

 **IF YOU BOAST** a lazy Susan, earmark it for holiday decorations. Start with some fine chicken wire, fastened cornucopia shape and filled with spagnum moss which has been dipped in water.

INTO THE MOSS stick red berries and around the bottom of the cornucopia arrange Christmas balls and your succulent. A perky top which finishes off the centerpiece airily is a piece of leptospermum (Australian tea tree).

LADY, do you have some pittosporum tobira, some lemons, some pyracantha or leptospermum in your garden? Then you're set!

We don't need to tell you that one way to make Christmas merry is to make it pretty. And to make it pretty, according to garden expert Mirandy, a person does not need to spend money. "Use natural materials," she advises, "instead of tinsel."

Arm yourself with a pair of shears and sally forth into the yard on a Christmas-decoration-reconnoiter-

▲ **UNLESS THE DOORWAY** invitingly suggests a holiday mood, your decorations inside lose some of their appeal. Mirandy suggests that folks gather their Sequoia cones (or any others) during vacations, then at holiday time wire to a large spray of evergreen topped off with pretty ribbon.

▼ **A FRILL OF SILVER-FOIL** holly leaves down the center of the table, fat red candles, and an epergne loaded with seasonal fruit and foliage symbolize Yuletide. Mirandy cleverly combined apples, Natal plums (carissa), and lemons with leptospermum in the topmost container. (Make your own epergne by putting a vase atop consecutively larger footed bowls.)



▲ **IF YOU HAVE A NICHE**, it will lend itself beautifully to Christmas decoration. Mirandy's, located in her entry hall, has been arranged with an intriguing piece of driftwood, rosemary and red berries (pyracantha). Small hidden water containers keep the arrangement fresh.

ing trip. Look for holiday possibilities in your own back yard, in other words. The lemon tree, the mock orange bush, the magnolia branch, the apple tree, the pine bough—all of these hold delightful decorative surprises for you, as they did for Mirandy when she created the holiday arrangements on the accompanying pages.

After you have made your selections in the garden, it might help in fashioning effective decorations to take some of Mirandy's advice.

"First thing to do is get the decks cleared for action. Don't put decora-

tion on decoration. Put away your knickknacks. Especially never try to make an arrangement in front of a picture. Take down conflicting pictures, but not mirrors." They simply enhance your efforts.

"Don't try to be too elaborate," warns Mirandy. "Don't put something in every corner. Have a center of interest in each room—something you see when you come in—and let it go at that. In other words, use restraint.

"Use lots of candles. They are festive and kind of symbolic of the Christmas season. I like plain white

ones," she added. Mirandy also prefers a green Christmas tree to any other kind. She always puts hers in water into which a little commercial fertilizer has been added. This way, your tree stays fresher longer.

Try following Mirandy's suggestions, using restraint and quelling that seasonal impulse to hang a sprig of holly from every door. "That's old-fashioned," she shudders. "Cultivate your own resourcefulness and use what you have at hand as basis for ornamenting your home. "Go into the outdoors and bring it in!" is Mirandy's Christmas command.

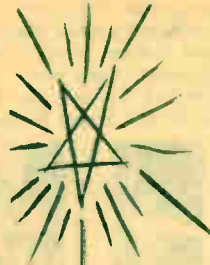
▼ **IF YOU HAVE A WINDOW OR DUTCH DOOR** like Mirandy's, tack up a spray of greenery above and brighten the panes with giant silver or gold-foil snowflakes. (On each side of the door Mirandy has placed statuettes of St. Francis, patron of birds, and St. Fiacre, patron of the garden.)

▼ **AN EFFECTIVE, ALL-GREEN MANTEL** in the den. "Magnolia leaves are one of the finest things you can use," says Mirandy. Combined with these are contrasting textured mock orange (pittosporum tobira), long-needled pine and homemade candles (green coloring put on with brush and allowed to trickle down candle).





◀ **GEORGE AND GRACIE:** "Dis-appointment"?



Jimmy Durante—"It was 'way back in 1923. We were living in New York at the time—at 52nd Street and Broadway. When I say 'we' I mean Lou Clayton, Eddie Jackson and me. Things were different then, namely, we were broke. You see, we had sunk what little money we had into a small night club called 'The Durant Club.' We were pretty new to the game and we weren't becoming millionaires overnight. In fact, it was just the opposite way around.

"So along comes Christmas that year. We were sitting up in our apartment and none of us wanted the others to know how low we felt. Suddenly Eddie pops up and says, 'Fellows, I didn't have no time to do Christmas shopping. So I wonder if you would object to accepting a little check from me.'

"'Funny, the same thing happened to me,' says Lou. 'Didn't have time for shopping, and who's gonna buck those crowds anyway? I'd like to write you guys a check, too.'

