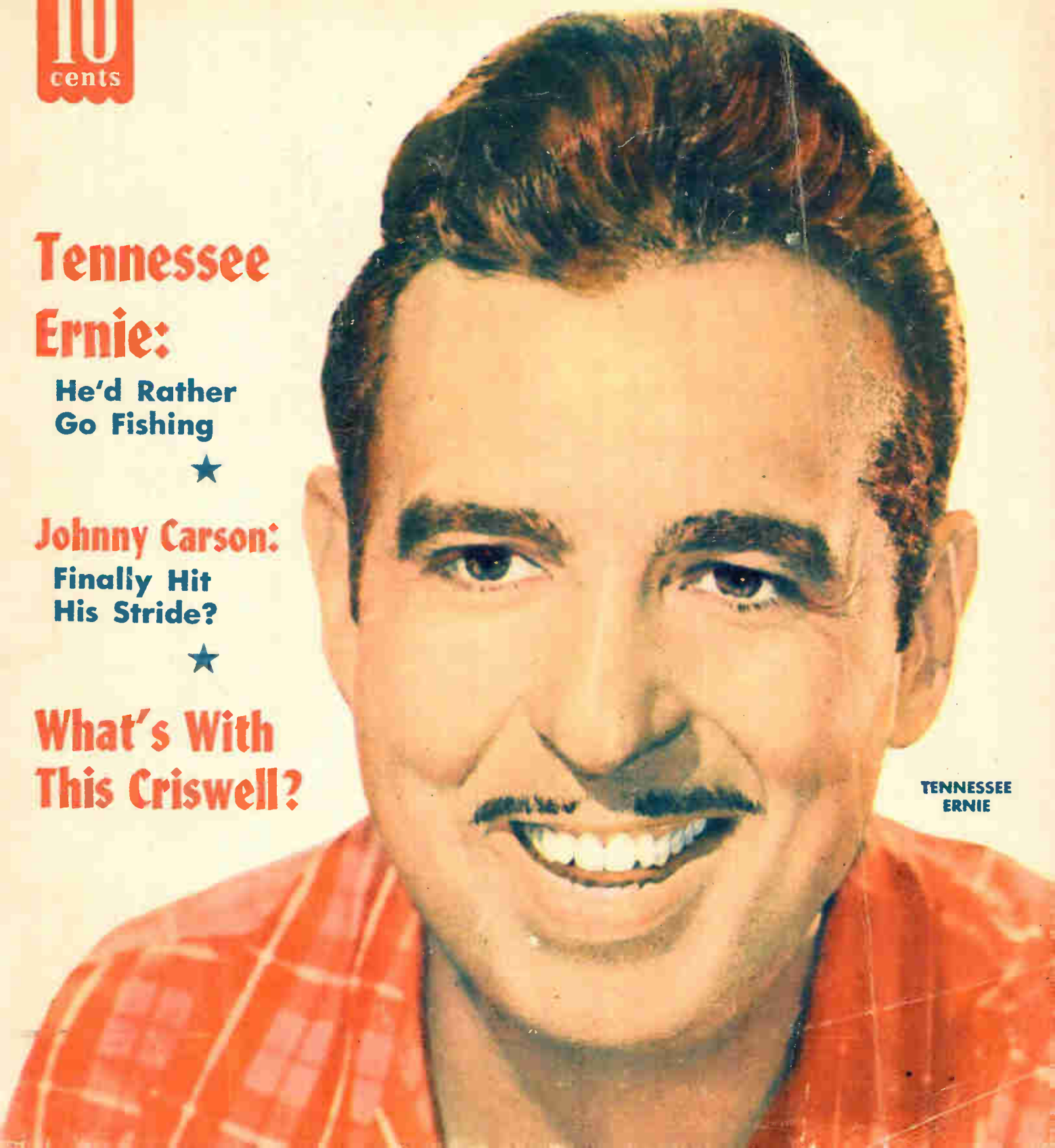

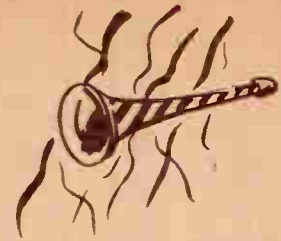

# Quizmaster Gets Quizzed

**A**LTHOUGH Johnny Carson has only been in Hollywood for three years, he has already established himself as one of the most promising comics in the business. His latest undertaking, as quizmaster on CBS-TV's "Earn Your Vacation," finds him in a new and different kind of a role.

