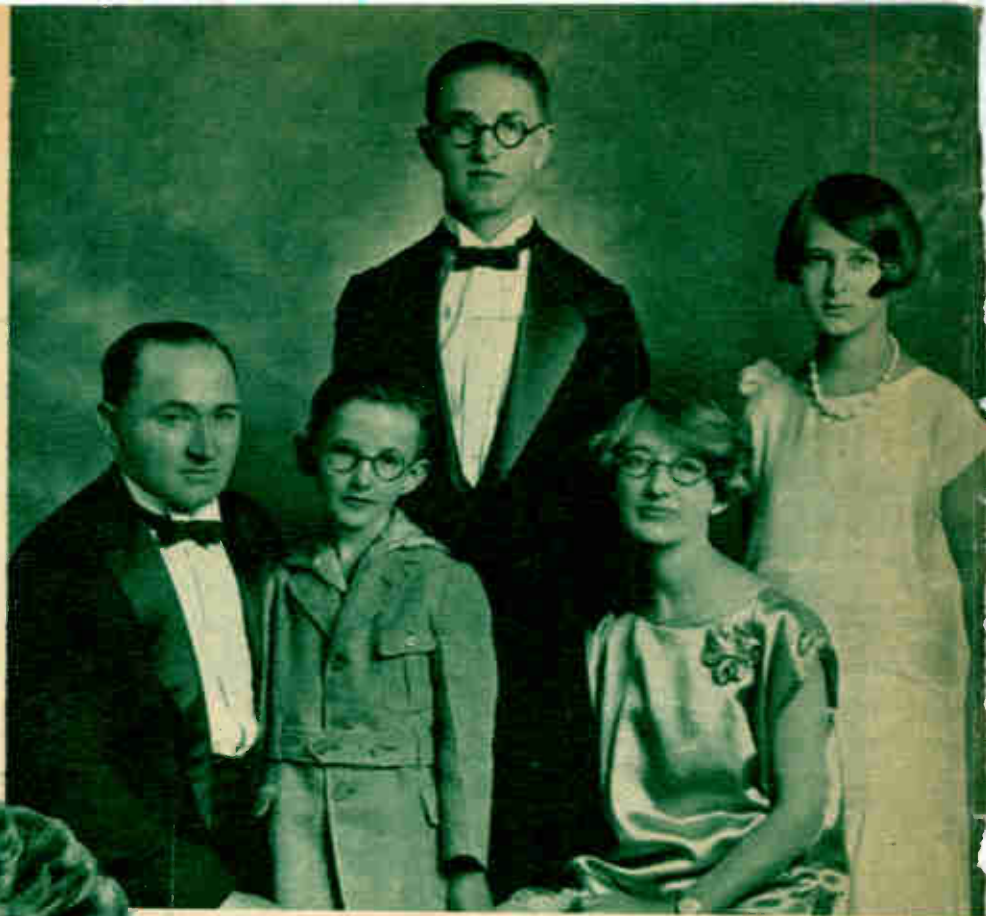
After twenty minutes of both sweet and solid music, Ada takes a ten-minute break and sits at a nearby table for a chat and a cup of cof-

This Is Your Life,

If the Famous Emcee Were to Re-enact Span, Here Are the People

HOLLYWOOD WOULD be a lovely place to work and live if more stars were like Ralph Edwards. He surely must have been born with natural likability, for his "Mom" displays this quality the minute one meets her. Added to his hereditary charm, though, is Ralph's intimately polished but tastefully friendly manner with people, especially those in studio audiences. One needs only to tune Edwards's new daytime TV program on KNBH or dial his new NBC radio show to rediscover the Edwards personality.

Curious about the environment developing a Ralph Edwards and remembering warmly his "This Is Your Life" program, we asked him if he would single out eight to ten persons contributing to his life. With typical generosity, Ralph made the number eleven. They are, in his own words:

1. My mother. She fostered the creative side of my life. She always told us children fairy tales of her own making. She also drilled a strict moral code into us and made me whatever disciplinarian I hope I am. All that and plus. What Abe Lincoln said about mother is only fifty per cent of it.

2. Miss Effie. She was a teacher in Merino, Colorado. She carried on at school where mother left off at home. She was a great complement to Mom . . . had me actually writing plays when I was in the first grade.

