# The Moments That Changed My Life

By Sam Balter

As Told to Ted Hilgenstuhler

▲ **AN ACCIDENTAL FLIP** of the radio dial changed the whole pattern of Sam Balter's life. This unusual story is told by Sam in this exclusive TV-RADIO LIFE story.

**T**HE MOMENT that changed my life happened one night in 1937.

I was teaching at the El Segundo High School and lived in a little house on the school grounds. I had nothing to do with radio then. As a matter of fact, I had never seen a microphone in my life.

I came home one evening and turned on the radio. By the mere twist of the dial I happened to tune to a local sports program. The announcer, whom I won't name, merely read wire stories. It was dull and tiring and poorly done. By another accidental twist of the dial, I heard the voice of Alexander Woollcott. Mr. Woollcott, in my opinion, was the greatest story teller of all time.

That particular night, which I shall never forget, he told a story about Katharine Cornell.

Mr. Woollcott related how Miss Cornell was scheduled to make an appearance at a Seattle theater at 8:30 p.m. Her train was delayed, and she wired the manager that she would be late.

Regretfully, the manager apologized to the assembled throng. Instead of leaving the theater, the audience just waited. Miss Cornell finally arrived at the very late hour of 2:30 in the morning—and performed until 5:30 that same morning. It was a magnificent tribute to the

first lady of the stage. And the way Woollcott told the story it left a catch in your throat.

### Thinks and Acts

Listening, I couldn't help thinking about the great contrast between Woollcott's brilliant, dramatic method, and that miserable sports program.

"Why," I asked myself, "couldn't this same approach be used for the world of sports with its frustrations and victories, with its high comedy and drama, and vice versa?"

Well, instead of merely criticizing, as many are prone to do, I decided to do something about it. I tried to devise a new kind of sports show. I called it "The Sports Page of the Air" and labeled stories under various headings, such as "Humor," "Editorial," etc.

This also allowed me to use Woollcott's technique under a heading called: "It Happens Once in a Lifetime." It's "old hat" now, but no one had ever done it before.

### First Show

At that time I had no contacts in the radio field. Art Whizhim, who ran a Chili-bowl restaurant, and who is still one of my closest friends, was looking for a radio show.

Although he was not particularly a sports enthusiast, I told him about my idea.

"Is it good?" he asked.

"I don't know," I replied. "I've never tried it out."

For thirteen weeks I did the show on station KEHE. Then the summer came and the people didn't eat as much chili. I was off the air.

### Second Moment

To make a long story short, my "second biggest moment" came several months later. Unknown to me, a man from Philadelphia named Neil Ivey heard a recording of my program.

I had forgotten completely about my radio career and was working for the National Youth Association for \$94 a month. One day while I was supervising a group of girls in a gardening project, I was told to appear at the CBS radio station.

Ivey asked me if I would be interested in doing the show on the Pacific Coast for \$175. Astonished, I said yes. I was twice as astonished when they told me the \$175 was a week's pay, and not a month's.

Ten weeks later I was on a coast-to-coast show, the first sports commentary program ever to be heard across the entire nation. From then on, my reputation was made.

All this happened six months after I had seen a microphone for the first time. This in itself, I think, "Happens Once in a Lifetime."

The Lillian Roth show was one of my biggest thrills. It left me with the feeling that the evening was well worth reliving. I had known Lillian and had admired her great struggle over her illness so when we asked her if we could present her life—hers being the only one in which the principal subject was notified in advance—she replied, "Gladly, if it will help anyone else." I felt it would help many people—and it did. Letters of praise came from the world over. It also brought a great deal of personal tribute to Lillian. She had just started working the night-club circuit again and our show was responsible for her

getting a fourteen-week holdover at the Copa in Miami. The entire city of Miami even paid tribute to her with a big dinner, the key to the city, and many more honors. She received a great deal of mail from those who remembered her from the past. Lillian tells about meeting a man in New Orleans who said to her, "Young lady, I enjoyed your mother twenty years ago just as much as I enjoyed your show tonight." Lillian smiled and said, "I'm sorry, sir, but the person you thought was my mother was me."

### Other Thrills

There was also great satisfaction in the story of Rev. Jim McLain, formerly Dr. I. Q. On the show he told of his dream to have a Boys' Ranch in Texas for homeless boys of all creeds and races. \$20,000 was needed. From this show and from the great hearts of the American public, Jim got the money and now has his dream ranch.

Lovely Joan Caulfield, who was so

There are more examples of the help "This Is Your Life" has been to people. Fifi D'Orsay, for example, started a whole new career when, as she put it, "people found out I wasn't dead."