Quizzing the quizmaster, here are some of the answers we received:

**Q.** After "knocking around" on various types of TV shows, do you think "Earn Your Vacation" is the right format for you?

**A.** I feel very comfortable on it. For my first network show I think it is perfect for me. Because of the nature of the program you don't have to live or die on every line.

**Q.** What do you think would be the "Ideal" show for you?

**A.** That's difficult to answer because you really don't know until it happens to you. Actually, you just have to wait until the right thing comes along and then take full advantage of it. Up to now the format I personally liked the most was the way we originally did "Carson's Cellar" on KNXT. I'd like to do it again without being sophisticated.

**Q.** Are some of the comic routines, particularly at the beginning of "Earn Your Vacation," a part of the original format or did you request that they be inserted to showcase

you on your first network program?

**A.** By mutual agreement, we decided to do some sort of monologue. There's a very definite purpose behind it. It's not just for me alone so I can show-off a little. Its main purpose is to loosen the audience up a little and to let them know what type of quiz show we are doing. Ours is a humorous rather than a maudlin type of quiz show.

## Flat Broke

**Q.** How did you get the job?

**A.** "Earn Your Vacation" is not a new show. It has been on radio before. When CBS and John Guedel wanted to make a pilot film back in November, 1953, they were familiar with my work at CBS and just called me on the phone and asked me if I were interested.

**Q.** How did the idea strike you when you first heard the offer?

**A.** It struck me great. I was flat broke at the time with a family to support.

**Q.** Is there anything different about "Earn Your Vacation" from other quiz shows?

**A.** A quiz show is a quiz show. Of course the travel and vacation angle has a special appeal to the people. What's the difference between Herb Shriner and Groucho Marx outside of the personality involved? It all depends on how you handle your contestants. I try to keep the show a little on the light side without



getting too sentimental about some of the situations.

#### Not A Cent

Q. What places do most people want to go to?

A. We have no definite statistics on that. Paris and Rome seem to be the most popular European spots.

Q. Does the vacation cost the winner anything at all?

A. Not a single cent. Pan American and CBS furnish all the transportation and expense money. Of course if the individual wants to stay longer than the allotted time, which is usually a week, then he has to pay the extra fees.

Q. What has been the reaction so far from the public? Any bad comments about either you or the show?

A. The response has been tremendous. I have received many fine and complimentary letters. No, there haven't been any bad ones—as yet.

Q. How do they pick the contestants?

A. The only way a person can appear is by sending a letter to CBS-TV stating where he would like to go on a vacation and why. A staff then selects the ones to appear. I have nothing to do with that. As a matter of fact, I do have a general idea of what people are going to be on and where they want to go, but I actually never meet them face to face until they come on stage. I prefer it this way. It makes for greater spontaneity.

Q. What have been some of the strangest requests?

A. I remember the one lady who wanted to go to Casablanca to see her husband. He was an electrician for the Army and she just wanted to go there to check up on him.

#### Africa For Him

Q. Will "Earn Your Vacation" continue after the summer?

A. That's hard to say right now. If it catches on it will stay on.

Q. What else are you doing, Johnny, besides this show?

A. I still have my five-minute show on KNXT every morning. And I'm also doing some writing for Red Skelton. My wife and three kids keep me busy the rest of the time.

Q. Ever since your first appearance on TV in Hollywood, many people have labelled you as one of our "future great comedians." Do you think you will be "great" some day, that is, in the Benny, Hope, Skelton class?

A. I really couldn't answer that. I think that everyone should have an urge to do the best that he can and you hope that people will accept you. In this business you must have a certain amount of egotism and drive. I think that is true of any vocation. Yes, I have ambitions, of course I do. Whether they will come true or not I certainly can't say. I do know, however, that I'm going to try my very best.

Q. Finally, where would you request to go yourself if you appeared as a contestant on "Earn Your Vacation"?

A. Africa. Don't ask me why because I really don't know. It just sounds like a nice place to go for a vacation.

# This Week in TV

## Around TV Row

Gene Autry is opening the old Monogram Ranch, where he shoots his tele-series, to the public. Looks like competition for Corriganville. . . . Donald Crisp produces and stars in a new tele-series, yet untitled, in which he plays the part of a kind-hearted banker.

"Range Rider" returns to KNBH on August 24. . . . Space scientist, Dr. Wernher Von Braun has been signed by Walt Disney as Technical Consultant. . . . CBS-TV City is converting its spacious Studio 43 for color telecasts.

