TV-Radio Life Gets Exclusive Story in "Twenty Questions"

Faye Emerson



1. Is your "plunging neckline" a thing of the past?

I consider this a trick question, as I have never conceded that I wore necklines that plunged beyond what I consider the point of good taste. I wear what I consider to be appropriate to the show. Sometimes it's a suit and sometimes it's a ball gown—the latter, of course, is occasionally off the shoulders and low-cut. The most important thing is to wear something comfortable. I don't think excessively low-cut gowns are becoming to any woman.

2. What effects do you think the "plunging neckline" had on women's styles, public morals, parlor-room discussions, and any other items you would care to mention?

I think it was the first great controversy sparked by television. I don't believe that outside of providing comedians with material for jokes it has damaged any morals. Women have been wearing plunging necklines since long before Cleopatra, and most heroines in comic strips dress more dangerously than any TV gal would dare to.

3. Do you and Skitch (Henderson) have any problems in combining your two careers? Explain.


One great problem is to find time to work together. I would rather work with Skitch than with anyone else I know, but he is very busy with his own program. However, he conducts and composes original music for my show, "Wonderful Town," for which I am very grateful. As far as our personal life is concerned, I think we see each other more than the average husband and wife.

4. What are your future plans? For TV? The stage? Movies? Radio? Others? If you wish, also include Skitch's plans.

I contemplate no change. "Wonderful Town" and the few guest appearances I do keep me very busy now. I would like to do a daytime TV show with Skitch, as I enjoy that kind of work tremendously. I would like to do a movie if it were the right one and could be made without affecting my television schedule. And the theatre I love with a passion, but I would rather do one job reasonably well than attempt to do several with mediocrity.

5. If you continue televising, would you consider making any, all, or no "live" broadcasts from Hollywood?

Certainly, if the occasion arises. I might make a few telecasts not just from Hollywood but from different points of origin—Hollywood, Chicago and other cities which will be on the cable eventually. I consider it healthy

for the industry to have diversification, but my main headquarters will always be New York, where my home is.

6. Do you prefer making "live" TV shows, or those on film? Why?

I much prefer "live" television. I think film gives a secondary quality rather than the "nowness," the direct contact and the excitement of live TV. I do believe that most dramatic shows will eventually be better done on film, but I prefer the spontaneity of a live show.

7. Do you prefer working on TV shows, the legitimate stage, or movies? Why?

I never really liked making movies, so they are not competitive. The theatre is, I suppose, the most satisfactory and exciting medium in which to work, but television gives you a warm, personal touch with people. It has tremendous hazards, but it is never dull. Therefore, it is certainly my favorite—and TV has been very good to me.

8. Do you have any make-up problems for TV? If so, which ones?

From the very first TV shows, I have worn the same make-up. It is very thin and light, like a street make-up, but a little heavier around the eyes and mouth. I consider this more natural than a heavy make-up, and it seems to televise well.

9. Do you eat according to a planned diet? If so, how?

Certainly not, although I should. But it is very difficult to do when one is working and traveling around the country a good deal. However, I am very healthy and I consider this is the most important thing. When I diet too strenuously I'm not very sweet-tempered or happy, so I'd rather be a little plump and pleasant than grumpy and glamorous.

10. What does TV demand by way of a wardrobe, i.e., how many changes? what kind of dresses? what price range?, etc.

It demands a tremendous wardrobe. I wear a new dress on "Wonderful Town" each week, but on guest appearances I quite often wear an old favorite of mine that may have been seen several times. The price of a gown hasn't an awful lot to do with its becomingness. Some of my most effective dresses have nicked my pocketbook the least. I prefer the nipped-in waist and the full and graceful skirt, which makes it easy to move. Ceil Chapman does these so well that most of the gals on TV do wear her clothes.

11. Do you find it easier to interview show people, politicians, sports personalities, businessmen, professional men, or any other category you would care to mention? Why?

