

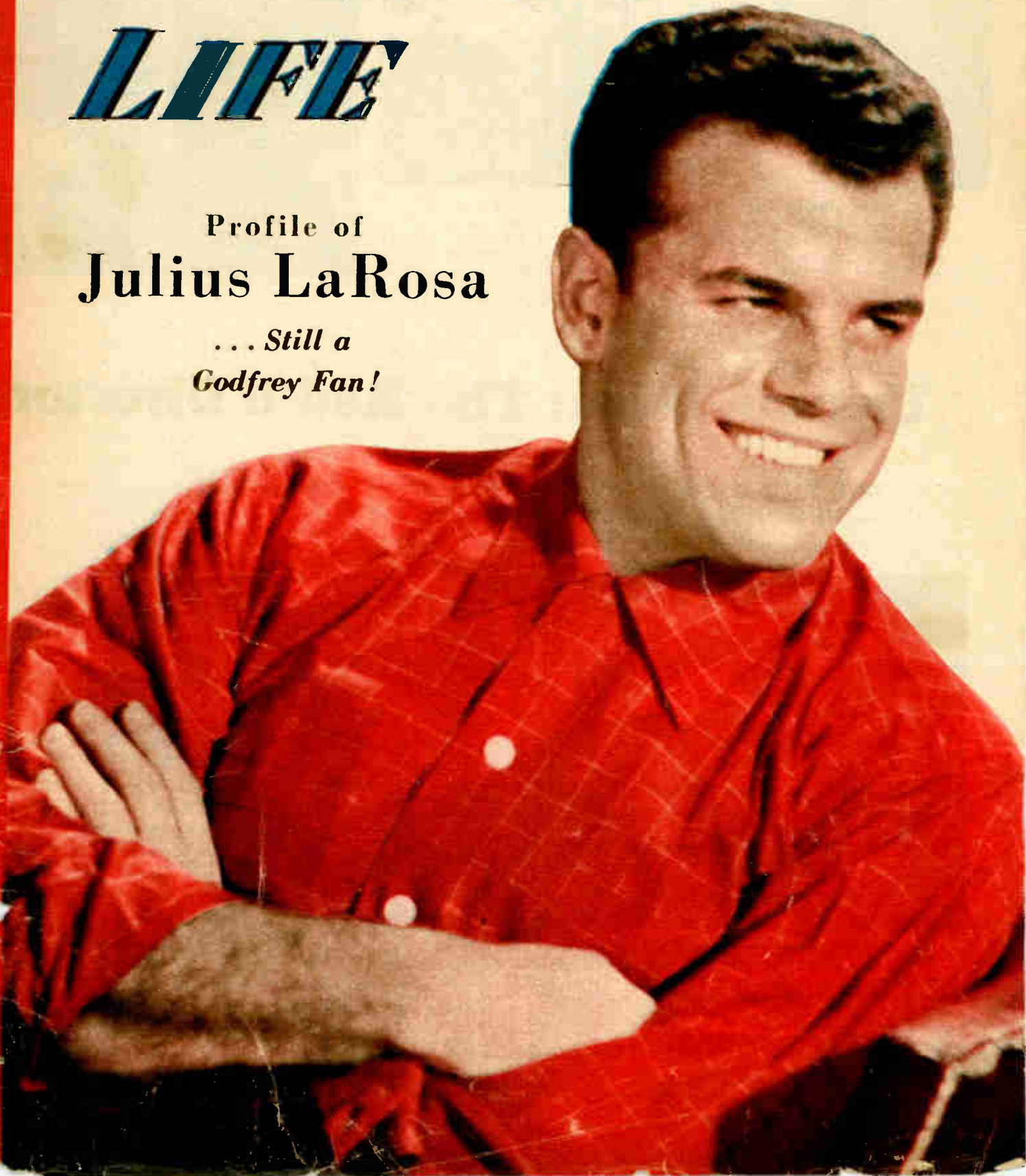

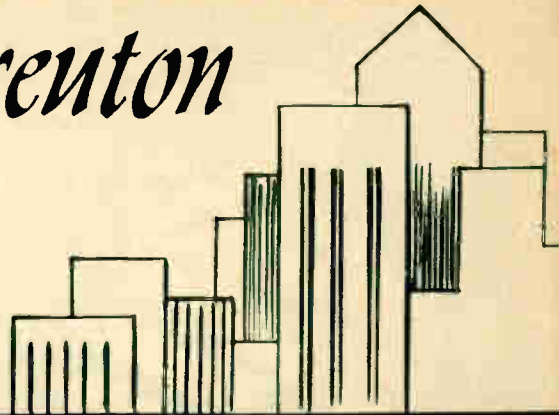

Cowboy From Trenton

ALL WESTERN stars aren't from Oklahoma and here's one who's frank enough to admit it. He's KTLA's Eddie Clethro. Eddie hails from Trenton, New Jersey, and his real moniker is O'Cletherow. As happy an Irish name as O'Erien or O'Toole!