"It so happens I was in the same spot. So I offers to write them a little check also, to show them my esteem. We all yanked out our check books and seriously passed each other five-dollar checks. It was wonderful. We looked at the checks, thanked each other and felt really great. Of course none of us had a cent in the bank. But what did that matter? It couldn't have been nicer even if we had the dough.

"And that, I would say, is my most memorable Christmas."

Charles E. Fuller (speaker on ABC's "Old-Fashioned Revival Hour")—"My most memorable Christmas—as I recall it now—was one at the height of the depression when our son Dan was about eight years old. He was still recovering from a serious illness of several years before and he had expressed an earnest desire for a bicycle. Right up to Christmas Eve it seemed the bicycle would be impossible—but then at almost the last

minute the lacking funds were made available, and I do not believe I have ever seen such a happy face as that of Dan Fuller on seeing his bicycle Christmas morning."

George Burns and Gracie Allen—"Naturally, there are many Yuletides Gracie and I remember with pride and happiness, the usual kind with the children when they were very young and wide-eyed. But there is one particular Christmas which sticks in our minds as being particularly important to us in our struggle to become successful in show business. It happened many years ago when we were what is known in the trade as a 'disappointment act.' That's the act that's always brought in at the last minute when the big star performer suddenly gets ill and can't go on. During that time, we lived with our bags packed, ready for a moment's notice as a replacement. Well, the Christmas we'll never forget was the one during which we were booked in our own right to play a fair-sized theater in a good-sized town. It was Christmas Day and we were supposed to open that night. We both came down with the measles, believe it or not, and they had to get a 'disappointment act' to replace us. That we'll never forget."

James Hilton (famed author and narrator of "Hallmark Playhouse")—"Christmas 1918. I was in England, eighteen years old. The first World War was over and we thought it had been a war to end wars. That innocence, plus optimism, plus youth, made it the most memorable Christmas I have ever known."

Jack Benny—"Ever since I was a kid in show business, I've spent Christmas in traveling; even while in radio in New York I lived in an apartment. In 1937, I moved to California and built my own home in Beverly Hills, and for the first time in my life I spent a Christmas at home with my wife and child and my relatives."

Hank Weaver (of ABC's "Hollywood

JAMES HILTON: Optimism in 1918.

Byline")—"Perhaps the most memorable Christmas I ever experienced was December 25, 1944.

"Waiting for a plane to take forty of us marines off Peleliu, we sweltered under the hot sun and squinted against its glare. Peleliu, a miserable place to spend Christmas, wasn't any nicer on an empty stomach. All we'd had was some warm lemonade made from a citrus powder and a slab of cheese apiece. Then the Sea Bee detachment heard about us—and sent a couple of trucks to take us to their mess hall. There they promptly marched us to the head of the line in front of about six hundred smiling Sea Bees. They didn't mind; I guess they thought that we had a turkey dinner coming to us. And we got it.

"Christmas night we caught our plane, and, navigating by Sirius, the brightest star in the heavens and sometimes referred to as the Star of Bethlehem, we headed for our outfit and Iwo Jima."

H. M. S. Richards ("Voice of Prophecy" speaker—"It was in Denver. It was the coldest, stormiest Christmas we had ever known and times were hard. But Father and Mother were determined that their two little boys should have a happy Christmas. And we had, even though Mother had only ten cents to spend. Of course, ten cents then was more like thirty-five cents now, so Mother went down the street and bought a little popcorn, a little red candy, a few cranberries, some animal crackers, several small colored candles, a penny top—and what a Christmas we had!

"Mother is a natural artist. She transformed a small evergreen twig into a decorated tree. I can see it now, right where she placed it in

"Mother Knows Best" sans sponsor? . . . Bing Crosby may do the Broadway hit, "Silver Whistle," as his next film—and we couldn't think of anything cuter. . . . And if Lucille Ball goes east to do a Broadway play, she'll move "My Favorite Husband" there. . . . Abe Burrows, book critic Virginia Peterson and educator Lyman Bryson may be teamed on a CBS discussion program, "We Take Your Word."

Looks Like

"One Man's Family" will be sponsored by Miles Laboratories as of February 5. . . . Jack Smith will do the lead in "The Red Mill" on "The Railroad Hour" on January 2—and we've gotta hear that. . . . "Ma Perkins" is positively venerable—she's celebrating her sixteenth anniversary this month. . . . Groucho Marx will be seen again on local screens via two more revivals of his old films, "Horse Feathers" and "Monkey Business." . . . Louella Parsons will have a repeat on ABC in January. Time is 8:45 p.m. . . . The Colmans in "Halls of Ivy" definitely start on NBC on January 6. . . . Helen Hayes returns to legit in March but still has no plans to resume her air show. . . . New ABC detective will be "Hannibal Cobb," the photocrime sleuth from Look magazine. . . . Fred Allen will return to radio as a guest when he visits Hollywood in January. He's been lined up for spots on the Jack Benny and Bob Hope shows and on "Suspense." . . . NBC says that "Six Times a Week and Twice on Sundays" may now be sung on the net provided that it is always announced along with the rest of the sentence, "I get a kiss by the garden gate." . . . ABC lets us know that "Quick as a Flash" isn't losing a sponsor like we said. How could it, they ask, it only started last week. A good point, gentlemen.