I think politicians are the easiest to interview. Most of them have very definite ideas about what they want to say and never seem to be at a loss for words. The same is true of scientists, who love to explain their particular work. Show people's lives have been so much in public view that it's often difficult to find a

fresh approach. I love doing sports interviews but, unfortunately, I am not terribly well informed on them. However, Skitch is correcting me. I don't think a person's profession matters particularly—it's their ease and personal charm that make for a good interview.

12. Since appearing on television, and after interviewing so many different people, do you feel that you have learned any new insights or have different feelings about people which you did not have before? Explain.

It would be impossible to talk to that many people from so many different walks of life and not learn a good deal from them. I still have a lot to learn, but this is one of the things I have enjoyed most about television.

13. Who is the "greatest" man or woman (or both) you have ever met? How? (By "greatest" we mean all-around personal and intellectual qualities which have or had a beneficial or magnetic influence upon those he or she came in contact with.)

I do not even hesitate to say Mrs. Franklin Delano Roosevelt, who combines great heart with a warm sense of humor, and a fine intelligence with incredible modesty—a truly great lady.

14. Do you think the abundance of mediocre television shows and films, particularly in regard to vaudeville talent, has helped or hindered the growth of television? Why?

I don't see how anything has hindered the growth of television. It has grown in three years from nothing to a monster industry. Naturally, all the shows could not have been "tops"—there was too much time to fill. I hope that we shall improve the quality of the programs as I feel those in TV have a personal responsibility to millions of people who, by buying sets, made its growth possible.

15. Since your appearance on television, do you find that your private life has been altered any because of a greater familiarity with the public? If so, please give an instance.

Oh, yes . . . although I was used to being recognized to a certain degree in public. I have never seen anything like TV's impact on people's minds. Because you go directly into their homes, they know your face by heart. It's very nice when you walk down the street to have people say, "Hi, Faye," in a friendly and easy way. They feel they know you—and, as a matter of fact, they do.

16. Can you give an unusual or unrehearsed incident which happened on your TV show?

Probably the most famous was the time that an actor, hired to do the commercial, rhapsodized for a while about the product until he reached the name of it—and then, very distinctly and with great conviction, gave the name of our competing

product. It was one of those ghastly moments when you don't believe your ears and you're sure that the ceiling is going to fall down. But my first reaction was a little unorthodox. I wanted so hard to laugh, finally smothered it like a schoolgirl, and somehow picked up the disconnected commercial and put it back on the track again.

17. What are some of your hobbies or pastimes during your "free time"?

We like watching television, reading, going to the theatre, and of course Skitch's world is music—concerts and the opera. Most of all I like being with my friends and talking to them.

18. In changing from the stage and screen to television, did you find you had to make any changes in your acting style?

Each medium requires its own style of acting. TV, I think, should be the most natural and restrained. Except when I occasionally do dramatic shows, I only play myself anyway, and the trick to that is to be yourself.

19. What, in general, are some improvements TV can make, both from the actors' and public's viewpoints?

I think TV has already made tremendous improvements in the last year. I think the first and most important step is to remember that we must justify our existence, not merely by entertainment alone, but by adding enough educational and cultural values to the medium so that it enriches the minds and the lives of our viewers.

20. If you had to do it all "over again" would you choose "show business" as a career? If not, what other career would you pick?

Certainly I would choose show business. The fortunate thing about people in show business is they make their living from their hobby—the thing they love to do most in the world. It is not a secure life, but neither is it ever dull. I'm a lucky girl.

