# The Mask Is Off!

**I**T'S finally been proven "Lonesome Gal"—Jean King in real life—does not have three eyes, no nose, or any other unusual facial characteristics.

"That's why many people thought I wore the mask," she explained one afternoon at her big, lovely, and livable Longridge estate. "It was just a gimmick to attract attention. Like many other such ideas, its life span has ended. The mask is off — for good."

As a young girl in her native Dallas, Texas, Jean was a girl leader of the all-male band at Southern Methodist University, and also did over 3,000 broadcasts on local stations.

But the people from Texas, in general, were too "prejudiced" for Jean. She was even banned from a sorority because her father, a dentist, treated patients of a certain religious faith. She knew that some day she would leave Texas, and never come back.

## California Bound

With their luggage packed in crates and cardboard boxes, teen-aged Jean and her mother and sister first came to Hollywood in 1937. Her first radio role was that of a Texan in the "I Love a Mystery" series. This was not too unusual, except for the fact that Jean had spent over \$3,500 for special courses in learning how to lose her Southern accent!

"There are two occasions when I still break out with my Texas drawl," Jean remarked. "First, when I lose my temper. And second, when I talk to another Texan."

Although she appeared in various radio and movie roles in Hollywood for ten years, the five foot-six inch, 126 pound actress had to go all the way to Dayton, Ohio, to get started with her greatest venture, "Lonesome Gal." In 1947, she visited her married sister in Dayton. While there, she

persuaded the officials at WING to try out her idea of a girl disc-jockey show.

The central idea was to provide moments of happiness for the listening audience via the soft-spoken word and pleasant music. There was a good reason for the format. Because of a calcium deficiency between the ages of eight and fourteen, Jean King could not walk. She had never forgotten those dreadful days of deprivation and loneliness.

## Mask Is Born

The idea for the mask came about when Jean attended a stag party at Dayton, got some "inside information" on some of the prominent men present, and "faked" a broadcast.

"When I was to come out on stage, I knew I couldn't let those men recognize me. I think they would have killed me," Jean recalled, smiling. "So I hurried to a nearby store, bought a ten-cent Halloween mask, and wore it when I made my appearance. It was a good idea, I decided to use it when pictures were taken of me or I made a personal appearance. I still have that original mask."

Although the brown-eyed brunette wanted to return immediately to Hollywood, after winning the coveted Billboard award in 1948 for having the top new show on the air, she felt obligated to remain at the Dayton station for awhile.

Finally, in 1949, Jean came back to California. On July 13, the greatest event in her life occurred. She met Bill Rousseau, who was then producing "Dragnet." It happens to some people this way, and right away Bill and Jean knew they were meant for each other.

That same day they agreed to get married. And three weeks later, August 6, 1949, they became man and wife. "The Lonesome Gal" wasn't lonesome anymore.

Together, they worked long and

hard at making "Lonesome Gal" a success. Jean has been known to do over 110 commercials in one single day for a period of three weeks. She herself has written over a million words of copy a year for the program.

Today, Jean and Bill, and their two children, Patricia and Fargo, live an ideal life in their huge Sherman Oaks estate. Equipped with a modern studio, (which saves an enormous amount of money and traveling time), Jean does all her work at home. Bill is also working on a documentary series for TV.

One of the many oddities about "Lonesome Gal," is that when Jean first submitted the idea to ABC, certain persons thought it was "too sexy" to put on the air. Now, several years later, Jean is not only heard on KECA regularly (for which she prepares a special, exclusive broadcast), but the ABC network is her biggest booster.

# Offspring Makes Good

*"Fibber McGee and Molly's" Son  
Jim Hits Big Time On Television...*

**J**IM and Marian Jordan, "Fibber McGee and Molly" to you, are proud of a certain young man in the entertainment world. He happens to be their son, Jim Jordan.

As director of NBC's "Colgate Comedy Hour," for the past two seasons, young Jim has been associated with some of the greatest comics of all time. He has gained respect for his TV know-how from Eddie Cantor, Bob Hope, Donald O'Connor and others in the Colgate lineup. Although he is many years their junior his technical knowledge is rarely questioned by these veteran showmen. On the other hand, Jim is smart enough to know that these comics have developed their own styles and consequently he lets them alone. "I'm strictly a technical director; I'm not the kind of a guy to tell these greats how to read their lines," he says.