NBC and KFI Tie Knot

Niles Trammell, chairman of the board of the NBC network, announced

last week that his company had again signed KFI as the net's local outlet. The pact is for a two-year term and the conditions are the same which the two have observed in the past.

Earlier in the year, the National Broadcasting Company was close to purchasing station KMPC as outlet for the chain. After that was iced, there was a rumor that another local station would be sought, perhaps KFWB. Earle C. Anthony, owner of KFI, is not interested in selling his station.

During the period when it was almost taken for granted that the G. A. Richards station would join NBC, KFI signed to carry many of the star-studded MGM transcribed shows, thus carrying even more locally originated programs than before. Fitting these in with the net shows and the present local airers should give KFI an even richer schedule than before.

Happily, dialers won't have to start all over again to adjust their reflexes to find NBC broadcasts on the dial, it's still 640.

"NBC Theater" Comes

Continuing its policy of presenting adaptations of the best in American literature, the "NBC Theater" has cleared some interesting works for December and January. Included are "Manhattan Transfer" by John Dos Passos, Thornton Wilder's "The Ides of March," "At Heaven's Gate" by Robert Penn Warren and "Pale Horse, Pale Rider" by Katherine Anne Porter.

"Command" Retires

The program that presented some of the greatest shows ever to hit the air is destined for the shelf. "Command Performance, U.S.A.," the Armed Forces Radio Service variety show, will give its last live performance on December 20 from the Vine Street Playhouse. An economy measure effected by the Department of Defense, directing AFRS to reduce current operating expenses by a total of \$153,000, is the hand that wields the axe.

Into the records will go "Command Performance" and its 414 shows. The "Dick Tracy" parody that had Bing as "Dick," the late Frank Morgan as "Flintheart," Dinah Shore as "Tess Trueheart," the Andrews Sisters playing the "Summer Sisters" and Frank Sinatra and Bob Hope as "Tracy" villains, "Mole" and "B-B Eyes," will be the most fondly remembered on radio row. The Christmas programs, with almost every star in Hollywood huddled backstage at the Vine Street theater waiting to go on, were among

A total of eleven AFPS shows will be canceled out by this budget cut, but "Command Performance," most sorely missed and best remembered, is the one that will mark the end of an era.

Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

Lanny Ross

No radio listener of any standing has to be reminded of the talents of Lanny Ross, now heard on KHJ, 9:15 a.m. Monday through Friday. Famed during the thirties as leading man on radio's "Showboat" program, Lanny forsook the air for a long time thereafter. In recent months he's returned with guest appearances on radio and television and finally with his own program.

Lanny's present show is one of those fifteen-minute musical segments that are so popular these days. He gets a lot of music into it, ballads old and new, and to these ears his voice sounds as clear and bright a tenor as it ever was. The present Lanny seems to have much more humor at the mike than the earlier Lanny did. He introduces numbers and chats with guests with an ease we don't remember from the old days.

A recent broadcast had, of all people, Mae West as visitor. (First time we've heard her since the famous West-Ameche "Adam and Eve" script.) Lanny named the ten most "come up and see me-est" gals in history, including ladies like Cleopatra, Salome, Mae's old friend Eve, Helen of Troy and, of course, Miss West.

As guest star, Miss West was very cute and it's high time she was forgiven her earlier air mis-step and asked back on more shows.

"Adventures in Research"

The Wednesday broadcast of the "Radio Ways to Learning" series, heard on KFAC, Monday through Friday at 1:15 p.m., is devoted to the dramatized experiences of great men of science. The whole series is presented under the L. A. City Schools classroom radio education plan and the "Adventures in Research" portion is particularly interesting.

Production is extensive for a program of this type. On a recent broadcast, the story of the French chemist Duvoisier was presented, and along with the story of his experiments in combustion and his search for the component parts of air, the script included a credible impression of the French Revolution.

If you're looking for education in place of soap operas, you could find

much of interest in this schoolroom series, and incidentally, entertainment, too.

Playbacks (Critical Comment)

We Point With Pride

. . . To the hour-long anniversary program for the U.N. carried in the usual "NBC Theater" spot on KFI, Sunday, December 11. Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, Trygve Lie, Sir Laurence Olivier and Carlos Romulo were heard on the program. Particularly inspiring was Olivier's reading of the human-rights section of the charter with an orchestral background, a la his "Henry V" readings.