The Old Adage About Better Being Safe Than Sorry Was Never More Important Than Now, If You Want

Christmas Without a Crisis

1. The comely television actress first cuts the butt of the tree on a slant so there will be more surface to absorb the fireproofing solution. She has kept the tree in a cool place until it is ready to put up. The inexpensive fireproofing solution is made by dissolving two pounds of calcium chloride or ammonium sulphate (obtainable at drug and hardware stores) in one and a half quarts of water. 2. Wendy then places the tree in the solution and lets it remain as long as it will absorb the liquid, usually from four to six days. The solution not only flameproofs the tree, it also lengthens its life. Needles so impregnated remain green longer and will not drop off so quickly. 3. After selecting a container and making sure her tree is in no danger of falling, Wendy checks radiators and heat registers near it to see they are turned off. She has examined the light sets for worn insulation and for broken or loose sockets, and has chosen non-inflammable decorations. A fall can mean a Christmas in a hospital, so Wendy uses a sturdy combination kitchen stool and stepladder to trim her tree. 4. Wendy tests the lights. Note that she has a switch to turn the Christmas lights on and off, and is not constantly plugging and unplugging the cord. She also has been careful not to overload the extensions.

On the Ball with Bob Kelley

Somehow or other most people have the idea that a football broadcaster just sits up in the booth and calls the plays as they unfold. It's not that easy.

Actually the work on a football broadcast starts almost a week before the game. The first thing I do is contact the assistant coaches of the two competing clubs. Sometimes they allow me to go over the scouting reports on their opponent. If not, the coaches furnish me with what we call a "three-deep."



That means a list of their first three strings at every position, on both offense and defense. The way the game is played today, this practically amounts to two separate sets of names. I also get a list of all the players who may alternate positions.

The next step is to make up my spotting boards. I use one for each team, and sometimes—in the case of clubs like SC with a tremendous roster—I make up a separate board for both offense and de-

fense. There's nothing fancy about my spotting boards.

I simply write down the names of each player at the corresponding position on a piece of white paper about the size of a tabloid newspaper. Next to the player's name I write his number in large figures. And in smaller print under it I list his first name, height, weight, experience and home town.

By the time I'm finished, the white sheet of paper is just about filled with names, with as many as six players—offense and defense—at each position. There's one little gimmick I employ to help both myself and my spotters. I list the offensive men in blue pencil, the defensive men in red.

Then comes the day of the ball game. With a spotter on each side of me, I glance at the boards from time to time to see who carried the ball, who caught the pass, and who made a tackle or key block. Of course with a team that I know as well as the Rams I don't really need a spotter.

But believe me, there's more to calling a football game than simply walking into a broadcasting booth and opening your mouth.

Only when NBC relinquished the complete responsibility the other night did we realize how tastefully the network had handled the parade (and itself) all this time. No commercialism, no flaunting.

I WOULD LIKE TO SUGGEST THAT next year the parade be a star procession with just a few top bands and that if all the high schools want to get into the act with bands and pom poms, that they be invited to appear for a mammoth telecast the night after the opening.

MIXED FEELINGS: From a fine balcony seat at NBC's El Capitan Theater, I saw the "All-Star Revue" starring Jimmy Durante and presenting, in her TV debut, Miss Ethel Barrymore. To say I enjoyed the show is a masterpiece of understatement. It was especially fine to be able to view it in the theater or to look at, if I chose, a giant monitor screen over the stage.

FEW WILL DISPUTE THE FACT that Durante is one of our greatest living showmen. And he's one personality so versatile and so vital that he can be "on" for an hour without making his audience tired. The other night was no exception.

WHERE THE SHOW DISAPPOINTED, however, was in Miss Barrymore's material. It is great fun to have a Pinza in "South Pacific," but the music must be good and suited to him. It is equally grand to see and hear Miss Ethel Barrymore toss around comedy lines, but they still should be worthy of her great talent.

SHE IS A GREAT LADY and looked

far lovelier onstage than on camera. Her skin is beautiful and surprisingly fresh; her hair is a becoming gray; and her soft black velvet dress and shortie coat complemented her excellent features. Hope she was pleased enough with her "initiation" to come back for more.

"Time for Defense"

Monday, 8:00 p.m.
ABC-KECA

On KECA's "Time for Defense" you are taken on an air trip to spots from which the headlines are beamed. This broadcast is aired from Washington, D. C., via transcriptions in cooperation with the U. S. Department of Defense. The series is sent out over the Voice of America and the Armed Forces Radio Service regularly.