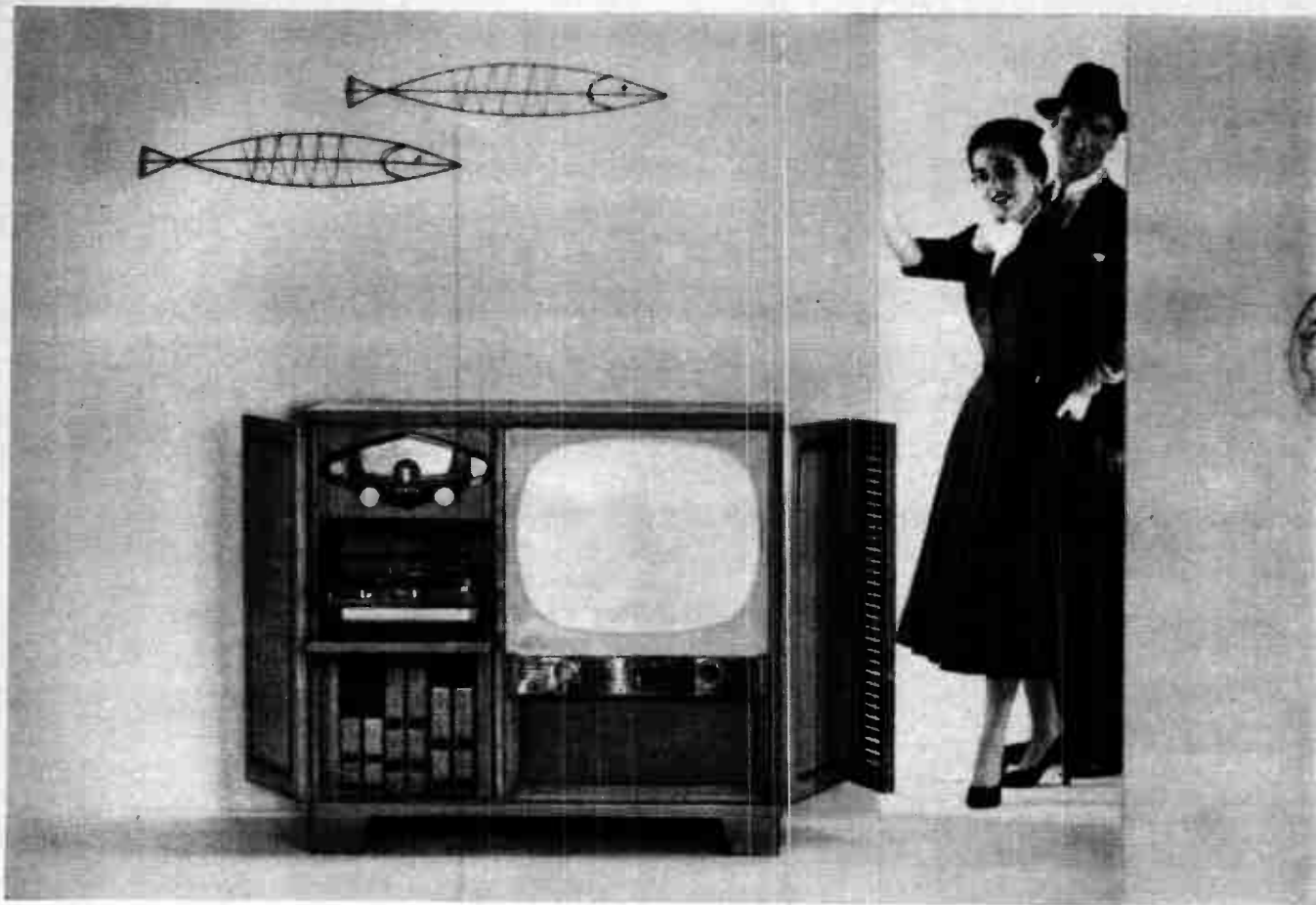
I can never forget the thrill in seeing such happiness spread over the faces of Mr. and Mrs. Eiler of Nebraska when on Christmas Day their three sons, who they thought were overseas, were flown home by our show to join them for Christmas. Nor can I forget the call from Mrs. Gus Edwards, who said, "I received letters and telegrams from people I haven't heard from in twenty years. It's wonderful to be so remembered."

The two shows that brought per-

haps the biggest lump to my throat were the Scarpitta and Kohner telecasts. Mrs. Nadia Scarpitta saw her son, Salvatore, whom she had been unable to visit in Rome for nine years when she appeared on "This Is Your Life."

Hannah Kohner was the lovely young woman who had suffered so much in prison camps. Can anyone forget her tremendous job when she saw her brother, now a doctor in Israel, whom she had not seen since they were separated and sent to extermination camps at the time Germany invaded the Sudetenland?

But perhaps the greatest thrill on TV has been the audience—and the letters that pour in saying how much this or that show was enjoyed. These letters have come from the most celebrated as well as from your next-door neighbor and mine—and all are deeply treasured. To know that "This Is Your Life" has been fortunate enough to touch the hearts of so many is something I shall carry with me as long as I live.

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Around TV Row

Fred Allen's liberal references to CBS and Herb Shriner on his initial NBC teleairer "Judge For Yourself" probably ruffled NBC brass. But Fred is the Godfather of Herb's daughter as well as a long-time fan.

... **Mitzl Gaynor** makes her TV debut on **George Jessel's** premiere ABC teleshow. ... **Tele-Vespers**, the oldest, continuous religious program on television, celebrated its 250th consecutive telecast on **KTLA** last week. ... **"Pentagon, USA,"** which debuted in August, is now in the top ten ratings according to Trendex reports. ... **Stacy Harris** and **Raymond Bramley** star in a new series, "Doorway to Danger," a series of taunt thrillers delving into smuggling and espionage. on **KECA-TV**.

