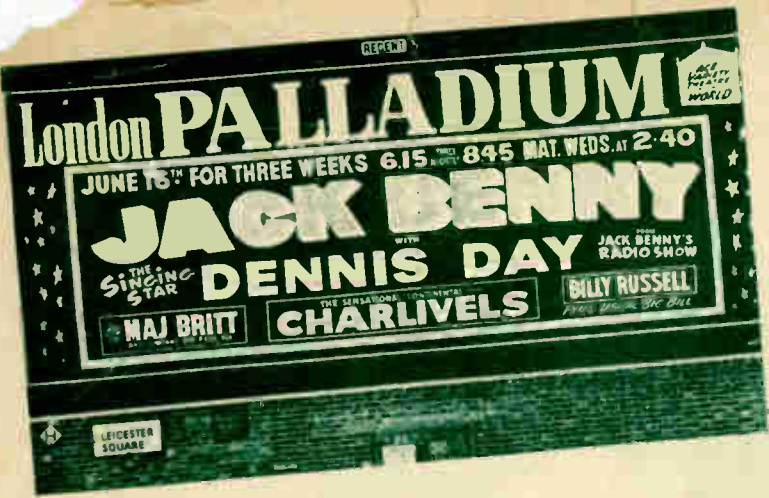

# God Is His Sponsor

**S**OME RUDE wisecracks have irreverently spoken of him as "Uncle Fultie." In this fashion, not unkindly, they refer thus to His Excellency the Most Reverend Fulton J. Sheen, Ph.D., D.D., Agrège en Philosophie de l'Université de Louvain, Bishop of New York, and national director of the World Mission Society for the Propagation of the Faith. The reference is simply a tradesman comparison to the success of a loud and funny comic who piled up ratings that made him top dog on TV for a long time. Bishop Fulton Sheen, speaking to man of his relationship with God, debuted on television (after twenty successful years of radio) opposite "Uncle Miltie" Berle and Frank Sinatra and promptly caused innumerable dials nationwide to flick to the DuMont outlet in various cities.

## Educator - Lecturer - Writer

The stunning personality in the Bishop's robes can weekly wax philosophical without being boring because he is a stunning personality with a fertile, active mind and a tireless body.

He has written thirty-eight books. He turns out columns, treatises, papers and innumerable radio broadcasts. But his television show is a marvel of ad lib. Only key words and a ten-minute pre-show meditative period guide Bishop Sheen through the twenty-eight minutes of aired thought and wisdom. Magically, the

popular missionary knows almost to the second when his speech should end. He has never been more than two seconds long or short in estimating his own air time, an unheard-of feat among other long-trained stage people.

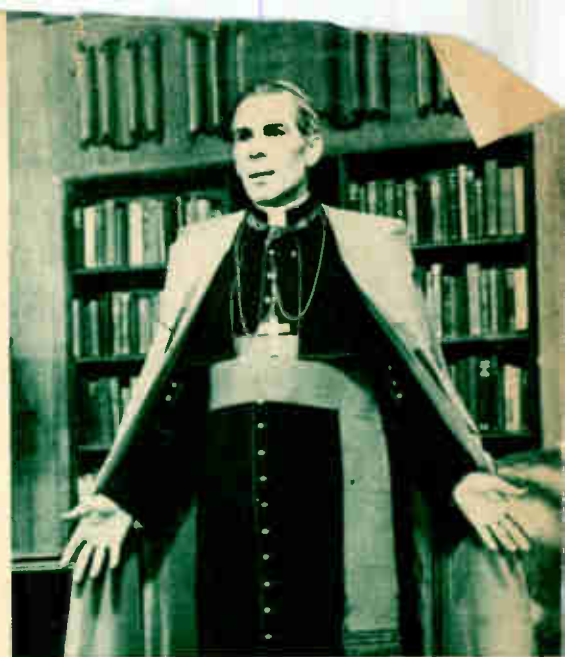
## His Sponsors

The Peter John Sheen of El Paso, Illinois, who made good in such citadels of Catholicism as New York and Rome took the name Fulton from his grandfather Fulton (dropping the Peter), who started today's favorite Bishop on the road to spiritual leadership by registering the boy at Spaulding Institute in Peoria. The man who today has been heard on TV to whimsically refer to God as "his sponsor" won the highest honors, scholastically, ever given at any place he studied.

Yet this same honored scholar with the high Hooper rating has a side to his life most of us would consider bleak.

