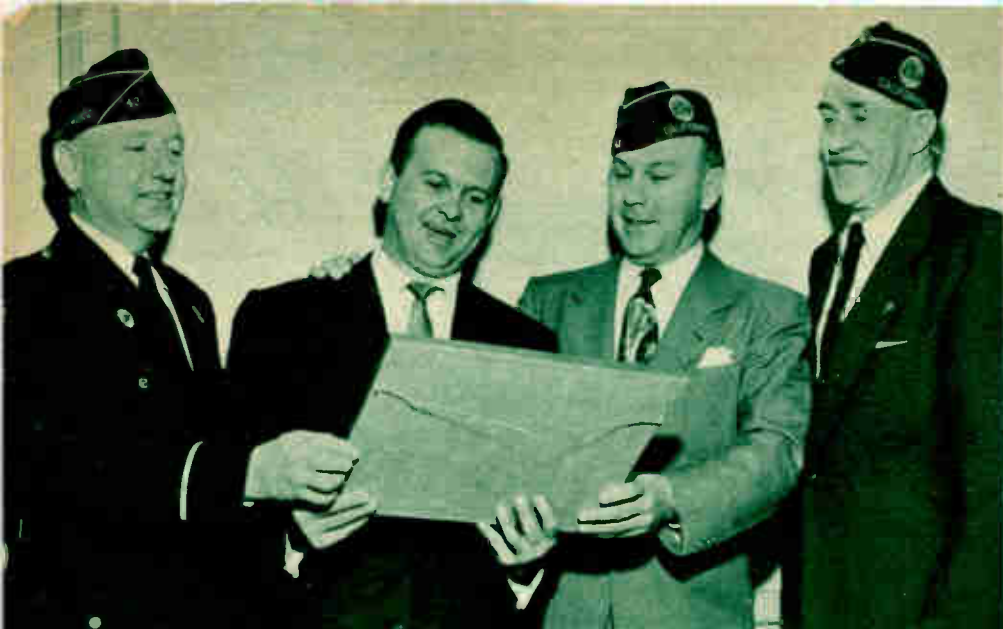

THE DARK-HAIRED, jut-jawed actor who plays "Dick Tracy" on the KNBH series of the same name started early to work for the forces of "right." While Ralph Byrd was still a teen-ager of Dayton, Ohio, he was made District Commissioner of the Boy Scouts of America. The youngest man to be so named, incidentally.

Chapter One—Class Play

Yet Byrd came by his "Tracy" crime-busting antics strictly by accidents, one after another. The Dayton school he attended was giving a senior-class play. Being fresh out of seniors who could sing and act, that class dipped into the ranks of the juniors and came up with baritone Byrd, who warbled happily in the big kids' league for three nights.

"Just by accident," recalls Ralph, "a booking agent was in the audience. That following summer he approached me to sing with a band. The work was easy, the pay good, so away I went."

As with most people, one taste of performance swayed Byrd away from a life of accounting, window-washing or whatever other endeavor might have seemed attractive. By now most movie fans have seen myriad pictures in which Byrd either starred or appeared.

His first casting as "Tracy" in the movie serial was again based on slimmest chance. Ralph was standing outside Columbia Studio, in Hollywood, enjoying a last drag on a

cigarette before going in to read for a movie role. The casting director from rival Republic Studios drove by, waved at his actor friend, then slammed on his brakes and hailed Byrd to the car. He persuaded Ralph on the spot to come out to his studio and read for the new series.

Wanted Out

"The reading at Republic was with half a dozen other actors who wanted the part. We also were supposed to memorize the page or so, and go before camera letter-perfect. I didn't want the part and thought this was my out, so protested having no time to memorize anything.

"You know how it is when you don't care. You can do no wrong. So the casting director had me just read the lines, make an entrance and an exit, and announced that I was 'it.' I learned later what 'it' meant. He was so right! That was in the days before unions, and I found myself going at it five days and five nights a week."

But Byrd looks back happily over the "Tracy" movie work. It helped him buy the two-and-a-half-acre hilltop home in Tarzana where he lives with his wife and fourteen-year-old daughter.

