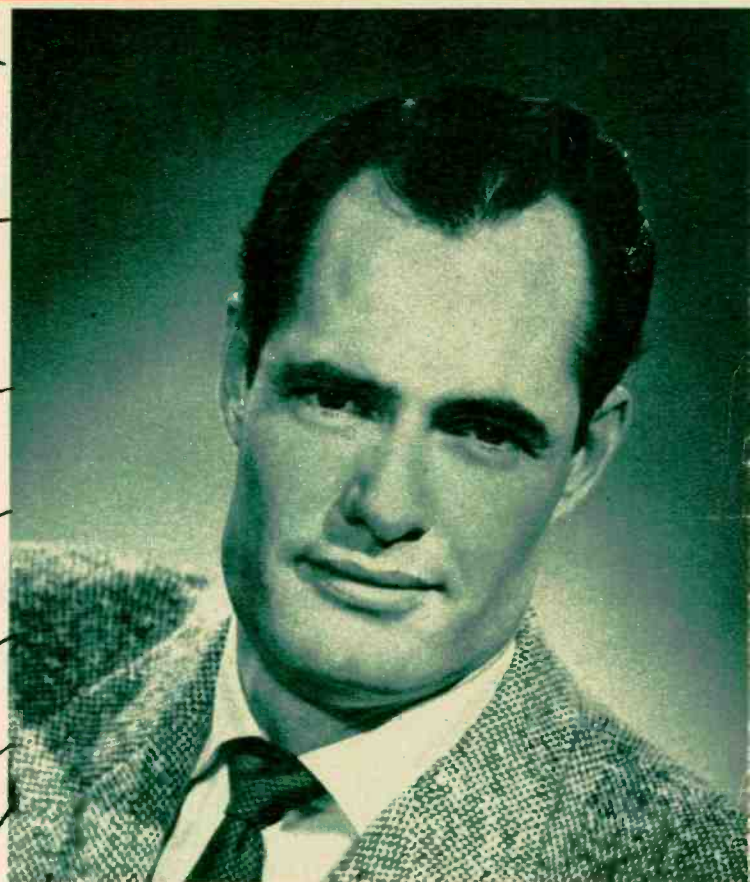

# The Moment That Changed My Life

*Clete Roberts Has Seen Much Drama  
In His Life But This Is the One  
He Remembers the Most Vividly*

**A**S PACIFIC Correspondent for ABC, I landed with three other press men at Tacloban on the Philippine Island of Leyte on October 24, 1944. We landed with the first wave of troops, and in twenty-four hours they had captured the island.

John Terry of the Chicago Daily News, Stanley Gumn of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, and Ace Bush of the Associated Press and I took over the best house we could find. Jap snipers were everywhere and Jap planes were making night runs on

the island. When General MacArthur arrived we had to take the second-best house, though we took the liquor with us.

That night I woke up in the middle of a bad dream, finding myself hurtling through the air and landing in a pile of rubble. Three bombs had fallen on our house. My three best friends were killed. I had three jagged shrapnel wounds in my arm and a broken jaw.

From that moment on I was on velvet. What used to worry me now had no effect. My whole perspective had been changed. Life and death

were one, both comparatively unimportant. The air was clear. My life was changed.

As a footnote to the story some years later I visited the spot that was bombed. The house had been converted into a schoolroom for children. I told the teacher about my experience there and showed her some pieces of shrapnel that were still in the walls. She was impressed enough to tell her class the whole story.

There may be other dramatic moments in my life, but, believe me, I'm ready for them.

# Back Into Grease Paint

*Twenty Years of Retirement Haven't Affected Charles Farrell's Appeal*

**T**HE HAL ROACH Studio may not be very impressive but the people on its lot are, especially when handsome, silver-haired Charles Farrell is the object of your visit. We met the loquacious Mr. Farrell on the "My Little Margie" set during the noon-hour break.

Until two years ago, Mr. Farrell was content with being the Mayor of Palm Springs. But in 1951 he got back into grease paint to star in the revival of "Seventh Heaven" with Janet Gaynor on the Lux Radio Theater presentation of the film classic which made the pair a romantic celluloid team in the late twenties.