3. Another teacher (teachers are a terrific influence). This one was named Miss Edwards (no relative) and taught at Cleveland Grammar School in Oakland, California, where we moved when we left the farm.

She went far beyond academic levels. . . . I hold her responsible for adapting me to city ways without losing some of my country ways. Miss Edwards lives in La Mesa now and I write her once a month.

4. Jerome Douglas. My first companion in Oakland. He was a little Jewish boy who lived across the street . . . we carried newspaper routes together. We were quite "palsy" and it was interesting to me, a Methodist, to learn that there were other religions. It developed tolerance in me.

5. Mr. Pedley. He owned Pedley's Pharmacy at Park Boulevard and Newton and I worked for him four years after school during the ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades. I was his "boy"—jerked sodas, washed windows, weighed the Epsom salts. Mr. Pedley gave me a slant on the practical side of life. Often he would leave me alone in the store and this taught me re-

sponsibility. Also honesty and businesslike procedure, for whenever I made myself a shake, I made Mr. Pedley a note. I remember when Mr. Pedley, a darned good baritone, got a radio and we used to listen to "Amos 'n' Andy" and Phil Harris when he was a drummer with Lofner's Orchestra at Peacock Court. The Pedleys still live in Oakland. They lost their only son in the war. I see them whenever I go back and they more or less accept me as one of the family.

6. Frank Wright. He was an agency man, sold commercial shows and the ones he didn't have time to do himself he let me do. He taught me salesmanship. I had a disc-jockey show and a news program and began to establish the technique of selling over the air which I later used in New York. It involves underplaying and getting to the hearts of the listeners. I think Frank Wright is still in San Francisco.

7. A couple of teachers at Cal. Sara Hutman Sturges, my public-speak-



ing teacher, and Dr. Charles von Neumeyer, dramatic coach, who urged me to go to New York even if I had to starve.

8. Doug Coulter. He was the guy who hired me at CBS New York. I had been there three months . . . no work . . . I had done auditions . . . everybody had turned me down. Then Coulter held an audition for announcers. Sixty-nine of us turned

Sheen may go into television, with a suitable program of lectures and guidance.

... Bela Lugosi is being talked of as a TV star. The vehicles would be chillers, of course. . . . That Charles Laugh-ton will bring his Biblical and classical readings to TV fans. . . . That Basil Rathbone is about to take to the tube in the role of Conan Doyle's famous sleuth, "Sherlock Holmes."

Ya takes your choice and gives up your money. . . . An announcement will be made within two weeks about maestro Frank DeVol's new hour-long TV show which will originate from a local city ballroom.