A recent airing considered the "see-saw war" in Korea by bringing an on-the-scene account of the destructive results of war. A correspondent described the civilian conditions. A woman worker in one of the combat-zone orphanages discussed her job and the need for helping Korean war orphans. Another Army man presented his picture of soldier evacuation by U. S. helicopters and stressed the desperate need for blood plasma, which is now given to wounded men as they are in transit via helicopter.

We must admit that this air show is not entertaining. Much of the information is presented by people not experienced on the radio, and being such it is often dull listening. But this weakness is to be overlooked when you consider the type of verbal picture which is given the home listeners. It's all about the war in which U. S. sons are fighting each day . . . and that's why it's not entertaining.

Is it worth listening to? Yes, because it is one of the few ways we can do at least part of the job of being a citizen of our country. We can all probably learn a lot about what seems to many of us a war so far removed from our daily lives, if we tune in regularly to the military-services-supported "Time for Defense."—A. G.

Ralph's four-week trip cost \$411.50. The Military Air Transport Service supplied his aerial transportation. His most expensive item was lodging; whereas his food was least expensive, due partly to the low cost of meals on the air bases.

Ralph's transcribed reports from Europe, the Near East and Africa were integrated in more than sixty broadcasts. He was equipped with a minitape and magnacorder, but had to dispense with the latter because it was too clumsy; and often neither current nor a storage battery was available to run it.

One of the most unusual reports he presented was "The Sounds of Rome." He recorded the sounds of the magic fountain in the Palazzo, Venetia, where legend has it that if you throw a coin into the fountain, you will return to Rome . . . footsteps on the Appian Way . . . in the Catacombs, and sounds of Italian cars and a coffee machine.

It would be wise to remember that OPS (Office of Price Stabilization) regulations are in effect on most canned foods, which puts a ceiling on those prices. While we are on the vegetable-talk, here is a current tip which is not generally known. Corn (all varieties of packs) is a wise buy at present prices, inasmuch as future prices in this food are uncertain.

For the story on canned fruits, we may look to all varieties of peaches for the same reason . . . a good crop, a good buy. For those of you who enjoy purple plums in tasty thick syrup on the breakfast menu, you are in good luck as well as your pocketbook. More and more, I am learning to thank our grocers for passing along good prices in all foods.

When you consider the number of grocery stores in this, our Los Angeles, you will realize the extreme competition which causes each corner grocer and supermarket to sell at the smallest margin possible. Low mark-ups mean low prices for YOU.

It has been the custom to announce the name of the record preceding the playing of the record; but so often the listener, after hearing the record, would like to add that particular recording to his collection but has forgotten the name because it meant nothing to him UNTIL he heard the melody. I am sure there are many people who would much prefer the semi-classical selections which are easier on the nerves, especially the soothing music of the organ.

Spareribs with Artichokes.

(Something new for you)

- 1 side of spareribs (about 4 lbs.)
- 24 small whole artichokes
- 1 No. 2 can tomatoes
- 3 cloves of garlic (ouch)
- ½ t. salt
- Pinch each of sage and rosemary

Cut up the spareribs in serving pieces. Brown on both sides in skillet, then place in baking dish. Place the small, cleaned artichokes in and around the meat.

Cover with the tomatoes that have been seasoned with garlic, salt, sage, and rosemary.

Cover and bake at 350 degrees until the meat and artichokes are tender—would say about an hour.

Cooking the artichokes and spareribs together brings out each other's flavor.

Bob is an opponent of teenicide. Unnecessary, fatal accidents caused by reckless teen-age drivers motivated an Ohio traffic judge to coin this new word.

When the Inter-Industry Highway Safety Committee approached him a few years ago with the suggestion that his radio show might be an excellent vehicle to put across to the public the idea of driving safely, Bob was skeptical. He couldn't visualize the feasibility of including accident statistics on a situation-comedy program. However, the writers of the show cleverly and carefully integrated believable safety

discussions for the fictional family.