Farrell's "Lux" performance triggered the chain of events which led to his starring in the "My Little Margie" series. Playing the debonair widower, "Vern Allbright," Farrell has lovely Gale Storm as his co-star in the popular domestic comedy series. Miss Storm is heard in the role of "Margie," the romantically inclined young daughter.

## Sports and Politics

Chatting over our lunch in the commissary, we learned that Charles Farrell hailed from Massachusetts. "I was a fair student," he says, "but gained more of a reputation while at school as a fast man with my fists." We might also add that he's a fast man with his tennis racket. As you undoubtedly know it was his interest in the sport that eventually led to his ownership of the famed Racquet Club. His business success

can in part be credited to the wisdom of his retiring at the peak of his motion-picture career. Following his retirement from the screen, he moved to Palm Springs in 1934 and opened the now famous club. Farrell, the hotel owner, has been the Mayor of Palm Springs since 1947. The tall actor-sportsman-politician is serving his third term of office. As a matter of fact our interview was interrupted by a long-distance call from the city manager, who needed Mayor Farrell's consent on a civic matter.

Although it's been almost twenty years since Charles Farrell has been seen in a motion picture his fans have never forgotten him. During World War II, he was a lieutenant aboard the aircraft carrier Hornet. The young sailors had never heard of him but their aunts, mothers and grandmothers had. Many letters were exchanged between these female relatives and the young salts which were solely devoted to "that handsome Charles Farrell."

Since his appearance in the "My Little Margie" series the mail has been pouring in from viewers, reminiscing about the past.

"My Little Margie" started as a summer replacement last season and it was literally kicked around from TV to radio and back again. It finally found its niche when Philip Morris sponsored the series on both CBS radio and television (aired locally over KNX and KNXT).

Thanks to the sponsor, Charles Farrell will be back in grease paint for at least the next five years.

Bigelow** and students of **Columbia University** on "Seminar" telecast, Sunday, **May 17**, from 12 to 12:30 p.m. over **KECA-TV**. . . . The very inspiring song, "I Believe," which **Jane Froman** introduced on her CBS-TV show some weeks back, is now number one in the country and also received the **Christopher Award** for work "representative of the opportunity for those in the creative arts to provide both

inspiration and entertainment for the millions." A well-deserved award. . . . Did you know that **Barbara Hale**, who is the guest star-hostess on the "Schlitz Playhouse of Stars" **May 15**, once studied commercial art at the **Chicago Academy of Fine Arts**? However, after two years of study she began modeling and from that won a movie contract.

**Robert Montgomery** received the **Gold Medal of Merit and Citation of the Veterans of Foreign Wars**. The citation read: "Presented to **Robert Montgomery** in commendation of past distinguished and meritorious radio programs warning of the Communist menace within and without, pointing out organized crime, and presenting an enlightened interpretation of views and opinion that furthered a greater appreciation of the American tradition."

**David and Ricky Nelson** took top honors in the recently completed national **Milky Way Gold Star** awards to find the top child entertainers of the year. . . . **NBC-TV** launches a new domestic comedy called "Ethel and Albert," starring **Peg Lynch** and **Alan Bunce**, **May 16, 9 p.m.**

### We Point With Pride . . .

To **CBS-TV** for its excellent TV series called "Adventure." Here is a great step forward towards making

educational TV interesting in a dramatic way. Some of the sequences to be presented are "Life in the Garden," in which the violent struggle among insects and other animal life for existence will be graphically pictured—and "Undersea Story," the story of the grim and sometimes brutal determination of native fishermen who go out to sea off Sicily in their quest for tunny fish. Producer of "Adventure" is **Perry Wolf**, two-time **Peabody Award** winner, and **Samuel Goldwyn, Jr.** is associate producer. The **American Museum of Natural History** is heading this fine new TV project. Let's hope it's a smash hit!

To **RCA Victor** for release of what should be a fascinating record, regardless of your political preferences: "Adlai Stevenson Speaks." Key excerpts from the former **Democratic** nominee for the presidency's speeches will be included. **NBC commentator James Fleming** will narrate. Everyone has agreed **Stevenson's** talks were masterpieces so this album will be a fine collector's album. Equally interesting is that a similar project on portions of **Dwight D. Eisenhower's** speeches will be recorded soon by **RCA**.

