Music Hath Charms - And How!

REMEMBER THE days when opera stars playing love scenes reminded you of two ten-ton trucks doing a head-on collision?

Well, fortunately, the new motif today is for curves, beauty, and charm—and Dorothy Warenskjold, the lovely who sings with Gordon MacRae these summer evenings over NBC radio on "The Railroad Hour," is a convincing example of this new trend.

"Practically every opera star you can name has conformed to the movie-star type," Dorothy commented recently. "People no longer will stand for a star weighing over 160 portraying a frail young thing dying of consumption. And TV has had a lot to do too with adjusting the public's insistence on the right curves in the right places."

Dorothy has had an extensive career as one of the country's most prominent singers. She has appeared on television on the Standard Hour series, on the "Ford Festival" with James Melton, and on "The Voice of Firestone." On radio she has been heard on "The Railroad Hour," "The Voice of Firestone," "Harvest of Stars," and many others. She is also well known for her concert tours and her opera appearances with the San Francisco Opera Company.

Prefers Radio . . .

"I frankly prefer radio over TV,"

Dorothy said, "and simply because it's so much easier. The time spent on rehearsals for a television show is fantastic. Gordon MacRae told me recently that he rehearsed for fifteen hours for a single fifteen-minute TV spot. In contrast, our radio show requires only about an hour preparation."

Dorothy has intrigued many by her talent—and by her name. She has steadfastly refused to change it and only reminds people that the last name is pronounced: "Waren-shold."

"I was attending a very important social function in Cincinnati once," Dorothy smiled. "The man in charge made a great point of telling me that he had spent three days practicing the pronunciation of my name. When he took me around to introduce me something happened for he called me 'Miss Watchrotch.' I'll never know how he got that one. But I've been called many things—even Miss Wag. . . ."

Memorable Moments

One of this embarrassment Dorothy told me of her experience was the night her career. . . .

She was doing the James Melton show one evening as usual, about nine minutes when he cut from the show. She had one quick one-minute change of which involved removing a wig, putting on a different and elaborate dress, and a

few other items. After she finished one scene, she rushed into her dressing room to make the fast change. Then she ran to the wings to wait for her cue. Suddenly, there was a prolonged silence on stage.

"I instinctively felt I should be on stage," Dorothy said, "even though I hadn't had my cue. I was right—the pause was for my entrance. It seems more time had been cut and nobody had so informed me."

"James Melton was responsible for another memorable moment."

"I heard he was opening at the Thunderbird in Las Vegas so I decided to go down to catch his show. I sent him a wire beforehand saying I was coming. When I got to my hotel I had an urgent message to call James. I did—and he excitedly told me he had laryngitis and would I do the show for him that night. I had never sung in a night club before, but I agreed."

"I'll never forget that opening night. I was scared stiff. Just how would a night-club audience react to my kind of singing? Well, I did the show and even sang an operatic aria. I am happy to say the people seemed to like me. I substituted for James for about five shows."

Dorothy now lives in Encino with her family—and she is not thinking of changing her single status as yet.

"I'm traveling so much I never have the time to acquire any romance," she laughed. "But I'm not worried—the day will come."

Dorothy has no unachieved ambition. She has covered all the fields possible in her career. About all she wants from life is to be able to sing as much as possible.

With the combination of beauty and talent, Dorothy can go on charming the public for as long as she wishes.

GORDON MacRAE AND DOROTHY have sparked many a Monday evening over NBC-Radio with their performances on "The Railroad Hour." Dorothy has appeared on radio and on television. The star is fast becoming a local as well as a national favorite.

PENNY SINGLETON—Better known as "Blondie" to millions of radio and motion-picture fans, Penny still does night-club work but has never found the right format for her own program on TV.

BOB BURNS—The ole "bazooka" man of radio and movie fame is now retired and lives a life of ease in the San Fernando Valley. He is independently wealthy.

SANDRA BERKOVA—One of the most talented and telegenic girls



ever to hit the local screens was Sandra Berkova, the lovely blonde violinist who appeared regularly on the Ina Ray Hutton All-Girl Show. Because she appeared on another channel, her contract was terminated with KTLA. After that she made a few guest appearances, but never regained the spotlight or popularity she once had. No one seems to know what Sandra is doing now. One rumor several months ago reported that she was in San Francisco. Why this girl was not taken in hand and developed into a star in the TV world is still a great mystery and misfortune.

