King of Ingenuity

Cal Howard Wears the Crown—In Gags and Gadgets He Abounds

INGENIOUS CAL HOWARD handles the producer-director chores on NBC's Ralph Edwards and Johnny Dugan shows with competent glee.

The limitless possibilities of this former cartoonist's pen have served the master creditably. Cal Howard was the "idea man"-cartoonist on the first Academy Award-winning "Tom and Jerry" cartoon. The calibre of Cal's work has continued in television. He can visualize the most unimaginable prop in its most concrete form.

Impatient for TV

Pleasant, moon-faced Cal says: "I couldn't wait for television to get here, so I gave up a well-paying position to head for New York and become a floor manager at NBC. Needless to say I had to supplement my income with free-lance illustrations. Fortunately," he continued, "my wife had as much faith in the future of TV as I did. She approved of the economic upheaval and family sacrifices we weathered getting started. Subsequently I became writer and director. However, it wasn't until I

had the Henry Morgan, 'Judy Splinters,' and Jerry Lester shows under my belt that I felt confident to accept the offer to direct the Ralph Edwards show on the Coast."

Gags and Gadgets

Cal Howard avidly meets the challenge of low budgets. He can contrive more gags and gadgets from out of nowhere, making something out of nothing. For one TV stint he rented a flea circus, an eighteen-dollar investment which paid off in \$18,000 worth of entertainment. A microscopic lens picked up the fleas' performances . . . a juggler, a strong man and a chariot race . . . with nary a bit of eyestrain for the television viewers.

For weeks Ralph Edwards displayed an unnamed gadget which aroused the curiosity of viewers. The confusing contraption turned out to be an obsolete apple peeler, which Cal picked up while rummaging through a curio shop. Cal literally saves the network thousands of dollars by his ingenuity.

The adage, one picture is worth a thousand words, is amply illustrated

by Cal's drawing talents. He can rapidly sketch a TV stage set in detail, providing graphic illustration for the technical director.

Cal never had formal art training, just natural ability. He even preferred to answer questions on school examinations with sketches rather than delve into descriptive verbs and adjectives. And strangely enough, so he tells us, his teachers let him get away with it.

Cal asked if we'd like to hear about the Yokum family's TV appearance. . .

"And so, we announced," he said, "that the Yokum family would be on TV next Tuesday, and they were, by golly, as metal windups." (Well, we warned you about the king of ingenuity!)

Successful Men From All Walks of
Life Express Their Philosophy on

"This I Believe"

AT A LUNCH of four businessmen in 1949 in Philadelphia, KNX's "This I Believe" series was conceived.

The conversation began with the truism that among people generally material values were gaining and spiritual values were losing. The reasons were obvious—the uncertainty of the economic future, impending war, the atom bomb, army service for loved ones, frustration in young people in facing the future. The basic fundamentals seemed to be losing ground, so what could be done?

The group of four decided to start the five-minute radio program to run daily. It originated at station WCAU, Philadelphia, and after a successful run spread to New York. It was offered to West Coast listeners, and Los Angeles audiences began to hear it in January 1952. It is currently heard on KNX Monday through Friday, 11:30 to 11:45 p.m., and is used seven nights a week to close the station at 1:05 to 1:15 a.m. Edward R. Murrow, one of the group, agreed to be host for the series.

Every day it was planned to have a successful man or woman, regardless of religion, race or color, who is a decent citizen, tell his personal philosophy, what he deems important, the personal rules upon which he runs his life. The guests would cover all stations of life—businessmen, lawyers, social workers, baseball players, painters, butchers, actors—anyone who has been successful in his chosen profession and in his adjustment to the realities of the world.

"What is worth while?" "What can I believe?" "What shall be my personal credo?" Here are some of their answers:

ACTOR LIONEL BARRYMORE: "I believe the difference between an eminently successful person and one whose life is just mediocre is the difference between a person who had an aim, a focus, a model upon which he superimposed his own life, and one who didn't. To put it bluntly, you can't get anywhere unless you

know where to start from and have somewhere to go."