### "Millie" Goes to Brooklyn

"Meet **Millie**," popular **CBS** radio and TV airer, has been on the airlines long enough to prove its audience appeal. Why some smart sponsor doesn't pick up the TV tab remains a mystery. (The radio version boasts a sponsor.) The fan mail received from **Brooklyn** alone makes it worthy of sponsorship. To show her appreciation of their appreciation, "**Millie's**" pretty star, **Elena Verdugo**, heads east to **Brooklyn** next month. **Elena** is a native **Angeleno** and has never visited the fair **Borough**. But like the **Dodgers**, she has won many fans for her portrayal of "**Millie Eronson**," the **Brooklynese** secretary.

### "Dixie Dugan" Tries TV

America's best-known secretary, **Dixie Dugan**, whose trials and tribulations at home and at the office have been brought to the American public in a daily cartoon strip for over eighteen years in leading newspapers in the United States, will soon be seen on television screens.

# Mrs. R. Colman Makes Comeback

One thing that may be to the everlasting credit of television is the return to the screen of **Benita Hume** (Mrs. **Ronald Colman** in private life). The actress makes her TV debut in the "Four-Star Playhouse" program of Thursday, May 21. Called "The Ladies on His Mind," it stars her husband in his third play for the series.

"I can't get over it," she says. "Three days and the whole blooming picture is over. When I last made a picture we spent anywhere from three to six months on a comparable amount of footage."

Her last picture, before she retired from the screen to marry **Colman** in 1938, was "The Last of Mrs. Cheyney," starring **Joan Crawford** and **Robert Montgomery**.

Mrs. Colman says she hadn't thought of television until her husband, highly enthused over the unique set-up of "Four-Star Playhouse," began to talk TV night and day.

"Then," she says, "**Milton Merlin** showed Ronnie a script about a psychiatrist written especially for him. It was called 'The Women on My Couch' then. It naturally called for a lot of actresses to portray his patients. By the time they got around to casting the psychiatrist's wife, they thought of me."

(Scripter **Merlin**, incidentally, differs with the lady on this point. "I had her in mind from the first, but I didn't want to scare her. We worked up to the obvious gradually.")

Mrs. Colman's finest piece of acting, she maintains, was the utter calm she showed on the set. "Excited? Of course I was excited," she admits. "Right after I definitely said yes, I'd play the part, I went and got the most exquisite Christian Dior gown I could find. But Ronnie said it was too 'busy' for a television camera. So then I shopped around at **Don Loper's**. I found a perfect dream of a dress, but . . . Yes, it was too 'busy' too. How did I know that black lace over pink satin would show up like a game of checkers?

The play was the direct result, says **Merlin**, of **Colman's** joking lament about his last picture in which there were no women. As a consequence, the new film has four women in addition to Mrs. Colman.

It doesn't disturb her at all. "I got even with Ronnie," she smiles. "I've also made my debut as a writer. Mrs. **Merlin** and I decided that if our husbands could get such pleasure out of a play involving one man and five women, we'd write one about one woman and as many men. We did, too!"

So, televiewer, when you've gotten over the experience of seeing **Benita Hume** on the screen, watch for her debut as a "Four-Star Playhouse" script writer. Her play, co-authored with **Barbara Merlin** and called "I Wonder Who," has been purchased as **Merle Oberon's** next play in the series.

# HOLLAND'S TUNNEL

You hear a lot about how fast TV stars have to work on filmed shows but it wasn't until I went out to **Bob Cummings's** "My Hero" set recently that the full meaning of speed was made graphically clear. The shooting had gone so fast that **Bob** and **John Litel** found themselves with enough time left to do one more scene. However, neither **Bob** nor **John** had expected to do the scene until the next day so they weren't set for it. The two thereupon decided to take a fast glance at the script and try to "wing" it—meaning doing it almost ad-lib. After five minutes looking at the lines they went into the scene and with some very amusing interpolations of their own wound it up within about ten minutes — and with only about three "takes" necessary.

Here was convincing proof that to be good on TV you have to be able to turn on the speed whenever necessary and still do a first-rate job. The task of TV stars is made even greater because on most shows no time is allotted for rehearsal. "As a result," **Bob** said, "each time we do a scene we get stage fright just as you'd get opening night in a play." Afterwards, **Bob** took me to the projection room to see the "rushes" of the work done the day before. **Mary Beth Hughes** is in this episode—and it looks like a riot. Don't miss it. Incidentally, **Bob** is one of the greatest guys in the business.

