You Don't See It But the Camera Does

WHEN YOU sit at home contentedly gazing at your TV screen, you see countless well-composed, dramatic shots of what appear to be perfectly calm and collected scenes, but they don't appear that way to the cameraman shuttling rapidly back and forth in the television studio. He sees a lot more than you do and everything he looks at seems to be only temporary, every set only half complete and every person a bit harried.

It has been said that Dagmar was noticed on television screens because some very alert cameraman who had an eye for a good shot when he saw one, put her on camera every chance he got. If this is true, then it's those silent, soft-shoed camera boys who may actually start many a video star on her way to stardom.

What Does It Take?

Just what does it take to be a TV cameraman? We asked Cam Pierce, head of engineering at KECA-TV. First thing he did was tell us that cameramen are classified as engineers and that with few exceptions they all have had professional photographic experience before they set foot in a TV studio.

Every young fellow who focuses a camera on those intriguing pictures which entertain you at home must

have, according to Pierce, "a good sense of picture composition, good physical and mental coordination, an excellent memory and a fine sense of showmanship." Cameramen must be able to anticipate the TV director's instructions before he gives them. Some directors have readily admitted that "a cameraman makes the director."

Television demands that these lensmen govern a camera weighing about 500 or 600 pounds, compose the picture, focus it, tilt the camera and change camera heights. Each man knows that he has to take the shot "the first time and right now." With all these problems the cameraman behind the video equipment loves his work. One operator who covered the Kefauver investigations was so interested in his assignment that he wouldn't let his "relief" take over for him.

Jimmy Morris

Jimmy Morris, one of the outstanding cameramen at KECA-TV, likes his job mainly "because I'm exposed to many different types of people, and I see bits of dialogue, scenery and action grow into a show." Jimmy is the sort of fellow who claims, "I

don't go on the set with the attitude of just coming on. I try to think, what can I contribute to the show? What can I give the director?"

Shooting television action is very tiring to anyone and Jimmy said that it often takes him two hours to relax after a difficult show. How does he do it? "I listen to good music for a couple of hours until I'm un-wound."

What does he see that you set-considerers never get to see? "I see all the last-minute scurrying around looking for that bottle of beer, which the viewer only sees as it is calmly being poured into the glass for a commercial. Sometimes I see a guy get up and walk away just after getting a knife in his back."

Other Cameramen

Another KECA-TV cameraman is Dick Loeb, who was a professional "still" photographer before going into TV. Dick is a married man who proudly boasts of becoming a recent father of twins, but who doesn't care for the hours demanded of a TV cameraman. He said, "It's not too good for the family, but they have come to accept them." He has ambitions to try television from the business rather than the production angle, because of more stable hours and greater security.

more than my own. I'd rather listen than do them. I travel around so much that I often spend the entire day taping shows here and in New York. I imagine now they will have to be prepared for transcribing 'Silent Men' shows overseas."

Overseas broadcasts of the NBC adventure series starring Fairbanks are in the offing, as the suave actor is on his way to Ceylon and India, where his own company will produce the movie "Elephant Walk," which stars Fairbanks.

How about TV for this appealing performer who is thoroughly experienced in working before the cameras?

"At present I have no ambitions to do 'live' TV. My ambition is to lie in the sun and hear someone nearby strumming a guitar." However, he will appear in one filmed video series and supervise production of other TV celluloids. NBC-TV has just signed the famed actor for three dramatic series on film, "International Theatre," "Foreign Legion" and "Silent Men."

His Family

Fairbanks is married to Mary Lee Epling and has three daughters, Daphne, eleven, Victoria, eight, and Melissa, three.

How about his daughters . . . do they show signs of following the Fairbanks tradition of becoming movieland greats?

"No, I doubt it," said their father. "Last year they wanted to become nurses. The year before it was firemen, and this year they want to be ballerinas. They sent me out after an autograph from Moira Shearer."

His Opinions

Since "Silent Men" is closely related to the type of government work which Fairbanks comes in contact with, we wondered if he took a personal interest in the scripts.

Being modest on this subject, he said, "I'd like to put a feather in my cap and say I have a lot to do with the scripting of the show, but I don't. Warren Lewis, the NBC director, is the one who digs out most of the documentary material and puts it together."

