**T**HE LIST of arguments on either side of the question, "Does It Pay To Be Married?" are voluminous. Some are in a humorous vein, others on a more serious note.

The gay bachelor, man or maiden, waxes enthusiastically about the blessedness of single bliss while stealing envious glances at the happily married couple. Sometimes the happily married couple become overwhelmed by the problems that beset their nuptial bliss and they secretly long for the days when they were foot loose and free of responsibility.

#### Purpose

NBC's daytime ailer, "It Pays To Be Married," takes the affirmative side of this argument. Jay Stewart, emcee, explains that the program does not interview married couples just for the sake of capitalizing on human suffering. Rather, the show emphasizes the moral and spiritual values of couples who have survived adversities because of their love and understanding. The program honors the American home and pays tribute to the institution of marriage.

## Does It Pay To Be Married?

*There's Scarcely A More Debatable Topic Discussed In Drawing Rooms Than Marriage and Whether Or Not It Pays To Be Hitched.*

Substantiating the program's premise are both Mr. and Mrs. Show Biz and Mr. and Mrs. John Doe. Hollywood weddings and divorces are always the ones to hit the headlines. Yet the stories about couples who have been happily married for years rarely get into print.

#### Danny Thomas

"For example," says Jay, "Danny Thomas attributes much of his success in show business to his wife Rosemarie, who was always by his side when he had to make a big decision and has always helped him make the right one. Danny and Rosemarie were married in 1936. During the first years of their marriage he was a struggling night club entertainer. But the sensitive performer almost gave up show business when a manager of a club told him that he was just a two dollar entertainer. Rosemarie soothed his humiliation and encouraged him to go ahead with his career, which has turned out to be tremendously successful. With-

out qualifications, he feels that it pays to be married.

"Alice Faye and Phil Harris are examples of a married couple who found the right formula for combining their home and careers. They have been married for almost fourteen years and have two daughters, Phyllis and Alice. They met when Alice's dog attacked Phil's dog and got the better of him. Phil was proud of his dog and very angry at what had happened. But when he met Alice Faye his anger was appeased. He wooed and won her. Knowing the pitfalls of show biz marriages, they reached an agreement when they were first married that helped bring about their marital happiness. Alice gave up her motion picture career and Phil gave up road tours with his band. They realized the importance of being together. Their radio show enables them to work together and still have a home life. Their formula has worked."

Steve Hatos and Henry Hooper, co-producers of the program, feel that the John Does too have dramatic incidents in their marital lives which

**A** GOOD MANY eyebrows were raised when Rev. James McClain, the original Dr. I.Q. of radio fame, decided to return to this popular show when it went on TV over KABC-TV.

It was not uncommon knowledge that Rev. McClain had spent the last several years devoting his time to the ministry where he was serving at St. Marks Church in Evanston, Illinois. It was also widely known that a good deal of his time was spent in getting funds for his "Three Cross Ranch" in Texas, a home for boys and girls from broken homes. So his return to active participation on the "Dr. I.Q." show was something of a blockbuster.

Actually, it was a dream that brought him back to his famous role as the man who used to say in theatres, "Give that lady in the balcony umpteen silver dollars."

The fame he enjoyed in his radio

role was never quite enough for James McClain. There was an inner seeking, a desire to find a richer and fuller life. He found his answer in the ministry and left the show to study for the ministry at the Seabury-Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois. He was finally ordained in May, 1947, at St. Marks Church in Evanston.

He began doing mission work and his activities took him to a circuit of towns which included Ranger, Texas. In the next three years he built three churches and established five missions, three of which are now independent parishes — Eastland, Breckenridge, and Strawn. In 1950 he moved to Dallas and was put in charge of St. Marks Church in Irving, a suburb of Dallas, and then became assistant curate at St. Matthews Cathedral in Dallas, simultaneously serving as Chaplain of the Detention Home in Dallas.