Movies and TV are drawing ever closer. The newest "marriage" is **CBS-TV's** "sneak preview" show which debuts Wednesday, May 13, at 11 p.m. The program will present an intelligent behind-the-scenes presentation of film making in Hollywood and the first picture to be "analyzed" is **RKO's** "Split Second," a real thriller too. **Reed Hadley** will be permanent host on the program.

**Jack Webb** and his wife are still separated—and it's apparently no go for a reconciliation. Many reasons have been given for the split but you'd probably win if you bet that the main cause was **Jack's** being so busy all the time with TV that a home life was next to impossible. Both **Jack** and **Julie** are fine people, so let's hope they find a common meeting ground again.

**Lambert Day**, sound-mixer for **Screen Gems'** production of "Jr." for "Ford Theatre," had a real dilly on his hands. He had to make like an actor during preliminary rehearsals because the script called for star **Edward Arnold** to speak only in a hoarse whisper during half the footage. So the mixer not only had to manage two sound equalizers, one for the normal speaking actors and the other for **Arnold**, but he had to know the actors' lines verbatim in order to pick up cues for change of those equalizers. Special and complicated sound equipment had to be constructed to supplement the regular equalizer. The task was even tougher because set construction permitted the use of only one mike. Well, anyway, technicians will understand this even if some of you don't.

Went to **Moonridge Estates** at **Big Bear** last week end and was amazed to find how well TV is actually coming through up there. Reception is quite good, considering mountain difficulties, and many of the residents have TV sets. Channels 2, 4, 5 and 11 show up quite well, with Channel 2 holding the edge with the best picture. Incidentally, our thanks to **Jack Renfro** for a wonderful visit at this fabulous new development at **Moonridge**.

Ran into **Benson Fong** at his wonderful Chinese restaurant, **Ah Fong's**, recently, and asked him why he wasn't doing TV. **Benson**, you'll remember, was **Charlié Chan's** son in all the Chan pictures you're seeing on TV now. **Benson** honestly admitted television so far couldn't meet his price—and he doesn't feel like knocking his brains out for peanuts. Not when he's as busy as he is in the movies. Also—with the crowds at his restaurant, he should worry about any wolf at the door. If this is a plug, so be it.

After seeing **Henry Fonda's** fine performance at the **Biltmore** in "Point of No Return," can't help thinking what a decided asset he would be to TV—perhaps in a series of half-hour dramatic shows of his own. His ingratiating personality and his undeniable talent practically make "Point of No Return" the hit it is, so think what he could do for television! Catch his show and see for yourself.

# Lifelines

**REMINDER TO YOU TO RED-CIRCLE TUESDAY, May 19, for 8:00 p.m.** This is a rave for the TV show to be released here at that time and a regretful rap because we in Southern California have to see it by kinescope (it went live, coast-to-coast, a week ago Sunday!) The show is ABC-TV's Part I, "A Tale of Two Cities" (one of the network's new "Album" shows), and when you view it you'll probably think you're seeing a motion picture rather than a television production. (Part II will be screened here the following Tuesday night, May 26.)

**VIDEO ADAPTATION OF DICKENS'S FAMOUS** novel assumes the flavor of large-scale movie production notably because of the manner in which all outdoors is brought into the act. ABC's Television Center, as you may recall, took over the old Vitagraph lot four years ago as nucleus for its TV activities.

There are twenty-three acres and wide open spaces. So, when a coach drives away at the end of "Tale of Two Cities" it's a real coach that winds up a road and into the distance. I was on the lot last week when workmen were repainting the whole side of a huge sound stage to represent The Bastille. When you see it on screen you'll know it's not just a backdrop.

**ADDED TO THIS REALISM IS THE VISTASCOPE** process, meticulous integration of a doorway, gate to a city, or such, with a painted background. Vistascope is used in the final carriage scene of Part I by employing a blue sky backdrop to shut out the actual Southern California mountains and Spanish houses dotting the hills to the north of the ABC-TV lot.

**THE FAMOUS STAGE I AT TELEVISION CENTER**—the stage where Al Jolson, Bing Crosby and other greats once cavorted for the flicker cameras and later turned into an audience hall by ABC-TV—has had every seat ripped out to make room for the vast "Tale of Two Cities" sets. Dik Darley, director for the Dickens classic, used seventy-five extras, in costume, for one scene. Total cast nearly 100. Almost 100 additional craftsmen.

