## The Best-Read Man in Town

↑ **MOTHER MURRAY WATCHES HER BUSY BROOD.** That's Pam at the telephone, Tony at the typewriter and Johnny, the best-read man in town, who blissfully ignores the rest of the family while he catches up on the latest best seller. Their little peke, Peppe, seems to be the only one with nothing to do.

**A**RE YOU bored with your work-a-day routine? So was KFI's Johnny Murray until he found escape from monotony in the world of books.

The pleasant blue-eyed, slightly greying Mr. Murray reads over 175 periodicals and more than twenty-five books a month. Despite his exposure to every conceivable style and manner of writing, he hasn't succumbed to the writing bug. He smilingly explains, "I have all I can do to write my radio scripts. Besides I feel that I can be a better critic if I don't jump the fence."

Our glib Johnny Murray doesn't hole up in a secluded, quiet corner to do his reading, which also happens to be his work. On the contrary he reads in the dining room of his house amidst the normal domestic distractions, among which are two teen-age children. Neither does he believe in pampering himself. Instead of curling up in a soft easy chair, he finds a right-angle position in a hard chair more conducive to concentration.

The former musician-singer (his voice was frequently dubbed for Richard Barthelmess in many of the former star's musical pictures) entered the radio field in 1931 via KFWB. "Those were the days," says Johnny, "when staff members were called upon to do anything from singing songs to playing four or five roles in a single drama. Providing our own sound effects was considered incidental. But it was a grand education and afforded invaluable experience," he said.

### Joins KFI

Johnny joined KFI in 1938 and today has three programs of his own on the station. On his daily "Johnny Murray Talks It Over" he delivers a capsule report on interesting fiction stories, sports articles and items of general interest. "The World We Live In" is devoted to personality sketches and the background of people who are actually responsible for the present-day world we live in.

To do "World of Books" Johnny has to read almost every book off the publishing house presses. His detailed analysis and discussion of these volumes has become a listener's must. The author-guest list on this program reads like a who's who in the literary world. Herman Wouk, Paul Wellman, Bennett Cerf, Fleur Cowles, and J. Arthur Kennedy are but a few of the prominent authors who have shared the mike with Johnny.

Regarding the public's reading habits, Johnny had this to say: "Escape literature, so popular dur-

ing the war, is on the decline; whereas the upswing in biographical and factual books is increasing daily. Book shops can't seem to meet the demand for 'How To' books. There isn't a subject under the sun that isn't covered by a 'How To' book whether it be . . . how to can melba peaches or how to build a model railroad."

Johnny's personal preferences are biographies.

### Favorites

According to Johnny, Hemingway is a master craftsman and in a class of his own. Ferber, Costain and Hemingway are his favorite writers. He cites young Truman Capote's works as an example of studied, ineffectual writing.

Johnny has never had the time to reread a book he has particularly enjoyed. "I have to keep up with the new ones as they come off the press," he says, "but I love to read and I hope my radio presentations help to make reading once again a popular pastime—in spite of TV."

**F**UN-LOVING, laugh-provoking CBS-TV star Jackie Gleason has a serious streak in his nature—for example his strong belief in fate.

He owns some 350 books on the subject of psychic phenomena, hypnotism, telepathy and other aspects of extrasensory perception. Explaining his interest in this field he says: "While studying theology I became interested in the lives of saints. Their supernormal powers made me curious to understand their phenomena. This naturally brought me around to the study of extrasensory perception. It has proved to be such a fascinating subject that it has become my hobby."

But what is Jackie really like?

"My pet peeve is the complainer and the person who always tries to shift the blame," he exclaims.

He has a soft spot for the tune "Tenderly," which is the background music for his "Poor Soul" sketches. Many people have asked him which of the characterizations he does is his favorite. To which he candidly replies: "I like them all and the favorite is the one I happen to have the best script for at the time."

Speaking of favorites, Jackie's favorite color is orange. A vibrant color for a vibrant personality. His favorite serious music is Beethoven. He also likes string music in any form, whether it be a steel guitar or chamber music.