FRANK SINATRA—The idol of the bobby-soxers is still active in show business singing at concerts, making records and doing night-club work. However, ever since the cancellation of his own CBS-TV show last year, and with the exception of a few guest appearances, Frankie still hasn't been able to hit his stride on TV. But don't count Frankie out. For years now they've been saying he's "through." But then he always seems to come up with a hit record or a good night-club stand. Maybe he'll do the same on TV. He has just finished a role in "From Here To Eternity" for Columbia Pictures.

AL PEARCE—A vet of radio for

many years, Al took a crack at TV last year with a coast-to-coast morning show over CBS-TV. It didn't work out too well. So Al is back growing prunes in Northern California. It's a lucrative business, and he says he's much happier.

DAGMAR—For several years, particularly back East, Dagmar was the most talked-about girl on TV, mainly because of her appearances on "Broadway Open House." Now, with the exception of a few guest appearances, she is hardly ever seen. APC and NBC both tried for some time to work out a format for Dagmar; neither succeeded. Now, according to the latest information we have from New York, she is devoting most of her time to a few night-club shows—and her husband, Danny Dayton, whom she married in Las Vegas, May 21, 1951.

JERRY COLONNA—Long a favorite to TV and radio fans, Jerry formerly had his own show on Channel 7. Now his TV activities consist mainly of guest appearances.

FOREMAN PHILLIPS—Although Foreman's show has been off KECA-TV for several years now, TV-RADIO LIFE still receives letters asking what he is doing now. Currently, Foreman concentrates all his energy on operating his own dance hall in Compton.

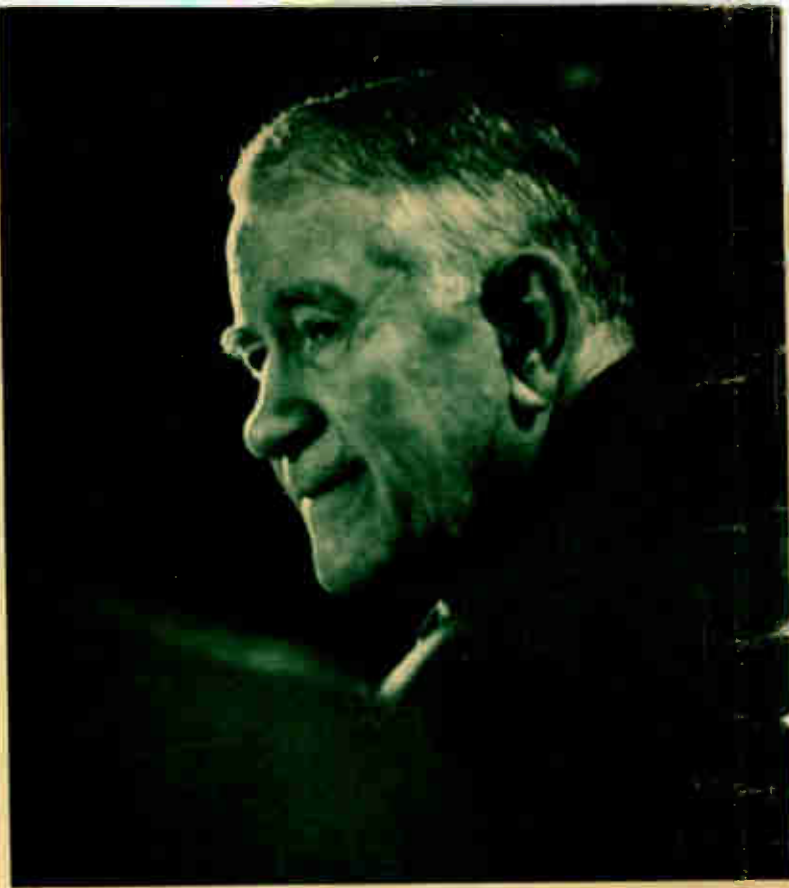

Former Vice President Alben Barkley submits to exclusive interview for TV-Radio Life

ALBEN W. BARKLEY may no longer be Vice President but his influence and opinions continue to be put before the American public. Not from the floor of Congress, true, but from another and newer sounding board . . . the television camera. Mr. Barkley reaches millions of citizens through his weekly NBC-TV telecasts (KNBH, 3:15 p.m. Sunday).