He is a six-o'clock-in-the-morning riser who prays for an hour before moving on to serve for the Mass conducted each day by Monsignor Charles McBride. Then Monsignor McBride serves the Mass which Bishop Fulton Sheen celebrates.

A breakfast of hot water, orange juice, and dry toast is usual, then an hour's writing for the multitudinous columns and books mentioned above, and for the thousands of notes to people. The rest of his time is spent

in converting, educating, lecturing, religious counseling and conducting services. He has a regular office and a secretary.

He keeps in shape by eating sparingly and by playing tennis. The Bishop is fifty-seven years old. Yet probably no one watching the thirty-three TV stations (which grew out of three DuMont started with) on which Bishop Fulton J. Sheen appears ever thinks "I wonder how old he is . . ." or "I wonder if he's tired," no matter how familiar that viewer may be with his busy life.

## Humor With Godliness

The audience that is falling away from his competition is too busy listening to Bishop Sheen discussing life in general and happiness in living.

To lighten his discourses he tells funny stories, relates amusing incidents from his career, and illustrates his talks with what he terms "attempts" at blackboard drawing. One horse, drawn last spring, was so good he almost didn't have to identify it.

# The Myth of the Pacific

## ... Becomes Reality on Radio

WEBLY EDWARDS'S first reaction to a musical broadcast from Hawaii was not a favorable one. It happened one afternoon in 1934 at KFRC in San Francisco. Web was sitting around the studio listening to a short-wave program from the Pacific island.

"That's terrible stuff," Web groaned.

"Could you do better?" his boss asked.

"I sure could try," Web replied. And that he did.

In July, 1935, Edwards directed, produced, and narrated the first show of "Hawaii Calls." With the exception of a few weeks around the time Pearl Harbor was bombed, he has been at it every week for the past eighteen years.

During a recent visit here, Web explained some of the idiosyncrasies of this unique Mutual-KHJ production.

"This is not the greatest show on radio," Web explained, "but it is the only one which features Hawaiian music, by Hawaiians, from Hawaii."

For an entire week the finest musicians and vocalists from over all the Hawaiian Islands rehearse for the program. The group, usually with a nucleus of sixteen, is led by Al Kealoha Perry.

### No Written Music

On Saturday afternoon they perform before an average crowd of 2,000 people "from under the banyan trees, right on the shores of Waikiki."

From over 3,000 native songs, ten are played each week — three with English lyrics, three pure Hawaiian, and four current or novelty numbers.

There is no brass section in the organization. All the music is provided by steel guitars, regular guitars, ukuleles, Paho drums, and Hawaiian gourds. There is not one single note of music written for the entire broadcast.

Harry Owens, Hilo Hattie, Haleloke (Godfrey's gal), Alfred Apaka, and Ray Kinney are just a few who were given their first big break on Edwards's show.

# One of TV's Best Won't Bring You...

*Chloroform, Hollywood Sex, or Misdeeds Among the Medical World. A Matter of Percentage, Not Lack of Daring, Keeps Them Off "Dragnet"*

**I** DON'T say there shouldn't be a TV-radio code, but I do say that you can present anything but prostitution in an adult, inoffensive fashion."

Speaker Jack Webb, as producer, writer, narrator and lead of the NBC-TV "Dragnet" series which has aroused such a favorable furor, has presented everything else that appears in a preponderance on the leaves of the Los Angeles Police files. In a most adult fashion that does not offend.

## They Don't Rate Showing

Yet there are certain crimes you will never see on even this frank documentary based on actual fact, in which "Police Sergeant Friday" and helper "Ben Romero" pursue solutions so satisfactorily.

You may see a religious fanatic brought to justice, but you will never see the "Hollywood set" as such pictured as busy with some of the crimes that the newspapers play up. You will never see a doctor or a nurse pictured as a sly administrator of poison or a wielder of the knife. Nor an Oriental, and probably not a Negro, pictured as a culprit.

And why not? You've read about them, some time or another. But crimes by these types are kept from "Dragnet's" engrossing chapters through the fact that they don't occur often enough. Their percentage on the police blotter is just too low.

As Webb explains it, "For Dragnet's scripts we follow the police files, basing each story on an actual case. In any metropolitan area, the police department deals preponderantly with robbers and thieves, vagrants and drunks, and the murders contingent upon the activities of these. To choose isolated cases that occur once in a thousand would not be presenting an actual account of police work here in Los Angeles.