"Toast of the Town" will have "cut-ins" from cities all over the country next fall. . . . Gertrude Berg has been signed by Columbia Records to make a series of discs as "Molly Goldberg."

Anna Maria Alberghetti and CBS are "talking" about a series for the petite songstress. . . . Two favorites, Gilbert Roland and Duncan Renaldo, team up in "Chico and Pablo," KTLA's new adventure series. Leo Carrillo is also featured.

"Give-A-Thon," a sixteen hour telethon on behalf of Multiple Sclerosis is set for KNXT on August 28. Duke Goldstone, who directs the Florian ZaBach show, casts his eight-year-old son Dickie in it. . . . Ralph Levy takes a leave of absence from CBS after completing the next two Jack Benny telefilms. Levy will co-produce Maxwell Anderson's new play "The Bad Seed."

"Favorite Story" will be shot in color henceforth. . . . Mary Martin, Joseph Cotton, David Niven and Cyril Ritchard have been set for Leland Hayward's presentation of "Tonight at 8:30," NBC, October 18. . . . Walt Disney is planning a helicopter shuttle service between his Burbank studio and the 160-acre Disneyland site in Anaheim.

Starting September 18, ABC will televise the NCAA Football games and other major collegiate sports events. . . . First it was Paul Coates who showed the painless birth of a child by using hypnosis on "Confidential File," now it's Dr. Lawrence Harris, dentist, making the guesting circuit and demonstrating how dentistry is also made painless by hypnosis. Wonder if anyone will devise a scheme to make commercials painless under hypnotic suggestion?—M.R.

## Latest on Linn

KTLA's "Cafe Continental," featuring Roberta Linn, will originate from the "Castles in the Woods" in conjunction with the City of Hope on Tuesday, August 10.

The show will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will last for an hour and one-half—not two and one-half hours as misprinted in another publication.

## Red Skelton Revue

Red was back on TV last week with an hour-long variety format that showed promise of becoming an entertaining series. Next fall the Skelton Revue will be slotted opposite Milton Berle on Tuesday nights and it will be interesting to note what effect, if any, the CBS stanza has on Berle's rating.

Liberace and brother George guested. Lee played his ever favorite "Clair de la Lune" and a Latin rhythm tune. A piano-tuning skit with Red intentionally wrecking the keyboard was a very funny bit. Liberace and Red's excellent soft shoe routine backgrounded by the dancing Redettes, climaxed the show.

Red's skits, using his stock characters, "Freddie the Free Loader" and "Klem Kadiddlehopper" were quite ordinary with "Freddie" having a edge on "Klem." Tony Curtis appeared briefly and film clips of his picture "Black Shield of Falworth" were shown. Red muffed Curtis' name and handled the short interview awkwardly.

The Amin Brothers, a pair of Egyptian acrobats, were very impressive. The director, Jack Donohue, rates a bow for using overhead camera shots to show the team off advantageously. Line up of dancers from the Sahara Hotel looked fetching in a square dance number, and David Rose's orchestra, batoned by Lud Gluskin, did a topnotch job. M.R.

**STICK AROUND AWHILE AND YOU'LL** learn something new! I did, last week at Hollywood Ad Club, where several gentlemen, engaged in a new type of publicity, participated in a panel discussion revealing how free plugs are finagled on television.

**I ASSUME YOU ARE ALL FAMILIAR** with the ordinary plug, like a performer's mention of his story in TV-Radio Life. The plugs which popped my peepers weren't this type. They separated themselves, so I concluded, into two types, or intensities: (1) the plug frankly aimed at obtaining a gratis mention of a product, name or cause, usually on a newscast, by subtly tying the client's name into a news hook. This kind of plug, so we are informed, is achieved by supplying the TV stations with a short film. The approach to the client's product or project is made by roundabout methods—"according to (Client's Name) 600 men stubbed their toes against the bedstead this week." Or again, the plug may be visual only—the name of a bakery over a door, the make of a range on the splash-panel, or the insignia of an ice cream or soft drink company on the side of a truck.

**THE SECOND TYPE OF PLUG WAS** the lobby or propaganda.

**AT FIRST I WAS CONCERNED** about both species. Some checking and re-checking with TV news departments and publicity firms allayed my qualms about the No. One type. Seems three or four outfits are now busily engaged in Hollywood making and placing films (for roughly \$250 per one-minute spot) for their clients with the news departments of the TV stations. It was thought they were doing a pretty good job so long as they made their films newsworthy.