We contacted Mr. Barkley in Washington, and asked him some questions pertinent to his new career as a television commentator.

How do you feel you differ from other TV political commentators?

Whether I differ from other television political commentators may be a matter of public opinion. I am trying to make my comments informative and instructive . . . not too heavy . . . but to contain a good many basic truths.

Would you rather be a Vice President of the U.S. or a TV star?

As to whether I would rather be Vice President or a television star, I do not know that I am a television star, and I am quite certain I will not again be Vice President, so the question is academic.

Does the TV camera make you nervous? Would you rather address Congress or an unseen TV audience?

The television camera does not make me nervous. I have appeared

on radio and television casually at conventions, dinners, and at all sorts of public gatherings. Found it a little different when I was on my own program. It caused some anxiety as to whether the program would be well received or valuable. The reaction has been very satisfactory up to now.

Do you use make-up for your TV appearances?

I do not use make-up for my television appearances.

Do you plan to have Mrs. Barkley on your TV program?

I have had Mrs. Barkley on my program once and may have her again, but not regularly.

What does she think of your new "career"?

She thinks very well of my new career.

How do you plan to adhere to a non-partisan format?

I plan to adhere to a non-partisan format by discussing questions in a non-partisan way. I have not abrogated my position as a Democrat and do not intend to. I reserve the right to be as partisan as I feel like being elsewhere and on other occasions, but that on this program I should be as non-partisan as possible.

What are the most important issues in this country today?

There are so many important issues before the country that it would

be impossible to discuss all of them: Inflation; taxation; expenditures; world trade; world peace; the Korean situation; the welfare of the farmer, the laborer, the businessman; and many others could be catalogued. Some of these I have discussed and may discuss others as their importance may become current and appropriate.

What are the most popular misconceptions regarding Congressmen and/or politicians at large?

One of the most popular misconceptions regarding Congressmen and public officials at large may be said to be a general idea that because of a few of them being venal, the whole lot are corrupt and dishonest. One shyster lawyer can ruin the reputation of the whole Bar. My forty years experience in both Houses of Congress has convinced me that the vast majority of them are honest, hard-working, sincere public servants, and that goes for all other public officials, whether elected or appointed.

May we have one of your choice humorous anecdotes?

Since this is the commencement season, it might be appropriate to recall that one farmer said to another: "Where is your son?" "In college," said the other. "Do you miss him?" "I certainly do. He taught the livestock never to move until they heard the college yell, and I have forgotten it."

Fred Clark, who played the role for the past two seasons, withdrew because he felt he was becoming type-cast. This situation is becoming more and more prevalent as TV grows. Cathy Lewis resigned from "My Friend Irma" for the same reason and Robert Preston nixed a TV series because he too didn't want to lose his identity in a running part. . . . "The Modernaires," long associated with Bob Crosby during his "Club 15" radio days, will join the maestro on his five-a-week afternoon CBS-TV airer. . . . Reports indicate that the Spanish version of "Howdy Doody" ("La Hora de Jaudi Dudi") is being avidly greeted by Mexico's little amigos.

KHJ-TV is going to air the "Little League Baseball" games August 13, 14, and 15. . . . Jovial Jack McElroy is planning to participate in the "Fishermen's Fiesta" next September. The KNBH star has latched on to a tuna boat for the occasion. Lawrence Welk chalks up his 100th consecutive telecast on KTLA. . . . Philip Morris has picked up the tab on Ezio Pinza's new stanza, tentatively titled "I Bonino." . . . KBIC-TV are the call letters assigned to John Poole's Sacramento station. But you'll have to have a UHF set to get the station because it has been allocated to Channel 46.

Now It Can Be Proven: TV Advertising Pays

Each month various agencies publish "ratings" of various TV shows. Although not infallible they are, to date, the most scientific way of measuring how many people are watching a particular show.

Valuable as these surveys may be, they still leave unanswered a very pertinent question for TV advertisers.