. . . To Danny Kaye's surprising record of "Love Me or Leave Me." Sounds like a young Bing.

. . . To Shirley Booth for her portrayal of the wife in "Street Scene" on "Theater Guild on the Air."

. . . To the nice music played by George Sanders on "Spade Cooley Time" during the wee small hours on KFVD. From 1:00 a.m. on, he plays popular music, mostly ballads, of much persuasion. We'll always be grateful to him for playing all Buddy Clark's recordings the night of his death.

. . . To the recordings of Cecil Brown's British interviews played on Brown's KHJ time along with John Bosman's newscasts. Brown's interrogation is not confined to weighty discussions, he relays the impressions of the man in the street (and the pub) and, as always, taps the human interest.

. . . To Loretta Young's fine portrayal of "Elizabeth" on the "Prudential Family Hour" broadcast of Maxwell Anderson's "Elizabeth and Essex," a repeat of her triumph in the same author's "Mary of Scotland." John McIntyre as "Essex" was also great, and Miss Young proved herself deserving of her Academy Award and then some.

. . . And to another extraordinary performance, that of Dorothy McGuire on "Hallmark Playhouse" in a sweet little story titled "Christopher and Columbus." Miss McGuire had the tough assignment of portraying twins of identical condition and unlike personality. She succeeded in doing it—and with great charm.

We View With Alarm

. . . That Christmas commercial that has been telling listeners to hurry up and get their dollars in during the next forty-eight hours or else the company cannot promise delivery. This same announcement has been made steadily for at least the past two weeks and many forty-eight-hour periods have elapsed without any change in copy.

. . . The popular Christmas music that is managing to alter time-honored Santa Claus lore. If we were small children again, we'd fetch any grown-up a sharp blow on the ankle who tried to put over "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer" on us. We know that

Santa's reindeer are Dancer, Dasher, Comet, Prancer, Cupid, Vixen, Donner and Blitzen, and "Rudolph" is a pushy upstart who doesn't belong in the charmed circle.

We did give up several seasons ago and permitted Irving Berlin's "White Christmas" into our scheme of things. But that's no sign that we'll accept blue, pink, purple or yellow Christmases as anything to sing about. We could also do without sacred references in what is obviously intended as popular, though seasonal, dance music.

...The manner in which "Mary," "Boston Blackie's" girl friend, laughs delightedly at the limpest remarks tossed off by "Blackie." The director undoubtedly hopes that this gives the program a "light" sound. It doesn't, it merely makes "Boston Blackie" sound as if he has a half-witted girl friend.

...The jerky little singing commercial that breaks into "Gang Busters," yelping the praises of Grape-Nuts with the idiotic words, "Get Grape-Nuts in your Bee-ee-Bee." The sponsors may be interested to learn that this means nothing as far as we are able to determine.

...And we view ourselves with alarm for mixing up the captions in our story on the "Blondie" kids and labeling Marlene Aames with Joan Rae's caption. And vice-versa. Marlene played "Cookie" several seasons ago, Joan does it at present.

NBC's "Light-Up Time" star Frank Sinatra can sympathize with parents whose children are just beginning their musical educations. His two eldest, Nancy and Frankie, are piano students, taking two lessons a week and daily practice. The youngest daughter, Tina, not to be outdone, demands the piano from time to time for her own unique compositions. In addition to the three novices, Big Nancy (height only five foot two) has decided to learn the piano along with the children, so she takes the same lessons.

Frank is pleased that his family shows such mass interest, but he's hoping they don't go on to the violin or trumpet—at least, not all at the same time.

Though there is no news of its immediate reentry at present, listeners still call us to check its possible return. In the meantime, Haven is taking a well-deserved rest, years of work behind him as well as the memory of the audience tribute he received on the closing night of "Noah Webster" when a packed house stood in tribute to him and his program. Before him is another successful return to the air and to a host of friends.

Dennis Day became a father for the second time with the arrival of Dennis, Jr., his second son. Steve Allen of CBS welcomed son number three, David.

No doubt you'll get the same strange feeling we did when you hear the fine voice of the late **BUDDY CLARK** (Columbia) singing "Winter Wonderland" and "Merry Christmas Waltz." . . . For your holiday dancing pleasure there's **RUSS MORGAN'S ORCH.** (Decca) with the toe-tapping "Mistletoe Kiss" and "Blue Christmas" and **VAUGHN MONROE** (RCA-Victor) with the lively "Jolly Old Man in the Bright Red Suit" coupled with a straight rhythmic arrangement of "Auld Lang Syne." . . . Some child also invariably got sick the night of the program (usually too much Christmas candy) and it never failed that this child was almost indispensable, like the girl holding the letter "M" in the streamer spelling out "MERRY CHRISTMAS" or the boy taking the role of Joseph in the final playlet.