While Byrd was a logical choice for the "Tracy" TV series, it was an-

other accidental encounter which sewed it up. During his years in the service, Byrd was at one time stationed in Joplin, Missouri, in the company of a buddy named Joe Parker. The two used to wander the streets of the small town, swapping show-business anecdotes, and became great pals. When Parker, later on in Hollywood, produced the original "Tracy" pilot film, he remembered Byrd's "Tracy" film experience and cast him in the lead. Then when Snader Productions took over the full-time creations of the TV series, Byrd was in like Flynn.

Another accident nearly reversed all Lady Chance's benevolence to Byrd by removing him from the well-known role of lantern-jawed sleuth. After having just completed 30,000 miles of personal-appearance tours, Byrd was driving along a road in the Valley. Out went a tire on his station wagon, and over it toppled, pinning the driver firmly beneath.

He lay there for hours while cars whizzed over nearby Reseda Avenue. Finally a little girl and her dog came across the paralyzed victim and were able to summon help.

"My two-way wrist watch didn't do me a bit of good that turn," grinned Ralph. "My daughter wears the other one, and probably didn't have hers turned on!"

Miss Byrd, incidentally, is quite pleased with father as "Dick Tracy."

"But she is completely smitten with a fellow named Roy Rogers. He gave her a horse once, and all I could provide were a couple of dogs and a cat named Cinderella. Funny thing about that cat—we came by it quite by accident. . . ."

She Goes to Your Head

MANY YOUNG girls dream of being queen vocalist with one of the nation's top popular dance bands. And so did Roberta Linn, ever since she was in her teens. Her dream came true even though her lucky number is thirteen.

Roberta, who has black, black hair, deep-brown eyes and an undeniable sparkle, was all set to sing in front of Jan Garber's orchestra when she met Lawrence Welk and his music men; she made a quick switch and signed two and a half years ago with Welk's musical aggregation.

Not Sophisticated

After viewing Roberta's rendition of almost any pop tune maybe you won't agree with Roberta's own description of herself, "I'm not the sophisticated type." Proof of this fact was never better displayed than the night the singer removed her shoes on camera, so she would be more nearly the height of a shorter vocalist. Klaus Landsberg, KTLA director, suggested she take off her shoes, but even he didn't expect that her informal approach to television would "break up the entire band."

Roberta is one songstress who can brag of starting her warbling career at the age of three and of being one local gal who made good. She started

her singing in Huntington Park, California, and once sang ballads at Topsy's in South Gate.

Champagne Music

Since she gained fame as the "Champagne Lady," we asked her to describe Welk's famous Champagne Music.

"It's the best darn dance music you can get. It really has a little bubble in it," was her answer. She went on to tell us one reason Welk has such a wonderful band is that he keeps his men with him for years. One man, the organist, has been with the band for seventeen years.

Does it take much work to render hit tunes week in and week out for one of the top dance orchestras?

Roberta said, "Yes. It's a lot of work. Sometimes I memorize twelve songs and get them ready in a week. You can't sell a song until you are absolutely sure of it, and that takes time. Every minute I'm in front of the cameras or the public I'm learning more."

When it comes to her favorite tunes, it's always a torch or blues song. "Say It Isn't So" is her first choice. She likes Kay Armen, Tony Martin and Gordon MacRae when it comes to balladeers.

Roberta, who is twenty-three, is single and lives with her mother and

LEO CARRILLO: From Cartoonist to Cowboy

ONE OF California's own native sons, Leo Antonio Carrillo, made the transition from newspaper cartoonist to cowboy innocently and without premeditation. After completing his schooling at Loyola University, he took a job with the San Francisco Examiner as a cartoonist.

His assignments took him to every nook and cranny in that charming city. As a matter of fact, Leo claims it was an education. "I picked up a knowledge of Japanese and Chinese in the Asiatic sections of the cosmopolitan city." His capacity for enjoying and cultivating many friends has enriched his knowledge of foreign languages. "I have a smattering of German, French, Italian, as well as the Asiatic tongues, and, of course, am quite garrulous in my native English and Spanish."

His mimicry in dialect kept the city room in an uproar, and fellow reporters took him to the Family Club, where Major Eddie Bowes, in charge of the club's annual play, wrote Leo's "stuff" into the show. The "kid" on the Examiner who made people laugh filled in one night at San Francisco's Orpheum. From then on Leo was on his way. "I remember the first hundred dollars I ever earned," he recalled. "I spread it out on a table, all of it in singles, and just stared at it." Leo's guiding meteor led him from mimic to Broadway character actor to Hollywood's

horse operas. Hollywood meant home to Leo.