"We know approximately how many people are watching a show, but how can we tell how effective TV advertising on the show actually is? High ratings are nice to have, but if the show is not selling a product it is not worth much to the advertiser who is forking over thousands (sometimes millions) of dollars.

In a special survey just released in Los Angeles, NBC-TV has attempted to answer the advertiser's questions. Called "Why Sales Come in Curves," the report was based (not on bathing beauties, darn it), but on a two-wave survey conducted with a cross section of people in a typical medium-sized Midwestern market in February and May, 1952. Over 9750 people were interviewed by W. R. Simmons and As-

sociates, Research, Inc., of New York. These were the conclusions:

- (1) When customers begin viewing TV, they also begin buying the products they see advertised.
- (2) If they stop viewing TV, they tend to stop buying the goods they no longer see advertised.
- (3) And if they continue viewing, they continue buying the brands they see advertised.

These conclusions might prompt one to say: "Elementary, my dear Watson. TV advertising pays! I could have told you that before you started."

The main point, however, is that by means of this research NBC-TV now has the facts in black and white to show to current and prospective advertisers.

What's Happened to Color TV?

Color television was once as exciting a topic to the industry as 3-D has become to the movies.

Recently, color TV was opened up again as an issue when the House Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce conducted some hearings on the present status of TV with pastel hues.

After a lot of general yakking, Dr. Frank Stanton, president of CBS, got down to some brass tacks.

"I wish to record our genuine hope that these hearings will speed the day of color by clearing the air and clarifying the confusion.

"We might as well face it, all of us—broadcasters, manufacturers, distributors and dealers, and especially the public which spends its dollars for receivers—can plan sensibly and soundly for the future only if those who are interested in the new color system take the matter before the Federal Communications Commission, as we have repeatedly urged them to do since December 1950, and get this question settled once and for all at the earliest possible moment. Once settled by the Commission—either in favor of the present Field Sequential System or in favor of the new system

—we can go forward to bring color television to the people promptly.”

Dr. Stanton then went out to put a few more facts squarely before the House Committee.

“We had thought and we had hoped that the FCC decision in 1950 and the long litigation would settle the matter at least for a reasonable time. We had thought and we had hoped that when during the FCC hearing, the President of the Radio-Television Manufacturers Association testified that the association would support whatever system the FCC decided to approve, there was some assurance of industry cooperation.

“We had thought and we had hoped that the FCC decision would bring an end to the conflicting claims and the public's confusion and bewilderment which resulted from such claims. There were some hopes in the fall of 1951 that our hopes would be realized.”

Last week, CBS-TV took a further step. President J. L. Van Volkenberg announced that CBS-TV is planning to feed color programs to its network beginning on or about September 15, 1953. This is only on an experimental basis, and will not be receivable in the average home. CBS-TV will broadcast color under the N.T.S.C. (National Television Systems' Committee) plan.

If and when the NTSC color standards are adopted by the Federal Communications Commission, CBS-TV will immediately begin a regular schedule of network color broadcasts under that system.

The day when color TV will be practical for the average home is still a long way off, however.

... To the singing of Lucille Shepard on the “Jules and Ramona Strongbow at Home” show on Channel 13 last Wednesday night. A cute, telegenic, and talented young lady, Lucille has never sung professionally, but she certainly didn't show it. We hope this turns out to be a “big break” for her.

“Glamour Girl”

Every woman, regardless of her station in life, wants to be glamorous simply because she's a woman. Perhaps this is why NBC's new “Glamour Girl” stanza became an instant hit. It's not just an ordinary giveaway show; it's one with emotional appeal that reaches every woman in the audience.

Contestants are selected to tell affable emcee Harry Babbitt why they

want to be glamorized. The reasons vary for wanting glamour . . . to help gain employment, to impress the boy friend or to counteract the effects of bedridden years. The audience picks the winning contestant by applause, and within twenty-four hours she's given the full glamour treatment. Under the capable hands of Mary Webb Davis, the show's fashion coordinator, the winner is transformed by a luxurious new wardrobe, hair style and make-up. She also receives a staggering amount of gifts, including an all-expense-paid vacation.