When Eddie decided to enter the Western field of music he thought it was necessary to be from either Oklahoma or Texas before he could be accepted by the "folks." So he swapped Trenton for Colgate, Oklahoma, and O'Cletherow for Clethro. Then he dropped the clarinets and trombones from his society dance band and added some fiddles and an accordion, converting his combo to a Western band. Gradually the band's tempo was changed from a waltzing rhythm to the strumming beat of the guitar.

Eddie's transition from Society to

Western music occurred in a rather unique manner. He was doing a Western broadcast with Stuart Hamblen's "Lucky Stars" over KFVB during the day and playing at the former Tom Brenneman restaurant in the evening. The clientele frequenting that night spot seemed indifferent to the sweet and low melodies but whenever the band slipped in a Western number the audience applauded enthusiastically. As far as Eddie was concerned, this reaction indicated the music trend in Los Angeles, and he decided to enter the Western field exclusively.

Forman Phillips gave him his first break as a Western star when he booked him into his Baldwin Park Ballroom. Eddie admits it was a far cry from his previous engagements at the El Rancho in Las Vegas or our own Ambassador Hotel. But he was determined to make the grade as a Western entertainer.

At first the transition was difficult for Eddie. He felt somewhat like a fish out of water. But he liked the homey, friendliness of his audiences. He resolved that in time he would make them feel that he was one of them. Even the music and lyrics had a sincere meaning. The feeling and significance caught hold once he became immersed in its tempo. He calls it a type of folk music, a kind of Americana.

The smiling Irishman has become a true convert to Western music and he's convinced that the potential for more converts is growing every day. Recently, when KTLA's Klaus Landsberg was cited by the B'nai B'rith at the Beverly Hills Hotel, Eddie and his Round-Up Boys were called upon to play at the function. The guests, attired in evening splendor, cast aloof glances at the group of musicians wearing Western regalia. However, their icy stares melted once Eddie and the band had them tapping their feet to Western melodies. Eddie isn't sure whether or not he converted some of those sophisticates to Western music after their first exposure to the singing guitar. But he's sure of one thing — you don't have to come from Texas or Oklahoma to make the grade as a Western entertainer.

(The characters in this play are Ida Moore, better known as "Lavinia," the elderly lady who takes a motherly interest in Dennis Day on the NBC Dennis Day Show and who takes a romantic one in Charley Weaver, and Cliff Arquette, the lovable Charley Weaver who has delighted TV and radio fans for years.

(The subject matter of the play is: romance—how to get it and how to avoid it.)

CLIFF: I've tried romance the serious way—twice. My conclusions are simply that old wives are like cars. You make the down payment on them and then keep on paying monthly payments for years. My wives and I left good friends. I left her friends and she left mine.

IDA: I've never been married. I guess I just didn't move fast enough. My girl friends beat me to the men I liked. But I think marriage is a wonderful institution. I'm sorry I never tried it.

CLIFF: It's an institution all right. It can give you a nice trip to Norway. But I hear it's pretty there in the spring.

IDA: Now, Cliff, you know you don't really feel that way. Everyone wants to belong to someone.

CLIFF: Sure he does. But it all depends to what you belong.

IDA: Well, no man has to fall into the trap for marriage—if he doesn't want to and from what I've seen he always wants to.

CLIFF: I have to admit I wanted to fall into them, but at least I've learned to know what the various traps are. Take the girl on the prowl. She has her sights set on a guy and she becomes all kinds of characters to get him. At first she's the quiet little thing who looks at you adoringly. That's the little girl approach. The next time you see her she is the housewifely type who has cooked you an abominable dinner. Being a cook myself I can at least tell when a dinner is bad. The third time you see her she is in a black negligee and is quite the siren. That's the time to tell her to blow.