Jackie's favorite foods are Italian

or Chinese cuisine, but because he has a tendency to become overweight, he reserves these dishes for special occasions.

### Career

Rotund Jackie's rags-to-riches career is a fascinating success story, for his road to fame was rough and rocky. He was left parentless at the age of sixteen. When he lost his mother, he lost the only person who had consistently encouraged his youthful ambition for show business. He launched his career, while in his teens, by performing in amateur-night acts; subsequently he played vaudeville and night clubs. In 1940, movie mogul Jack Warner saw him and signed him for pictures. Five pictures and two years later he returned to New York and the Broadway stage. Jackie reached stardom in such musical comedies as "Artists and Models," "Follow the Girls," "Rosalie," "Rio Rita" and "The Show-Off."

He made his television bow in the lead role of "The Life of Riley." But the variety-comedy format of DuMont's "Cavalcade of Stars" was more up his alley than the situation comedy. Jackie's popularity started to climb with his "Cavalcade" show and it continues to spiral on the CBS net.

Jackie has worked hard for the success he so richly deserves. He has received several offers to make a motion picture this summer, but as he puts it: "I believe it absolutely necessary for me to rest at the close of this TV season, therefore I have accepted none of these offers." Jackie was once quoted as saying: "The perfect vacation, it seems to me, would be an absolute break from show business."

**O**N CAMERA, George and Jackson are constantly going through the buddy-buddy routine.

George Putnam finishes his newscasts on KTTV around 11:15 p.m. and then tells his audience "Your old dad, Jackson Wheeler" will follow shortly.

Jackson does show up (he hasn't missed a show in five years)—usually breathing hard because he calls his wife every night at 11 o'clock and then he has to run across the studio to be on time. Right away, he goes into a laudatory spiel about the newscasting merits of his long-time friend, George Putnam.

What the viewer may ask occasionally (and if he is a person of average intelligence and sensitivities, he certainly couldn't be blamed for it), is simply this: Are George and Jackson on the level with this routine? Do they really feel this way about each other's ability? Or are they being hams about the whole deal, and just laying it on pretty thick for the gullible public?

I have spent many, many hours at KTTV just passing away the time of night with Wheeler, Putnam, and the rest of the crew. During all that time, only the most pleasant, jovial, and businesslike conversation was ever heard between these two men. And things haven't always been too quiet on ye ole KTTV front.

### Not All Roses

For example, there was the one occasion when a sponsor bought a news show for the early hours in the morning. Wheeler was going to narrate it. Wheeler was informed he was to use some of Putnam's early

news, and some late news bulletins.

Well, George was ready to blow his top! And who could blame the guy! Here he works all day and night reading and editing and working on film clips—just to have it re-read on the air a little later.

If it had been anyone else except Jackson Wheeler, there's no telling what the stunned Mr. Putnam might have done. As it was, he and Jackson sat down together and within a few hours the situation was all straightened out.

To relate the hundreds of incidents and the numerous qualities these men have in common would take a book. However, there are a few obvious principles involved.

Both men are basically extroverts. They have the same outlooks, standards, and tastes. They can both take a joke, and they certainly know how to hand it out! When it comes to work, years of experience have taught them when to "stick to business" and when to "horse around." They do their share of both — on camera and off.

One afternoon, I put these guys on a spot. In the presence of both men, I asked each of them what he really thought of the other's ability.

### Wheeler Deals

It didn't take Jackson very long to articulate a few thousand words on the subject. Briefly, he said this:

"I honestly believe George is tops in his field of newscasting. For three main reasons: 1. He's authoritative. Combining innate intelligence with years of experience, he is able to analyze and write news the way it should be written. And don't for-

get that George writes his own copy.

"2. He's sincere.

"3. He has personality. Especially for TV, if you have all the other things and don't have the personality to carry it over then all that talent is wasted. Fortunately, George has all these things combined."

George looked a little embarrassed sitting there as Jackson spoke—and Russell Hayden, the cowboy star, can tell you because he was there when this happened.

"I had a feeling this was going to sound like a love nest or something," George commented. "And I feel kind of funny about it. But I can't let Jackson have the last word," he smiled.