The televersion of "My Favorite Husband" starring **Joan Caulfield** and **Barry Nelson** finally makes its bow on **KNXT**, September 12. ... **Clete Roberts**, world-reporter and news commentator, starts a new series on **KECA-TV** titled "Crossroads of Life." ... **Bob Crosby's** TVer is set for September 14. ... "My Little Margie" returns to the videolanes on the ninth. ... **CBS** is mulling a kiddie show with **Ed Wynn** as emcee. ... **Betty Hutton** has been inked for four "Colgate Comedy Hour" shows. ... **Betty Furness** started something when she began opening and closing Westinghouse refrigerator doors. **Kathi Norris**, a TV performer and commercial player, has just signed a long-term contract with **General Electric** and plans to give the **Betty Furness** treatment to GE's products. ... After a two year's absence, "Leave It to the Girls" returns to the ABC lanes. ... **CBS-TV's** City will be spotlighted on a forthcoming "See It Now" stanza. ... Two major NBC television "spectaculars" are on the agenda for the 1953-54 season. One will bring back **Maurice Evans** in a Shakespearean production, the other project concerns **Mary Martin** and **Ezio Pinza** in an elaborate musical production.

**Frank Sinatra** will guest with "Uncle Miltie" on the latter's kick-off telecast for the new Buick sponsor. ... After their Cocoanut Grove engagement, **Andy and Della Russell** will split up, professionally, that is. **Mrs. R.** will concentrate on her dress shop while **Andy** continues as a vocalist. ... **Charlie Issacs** has signed a five-year producer-director-writer pact with **NBC**. ... **CBS** is trying to clear a minimum of twelve

stations for the continuance of the **Mel Torme-Teresa Brewer** stanza. ... **KLAC-TV** could be had for two-and-a-half million dollars. ... From all indications **Larry Storch** will wind up as a summer casualty. ... **Du Mont** and ex-teacher **Sam Levenson** are talking things over. ... Many viewers have missed the pleasant round-faced Sam's good humor. If **Du Mont** and the former teacher can get together we'll chalk up another "must" for TV-viewing.—**M. R.**

### "Father" Is 80

A small crowd consisting of the officers and board members of the **National Association for Better Radio and TV** gathered for lunch at the **Biltmore Hotel** last Wednesday.

Before seating themselves, they stood next to their chairs and applauded a silver-haired, scholarly looking gentleman, who walked towards the head table. His name was **Dr. Lee de Forest**, the "father of radio," and one of America's greatest inventors. The originator of over 200 inventions, it was **Dr. de Forest's** electron tube which paved the way for radio, TV, radar, the long-distance telephone, the talking picture and other modern miracles of science.

The occasion was the celebration of his 80th birthday. Introduced by **Mrs. Clara Logan**, president of **NAFBRAT**, **Dr. de Forest's** address was brief and significant:

"From primitive beginnings, and after many disheartening experiments I had to overcome skepticism on the part of human nature. . . I have

never lost faith in myself. . . I have asked broadcasters: 'What have you done to my child (radio)?' You have debased my child. It was a laughing stock to the intelligence. . . But all in all, I am proud of my child."

**Dr. de Forest** also raised some questions and doubts concerning his "grandchild" (television). "Someday," he said, "I hope the directors' intelligence will equal that of the scientist."

It is such organizations as the **NAFBRAT**, of which **Dr. de Forest** is a vice-president, that try to make his "child" a mature, and grown-up medium of communication.

The still-active inventor also announced the first winner of the annual "Lee de Forest Award": **Joyce C. Hall**, president and founder of the **Hallmark Greeting Card Company** and sponsor of radio and TV drama shows.

It was a very happy birthday for the famed scientist, and **TV-RADIO LIFE** wishes him many more to come.

### National Weeks

Did you know there are more National (this and that) Weeks celebrated in this commercially minded country than there are weeks in the year?

This is the discovery of TV Star **Norma Gilchrist**, who makes a specialty of highlighting these celebrations on her daily **KTTV** program.

Seldom does a National Week of something or other celebration pass without TV Homemaker **Star Norma Gilchrist** finding a worthwhile application of the occurrence to bring to her viewers. For example:

**National Secretaries Week** found **Norma** presenting a fashion show of five dresses made by one secretary-homemaker in her spare moments, all of the dresses being budget priced, yet exceedingly smart. These were expertly modeled by secretaries on the show to further point up the capabilities of America's thousands of secretaries.

**National Wine Week** is of particular significance to California, which raises 90% of the nation's winery output on a half million acres of vineyards. **Norma** duly pointed out what wines to serve with various foods and exploded the theory that red wines are reserved for red meats and white wines are palatable only with fish and poultry.

On the contrary, **Norma** acquainted homemakers with the appetite and etiquette acceptance of breaking this rule to suit one's taste.

Whatever the occasion or product sooner or later it receives recognition by having a week set aside in its honor. It makes us wonder what will happen to the late comers. After all there are only fifty-two weeks in a year.

### Landsberg Lauded—Again

The Veterans of Foreign Wars honored **Klaus Landsberg**, **KTLA** bossman, last week for "his foresight and genius of the telecasting of the Atomic Bomb experiments." The award was made at Patriotic Hall.

**Stop, Listen, Look** ( Shows You May Like )

*"Surprise Twist"*

Monday-Friday, 7:15 p.m.  
KTLA (Channel 5)

KTLA's first big entry for fall viewing hit the videolanes last week with a series of one act playlets entitled "Surprise Twist."