MICHAEL D. FANNING, POSTMASTER OF LOS ANGELES: "I believe that all of our mature years are spent relearning the truths which were given us in childhood . . . in this fast-moving life, human standards are mutable, continually changing. Only one standard has never changed and never can change because it is the standard and order of the universe . . . it is the standard of God."

DARRYL F. ZANUCK, 20TH CENTURY-FOX PRODUCER: "Way down deep the fundamental values I learned as a boy in Nebraska are still the fundamental virtues of life . . . to me the most important are loyalty and charity."

JOHN ANSON FORD, L. A. COUNTY SUPERVISOR: "I believe no life should be self-centered; the more completely one's work is permeated with the idea of service, the more satisfactory one's life is."

ACTOR DICK POWELL: "As I watch my young son crawling on the floor, trying to learn to walk, I will try to pass on to him those things I've believed in during my attempt to live a full and useful life, which can best be exemplified in these proverbs: 'Honesty is the best policy'—'A stitch in time saves nine'—'A rolling stone gathers no moss'—'Laugh and the world laughs with you, weep and you weep alone,' and the all-important 'Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.'"

DR. FRED DOW FAGG, PRESIDENT OF U.S.C.: "The nature of this world and of the people in it is determined more by our individual vision, understanding and conduct, than by any material environmental factors."

DR. LEE DU BRIDGE, PRESIDENT OF CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY: "I believe that men everywhere strive for peace, happiness and brotherhood and good will among men, and that man's intellectual efforts aimed toward these moral goals can and will bring him ever closer to them."

'Good Evening Neighbors'

George V. Denny Jr.'s Familiar Salute Comes Across the Vidcolanes Bringing You Both Sides of Pertinent Issues

"Rocks are largely what they are because it's where they are and that goes for people as well as rocks."

George V. Denny, Jr., uses his old geology teacher's quote to summarize his seventeen years of observations as moderator of radio's "Town Meeting of the Air."

Throughout these years Mr. Denny has remained unobtrusively in the background. Town Hall, its discussions and its participants were always first and foremost. A conniving, ambitious person could have exploited the situation for personal gain with but little effort. But Denny's sincerity guided his dream of adapting the original New England Town Meeting to radio.

Views the News

His cheery "Good Evening Neighbors" now comes to viewers nightly over KECA-TV. George V. Denny: "Views the News" is a fifteen-minute impartial analysis of the day's events. Famous for years as the moderator who could successfully walk a figurative tight rope. On his show the most brilliant men and women of our times usually managed to arrive at diametrically opposed points of view while using the same set of facts. Denny utilizes the same honest, unbiased objective approach on his news program.

Slated to become a minister, George Denny called a halt to his ecclesiastical studies when he realized that the oft-repeated quote: "To thine own self be true" applied to himself. The pulpit would mean that he would have to be above reproach. "I decided to allow for that margin of error and changed my profession," he smiled.

Dramatics and public speaking at college became his forte. Upon graduation he tried Broadway and real estate, and subsequently got a job as manager of a lecture bureau. He then became the director of the Institute of Arts and Sciences of Columbia University. Here Town Hall heard of him and Denny became the assistant to Robert Erskine Ely, then director of Town Hall.

Relaxation

When Denny isn't contemplating world problems he loves to relax by swimming, skiing and sightseeing. He proudly tells about the red barn in Connecticut which he reconverted. "We made it as livable an abode as Southern California's custom-built ranch-type homes," he boasts.

Denny has three grown children, a married daughter and a set of twins. His son is in the Air Force and his

daughter is an assistant casting director for CBS.