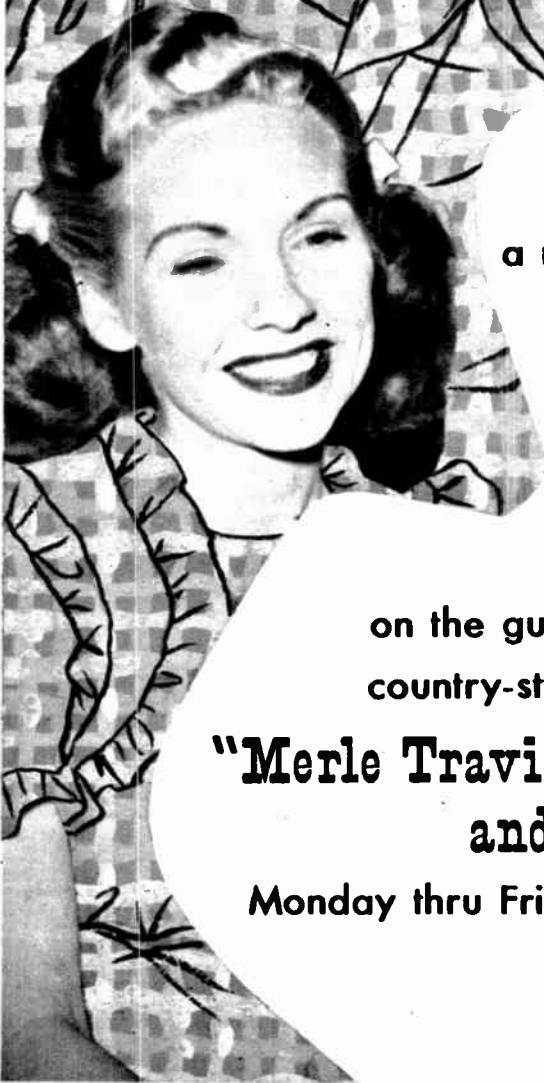
"Seriously, I doubt if anyone else could do the job that Jackson does night after night on Channel 11. When you consider the number of shows—it averages twenty-eight a week, doesn't it, Jackson?—with over thirty hours on camera, with over seventy different sponsors, then you only begin to realize the tremendous job that he does. And Jackson has to know his products, because he doesn't endorse anything he doesn't believe in."

Jackson was blushing now. "I've got the quantity, Georgie boy. But you have the quality!" Jackson said.

"Well, yes. That's true!" George kidded.

"Now wait a minute. I want to clarify my statement . . ." Jackson started, seemingly trapped by his own words.

—Okay, gents. That's enough for the Wheeler-Putnam commercial. Let's get back to the picture.

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Around TV Row

Because his mail indicated that viewers were not in favor of film previews, Ed Sullivan has decided to drop the film clips from "Toast of the Town." . . . Author Ben Hecht has an extensive library, yet its shelves do not contain a single copy of his own writings. . . . KNXT is reverting its 10:30 News show to a half hour for more complete coverage. . . . Dave Willock is set as panelist on Mike Stokey's returning "Pantomime Quiz." . . . William Spier will lend his production genius to CBS-TV's new dramatic series "Medallion Theatre." . . . A milestone in television and motion-picture history was announced last week when ABC-TV and MPAA combined their resources for a new television series. Tentatively titled "Hollywood Parade," the program will present highlight excerpts from current top-flight screen attractions, personal appearances by leading screen stars