IDA: A girl in love can't be blamed for trying anything she can to get the man she wants. I didn't try so I never married. After all, I still say

a man likes to be trapped or he wouldn't be trapped.

CLIFF: Yeah, he's like the little boy who doesn't want to take a bath but when he's in it it's nice—at times.

IDA: I still believe men are uncomfortable when they're alone. They like to be taken care of.

CLIFF: They're certainly migratory beasts—that's for sure. But they also have to be alert at all times. They have to be women watchers. That's one reason why I like the character of Charley Weaver — he never has to worry about women.

IDA: He's certainly an evasive person on the show anyway.

CLIFF: Men are susceptible to romance from the time they're two years old. They like to be patted on the head and given candy even then. It's just that later on as they grow up and get involved with girls they get patted on the head harder and get punch drunk. And I know right now that, with all my firm beliefs, somebody could come along and I'd go right on my head.

Ida Moore and Cliff Arquette, the popular characters on the "Dennis Day Show," trade views on the ancient arts of how to get a man and how to avoid a girl. This being leap year, their remarks are quite significant.

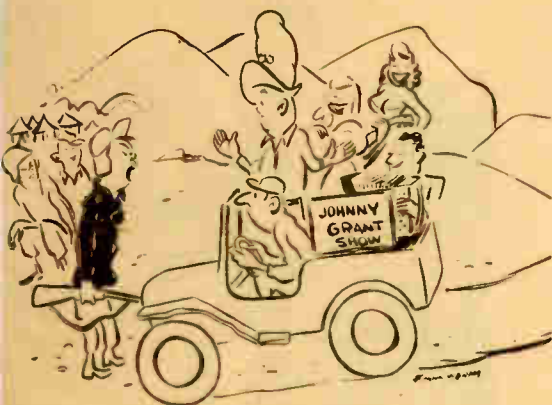

SMILING Johnny Grant answers to the name of “Jokie, Jokie.” It's become a simple reflex action for this is the name the children of Korea have tagged on him.

Johnny has established an enviable record among top-flight entertainers. He has made five trips to remote Korea. Troops in Panama, Alaska and the Aleutians have also enjoyed Johnny's performances. Actually Johnny didn't get started as a USO entertainer until 1950. He was busily engaged during the war as Sergeant J. Grant.

While Johnny was sitting in Bob Hope's dressing room one evening, Hope was lamenting to Johnny that he had reluctantly turned down an invitation to March Field because of a previous commitment, Hope suggested that Johnny go there instead to entertain the troops. Johnny has always been glad that he accepted the suggestion.

Johnny, with his twenty gallon hat adorned with five stars, has become a tradition in Korea. There are no reserve seats when the curtain goes up for Johnny and his troupe of USO entertainers. Army brass has figuratively hung from the rafters to watch his shows. His audiences walk miles to see the rotund disc jockey, KMPC's

pride and joy, who turned comedian but a few short years ago.

Confidence, respect and admiration is a two-way deal between Johnny and the servicemen. He ribs the pants off the brass and what's more these very same officers tip Johnny off on the gripes of the men under their command so that he can peg his gags on these gripes.

Know the Score

After five trips to Korea Johnny is more convinced than ever that the boys are genuinely concerned about combating the spread of Communism. “They endorse the United Nations and the principles for which they were fighting. The Army of Occupation knows they have a big job in helping to reconstruct war-torn Korea. The GI's have taken untold thousands of dollars from their own pockets to help finance the rebuilding of Korea. California's 48th Division has built a modern school, contributing both the physical and monetary factors. The men in Korea are our country's best ambassadors of good will.”

Johnny's eyes were moist as he related the 1953 Christmas Party for 500 Korean children. He said it was a touching sight to see each member of an entire company adopt a different child with whom to share Christmas.

The importance of letters and entertainment for the boys in Korea was strongly stressed by Johnny. Although the Army of Occupation is busy rebuilding Korea, their need for that letter from home is more urgent than ever.

Entertainment

Johnny cited that the GI's today have higher standards of entertainment than their older brothers had during World War II. In addition to the Armed Forces Radio Shows, servicemen see kinescopes of such television programs as “Colgate Comedy Hour,” “I Love Lucy,” “My Little Margie,” “Hit Parade,” and many special and sporting events. To meet this kind of competition USO entertainers must put on a good show. He referred to the Terry Moore situation as much to do about nothing—an incident which snowballed into adverse publicity.