The amicable bow-tied George V. Denny, Jr., has settled in L.A. but needs no introduction to his new community. The world-traveler-moderator has a

Evening Friends" is an invitation to a stimulating, informative news commentary.

single boisterous tale of life aboard a cargo ship plying dangerous waters during the first World War. Director John Ford has projected the adventures of the seamen and the monotonous squalor of their environment (to the landlubber, at least) with his usual skill, and the concluding sequence, which shows the men on liberty in a foggy, lonely British port, is a fine work of cinematic art. The ex-

cellent cast includes John Wayne, Barry Fitzgerald, Thomas Mitchell, Ward Bond and Mildred Natwick.

"The Count of Monte Cristo." Alexandre Dumas' classic about the innocent man railroaded to prison, where he learns the location of a fabulous treasure. He escapes, acquires the treasure and wreaks vengeance on the men who had him incarcerated. And if this superficial synopsis doesn't offend Dumas devotees, nothing will. With Robert Donat.

"Avalanche," and "Divorce." Bruce Cabot is the hero of both these films. In the first he dons skis and chases a murderer down a mountainside, snow-covered, of course. And in the second he dilly-dallys with Kay Francis, much to the peril of his happy home.

"The Nut Farm." An old, unpretentious comedy about the hectic goings-on in a movie studio. Wallace Ford plays a ne'er-do-well who wants to be a film director, and it turns out he has made a happy choice of careers when his first picture is a success. There's an obvious conclusion there, somewhere.

"Bachelor's Daughters." Adolphe Menjou plays father to a bevy of beauties who pool their resources and rent an estate in the hope of attracting some rich husbands. One or two of them succeed, I think, and the rest of them fall in love. With Claire Trevor.

"No Funny Business." An early British film featuring Laurence Olivier and the late, great star of "Anna and the King of Siam." Gertrude Lawrence.

ment we have found quite a few news-men unable to claim. First he assembles his NBC radio newscast, so by the time he attacks his evening telecast, the items are fairly familiar to him. Then he prepares a cue sheet on large drawing paper which is hung alongside the center camera. This sheet holds key words to jog Peterson's memory. A "K" stands for Korea and indicates a news item from there, while "Ike" or "Stevie" similarly serve as reminders.

IN OTHER WORDS, PETERSON AD-LIBS his entire telecast and is able, by clipping his wordage and culling essential facts, to cover an enormous amount of news in a very short time. This is more difficult than having lots of time, for when ad-libbing one is inclined to distend a subject and lose his race with the stop watch. Peterson is signaled when he has a minute and a half left to go and again at thirty seconds before closing, when his farsighted eyes keep track of the sweep-hand of a stop watch hung alongside the camera. Once someone held the watch upside down and Peterson had quite a hassle gauging his seconds, but experience came to his aid and he signed off on the nose. The capable newsman has several ideas in the back of his head for other treatments of the day's news, but feels that for now the simple approach he uses is best. Would that many other telecasters trying to do a similar job were as competent and straightforward in their delivery as Peterson.

TALKED WITH MURDO MCKENZIE, Bing's co-producer, the other night and he's of the opinion that TV will be taped in a few years. . . . Did you "Peepers" fans hear Wally Cox on "Theater Guild" last week? . . . Hope you enjoyed Ethel Barrymore's appearance on "What's My Line" as much as I did. Mais oui!

THIS WEEK'S NATURAL SEVEN: Bing Crosby-Andrews Sisters' "South Rampart Street Parade" (Decca). Don Cornell's "I" and "Be Fair" (Coral). Wingy Manone's "Just a Gigolo" (Coral). Toni Arden's "Sweet Forgiveness" (Columbia). Mindy Carson-Guy Mitchell's "Train of Love" (Columbia). Skip Martin's Orchestra—"Rose Room" (MGM) and Gisele MacKenzie's "My Favorite Song" (Capitol).



"Somebody Loves Me" (Decca LP): Full to the brim with nostalgia are these songs of yesterday by Blossom Seeley and Benny Fields. "Rose Room." "I Cried for You." "Jealous," "Dixie Dreams," "Way Down Yonder in New Orleans."—all played a big part in the lives of these veterans of show business, who sing them in easy, effervescent and raggy manner as they did two decades ago... yet they are as pleasurable to listen to as if you were hearing them for the first time.