and feature top talent in the role of the host from the film industry. . . . Mystery fans, before too long you'll be able to enjoy one of radio's favorite thrillers on your TV screens. NBC is filming "Inner Sanctum" for release next fall. . . . "Pentagon Confidential," a new dramatic series based upon actual cases from the files of the Criminal Investigation Division of the U. S. Army, makes its bow next August. . . . Mary Healy and Peter Lind Hayes were tricked into visiting the El Capitan Theatre last week on the premise that they were to make a trailer exploiting their newest picture. And Mary was one surprised gal when Ralph Edwards televised her life on "This Is Your Life." . . . Eddie Albert is finding TV kinder to him in New York than it was in Hollywood. In addition to all his dramatic performances, he now hosts a new variety stanza titled "Nothing But the Best." From the looks of the talent roster that's exactly what it's going to be. . . . Burgess Meredith exits his role as narrator on radio's "Adventure" series for a more suitable one on NBC-TV's "Junior Omnibus," slated for fall viewing. . . . In his first talent deal to stock up on stars for the "new" "Show of Shows" next season, Max Liebman signed Patrice Munsel. . . . Lawrence Welk announces his new Champagne Lady on July 3. It will be one of these four contestants: Aileen Stanley, Jr., Alice Lon, Vea Jay or Bunny Bishop.—M.R.

### Problems, Mr. Potter?

The discontent among the disc-jockey fraternity over the alleged preference given to spinner Peter Potter by record promotion men has been brewing for a long time but it's out in the open now. KFWB's deejays announced a 30-day ban on any record that was not delivered simultaneously to all of the town's disc pockeys.

Potter uses only seven new discs on his "Jury" show, which is built exclusively around new releases. Assuming that there are at least fifty new records released each week, why can't the other deejays preview the unused records? Surely, Mr. Potter can't pick all of the winners all of the time.

### "Saturday Night Revue"

Saturdays, 6 p.m., KNBH

"Saturday Night Revue," which is taking over "Show of Shows" time, is definitely no summer replacement. It is a big production that can stand on its own, although the hour-and-a-half time slot is too long.

Hoagy Carmichael makes a pleasantly unobtrusive emcee and his inimitable song styling is quite a joy. He keeps himself in center stage without becoming annoying or too much of a "star" attraction.

On the whole, the acts are good—even though not startlingly different.

When performers such as Mr. Donnell and Miss Patterson receive no name credit, and when some of the top acts are passed off so casually, something should be done fast to correct this flagrant error.

### "Masquerade Party"

Monday, 9:30 p.m.  
CBS-TV (KNXT)

"Masquerade Party" is another entry in the long and growing list of panel quiz shows. However, it is a cut above the other shows in this category because of its eye appeal.

The panel—Ilka Chase, Buff Cobb, Ogden Nash and Peter Donald—try to guess the identity of celebrities who masquerade in colorful disguises. The costumes these celebs wear are supposed to have some identification with their respective names. For example Yankee player Mickey Mantle was disguised in a cavalier's costume. The cape or mantle about his shoulders symbolized his name.

The panel guessed Mickey's identity, as they did Gloria Swanson's, who dressed up as a Keystone cop. Swanson's putty nose didn't fool Ilka Chase. However, the panel was stumped by Patrice Munsel, who with her husband, Bob Schuler, was dressed in a burger's costume. To make the guessing more difficult for the panel, a scrambled mike which completely distorts the voice is used by the evasive celebrities.

Commentator Doug Edwards is a bit stiff in his new role of emcee/host, but with a few more shows under his wing his uneasiness will probably disappear.

If you're trying to find a panel show that's a little different "Masquerade Party" might be your answer. At least the costumes will be intriguing.—M.R.

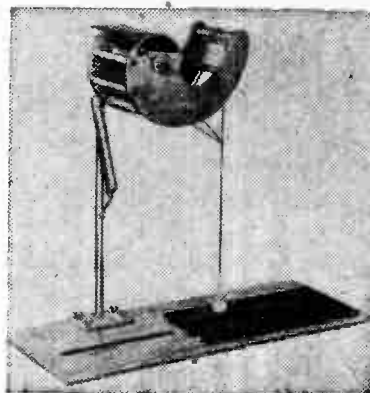

back in 1941, and also did the role of the gal on **"I Love a Mystery."** For the TV version of "Family," she enacted the role of **"Beth Holly,"** so her association with Morse undertakings has been pretty close.