Their first offering, "The Man With The Black Hair," had a double surprise twist ending. The stanza concerned a worrisome wife and her amicable husband, who was preparing to fly to London on business. On the eve before his departure he dreamt he met death. A dark haired man with a mustache and scar on his face informed him that everyone who had reservations on the overseas plane had to pass through the cemetery gate.

When the wife learned of his dream she tried to persuade him to cancel his trip. But he airily dismissed her concern, and busily occupied himself at his office, readying for his trip. About two hours before plane time the shoe shine boy put in his routine appearance. However it wasn't the "routine" shoe shine boy but a substitute who looked exactly like the messenger of death in the dream. The overseas trip was canceled immediately.

Later that evening, at dinner, a

news flash came over the radio announcing the fatal crash of the very plane the husband almost took. At this point the wife confessed that she employed an actor who resembled the messenger of death to replace the regular shoe shine boy. While the husband was complimenting his wife for her insight the telephone rang. It was the actor explaining that he had been delayed and apologizing for not showing up at her husband's office.

Viewers will come back for more climatic twists on this series, which was filmed in New York and features top Broadway players. **John McGovern**, who has a Claude Rains voice, and **Peggy Allenby** competently played the lead roles on the initial ailer. **Bernie Procter** produced the series, which is comprised of seventy-eight playlets.

KTLA's first entry on the fall schedule is a good one . . . good story lines, well produced and dramatized—M.R.

*Fred Allen Returns*

Fred Allen's return to active entertainment duty—and on TV—is news in itself. The old master of the dry humor has always been a popular personality and it's good to see those fine old New England lines on his face and hear that nasal twang rasping away once more.

As for "Judge For Yourself," it makes an attempt to be different and for the most part succeeds.

It is neither another panel show nor a talent show. It is actually a combination of both but with the new twist of having professional experts in show business and people from ordinary walks of life judging acts that have already

hit the professional mark. The only gimmick is that if an amateur judge rates the three acts being auditioned in the same order that the professional experts do, he gets \$1000.

The first three acts on the debut show were all right but only the girl singer seemed to spark. The other two were a little tired and familiar.

It is, of course, Mr. Allen to whom viewers will turn for their real enjoyment. In his opening remarks, delivered in his own unique style, he made some wonderful cracks about panel shows and quiz shows. He got all fouled up in words here and in some of the rest of the show, but he handled the slip-ups with such good humor that they were almost as good as his jokes. Fred Allen is about the only top name in the business who can mess up a line and make it sound good.

The Old Gold commercials are, as usual, just about the best on TV—if not the best. These commercials actually make viewers feel they have some intelligence. Dennis James's expert chores in extolling Old Gold make him the finest commercialist on TV.

"Judge for Yourself" is apt to catch on. It has a chance to be so popular that Fred Allen will be able to hear someone say, "Stop the Music" without blowing a fuse.—J.H.

*Stars Talk Back*

In our August 7 issue we had a story entitled "What's Happened to These Stars?" No sooner did we ask the question then we learned about the "doings" of two of these personalities . . . **Korla Pandit** and **Sandra Berkova**.

Korla is busily engaged on station KGO, San Francisco, and he just became the father of a second son. Mrs. Pandit and child are doing fine.

Sandra Berkova is making plans for a "Berkova Trio," including an accordionist and guitarist in addition to her nimble violin. Negotiations are under way for an early fall telepremiere.

*Tuesday Blues*

All four nets are set to slug it out for Tuesday night supremacy on the video lanes. **Milton Berle**, long time monopolist of the Tuesday stanza will return in the fall for twenty-six Tuesdays, alternating with **Bob Hope** and **Robert E. Sherwood's** heralded TV dramas. "Firestone Theatre," "Armstrong Theatre" and "Judge For Yourself" (the new Fred Allen stanza) are also slated for NBC's Tuesday lineup.

CBS is bringing forward a mass-appeal schedule in an attempt to lure NBC's viewers. Tentatively they've logged the "Gene Autry Show," **Red Skelton**, "This Is Show Business," "Suspense," and "Danger." They are also contemplating shifting **Edward R. Murrow's** "See It Now" to the Tuesday night lineup.

ABC is also going in for heavy scheduling on that certain night. It may throw in two of its newest packages, the "Joel Gray Comedy Revue" and its all-negro revue headed by **Sammy Davis, Jr.** "Cavalcade of America," the "Danny Thomas Show," "Theatre Guild of the Air," and "Name's the Same" are slated to go into Tuesday's lineup.

DuMont will be back with **Bishop Fulton Sheen** as Berle's opposition in the Eastern market.

Pity the poor viewer with the nets throwing so many of their high calibre shows into the Tuesday slot. There's only one solution for the weary-eyed audience—three TV sets in each living room and a large box of aspirins.

*Jr. Western Jamboree Teen-Age Show*

A new one-hour teen-age show is scheduled for KNBH, Channel 4. Headed by the Colwell Brothers, Paul, Steve, and Ralph, this "Junior Western Jamboree" will be a variety show featuring many talented youngsters.

Assisting the Colwell Bros. will be the **Musical Minors**; **Dave Bair** and **The Western Cubs Band**; **Barbara Luke** and **Jimmie Smith**, singers; **Denny Jackson** and his dog; "Mom" **O'Connor** (Mother of **Donald O'Connor**); **Catha Stroh**, singer; **The Twirler**, Square Dancers; and **Billy Walker**, singer and comic.