"Rough-House Piano" (Capitol Alb.): All the spirit of the style that never grows old is in the characteristic eighty-eighting of Joe "Fingers" Carr, who bangs out "Twelfth Street," "Lou's Blues," "Strutters' Ball" and the others with his fine honky-tonk technique. All that's missing from the aura of these fine grooves is the dim-lighted back rooms—and with a little imagination, even that's possible.

Disc-a and Data: Duke Ellington celebrates his Silver Anniversary with "Smada"—an uptempo'd modern jazz original by Billy Strayhorn and the calmer "Come On Home" with a Jimmy Grissom vocal that registers (Okeh)... It's jazz in the Crescent City style for Kid Ory's "Creole Song" (Cajun lyrics by The Kid) and a different jazz interpretation of the evergreen "South" (Good Time Jazz)... Same label has a pair of frantic sides on "Sailing Down Chesapeake Bay" and "Chicago," really given the business by Bob Scobey's popular Frisco Band, with Clancy Hayes vocals... Doris Day (Columbia) gets the nod for the best gal vocalist this week with "April in Paris" with the sexsational-voiced one at her whispery best with fine backing assist from the Percy Faith Orchestra, plus the Norman Luboff Choir... Alan Dale (Coral) walks away with top male vocal honors for his full-voiced discing of "Laugh, Clown, Laugh" Echo-chambered interpolation of Pagliacci excerpt should sell this boy as never before... (P.S. . . . Watch for complete versions of Verdi's "Aida" and "Il Trovatore" on Capitol. Recorded in Rome with top names, full orchestra and chorus, the production is outstanding... A.M.)

Jackson Wheeler vs. Paul Price

It finally happened. All hell broke loose last week on the TV-newspaper front.

This is the story:

The whole mud-slinging mess started innocently enough one afternoon on "Jackson's Theater" on KTTV. A picture, "Police Bullets" by name, was cut off before the ending.



In his column of October 6, Paul Price of The Daily News struck the spark which started the explosion: "Well, the day finally came when they had so many commercials on a TV program that they couldn't complete the show. Had to chop off a picture before it was completed . . ." The war had begun.

Mr. Wheeler read, didn't like it, and told his TV audience about it. Mr. Price heard Jackson, also didn't like it, and continued his "crusade" against over-commercialism with successive and fiery columns against "Ole Mr. Sincerity" on October 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, 17, etc.

The original issue was soon lost sight of. One night last week Wheeler explained to me that the picture referred to had been cut off, but that it was a "human error" on the part of the technical director, and he apologized for it to his audience. For almost an hour Jackson went on to give me all—and I do mean all—of the details of the controversy.

The following morning, I visited Paul Price and got his side of the story.

Now, having corralled a whole bunch of facts, slanders, and conflicting statements from both gentlemen, I still don't know who is right.

But I do know that these guys are not kidding. This is not a trumped-up feud to create publicity. For many reasons these guys are sore at each other, and they don't care who knows about it.

Writing for a TV magazine (consequently representing both TV and the press), I have not taken sides—not yet, anyhow.

I am interested in the fact, however, that for the first time here is an occasion in which the power of the press (heretofore all-powerful and almost immune from counter-criticism) has been challenged by a TV personality.

Although a certain amount of conflict between individuals is unavoidable, I would suggest for the benefit of themselves as well as the public that both Price and Wheeler keep the argument on a non-personal basis.

As I go to press (Saturday morning, October 18), Price is scheduled to

wrestling money at a circus—\$50 for pinning a bigger, more experienced man. Knowing Vic and Ted so well, I imagine that they had a hand in this—because they tried their luck at circus wrestling—for that matter, that is where I had my first professional bout.

Jerry is a shining example of the up-and-coming generation of wrestlers. He has both feet planted solidly on the ground and is pursuing his chosen career with careful planning. He is a sophomore at UCLA studying business management. He feels that he can combine both careers successfully.