**IT WAS LIKE OLD-HOME WEEK TO HER,** when she arrived back in Hollywood and walked into the Columbia Square studio to be greeted by persons with whom she had worked in Chicago years ago—Announcer **Charlie Lyon, Marvin Miller** and **Russell Thorsen**—and others like **Jeanette Nolan** and **Forrest Lewis**. In nothing flat, Mercedes related, the studio atmosphere was old shoe. To this, add Morse's fine respect and consideration for those working with him—the pleasant "Good morning" and the steaming hot cups of coffee instead of "Hiya folks, let's get to work" — and a cast gives its very best. Too few directors, Mercedes thinks, observe these important little customs of the theater. Carlton E. Morse is one and Mercedes's husband of **"Studio One"** fame is another.

**AS YET, MERCEDES'S ELEVEN-YEAR-OLD SON** (by her first husband, but now legally adopted by Markle) shows no interest in acting. He wants to be a farmer. As soon as he gets here from his vacation, he'll buy a German shepherd dog. The kind he wants costs about \$75 or \$100, so John saved \$35 toward its purchase.

**TOPS IN SINGLES:** Just in time for his Hollywood Palladium opening, "**Some Of These Days,**" played with a slow beat and featuring maestro **Buddy Morrow's** trombone (RCA-Victor) is just about the best for this band to date.

... reminded me of a guy named Phil Janazzio.

After World War II, I played some semi-pro ball one summer for a club in New York. Phil was the third sacker. Of Italian descent, he was in his thirties, a married man with kids, and had a good job. But like so many other men, he had baseball in his blood. It was a part of his life, and as long as he could hold his own, he had to play the game.



Maybe it was the big wad of chewing tobacco he always had bulging out of the side of his mouth; or the way he wore his uniform and handled himself in the field; or the vicious look in his eye every time he faced a chucker? At any rate, Phil always impressed me as having "class" as a ball player.

What has this got to do with Phil Rizzuto and the Yankees? Just this.

For many years the Reese-vs.-Rizzuto argument has been going on. One night in the locker room, talking to Phil, I opened my big mouth and expressed my preference for Reese.

"Let me tell you something," Phil said. "And don't forget it. Shortstop is the most important position on any ball club. And Phil Rizzuto is the greatest shortstop in the game today. He may be a small man, and he doesn't get the publicity like DiMag and the other boys do, but he holds that Yankee club together."

In the late 1930's, Phil Janazzio and Phil Rizzuto played pro ball together in the minor leagues. Janazzio went into great length about many of the fine points of Rizzuto's playing—which I don't have the space (or memory) to go into now.

Ever since then, I've been convinced of the greatness of Phil Rizzuto. If YOU are not, take a look at the record books.

Rizzuto has been the regular shortstop for the Yankees since 1941. The Yankees won the pennant in 1941, 1942, and 1943.

Rizzuto was in the service for three years. The Yankees, with Phil back at his old post, won the pennant in 1947, 1949, 1950, 1951, and 1952. And six of those seven times, they went on to win the World's Championship!

Last Monday night's blackout of wrestling over KTTV created a storm which jammed the switchboards at KTTV, the American Legion Stadium, The Los Angeles Times and Daily News and even my own telephone.

The wrestling fans demanded to know what was going on. During the last few years television fans have made Monday night wrestling night. All over Southern California fans hurried through their evening's chores, settled themselves down for an evening's entertainment and—no wrestling. According to official polls Monday night wrestling leads all others in popularity—and fans were not going to take the loss of it without a protest.

Several elements contribute to making Monday night wrestling the top grappling show. One is the skillful matchmaking of men of equal calibre and size. Promoter Hugh Nichols and matchmaker Pat O'Brien listen to the public request for matches and try to give the people what they want. The Hollywood Legion is the only televised arena which is run by wrestlers. Hugh Nichols is recognized by all wrestlers and people in the wrestling business as the greatest light heavyweight of all times. O'Brien is also one of the greats in the light heavyweight division. For twenty years he wrestled all over the world. So it is easy to understand why men like these are able to make and present better matches.

Another important factor in the success of Monday night wrestling is Bill Welsh's sportscasting. Through the years Bill has endeared himself to televiewers through his colorful handling of special events and his warm presentation of sports events.