The following day the winner appears on the show completely transformed into a charming glamour girl. When the husband or person most closely associated with each day's guest appears on the show to see the “new doll” his reaction adds a socko punch to the show.

“Glamour Girl” might well be the answer to daytime TV and set a new trend for a.m. audience-participation shows. Producer Don Ross and director Bill Bennington do a top-notch job in keeping the show well paced. Even the musical background under the direction of Gaylord Carter adds a touch of glamour to “Glamour Girl.”—M.R.

Al Jarvis D-J Show

Friday, 10:00 p.m.
KECA-TV, Channel 7

Another platter-panel show has hit the video lanes with little regard for originality. It's the “Al Jarvis D-J Show.”

Jarvis has a panel of four guest disc jockeys. Each in turn presents the new release he or she has selected to become a hit and gives specific reasons for the choice. These records are played for the viewers who cast their votes (via telephone) either confirming or dissenting the record choice of the guest d.j.

The votes are tallied on a tote board; however, in an endeavor to sustain interest and also to get the complete count the final results are not announced until the following week.

The show is encumbered by Jarvis's long-winded explanations and pleadings for the “jury at home” to telephone their votes. Neither do the used-car dealer's “unprofessional” commercials enhance the show.

On a recent ailer panelists Johnny Grant, Marilyn Hare, Donald Novis and Connie Haines, all of whom know their music and know it well, execut-

In the interests of sincere Christians who have been looking for spiritual guidance we are again bringing up the name of O. L. Jagers, KECA-TV's evangelist.

Mr. Jagers has claimed he has shut up this column for good. It seems he has a few things twisted. This column is hoping to join others, including Rev. Bob Shuler, Jr., of the Trinity Methodist Church and other ministers of the city in solving the Jagers puzzle. At a recent meeting of these gentlemen and certain civic leaders several questions were raised. The following are a few brought up then and at Rev. Shuler's Sunday service on July 26. **Can Jagers answer them—honestly?**

1. Were you defrocked from the Assemblies of God and why did you not appear before the committee to answer charges made against you?

2. Did you announce to your congregation that a Jonathan Perkins, who reportedly wrote your sermons, had never worked for you? If so, when Mr. Perkins made a claim against you for \$1200 back pay, why did you later send him a check for that amount with this notation on the check: "Settlement in full—all services by Jonathan Perkins terminated July 22, 1953"?

Do you actually own any property either in your own name or that of the World Church in San Bernardino County, and, if so, where is this on record?

4. Is the deed to your property which is described as Lots 9 to 15 of Tract 3438, Map Book 53, Page 3, recorded in Book 40809, Page 223 in the County Recorder's office? Is the said real property valued at \$9,660 for tax purposes and the buildings thereon

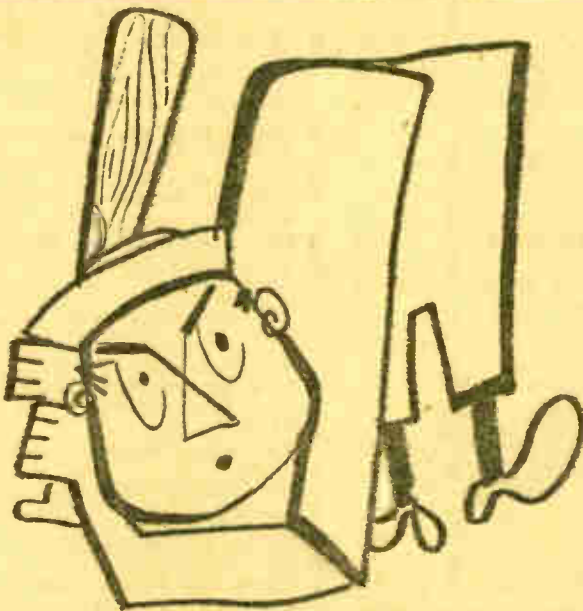

WILL ROGERS JR. DOESN'T THINK HE TALKS, acts or looks too much like his father, but twice during our interview chat at the Vine Street Derby he was approached for his autograph. Though Will Jr. recently sold his Beverly Hills Citizen, he's still a publisher—his new CBS radio show, "Rogers of the Gazette," has him cast in the believable role of a small-town newspaper editor—the human-interest stuff always seems to be more human and more interesting in a small town!