**HOW FORTUNATE THE PROGRAM'S STARS,** Wendell Corey, Wanda Hendrix, Judith Evelyn and Carleton Young, to display their talents in such a production! If this is a taste of the viewing the AB-PT merger is going to make possible, it spells fine things for ABC-TV and Television (with a capital T).

**ONE QUICKIE SIDELIGHT ON THE** production: Dik Darley, thirty-year-old director, was a page boy at Mutual Broadcasting in Hollywood just a few years ago. He has made rapid strides in TV, regularly directs the five-a-week "Space Patrol" TVer. A real success story, and nice twist is that he's a U.S.C. grad and was born right here in Hollywood.

**LIKE MILLIONS OF FANS, YOU** probably stay home Monday nights to watch TV and especially "Lucy," but

just in case you get another offer for the evening of June 1, don't accept. Stay true to your set and you'll see one of the most hilarious Desilu productions to date. Watching 'em film it the other night, I laughed till I cried. Right behind me sat writers Madelyn Pugh and Bob Carroll Jr., also laughing their heads off. They're such modest people, though, that when complimented on the terrific script, they passed all the credit on to Lucy, Desi and the other players. They told me that vet actor Jerry Hausner does all the baby-crying for the show, only on this particular night the real-life baby playing Ricky Jr. gave Jerry an assist.

**AFTER THE "LUCY" FILMING I BUMPED INTO RAY BOLGER,** who has a TV series coming up in the fall on ABC-TV and who had attended the Desilu program to get some pointers on television and how it's done in these parts. Ray plans to film his series. He said it will be mostly musical.

**ACTOR-TURNED-MARINE TOMMY COOK** paid his respects the other noon and told about helping with Camp Pendleton's TV show, "At Ease," and radio opus, "Marines in Review" on KECA. Tommy will be out in nine months, meanwhile he hopes he'll land an acting job or two while in Hollywood on month's leave. Pendleton men, he says, like Western stuff—in fact they go for it bigger than for most well-known Hollywood glamour entertainers.

**MIRROR COLUMNIST GORDON CURRIE** has a radio and TV show cooking in the double boiler—from the Statler, real soon, he thinks. That ever-lovin' trouper, Johnny Grant, admits he got a big lump in his throat during his recent (third) trip to bring laughs to the fellows in Korea. "I walked into a makeshift dressing room in Pusan," he said, "and saw a sign on the wall which read, 'Al Jolson sang here.'" Add to throat-lumps, the Don De Fore "This Is Your Life" TVer. Now that the program has refined the art of trapping guest-stars, the time has come to knock Mr. R. Edwards right off his pins by doing his life, don't you think?

**LATEST REPORT FROM LAWRENCE WELK** is that Alice Long of Dallas will appear with the band on TV Friday night, May 15. Welk claims to have auditioned over 300 singers, to have found six good prospects who will be slotted on weekly programs for trial. Decision will not be made

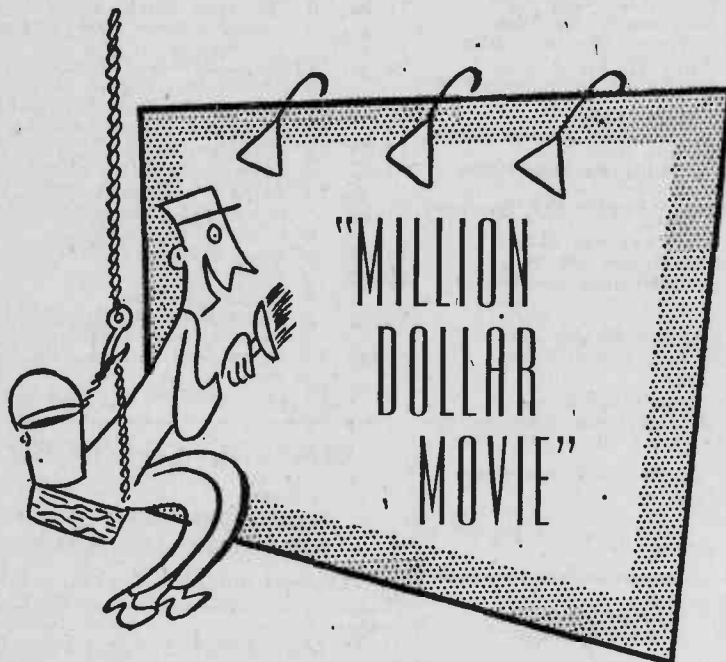

## Tell You What I'm Gonna Do...

### Fan Fax

By **FREDERICK ORME**

Many of the letters received by HOME LIFE have outlined in detail various schemes perpetrated upon unsuspecting victims of high-pressure salesmen. These letters DO name companies and individuals. Here are a few choice schemes.