"Each celebrity has his own approach to the medium. Hope, a stand up comic, likes to angle his performance as if he were playing before a theater audience. Cantor favors revue productions. He likes to put as much of the Ziegfeld extravaganza into his telecast as possible. O'Connor, on the other hand has no preconceived ideas and keys his productions to bring out the best advantages possible for the TV camera."

Jim has nothing but praise for the stars. He marvels at Cantor's vitality and enthusiasm. The veteran performer's interest and curiosity about people and things has never been

dimmed by his many active and full years in show business.

Self-effacing Jim Jordan is reluctant to talk about himself. Instead he prefers to talk about television. He is as overwhelmed by TV's possibilities as he is enthused about the medium.

Jim has been on both sides of the camera. During his teens he worked in radio and films as an actor. After his military service he worked at RKO as an actor and cutter. In 1948 he went to New York and got his first taste of television as stage manager for a series of NBC shows. In 1950 he directed the first NBC live coast-to-coast show starring Eddie Cantor on the "Comedy Hour." This first microwave telecast had the same significance as the first trans-oceanic telephone call.

Having been both actor and director, Jim prefers the latter. "I haven't the temperament to be an actor, besides there's too much insecurity in that end of the profession," he opines.

Jim lives in Encino with his wife, actress Peggy Knudson, and their three children. Their favorite diversion and big luxury is their swimming pool. Jim likes to putter in his garden and to read books having historical backgrounds. He has a quiet sense of humor and his favorite anecdote concerns the regional fame of his renowned parents, who have been in show business for thirty years.

"Fibber and Molly" were on a fishing vacation in Arkansas. Although

the inhabitants of the rural community (where they were vacationing) had radios they didn't seem to know about "Fibber and Molly's" program. When Jim Jordan asked the inn proprietress if she had ever heard "Fibber McGee and Molly" on the radio, her reply stopped him cold. No, she said, but hum me a few bars.

"If this is what happens after being headliners for thirty years, I'll stay behind the cameras, direct a show to the best of my ability, and forget about the limelight. It's not for me."

**R**AY MILLAND is that rare specimen—a movie star who thinks TV is a pretty soft deal.

Of course, to begin with he wanted no part of the whole business. He had several offers to do his own show and he turned them all down. But an agent who was also a friend of his of long standing kept begging Ray to do just one pilot film. Finally, to placate the man Ray agreed. And then promptly forgot about the whole thing.

Not long after Ray and his family were in New York ready to sail for Europe. His agents contacted him in the Big City and gleefully exclaimed, "Isn't it wonderfud! We've made a deal for forty films for the show."

"Just great!" Ray remarked. "And whom are the shows for?"

"For you, of course!" came back the fast retort.

"Hey, not me!" Ray exploded. "I'm going to Europe tomorrow morning."

"Yes, for you! But go ahead and go to Europe. We'll let you know when you're needed to start work."

And so Ray Milland, popular star of the motion pictures, found himself with a regular TV show which debuted September 17 over CBS-TV. The title is "Meet Mr. McNutley"—and it also premiered simultaneously

over the CBS Radio network, an unusual set-up in itself.

In this comedy series, Ray plays a romantic looking but absent-minded professor in a college. This, in itself, is a twist since Ray has usually done more of the strictly romantic type of things in the movies. And now he's doing what amounts to a character role—and loving it.

"Making films for TV is a fun fest," Ray said enthusiastically. "It's like going back to the old days of 1922 when speed counted. Why, we're doing as much work in one day as we do in the movies in six days. Frankly, I love the speed. Movie stars are used to too much pampering. They get callouses on delicate spots just sitting around waiting to do a scene. This has always bothered me, so I love the pressure cooker I'm in now. The day goes a lot faster and I, at last, get a feeling of accomplishment. I have always felt in the movies that the work was so easy I was earning money under false pretenses."

Ray, of course, is not going to stop making movies. In fact, he's now playing a really fine role in Warner's "Dial M for Murder." In addition, he had completed several pictures before starting "Meet Mr. McNutley."

# Great Racket

"Doing both movies and TV gets confusing at times," he laughed. "The other day, for instance, I found myself giving lines in a 'McNutley' film that I had said a couple of days before in a movie. The situation, the set and even the lines were so much alike that I got slightly confused."

Ray then went into a discussion of movies versus TV and with all the varied opinions now being so happily expounded on the subject, his views had more than passing interest.

"I think TV will eventually mean the end of the neighborhood theatres," Ray remarked. "In the future there will probably be just key theatres for the movies—the way there are key theatres for stage shows.