He considers himself a "neophyte" in radio acting and said, "I seldom try to swing my weight around. I just do my job the best I can. I have the highest regard for all radio performers."

What did Mr. Fairbanks think of the future of TV and the movie industry?

"Anybody's guess is as good as mine," he said. "I think movies, with more money and fewer limitations, will have the edge on TV for good dramatic film fare. But as the saying goes, there'll be some changes made in both industries."

Will Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., Be Doing "Live" TV?

IS DOUGLAS FAIRBANKS, JR., in real life the same handsome, swashbuckling charmer as he appears in his famous movie roles? Yes, even when one meets him in the unromantic surroundings of his strictly business office. Somehow as you walk up the carpeted stairs, lined with never-to-be-forgotten film stills of his most dashing movie roles, you can not help but feel that this is one son of a famous father who is happily and successfully riding the same magic carpet his father first set foot on years ago when our mothers and grandmothers were sighing at the celluloid flickers.

Today Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., is busy with NBC-Radio's "Silent Men," as well as producing his own motion pictures under the banner of his Dougfair Corporation, traveling around the world on missions for the U. S. State Department and starring in his own movie features. "Silent Men" is especially tailored for Fairbanks as it relates in dramatic-documentary form the heroic deeds of the unsung heroes among the ranks of

Martin and Lewis Dish It Out— He Takes It

EIGHT TUXEDOS in four years—ruined! Fifty \$20 shirts (in same length of time) demolished to wisps. By Martin and Lewis.

Not *their* shirts, my no! Nor *their* eight tuxedos. Though after watching the crazy pair, it would be no surprise to discover them "hard on their clothes."

The apparel belonged to their orchestra leader, Dick Stabile, who is not only an excellent saxophone soloist and conductor-composer, but is now an integral part of the Martin and Lewis act. Dick, who has just signed with the boys for seven more years (for all Martin and Lewis music—records, TV, radio, benefits, night clubs, movies), says Dean and Jerry get furious with him when he calls them "boss." "You work with us—we work with you," they always retort.

Stabile only last year was doing a solo on the Paramount stage in New York when Dean and Jerry swooped down on him. Jerry pulled at him from one side and Dean from the other. They tried to land the orchestra leader on the floor, but Stabile, who used to box and lift weights and who still keeps trim, wouldn't go down. All the hauling and pulling tore his suit. Not content with this, Martin and Lewis ripped off Dick's shirt and finally had him down to his shorts. They happened to be red and a loud plaid, and the audience loved the whole fracas. "People," claimed Dick, "stayed on for four or five shows just to see a repeat of this bit (which didn't happen)."

"The boys always make sure I have a dressing room next to theirs," Stabile continued. "I come off stage to find my sleeves sewed up, the cuffs of my trousers sewed up, my shoes knotted and hanging from the light fixtures. This usually happens when I've got to make a quick change. Sometimes I've had to go back on stage in my dressing gown. But if Dean and Jerry didn't beat

me, push me and scream at me I'd think they were mad at me."

The paths of the three crossed before they started working together four years ago. Stabile, who had his own band and has been in the business for fifteen years, knew Martin as a singer in the Middle West. After Martin, Lewis and Stabile had really met, Jerry Lewis told the orchestra leader that he, Lewis, when working as an usher at Loew's State in New York, had often hung around to admire the Stabile music. The three now work so hand-in-glove that recently when Dick was recording his famous "The Man I Love" for Capitol he found himself unable to play without the usual commotion around him. It was a psychological thing—standing in the recording studio and trying, unmolested, to tootle his sax with no accustomed Martin and Lewis hauling, kicking, heckling and ripping.

Turning to Jerry, Dick asked to be roughed up. "Jerry started kicking me and the recording turned out fine," Stabile beamed.

"I've never known, in four years, what to expect of the boys," Stabile continued. "We may go on and all I know is that Dean will do his opening number, I will introduce Jerry and Jerry will bring on Dean. From then on it's in God we trust. Dean is the greatest straight man in the business and Jerry is the greatest comedian."

Stabile calls Martin "Mr. Cool" because he never gets ruffled. "He's a powerful man," Dick commented in referring to Martin and Lewis's ability to scuffle onstage. "Jerry's wiry."