But the main thought in his life

## What's Behind Dr. I.Q.'s Return?

*Why did Rev. James McClain come back as the emcee of the "Dr. I.Q." show and why did he leave the ministry for the chore? Here's the heartwarming answer.*

was to establish a home for young people. He found the right location and started his Three Crosses Ranch — the three crosses symbolizing the three crosses of Galilee: one representing the penitent thief, one for Christ, and the third for the unrepentant thief. After much hard work his dream materialized into an actual working dairy ranch.

Getting funds for the Ranch wasn't easy, so when in 1952 Ralph Edwards dramatized McClain's life on "This Is Your Life" and appealed for money for the Ranch, the big break came. The response was so overwhelming that McClain saw quickly how greatly his project could be helped through this medium.

After the TV show, McClain took over the parish of St. Paul's in Alton, Illinois, but he couldn't get over the idea that a radio or TV show might help to build the Ranch. Recently he asked the Bishop of the Diocese of St. Paul to give him a leave of absence so he could work on the Ranch.

Then a top executive of the Hazel Bishop Company, which is sponsoring the TV version of "Dr. I.Q." asked McClain if he'd be interested in resuming his former role. This was like an answer to a prayer—and McClain accepted.

James McClain has not, then, really left the ministry to return to more worldly endeavors. He is merely doing something concrete to further a project that has already proved of inestimable help to hundreds of today's youth. He is after no monetary gain for himself. He is only giving of himself to help others.

He is still a servant of Christ. He is merely serving Him in a new and broader way. And when the day comes that he does return to his ministerial duties he'll be an even bigger and more important figure in the field of men who devote their lives to the teachings of the Christ.

"Juke Box Jury" celebrates its fifth year of telecasting. . . . Because of picture commitments, rumors of **Shelley Winters** going into TV film production are a bit premature. She made her first live TV appearance on the **Jimmy Durante**-**Colgate Comedy Hour** program last week and explains that her breathless singing was due to a too tightly-laced dress.

## Gil Stratton, Jr.

Affable **Gil Stratton Jr.** is the antithesis of the role he plays in CBS-TV's "That's My Boy." On camera, Gil acts as though he can't endure sports. And this is a convincing piece of acting for someone who loves athletics as much as Gil does.

Sports-minded viewers know that **Gil** was an umpire with the **Pacific Coast League** and that he does a nightly sports telecast on **KNXT**. Gil has successfully combined acting and athletics for many years.

**Gil** played goalie on his high school ice hockey team and between seasons he decided to learn the business of umpiring baseball so that he could keep his eagle eye sharp. Gil found umpiring exciting and decided to stay with it. During off-season periods, Gil tried his hand at acting and his big break came in the Broadway musical "Best Foot Forward." His performance clicked with **MGM** and he was signed to appear in "Girl Crazy."

Motion pictures, radio (**Gil** and **Johnny Jacobs** used to co-produce and announce football games for **San Fernando Valley's High Schools** on **KGIL**) and umpiring were Gil's mainstays until television beckoned him.

**Gil** is one of the few performers who'll go on record and say that he prefers live TV to a filmed show. Because of the mechanical limitations of doing a show live, there are apt to be fewer script changes on a live program and this pleases Gil no end. It suits his temperament and athletic training for clear cut action.

Despite his youthful boyishness, **Gil** is not as naive as he looks. He is flattered by the mistaken relationship but wants it clearly understood that he is not related to the great ball player **Monty Stratton**. **Monty** lived one career, **Gil** lives two.

Let the stars give the commercials, or at least help with them, doing a job well never lowers the prestige of anyone.

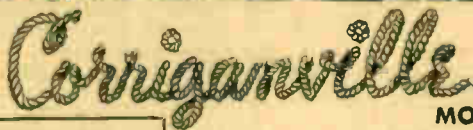

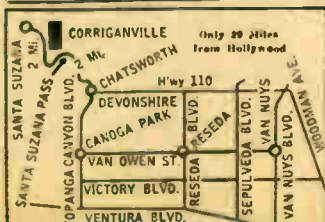

Strictly for laughs, don't miss Spike Jones' City Slickers (RCA-Victor) version of "I'm In The Mood For Love," a musical caricature



of a top TV personality, complete with candelabra, vocal, and real George! Kitty Kalten (Decca) expresses the mood of most wives (according to Mrs. M.) with "Little Things Mean A Lot"—a great record to present on Father's

Day in lieu of a hint.