ONE CHRISTMAS THERE WAS a beautiful fringy banner hung all the way across the platform. It spelled "Merry Christmas," but not for long, because some abstracted fellow moved the tree right under the sign and the twinkling candle which topped the tree made quick work of "Merry Christmas."

EVEN TO THIS DAY OUR WHOLE FAMILY sings carols around the lighted tree. This annual ceremony takes place before any packages are opened . . . an almost unbearable period of waiting for small fry.

CHILDREN OF OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL always received "treats" at the conclusion of the "entertainment." There was always candy. One Christmas the church members decided they would make all the candy for the gift stockings. For two weeks ours and many other houses were turned into candy factories. There were plates, pans and platters of fondant cooling on every piece of furniture. Some batches were colored pink, some were green with walnuts, or white rolled in coconut and topped with almonds, or extra special ones dipped in chocolate. My mother stood over a kettle of syrup days and nights on end worrying about her mixtures "turning to sugar." My father and I "sampled" so extensively that we were practically sick by Christmas Day.

HOPE ALL YOU READERS have a wonderful Christmas. In the midst of all your rushing around and excitement, do take time to absorb some of the beautiful holiday fare your radio and TV sets will be offering. There's a lot of merry Christmas waiting in those receivers. And a merrier wish in the hearts of the folks at Radio-TV Life that your holidays will be your best ever, really full of real Christmas spirit.

the middle of the table. We popped the corn and strung it with the red cranberries on thread. We made popcorn balls—and is there anything better when they are made right! And then, just think what you can do with animal crackers, little strings of red candy, a new top, candle light—and love! Yes, it was the best Christmas a boy ever had."

Carveth Wells (commentator-traveler heard on KFI)—"My most memorable Christmas was while I was surveying the railroad between Singapore and Bangkok in the Malay jungle. The tropics held not a sign of Christmas. I was dressed in a sarong because it was so hot. I couldn't get a Christmas tree, of course. Still I was very sentimental. One of my men cut down a little jungle tree for me, and as I had no presents I hung an unopened letter from home on the top of the tree and decorated the branches with candles. I was tired of eating my dinner out of cans, so I planned a real Christmas meal—or so I thought. One of my men shot a seven-inch deer for the meat course, and I gave the Chinese cook my recipe for plum pudding. I sat down in my sarong to enjoy my meal, ate almost the whole deer, incidentally. Then the cook brought out my plum pudding—in a teapot—and poured it into a cup! It seems he had boiled it for the required eight hours—but neglected to keep it in the wrappings. It was the only plum pudding I've ever drunk."

Dick Powell—"Performers are usually working on Christmas, so my most memorable Christmas happened while I was emcee of a stage show in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and for a strictly professional reason. I can't remember the date, but the occasion will always stand out in my mind. We had a half-professional, half-amateur variety show, and I get a kick out of looking back and recalling that I introduced a very young and very good Charleston dancer—Miss Ginger Rogers!"

Ed Wynn—"My most memorable Christmas was that of 1920. I was playing in the 'Ed Wynn Carnival,' my own show, and it was a hit. I was actor, composer, director, writer, manager and owner. Keenan was four and a half and I had built him a big electric train village. We set it up in the solarium and gave up that room for one whole year to the train and the village. There was only eight feet of walking space left in the room. On Christmas day, Keenan refused to come in to dinner, he was too busy with the train. So we set up two card tables in the train room and ate dinner there in the middle of the village."

Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

"Home Movie Theatre"

If you have already heard about KFI-TV's Sunday feature (3:00 p.m.) called "Home Movie Theatre," but have despaired of getting in on the act simply because your camera and footage are neither sixteen-millimeter nor thirty-five-millimeter, worry no more.

As of Sunday, December 4, eight-millimeter is in business on these **Grandy-Langley** productions. Through the use of a **Bell and Howell** machine, much too technical for us to describe (our hobby is china painting!), the first eight-millimeter to hit video screens was run off.

The show's format is simple, and thereby even more interesting. Four contestants per Sunday bring their self-edited film (or whole film edited

for the show by its staff) to the studio, where it is run off for a judge—usually some illustrious member of the photographic world. **C. J. Verhallin**, publisher of the **Home Movie Magazine**, internationally the largest and first such periodical, watched the footage go by the same recent Sunday we did.

The home movies ranged from amateurish, poorly done fantasy to film on a hike across Mt. Rainier, and from a dueling sequence atop the Pasadena City Hall to a dream sequence about a man who gave a newsy a phony coin.

Contestants ranged from a boy who had just finished his first home movie, a housewife whose hobby of seventeen years' standing had been movie-making, to a student of the art. Films were judged on "excellence only as it pertains to entertainment."