**THE STATIONS, I DISCOVERED,** receive these plug films much as newspapers receive "handouts" of "stills." News head of one of the network departments told me that daily they get from three to six film handouts. "About fifty per-cent of them wind up in the waste basket," he said. "In the course of an average week we use probably three to four minutes on a handout basis."

**WHETHER OR NOT HIS DEPARTMENT** used film handouts depended on the flow of news, he explained. If the day was fat, nothing, but if it was slack on news and the film was good, it actually helped fill a hole. "No matter how much money you have to spend nor how large your staff, there are always holes," he claimed.

**HE POINTED OUT THAT THEY** felt no obligation to use a handout film and that each one was viewed with "a jaundiced eye," particularly to see that it had news value and that all commercial mentions were in good taste.

**TO GET THE LOCAL OUTLET** viewpoint I checked a local news department, which said it used about twenty-five per cent of handout films received. The news man pointed out that the aircraft industry had done a "beautiful job" on handouts and that most films lent themselves to news. "Some of the other things we receive, no. If the films stick to the idea of giving information, I think they're good. However, so far this week (four days) we have used only thirty-six feet of handouts."

**I THEN ASKED THE QUESTION** WHICH had been bothering most: Let's assume a plug film is newsworthy and in good taste . . . you have a hole to fill and use it . . . how does the chap who is paying for the newscast regard another "client's" riding in on his time? How does the station view this? Doesn't it think it should sell time to the plug film "client?" If everybody tried to ride the sponsor's coattails, there might come a day when it would be tough to find a sponsor.

**SO FAR, I LEARNED, NO COMPLAINTS** from sponsors. They pay for commercial time, as such. And I learned that the plug client, who paid \$250 to have his film made, and who may occupy a one-minute spot, could buy the one-minute spot outright, say on a late evening newscast, for \$125. On the other hand, if his handout is run by fifty-five outlets (which was the record of one made for a kitchen range), the \$250 was well-invested.

**BOTH TYPE ONE AND TWO PLUG FILMS,** I learned, are carefully scrutinized in the TV newsrooms. Circulation of the lobby type is done quite matter-of-factly. Perhaps this is exactly what interested me most.

**NOW WE ARE ALL FAMILIAR** with propaganda. Newspapers, magazines—every medium of dissemination attracts its share. The TV aspect is the newest.

**THE CASE DEMONSTRATED AT HOLLYWOOD** Ad Club was that of Creole Petroleum, a Venezuelan subsidiary of Standard Oil of New Jersey. Pending in the House of Representatives was the Simpson Bill, which, among other things, advocated a limitation on importation of Venezuelan oil. A Hollywood firm specializing in making plug films was engaged to "do a story." We saw the film at Ad Club and the film specialists did a good story, tied in with strong news hooks—both President Eisenhower's favorable remarks on foreign trade and observation of foreign trade week itself. Importance of such exchange was shown in the film, with minimum accent on Creole Petroleum.

**THE IMPRESSION LEFT BY THE FILM** upon the average looker must have been subtle but definite. Here, it seemed to me, was an outright lobby practically passing under the guise of news. Most viewers, I've found, accept what they see or hear on a newscast as the gospel truth. They seldom take time or effort to discriminate between news and one side of it.

**I CHECKED THE LOCAL TV OUTLETS** to see whether this film had been run and how. Roy Neal, head of TV News and Special Events at NBC Hollywood, said he had run the film but first had made a statement to the effect that what the looker was about to see was "a propaganda piece prepared by people who have an interest in the facts therein."

**KNXT REPORTED IT HAD USED THE FILM,** but had no record of the script. KABC-TV said it, too, had used the film, but edited it to the general statement by the president of the oil company as to the importance of world trade and quoting of President Eisenhower. Other stations were unable to report. Of the four stations supposed to have used it, one had voiced a disclaimer, one had edited. Other two stations were indefinite or had incomplete report. (This was explainable as the film had run three months ago.)

**IT SEEMED OBVIOUS THAT SOMETHING** should be done to alert TV-Radio Life readers about the lobby or propaganda type film which comes on a TV newscast without disclaimer or editing. Proponents of the petroleum film pointed out to me that the other side of the lobby could also make a film. In turn, I pointed out that if a newscast had used the "pro" side, via plug film, the station would most certainly have to give equal airtime to the "anti" side should it also send a newsworthy, commercially tasteful film. This might lead to complications.

**IT MIGHT BE BETTER IF BOTH** sides bought airtime. But the client for a lobby film probably prefers a plug film because it passes on-screen in a news light. If he bought airtime, it would have to be stated that "The following is a paid political announcement—etc."