**FREE ENCYCLOPEDIAS:** This is where they use the approach that you have been selected as an outstanding citizen of your community to receive a free set of an encyclopedia. Don't you believe it! You'll find there is a charge for the extension service, monthly revisions, and other gimmicks, so that in the end, you pay as much or more than the encyclopedia costs in the beginning.

**FREE PERMANENT WAVES:** Usually offered by means of a printed coupon, the beauty shop using this gimmick neglects to tell you that the "free" permanent wave includes a shampoo, as well as "setting" of the hair; for which you must pay. The price you pay is equal to the cost of any permanent wave they have in the shop. You do not get a free permanent.

**SKIP TRACERS:** Tracing missing debtors requires diligent research and patience. People who leave unpaid bills are known as skips. If tracing companies cannot get you to reveal your place of employment, or find out from your friends or neighbors, they employ the U. S. mail. Here is a sample of how they get you to reveal the information they want. You receive a letter, advising you that a check is being held, payable to you, for an

unstated sum, by so and so firm. You must identify yourself by return mail, along with enough facts about yourself that the company will feel free to release the check to you. You let them know the facts, they send you a check for not over \$2, and next week you find a garnishee slapped on your salary check. Uncle Sam frowns upon these tactics but the trick is legal, as you do get a check. You can avoid this scheme simply enough. Pay your just debts.

**UNORDERED MERCHANDISE:** You are not legally obligated to pay for any merchandise not ordered by you which you receive through the mail, nor are you required to return it. A number of companies send out various types of merchandise with a bill, or perhaps a charitable appeal, hoping your basic honesty will bring them a check or money in return.

**TELEVISION SCHOOLS:** Many a parent has been victimized in past years by so-called "talent school" representatives who promise that a brush-up course in the school they represent would be the speediest means of getting into motion pictures. Some of these fast operators have now jumped onto the television bandwagon. They offer you everything they think you are gullible enough to accept in an effort to take away some of your hard-earned money for their own pockets. There are some legitimate schools. However, we advise looking into the claims of some of these people before you invest or pay any advance fees.

#### Curt Massey

Curt Massey, the singing co-star of CBS Radio's "Curt Massey Time," made his professional debut in the Roswell, New Mexico, jail.

This was not as inauspicious a start as it may seem at first glance, however, since he was there at the invitation of the sheriff, who wanted him to play for the prisoners. He was only nine years old, and the sheriff paid him a dollar for his concert.

Today Curt also plays trumpet, piano and just about every other musical instrument, in addition to having a fine baritone voice.

His whole family is just as musical, if not as well known. Curt's five brothers and his sister, Louise, also played various musical instruments and together they formed a band that toured the midwest and Canada.

He attended a music conservatory in Kansas City, Missouri, began doing character roles on Station KMBC, and played with the orchestra at Kansas City's Pla-Mor Ballroom. He became leader of the orchestra a few months after he joined it.

It was about the same time that he met his wife, Edythe, whom he married in June, 1932. They now live in Beverly Hills with their two sons, Stevie, eleven, and David, five.

A year after his marriage, Curt and his sister formed "The Westerners." Their success in radio's "National Barn Dance" took them to New York where they were a hit in the network big-time shows like "Showboat" and the "Al Pearce Show."

In 1940 Curt went to Chicago, determined to discard the label of "Western singer," and starred in his own radio show there until 1945, when California beckoned.

In Hollywood Curt was immediately successful, working on shows with Red Skelton, the Andrews Sisters, David Rose and others.

In the summer of 1949 "Curt Massey Time" went on the air as a summer replacement—and on March 30, 1953 celebrated its 200th consecutive week on the CBS Radio Network.