The show gives complete details on entry, information as to the acceptability of color film and cut or uncut film footage, and further complete details on the snapshot entry that is a natural for anyone who happens to have some cute pictures around. We say a "natural" for them because the winning pictures we saw were a far cry from our idea of prize-winning stuff. Possibly the judges saw something therein we missed, but we just happen to have a couple of pictures at home we had thought of as merely cute before. Now they stand as monuments to human ingenuity with a camera, and we think strongly of entering them under another name.

Proof of this show's interest, worth and amusement value lies in its having drawn viewers in spite of the in-terminable, badly spotted commercials. We don't blame the **Independent Druggists** (and their products) who made the show possible, nor do we blame emcee **Rolly Langley** or producer **Roy Grandy**. We blame the lack of imagination that not only permits but insists on **Johnson and Johnson Red Cross Surgical Aids** being touted between every word or picture assembled as entertainment on the show.

If you don't want information and have nothing to enter, you can still benefit, as far as pure entertainment goes, from watching some Sunday at 3:00. Good fun.

This Is Show Business

Of the same entertaining premise and with the same entertaining people as were present on radio's hour-long "This Is Broadway," video's thirty-minute counterpart, "This Is Show Business" (KTTV, Channel 11, Sunday, 7:00 p.m.) could hardly miss being

good entertainment. Its regular personnel is a panel of renowned Broadway-ites (Clifton Fadiman, George Kaufman, Abe Burrows) whose glib tongues and agile minds go gleefully to work on the assorted "problems" of professionals who come to seek their advice and, not incidentally, also to showcase their talents. This provides something of a three-ring circus—the banter of the panelists, the sometimes thought-provoking, more often rib-tickling, troubles of the visiting performers, and thirdly, the performances delivered by this latter array of experienced talent.

A week or so ago viewers found playwright Marc Connelly substituting for his esteemed contemporary, Kaufman, and exchanging "no hair" jokes with his fellow shiny-pated wit, Burrows. For this lensing, Jinx Falkenburg was the panel's feminine guest member. The week following, Miriam Hopkins filled this spot. One of the most successful of the panel's guesting gals has been the frank and enthusiastic Binnie Barnes.

The performing professionals who had "problems" of serious and lesser degree on this particular edition of the show included singer Jane Harvey (Her problem: "I'm newly married; how can I keep up with my career, yet spend sufficient time with my husband?") The panel's decision: "Come back when things get in a worse state. We've loused up marriages on this show." Sizable-beaked comedian Artie Dan (Problem: "Should I have a nose job?") Answer: "No, it's an asset to your business. Who ever heard of a successful handsome comic?"; excellent twenty-two-year-old dancer Lou Wills Jr. (Problem: "How old does a guy in show business have to be to have his own apartment?") Answer: "It depends on what you want it for." Decision (by Burrows): "Stay home with your folks and when you need an apartment, you can use mine.")

As you can see, the accent of "This Is Show Business" remains on the lighter side with very few problems (if any) accorded weighty deliberation. However, if we had a problem, big or little, we'd choose Abe Burrows to solve it over John J. Anthony any time.

WELL, it's time for the same old Christmas carols again. The air is already filled with "Little Town of Bethlehem," "Silent Night," "Adeste Fideles," "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear," "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen" and "Good King Wineselas . . . Winsilus . . . Winseclas . . ." (Ever since I had to appear in the Christmas cantatas at the First Congregational Church in Mason City, wearing pants with the little pee-hole in front that would never stay closed, I have been singing, at least once a year, that song about that King, and

this is as good a time as any to admit that not only do I not know how to spell his name, but I also don't know who he was, what he did or how you pronounce him. It was also comparatively recently that I learned for the first time that it is "God rest you merry, gentlemen," and not, as I had always supposed, "God rest you, merry gentlemen." Still I, along with everybody else, go into every season singing and hearing fifty times a day the same half-dozen little pieces of simple music, over and over and over.

The only addition to these venerables in a good long time has been Irving Berlin's "White Christmas"—unless you count that little thing for the children about "Santa Claus Is Coming to Town." Instrumentally, "The Parade of the Wooden Soldiers" and Raymond Scott's "Toy Trumpet" seem to carry the pop banner unassisted, and the symphonic repertoire offers one selection: "The Nutcracker Suite" by Tchaikowsky. According to my radio THAT IS ALL.

Oh, I did forget one—"Jingle Bells." Poor, poor "Jingle Bells." By the beginning of the second week in December, "Jingle Bells" has already appeared in every possible tempo

and mood—even creeping into radio signatures and providing a new pizzicato original for Dave Rose on the Skelton show. It slows down ideally for Frankie Laine and it provides a great special-material patter for the Andrews Sisters. It stretches wonderfully into a half-hour fantasy for Fred Waring and it makes the sturdiest kind of counterpoint to Jack Smith's "to-morrROW night," "The Whistler's" unsingable theme and "Eastern Columbia Broadway at Ninth," not to mention Harry Stanton's brave basso profundo on the Coast Federal Savings fantastic little rhymeless wonder.