"I do feel that all the present day gimmicks like 3-D, Wide Screen, and what-have-you will do a fade. After all, there's nothing new about any of them. They were doing the same type about thirty years ago. The whole business is like preparing fish for dinner. A fancy chef can make up all the elegant trimmings and then comes the day when you want just plain old fried halibut. All audiences are going to want from movies is good, solid stories. Nothing else will sell—permanently."

"Meet Mr. McNutley" won't be Ray's TV debut since he did a television type interview in London back

in 1932—in the days when the lights burned you to a cinder and you wore dark green make-up.

"A lot has happened naturally to TV since then," he laughed. "I like the medium except for some of the commercials—like toothpaste plugs and those deodorant things. Every-time I see a chart showing bacteria in the gums, all to sell some paste or other, I get livid. And can anyone tell me what's attractive about seeing a pretty girl lift up her arms to plug a body odor product? My other pet hates are those scenes showing doctors recommending a certain type of cigarette.

"I don't watch TV too much—except for 'Dragnet' occasionally, a few of the good dramatic programs, the fights, and 'Groucho.' Interestingly enough, we'll be opposite Groucho since we're on Thursdays at eight over CBS-TV. Some people have considered that a bad time slot but I don't agree. Any time when people are watching their sets is a good time—and besides, competition is good for any show.

"When I agreed to do this series I was, of course, asked how I felt about TV's wearing out a performer's welcome. My answer is that TV or movies or anything else will ruin a star if he depends solely on personal traits and character gimmicks

to get across. A good story or good material is all that counts. Too many personalities on TV today are so overpowering they not only overpower the product they're selling but also themselves.

"I frankly don't expect to watch my show very much after the first couple of times it's on. I've never enjoyed seeing myself on the screen. I'm one actor who's always too consciously aware that it's I on the screen. If I weren't aware of it, I wouldn't cringe as much as I do. I'd like to be able to adopt the nonchalant attitude of my youngsters. Neither one is in the least excited about my doing TV—nor are they impressed by the fact I'm an actor. To them I'm just a father who goes out on a job. This is the way I like it."

Ray's family doesn't see much of him, though, except on week-ends. He's so busy now all the time he doesn't even have time to study his scripts at home, so, being a fast study, he learns them in the set. He does, however, let nothing interfere with his week-ends at Balboa where he and his family go each week.

In spite of the hectic life Ray appears to be in a happy frame of mind. And ten to one you will be too when you see him in "Meet Mr. McNutley." This ought to be a winner.

**1. Do you contemplate any changes in the format of your "Juke Box Jury" now that you are on a coast-to-coast hookup for ABC?**

Yes, there will be a number of changes in the format of "Juke Box Jury." There will be four panelists instead of six; and we've added two features which I believe will be welcomed by music lovers.

**2. Do you think the nation will be swamped with "Juke Box" panel shows as L. A. was after your show became a success? Would you object again?**

Very likely other similar type panel shows will crop up around the country. This seems to be a sign of success for which I am very proud. However, I will assure our viewers that the format and its features will be fully protected so that they may expect a different kind of show when they tune into "JBJ." It's been a long, hard grind to try to perfect an individual show, and naturally it's upsetting to have someone copy almost verbatim ideas and gimmicks which have taken hours of work, heartaches, and money to develop.

**3. What is the status of your current suit against CBS?**

The suit, now pending against KNXT-CBS, should have a tremendous meaning to others with similar ideas. It is not yet settled. We are anticipating favorable results.

**4. What, in your opinion, are the ten top songs of the past ten years.**

There have been many great songs. In my opinion, for one reason or another, the following are tops: "Tenderly," "Ballerina," "Tennessee Waltz," "Nature Boy," "Autumn in New York," "Christmas Song," "To Each His Own," "Accentuate the Positive," "That's My Desire," and "Golden Earrings."

**5. Who are the top male and female vocalists?**

There are many who run both hot and cold year after year. However, there are two who have taught our modern day vocalists how to sing, namely, Bing Crosby and Ella Fitzgerald. Both shall remain all time "greats" for most popular fans.

**6. What guest or guests did you enjoy working with most? Which did you have the most trouble with?**

There have been over 1000 guests and I must tell you most sincerely that I liked each and every one of them. There were some who stuck out a little more because of their honesty, sincerity, and humor. I was very pleased when such stars as Ann Sheridan, Linda Darnell, and others expressed their desire to go on the panel. It was a sign they liked my show—for in many cases they turned down good money and yet went on my show because they said they enjoyed it. The only trouble I have on "JBJ" is keeping a straight face when I know there is someone on the "hot seat" and the panel is "going to town" on his record. Recalling the time when Jack Bailey was on the panel and a record which Jack had made for a gag the day before was being "murdered" by his fellow jurors. (Your guess who voted it a "hit".) Jack's only reply was "Thank you, my friends." The most controversial guest has been Mickey

Rooney. Cole Porter's appearance was the most talked about. Desi Arnaz, due to his baby's birth, the most sentimental.