Whenever Johnny returns from a

junket to Korea he brings tape recordings of Southern California's native sons. Some of the were made during Freedom Village's “Operation Big Switch.” He makes a record of each tape and mails it to the parents after he has played it on his KMPC ailer.

Johnny has had many citations and letters commending him for his patriotism and showmanship. But the letter he cherishes the most came from a fatally wounded serviceman, whom Johnny had entertained at a base hospital. The letter of appreciation concluded with: “Guys like you do as much good in Korea as the guys like us.”

Caesar-Coca Spit

The news this week that Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca would not appear together on next season's "Show of Shows" was hardly a surprise.

Early last year there were reports that the two stars were tiring of the show's format as it existed. There were rumors that both wanted out—or wanted more money. And that each wanted his own program. At the time these comments were dismissed with a casual nod of the head and with the explanation that a disgruntled lesser-employee had fanned the breeze too much.

Now it is set that Caesar will have his own hour long show next season and that a half-hour situation comedy, which is what she has always wanted, would be developed for Miss Coca.

Max Liebman, producer of "Show of Shows," emphatically has stated that the separation of the two stars was amicable and friendly and each would be happy to do guest spots on the other's program—whatever it might be. Let's hope this statement isn't like the one handed out by Hollywood stars who get divorced: "We're still good friends."

Caesar and Coca have done a terrific job for "Show of Shows." They are great artists and they deserve the chance to go out on their own. They realize that too much of a good thing can be bad for them and eventually boring to the public. They have made the right move at the right time and we wish them both luck.

Bing Crosby is considering entering the telefilm industry next year as a producer, not an entertainer. His next TV stint, with guest stars Joanne Gilbert and the Wiere Brothers, is set for April 4. The stanza was filmed in one day and you can bet that there was no fooling around on the set the day of the shooting.

Joan Caulfield has been set to emcee the Frances Holmes Achievement Awards presentation next month. Lulus, a statuette, are presented to women who have made outstanding contributions to the advertising industry. . . . Ray Bolger and wife Gwen have decided to make California their permanent residence. Consequently, they moved from the in-laws to their own address in Beverly Hills. . . . Richard English, packager of NBC's radio stanza "Last Man Out," an anti-communistic series, has been asked to do a TV adaptation for "U. S. Steel."

Eddie Fisher is set to arrive on the Coast the first of next week to celebrate his first anniversary as star of NBC-TV's "Coke Time." . . . Public Defender, starring Reed Halley bows on CBS-TV, March 11. The series reveals the exciting and distinguished role played by a defense counsel for de-

fendants unable to furnish their own. . . . Cleve Roberts is on leave to the Far East where he prepares another series on that area. . . . Commander Comet (Larry Harmon) produces "They Strike By Night." Telefilm series deals with underground activities in Europe during the night. Recently the bottom fell out of Hank's dreams. The sponsor pulled out (said the show cost too much). So Hank was stuck—without a show and with a bunch of obligations to fulfill to his cast members. A significant legal suit may come out of the whole deal.

Ear, Eye Inspire the Pen

First of all, as you said in a recent issue, Red Skelton is the real all round comedian for young and old alike. I like many others—such as Jack Benny—but of course the difference in their special type of entertainment is so great that my reasons for picking out Red especially so, is because unfortunately he had been getting bad material recently. His ad libs are superb—and that because he certainly has it in him to be tops.

I mainly write this because I wish Red would sing one of his songs on each program, or at least now and again; for when I used to listen to him first sing that "Tennessee Waltz" on radio, I made the remark to many that his voice is perfect for the microphone. It is soothing and very musical—and as we all know every comedian to be great—must also have pathos. Charlie Chaplin had that pathos too—which made him so great in his day. I lived in England when the latter was on the silent screen, and he could make you weep as well as rock with laughter. A comedian without pathos is dead. Red when he played one of his recent pictures with the young lad without being mushy and boring, his face revealed every single pathetic moment to such an extent, a person would have had to be void of sentiment not to have wept. Some called it corny perhaps, but I know when a thing is corny and false sentiment.

I read recently of the great George Robey in London (84 years of age) just being knighted, and there is no other person of whom I know nowadays who would better in his capacity for such an honor were it given here than Red Skelton. I would much prefer that his writers leave out the sordid mimicry of a drunkard—he does it superbly—but that would, in time, hurt Red's popularity with the best majority, and that is what counts. He doesn't have to knock himself out either, for I hate to see a wonderful actor whether comedian or otherwise, wear himself out. . . .