"Narcotics pushers among teenagers have become a problem frequent enough for 'Dragnet' to devote one out of fifty-two shows to. So we did. But the small percentage of Orientals or any other minority race group who commit crimes would make it ridiculous for us to present them as such in even one out of the yearly fifty-two shows. So we don't."

## Professionals in Minority

"And one out of how many thousands and thousands of doctors goes off his rocker and commits a crime? The percentage just isn't with 'em," grinned Jack. "So we don't use them."

After observing the first rule of percentages for authenticity's sake, good taste sometimes rules out what seems a common enough misdeed. The lewd-picture racket, for instance, is left alone. Not only could the lewd pictures themselves never be shown on TV, but the connotation might be offensive to many viewers.

In one script, the reference to a witness as "a big, dumb Swede" was deleted. This went because actually it served no purpose, and any size-

able viewer of Swedish ancestry could have done a burn.

Chloroform will never be seen as an instrument of death on "Dragnet." This is a standard radio-TV rule, enforced by the continuity department. Everyone knows chloroform in large doses is lethal, but the entertainment medium has no desire to plant either the idea of its use nor the method in the possibly unbalanced mind of a single viewer.

## The Plot

The actual crime, whether it be murder, arson, kidnaping, robbery or pushing dope, is never seen on the popular documentary for quite another reason. The show has the viewer with Officers "Friday" and "Romero" from beginning to end. If the viewer could see the crime in the works, that would mean the officers, too, would be on the scene. And criminals are never at their nasty best with two stalwarts of the law standing by.

Abortion rings and single practicing abortionists have been mentioned graphically in the public newspaper. And they have been listed on the police files. But how to picture them on TV? You have to show either the victim or perpetrator. Hence not feasible for video film.

"Best proof of the fact that we haven't dealt in sensationalism, preached prejudice or brought anything offensive into the home is the fact that only one out of every thousand letters we get, by actual count, has any complaint about anything."

Jack's own complaint deals with

## Why Ina Ray Hutton Disappeared Between Her TV Shows to Pursue a Hermit-Like Existence

Ina Ray's reclusiveness has at last been explained. At last, KTLA's dynamic blonde bombshell explains why she surrounded herself with an aura of silence and sought seclusion when off camera.

"Only a few of my friends knew, and most of my fans did not know, that three years ago Randy Brooks and I were married," explains Ina. "Shortly after our marriage a terrible event happened. Randy was stricken with an attack of cerebral hemorrhage. He became a complete invalid, losing his eyesight and power of speech. His entire left side also became paralyzed. Doctors would make no predictions as to whether he would recover, and if so, what permanent effects would remain," whispered Ina as she recalled the nightmare.

Certainly fate dealt Randy Brooks, the noted trumpet player and orchestra leader, a cruel blow. However, the newlyweds found solace in each other. Randy received the best hospital and medical care available. But more

important than medicine, he received the love, inspiration and constant attention of his wife.

Ina cut herself off completely from the world, except for Tuesdays, when she would dash off to rehearsals and do her show, then rush immediately back to Randy's bedside.

### Recovery

Randy's recovery was slow and tortuous. It was three months before he regained his eyesight. It was nearly a year before he was able to speak so he could be understood. It took two years before he could walk alone.

During all that time Ina was with Randy night and day. She taught him to walk all over again. She went swimming with him two or three times a day in their pool, encouraging him to strengthen his muscles.

Now, as though by a miracle, Randy has recovered and his doctors have given him the green light to resume his career. Throughout their ordeal, Randy and Ina have never forgotten to laugh. His sense of humor was as much of a morale builder for Ina as was her devoted care to him.

### Farmerette

Ina developed unusual interests while caring for Randy at their secluded Northridge home. The girl who has been waving a baton since her early teens has become a farmerette.

Ina is raising eight head of cattle on her estate. She plans to fatten them for market, but wants to keep enough of them for breeding purposes. Obviously this isn't a passing fancy with her, if she wants to keep her stock propagated.

Ina is somewhat like "Old MacDonald," because on her farm she also has some chicks. Ina can deliver a discourse on the care and raising of Plymouth hens along with the rest of the experts.

"If anyone had told me years ago that I would become a farmerette," laughed Ina, "I wouldn't have hesitated in the least to tell them they were off their rocker," she said. "But now that Randy's better I intend to continue pursuing my barnyard interests, even though our need for staying close to home has diminished," said Ina convincingly.