**7. Do the guests receive money for their appearances? Will they receive money for the new ABC-TV network show?**

All the "Juke Box Jury" panel members are paid locally and will be paid on the new ABC-TV network show.

**8. The rumor is that Al Jarvis was annoyed when ABC gave you this network assignment? Do you think this is justified?**

First of all, I don't believe Al Jarvis was annoyed when he heard about my show going network. Secondly, ABC didn't give me the network assignment. They only sold time to my new sponsors, "Hazel Bishop Lipstick" who bought "JBJ" before a station or time was set.

**9. Is it true that you were one of the deejays referred to in a recent newspaper article who makes "at least \$2000 and more a week?"**

I doubt it seriously, because I do not make \$2000 a week. But I must tell you I was so elated that someone should think so that I went out to LaRue's for dinner. P. S. I had to charge it!

**10. Do you think disc jockeys are overpaid?**

Definitely not. For the audience they maintain and the pre-work that goes in for the sponsors, station, listening and choosing from several hundred records a month—records you believe will please your audience, along with countless other duties of a disc-jockey—it is my opinion in most cases that the average d. j. is under-paid. For the good will and the selling job he does for both the station and the sponsor he should be referred to as an angel, not disc-jockey.

## Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

### Danny Thomas Show

Tuesday, 9:00 p.m.

Viewers will undoubtedly make room for Danny Thomas after catching the premiere show of his new teleseries, "Make Room for Daddy."

Danny plays the part of Danny Wil-

liams, a top-flight performer who, after an extended out-of-town night club booking, returns home to a waiting family. Because he sees his family so infrequently his children call him "Uncle Daddy;" the family dog bites the "stranger" and his wife (played by Jean Hagan) acts hostile upon his acceptance of a Las Vegas engagement moments after his arrival home. He makes peace in the family by cancelling the engagement, in favor of reservations in Atlantic City for a second honeymoon.

But these plans are also cancelled when his eleven-year-old daughter Terry (played by Sherry Jackson) insists that he entertain before her 6B assembly class by reciting Longfellow's "The Children's Hour." Danny rebels and delivers his night club routine, which of course, falls flatter than a pancake. Swallowing his pride he recites Longfellow's poem and his performance is a howling success.

From all indications the situation-comedy telefilm series looks like the solution to Danny Thomas's former TV dilemma. "Make Room for Daddy" has many similarities to Danny's personal life and he adds genuine warmth and humor to the role of Danny Williams. The cast including Jean Hagen, Sherry Jackson and Rusty Hamer (as six-year-old Rusty Williams) is excellent. Ben Lessy's brief appearance as Danny's accompanist was thoroughly enjoyable. The production and writing on the first show was tops. M.R.

### "The Colgate Comedy Hour"

Martin and Lewis launched the new season for the Colgate Comedy Hour with a show that had its share of hits and misses.

Leading off with a routine that didn't generate much excitement, it proceeded to fall into a rut with a skit about the TV set and the "friendly" spieler as played by Jerry. The act was too long and was saved from disaster only because of Jerry's amusing satire on various types of TV plug artists.

The show started to move in the Burt Lancaster skit—with Burt's doing a remarkably good job. Playing his role, a take-off on his part in "Come Back, Little Sheba," in a somewhat serious fashion, he gave Dean and Jerry a run for their money. It was undoubtedly one of the high spots of the evening. Here were three great talents doing a remarkable job. The skit was a little long, but the boys maintained laughs in spite of the unnecessary length.

Martin and Lewis, however, caught fire, as usual, with their closing bit. Jerry's leading the orchestra while Dean sings has always been good for loud laughs and this one was no ex-

ception. The "Dragnet" bit was tops.

On the whole, the boys seemed to have been held down more than in the past. This had its advantages and disadvantages because, to this reviewer, the success of Martin and Lewis has been their hilarious impromptu routines. But perhaps even these guys need a strong hand to keep them from tearing up the place.

On the basis of the opener, the "Comedy Hour" should hold on to its vast viewing audience.—J.H.