The musical producer is **Scott Seely**; producer, **George Carillon**; exec. producer, **William Orwing**; director, **Jon Bushallow**.

I don't like some of the movies shown on TV (I'll mention no titles) by some of the stations (I'll mention no call letters) and I don't like some of the announcers who introduce them (I'll mention no names) and I want whoever is responsible to mend his ways. There, how's that for a fearless, unequivocal stand?



"The Time of Your Life," (5) Sept. 6, 7:30. This is not a very faithful adaptation of William Saroyan's Critics' Circle Prize Play of 1939, and was produced just few years ago by James Cagney, who also plays the leading role. The entire action takes place in a San Francisco pub, where a motley crew of indearing, enduring characters pursue the good life. The theme of the piece, in Saroyan's own words, is, "In the time of your life, live—so that in that good time there shall be no ugliness or death for yourself or for any life your life touches ... so that in that wondrous time you

shall not add to the misery and sorrow of the world but shall smile to the infinite delight and mystery of it." And that, in essence, is the theme of all of Saroyan's work.

"Bushwhackers," (5) Sept. 11, 10:00. John Ireland goes west in search of peace after the Civil War and runs into a land war and a bunch of bushwhackers, headed by Lon Chaney. After being clobbered a couple of times, Ireland decides he's better at least defend himself, and so he helps the settlers beat the bad guys and the railroad buys the land and the good guys make themselves a buck, and what I liked about this movie was the original plot.

"Wooden Horse," (13) Sept. 9, 10:30. Three British soldiers escaped from a Nazi prison camp during World War II, and "Wooden Horse," shows the ingenious way in which it was done. The film is exciting, authentic and boasts a fine performance by Leo Genn, but the last time I saw it on TV, it was cut so badly that it lost much of its effect. I hope such will not be the case with this showing.

"To Have and to Hold," (2) Sept. 5, Midnight. A man has only six months to live and so he tries to drive his wife into the arms of another man. Aren't stiff upper lips solid?

"Single Sin," (7) Sept. 10, 10:45. Well, one at a time, anyway.

RADIO*Lifelines*

Aboard the S. S. ALASKA—

**YESTERDAY** a heavy fog set in about 4 p.m. One of the ship's two pilots, **Captain Elmer Joost**, had told me earlier that he would arrange for me to visit the bridge and see the radar in operation.

**WHEN THE** fog became soupy, I uttered the wish "Now I'd like to see that radar working" and no sooner had I gotten out the words (while doing a fast promenade of the deck) than I rounded a turn and here was **Purser Banwell**, come to fetch me to the bridge.

**CAPTAIN MERRILL STEWART** himself was scanning the screen, while **Captain Joost** was likewise the horizon and **Third Mate Bernard O'Brien** was steering and **Quartermaster Bersin** was navigating. Captain Stewart demonstrated both the six and fifteen-mile radius beam. The tip end of **Vancouver Island**, a fishing boat, an approaching ship, a barge all showed up on the screen. I felt a lot better about shipping through the fog after this demonstration.

**WHAT DID** they do before radar? (They've had it only since 1946.) Well, they stayed alert, even as now, but depended on the whistle. It warned others and by gauging the length of time for the whistle's echo to return, gauged distance from shore.

**OUR SHIP**, the *Alaska*, is not new. (Built 1923.) But its yearly refurbishings keep it fairly up-to-date. **Second Steward Laurence Cain**, who has been sailing for thirty-five years, and whose stories of Alaska are fascinating, told me the *Alaska* was built by the **Guggenheims**, who developed the tremendous copper vein at Cordova. (\$1,000,000 worth of ninety per cent pure copper are said to have been taken out every month until they stopped working the vein in 1936 and transferred operations to South America.) The *Alaska* used to bring workmen to the mines and copper back to the U.S. along with passengers. Nowadays it's passengers and some cargo, mostly oil and merchandise for Alaska and frozen fish for the United States.

**MR. CAIN** also piqued my curiosity with wonderful tales of Alaskan characters—**Mrs. Pullen** of the old **Pullen House** in **Skagway**; **Soapy Smith**, the con man; **Molly Walsh**, who left her husband to elope with **Packer Jack** (her husband caught up with them in **Seattle** and shot and killed **Molly**—thirty-three years later, in 1931, **Packer Jack** returned to **Skagway** and erected a monument in memory of **Molly**.)

**CAPTAIN STEWART** of the *Alaska* is a very fine-looking gentleman, quiet and efficient. Quite different from the skippers who used to ride

Alaskan waters. The old Aleutian (we're coming home on the "new" Aleutian) first had her hull ripped open at **Seymour Narrows**. She was salvaged and **Captain Nord**, according to reports a rugged old salt, was sailing her when she hit a rock near **Seward** and went down in 1929. It was the captain's one and only disaster in forty years of sea-going. Shortly after, while on land, the auto in which he was riding slid into a ditch and he drowned in a foot and a half of water. Ignominious end to a fabulous career of an "iron man."

**THERE'S A SAYING** that "they used to have ships of wood with men of iron" but today "it's ships of iron and men of wood." However, the Alaska men, from **Captain Stewart** on down, nicely refute this saying.