His Spanish ancestors settled in California more than 200 years ago. In 1837 his grandfather, Carlos Antonio Carrillo, was the first governor of California . . . his father, Don Juan, mayor of Santa Monica; and his great-grandmother, Josefa Bandini, was given all of Coronado Island as a wedding present. The historical and romantic sagas of our colorful state were personally handed down to Leo by his forebears. The heritage of the West truly belongs to Leo Carrillo.

Speaking of the West, Leo has endeared himself to the younger generation by his lovable "Pancho" characterization, which is popular throughout the country. It's inconceivable to think of "The Cisco Kid" without his sidekick, "Pancho." While kids enjoy the adventures of "Cisco" (KECA-TV), the grown-ups watch "Dude Ranch Varieties" over KLAC-TV.

Leo has some very definite opinions pertaining to television. "Good taste is the prime requisite for TV entertainment. We are in your living room and are your guest. I remember that when televising my Western variety show, and never breach good etiquette. Perhaps that's why our KLAC-TV show appeals to kids from six to sixty.

"To my way of thinking, television's future lies in Phonevision. The marriage of movies and TV is inevitable. Low admission price, comfort

and no additional expense for baby sitters is the answer."

Between pictures and television, Leo farms his 5000-acre Rancho de los Quietos in the rolling San Diego hills, or he may be seen as grand marshal leading a parade.

"Everybody loves a parade," explains Leo, who's given a lot of thought to the art and philosophy of parading. He's been grand marshal of so many parades that after the first thousand he lost count. As a matter of fact, a friendly rivalry exists between Leo and his cousin, Sheriff Eugene Biscailuz, as to who has been grand marshal the most times.

Leo's parading helped elect Earl Warren governor. As a reward he received a place on the State Parks Commission, a job that nobody had ever asked for previously. Carrillo wanted it because his mania is restoring old missions, which he regards as California's most priceless treasures.

"Besides, any time a mission is restored it is an occasion for a parade and fiesta. I guess next to parades, I love fiestas best," he smilingly explains. One of the picturesque festivities that Carrillo helped organize is Santa Barbara's Los Rancheros Visitadores, a cavalcade through the hinterlands for the sheer enjoyment of dolling up in Spanish dons' costumes and riding horseback. Today, at seventy-one, Leo can and does ride with the best of them.

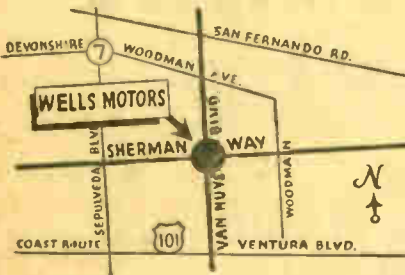

He doesn't have much spare time, but when he can find it you'll find him racing around San Diego bay in his new speedboat—owned jointly with Channel 8's Jack Briggs, his buddy, but no relation. That's the thumbnail sketch of San Diego's Channel 8 busy man, Fred Briggs.

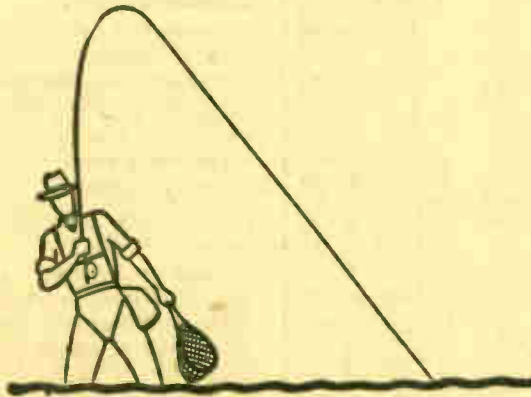

Final Word on Benny

It is no longer a rumor. Jack Benny is going to continue on CBS radio next season with his comedy show. Benny said he is doing so at the request of his sponsor. "After all," he observed, "it would have been very difficult to say farewell to an audience that they estimate as 18,575,000 listeners a week. And I am sure that with Mary, Dennis, Rochester, Don, The Sportsmen and my regular radio writers with us again, we will broadcast as funny a show as we possibly can for the listeners to this country's 105,000,000 radio sets who tune us in." Bob Crosby will take over the spot held by Phil Harris for years. Benny will do only one TV appearance every four weeks so that he can have time for radio.