### Dennis Day Show

Playing opposite the popular "I Love Lucy" teleseries is about the toughest assignment imaginable, but apparently it holds no bugaboos for Dennis Day. His first show of the season (for those who tore themselves away from "Lucy" to see it), came off beautifully loaded with warmth, humor and melody.

Because he has switched from a live to filmed show, Dennis emerges as a more flexible personality. The expediency of film adds much to the Dennis Day show as does the revamping of the format. In lieu of the perennial girl friend, on the opening stanza Dennis had "Lavinia," a charming, mischievous, motherly housekeeper with which to contend. Role was played by Ida Moore.

"Charley Weaver" (Cliff Arquette) contributes only moral support to Dennis's problem. "Charley" remains just as loveable and pixilated as ever with his solo bits little gems of Mt. Idy humor.

*"Omnibus"*

**KXNT**  
Sundays, 2 p.m.

Last year "Omnibus" attempted to flatter the intelligence of the average viewer and came up with mixed results. In fact, the show had quite a struggle. The cause seemed to be more the time slot than audience interest.

It hasn't improved as far as the time is concerned, but it is certainly one of the best shows on TV. It's loaded with imagination, effective writing and directing, and it is a relief from the many productions that bank heavily on cliché.

In addition to the excerpts from "Oklahoma," there were two really outstanding segments in this hour and a half show. One was scenes from the prize-winning film, "The Little Fugitive." This was an absolute joy.

The highlight, however, was the play, "Glory in the Flower," written by William Inge and starring Hume Cronyn and Jessica Tandy. This was a beautiful, moving production. Its writing was outstanding, the performances by Jessica Tandy and Cronyn were superb.

This reviewer didn't catch the James Thurber skit but if it was as good as the rest of the show, "Omnibus" is really doing a service to the public. Even though it's on at a bad time, give it a good, long look and get your faith in TV renewed.—J.H.

"Pride of the Family," KECA-TV's new entry to its power-laden line-up for the year, has been touted in advance as a sensation. Well, it's not exactly a sensation but it is certainly pleasant watching.

Another of the domestic comedy situation shows, the first telecast had enough good solid laughs and warmth to generate some excitement for its future. Plot-wise it was nothing out of the ordinary, but the capable playing of stars Paul Hartman, Fay Wray and Natalie Wood lifted it well above the so-so level.

Paul Hartman displayed an excellent flair for light comedy. He is no eccentric—just an ordinary father with ordinary problems to meet. # Lifelines

WHEN STAN FREBERG AND DAWS BUTLER appeared on Ed Sullivan's "Toast of the Town" a couple of weeks ago, my pride was bursting because two local lads were hitting the sky. Their record, "St. George and the Dragonet" and "Little Blue Riding Hood," had already smashed precedent by selling 508,000 copies the first week it was released. Last week when I enjoyed a lively meal with Stan, Daws and their agent, Miles Auer, Stan had just received word that sales had hit 900,000.

I THINK THIS IS THE KIND of story people like to dig into—I know I relished every facet of the success story as the boys told it.

FIRST, YOU SHOULD KNOW THAT Stan and Daws have been around for several years playing on radio, on TV ("Beany") and doing voices for movie cartoons. Stan is a Pasadena boy, son of a retired Swedish Baptist minister. He went to school in South Pasadena and at Alhambra High and for two years appeared with Clifflie Stone on the "Coffee Time" program. As yet unmarried, he still lives at home in Pasadena with his folks. Daws is married (and expecting).

STAN HAS CUT A FEW SATIRICAL records the past couple years under a Capitol contract and it was Capitol's veep, Alan Livingston, who first had the brainstorm to do a satire on "Dragnet" shortly after Ray Anthony's record got big. Stan and Daws agreed that this was a great idea, but knew that they should first obtain Jack Webb's permission. The fellows went out onto a set where Jack was shooting his TV "Dragnet." Jack wasn't too keen about the idea at first—he felt that "Dragnet" was a serious thing and that a satire might not be too good. It took three hours to convince him that somebody was going to do what Stan and Daws proposed, so Jack might as well give permission to guys he knew and trusted. Freberg had appeared several times on "Dragnet" and Daws had been around Radio Row long enough for Webb to feel safe with them. Naturally, Stan and Daws agreed to cut Webb in on a share of profits and left with permission granted, presumably

to write the material. If Jack Webb reads this, he'll know for the first time that when Freberg and Butler came to plead with him last August 17 the satire for both sides of the record was already in their pockets.