WILL JR. SEEMS TO BE IN THE same situation as the new baby whom every visitor scrutinizes and then declares: "He looks like his father," or "She has her mother's nose and her dad's eyes." (I once heard a dissenting grandfather snort, "Why can't the baby look like himself? Why does he have to look like anybody else?")

ROGERS CLAIMS HE DOESN'T have his father's superlative showbiz talent, that he hasn't inherited the perfect timing and the way with the joke which made Rogers Sr. so beloved. He may "look something like" his famous dad (I think he looks a lot like him) but he adds, "so does my brother." Will Jr.'s first problem in tackling a movie or radio role is to convince the powers-that-be that he can't and doesn't want to play his father—he is more comfortable being himself. One of the few to grasp this point at the outset was Mike Curtiz when the recent "Story of Will Rogers" was being filmed.

ROGERS JR. FEELS AT HOME IN HIS radio show and hopes that, as time goes on, more and more of the newspaper feeling will be injected. When he was first asked to do a radio program it was suggested that he take some of his father's quotes and supplement them with an up-to-date slant. Will Jr. recognizes his father as a master of the slowly built gag, the circuitous approach in which he does not consider himself expert, so the idea was discarded. Will Jr. also believes that radio has changed greatly since the days when his dad was on the air, though he just as firmly believes that were his father alive, radio today would have to conform to him if he had a show, not he to radio.

ROGERS WAS AMAZED RECENTLY TO DISCOVER how important and difficult radio writing can be—he tried his hand at some of the "Rogers of the Gazette" scripting. In between tapings of his CBS show, he hopes to do some magazine writing. Some stories on the Navajos are first on his list.

WHILE ENJOYING MY ROGERS INTERVIEW, I was happy to see Art Linkletter heading for a Derby table. He said his recent European trip had Page Twenty-six

really been an eye-opener, for he was able to talk to the man on the street and put his finger on the shaky pulse over there. He met many displaced persons—some had crossed borders in coffins or under hoods of cars—and their already sad situation was accentuated by their having nothing to do once they've escaped suppression. In fact, some escapees rotting away in camps have become so discouraged they talk of returning to their plights. Art expressed approval of the Congressional proposition to admit 200,000 of these unfortunates to the U.S. The Linkletters' eldest son accompanied Art and Lois on this trip. "For the first time I really got to know my boy," Link smiled. "Spent day after day with him. He's a good kid!"

Wrestlers are like anyone else who works for a living. They are like your next-door neighbor. They get tired of doing the same thing regularly and lose interest. After a while it shows up in their work. They get lazy and go into a slump.

This transition comes about so gradually that those of us who see them regularly don't even notice. Maybe we think that the matches are duller than they used to be but we don't realize why.

Of course many people still don't look upon wrestlers as human beings. They regard them as some kind of a curio or a substantiation of the Darwin theory. Actually, they make excellent neighbors and are a big jolly lot who love their homes and families. In general, they keep to themselves more than other folks do, however, and are much more clannish than other professions.

I have just talked with him via long-distance telephone and he will appear here by the time the story comes out.

TV's Pioneer Show

A SLEEPER," the man said.

No, he wasn't referring to Mr. Moto's famous wrestling hold. Or a poor, tired, old snoring specimen of humanity. He was talking about a TV show. The same show which he has been virtually the editor-in-chief of for over five years.

It was Gil Martyn, KTLA's stellar newsman. And he was talking about "Spotlight Magazine"—formerly known as "The Magazine of the Week."

What does Gil mean by a "sleeper"? Simply this:

KTLA's "Spotlight Magazine" has always been one of the cleanest, most refined, interesting, and substantial shows seen on the local screens. And steady. And how! Starting April 11, 1948, it is the oldest live show on the oldest commercial station in the West.

First Big Story

Because of the lack of sensationalism, sex, or theatrical gimmicks, very little publicity has been given to the show. As a matter of fact, this TV-RADIO LIFE interview with Editor Gil Martyn is the very first time that any publication has taken the time to find out some of the facts about the TV magazine.

Gil has been the editor-in-chief ever since the first telecast. He also holds the distinction of being the first newscaster ever to be heard and seen on a TV station, WNBT in New York. That was where he first met his present boss, Klaus Landsberg.