In conjunction with the periodic safety scripts, Bob and the Committee have initiated the Robert Young Good Driver Clubs throughout the country. Official "Man-to-Man" and "Dad-to-Daughter" pledges are distributed. These agreements list the eight basic tenets of good driving and are signed by the parents and their children. Drivers under twenty-five years of age thus formally promise, on their honor, to abide by the eight rules in return for use of the family car. They receive membership cards along with their pledge certificates.

Overwhelming Response

The response to his personalized safety pledges was overwhelming, and Bob has swapped his skepticism for enthusiasm. He admits, "I was never gladder to be wrong. I was frankly amazed and thrilled by the proof that people of all ages are sincerely concerned about traffic safety. Since the inception of this nationwide drive to help teen-agers to help themselves to greater safety on the road, we have had requests for agreements from well over three million people."

This national safety campaign is primarily directed at motorists under twenty-five, who are responsible for one third of America's traffic casualties. Bob feels that most of the teen-agers are good, competent drivers, but ironically enough because they are such good drivers they take chances and try road tricks that older drivers would never dare attempt. They rely on quick reflexes, superior coordination and trustful optimism.

P. A. Tours

On behalf of his safety campaign activities, Bob has also made personal-appearance tours to address high-school youngsters on the subject. The thought of addressing an assembly of hep high-schoolers created a bad case of stage fright for the veteran actor. "I expected to be received as a kind of spoil-sport, an old gaffer with a lecture to deliver, and I wouldn't have been the least surprised if the spit-balls had begun to fly," he confesses. However, Bob's fears were readily set aside by the intelligent reception he received. The majority of the youngsters were aware of the safety problem and

were anxious to find some practical solution to it.

Driver Training

Driver-training courses in the schools are becoming a growing part of the high-school curriculum and they seem to be the most effective weapon in this crusade. California's law states that all high-school students must have a course in driver education. Bob has visited several of these classes and has found the students eager to learn and abide by the traffic regulations. He believes that it isn't enough for parents and friends to act as driving teachers, because sometimes they are not very good drivers themselves and they transmit their faults to the beginner.

"The reward for safety is a longer life and the ability to enjoy it, and who can ask for a better compensation?" queries Bob.

Although Bob Young is active in safety driving campaigns, his 17-year-old daughter Carol Anne doesn't own a driving license, while his radio daughter, Rhoda Williams, does and is also a holder of his Daughter-to-Dad pledge card.

The Al Jarvis Story



▲ **"I WANT YOU for Christmas."** That's what Al seems to be saying to his pretty wife, Marilyn, who appears quite often on KLAC's afternoon show.

AFTER HEARING and watching the smooth-talking, pudgy-faced Al Jarvis on numerous occasions, we began to wonder what sort of a fellow he really was.

Was the off-stage Jarvis as unaffected, natural, and sincere as he appeared on TV and radio?

It didn't take long to find an answer to our question.

While waiting in the narrow hallway of his busy little wooden shack, located in the heart of the KLAC-TV studios, a secretary informed us that Mr. Jarvis would see us shortly.

"Oh, oh," we thought. "Here goes another of those cozy office interviews with the usual back-slapping, I-love-everybody routine."

A few minutes later, however, Al walked toward us, introduced himself, and then stepped out of the building into the bright sun, remarking: "Let's see where we can go. How about that place over there?"

Nodding agreement, we followed the short, springing steps of the

forty-two-year-old disc jockey, emcee and comedian.

"That place" turned out to be the combination dressing and rest room for ladies and gents at the studio. It was there that we found out about the man who gets as many as 10,000 letters a week.

One of the first things Al did was to open a small metal lunch box and start nibbling on some food.

"I never have time to go out for lunch," Al explained. "I swiped this lunch box from my kids, and it sure comes in handy."

Al and his charming wife Marilyn have four children: Jonathan Michael, 3, Jeffrey Michael, 4, Elliott Michael, 10, and Jerry, 18.