It was the song "Tenderly" which brought Ina Ray and Randy together. When Ina first heard Randy's recording of the tune in 1942 she "flipped," as the musicians say. His trumpet solo sent her then and from all appearances the devoted couple are on a perpetual honeymoon.

# PICK of the PIX

Fall is upon us, or is tottering, at any rate, and that means the new shows are returning to TV. As far as movies are concerned, however, the new shows and the old shows, la meme chose (which means, in French, the same thing, or so I was assured by the bartender at the Cafe de Paris). You can see first-run films on television, but you'll have to buy a home in Palm Springs, install a set with a coin slot, and wait for the Telemeter test to be conducted in February. If you lack the scratch for a project like that, I hope you enjoy the admirable Bernard Shaw films commented on below.

"Pygmalion" is the screen version of George Bernard Shaw's most popular and certainly most commercially successful play. A noted phonetics expert, Leslie Howard, undertakes on a bet to make a "lady" of a cockney girl. Wendy Hiller, by teaching her the speech and social graces of the British upper class. After a thorough and hilarious period of coaching, he wins his wager when his creation manages to flummox all the guests at a grand ball given by royalty. The professor then discovers that he is in love with the beautiful and gracious woman he has fashioned. An excellent picture with truly wonderful performances by Howard, Miss Hiller and Wilfrid Lawson. Notable scene among many: The girl, halfway through her training, tests her new-found knowledge at a small tea party and enthalls the guests with her small talk, which consists of a practice sentence for diction "The rain in Spain falls mainly in the plains," and a grisly account of how her aunt fell prey to the evils of gin.

"Major Barbara." Another Shaw play made into a picture and starring again Wendy Hiller, this time with Rex Harrison, Robert Newton, Robert Morley, Deborah Kerr and Emyln Williams. Miss Hiller plays a Salvation Army major determined to make up through religious work for the damage she considers has been done by her father, a munitions maker. The film is fat with typical Shavian colloquies, quite a few of them clever, some of them profound, and all of them entertaining. Fine performances are given by all the aforementioned.

"Young and Willing." This is a comedy about a group of stage-struck young people who live in the same apartment and devote their energies to attracting the attention of the producer who lives downstairs. The old gags come off pretty well in the hands of William Holden, Susan Hayward, Eddie Bracken and the late, very much lamented Robert Benchley.

"Getting Gertie's Garter." This one finds Dennis O'Keefe engaged in the happy pursuit that has existed ever since Gertie began wearing stockings.

It was a bright and sunny afternoon, and Florence Chadwick was just about to leave our office. "Are you afraid, Miss Chadwick? Don't you dread the hour when you have to walk alone down to the beach and into the water, and start that grueling twenty-mile swim?" I asked.

"Oh no, not at all," she smiled. A warm, pleasant smile, which comes as naturally to her as swimming. "Honestly, I'm looking forward to it. I can hardly wait until I get in that water and am on my way."

Yes, this native Californian has a lovely smile. But it was in her eyes, her clear, sharply focused eyes, that you could tell immediately that this woman meant wholeheartedly what she said.

Why, but why, should a mature, pleasant woman such as Florence Chadwick go around risking her neck conquering channels? She doesn't do it for money; her mother operates one of the most successful restaurants in San Diego, and Flo can take over any time she desires. She doesn't do it for fame; her two successful English Channel swims were enough to assure her of worldwide prominence for the rest of her life.

Flo just loves to swim. She's been doing it since the age of six, and she says it's even easier than walking.

#### Flo's Background

Thousands of words have been written about Florence Chadwick and her channel swims, but few publications have devoted space to the simple facts of her life. Here they are:

She was born November 9, 1919, in San Diego. Her father, who passed away a year ago, trained her ever since she was a child to be a great swimmer.

She has one older brother, Richard, Jr., who was with her all the time when she made her second attempt to swim the Catalina Channel.

At the time of our interview, Flo thought her mother, Mary, might also be along, but it had not been definitely decided yet. The mental strain of seeing her own daughter fighting time and the sea for more than sixteen hours is a tremendous ordeal for any mother to go through.

After graduating from Point Loma High School, Flo enrolled at San Diego State College for two years, attended Southwestern in Los Angeles for one year, and studied law for one year at Balboa Law College. She also trained six months to be a comptometer operator, and put in a full year at a business college.