Gathering the news, contacting the personalities, and preparing the four to six features is a full week's job for Editor Gil. He gives particular credit to his associate editor, Ken

Graue, director Lloyd Backhaus, and floor manager Stan Winston. Capable Dorothy Gardiner has also been added recently as Fashion Co-ordinator.

Editorial Policy

Like any reputable magazine, Gil's has an editorial policy.

"On any story I telecast—and you must remember that the show is ninety per cent visual—I have three principles which I constantly consider: (1.) Educational; (2.) Cultural; (3.) Entertaining. If a feature does not fulfill at least one of these requirements, then it is never seen on camera."

Averaging from four to six features a week over a period of five years, the gamut of emotions have been evoked on this KTLA production.

The funniest, Editor Martyn recalls, was when one hundred baby monkeys got loose in the studio.

The most serious: when a leopard got vicious and bit Gil's leg.

The most difficult to get: the first Leonardo da Vinci collection.

During his years as Editor, Martyn has had over a thousand different ideas for stories, including many "scoops" and firsts. Only once has he failed to achieve his goal.

He wanted to borrow the original Gutenberg Bible from the Huntington Library and show it on the air. Insurance difficulties (the Bible itself is priceless) prevented him from doing it.

Probably the most interesting behind-the-scenes fact about "Spotlight" is a monetary one. Most TV shows, especially those with regular outstanding features and guests, have substantial, sometimes fantastic budgets to work with.

Editor Martyn's weekly budget: the telephone bill.

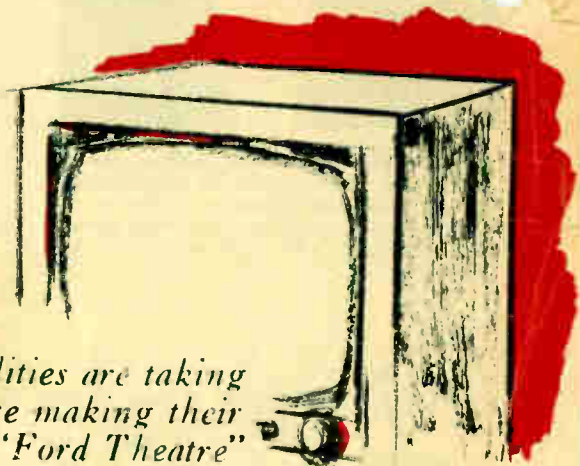

The Dick Lane You DON'T Know

ALTHOUGH DICK LANE is one of the real veteran TV personalities in the local area, there is a side to his personality that few people know about. This TV-RADIO LIFE story tells it for the first time.

DICK LANE is one of the real pioneers of local television. He has been with KTLA for over 11 years.

One day back in 1942, while working in a picture at Paramount, he wandered into a building with the sign "Television Productions" painted on a sound stage. He introduced himself to Klaus Landsberg, KTLA's organizer, asked for a job, got it, and has been at it ever since.

Now television being the very intimate medium it is, the public probably thinks they know Dick Lane pretty well. After eleven years of being invited into millions of living rooms on two, three and four shows a week, the public has seen almost as much of Dick as his own family.

The public probably feels closer to Dick, because, unlike many professionals in show business, he is the same type of person off-camera as he is on. The key word to his success is "sincerity." Otherwise, he would never be the top salesman he has been for these many years.

Unknown Side

However, strange as it may seem at first, there is one side to Dick Lane that is not known by the TV public. Thousands of people are aware of it, but thousands are not.

Sound like a contradiction? Well, it is. And here's the explanation:

Every week Dick Lane makes from three to five guest appearances at various benefits, dinners, celebrations, etc. At most of these affairs, only a few hundred people will show up. Now to these hundred people, this particular occasion is the most important event of the year.

Although, in a sense, it is good "business" to attend these functions, Dick Lane does not do it for business reasons. If he did, he certainly would not have to attend the thousands of affairs that he has. Naturally, there are reasons, and Dick explained a few of them to us.

"It's like a snowball," he explained. "You attend one benefit or dinner, and get invited to two or three more. The same thing happens over and over again. Now it has gotten to the point where I know six weeks to two months ahead of time, exactly where I'll be and what I'll be doing.