Yes, by and large, it would certainly seem that the good old familiars have nothing to worry about in the way of a Hooper rating.

Not So

Now, you may think the answer is that maybe no one is interested in adding new songs to the treasure of Christmas music. Well, I did some research on the subject—if I may modestly state—and that is not the answer. The boys are trying hard enough all right.

Take a look at some of the recent professional publications of Christmas songs that I'm sure you never

heard of and probably never will. In the C's there are: "Christmas Eve," "Christmas Lullaby," "Christmas Polka," "Christmas Candy," "Christmas Stocking," "Christmas Bells," "Christmas Hopes," "Christmas Dreams," "Christmas Reindeer," "Christmas Snow" and "Christmas in the Rain." In the D's you'll find: "Don't You Believe in Christmas?" "Dear Little Christmas Dolly," "Dining on Christmas Eve," "Dancer, Prancer and Me," "Drop Down My Chimney If You Dare," "Douglas Fir, I Love You" and I haven't the strength to hunt up the A's and B's, let alone continue through the alphabet. A lot of these songs are very good, well-written and even inspired. Why don't we accept them then, or some of the tens of thousands of others—sacred, secular, symphonic and popular?

I don't know why—unless it's just that maybe in our hearts, we all of us want our Christmases to be familiar with old-fashioned trimming, holly and poinsettias, wreaths on the door and folding bells of red and green paper hanging in the dining room, chestnut dressing and that ribbon candy that looks like a nobleman's neck-ruff, an orange in the toe of the kids' stockings and a pipe-smoking, kindly old uncle around to pare the oranges for them in one unbroken fortune-telling peeling; tinsel and strung cranberries, the school blackboard decorated in red and green chalk, pink and white taffy and a monkey on a string, grace at the table and a firm resolve about PEACE ON EARTH, GOOD WILL TOWARD MEN. . . .

Whatever the reason, there's a great deal of calm security and reassurance and quiet joy in knowing that none of us want to replace, or try to find out what it would be like to live without, those half-dozen short little pieces of simple, glorious music we hear over and over every December—the Christmas Carols.

Eat and Be Merry

(Note: The beauty of Christmas dinner is as important as the taste, believes June Whitley, who portrays "Mrs. Anderson" on NBC's "Father Knows Best." Former culinary columnist for a Canadian newspaper, June, Radio-Television Life readers, offers the menu she will be busy preparing Christmas day. Her unique recipes, such as the oyster stuffing for the turkey, almond whipped cream, and the beautiful peaches flambeau, which is served while still flaming, are bound to make even the most modest of cooks beam with delight.)

CHRISTMAS FEAST

- Shrimps on Sticks in Sauce
- Consomme Au Sherry
- Celery Curls
- Radish Roses
- Large Olives
- Cherry Wine Jello Salad
- Turkey with Oyster Rice Dressing
- Spiced Cranberry Jelly
- Sweet Potatoes in Orange Juice
- Buttered Broccoli
- Hot Biscuits and Homemade

- Strawberry Jam
- Peaches Flambeau
- Pecan Puffs
- Shrimp Dip Sauce

One-fourth cup each of:
 Tomato catsup
 Chili sauce
 Lemon juice
 Dry sherry
 Six drops of: Tabasco sauce
 One good teaspoon grated horseradish
 (Optional: One teaspoon chopped olives. One-half teaspoon parsley)

Shake together vigorously; serve chilled with shrimps on toothpicks.

Consomme Au Sherry

Add to each serving of consomme one tablespoon of dry sherry. Serve with anchovy-spread melba toast.

Cherry Wine Jello Salad

One package cherry Jello
 One and one-fourth cups hot water or cherry syrup
 Three-fourths cup port wine
 One cup pitted canned cherries (Black Bing in heavy syrup)

Pour wine over cherries and let stand. Dissolve Jello in hot water and syrup (using all the syrup from the cherries.) When cool, combine with cherries and wine, pour into desired molds. When firm, turn onto lettuce or endive and serve with mayonnaise thinned with cream.

Oyster Rice Dressing

(Sufficient for twelve- to fourteen-pound bird)

Melt: One-half cup butter
 Saute lightly in the fat:
 Chopped giblets
 One-third cup chopped onions
 Add: One and one-half quarts drained oysters and cook them until their edges curl.
 Add: Three cups cooked Minute rice
 One-half cup chopped celery
 Three tablespoons chopped parsley
 One small clove garlic, minced
 One teaspoon salt
 One-half teaspoon paprika
 Mix and stuff turkey as with any other dressing.

Sweet Potatoes with Orange Juice

Cook and mash sweet potatoes.