**ONE NIGHT** in **Ketchikan**, **Mr. and Mrs. Bob Meehan** of **KTKN**, and **Thelma Alden**, program director, took our party atop a hill where we could get a wonderful view of the town—the vitally important fish canneries, the boat harbor with its thicket of mast, the lumber mill, the radio transmitter blinking conscientiously, and the haphazard streets with quaint houses clamboring up the pine-greened mountains. An unforgettable sight!

**BACK DOWN** in town we made the rounds of **The Narrows**, a swank new eatery whose outside appearances belie its ultra interior; **Roger J. Tousignant's Mural Room**, where **Jane Belgin** just completed some extremely interesting murals done with enamel on the plank walls; the luxurious **Elks' Clubrooms**; and the press room of the popular "**Alaska Sportsman**." The **Coopers** and I felt we'd really had a whirl when the evening was over.

FAIRBANKS, ALASKA—

**ALASKA IS** tremendously air-minded. Everybody flies everywhere. Pilots are the best of they don't last. **Wien Lines** boasts of never having had a fatality. Hundreds and hundreds of private planes are maintained. Lack of ship facilities also points the way toward travel here by air.

**HOWEVER, YESTERDAY** we enjoyed a river boat trip down the **Tanana River**. I was not too keen about going, but now I'm thankful I did, for I met two of the most charming persons—**Captain** and **Mrs. Jim Binkley**, who own and operate the **Godspeed**, a specially constructed boat navigable in as little as 18 inches of water.

**THE TANANA** is a wide, muddy and treacherous stream, constantly changing, and the skipper has to know his way around or he'll wind up on a sandbank.

**CAPTAIN BINKLEY** was assisted by **Pete**, an Athabascan Indian from **Fort Yukon**. **Pete** developed into a thor-

oughly delightful character with a delicious sense of humor. (**Pete**, who is sixty-one years old and looks forty, spends three months yearly helping the **Binkleys** conduct their tour. He remains here in **Fairbanks** until **October 1st**, then goes back to **Fort Yukon**, to return about **April**. The **Binkleys** have known **Pete** fifteen years.)

**WE HAD** to wend a careful way on the **Godspeed**—just at first—until we got out into secure water. Apparently the currents had changed the course over the previous day and **Pete** kept busily sounding so we wouldn't get stuck.

We visited old **Susie Silas**, another Athabascan Indian, to see the fish wheels, smoke house, and tanning of moosehide. Also called at a husky farm and saw noisy, but beautiful beasts. At one of the fish wheels, a beauty about two feet long flopped into the trough, so to please the shutterbugs, old **Pete** picked up the salmon and posed for pictures. The camera fiends, having a field day, kept insisting on "just one more shot," as **Pete** stood, holding the still-wriggling fish. **Pete** grinned and posed obligingly, saying "I have lots of time!" Then, he added, "So does the fish!"

MCKINLEY, ALASKA—

**GUESS WE** haven't been living right. The crowd on tour here **Monday** saw **Mt. McKinley** in all its snowy glory. Yesterday, this tallest peak on our continent (**20,260 feet**) played prima donna and hid. Apparently, seeing **Mt. McKinley** (closest you get to it is **twenty-two miles**) is an unpredictable piece of fortune.

**AT LEAST** we tried. Shot out of bed at crack of dawn, and I mean dawn, **3:00 a.m.** to be precise. All over the lodge you could hear the room phones clanging as the clerks roused the tour group. Breakfast was a merry affair. Any sleepy grumpiness was dissipated by the happy clamor of a group drawn closer together by achieving such an unusual feat of getting up in the middle of the night.

**WE WERE** on the road at **4:00 a.m.** and until **3:00 p.m.** we drove **132 miles** of some of the most scenic and primitive country imaginable—over roads that **actually weren't**. If the bridge was washed out, we forded the stream and once we stopped while a road tractor cleared away the dirt so we could pass.

**ALL DAY** we spotted wildlife. We saw (and watched for some time) seven grizzly bears, five caribou, five moose, encountered rabbits, squirrels, golden eagles, **Dahl** sheep; marmots (three) and lovely birds called ptarmigan. (They're brownish in summer and snow white in winter and right now are in between, with dark bodies and white wings.) Camera fiends in the party had a marvelous time, as you can imagine. It was a rough day, but it had its compensations.

**NEAR THE** hotel, en route back, we saw a porcupine. Gave him wide berth. Up the line a way we developed a flat tire and when the fellows took it off to fix it, out of the rubber they pulled what had punctured the tube—quills from a porcupine we'd passed on the road the night before!

# Is Prayer

WHEN ED SULLIVAN of "Toast of the Town" fame was recently in Hollywood, he accepted an invitation to act as host on a "Family Theatre" broadcast. Ed was so deeply impressed by the responsibility of his message that he insisted on writing it himself. Down he sat at the typewriter in his room at the Beverly Hills Hotel and pecked out words that came from his heart and convictions. "When Helen Hayes lost her young daughter," Ed wrote, "she almost went insane with grief. Helen told me that the only thing that saved her mind was prayer, daily visits to a tiny New York church on Lexington Avenue. Helen lost a daughter—won back her religion."

## Another Example

"It was back in 1926 that I first stepped to the WOR mike after an introduction by Basil Ruysdale. On that first broadcast, I introduced to the country a night-club trio from Broadway's Silver Slipper—Clayton, Jackson and Durante.