Then there's George Putnam. He's a very convincing talker, a mighty nice fellow and we like him. He's a quiet talker and we always listen to him. He is our favorite of the late newscasters. We hear him at 11 p.m. just before shutting the set off and going to bed.

And what's wrong with Bill Welsh? He's generous enough to send his thanks and his picture to his admirers—which is something you can't say for a lot of the others.

Dick Lane is in a class all by himself. We've liked and admired him for a long time, no matter where he's at or what he's doing. We like Dick Lane, period. Did you ever hear him sing? We prefer him to Julius La Rosa—and a whole lot of the others, and have begged KTLA to give him a spot. He roars out his commercial something like the MGM Lion and when he does, we tune him down.

I think, for many reasons, I'd give Dick my vote, even though he is an old meany and won't put out any pictures of himself or write any letters of appreciation. I'd like one with his glasses on just the way he looks at "Wrestler's Lament" time, eyes twinkling and full of deviltry. His wife would have no cause for apprehensions. I'm 65.

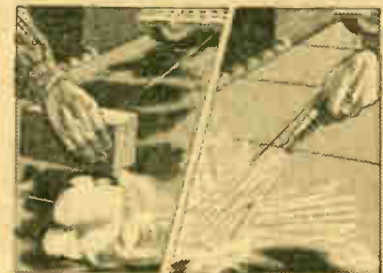

Recently there has been a good deal of talk pro and con about newscasters analyzing the news. Frankly, we can't see what all the fuss is about since this sort of thing has been going on for quite a few years now with no special issue made of it before. It has been the practice on radio and now on TV for certain newscasters to spend most of their time in analysis of the news. Men like Edward R. Murrow, Cecil Brown, Chet Huntley, Elmer Peterson, and others have worked along the analytical lines. And in most instances they have done much to clarify the endless maze of news releases. Naturally, at times their personal views are bound to enter their discussions, but what's so bad about that? For those who don't like their news analyzed, there's always another station or channel to switch to—and yet the ones who complain the most about the commentators are the ones who seem to spend the most time listening to them. These analysts do serve a purpose—they do make vital issues more understandable. If their interpretation doesn't fit yours, tune in somebody else whose views are more to your liking.

Watched three TV dramas in a row

one night recently and was struck by the excess schmaltz dished out in all. Two of them even concerned themselves with television as the motivating factor. And each had an ending that was telegraphed far in advance and that was as corny as all get-out. Only a few dramatic programs seem to go after a high standard—and these never fail to draw an imposing list of regular viewers. So wouldn't this seem an indication to the rest of the TV dramas that lightweight drivel isn't exactly what the public is looking for? Speaking of dramatic programs, one of the better offerings is the Goodyear and Philco Playhouse and Roddy McDowall did another good job last week in "Buy Me Blue Ribbons." He's fast becoming a regular TV fixture.

The Colegate Comedy Hour's production of "Anything Goes," a smash Broadway musical hit of a few years ago, should be the start of something different. Why not do other musicals in their entirety? There's a limitless field here and almost everyone would love to see productions of hits like "Vagabond King," "Chocolate Soldier," "South Pacific," "Carousel," and many more. Royalties might boost

the budget in these instances, but they'd be good on occasions anyway.

Jack Rourke, who has three shows on KABC-TV now, is starting a new contest—a "Phantom Personality" idea. First clues are to be given on his show beginning March 1. The programs are "Jack Rourke Show" from 3-3:30 p.m., "Ladies Matinee" from 3:30 to 3:55 p.m., and "Jack Rourke in Hollywood" from 5:55-6 p.m. We'll hazard a guess on his first "personality" and say she's either Jane Russell or Audrey Hepburn.

Understand that "T Men In Action" is going off TV soon. Let's hope that this high-rated show will find another spot because it has steadily improved and has become one of the better offerings. There is some talk of its getting a new time slot and perhaps a new network, so will try to keep you informed.

Amos 'n' Andy

"Amos 'n' Andy" deviated from their usual format to dramatize their life story, in commemoration of their twenty-seventh year in broadcasting. The life story of the pair has been told many times before but never in this manner.

Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll traced their careers from their early days when they were struggling producers of amateur shows, to their eventual success as blackface comics.