Tommy Dorsey's Orchestra (Bell) does fine dance versions of "I Speak To the Stars" and "Wanted," with Bill Raymond and Lynn Roberts' vocals sparking these hit-headed tunes. . . . In really rocking mood are Bill Haley and His Comets (Decca) for "Rock Around The Clock," but what's lacking in melody and lyrics is more than made up in rhythm and strong beat.

In similar hand-clapping rock-and-roll style is the Eileen Barton - Jimmy Wakely discing (Coral) of "Bright-Eyed and Bushy-Tailed," a western-flavored opus with plenty of zip and what it takes to be a big 'un.

Patti Page (Mercury) fits her style to the title and what comes out should be a sizzler for the Singing Rage when she turns on "Steam Heat," best to date on this Broadway stage tune.

For the nostalgist, there's a new RCA-Victor album by yesterday's Gene Austin . . . or rather let's say today's Gene Austin, for this popular singer of songs proves he has lost none of the song-salesmanship he displayed in the twenties when he sang "My Blue Heaven," "Ramona," "Lonesome Road," and many others into top sellers. Recorded in medley form, these new versions of yesterday's hits should help the younger generation discover what the older one fondly remembers.

The guest speaker will be Secretary of the Navy Thomas. You can trace the advances made by this church recently to the inspired guidance of Howard Perry.

At a dinner at TV director Ted Post's house recently I met Winston O'Keefe, who is producing the "Tutt" series for television. Sounds like he has quite a package here with Walter Brennan set as the star. Almost everyone has read the famous "Tutt" stories by Arthur Train and there is plenty of material for a really good show here. The pilot is now being filmed at Desilu and the outlook is very bright.

Some people have wondered if Gil Stratton, who plays the non-athletic son on "That's My Boy" and the Gil Stratton who delivers the sports news on KNXT are one and the same person. He is—and this certainly is good indication of his versatility. He looks so young on "That's My Boy" you almost think he's the son of the guy who does the sports program. Not that the Stratton on the KNXT news show is a tottering antique.

The Radio and Television News Club of Southern California is awarding its

awards at Nickodell's on June 18. Don't be too surprised if Edward R. Murrow and Chet Huntley walk away with the honors. There seems to be a tendency now on TV Playhouse on Sundays to go as arty as possible in performances. Geraldine Page's rather eccentric portrayal of last week was only further proof of an apparently new trend. Now, we're all for art and good performances but too much of this sort of thing can get a little dull. What's wrong with just honest acting with no frills and trills? Is a characterization on TV so difficult to give that tricks are necessary? TV Playhouse has done many excellent shows, but a few more like "The Joker" and the Page one and we're going to wonder if all the actors are being psychoanalyzed.

"Waterfront" has really caught on lately. And you can look for even more improvement with the important names signed as writers on the show. One good thing is the new emphasis being given the Preston Foster role. The character, as recently written, is well-rounded and has some substance. And with Ted Post's being signed to direct several of the shows, the future looks bright for this show.

And if you were a baseball fan, and you didn't like that contest—then all I can say is that you don't like apple pie.

So hats off to the Oaks and the

Stars for putting on one of the greatest baseball games of the year. There may be games in the future this season that will rival this one, but I doubt it. Me—long hours and all—I loved it. Even if the Oaks did win.

P.S. And I'm not mad at Lyle for saying in the eighth inning that we hadn't had an extra inning game at Gilmore Field this year!