"Lou Clayton has since died. I was talking to his widow, Ida Clayton, a few nights ago, here in Hollywood, and she recalled that one of 'Family Theatre's' greatest fans was Lou. He believed, as we do, that prayer is the only way to win peace for ourselves, peace for our families, peace for our world. In pursuit of that thought, 'Family Theatre' urges you to pray—and particularly to pray together as a family."

These remarks of Sullivan, which he himself broadcast, were typical of other stars' weekly messages given on "Family Theatre" over Mutual-Don Lee-KHJ. Father Lawyer, business manager for "Family Theatre," and his co-workers refer to these messages as "the commercials." There is a "commercial" at start of the broadcast and one at the end, but no "middle commercial." Father Lawyer, Director Joe Mansfield, Secretary Dorothy Lytle and others connected with the broadcast feel that the usual "plug" in the center of a program breaks the continuity and usually irritates the listener.

"Family Theatre" doesn't want to ruffle listeners because it has something very important to sell. The "product" is prayer.

Though Father Patrick Peyton of the Catholic Church founded "Family Theatre," the entire operation is now and always has been non-sectarian. On the basis of what the program's "commercials" have done to listeners-at-large, one can set down the cases of suicide which have been thwarted

because "the commercial" got through in time, the homes that have been re-assembled after practically crumbling apart and the indifferent souls who have taken the "sponsor's" message to heart and re-knit the dropped stitches in their spiritual garments. Obviously a good selling job is done on the show.

## Own Instance

But more than this, the program has proved to be a scintillating example in its own right. It started as "a one-time shot" on the air, May 13, 1945, with Bing Crosby and Cardinal Spellman as guests. It took two years to establish the program on a permanent basis. But once a scheduled airshow, "Family Theatre" seemed launched on only a hand-to-mouth existence.

It was, and is now, sustained merely by voluntary offerings. There is never an appeal made on the air. "The worst thing you can do," observed Father Lawyer, "is to mix money with religion. Let the program stand on its own merits."

The Father recalls several instances of airtime approaching without any funds at hand to pay for the program. Once it came up to Monday before the Thursday show and there was no money. Father Lawyer contacted Father Peyton, who was



# "Commercial"?

*"Family Theatre" has something to sell—and goes about the job like any other top-drawer sponsor*

on tour in Canada. "Oh, just have faith." Father Peyton replied reassuringly.

The necessary money didn't come in, but the show was saved by other means. "We were bumped off by the President," explained Father Lawyer. "That saved us for one week, but by the following Wednesday we still didn't have any money. Then out of the blue we received a letter from a man in Maryland who wanted to help and our problem was solved."

The biggest of stars donate their talents to "Family Theatre." Personalities like Ann Blyth, Lizbeth Scott and Ethel Barrymore have passed up lucrative opportunities paying \$2500 and \$3000 a broadcast in order to "work" this show. During the past six years, 342 stars have donated services worth approximately \$2,565,000. Mutual Broadcasting has given facilities, musical back-grounding, sound effects, and time charges totaling approximately \$10,000 weekly, or more than \$3,000,000.

However, it still requires money to keep the program rolling, because all AFTRA players (average five weekly) and the scripter must be paid and over-all costs met.

## House Gift

One tremendous step in solving overhead was Mrs. Jacoba Buchineau's gift of a large house on Sunset Boulevard near La Brea. In this roomy, chrome-green structure, former home of Edward Everett Horton, "Family Theatre" operations are housed. Downstairs there are business offices and a cutting room, while production-writing occupy the second floor. In addition to the radio program, "Family Theatre" activities include a Rosary Hour and special broadcasts for Thanksgiving, Easter and Christmas. TV programs are also prepared for these three days plus Mother's Day and St. Patrick's. Currently, 365 short "spots" are also being made.

Persons of all faiths offer their talents to appear on Mutual's "Family Theatre." It is an error to think that Catholics maintain exclusivity in this regard. True, Catholics like Bing, Ruth Hussey, Loretta Young,

Pat O'Brien and Ann Blyth have made many appearances, Miss Hussey holding top score with thirty-three guestings, followed by Miss Blyth (thirty-one), Pat O'Brien (nineteen), Loretta Young (twenty-two) and others. But non-Catholics like Otto Kruger, Barry Sullivan, Robert Young, Charlie Ruggles, Gale Storm, and Keefe Braselle have also been generous with their appearances. The usual message from all of these personalities is "Any time, Father Lawyer, all you have to do is call." Jeff Chandler, who has appeared twenty-six times on the program, often in minor roles, actually gets worried if he doesn't receive periodic calls for the show. One star even contacted Father Lawyer to ask, "Why don't you get me on *that big show?*"

Father Lawyer, who feels that this country is definitely on the upsurge of a spiritual revival and that the people are hungry for guidance, still points out that in selling his "product," extreme delicacy must be used. Listeners can't be sledge-hammered.

The program must be appealing and varied, not a religious program per se. "If you label it religious, there goes your dial," the Father observed. "Before starting our series, Father Peyton and his assistants studied other commercials on the air. They tried to find out how other programs sold coffee, soap, and other products. They employed what they thought were the best techniques from these to sell their "product."

If mail is indication, it is evident that "Family Theatre's" "commercials" sell the "goods." More than 1000 letters are received every week.

# Star Time With Shirley

*Shirley Thomas, CBS Radio's Hollywood correspondent, is completely unique in her field. You can't sell her scandal.*

**I**F YOU'VE listened to commentators on the Hollywood scene you've heard them asthmatically expounding about all the scandals of the stars. Feeding the gossip mill is their meat.