Went Dead

What happens when the sound track at a live air show suddenly goes dead? Radio director Jack Johnstone answered that question when that rare occasion turned up on his NBC-KFI "Hollywood Star Playhouse." During the final thirty seconds of the broadcast the sound track and turntable were short-circuited. A climaxing car crash was expected. Moving quickly, Johnstone kicked over a couple of nearby chairs and jumped up and down for sound until Floyd Caton and Monty Fraser of the sound crew located the loose wire with only a couple of seconds to spare . . . and the listeners probably didn't notice the real-life climax for director Johnstone.

"Littleman" Leaves Footprints

If you have seen these tiny footprints around don't be alarmed, for they are only signs of "Littleman," a pixie character who is heard every afternoon at 4:45 on comedian Hawthorne's CBS-KNX radio show. "Littleman," who has never been seen, but who talks a blue streak on the show, is said to be only four inches tall and has been around for hundreds of years. "In fact," says Hawthorne, there's always been a 'Littleman.' We all have one." When "Littleman" started walking across the papers on Hawthorne's desk during the broadcasts, listeners started writing in, asking to see the footprints. So now Hawthorne has "Littleman" walk on each post card or letter that is sent in self-addressed and with postage for the return trip. Hollywood people no longer say, "Kilroy was here." They say, "'Littleman' was here."

THIS WEEK'S NATURAL SEVEN: Peggy Lee's "Be Anything" (Decca), Martha and Liz Tilton's "Am I in Love?" (Coral), Walter Schumann Voices' "Last Night" (Capitol), Helen O'Connell's "Right or Wrong" (Capitol), Modernaires' "Bugle Call Rag" (Coral), Frank Sinatra's "Walking in the Sunshine" (Columbia) and Art Lund's "Frenesi" (MGM).

Reissues from Signature masters of five years ago made their appearance on Coral label this week. Ray Bloch's "Espanaharlem" and "Harlem Nocturne," great waxings when recorded, should be even bigger today. . . ditto for Johnny Long's ensemble-singing orchestra doing "Happy Birthday" and "Sweet Sue." . . . Vocalists Connie Haines singing "You Made Me Love You" and Anita O'Day's "Boot Whip" and "Key Largo" are others that record fans will welcome to their collections.



Girl Vocalists had a corner on the week's batch of shellac with Columbia's Toni Arden topping the list with the lyrical adaptation of "El Choclo" called "Kiss of Fire"—and, take it from Mansfield, Toni puts just what the title suggests into her singing. As if that weren't enough, reverse side, "I'm Yours," is almost as good. . . Jo Stafford (Columbia) has an unusual waxing in "Raminay!", the street cry of New Orleans chimney sweeps in bygone days. To Weston's fine backing in mambo-blues tempo, tune is a natural for the Stafford styling.

David Rose heads the instrumental section this week with his individual string styling of "Harlem Nocturne," with Woody Herman featured as sax soloist throughout for some great listening. Flip is a new Rose composition, "On a Little Country Road in Switzerland," better described as a Holiday for Strings in Yodel tempo.

Ella Fitzgerald (Decca) has a swiny revival of yesterday's "Goody Goody" that ranks with the best, and a bop vocal on the Benny Goodman classic, "Air-Mail Special," that still sounds good on Ella as the Last of the Be-Boppers. . . Herb Jeffries (Coral) has a top coupling of a brace of tunes closely allied with his career—"Basin Street Blues" and "Flamingo," both to fine backing by Les Brown's Orchestra. . . (P.S.: Mrs. M. suggests we use both on our KFI program. . . Good idea, but I'll still Turn Back the Clock to the Buddy Baker and Duke Ellington versions. . . A.M.)

Wrestling Is My Business

EXPERT OPINIONS ON THESZ-LEONE MATCH

All indications point to the **Baron Michele Leone-Lou Thesz** championship match being the greatest wrestling event since the days of Milo. Interest, speculation and excitement are spreading all over the world.