His main hobbies are golfing and running his 3500-acre cattle ranch in San Diego County.

In addition to this, he recently opened a haberdashery in Tarzana with Del Moore, located at 18606 Ventura Blvd. Gary is a walking advertisement for the store, with his fondness for gay ties, belts and suspenders.

As if these jobs weren't enough for one man, he is head coach for the Goodwin backfield, consisting of his four sons, ten, eight, four and a half and two. His wife, Mary, acts as trainer and jean knee patcher.

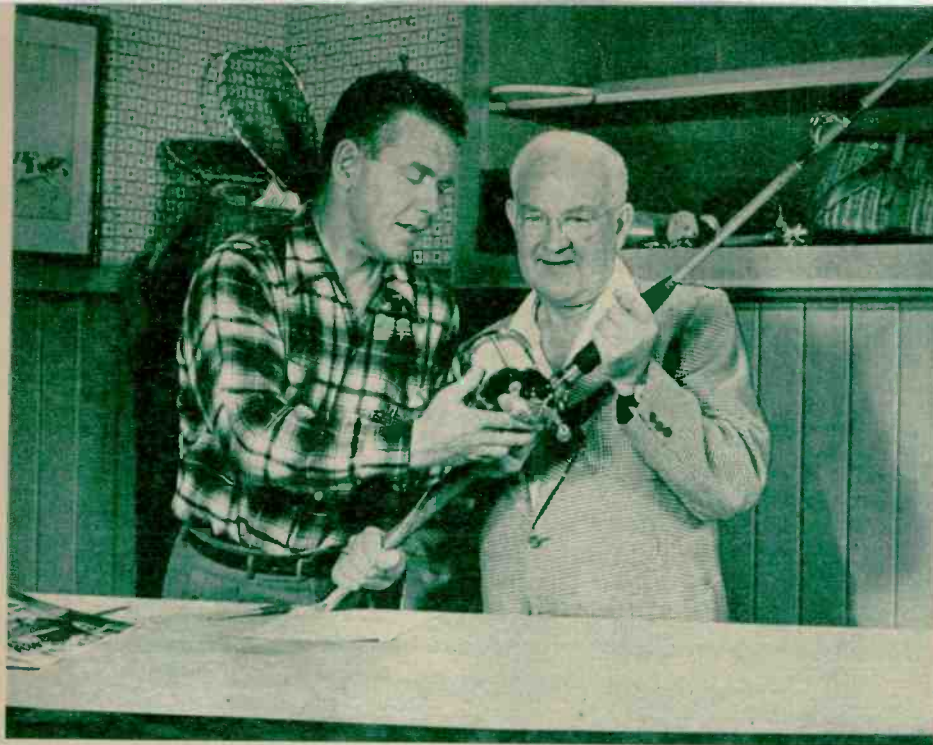

## The Poor Man's Arthur Godfrey

**A**NDY KELLY has a pretty common name, but he's a very uncommon fellow. Most people in show business—and you can't blame them because it's a part of their job—spend hours trying to convince others how great they are. So it's kind of surprising when you interview this Kelly lad.

Although he's been on TV regularly for over four years, he has no illusions about being a TV star.

"I'm no TV personality," explains Kelly. "I just sit there and chew the rag with the boys for awhile, be it about fishing or any other matter.

"I suppose everyone has a little bit of 'ham' in him, and I'm no exception. But I don't think it will ever get to the point where I'll consider myself as a full-fledged star."

Kelly created the original fisherman's television show, "Fishing's Fun," back in 1949. It was the first program of its type and attracted the attention of the thousands of fishing fanatics in the local area. What caused this stroke of genius on Andy's part?

"Simple," says Kelly. "Actually, I'm in the advertising business. I love fishing, and so do many of my clients. This fishing show gave me a chance to take my clients fishing and still call it work."

In addition to his perennial angling program, the former reporter for the Hearst chain in Chicago cooked up a fifteen-minute package this past winter on KTTV.