So along comes a young lady by the name of Shirley Thomas who hits the CBS airwaves with "Shirley Thomas From Hollywood" and Hollywood does a great double-take. This young lady is actually refusing to expose anybody or anything and is interested only in doing a sincere public-relations job on the much-abused film industry.

## No Scandal

"When I first started my show," Shirley commented, "I was determined to omit any harmful or scandalous type of reporting. I felt it was time that the stars were treated as decently as I would like to be treated. I also wanted to do nothing on my show that would be negative as far as the industry itself is concerned. It's odd about the movie business. Almost every big industry has a finely organized public-relations campaign to sell its worth, but no one has taken the time to point out that Hollywood is far more than a town where occasionally a star gets a divorce or where a scandal may crop up at times. It is even worse when some who are making their living from Hollywood spend their professional time tearing it down.

"Several of my friends told me that without gossip and expose material I'd not get any listeners. However, I have had a really fine response from the public about the construc-

tive kind of program I'm trying to do."

Shirley's ideas have paid off for her as far as the studios and stars are concerned. One influential man at Paramount wrote her, "This is the kind of show Hollywood has been needing for years. I'm glad to see you've finally given it to us."

"While I'm not going to run anybody down, I'm also not interested in going overboard by being too sugary and phony complimentary," Shirley added. "The stars don't like this any more than the public does."

Shirley was raised in Hollywood and has always had an interest in the entertainment business, but she had no great yen to be in the movies because her work was in radio and TV.

She got her first introduction in acting from a group of actors who had done a good deal of Shakespearean work. It was while studying with them back in 1937 that she heard of a television station in Los Angeles—W6XAO, if you remember. She talked to Harry Lubcke at the station and sold him on the idea of doing a fifteen-minute dramatic serial called "Vine Street." Shirley's brother, John Cole Annis, played opposite her.

"We also did some Shakespeare, including the full version of 'Macbeth' in which I played 'Lady Macbeth' to Fritz Leiber's 'Macbeth,' Shirley went on. "In addition, we did the first full-length three-act play on TV. All this happened from 1937 to 1940.

"When the war came our activities in TV were curtailed and my brother

and I turned to radio. We whipped up a show called 'Eyes That Never Close' and it was on KMPC for quite some time."

Shirley continued active in radio even after her brother left to go into service. She married and, with her husband, formed Commodore Productions which handled the "Hop-along Cassidy" and "Tarzan" radio series. She also produced the "Clyde Beatty Show." However, her activities in this line broke up when she divorced her husband and found herself facing a new life.

"I had to start all over again," she said. "And I don't think I could have faced the difficult months that followed without the wonderful help of my family—and friends. In thinking of what I should do I reached out for something I could do on my own. I wrote a lot of formats and then one day in a casual conversation someone suggested I do a Hollywood commentary program. This, I knew, was what I had been looking for."

## Hollywood Story

"I contacted the president of Dr. Ross Dog Food Company, told him my idea, and he told me to work up a format. I spent six weeks on the format—and it was sold to the Dr. Ross Company.

Shirley's brother is working with her again as producer and recently her sister joined up as production assistant. Orin Borstin is her writer.

She now hopes to do a Hollywood show for TV, but in the meantime she will continue to be the medicine the movie business has needed for years.

Sighs of despair could be heard in every community when "You're Never Too Old" was dropped from the TV screens last November. Letters of protest literally deluged the station. Harry Koplan, producer of the show, had an intuition to save those letters. He felt they might come in handy at some later date. And that's exactly what happened. Frankly, they became sponsor's bait, and it didn't take long for one to smarten up and latch on to this popular show.

**Mail**

Harry and Marilyn Hare, co-star of the show, are indeed grateful to their loyal friends and fans who took the trouble to express their disappointment when the show was dropped. One of their choice letters came from a trailer court in Lomita, California. It stated: "Seventy-two families have gone into mourning in this court, hearing your news (about the show being dropped). How can anyone let you get away? Hoping you will soon be back."

Excerpts from another letter . . . "May God richly bless and protect you both as you continue to make old folks happy and feel that they are still wanted." Still another . . . "We were stunned to hear your pro-

gram was leaving the air . . . we can't believe such a wonderful program will be gone very long. If it is we will sell our set. . . ."

For the benefit of newcomers, KNXT's "You're Never Too Old" showcases talent of people over sixty. The majority of performers who appear on the show are non-professionals. Thus far, ninety-four-year-old Charlie Andrews has been the oldest entertainer. He sings a wicked tune and boasts of his original Stephen Foster scores. It was Andrews' dad who published the famous composer's songs.

A ninety-two-year-old roller skater proved to be a show stopper. The spry young man says, "I just like people so much I can't ever die." Performers on "Old" vie for seniority. Even the women are happy to admit they're at least sixty. This in itself is a unique accomplishment.

While seniority seems of utmost importance behind the camera, the viewers represent a varied range of age groups. According to Harry Koplan an audience breakdown reads something like this: 28 percent of the viewers are under 20; 49 percent are between 20 and 49; 23 percent are over 50. Female viewers have a slight edge over the men. They chalked up 51 percent of the audience.

If you want to live long enough to be told "You're never too old," take the advice of these "young" performers: "Everything in moderation and interest in other people."