# How Long Will 'Live' TV Live?



ALTHOUGH BARRY NELSON enjoys doing comedy the most, especially his role on CBS-TV's "My Favorite Husband," he takes his acting profession very seriously. Like many other in his trade, Barry wonders just how long "live" TV will live.



THE WEEKLY ROUTINE that Joan Caulfield left and Barry have to go through each week to do their show is a very grueling one. As with most "live" shows, however, Joan and Barry enjoy the challenge.

THE BIG battle within the TV world continues. It actually started when TV started. During the past year, the cannon-like shouts from both sides have become louder and louder.

The turning point in this war could happen, and is happening, every day.

So who's fighting? Well, on one side are the advocates of TV film. On the other, the men who say the only way to do a TV show is "live." "If you don't do TV on-the-spot," they say, "you lose the spontaneity, the tenseness, the reality of the moment."

"Do it on film," the other side counters. "It's cheaper, more practical, less nerve-wracking, and the end product is more compact and nearer perfection."

So who's winning? Right now, and especially in Hollywood, the film fanciers have the decided edge. Whereas a few years ago there were only a handful of TV film shows being shot, now there are hundreds. True, there are also more "live" programs on the air, but the ratio is decidedly in favor of the celluloid carterers.

(Please note that in discussing the merits and demerits of "live" TV in this article, we are referring to specific types of shows. We are speaking of documentaries, comedies, dramas, etc. In other words, programs of a "timeless" nature. Pro-

grams with a definite time element, such as first-hand news reporting, athletic contests, special events, etc., must always be "live" if they are to be effectual.)

## The Future

So what's with the future? If TV film activities during the past two years are to serve as any yardstick, then ten years from now "live" TV (in the types of shows described above) will be as dead as Diogenes. The scientific advancement of magnetic tape will make the death toll for "live" TV come quicker than anyone may expect.

Why? Lots of reasons. Time. Money. Facilities. Permanency. And one other, heretofore almost overlooked factor: the actor.

"Live" TV is tough on an actor. Not many of them who are working on such programs today will complain aloud—especially if they have a nice, fat contract with a nice, big sponsor.

Take the case of veteran Barry Nelson. Currently, the Broadway and movie favorite is co-starred with Joan Caulfield in CBS-TV's "My Favorite Husband." During the week, the entire cast averages four hours of rehearsal each day at Television City. Saturday is the hectic day. That's when "Husband" goes "live" from coast to coast.

Mistakes are verboten. An actor not only can't make any, he doesn't ever dare think about pulling a bon-

er. Of course, that's a part of an actor's job. But week after week after week of the same strain eventually wears on anyone's nerves.

## Facts, Ma'm

"Granted, there's a tremendous sense of satisfaction after each telecast is over. And they do say that our show is one of the 'smoothest' on the air," Barry explained when TV-RADIO LIFE interviewed him on this question.

"However, I don't know, over a period of years, how an actor could keep it up. We do need some sort of a break—even if it's only for a few weeks. As things are now, on a live TV show such as ours, you not only put a lot of hours in at rehearsals, but at least one-third of the total time is spent at home memorizing scripts for each week's performance."

Barry himself is not complaining about "live" TV shows. A role such as he portrays in "My Favorite Husband" is the type of think he has wanted to do all his life. He dropped Broadway and movie offers to devote full time to this TV stint. And he's not sorry for it, either.

Put the facts are still the facts (ma'm). Actors on long-run "live" TV programs will not be sorry when they switch to film or magnetic tape.

Maybe they won't get the same thrill and satisfaction as doing a "live" telecast; but they'll certainly live a lot longer to tell about it.

Jones,' and 'Abbott and Costello.' When the curtain came down on these shows, Ike had saved enough so that our standard of living remained unchanged. This is the kind of wife all men should have!"

His private life probably explains why Mike always looks so happily complacent on his shows. That good humor obviously comes from a good way of living.

**H**OME LIFE for Mike Roy began back in the thirties — and he entered into the blissful state of matrimony practically by accident.