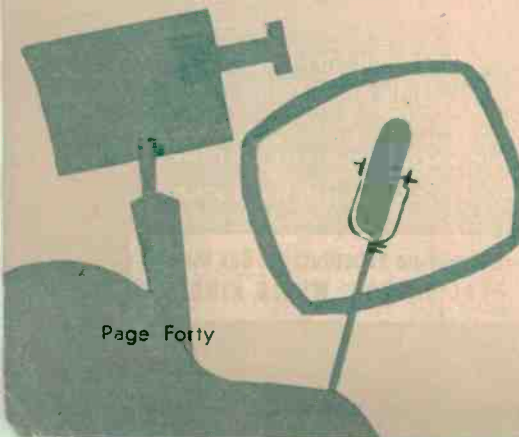
Called "Andy Kelly Presents," it featured well-known personalities from movieland, industry, and the sports world. As an added gimmick, Kelly introduced a "third-man" theme in which the "other" personality of the guest was brought out by his or her hobbies or avocations.

Mayor Fletcher Bowron, for example, turned out to be an avid marlin fisherman. Xavier Cugat loved Abbe Lane, chihuahuas and cartooning. Reginald Denny is a remote-control plane bug. Bob Stack likes guns and cameras and holds a number of national skeet-shooting titles. Lon Chaney cherishes his rod and reel. No matter whom he is interviewing, it doesn't take Kelly long to bring out the "third-man" personality.

Maybe Mr. Kelly never figured it this way, but being "natural" and completely himself on-camera is probably the main reason he's stuck around so long.

"I'm just the poor man's Arthur Godfrey," says Kelly.

That's bad? (Latest estimates show that Godfrey pulls in fifteen million dollars worth of business each year for CBS.)

My wife, Helen, and I have always made a point of encouraging the boys to save their money so we provided them with two tobacco cans in which they deposit ten per cent of all they earn—or are given as presents. I only wish I'd saved that much out of the money I made from the time I was their age. I'd be a far richer man today. Fortunately, the boys have this ten per cent habit and seem to enjoy it. In fact, they often use their savings as a weapon to get an occasionally delayed allowance. A few days ago, Dickie said to us, "You owe me \$3.00 so here's my thirty cents." He got paid up that way.

When it comes to disciplining the boys my wife and I have met the usual problems. We have tried to do as good a job as possible to teach them that this is their home as much as ours and that it's therefore up to them to share the responsibilities of a home. One of their newer chores is washing dishes on the maid's day off. Helen and I were doing them one Thursday when Helen suddenly said to the boys, "From now on this will be your job." The boys made no comment—but they're at the sink on Thursdays.

I have always tried to pal around with my sons. For one thing, Peter and I do a lot of shooting together—and it took a lot to get me used to the idea of Peter's handling a gun. You see, when my father was a boy he shot his brother's hat off accidentally with a gun that was supposedly not loaded. From that time on he would have nothing to do with any firearms and naturally I was never allowed to have a gun.

But there came the day when Pete went to a military school, and of course he was given a gun and taught to shoot it. I have finally decided it's time I learned to shoot too so Friday afternoon Pete and I go to the school to practice.

You will note that I have carefully refrained from mentioning my KECA-

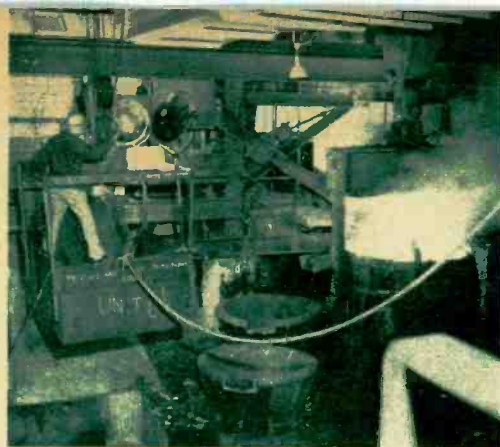
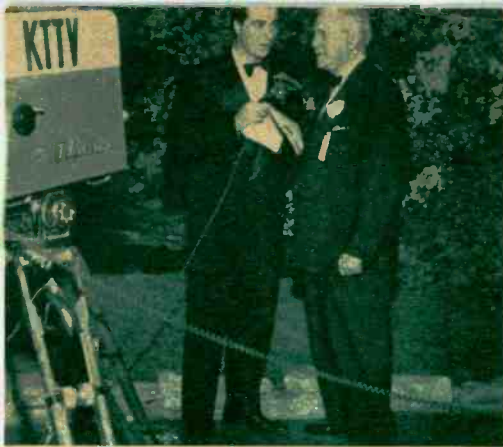