Everything that young Christy does is built around his wrestling career—even his sports and hobbies. He shunned the sports popular with most teen-agers and took up handball and weight-lifting—two of the best body builders and conditioners—and works out regularly in a gymnasium. He is an active member of the Naval Reserve, attending regular training periods.

In three weeks he will be twenty-one—he has worked, studied and trained and is ready to make his bid for mat fame. He is one of the most personable, well-mannered boys I have ever met—quiet, unassuming and serious-minded. He is a good-looking kid but very shy—in fact he doesn't even have a steady girl.

His specialty is a type of knee lift, similar to Leo Garibaldi's "Bombs Away," called the Christy Comet. In other words, when you are on the receiving end of one of these lifts, you go places.

And Jerry's going places if I am any judge of wrestling ability. It couldn't happen to a nicer guy.

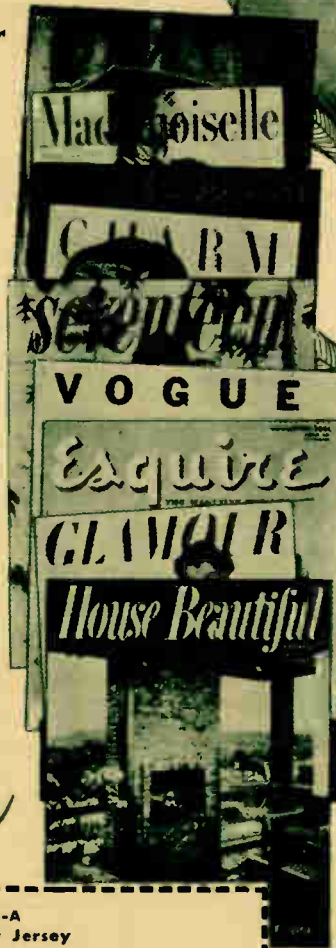

Don't laugh! Lee tells us that there's a list of applicants waiting to enroll in the "culinary arts" course which he initiated at his alma mater.

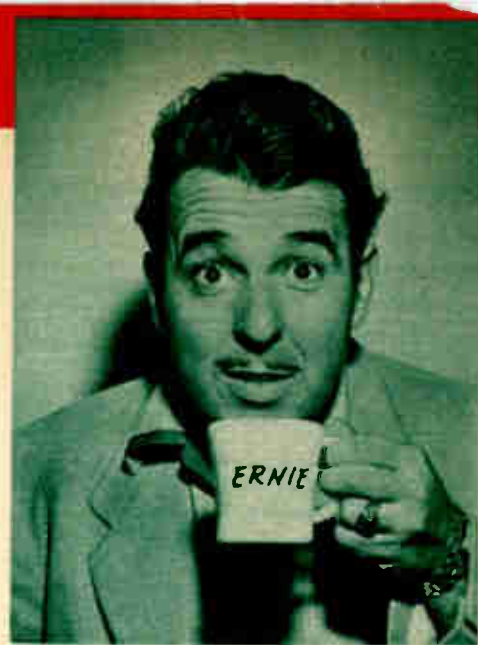

FOR THE first twenty-nine years of his life, any relationship between Tennessee Ernie and show business was purely coincidental.

Only thirty-three now, ABC's uninhibited, ad-lib deejay is one of the leading recording, TV and radio stars in the business. His success story is an ordinary and yet amazing one.

Born Ernest Ford on February 13, 1919, he attended public school and high school in Bristol, Tennessee. After working in a dry-cleaning shop and as a grocery clerk, he started to hang around the local radio station. He was finally hired as a staff announcer in 1937 for \$10 a week.

From 1939 to 1941, he announced for stations in Atlanta and Knoxville. Then World War II came along.

Ernie enlisted in the Air Corps in January, 1942, flew heavy bombers and instructed for two years. While in California, he met and married his present wife, Mary.