Ready for any turn the comedians' antics may take, Stabile also has to keep his musicians on the alert. Spotters among the players give signals to other musicians after Stabile throws a quick cue. It requires split-second timing to produce this teamwork. "I've even made an arrangement while Martin and Lewis were

Harry, Hilo, and NaPua

Our cover trio this week are KTLA's Harry Owens Royal Hawaiians. With Harry are Hilo Hattie and NaPua.

Harry is devoted to the Islands, but is not a native by birth. He began his career as a trumpeter in Missoula, Montana, and from there traveled with orchestras in the West and took time out to study law at Loyola University. Owens is well known for his musical compositions, "Linger Awhile," "Sweet Leilani," "To You, Sweetheart, Aloha" and "Dancing Under the Stars." "Sweet Leilani," which means "little gift from the heavens," was written at the birth of his daughter. He loves to "live" in the Islands with his sons, Harry, Jr., and Timmy, and to search for native-folklore and music. Many years of his entertainment career were spent in Hawaii.

Ex-Schoolmarm

Hilo Hattie, who taught school for sixteen years in her native Honolulu and was then known as Clara Inter, doesn't want to change places with anyone. She said, "I'm perfectly happy with what I'm doing. To be happy and make other people happy, that makes me happy. It's just a give and take."

This former schoolmarm, who is featured each Friday over Channel 5 with Harry Owens Royal Hawaiians,

has been in show business for fifteen years and is not afraid to admit that she is fifty years old. At present most of her time is spent concentrating on television at KTLA, but she is scheduled to begin a four-week engagement at the Roosevelt Hotel in Los Angeles in the Hawaiian Room.

When she is away from the TV cameras, Hilo likes to "keep house" and "dig in the yard." She wears either her native dress, a "muumuu," or a pair of striped overalls when she is puttering around. Her husband, Carlyle, a musician, is never without a supply of Hilo's photographs to pass out to her fans. Two dogs, Kane (pronounced Connie), a cocker, and Reme, a Kerry blue terrier, complete Hilo's household.

Although the hula dance is basic to all of Hilo's acts, she admitted that she has never taken a hula lesson in her life. She enjoys putting on her comic routines as much as the viewers do watching her. Recently she stepped in front of the movie cameras for roles in "Ma and Pa Kettle Go to Waikiki" and "City Beneath the Sea."

Her ideal way of life would be to spend six months at her California home in Dark Canyon and six months

in her homeland, Hawaii. She does manage to get back to her native land at least once a year and has made twelve trips across the Pacific.

"Little Flower"

Our other cover girl, NaPua, is a popular Hawaiian singer, dancer and comedienne. NaPua, which means "Little Flower" in Hawaiian, appeared with Harry Owens almost fifteen years ago in Hawaii at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel. Since that time she has become a well-known night-club entertainer throughout the country and appeared most recently in Los Angeles at the Seven Seas. NaPua is married to Sam Koki, a guitarist with Harry Owens's KTLA show. They have two sons, one of whom recently served with the U. S. Army and is a male hula dancer. NaPua is a native Hawaiian and is about forty years old.

Harry Owens's KTLA show will take a summer vacation and return to Channel 5 in September with the same cast members. Our cover photo was taken by Bill Hall.

Here is this week's winning letter: Mr. B. J. Alexander, Box 4055, North Park Station, San Diego 4, Calif.

The hint is:

When a coil spring is used on a door or gate, it rubs, rasps and tears at the wood whenever the door or gate is opened. A much better way is to place a 3- or 4-inch strap hinge behind the spring to hold it away from the wood. Let's get right into the fillums.

"Paisan." This very good Italian picture was directed by the gifted **Roberto Rossellini**, who also collaborated on the screenplay, and is made up of five episodes limning various phases of the American soldier's activities in Italy. The fighting man, the young soldier in love, the Negro soldier, the chaplain, and the O.S.S. agent are the principals in this eventful film, and each is dealt with lucidly and realistically. The high point of the picture, I feel, is the last episode, in which the O.S.S. agent and a group of guerrillas fight a battle with the Germans on a marshy swampland. This sequence, done in a spare, poetic style, engenders the confusion, the loneliness and the desperation which is the true essence of war, and serves as an effective climax to a fine motion picture.