Their radio venture "Sam and Henry" was such a success on an indie station that they were offered a network show. Their moniker became "Amos 'n' Andy" when they went coast-to-coast because the independent station would not relinquish its ownership of the title "Sam and Henry."

At first, the reviews were terrible. "A and A" was called the biggest flop and a great disappointment among other things. Gosden and Correll worked hard at being "A and A" despite the caustic reviews.

Encouragement from the singer with the Whiteman band, a young vocalist named Bing Crosby, and a vaudevilleian called Jack Benny, gave the boys heart.

Eventually the show caught on and it became a custom for motion picture houses to halt their films at seven and turn on the radio so that their audiences could listen to the popular "Amos 'n' Andy" show.

After a brief visit to the United States the great Bernard

Shaw said: "What I'll remember most about the United States is Niagara Falls, the Rocky Mountains and 'Amos 'n' Andy'."

Bill Hay, the announcer who was with them for so many years, was dragged out of retirement to participate in the special broadcast. Ed Murrow referred to the program as becoming part of American folklore. Lowell Thomas was also on hand to pay tribute to the boys. The presence of Bill Paley, Chairman of the CBS Board, and Gen. David Sarnoff, Chairman of the NBC Board, on the same program was a noteworthy spot.

"Amos 'n' Andy" talked of retirement a year ago but public sentiment changed their minds. Gosden and Correll have made radio history. And history cannot retire.—M.R.

On mike Dave Maxwell sounds like Bing Crosby. The KBIG announcer has been accused of effecting the similarity of voices. But Dave is the least affected guy in the business.

Godfrey sent Julie a telegram to appear at the club, heard him sing, and Julie appeared on the Godfrey shows a few times in uniform . . . Godfrey told him to see him when he was discharged . . .

Julie has a CBS radio contract . . . he records for Cadence Records . . . he is proud of his eight new suits, his first especially tailored clothes . . . grey is his favorite color . . . he

weighs 175 pounds, but has lost about eighteen pounds in the last two months . . . he's a sound sleeper and can sleep anywhere, anytime . . . he enjoys swimming, loves baseball, football as spectator sports. . . .

He wears conservative clothes and loves sports outfits . . . he is particular about his trousers always being well pressed . . . he likes loafer shoes, but wears dressier shoes on stage, and these he slips off if they bother him . . .

He's impulsive and has a true Italian temperament . . . says what's on his mind and what's in his heart . . . his ambition has always been to sing . . . his idol is Frank Sinatra . . . he used to play hookey from school to sit out two or three shows at the Paramount when Sinatra appeared there . . . while Frankie is his idol he worships Perry Como . . . thinks he's a "saint." . . .

Fans Mob Him

His fans now give him the same treatment they gave Sinatra . . . 300 to 500 kids hang around the theaters constantly . . . he talks to them from the window in his dressing room . . . he realizes that a lot of his fans are teenagers, but when adults, middle-aged folk, old people stop him in hotel lobbies or the street he's speechless . . . he just mumbles a shy "thank you, sir" or "thank you, ma'am."

He's thrilled by police escorts . . . he got a big kick out of the time he had a barber come up to his hotel room to shave him . . . he couldn't get out of his room because the hotel lobby was jammed with kids waiting to see him . . . he's still thrilled at meeting celebrities. . . .

When he's out of town on tours he calls his folks every night . . . ordinarily he speaks on the phone with people around him, but when he makes a call to his mother and father he always goes into a room and closes the door . . .

The Theater's Noted Mr. and Mrs. Team Delight Listeners With Their Radio Series, "The Marriage."

COMEDY writers are continually poking fun at marriage. Serious writers have a tendency to overemphasize the weighty problems which revolve about matrimony.

However, Jessica Tandy and Hume Cronyn have a different approach to the subject. As "Mr. and Mrs. Marriott" in their NBC radio series, appropriately titled "The Marriage," the pair adopts a middle-of-the-road policy. Their perspective is closer to reality than any other family situation series, be it radio or television.

On the basis that marriage is a most popular domestic relationship between friendly couples, the talented pair weaves a stanza that's sure to please many listeners. The fact that the stars are husband and wife could conceivably contribute to their enjoyable performance.