IT HAD TAKEN STAN AND DAWS about fifteen hours of collaboration to turn out both "St. George" and "Riding Hood." "St. George" was the easy one—consumed about four hours. "Riding Hood" came tougher.

FUNNY PART ABOUT THIS SATIRICAL material was it contained some gags "borrowed" from a proposed radio show which Stan and Daws had

been trying to peddle without success. Their feeling was and of course now is that the public is much sharper today than twenty years ago. The public taste has grown to where it can enjoy keen satire. Now the record has proved that, but until Freberg and Butler made a smash disc, radio and TV program men couldn't see their stuff for dust. Repeatedly Stan and Daws were told it would go over listeners' and lookers' heads.

ANYWAY, THE BOYS WENT AHEAD, fingers crossed, and cut the platter August 26, a Wednesday night. Part of the deal with Jack Webb was that Walter Schuman, who composed the "Dragnet" theme, be included in the

cutting and royalties. Apparently Jack trusted Stan and Daws implicitly, for he didn't even ask to see the copy before the record was made.

"IT LOOKED GOOD RIGHT AWAY," Freberg said. "Capitol played it next morning for some of its personnel and everyone was enthusiastic." It was piped onto the "Dragnet" set. Everyone laughed like crazy.

**THE BOYS WAITED.** The record was scheduled to come out over the week-end of September 12 and to be released nationally on Monday, September 14. Saturday evening, on Peter Potter's "Juke Box Jury," three people, Jimmy Boyd, Dorothy Malone and Bob Crosby, voted it a "miss" (wouldn't sell 200,000). Al Martineau, Polly Bergen and Kathy Crosby (Bob's sprout) considered it a "hit." Twenty-four hours later "St. George and the Dragonet" and "Little Blue Riding Hood" had sold 250,000 copies. By week's end, the record had been bought by 508,000 fans. Sunday, September 27, Freberg and Butler, along with radio actress June Foray who took the part of "Little Blue Riding Hood," flew to New York to appear

coast-to-coast on Sullivan's show. Three weeks and two days after the record first appeared, it had sold in excess of 900,000 and was smashing through to a million.

**NEEDLESS TO SAY,** Freberg and Butler are walking on air. They told me that when they stood backstage, waiting to walk on "Toast of the Town," when the music struck up, they were thrilled to the core and said to one another, "This is IT!"

**THEY'RE HAPPY IN MORE WAYS** than one. Money and success, sure. But additionally, this is their first collaboration and now they want to do much more satirical writing and acting together. They've also proved to their own satisfaction that the public's taste is sharper than some believed. And what's more, the ones who first disagreed with Stan and Daws are now swinging around.

"Doors are opening right and left," Stan beamed. "They want us at New York Paramount. In Chicago. At Las Vegas. They want us to go on the Perry Como Show, but we don't seem to be able to get permission to leave 'Beany' for even a couple of days." (Stan has played "Ceil" and other parts and

Manning the microphones in their respective cities are **Paul Masterson** and **Sylvie St. Clair** from the Mocambo; **Jean Paul King** from the Sands Hotel; **Eddie Hubbard** from the Hotel Morrison and **Mike O'Shea** from the Penand Pencil Restaurant.

The sum total of the hop-scotch format was sixty minutes of off-the-cuff repetitious interviews loaded with plugs, by the celebs for their movies, plays or records. The only reticent interviewee was **Bill A. DeWitt**, co-author with **Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt** of the new tome "U. N.: Today and Tomorrow."

We still say that with the proper format, Frank could be a TV leader. Regardless of that, his comeback is the talk of the town.

If you'd like to hear how commercials should be given, give a listen to Dennis James's spiels for Old Gold. You can believe this man is sincere. Of course, it probably helps him to have intelligent commercials to deliver. Whatever the reason, he's a standout in his field. Which reminds us—we can't help wondering just what the two girls who are the dancing Old Gold packages are thinking as they go through their routine. They probably spent a good amount of time learning to dance—and then to end up with their faces covered and being packages of cigarettes! They must feel very frustrated.

# What I Know About Guy

▲ **GUY MADISON** and Andy Devine are good friends off their "Wild Bill Hickok" shows as well as on. You seldom see pictures of these two western favorites in "civvies." Two dashing gentlemen, eh what?

▼ **GUY AND ANDY WERE RECENT GUESTS** of the famous Frontier Days Rodeo in Cheyenne. Their appearances added plenty of lustre and excitement to the occasion. Also at the rodeo were eleven-year old Gene Kirkman and twelve-year old Nora Kerr, winners in the "Name Andy's Ranch" contest sponsored by the Kellogg Company.