Last week I promised you the opinions of the nation's leading wrestling authorities. I figured they would be interesting to you—as well as to me. I asked them to talk with wrestlers, sports writers and promoters in their territory, and give me a general consensus of opinion. Here is what the experts have to say:

Tony Stecker, brother and manager of Joe Stecker, voiced the opinion of authority around Minnesota, North and South Dakota and Iowa. He thinks Lou will win in two straight falls because he is too big for Leone. His opinion is based on seeing Thesz in action, but he has seen the Baron only on television.

The Eastern Seaboard, through Rudy Dusek, former wrestler and eldest of the famous Dusek clan, thinks that Lou will win by a decision on experience. Rudy books wrestlers out of New York.

Oroville Brown, the king of wrestlers around the Midwestern country, says that throughout Kansas, Missouri and Oklahoma, the opinion is that Lou will take the Baron in a two-out-of-three-fall match, because of his size, age and speed. Brown also said, "Baron Leone is a very good wrestler and it should be a great match. I would like to see it."

Oroville has a strong personal interest in the match May 21—if it were not for a tragic automobile accident, it might be he who steps into the ring to meet Leone for the undisputed heavyweight championship of the world. At the time of the accident, he was booked in St. Louis to meet Lou; the winner to be declared the National Wrestling Alliance heavyweight champion. Fate interfered, and his injuries prevented him from ever wrestling again—although he is booking wrestlers out of Kansas City.

Sam Menacker, a former wrestler here, is now promoting in El Paso,

Texas, and doing a great job of it. Sam speaks for experts in New Mexico, Arizona and his part of Texas. Opinion there is certain that Thesz will be the winner in a thrilling two-out-of-three match, because of his speed, natural ability, experience, and his manager, Ed "Strangler" Lewis. Menacker said, "While Baron Leone will no doubt be picked by some as the winner, I feel that Lou's speed and endurance will eventually overcome the brute strength of the mighty Baron."

Joe Malcewicz, formerly known as the **Utica Panther**, who now is retired and promoting in San Francisco, says that the Bay Area believes Thesz will win. Joe stated, "It's the old story, a good big man will always beat a good little man."

Morris P. Sigel, promoter in Houston, Texas, voiced an opinion of the Texans. I put a lot of confidence in Sigel's opinion, for he has been promoting there for twenty years. He has brought every great wrestler in the game there, has seen them all, and has a keen sense of values. He has a fellow with him who has shown the world a few tricks in wrestling promotion in Dallas during the past ten years, Dr. Karl Sarpolis. This is what Sigel said: "We Texans think Thesz will win in two straight falls. We believe he will out-wrestle, out-think and out-battle Baron Leone. We predict that it will be one of the really great matches in wrestling history and have only one regret—that California was able to snare the prize instead of Texas—the first time you have been ahead of us in a century."

The Great Lakes country believes Leone will take the title in two straight falls. Joe "Toots" Mondt, promoter in Chicago, is well qualified to predict this match. Even Ed Lewis, Thesz's manager, who wrestled at the same time as Mondt, rated him the toughest wrestler of his time for four

or five years. "Toots" said, "Leone is acclimated and will carry the fight from the start. He is stronger than Thesz and knows more rough wrestling. I predict Leone will be the undisputed champion of the world."

From the deep South, down Virginia and Georgia way, comes a report from Bill Lewis, promoter in Richmond and Norfolk. Authorities in his country think Leone will win two out of three falls. Possibly some of you older fans remember Bill here a number of years ago when he worked under the moniker of Bluebeard Bill Lewis. Bill's brief summary is: "Leone is a very tough wrestler and is wrestling in his own back yard"—a very important aspect in a match.

Southern California wrestlers and promoters seem to think Leone will win, two to one. Hugh Nichols, former light-heavyweight champion of the world, and now promoter at Hollywood Legion Stadium and San Diego Coliseum, summed up local opinion very well. Nichols said, "Personally, I believe that Baron Leone will win. He is a rough, tough and rugged wrestler who can go by the hour. He has stamina, guts and determination. In wrestling, it is ninety per cent condition and ten per cent ability. I don't mean Thesz won't be in condition, but I don't believe he will be in the condition that the Baron is in. I doubt if Lou will be able to stand up under the brutal attack of Leone for two hours. I pick Leone because I think he will wear Thesz, who depends on speed, down and beat him."

Well, there they are—the opinions of the men who know. Their ideas are just as diversified as yours and mine. The only point of agreement is that it will be a match to go down in history.

Next week I will tell you how I think it will go and why.