## Met His Wife

One day while on a valley radio station doing a record show, a young lady called him up and asked him to help her get a job. He was so impressed with her telephone voice that he asked her to come in to see him.

"She was the only girl whom I had met in twenty years of radio work who made a distinct impression on me," Mike grinned. "We were both in our thirties then and we had enough in common to warrant our taking the fatal step three months later. Her name is Alison but her parents had always called her Alecky Ike, so now we're Mike and Ike. Of course, we have a somewhat larger family now. Our two youngsters are Robin, five and a half, who was named after the Scottish hero, Rob Roy, and Dana, one and a half, who is nicknamed 'Fud' because he looks like one."

From the outside looking in, the

whole program gives young people with great musical talent a chance to show their ability. In addition to the three soloists, the most thrilling portion of the hour-long show is when eighteen-year-old David Blum raises his baton and leads the huge symphonic orchestra through a melodic and masterful composition.

From the inside looking out, there's another story to be told. It centers around a petite, energetic woman named Sylvia Kunin. Without her, "Debut" would never have seen the dawn of TV; without her hundreds of teen-agers with great talents would still be unknown and unheard except by their teachers and close friends.

A former concert pianist herself, she grew sick at heart watching various talent and amateur shows.

"I knew from personal experience and contacts that there were so many, many kids in the classical field who had far greater talent to offer the public, and who were not being given the opportunity. I was determined to do something about it."

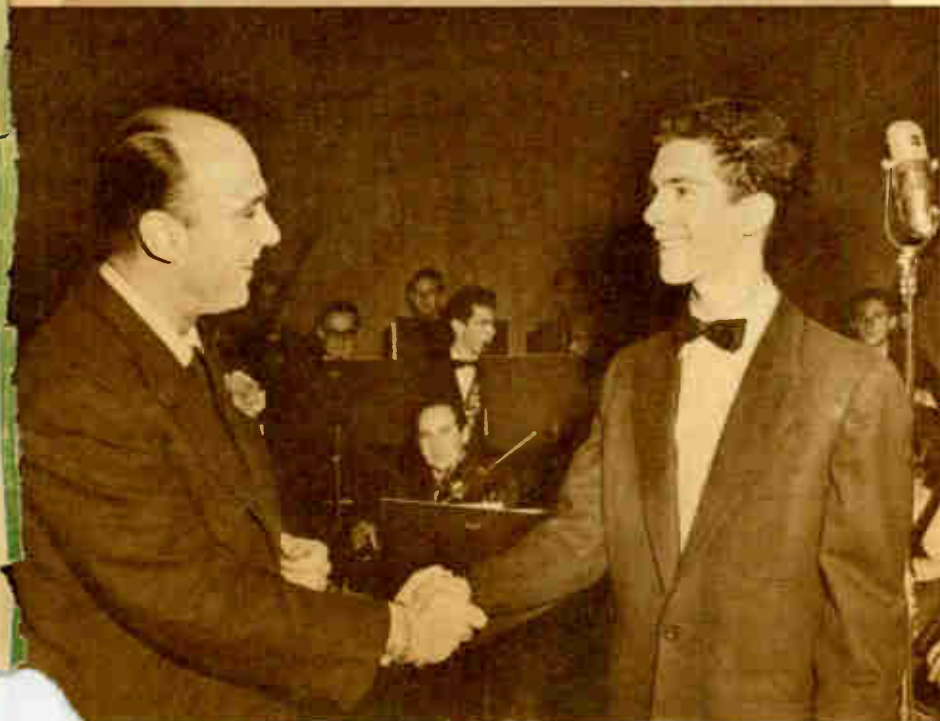

Barker Brothers, and their co-sponsors, have done a greater quality business than they ever expected. KCOP is content with a sponsored program.

Paradoxically enough, the one person who isn't making a dime on the whole deal is Sylvia Kunin. As a matter of fact, up to now, she's even losing a few bucks. However, you can tell by her satisfied smile and the gleam in her eye when she talks about "her kids," that she has gained much, much more than money.