**I**T TOOK a couple of months of working with him on the "Wild Bill Hickok" series before I realized how much Guy Madison and I had in common. Guy is pretty quiet until he gets before the camera or the mike, so he doesn't volunteer a lot of information about himself. I'd read a lot of publicity about him when he first started in pictures which gave him a big build-up as a glamour boy. Then one day I asked him where he grew up. He told me, "Just outside Bakersfield." I gave a big sigh of relief and said, "I'm from Arizona, so it looks like this show is stuck with a couple of country boys come to town."

The next day I asked him to drop by the house for some cornbread and blackeyed peas. Since then he's been to our place so often we all think of him as one of the family.

What impresses me most about Guy is his humility. In our early days of making "Hickok" TV films he asked me to give him any suggestions at all that would help his performance. I've never had an acting lesson in my life, but after working in pictures since 1926 I've picked up a few tricks from watching western stars like Hoot Gibson, Tom Mix and Buck Jones. For instance, in

making fast mounts and dismounts your actions will look bigger and cleaner if you're facing the camera instead of lined up at a side angle. This was a little gimmick I'd been keeping to myself for several years, but I quickly passed it along to Guy because anybody as unassuming and eager to learn as he is deserves everything I've got to give.

I think Guy's first hit in pictures about ten years ago came about because he was probably the best-looking young man in town. But he's not trading on his looks these days. His wonderful success both in the "Hickok" series and in his Warner Brothers pictures is because he's one of the hardest workers I've ever known and at the same time he doesn't make a move or speak a line without complete sincerity. That's a combination which will put anybody on top.

I'll never forget the time near the end of a long day of shooting when he kept mispronouncing the word "bank" as "bink." "There's that Bakersfield coming out in you!" I yelled. "From now on you're going to be known as 'Bink.'" The nickname caught on. Everybody on the set and at the KHJ radio show now calls him that. I wasn't sure just how he took to his new name until one day he said to me, "I'll always appreciate it that you got everybody started on 'Bink.' My real name is Bob Moselev, but years back the studio changed it, and I never got used to 'Guy' because it's a phony. But 'Bink' somehow fits me."

Another thing I like about him is that he's a young man with a purpose. He's saving his money to buy a ranch in northern California or Nevada. I remember the respect I felt when he once said to me, "A lot of people say they're actors because they need acting as a form of expression to satisfy their emotions. I like this business, but the biggest emotion I feel about it is when I endorse my paychecks."

I've been hooked up with Guy about three years now, and in that time I've stopped thinking of him as a co-worker in the "Hickok" series. Instead, I feel the same interest, warmth and pride in him as though he'd joined the family as another son.

# What I Know About Andy

**A**NDY DEVINE plays the part of Jingles in the "Wild Bill Hickok" TV-radio series as a slow-thinking, not-too-bright fellow whose biggest aim is to keep his stomach full. But don't let his acting give you any clues to his real personality. Actually, he's one of the most intelligent men in Hollywood.

He can talk at length on more subjects than anyone else I know. Here's just a partial list of the various activities which have been a part of his life aside from acting: orchid growing, raising jumping horses, flying, operating an airport, running a restaurant, breeding Labrador retrievers, life-guarding, playing professional football and baseball, operating a lighthouse, railroad construction, working as a cowboy, raising chickens, pigeon racing and acting as honorary mayor of Van Nuys for fifteen years.

His home life is ideal and a pattern for anyone to follow. He eloped in 1933 with Dorothy "Doogie" House whom he'd met through Will Rogers. They have two sons, Tad and Denny. Tad, who is about five years older than Denny, week after week won all kinds of medals and prizes for swimming two summers ago. His picture was in the paper often and he got a lot of well-deserved attention from all the Devines' friends and relatives. Andy realized that Denny, who was at the sensitive age of twelve, might feel a little neglected. So just before school started last fall Andy took him on his first trip to New York. It was Denny's holiday, so anything the boy wanted to do, they did. Denny came back with a lot more importance attached to his twelve-year-old life.