Most of Lundy Roark's platters come from among those favorite arrangements which you have never forgotten, but which were made a number of years ago. You are very likely to hear many of those recordings which you wish you had in your own collection.

This is a record offering that can easily become a habit with all those who switch on the radio to look for music and talk that helps them to forget or remember. It won't please the cynic, but it will certainly charm the romanticist.—A. G.

Radio is not taking a back seat to any other medium when it comes to timely coverage of the political campaigns this year. One of the most intelligent and vital air shows is "Crossfire," which follows through on its title by offering listeners plenty of questioning and counter-questioning.

Each week permanent panel members Elmer Davis, Bert Andrew and Martin Agronsky, all outstanding newsmen, put the visiting politician on the carpet. These reporters, who have a vast accumulation of knowledge at their beck and call, proceed to fire stimulating and intelligent questions at the guest. ABC's Gunnar Back, noted Washington correspondent since 1939, serves as program moderator. After the newsmen aim questions at the political bigwig, the party leader has a chance to ask the newspapermen a question or two.

Guy George Gabrielson, Chairman of the National Republican Committee, was a recent guest who proved that politics can be just the setting for clever verbal manipulating and boxing. At one point a "Crossfire" panelist asked Gabrielson if he had much to do with selecting the man who would make the keynote speech at the Republican Convention. Although Gabrielson admitted that he was chairman of the committee on arrangements which named the main speaker, he flatly denied that he would have any great say about the matter. Gabrielson did not put himself in a very good light when he evaded the issue under question, although the procedure did prove to be entertaining to the listener.

This program is also informative, as the newsmen, who obviously possess a high degree of patience, try to maneuver the politician into a position where his answers will reveal something significant to the listeners. Of course all politicians are veterans in this sort of verbal evasion.

It matters little for full enjoyment of this program which side of the political fence you may be on. Regardless of what he says, each party member reveals a little more of his own personality as he boxes with the journalists.—A. G.

Wrestling Is My Business

MY OPINION ON LEONE-THEsz MATCH

Like the walrus said, "The time has come"—time to open my mouth and put both size 13 feet in it by predicting the outcome of the Baron Leone-Lou Thesz match Wednesday night at Gilmore Field.

It will be the battle of all times. Hardly ever have two wrestlers clashed for the championship with such different builds and styles.

Baron Leone, short, barrel-chested, big-lunged, strong, fighting heart, powerful legs and arms, and stamina—with a style we used to call "main strength and awkwardness" when we wrestled back of the barn in Oklahoma.

Lou Thesz, tall, slender, built like a racehorse, fast as lightning, normally weighing 235 pounds but training down to 224, with a smaller chest and neck than Leone.

Here is my prediction as to the undisputed world's heavyweight championship match. I think if the match goes the full two hours, Lou will win on a decision by the judges and referee. If the match is decided by falls, I believe Leone will win. Since one man has to win, I pick Leone to be the victor.

This is the reason. I do not think Lou can last for two hours against the Baron, traveling at the speed he must travel to keep on the offense. He has speed to burn but has never been extended over long courses. One hour has always been the time limit in the East with a ninety-minute match the absolute maximum. Also, in a ninety-minute match, they have ten-minute intermissions. If two falls are scored, the event lasts only seventy minutes. Here on the West Coast we have three-minute rest periods between falls, which does not allow much time for recuperation.

Another factor against Lou is his neck. I have told you time and again

that the neck is the most important part of a wrestler's body. I doubt if Lou's small neck can withstand the Baron's neck-cracker. In watching Lou's training the other day, I noticed he did not stress any neck exercises.

Lou is the type of long, rangy wrestler who is always giving an opponent an elbow or knee in a mix-up. An opponent has to watch out for these as either can open an eye—which might put him out of order.

Thesz has a large following in the wrestling fraternity who feel he will win. Most of them are men he has wrestled, but in practically every case they are fellows who were not in condition, and Lou wore them out trying to keep up with his speed. Those who could match his speed were always smaller men who had to give away forty or fifty pounds in weight.