Discharged in Florida in 1945, the pilot from Tennessee returned to his old job at Bristol.

Without promise of a job, and with no contacts, he got a notion one day to try his luck in California. He and his wife bought a '41 Plymouth and took off for the Golden State.

California and Cliffie

Strictly as a staff announcer, and still not in any "show-business" category, he joined the staff of KFXM in San Bernardino in 1946. After a short stint as the chief announcer at KOH in Reno, Ernie returned to KXLA in April, 1948, to deejay a hillbilly show and act as a staff man.

His first day at the station was his most memorable one, for that was the day he met Cliffie Stone, one of the real vets of Western music.

"Just for the heck of it," Ernie recalls, "I used to run in while Cliffie was on the air, exchange a few jokes, sing a few numbers, and then leave. All for nothing, and just for fun."

With the exception of some glee-club work and a short term at Cincinnati's Conservatory of Music (lack of funds ended his studies), Ernie had never taken his singing career seriously.

At Cliffie's insistence, however, he soon started to join the "Hometown Jamboree" gang every Saturday at Placentia. Since then, his fabulous rise in the entertainment world is well known to millions of Southern Californians.

A TV show on KLAC-TV; nightclub dates in Las Vegas, Detroit, New York and Honolulu; a contract with Capitol Records (selling over three and a half million copies); various guest appearances; and a coast-to-coast hookup on the ABC radio network followed during the next four years.

Today, Ernie, his wife and two children have a lovely home in San Gabriel.

Gone Hollywood?

Has success in Hollywood spoiled the kid from Tennessee? Definitely not.

Ernie is still the same easy-going, sharp-witted fellow he was before he started clicking.

Poor Ernie is stuck. He's just an average country boy with a tremen-

dous sense of humor, who likes people, and who is appreciative of what he has.

He couldn't change if he wanted to, because his meal ticket depends upon his informal, homey style. If he did change, he would lose all the unique individuality which has made Tennessee Ernie a popular parlor and front-porch favorite in millions of American homes.

It looks as if Ernie will have to stay a nice, normal guy if he wants to continue his success story.

Alas, Tennessee Ernie will never be able to "go Hollywood." To the contrary, it seems that Hollywood has "gone Tennessee Ernie."

One of a duo of comradely housewives enjoying coffee and a television break exclaimed happily, "Why, that's Jane Sterling!"

Unwilling to see an old favorite lose her identity, the second viewer replied with some acerbity. "Really, dear, I've been watching her for some years. She's marvelous with food, you know. Prepares a whole meal. And certainly you heard the announcer very plainly introduce her as Corris Guy." More sweetly, "Of course not having had a TV set until recently, you would be mixed up."

"Then certainly Jane Sterling is Corris Guy. Why, she's been with Helms for simply years. Miss Sterling is the hostess in charge of the big Hostess House out there. Marvelous with food is right. I always read her columns."

Dual Personality

Both fans were right. Corris's family named her Corris Guy. Helms Bakeries named the home economist de luxe Jane Sterling. As Jane Sterling she feeds some 60,000 people a year at the swank Hostess House on Venice. Every visiting celebrity to

Under her own name the indefatigable specialist came to KTLA over five years ago as a guest replacement for the ailing chef from Earl Carroll's. He had been whipping up crepes suzettes and other specialties. Corris's deft ways, nice personality and adherence to the fare that Joe Smith could down seven times a week won her a permanent berth.

The Other Corris

But there is a third person whom neither Corris Guy nor Jane Sterling fans know. This is the Corris who describes herself as "a real dirt gardener." This woman can bow off camera, go home, build a fence, plant a garden or bend over the stove again to entertain personal friends as though she hadn't lifted a hand all day.

In order to get her University of Washington Bachelor of Science in home economics, Corris once had to take architecture. So she designed her all-gas home in Leimert Park last year.

Once every brick and panel was in place, Corris started on the outside. She climbed out of the cocktail dresses and off the social merry-go-round of parties which two jobs required, and put in her own grape stake fence.