"Don't believe that old saying about 'absence makes the heart grow fonder.' In TV, at any rate, absence does not make the heart grow fonder.

"In the night club, you get a applause or boos to let you know how the public reacts. In TV, you can't assume that the audience is friendly, or else they would have switched to another station. But still you are not too sure. You have to go and meet the people in order to find out."

To give our readers a general idea, here are just a few of the many organizations and affairs that he helps out every year: the Kiwanis; American Legion; and Shriners (all of which he belongs to personally); the B'nai B'rith (an honorary member); Peace Officers Association; City of Hope; the Masquers; Retail Paper and Wall Association; Wholesale and Retail Growers' Association; the "Wildcatters"; Sons and Daughters of the Golden West; Moose Lodge; American Newspaper Guild; Los Angeles Ad Club; Jewish Home for the Aged; Cerebral Palsy fund; Salvation Army; Times Boys Club; and Amalgamated Clothing Workers' Union. The list is endless.

No Dough

Some skeptics might say that Dick Lane attends these functions for money (as many stars do). This is not true. Dick Lane does not get an extra dime for his personal appearances.

Actually, because of various business activities, such as his chemical field and lumbering and mining interests—plus his TV pay—Dick doesn't have to worry about his bank account.

Of course, there's one advantage he really thought about before," he continued, a slight smile coming across his face.

"One can never tell what will happen tomorrow. Just in case I may be down on the luck in the future, at least I know a few friends around town now who would be willing to have me over for a good meal."

It was Ben Blue speaking. The droll and very funny comic of such NBC shows as "Comedy Hour" and the now defunct "All-Star Revue" has suddenly come back into real prominence on television. Not only has he done more guest spots than almost any comic in the business but he has already made the pilot film for a projected new TV series to be called "Ben Blue, Esq."

But Ben, despite his present popularity, has no illusions about the future.

"TV is a monster that uses a performer like a parlor guest," he commented ~~paraphrasing~~ "and an unwelcome guest at that—the kid you soon want to throw out. The life of a TV star is just about ~~for~~ years. And thereafter that brief fling, where does he go? He's so worn out his welcome that nobody is interested in seeing him anywhere. When once he may have made about \$18,000 a week he suddenly can't even pull in \$400. He's old hat—tired, old news—thanks to television."

How Can Stars Last?

"I just came back from a tour over the country and I heard many people discussing their current favorites. I asked one person what he thought

TV stars can't afford more than a couple of bad shows in a row. If that happens, everyone has already counted them out and they can't get back in the ring too easily after that.

"I've always held out for films for any sustained series I might do. For one thing, a performer can do better work on film. And his pictures can be shown later in the years to come to new audiences, thus enabling him to be popular a little longer.

"I want to get several hundred film sequences in the can, stay around for about four years, and then scram."

Too Familiar

"The other disadvantage to being a TV star is that everyone knows you too well. You become such a familiar product that sooner or later the old bromide about 'familiarity breeding contempt' becomes all too true. It's not long before nobody wants to see you anywhere.

As to the possibilities of television's building new stars, Ben feels—and logically so—that this is practically impossible.

New Talent

"You can't develop new talent on TV because you have to be an experienced performer to begin with," Ben continued. "All good stars on television are seasoned actors. The

of Caesar. His comeback was, 'Which Caesar?' He then said he thought Sid, to whom I was referring, was getting tiresome because he was repeating too much. I couldn't help reminding him that with all the shows Sid has done, how could he help repeating?

"Many top stars of today are being criticized for the same thing. All of which proves again how fickle the public is. It's a constant business of 'Hail the New Champ.' It's like a prize fighter who is a champion but gets knocked out in one fight. The next day he's a has-been. So later he wins a fight and he's a champ again.

demands of the medium itself make experience the primary requisite. There isn't enough time to train new talent.

"I'm in somewhat of an enviable position so far. I haven't really arrived on television yet. Frankly, I'm glad because once you arrive in this business you can do little but hang on by your teeth and hope you're around to catch that last train before it pulls out.

"I think," Ben added with a grin, "I'll just wait for the new medium, whatever it will be, and let others worry about being big TV stars."