Typical of these is LeRoy McGuirk, one of the greatest of the light-heavyweight and junior-heavyweight champions.

LeRoy said, "Thesz is a really great wrestler and his speed, strength, and stamina would have made him a great figure in any other line of sports. He is the greatest athlete to come along in two decades. Gaining even one fall on him is a moral victory for any opponent."

Baron Leone's opponents feel differently about him. He has not outmaneuvered any one of them. All of them feel they could match his speed, all felt at one time or other they had the Baron trapped—but invariably something went wrong. None of them analyze what happened. They threw everything they had at Leone, and he withstood their best and came plowing back for more. In other words, Leone has the stamina to take it and the power and knowledge to break their best holds. A dazzling display of speed will not worry the Baron.

Leone has engaged a man to train and condition him for the big match—a man who has seen more hard training campaigns than any other wrestler—Hugh Nichols, the greatest of the light heavies.

After the Baron's workout today, Nichols said, "Baron Leone has been in training with me for five weeks. Never have I seen a wrestler in greater condition. He is able to go three hours without a breather, giving his full strength and speed at all times. At the end of two hours, he was only getting

Marc Breslow, KNBH video director, classifies TV shutter men into different types. He says, "There's the kind that moves fast and gets the pix you want, but may lack sensitivity; then there's the guy that can anticipate your shots and frame them perfectly, and there's the fellow who will stick with the actor and get what you want even if you yourself can't see it."

Another KNBH cameraman, George Meyer, likes his profession because he has a chance to combine the "mechanical and the artistic . . . and I'm part of the show going out."

One KNBH cameraman, Bob Daly, admits that he or his fellow workers could be instrumental in drawing attention to any TV unknown. He said, "Of course the directors in the booth decide what goes out, but we are always moving around sending shots up to them. Maybe we could discover another Dagmar. I hope so."

doing the chorus." Stabile claimed, Stabile's twenty men, however, are envied by other musicians. The latter often come to Stabile and say "It's so dull where I am. I'd like to come with you." Others (often getting \$500 or \$600 a week) have offered to do a Martin and Lewis show with Stabile's orchestra for—nothing but the fun of it.

Not on TV, but often in night clubs, Martin and Lewis will grab the full plates of half a dozen paying customers and give them to the band. They have taken drinks right out of paying customers' fists and handed them to the musicians. The musicians have gotten a bang out of the deal and the customers have come back the next night for more.

The greatest highlight in my wrestling career was being chosen to announce this championship match by Promoter Cal Eaton. It is a real honor and pleasure to be a part of one of the greatest matches in wrestling history.