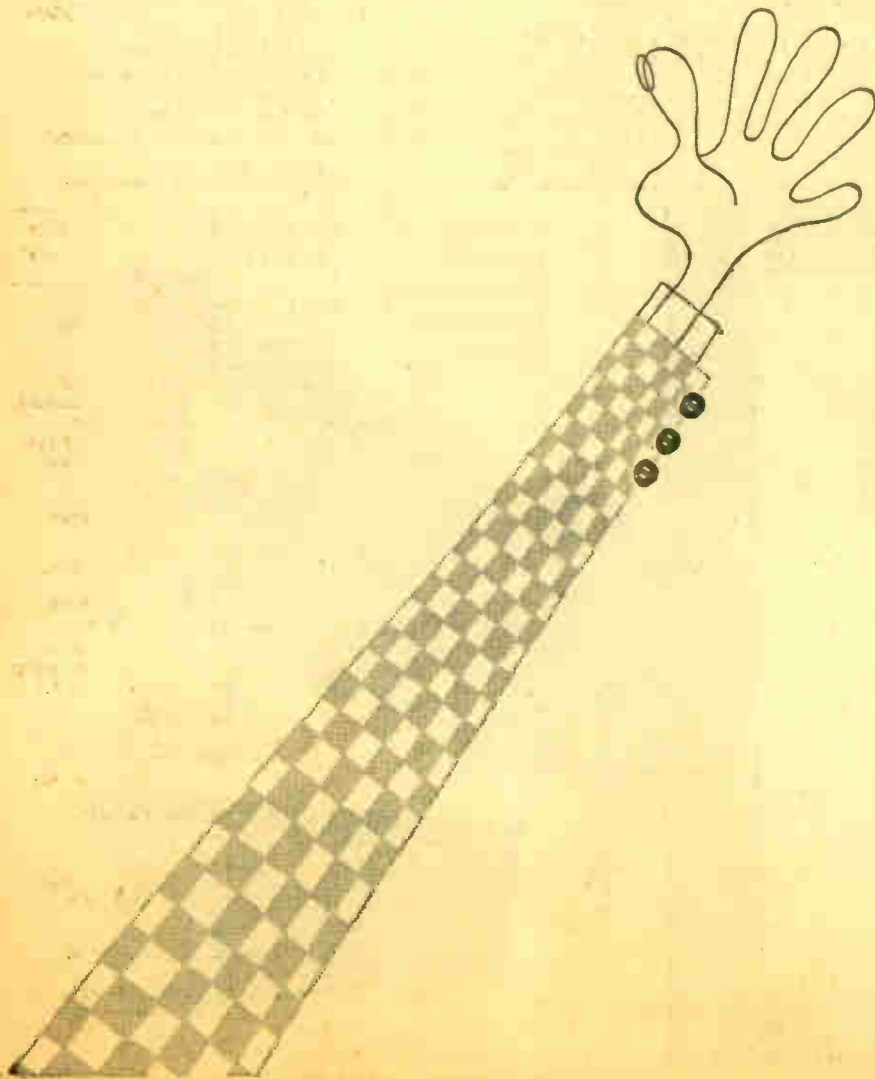

Stanwyck will appear on Jack Benny's TV show Sunday on CBS-TV. . . . After two weeks away, KTTV's musical madcaps, Ronnie and Rennie (Kemper and McEvoy, respectively), return to the station in a "new" half hour seen Friday nights—rather late.

. . . Jackson's Theater, KTTV late-evening film series, goes into double duty. Beginning this week it has an additional matinee showing. Theatre opens at 1:30 p.m. daily. . . . Bob Shannon and Bob Moon, co-emcees of another KTTV show called "A Date With Grandma," are looking for "Grandma California." The viewer or anyone interested in entering a nomination in the contest must write a 100-word letter to the program outlining why his candidate should receive the title. The contest closes on midnight, March 31, with results announced soon after, and "Grandma California" gets all kinds of goodies and surprises for becoming title-holder.

. . . Lawrence Welk has established a solid first through just signing another six-month contract with the Aragon Ballroom. That makes Welk the band leader to stay not only longest at the Aragon, but at any entertainment spot in Hollywood—and this isn't an easy town to bring to the front of the stand for that length of time.

Football for Hire?

It seems like a rather portentous step that the National Collegiate Athletic Association, at its annual meeting in Cincinnati recently, adopted a resolution that its Television Committee should work in close harmony with Zenith Radio Corporation on Phonevision. The NCAA is also exploring the possibilities of Skiatron and Telemeter. Two Phonevision demonstrations were given each day at the convention, and talks were made for the special panel which obviously is going to search the pay-as-you-watch field for a way to combine TV, football, and box office.

Zenith is also to give a special demonstration to the Pro Football League Owners Convention in New York.

Concurrently comes a Zenith announcement that it now has perfected five methods of sending Phonevision signals. That means four in addition to the telephone-line set-up.

And "perfected" means ready to go. In the nineteen and a half years the McDonald labs have been working on this pay-as-you-watch-special-events operation, two teams have been battling it out daily. One team builds methods—the second team works just as hard trying to knock it down.

Such objectiveness should result in something pretty satisfactory to the viewers.

The cast includes a precocious Freddie Bartholomew as Fauntleroy, Dolores Costello as the mother and C. Aubrey Smith as the grandfather. As Fauntleroy's street-urchin chum and speaking in pseudo-Brooklynese, you will see an extremely boyish Mickey Rooney.

Lifelines

AFTER REPLYING LAST WEEK TO ONE READER'S rather adverse comments on TV, I fully anticipated he might cancel his subscription; on the contrary and much to my surprise, he promptly acknowledged the comments with a charming letter, excerpts herewith:

"I AM SO GLAD THAT YOU TOOK TIME OUT to reply graciously to my little note concerning TV and radio and the trends of your esteemed publication. . . . The reason why I think that TV is a passing fad is because of recent experiences. Everybody in my neighborhood has TV, but most of my friends are disgusted with those awful intelligence-insulting programs and now turn on their sets only for those very comical faked wrestling matches. Also most of them speak of severe eyestrain—have you noticed that many drug stores are now cashing in on what they hopefully call TV drops for the eyes?"