The pros and cons of price ceilings find "our" candidate talking, as a fellow citizen, to his corner grocer about their mutual problems . . . the cameras might even eavesdrop on the candidate and his family at home.

"Non-professionals will appear in the scripted shows," explained Judy, "the butcher, baker and candlestick

maker will be just that and not members of the theatrical profession. Our aim is to have the candidate put his point across in his natural surroundings. Driving an idea home to a group of actors would defeat our purpose.

"Obviously," continued Judy, "I must remain completely neutral in my politics. I will never tell candidates what to say, only how to say it. Their beliefs and platforms will be integrated into their scripts."

The first of these political "programs" is expected to be viewed early this summer. The shows will be tailor-made for each client. "The viewers will have the opportunity to learn something about each of the candidates . . . his family life, hobbies and personal credo will be bared, as well as his politics." Elucidating further, Judy said, "Primarily a politician is a human being, having desirable traits as well as shortcomings. We intend to humanize him for the voters and not have him appear as some unattainable object."

Judy Lawton, whom we have watched and admired on her excellent public-service program, "Here's to the Vets," has had excellent training in radio and politics. In addition to an administrative post with the Blue Network, she supervised Louisiana's radio activities for ex-Governor Jim Davis. Enough said! Judy has had a varied background. When a teen-ager she sang with leading bands throughout the country. However, after fourteen years of road engagements, she tired of living out of a trunk and switched to radio. After intensive training in every phase of radio, Judy became one of the few women commentators in the country, broadcasting six fifteen-minute newscasts daily. In 1946 she won the coveted Peabody Award for her public-service program entitled "Brotherhood or Oblivion."

Leaving New Orleans in 1948, Judy came to California, where she has been in focus on the TV scene ever since. Judy Lawton and Associates are beginning to snowball. And as elections draw nearer, the proof of Judy's pudding will become more inevitable. It will be interesting to note how many of Judy's so-called clients are elected to office.

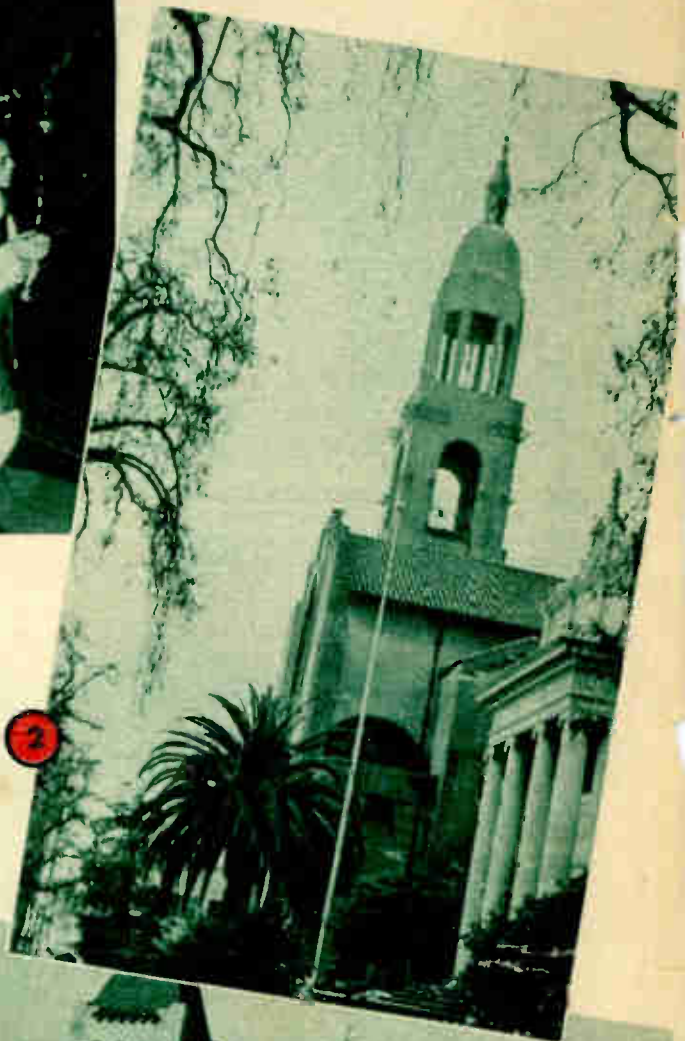