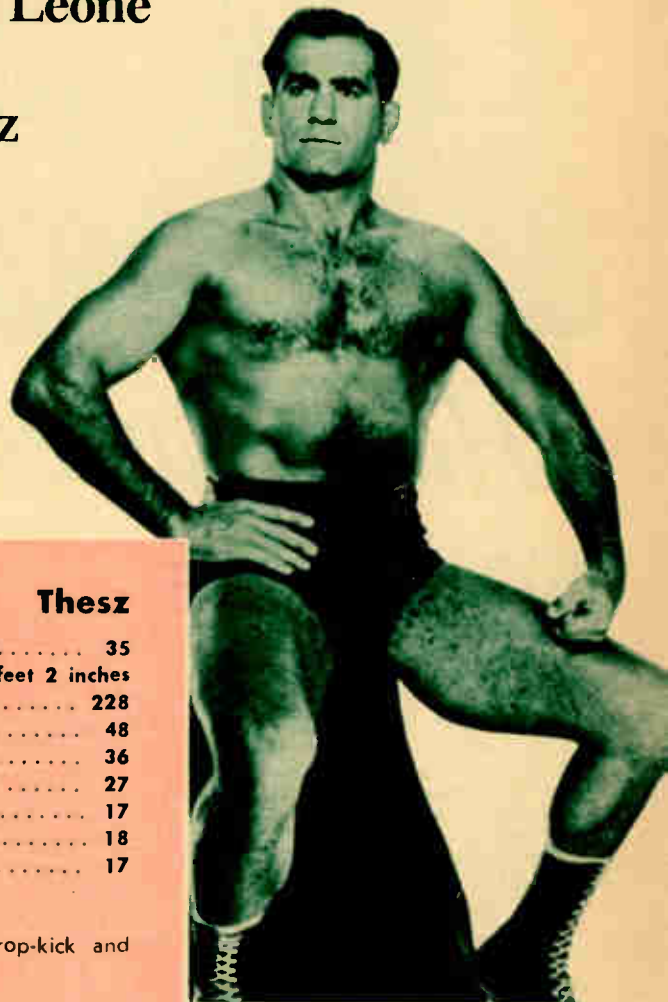

Remember the theater dates the James band played? The dates that brought wild, hysterical traffic jams and great crowds of adoring teenagers whooping up the aisles? Most people do recall this, but not how it ended—nor why.

No More Theater Dates

James simply walked off the stage one night and up to his room above the theater stage. The manager, in a frenzy, rushed behind him, shouting that he couldn't quit his theater date. "I have, just now," was James's calm retort. When both threats and pleas failed to stir the resting figure of the famous trumpet-playing band leader, the manager had what he considered an inspirational thought. He put it into effect next day, when

Harry James Remembers When

ONE NIGHT as the Benny Goodman band members scrambled from their chairs to "take five," the popular maestro stopped a lanky, thin-faced young man.

"We need a good trumpet number in the book, Harry," spoke Goodman. "Why don't you work one up?"

And Harry James, young member of the famous aggregation fronted by the bespectacled virtuoso of the clarinet, wandered out to have a smoke and think of appropriate tunes to feature on his golden horn.

He Establishes His Theme

Days later, sitting in his hotel room with another member of the band, Harry was idly fingering the valves and improvising. From outside came the strains of a record playing the Italian folk song "Ciribiribin." Harry picked it up.

"Say!" exclaimed the enraptured roomie, "that sounds swell on a horn!" Harry spent the next several hours working on it. The tune, of course, is James's famous theme song.

The name of the popular trumpet man has been so firmly imbedded in the minds of pop-music lovers that it is natural to think of James as a show personality who has been around for years and years. That is scarcely so.

During a recent rehearsal for his

Sunday night KNBH show, Harry recalled his early band days.

It was only fifteen years ago that the attention of the avid Goodman jazz followers became riveted on the "Ciribiribin" player, and less than a dozen years ago that James blossomed into full-blown popularity for his own band. And still plenty of people will argue that they remember dancing to the James band twenty years ago in Milwaukee or Philadelphia or Passaic!

Circus Days

As a matter of fact, twenty years ago James had probably just learned to play the trumpet. Harry was born and raised in the mighty Haag circus, his father having been bandmaster and his mother an aerial performer. At the age of eight little Harry was playing drums in the street parade. When he was twelve he learned to play the trumpet, and his father, as a reward, made him master of the number-two band.

What few people know about James is that before he was old enough to play instruments, he was billed as the world's youngest contortionist,

he showed up at Harry's hotel suite with a psychiatrist in tow.

Questions and answers brought to light the not-too-outlandish knowledge that Harry James was simply sick and tired of playing to theater crowds, who, in lieu of dancing, acted like idiots in the aisles. Rather than antagonize the public by making a fuss about this conduct, James decided to merely remove himself from the sight of it. Ballroom dates he still enjoyed. But a theater date, never again.

This sort of rational thinking was heartily endorsed by the medical man, who applauded Harry's courage and left the hotel room. And to this day James has stuck to ballroom stands and one-nighters, record cuttings (over 250 Capitol platters carry the James band), and now a TV show and radio broadcast.

The best endorsement of James's immortality as a band leader and trumpet player lies in the fact that at no time during his happy marriage to Betty Grable has he been identified as Mr. Grable. But she has been known as Mrs. James!

100 Hands Make One "Appearance"

PICTURE YOURSELF standing in the shadows of a television set that appears to be an incomplete stage setting, where you constantly hear crisp instructions like "Hold it, wait for the cue, turn toward the mike, hold it, now once again from the beginning," coming over a loud speaker near the ceiling. You'd be looking at the rehearsal for KECA's "Personal Appearance Theater."