Career

The Cronyns met backstage when a mutual friend introduced them many years ago. The versatile Hume started out to be a lawyer but switched to the acting profession. His Broadway credits are many. But most outstanding are "Hamlet," "Fourposter," "Hilda Crane," and "Now I Lay Me Down To Sleep." You've seen him on film in "Lifeboat," "Brute Force," "A Letter to Evie," and many more movies too numerous to mention. The actor's dignified bearing

compensates for his shortness of stature; he has gray eyes, brown hair and strongly-moulded features. He was an amateur boxer in college and now is devoted to skin fishing, equipped with the usual flippers and goggles plus an underwater camera.

British-born Jessica Tandy is perhaps best remembered for her role as the neurotic Blanche in the Pulitzer Prize winner "A Streetcar Named Desire." She has played in Britain's repertory theaters as well as on Broadway. She was "Ophelia" to Gielgud's "Hamlet" and appeared in "Time and the Conways," "The White Steed," "Fourposter," and "Hilda Crane." She co-starred with James Mason in the movie, "The Desert Fox." The actress has gentle English coloring. She is slender and dresses, offstage, in simply-cut ensembles of neutral colors. She has a good sense of humor and carries a career without a trace of fuss.

Preference

The Cronyns consult each other constantly regarding their careers. They like all acting media, but feel

loyal to the legitimate theatre, where they got their start. They prefer acting together—"Fourposter" and "The Little Blue Light"—for the sake of their family life. Susan, the eldest daughter, attends Vassar and hopes to become a social worker; Christopher, aged ten, wants to act and is slated to appear in a play next spring; Tandy, aged seven, is yet too young to plan a career.

Jessica has two favorite roles, "Blanche" in "Streetcar" and her role in "Fourposter." Hume's favorite is the role he had in the movie, "Brute Force." They have no philosophy about acting, except: "don't talk about it, do it."

The Cronyns do not parallel the "Marriotts" in behavior patterns. For the sake of action, the writers inject conflict into "The Marriage" scripts. The Cronyns avoid conflict by catering to one another's temperaments. They admit they do not have even dispositions and take cognizance of this situation. They don't analyze their marriage. They just live it with its problems and its joys.

No, she's not a bigamist. She merely plays the role of Danny Thomas's wife on his ABC-TV television show.

In private life, Jean is Mrs. Tom Siedel. They were married July 3, 1947, and have two children, Christine Patricia, three, and Aric Philip, one. These two, plus the two TV children, make it a grand total of four for Miss Hagen, Mrs. Siedel, or "Mrs. Thomas."

Facts and Figures

Here are some of the facts about "Danny's Other Wife":

Born on August 3, she attended Ryder School, in Chicago, and Elkhart High School, Indiana. She has always wanted to be an actress. Part-time radio jobs and work in little theater groups helped her to work

her way through Lake Forest College and Northwestern University.

It was radio, and not Broadway, which enabled her really to get started in the show business world. Jean became well known in radio via daytime serials, such as "Light of the World," "Hollywood Story," and "Grand Central Station."

Broadway finally beckoned. And then the movies. When the idea for Danny Thomas's new TV show was finally hit upon, the William Morris Agency called the five-foot-six-inch blonde and asked her if she would be interested in playing the role of Danny's wife. She was. And she made it.

It's not an easy task for Jean to be a real mother at home, and a "TV mother," too, but she's not complaining, and considers herself very fortunate that she can spend as much time at home as she does.

"My one big regret is that I'm not able to tuck my kids into bed on Friday and Saturday nights. That's when we have to work at night on our shows. Anyway, at least I get a chance to tuck my 'TV kids' in bed," Jean explained during a TV-RADIO LIFE interview.

The hazel-eyed, outspoken actress also stated that she had other TV plans besides her KECA-TV role as "Mrs. Thomas." She will do another movie shortly, and hopes to get some good roles on the top TV dramas.

Hidden Talent

Although the "Make Room for Daddy" show is done on film, it is actually more like the legitimate theater. Every Saturday night, before a live audience of 400 to 500 people, Danny and Jean and the others go through their paces just as if they were doing a play on Broadway. Jean likes it this way. It puts a lot of pressure on the performers, but it also makes them more alert and eager to do a good job.

Another thing that "Daddy" has done for "Mommy," is that it has

brought out some hidden talents in Jean.

"During all the time I have been in radio, on the stage, and in the movies, I never, never sang a single solitary note. On my very first TV show, the role called for me to sing. Ever since then I've been a singer," Jean explained, smiling and still a little startled.

"I've wanted to take some lessons. But they won't let me. They say it will ruin my voice."