"WHEN YOU SPEAK OF PARENTAL control of children, I am afraid you are a bit old-fashioned (me too!); most parents, unfortunately, give up in despair to keep the children from screaming and making life miserable for everyone. . . . As a matter of fact many parents now lean on TV like a drug to get the children out of their hair and to keep them quiet. All of this is very shocking and brings up far more serious moral problems for the future of our country than the small matter of the good or bad of TV.

"YOU HAVE ME ON THE HIP when you quote my 'brave fight of radio.' Though I find it on a much higher plane than TV, it has wasted many a golden opportunity and is often very bad. What I meant by 'brave' was really losing fight, back-against-the-wall sort of thing. I sometimes think I hear its death knell and that is why I appealed to you—let's try to help—you can do a lot! Of course, as we both know, the whole matter, alas! is in the hands of big business (those imbecile commercials—fight 'em!) and whichever medium brings in the greater profit will receive the larger budget.

"BUT WHEN TV BACKERS MAKE a survey of enlightened public opinion I feel confident that some of their favor (money) will rebound to radio. Here's hoping."

I WANT TO THANK MR. F. FOR his timely answer. In it he has brought out one point which is extremely provocative: How should (shouldn't) parents use TV in relation to their children? I agree that it becomes more than a TV problem when viewing is granted as a bribe or substitute for parental companionship and guidance; or non-viewing is meted out as punishment. Maybe parents need to get together on a policy the minute a TV set is installed in the home. This policy could be changed or expanded as time goes on, but should form the basic principle for viewing.

TV HAS DONE A GREAT DEAL TO cement home ties. We should all see

to it that in rejuvenating the home as the cornerstone of our country, we do not undermine it with lack of parental mortar.

Next time you're looking for an adventure story that is fast-moving and aired by a solid cast of radio actors turn to ABC's "Silver Eagle." You'll hear one of your old favorites, Jim Ameche, who has been in some of radio's top shows for years.

Each week a different story is aired. A recent show concerned the plight of some early pioneers who started out in the Northwest to find "Medicine Valley." These early settlers were moved by religious reasons to seek a new home. Many of them were from foreign lands such as Germany, Scotland and Ireland.

As the air script unfolded you got a very realistic picture of the life and struggles among the men and women who settled our country. This story was not steeped in romance and coincidences, but was motivated by the irregularities of climatic conditions in the Northwest and the foibles of greedy men. It was adventure that was believable and at the same time had its share of suspense and conflict.

There was also a religious theme running throughout the tale, which only added to the strength of the dramatization. Religion when handled this way often serves as a better sermon than some of those delivered dogmatically from the pulpit.

If every "Silver Eagle" broadcast proves to be as exciting listening as this one, they can't help but become a favorite of both the kids and the grown-ups. James Lawrence wrote the script and the show originated in the Chicago studios.—A. G.

Thus, when his voice gave out, he had no alternative but to keep it down. After it was over, Johnstone and the cast congratulated Dennis on his performance. O'Keefe answered in sign language. He couldn't even whisper.

Texas Ranger Praises Desperados

For thirty years Captain M. T. "Lone Wolf" Gonzauilas of the Texas Rangers, one of the last of the old-time quick-draw artists, chased bandits on horseback along the Rio Grande. Today he no longer rides the plains, but is a technical consultant on NBC's radio program, "Tales of the Texas Rangers," Sunday, KFI, 3:00 p.m.

Gonzauilas, who has killed and captured hundreds of criminals, has a lofty disdain for the "hard guys" of today, although he takes no chances with them. "The old desperado had a pride in his gun-throwing ability," he said. "He knew what he could do with a gun and he also knew pretty well what the officer he was up against could do.

"If he didn't think he had an even chance in a gun fight he'd give up. Today it's mighty different. Most of the gun punks running around today get up their courage by smoking marijuana or taking other dope. I call them mad-dog killers. A mad dog bites and runs. The killers today shoot and run. Few of them will stand up and shoot it out."