Although Al "spends more time behind a mike and in front of a television camera than any other performer in this hemisphere," he is still a devoted family man.

His daily routine consists of getting up at about six in the morning, playing with his kids, and arriving at the station at 8:30. After his busy day at that station, he returns home,

eats a late dinner, and retires early.

All told, Al spends a fantastic total of fifty-three hours a week behind a mike or in front of a camera.

"Why do you work so hard, Al?" we asked.

"It's like a guy building a house. He doesn't intend to work that hard all the time. We, and when I say 'we' I mean the whole staff, will make less and less mistakes and eventually things will be a lot easier for all of us."

Which was easier, TV or radio?

"Television is more of a challenge. The big thing to remember is that on TV you are not projecting to a mass audience, but rather to a family group.

"Incidentally, some people seem surprised that I can get by and yet don't have any so-called talent. But

they forget that I majored in speech and drama at USC. When I went into the disc-jockey business over fourteen years ago on the 'Make-Believe Ballroom' it was just a way to make a fast buck."

"The secret of a five-hour TV show is to know what *not* to do. I try to give people a break and put on what they want, because after all it's their time I'm really using, not mine. For example, one time I invited the editor of The Daily Worker to come on the show. However, he turned me down."

"Although there are a few parts of my show which I personally don't care for, I don't go by what I like or dislike. I go by what people like to see or hear.

"I love to get lots of criticism and I read every single letter that is addressed to me personally.

"Honestly, some of the letters I get are written by people far superior to me, and I feel a great humility when I read them. I am always awed by people who appreciate great literature. As for myself, I like to read books I don't understand so that some day I might be able to say I

do understand them. *This hasn't happened yet.*"

During the next few days we wandered around the KLAC studios watching Al and his staff operate. Publicized as "the man who has read more commercial copy than any other human during the past fifteen years," Al has long been recognized as "the boy who can get a station out of the red and into the black."

And no wonder! On his five-hour TV show alone, he averages thirty-two commercials a day. His hard work has paid off for KLAC as well as himself.

He owns a Cadillac and a mammoth home in the Beverly Hills section complete with a pool.

All the time we watched Al go through his paces, we kept remembering something he said to us:

"No matter how well this guy does, he remembers what hard times were, and he realizes that we could very well have them again."

That's the Al Jarvis story — about an ordinary guy with a simple philosophy, who has a big heart and lots of energy.