Back to the blackout. I will try to give you an impartial explanation of both sides of the story. In a way, it was a misunderstanding by the parties involved. A corporation, Ring Talent, Inc., has negotiated contracts for wrestling shows between the three parties concerned, the promoter, the television station, and wrestlers.

Some three months ago promoter Nichols contracted to film one of the matches at the Stadium. It was the

outcome of this filming which caused the blackout. Ring Talent felt that Nichols had no right to negotiate privately to film and refused to let him do so. Nichols, who has been promoting in the Legion Stadium for nearly twenty years, said that so long as he had no contract preventing him from filming matches and because he had done so many times in the past, he had every right to.

When Ring Talent said he couldn't make the film, Nichols said they couldn't televise his matches. Everyone was hurt. Ring Talent and Nichols and the wrestlers were all out the television money. Monday night fans abruptly lost an accustomed pleasure.

As we go to press, I have just talked to the men involved in the dispute and it looks very much like the trouble has been ironed out.

# *What I Learned From My Illness*

*What does the nearness of death teach a man? In Eddie Cantor's case he learned how to live.*

**L**AST SEPTEMBER the show world was stunned by the news that Eddie Cantor had suffered a heart attack. To millions, Eddie had always seemed indestructible. It seemed impossible to think of death walking so closely with him those first few days.

When a man has come face to face with the fact that his life may be cut short, he usually awakens to vast new realizations about himself, his work, his attitude toward living. Eddie came out of the Cedars of Lebanon Hospital not only a well man but a man with a brand-new philosophy toward life.

#### **Show Needn't Go On**

"I guess the greatest lesson I learned was that the old adage of 'the show must go on' is ridiculous," Eddie said. "It doesn't have to go on—but you do.

"To paraphrase a famous quotation, 'What profiteth an actor if he gain some notices and lose his life?' I suddenly saw the futility of driving myself constantly, of feeling I had to do everything. I learned I didn't have to do my job the hard way. I'm like a couple of pitchers now in the big leagues. Both have right arms that aren't as strong as they were ten years ago but they're still winning ball games by pitch-

ing with their heads. That's what I'm doing now — pitching with my head.

"Before my illness last September I had just finished an extensive tour in which I put on a two-hour one-man performance in Eastern cities to raise blood for the Red Cross. The price of admission to my shows was a pint of blood. I managed to get 110,000 pints in fourteen days. The day I had my attack I had planned to take off on another tour to raise money for Israel. When I had to cancel, friends of mine like Eddie Robinson took over for me—and I found that the job would be done without me.

"Now when there's a request for me to make some kind of a speech for a worthy cause I try to arrange a telephone set-up so I can make my speech over the phone instead of dashing all over the country. I am so convinced now that learning to relax and taking care of myself is important that I have even sold my contemporaries on the new philosophy."

#### **Mail Pours In**

While Eddie was in the hospital he received over 50,000 pieces of mail from fans all over the country, among which was a letter from the campaign train of President Eisenhower.

"There were 141 people in Scranton, too, who gave a pint of blood each to help me get well," Eddie said with real pride. "A priest even wrote me that over 100 candles had been lit in his parish by people praying for my recovery. But perhaps the most startling mail came from a woman in Boston who wrote me an air-mail letter every day. She said she had seen me first many years ago when she was engaged to be married—and was now a grandmother of four. She wrote: 'We would rather see a little less of you over a longer period of time.'

"Because of my illness I have a chance to use more new talent on my Comedy Hour shows. I don't think it matters at all to audiences whether a star is on for twenty-five minutes or an hour on a show if the material is good. And I don't think the public wants any performer to work so hard that he impairs his health. So now I can take it easy and still get a thrill out of seeing a new talent get a break on my show."

Eddie paused momentarily, stared into space, and then said quietly, "Some ask me why I just don't quit. I could and be all right, economically speaking. But I'd never be happy out of show business. It's the only life I've known. Without it I'd really be dead—inside."

"The bright lights were very hot. The mascara, which I had to put on extra thick on my eyebrows, began to melt from the intense heat. Instead of appearing happy and at ease, I looked as if I were crying!"

The young lady's name was Marion Morgan.