"The killers of today," the one-time Western law officer went on to say, "shoot from ambush or pot you in the back. They just start shooting and don't give a hoot who they hit. The old outlaws were gentlemen beside the killers these days."

"It's heavy," you remark.

"That's my face you're carrying," she replies, smiling.

All night long you have been amazed at the vitality of this woman. In the car, on the way home, her charm is as magnetic as ever, but her voice begins to tire, the glistening smile turns to only a slight parting of the lips, and her conversation becomes more subdued and even philosophical.

Sort of a blind date. And that's how Barbara came into my life and, as I always say, my three charming little "consequences." (Which really takes care of Persons No. 12, 13, 14 and 15.)

It's All "Theater" To Him

Earl Ebi Uses a Little Psychology on "Lux" Stars

ACTUALLY, HE looks more like an actor than a director. That's about the best way to describe tall, silver-haired Earl Ebi, who is responsible for the near-flawless productions week after week over "Lux Radio Theater." Ebi assumed this position last fall.

If there's one secret to his success in directing some of Hollywood's finest talent and often most temperamental stars, it lies in his own words, "Oh, I use a little psychology."

His Show Business

What does he mean, psychology? "I address all my on-stage comments to the *roles*, not to the stars. I talked to 'Eve,' not Anne Baxter, in the 'All About Eve' production." It may sound simple to you, but that's the way Ebi keeps complete control of the multiple threads of a "Lux" airing, from the time it leaves the film stage and is on its way to becoming polished radio drama.

Although much of Ebi's twenty-eight years in show business have been spent shuttling back and forth between California and New York City, he is a Californian. He prefers the Golden State because "I don't like making a trial of living. I'm a native son . . . born, bred and acclimated to California."

"Lux's" director is a man of one love . . . The Theater. He said, "I don't think there is a man more devoted to the theater than I am. It's truly a thrilling experience, for me, to see such stage productions as

'Member of the Wedding,' 'Streetcar Named Desire,' and 'Death of a Salesman.' I loved them for what they brought to the theater. I'm not looking for any messages. . . . I just like good solid drama. A good yarn, well acted and well directed."

A "Lux" Schedule

A week spent following the director of "Lux's" regular CBS-KNX Monday night broadcast might begin on a Friday afternoon or evening with the preliminary rehearsal. Then there would be a day off, until Sunday about 11 o'clock in the morning when rehearsals are started again.

By Sunday evening a transcription has been made of the rehearsal and Ebi has taken "reams and reams of notes" which he will take home and unscramble before the cast conference on Monday.

First thing Monday, a meeting is held with the scripter about the following week's script. By mid-afternoon the same day, the entire cast has heard the unscrambled notes taken after Sunday's rehearsal. Between four and five in the afternoon the final dress rehearsal is held, a short break is taken, and then "Lux" is on the air again.

Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday Ebi spends viewing movies (sometimes three features a day), interviewing performers for upcoming dramatizations and consulting with others about film-to-radio transformations. Because every "Lux" broadcast was first a film, the air-show director spends almost as much time with movies as with radio.

"I'm sincerely a very conscientious guy," Ebi said about himself. There's no doubt that this is a great asset for a man who has to meet a weekly "Lux" schedule.

Getting Personal

This conscientious guy plays a little golf and loves to go fishing. He claims, "I'm a lousy golfer. I can't concentrate on the game. Usually I'm off dreaming about something. I think the fellows just take me along because they have an idea I need the exercise." Any type of fishing will do for him because "It's the most relaxing thing I can do." Often his wife, the former June Pauly, takes off with him on these outdoor jaunts.

Does he have much time for hobbies? "Well, not much. I like to putter . . . but I'm not a hobbyist of any kind."

There has never been any other professional interest in Ebi's life quite to equal his love for the theater . . . "all kinds of theater." He has worked in TV, but believes radio is equally as interesting. Television will not be all in Hollywood or all in New York, according to Ebi. He said, "TV will be equally divided between the coasts. Probably the best live shows will come from New York and the best film out of Hollywood."

Will he be going into video directing? "Oh, yes . . . there's no escaping it." No matter which medium he's working in, Earl Ebi looks at it and loves it because everything is "pretty much theater" to him.