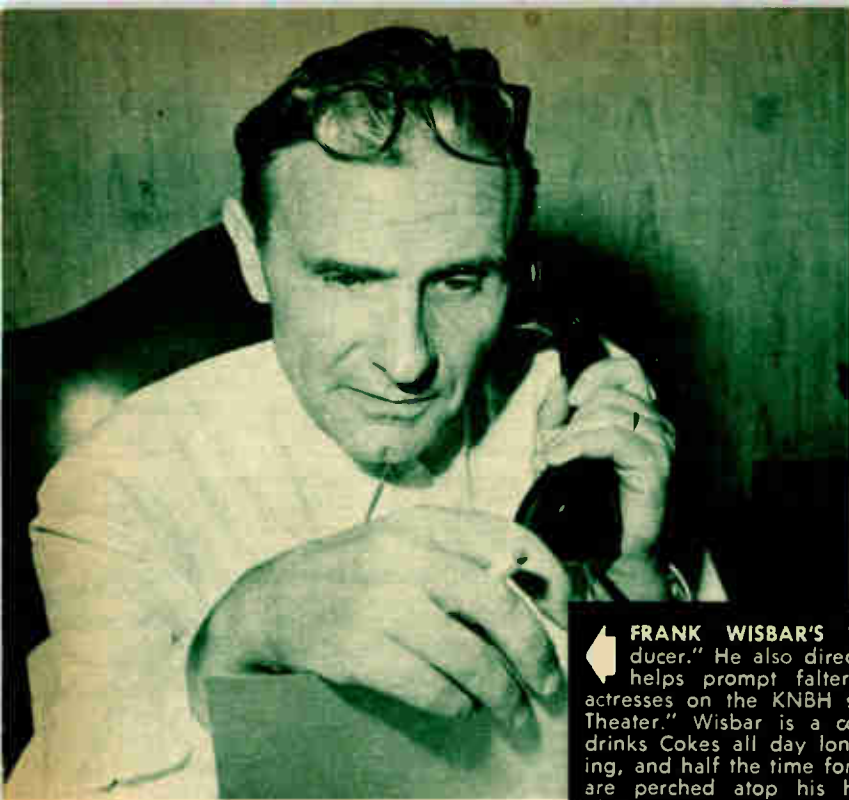

POSSIBLY ONE, yes, but could you choose a year's fare for television? Most major motion-picture studios turn out between thirty and forty features a year, with half of them but frail rehashes of familiar plots.

Frank Wisbar is called upon to deliver fifty-two half-hour "Fireside Theater" movies a year. Plots seldom if ever repeat. And his excellent movies have helped the career of more than one young artist in this town. Jim Davis, for instance, did but little movie work for months after his ill-fated appearance in "Winter Meeting," with the older Bette Davis. Wisbar showcased him in "White Violet," a story about a lumberjack, in which great character development was allowed. This presented Davis in an entirely different light. And anyone seeing him would leave the television screen distinctly under the impression of having watched a pretty capable guy perform.

Choosing Scripts

Frank credits his ability to choose fifty-two scripts a year and keep them all interesting to the fact that he remembers people want to be entertained. "It is what the viewer wants, not what I want, that develops 'Fireside Theater' fare.

"The fact that most of the audience comprises people relaxing at home precludes running many of the things I would like to do. You get a stronger play from a Dostoevski, perhaps, but the man lying on the sofa puffing at his after-dinner cigar doesn't want a writer to climb onto a soap box and tell the world how miserable life can be. He wants enjoyment."

And what, actually, is enjoyment?

and "a hangout" is entertaining, but the man who spins celluloid forty weeks out of fifty-two also spins a story as few other men can.

Departure

The developer of the "Fireside Theater" series feels that a man's escape from a cop or another hoodlum can never measure up to his escape from reality. He almost always looks for a departure in the stories he uses.

Frank Wisbar prefers building "Fireside" stories for himself. Aspiring young writers won't find a ready market here, and probably would save time by trying to turn out the cops-and-robbers series scripts that seem so popular on TV.

At his finger tips Wisbar seems to have plots aplenty, of the specialized character-development tack he so enjoys. And should the schedule of fifty-two a year devour these, there are realms of almost untapped literary sources to which he can turn for suggestion.

One of the shows Wisbar considers his best was built upon an old radio-show idea. Wisbar looked up the play, had the network search its files for the author's name and

Could You Choose A Good TV Script?

*Here Are a Few Tips on What Makes
Good Scripts, From a Producer Who
Knows What Appeals to the Public*

"Aside from the fact that it is not turning the microscope on social injustices, it is also turning out established-as-interesting fare. For instance, murder stories are very popular. In the best Greek tradition the human is caught in a net of circumstances and inevitably led to his doom. The televiewer won't watch this week in and week out, on every show he sees!"

When the earnest, voluble Wisbar talks about "Fireside Theater," he is talking about a series just as popular with wrestling addicts as it is with devotees of the drama. He strides about his office, stopping to enact every scene he remembers as particularly good — or particularly bad.

And Wisbar, in the telling, can make even a story outline fascinating. To hear him talking in a soft Viennese accent about a "hoodlum"

immediately contacted the writer and bought the play for TV. Then he went to work on the chase plot, turning it from an exciting cops-and-robbers epic into a memorable story based on the development of character under pursuit.

Unhampered by Business

Wisbar wisely and luckily doesn't have to mix business and his creative ideas. Business he discards by calmly announcing . . . "That is for the sponsor to take care of."