In her own smiling words: "I've done lots of studying at many different schools, but have no college degree to show for it." However, as a swimming coach, she is an official member of the faculty of New York University.

Desiring to "go out on her own," and also wanting to save some money for her English Channel swims, Flo worked for two years in Arabia for an oil company. Finally, on August 8, 1950, she swam across the English Channel going from France to England. A year later, on September 10, 1951, she reversed the procedure and swam from England to France.

#### Chadwick and Catalina

Flo Chadwick was a world-wide celebrity now. But she still had one ambition on her mind: ever since she first learned to swim in the blue waters of the Pacific, she has wanted to swim across the Catalina Channel.

On July 3 this past summer, her

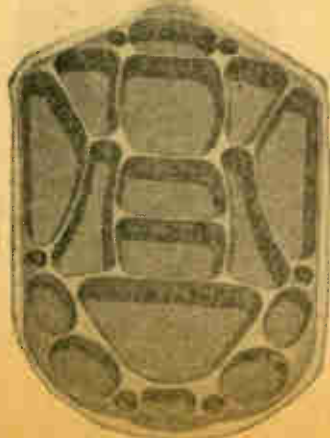

dream almost came true. She was within a mile of her destination, when a strong tide and extremely cold water forced her to give up. You saw her on KNBH, Channel 4.

In other ways, however, Flo achieved a greater victory. Mainly because of NBC-KNBH's TV coverage and KFVB's radio account, she won the sympathy and respect of millions of people throughout the entire nation.

The reasons she finally stopped—because of the extreme cold and because she thought her own health might be endangered—are now a part of history.

Nevertheless, at the time, this gallant woman visited our office, I had heard from several sources, both from the public and the press, that Florence Chadwick quit on purpose. She quit, these people said, because she knew she would get a good hunk of dough and publicity when she tried it a second time.

It's easy to have cynical thoughts such as these when you're off in your own smug little world. But when you come face to face with a charming and courageous woman such as Miss Chadwick, it's not so easy to pop the question.

"Did you quit on purpose?" I finally asked.

The Answer

If Florence Chadwick had gotten up

from her seat and, without a word, had left our office, never to return—I would not have blamed her.

She remained seated, however. Her face looked sad and sullen for a moment, but then slowly that broad, confident grin of hers returned.

"You are the first person who has ever asked me that question. No, I did not quit on purpose. I wanted to finish and I didn't want to disappoint all those people who were rooting for me. But I just couldn't. My whole body was numb. After the twelfth hour my hands were so cold that I couldn't keep my fingers together.

"I have been swimming since I was six years old. That was the first time in my entire life that I had to quit. I can assure you it was not a very nice feeling. But I had to because I thought my very life might have been jeopardized."

"Besides," Flo continued, "if I wanted to quit, I could just as easily have done it after the twelfth or thirteenth or fourteenth hour, instead of torturing myself for sixteen hours!"

What she said, and the way she said it, were enough to convince me of her sincerity.

Another point Miss Chadwick made quite clear was that she did not like to be classified as a "stunt girl." Swimming long distances is just as much a "sport" to her as any other aquatic activity.