You might not know it, but you would be witnessing the operation of the only "live" purely dramatic television production originating from Hollywood. There are close to 100 people working to put that show on your television set every Tuesday night. You would be surrounded by ladders, cables, rubber-wheeled cameras, and a teleparency screen, and see dozens of men in business suits and work clothes hurriedly running from side to side of the stage.

After you heard the welcome order "We're breaking now," you might have a chance to chat with either Dik Darley or Bob Finkel, directors of KECA's "Personal Appearance Theater."

Director Dik Darley

Dik would look the way a serious young director is supposed to look. He would readily admit "I love doing this show, because it's an opening night every time I do it." You would notice his deep respect for television production when he explained that it takes a large cast of actors, three or more cameramen, a floor manager, two or more boom operators, sound-effects men, technical director, light-

ing men, make-up, wardrobe, set designers and writers, to mention only a few, and that each performance is a challenge to him "to bring all of these elements together."

He will tell you, too, that "economy of doing something quickly in this business is important, because time means money in TV. It takes snap judgment, for there is no time to mull an idea when the show is going on."

If you ask Dik point-blank what he thinks of directing "Personal Appearance Theater," he will tell you, "This show is a privilege, not a problem to do."

Bob Finkel, Director

If you were to talk to Bob Finkel at "the break," chances are you wouldn't have to wait for him to come down from the director's booth as you would Dik Darley. Bob works from the stage because he likes the cast to feel that the director "is right there."

Bob, who appears less serious than Dik, would not hesitate to tell you the greatest difference between "live" TV dramatic fare and that put on film. His idea is that "the very essence of the unexpected is always present in 'live' television. It comes from being in a frame of mind, of knowing that this must be it."

He would be overjoyed to tell you: "I like doing 'Personal Appearance Theater' because it's like a completely new operation each week, with new script, new cast and new effects." He would also be generous in his praise of the other ninety-nine people besides himself who put on each weekly telecast. About the difference between directing "live" television or films, he might tell you, "I would be bored to tears if I went back to directing film."

And if you wonder if those directors become millionaires in their business, the answer is "no." But they still keep doing it, because as Dik Darley would tell you, "It's a privilege to create something artistically fine and give birth each week to a whole new drama. That's the reason a director will work for nothing or everything on a show like this."

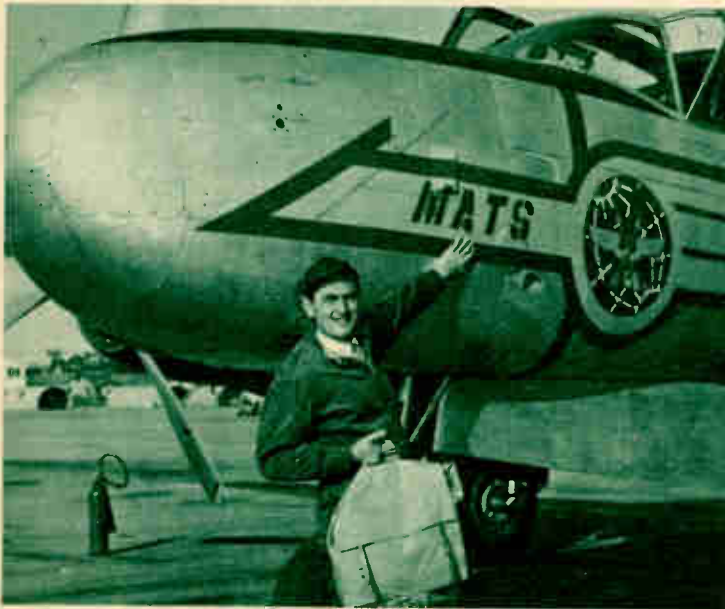

Does the Early Bird Catch the Worm?

Ralph Story, Ex-Fighter Pilot, Fights Alarm Clocks Each Dawn

THERE'S ONE man we know who's well qualified to answer that question: he's KNX's Ralph Story, who utters his first "good morning" at 5:25 a.m. over a cold, impersonal microphone. Although Ralph is in the know, he declined to comment on the early bird, so we guess it's up to us to ask the bird or perhaps the worm itself.

