amounts to five hours a week more than during the war.*

With the exigencies of conflict removed, AFRS operates in much smoother and more leisurely manner than before, eliminating all overtime. This partly accounts for there being 150 working now at AFRS, as against 250 during the war. Almost by the time this is in print, Armed Forces will be moving into new quarters, which will permanently house operations and the huge files of scripts and master records.

Naturally, AFRS has shifted the emphasis from war to peace. Our way of life is being broadcast to all parts of the world. Nightly, eleven and three-quarter hours of material are shortwaved from 7:15 in the evening until 6 a.m. The same sort of operation is maintained on the East Coast. Just how important AFRS broadcasts are to those in other countries is shown by an incident in Germany. When word was dropped that a station there was to be closed, AFRS was swamped with protests. In the absence of writing paper, fans

sent pleas written on pieces of tin, shingles and paper towels. Usually, approximately 6,000 letters arrive in a month's routine.

What Men Like

Most of the top shows in U. S. commercial radio are being sent overseas ("Fibber McGee," Jack Benny, Bob Hope, etc.). It is surprising to note that "Twenty Questions" has leaped into high regard by our men still away from home. It places second in demand. Interesting, too, that a show like Nila Mack's juvenile goodie, "Let's Pretend," is beamed servicemanward.

Then, there are many of the wartime AFRS "babies," rolling along practically unheralded. "Command Performance" still tops them all as

the cream production. And commercial packagers and their sponsors still eye it, wishfully thinking how great it would be to latch onto it for commercial radio. This is most unlikely, as no one in authority would feel like deciding to whom to allocate this radio gem. There has been pressure from numberless sides, but AFRS officials believe that "Command Performance" with its gratis, star-spangled talent roster belongs

Lum 'n' Orchids

*Ask the Man Who Grows 'Em—
He'll Discuss Cymbidiums
At the Fall of a Sombrero*

SHOULD you ever meet Chet Lauck, "Lum" of "Lum and Abner," and wonder what to talk about, turn the conversation immediately to orchids and you're "in."

Lauck, tall, good-looking and easy-going, waxes enthusiastic at the drop of a hat when orchids are mentioned, and there's a reason. He's an orchid-fancier, grows them on his Brentwood estate as a hobby. Lauck has

been doing it for the past eight or ten years and has been so successful that now he has a ready market waiting for his cymbidiums at a score of Los Angeles and Hollywood florist shops.

He started with approximately \$200 invested in orchid plants, and today the greenhouse at his home harbors nearly \$5,000 worth of rare and beautiful flowers. Lauck's not the type of fellow who lets the gardener do the work, either. Those are his prize possessions and there's a "No Admittance" sign hanging on the greenhouse.

"A man with little patience will never succeed in raising orchids," Lauck explains, "because it takes from three to five years to get a bloom, and, believe me, that calls for patience. If you start a plant from a cutting it is three years before you get a bloom. If you pollenize, five years pass before an orchid is produced."

Lauck doesn't restrict his hobbies, though. He likes hunting, fishing, riding horses and golf. He has a collection of rifles which is the envy of sportsmen in this section of the country. He has been collecting pistols of ancient vintage for years, and his display case at home now holds at least two dozen pistols which date back to the 1700's and boast fabulous histories.

When he can get away from his radio and orchid-raising duties, Lauck takes a plane to Las Vegas, Nevada, where he has a cattle ranch which stretches farther than the eye can see—143,000 acres to be exact—where he oversees the shipping of cattle to market.

The Laucks remodeled their home from Mediterranean to Colonial and have one of the show places of Brentwood. Two children, Nancy and Chet Jr., live with them, while a third, Shirley, is married and lives with her husband in the Midwest.

to the servicemen and should stay that way. It is now being slanted entirely to occupation troops.

"Jubilee" and "G.I. Jill" are still on the active list, as well as Frances Langford with her "Purple Heart Album," "Mail Call," which has recently featured Chili Williams and Barbara Britton, and "Personal Album." "Jubilee" and "Command Performance" are the only two which use an audience. "G.I. Jill" does a quarter-hour show six days weekly and "Jill's Juke Box," a half-hour weekly. She pulls the heaviest fan mail at Hollywood AFRS, twenty-five per cent of the letters bearing her name.

Hawthorne will, by the time this gets into print, have a weekly "Hawthorne Thing" on the AFRS air. George Fisher is starting his second year of Hollywood gossip, an extremely popular feature with our boys away from home. Fisher follows "G.I. Jill" in amount of mail. Lionel Barrymore has done narration for "Concert Hall" every week now for five years. This program features semi-classical music.

On the heavier side, AFRS airs a series of geopolitical programs considering various countries like China and India. The stories of these are told briefly and simply. "Heard at Home" is composed of discussion broadcasts such as the "Chicago Round Table." Only limitation placed on controversial airings for AFRS is that they avoid politics. Right now, officials are scratching their heads, wondering how to side-step domestic discussions during an election year.

More Shows

Self explanatory titles of other shows are "Bookshelf of the World," "Science Magazine of the Air," and "Greatest Story Ever Told," taken

from the Sunday airshow. "Bill of Rights" dramatizes this document and "Pride of the Outfit" tells the heroic story of various service units which have distinguished themselves.

In order to take the pulse on record shows, AFRS recently conducted an overseas poll of the top ten favorite recordings. For the week of April 9, the high three were "Now Is the Hour," "Near You," and "Beg Your Pardon"—not much different from "home."

To keep our men entertained and informed wherever they are and to carry our message to those of other countries is an operation of large-order proportions.

In view of the world situation and considering radio's still-untapped resources as a potent world medium, it is understandable when AFRS officials say solemnly, "We consider this operation more important now than at any other time in its history."