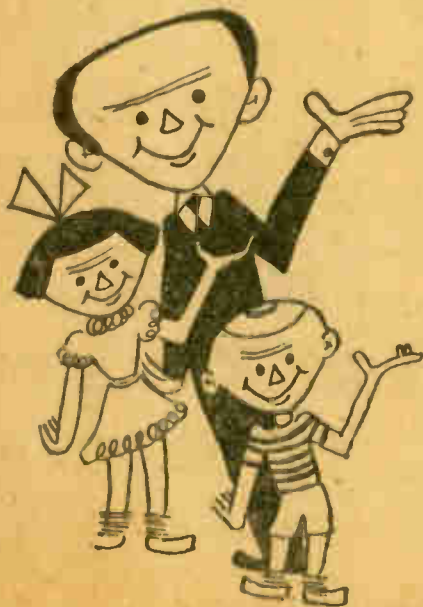

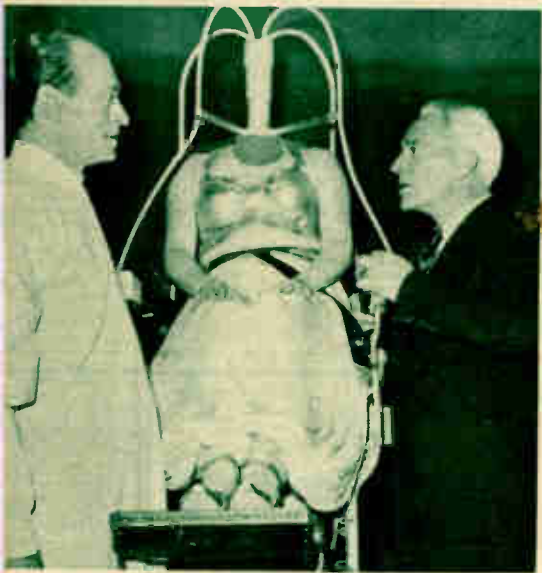
When it was all over, both Cece and Beany declared the visit was as fabulous as any that Captain Huffenpuff had ever arranged for them. Now Beany wants a printing press for Christmas; and Cecil, who confided that he thought a pressman's paper cap flattered his eyebrows, wants to learn how to "make the wheels go round."

# It Takes Art... Baker, That Is

**E**VER SINCE TV became a commercialized success, it seems that every Tom, Dick and Harriet has come up with a "colossal" show idea.

Back in September, 1950, Cran Chamberlain was just such a person. Imaginative Chamberlain even went nineteen better than the average individual. He had twenty ideas for TV productions.

One day he walked meekly into the office of Oxarart and Steffner, TV packagers, and addressed Wayne Steffner.

"I've got twenty ideas for TV shows," he declared.

"That's nice. Name one," the skeptical Steffner replied.

"Instead of telling people what they should have," Chamberlain began, "let the people decide for themselves. Let the audience write in requesting what *they* want; then *we* get it for them. Call it 'Ask for It.' Or better yet, 'You Asked for It.'"

Before Chamberlain could continue much further, the packager got on the phone and started calling various people. Within two hours the show was sold.

## Perfect Emcee

It didn't take much longer, either, to find the perfect emcee for such a program. Show-biz vet Art Baker has been at the helm of the ABC-TV hit ever since its inception in January, 1951.

Born on New York's famed Bowery and reared in Mishawaka, Indiana, Art enlisted at the age of twenty in World War I.

"Even then," the white-haired star recalls, "the boys used to call me 'Pop' because I was one of those freaks of nature categorized as 'pre-mature gray.'"

After the war, Baker ("What I lacked in quality, I made up for with loudness") toured the country for ten years as a choir leader. While employed as a lecturer in Forest Lawn in 1936, Art got a part-time job

as a radio announcer. His radio credits since then are legion. He has also appeared in more than forty motion pictures.

Now fifty-four years old, Art and his wife, Alice ("Poppins") live at Toluca Lake.

"Believe it or not, I won my wife at a quiz show during the last war. Because of my hair, someone remarked on the air that I was the 'fatherly' type. 'I don't think so,' Alice replied, 'I think you're cute.' Ever since then, we've gotten along fine."

## It Takes Art

On the basis of a juicy five-year contract, Art expects to string along with his "You Asked for It" chores for some time.

One of the oddities of the ABC-TV production is that Art, unlike most emcees, has to revolve about the show himself, rather than have the show revolve about him. This means that instead of merely introducing various acts, Art goes from one section of the huge ABC-TV stage to another, taking an active part in each skit.

The performances on "You Asked for It" have varied from Mabel Stark and her tigers to Lisa Bengtson and her swimming babies; from a stricken polio victim who painted with her teeth to the Siamese twins; from Ruby Keeler, former dancing star, to George McManus, the creator of "Jiggs."

Each week a group of six people have to read an average mail pull of 3,000 to 5,000 letters. When the participants from all parts of the nation are finally gathered together at the ABC-TV studio, it is the master, Art Baker, who applies the final unifying touch.

For the producers and the public it's dangerous; it's fun; it's heart-warming; and it provides TV with one of its most stirring and successful programs.

Art Baker didn't ask for "You Asked for It." But he's got it now — and he's darn glad of it.

# Swoon Over Sue

**B**ABY-VOICED Sue Thompson has the boys swooning. This pert red-haired, blue-eyed vocalist is television's answer to Bonnie Baker.

"I was movie-struck at the age of seven, like so many girls are from small towns," smiled soft-spoken Sue. "I hail from Missouri and I'm as stubborn as their proverbial mule."

#### Stubborn

Her persistence is what helped her gain a foothold in show business. Sue has been singing as far back as she can remember and without any professional coaching she made her