A few weeks later blue jeans and wool shirts replaced the watermelon, beige and navy hues she favors in dress clothes, and the hands familiar to televiewers scabbled around in the dirt putting in an entire patio.

"Right now I'm trying desperately to be a good rose grower," Corris laughed. "But there must be some trick to it I don't know."

Name It

"Speaking of tricks, during the Democratic Convention the show

changed time for a day and we got all kinds of new mail. But several of the viewers said they had never watched before because "Tricks and Treats" sounded like a children's show. I wonder if perhaps I should change the name? Maybe one of the viewers will send me a good title some day."

We'd go along with just Corris Guy as a title, should the hostess-economist insist on a change. That could start all kinds of interesting arguments among new viewers, who would certainly insist, "Why, that's Jane Sterling!"

REBEL RANDALL is not only a very gorgeous gal with lots of talent, she is also a very unusual person—especially for one as career-minded as she is.

The Chicago-born beauty has made it "on her own" ever since the age of twelve. Recognized as one of the outstanding models and cover girls in the nation, the green-eyed brunette has also appeared in more than thirty motion pictures, had a successful broadcasting career at WDSU in New Orleans, and finally was co-star of one of New York's most successful TV shows called "Auctionaire."

Publicized as "the most beautiful girl in TV," she found her road to stardom assured back East. Her income amounted to \$2500 a week.

Suddenly, and for considerably less money, the GI's "Dream Girl" gave it all up and joined the Armed Forces Radio Service in Hollywood. Two years ago she took over a five-week radio show at AFRS, "Juke Box, U.S.A.," and several months ago started the popular CBS radio program "America Calling."

Big Four

There were four main reasons for Rebel's big switch. The first three

were named Dave, Ted, and Dor—her three brothers were fighting overseas in Korea. As a disc jockey, "The Girl the GIs Would Most Like to Be Alone With" has done as much as any other radio performer for the morale of our troops all over the world.

The fourth reason involved Rebel's own personality. She is deeply religious, sincere, and altruistic.

Perhaps her broadcast on "This I Believe" explains better than anything else why she has chosen her present career:

"I believe in God above all things. I believe in good without compromise. . . . I believe in people as evidence of good. I believe in the freedom and dignity of mankind."

Sorting out and answering personally the thousands of letters she receives every week, making arrangements for world-wide phone calls (approximately \$200 worth per week), and then doing the actual CBS broadcast keeps her busy during the entire week.

However, the former student at Max Reinhardt's Workshop loves it. In her own small way, she believes she is helping our troops protect "the freedom and dignity of mankind."

Again, in the words of the charming CBS star: "Like everyone else, I want happiness. But I have never heard of happiness maintained within the physical realm. It begins in the mind. The body is the violin case for the instrument. The instrument of happiness is the mind."

If you talk to Rebel Randall for only a few minutes, you will be convinced that in her own mind she is "happy" and is fulfilling her career with the work she is doing on "America Calling."

One day a school chum literally dragged him into KGER and insisted Paul lend moral support by taking the same radio audition. Paul, reluctant to the end, wound up with a job. The friend didn't.

After early radio and the war, Phoenix and ABC radio work, he went to CBS. Now back at ABC he is happier than ever. That "rest of the day" is spent with his lovely wife Adele (who appears on Paul's Friday dawn show) and baby Debby, or in "kicking out walls" to make more room. The carpentry has grown into a hobby second only to music.

He's strictly a listener, and prefers piano; just as in sports he is strictly a watcher. Paul feels guilty that he doesn't care if sports keep school or not because he is the voice of Norman Sper's "This Week in Football," soon to be seen on TV.

The Mastersons live in Burbank, both love Mexican food, and share Paul's secret (one he feels never will be fulfilled) ambition of being a diplomat. He leans toward the conservative in dress, speech and taste, and by the time this appears in print will be a second-time father. That means another wall will have to go, and more carpentry will have to be started.