↑ **IN PREPARATION** for the oyster dressing, June puts all the ingredients in one place to save time, recommends quick-cooking rice that won't lump or stick. The dressing could be made the night before.

Allow to every cup of potatoes:
 One and one-fourth tablespoons
 butter
 One and one-fourth tablespoons
 brown sugar
 One-half teaspoon grated orange
 rind
 Three tablespoons orange juice
 One-half teaspoon salt

Place potatoes in casserole, sprinkle top with brown sugar and paprika. Cover dish closely and bake thirty minutes in 375° oven. Remove cover and bake until top is brown.

Spiced Cranberry Jelly

Wash and pick over one quart cranberries, place in saucepan and cover with two cups boiling water.

When water begins to boil, cover with lid. Boil for three to four minutes, then put through ricer or strainer.

Stir in two cups sugar, place over fire and bring to boil. Remove at once and pour into wet mold.

If liked, spiced jelly may be made by adding to the water:

Two inches stick cinnamon
 Two whole cloves
 One-fourth teaspoon salt

Peaches Flambeau

Drain syrup from homemade canned peaches and bring to a rolling boil. Place peaches in hot syrup and keep on burner for just a minute, then place peaches in serving dish and pour over them per half peach:

One tablespoon kirsch
 (cherry cordial) or
 One tablespoon brandy

Ignite at table and serve while still flaming.

Pecan Puffs

Beat until very soft one-half cup butter.

➔ **AFTER A GREAT** turkey feast who has room for much dessert? This clever little cook serves an impressive but light dish called peaches flambeau which is served while still flaming.



Add and blend until creamy two tablespoons sugar.

Add: One teaspoon vanilla.
 Measure, then grind: One cup pecan meats.

Sift before measuring: One cup cake flour.

Stir pecans and flour into butter mixture. Roll dough into small balls, place on greased sheet and bake in slow oven (300°) for around forty-five minutes. Roll puffs while hot in confectioners' sugar and roll again when they are cold.

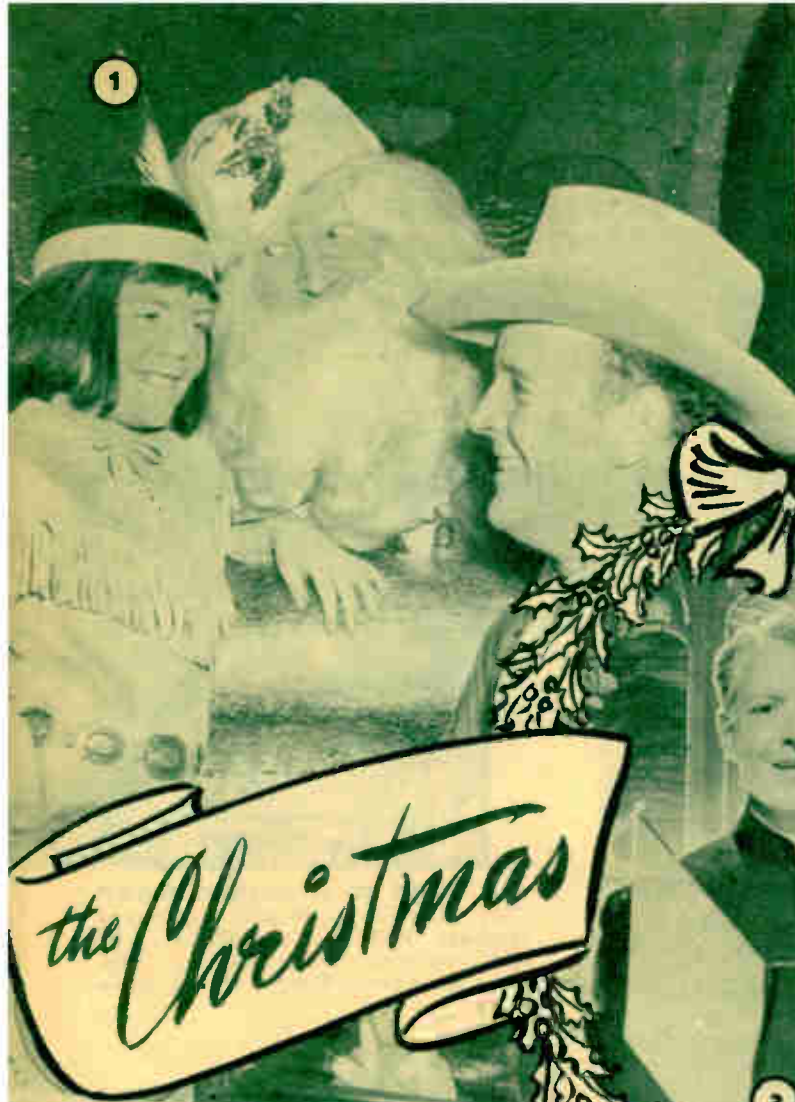