Encountering our Morning Host, we learned some interesting facts about him as well as about early risers. Since February 1949, lanky, broad-shouldered Ralph has been broadcasting humorous bits of chit-chat and news of Los Angeles and spinning records over KNX. This is one show which disregards current top-ten tunes. Ralph feels that jump and jive at five would send the "heppiest" individual running for an early-morning bromide.

Smooth Music

Therefore, soothing, palatable discs are played; Ralph selects the records that irritate the fewest. Another almost unique characteristic of the Ralph Story Show is the absence of guests. As Ralph puts it, "I promise not to import strangers into your homes during the wee hours of the morning. After all, unshaven faces and pin-curl hair aren't very inviting."

Story's pleasant, well-modulated

voice reaches many Angelenos as they drive to work each morning. You may be surprised to know that statistics prove the flow of traffic reaches its peak at 7:11 a.m. and not at that particular time of morning when you are jostling with other motorists.

European Junket

Through an unpremeditated chain of circumstances, Ralph found himself on a six-week junket through Europe last fall. In cooperation with the Military Air Transport Service and his sponsor, Bank of America, he visited approximately twenty cities in eleven countries, recording the unusual and interesting as he traveled. "I was a one-man reporter, engineer, red cap, public relations and production man. It made me feel somewhat like Jonathan Swift's famed Gulliver."

"These recordings," explained Ralph, "have all been aired, intermittently, on the 'Top of the Morning' portion of my program. They were not newsworthy in the strictest sense of the word, but primarily covered subjects which would interest tourists. The French couturier was always a mystery to me until

I interviewed Christian Dior.

"Dior employs a tremendous staff, including 2000 seamstresses who hand-stitch every one of his gowns. I learned that one does not shop at Dior's in the conventional manner. Each afternoon at three, mannequins fashion his creations to a select clientele. The patrons make their selections, which are then custom-made by Dior's staff. All this was new to me, a mere man," Ralph confessed. "but undoubtedly your women readers know all about this sort of thing."

Advice for Tourists

KNX's Morning Host had a bit of advice for tourists contemplating travel in Europe. "Remember you are not going to find American standards abroad. Telephone facilities, laundry service, and unlimited quantities of foodstuffs, as we know them, are nil in Europe. If you're interested in being an unofficial good-will ambassador," Ralph continued, "don't flamboyantly try to buy your way through Europe. Many Continentals maintain certain ethical standards which exclude monetary priorities."

At the time of our interview negotiations were under way for Ralph to complete the Pacific leg of his global circle. If the plans materialize, he will be escorted by the U. S. Navy, but this time he hopes to have a traveling associate to share his adventures and that inevitable early rising.

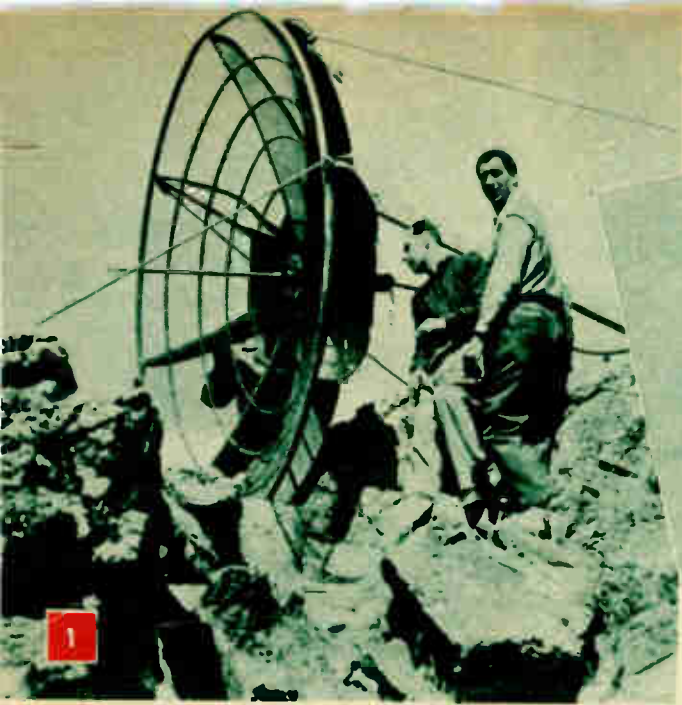