Some Performers

Typical of the acts who have performed on the show are Joe Horowitz, a Yellow Cab driver who did a great feat of balancing; Scotty Munro, a Scotch singer, Uncle Billy Beahan, an eighty-seven-year-old singer and dancer, who revived a great favorite of years ago, "He Walked Right In, Turned Around and Walked Right Out Again," which he had done in vaudeville some forty years previously.

Another is Tom Christy, sixty-six-year-old singer, whose grandfather founded the original Christy minstrels. Christy wears the same shoes his grandfather did 100 years ago.

The mother of Charlie and Jack Teagarden was a recent performer, as was Axel W. Christensen, the father of ragtime music.

Also seen recently was "Pop" Carter, ninety-five-year-old roller skater, who has been a professional for the past ninety-one years. He performed on a pair of skates given him in 1910 when he was honored as being an "old-timer" in show business. If "Pop" didn't prove that "You're Never Too Old," nothing will!

BERLIN, VIENNA, Paris, London and Stockholm are intriguing cities, but when a television unit weaves a story around such authentic settings they become even more romantic. KNBH's new series, "Foreign Intrigue," sets a new high in video entertainment.

The show depicts the adventures of an American newspaper correspondent in Europe and all exterior shots are filmed in the continental cities where the stories occur. Seasoned European actors are cast in supporting roles. But "Foreign Intrigue" doesn't rely entirely upon the allure of faraway places and strange-sounding names. The techniques used by the camera unit are far superior to those employed by many of our own local lensers. Unconventional lighting and angles are stressed, giving depth and character to the film. Enhancing this realistic footage are the scripts, which stress crisp dialogue and convincing action.

ceeded my expectations. I didn't have to adapt any preconceived ideas about TV because there is no television in Sweden. European actors are natural and convincing, and they speak English with an accent, attaining just the effect I want."

The stars of "Foreign Intrigue," Jerome Thor and Sydna Scott, are the only Americans in the cast. A native New Yorker, Jerome Thor has appeared in such Broadway hits as "My Sister Eileen," "Doughgirls," "Golden Boy," and "No Way Out," as well as many of New York's top TV shows. He portrays the role of a foreign correspondent as a quiet, intelligent individual who might actually be found in a newspaper office.

Beautiful Sydna Scott hails from Chicago, where she attended dramatic school. She has plied the professional boards in "Native Son," "Doughgirls," and "Stage Door," and she, too, has appeared on New York's dramatic TV shows. Sydna's Nordic features . . . high cheek bones and straight blonde hair . . . have caused many Scandinavians to mistake her for their Greta Garbo.

"Foreign Intrigue" captures an aura of suspense which more than meets the competition of its locally produced counterparts.

ONE OF the most daring mass plots to "commit the perfect crime" was conceived in broad daylight. It happened at lunch not so long ago in a Hollywood restaurant.* The "plotters" were well-known CBS radio investigators, detectives and inspectors. The victims were their writers.

Matt Grebb," "Inspector Peter Black" and "Sgt. Moffett") he said: "Fellas, I just had a horrible thought. Suppose that some week our writers decide to hand us the perfect crime to solve. One in which there is absolutely no trace of how the victim was done in. What would we do? I'll tell you what we'd do . . . nothing! Why, we'd look positively ridiculous, not being able to solve a crime for our listeners. We'd be the laughing stock of radio.

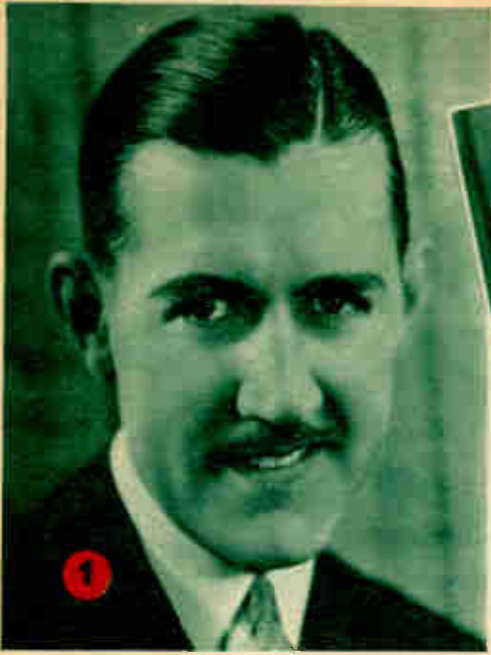