Procter and Gamble, being a company of some size, doesn't have to contemplate shutting down one of its branches if Wisbar buys a script and is unable to use it later. Loss of a few hundred dollars would be nothing against the company's getting fifty-two scripts a year, not only chosen but cast and filmed with the Wisbar touch.

No Time on His Hands

IF CURT MASSEY ever sings "Time on My Hands" on his daily CBS musical program, he won't be making a truthful statement.

Because, unlike the song title, the big Texas baritone finds himself wishing there were more than twenty-four hours in a day with his five-a-week radio show (4 p.m., KNX), the long list of benefits he's asked to do, acting as scoutmaster for a Boy Scout troop in Beverly Hills and conducting three business ventures on the side.

His Wife

His wife, Edythe, a very patient soul, isn't complaining, however. "The boys (Stephen and David) and I see him for a few fleeting moments over the week end — sometimes, that is. However, I wouldn't have it any other way because that's the type of fellow I'm married to. It's his nature to keep continually busy. He wouldn't be happy otherwise."

Recently Curt was called on a Saturday night and asked if he would fly to Travis Air Base the following morning at 5 a.m. to entertain wounded being brought back from Korea! The next morning, sleepy-eyed Massey boarded the plane and spent thirteen hours entertaining hospital patients just back from the war front. Then he jumped on another plane and was back in Holly-

wood next morning to do his radio show!

Busy as he is, Curt gave up a week end recently to go to Riverside and headline a benefit program for polio patients in Riverside County. He spent all day Saturday rehearsing, went to church Sunday morning, rehearsed in the afternoon and did the show that night.

He headlined a sports jamboree in Pasadena to aid the youth of that city. He went to Chicago with Martha Tilton to entertain in the annual International Square Dance, proceeds of which are used for Chicago's needy. Curt carries on the tradition of show people and never refuses to do a benefit if it is humanly possible to make the date.

Busy Man

Of all his activities, however, Curt's favorite is working as scoutmaster for the Boy Scouts in Beverly Hills because it is here that he gets to spend some time with his two boys, Stephen and David. And whenever a hike is scheduled for his troop, everything else is dropped. Nothing is allowed to interfere — not even a long-distance call from a frantic sponsor!

And, as if he weren't busy enough, the sponsor of Curt's five-a-week radio show now wants him to give some thought to a musical format for a TV musical program!

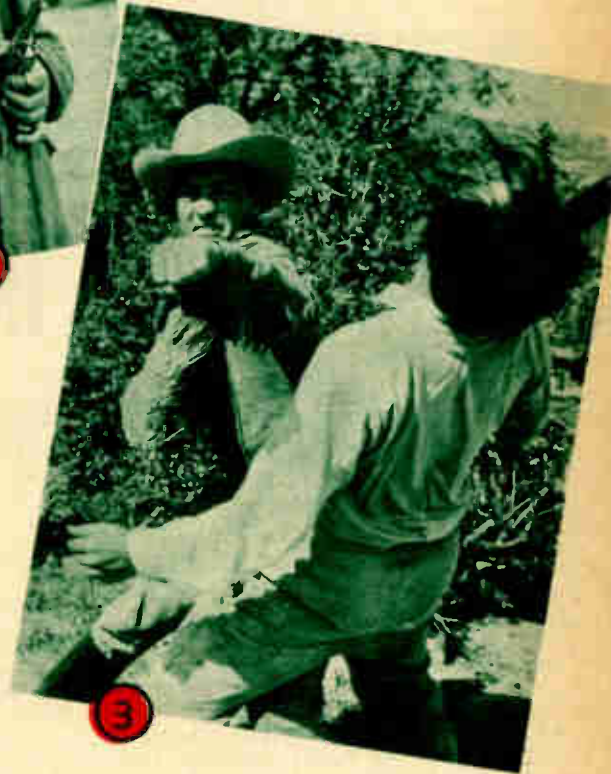