## Six Years Later

Oddly enough, almost six years later, Marion made her "second debut" on the same Channel 5. It was January, 1953, and she appeared as the new feminine vocalist on "Bandstand Revue."

This time—in addition to the technical improvements—Marion gave a fine, polished performance. She had become a "real trouper," as the saying goes.

Many events and people had crossed Marion's path during these six years to account for the theatrical metamorphosis.

First of all, there was Harry James. "A real great guy and a wonderful bunch of fellows," says Marion. She toured with "The Mu-

sic Makers" for two and a half years, and then went on her own.

Singing jobs were scarce then. One day she got a break when she was asked to fill in for an act at Ciro's.

Opening-night jitters caused a disappointing performance. Joan Crawford was there.

Joan said: "I like your voice very much, Marion; most of the other things you do can be improved tremendously. Do you mind if I help you?"

Thereafter under Joan's tutelage, Marion learned lots of little tricks of the trade she had never known before. Joan changed her hair-do, coached her in posture, made her re-

duce, and completely revamped her act.

Since then, Miss Morgan has appeared in almost every big-name night club from coast to coast. She also appeared regularly on "Break the Bank" and made MGM recordings.

## Last, But Not Least

Then there was her husband, Sid Beller. Formerly associated with Harry James, today Sid is Marion's manager. They were married in 1950 and live in North Hollywood.

What would Marion like to do in the future?

"I'm not asking for too much," she smiles. "Just my own show on TV, a fat recording contract, a radio show, theatrical engagements, some occasional night-club appearances, and of course, the movies. Seriously, my big ambition is to star in motion pictures."

Marion believes that, if properly handled, there shouldn't be any conflict between her career and her marital life.

Also, she has no intention of singing full-time with a band again.

"I'm past that stage," she says. "Besides, I've had enough of those one-night stands. They're rugged.

"I remember one night down South when we played several one-nighters in a row. I was really tired. I casually remarked to a gentleman:

"'You have a lovely city here. We sure had a nice time in Memphis last night.'

"'Lady,' he replied, 'This is Memphis!'"





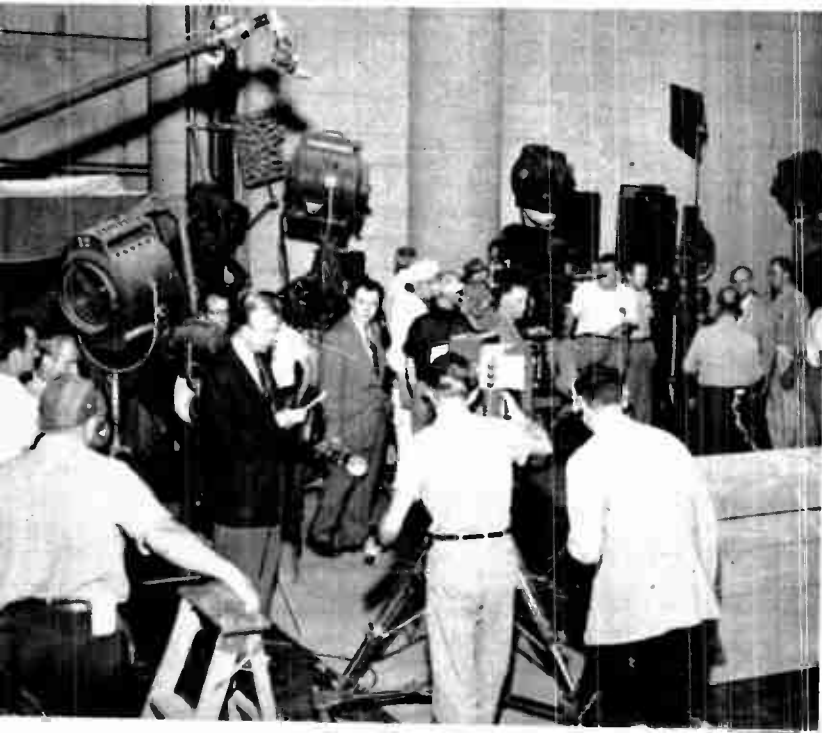