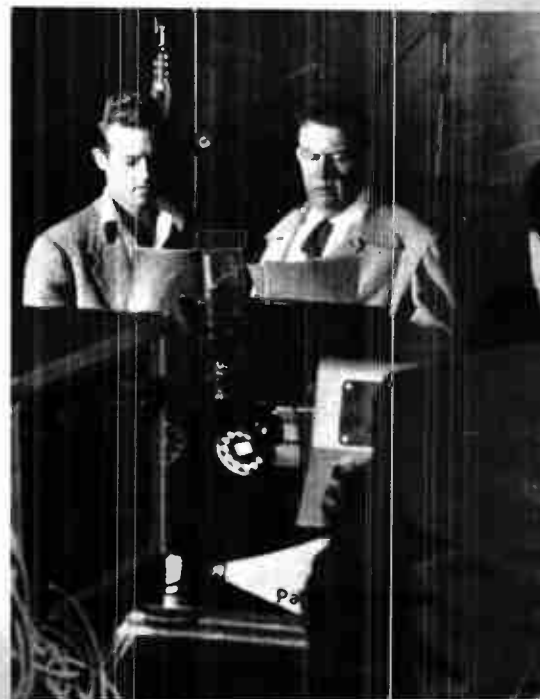

Another thing about Andy that I respect is his uncanny memory about people. He seems to be able to remember everyone he's worked with the past twenty-seven years by first name. This same ability goes for people outside Hollywood, too. We often leave town on personal-appearance tours, and I don't think there's been a single time at any airport throughout the nation that Andy didn't run into someone he knew well enough to say something like: "Hello, Dick. How are Rose and the kids?" Finally I asked him how he did it.

He said, "It's a holdover from my younger days. My dad ran a hotel in Kingman, Arizona. Also, my dad had a wooden leg. My brother and I used to work as bellboys, and if we didn't remember the name of every traveling salesman who came through Kingman each year we'd get the worst prod in the back from that wooden leg you can imagine.

I like Andy's personal philosophy and I think it's good enough to pass along. He says, "If everything's going well, be humble and grateful about it. If things seem bad, you've still got your hope."

## "Nutsy" Is Nuts About Kids

**I**T ISN'T at all strange that Vance Colvig became KNBH's "Nutsy the Clown." Vance comes by his clownship naturally; he's merely following the footsteps of his famous clown-father "Bozo."

His battered derby and caricatured face keep the children chuckling. According to tradition, kids are supposed to be the most important things to clowns and they certainly are to Vance. He proves his interest in the young fry by devoting endless hours to a constant round of the children's wards in the various hospitals. Vance never says no to a hospital p. a.

He claims that the youngsters believe that clowns, like Santa Claus, are a special breed of people created to make them happy. And Vance would no more shatter their illusions than he would jump off a cliff. Vance is loyal to their wonderful world of make believe by making sure he's always in costume and makeup whenever they are about. He's also careful not to smoke in their presence because it just doesn't look right. Because children can't conceive a Mrs. Clown, Vance even removes his wed-

ding band when performing. However all these precautions have a brighter side. When out of costume "Nutsy" becomes a nonentity and Vance enjoys the privacy seldom afforded to TV personalities. "For once," he smiles, "it pays to have a dual personality."

Vance didn't get his start in show business as a clown. He made his debut in a motion picture when he was six months old and later appeared in many of the Buster Brown, Our Gang and Mickey McGuire comedies. Upon completion of his schooling he tried his hand at the Pasadena Playhouse and radio. After a brief stint as a radio actor he started to write comedy and audience participation shows. He has scripted "Breakfast in Hollywood," "The Jack Kirkwood Show," "Bride and Groom" and many others.

About two years ago Vance made his bow as the happy tramp clown "Nutsy" on KNBH. Because his childhood was spent with the traveling circus, his background gives an authentic sawdust flavor to his show. And he calls upon his many personal circus friends to appear as guests.

In addition to circus and animal

acts, Vance has incorporated his favorite hobby, magic, into the program. After making a rabbit appear and disappear one week, the kids wrote in asking for more. The next week he tried it with two doves . . . and right in the middle of the act one of the doves ad libbed and dropped a tiny egg right on the stage. Everybody . . . the audience, the stage hands, the cameramen . . . except Nutsy was in an uproar. But, according to Vance, after thirty-three years in show business, this wasn't the first time his act had laid an egg.

Off the set, Vance has a delightful sense of humor and a thoroughly enjoyable, lackadaisical manner. His wife "Tinky" and son Tracy live in San Fernando Valley. He enjoys skeet shooting and piloting his own plane. He loves to slumber and the alarm clock is his worst enemy. On one occasion when he was the intended guest of honor at a fishing party he slept right through the morning never even hearing the screaming alarm clock. "I'm with kids so much of the time," he says, "that merely by association I've acquired their habit of needing lots of sleep."