**WHEN I ASKED ONE TV NEWS EDITOR** how he could be sure no lobby films got past without qualifications, he answered, "That's what editors are for . . . they can see through things." Lookers might also revise the old "Stop, Look and Listen" to "Look, Listen and Stop—to think about what you've seen."

This seems a legitimate beef. Certainly the people who perform in the various plays are deserving of attention. How many times have you wondered what was the name of someone you especially liked in a play? Either you couldn't read the "credits" fast enough or they were on such light backgrounds you couldn't decipher them anyway. It does seem that the Screen Actors Guild and Equity should make a definite move to assure their members of noticeable credit. Plenty of time is given the names of those who matter far less to the general public than do the actors. So how about taking it easy with those "credits" at the end? Slow 'em down, boys, and let's see who's doing what.

The recent strike against the stations by the writers is an unfortunate thing. It's not this column's province to say who is right and who is wrong, but it does strike us that the writers' demands aren't too far-fetched. The whole thing only heightens one pertinent fact—without good writing, what show can survive? And yet the ones who dream up the scripts, who provide the laugh lines for the comics and the to-be-hoped-for good dialogue for actors, are sadly neglected in the long range scheme of things. Writers get far too little credit for their work. They are usually given a fast shuffle while money is needlessly spent in huge quantities elsewhere. If anyone should come out on the long end of the deal it should be those who are providing the scripts from which everyone else in a production must work. Okay, so lots of writers are trying to make sales and their field is terrifically competitive. But no station is going to attract the best in the field if the pay isn't sufficient. Just thought we'd sound off a little on this.

Speaking of writers, much has been said about there being a big demand for plays for TV. On the other hand, you hear constant stories about scripts not even being given a decent reading. Harry Fried, of Screen Gems, is one man who conscientiously tries to do a job when it comes to giving writers a fair shake. But his biggest problem is finding scripts that can structurally fit into TV—scripts that lend themselves to a tight picturization in twenty-six or twenty-seven minutes. There are some story editors who do not give writers a decent break. So it's nice to know that Screen Gems has someone who is really trying to do a good job for all concerned. Incidentally, Screen Gems, which does "Ford Theatre," is not in the market for any murder mysteries or stories with lots of violence.

In his senior year, tragedy struck Lyle Bond on the baseball diamond. He was cracked in the back by a wild pitch. This unfortunate incident not only ended his baseball career, but hospitalized him for two years.

One good thing did develop from the baseball accident. In the hospital, Lyle was nursed back to health by a lovely brunette, Vi, who finally became his wife. They were married six weeks before Lyle left the hospital.

Mr. and Mrs. Bond have two children, five-year old Susan and eleven-year old Allen—the same Allen Bond who is star pitcher for "Lyle's Lions."

There are other stories significant in the life of Lyle Bond—such as how he brought his family to Los Angeles and supported them for months by addressing envelopes at five dollars per thousand, and how a local radio station gave him his first break as a summer replacement.

But it has been the great sport of baseball which has really been the nucleus around which Lyle's whole life has revolved.

So when you see Lyle Bond telecasting the Angel and Star games over KHJ-TV, he is not doing it just to earn a living. It is a part of Lyle's actual life—yesterday and today, and we hope for many tomorrows to come.

**D**URING THE PAST few years, many changes have occurred in the life of "Tennessee Ernie" Ford.

Five years ago he was practically unheard of. Then Cliffie Stone gave him his first break on station KXLA in Pasadena. In rapid succession there followed regular appearances on Channel 13's "Hometown Jamboree," in night clubs throughout the nation, and even at the Palladium in England. More recently CBS-radio put him on a coast-to-coast show. This summer, when NBC-TV decided to renew Kay Kyser's old "College of Musical Knowledge," the thirty-five-year-old comedian-warbler from Bristol, Tennessee, was given the choice assignment.

Other changes occurred. Originally trained as an operatic singer at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, Ernie began to do more than just western and hillbilly tunes. He began to branch out into the "pop" and ballad fields of music, recording such hits as "The River of No Return." Although he still likes to do western tunes on his "College of Musical Knowledge" show Ernie sticks to the "pop" numbers.

As a personality, Ernie also began to evolve. People discovered that he had a last name the same as anyone else. (Liberace, Vampira and others in that category excluded, of course). Commensurate with his fame, Ernie's bank roll also expanded. He had come a long way from the first time he earned ten dollars a week in 1937 at a local Bristol station.

### No Change Here

One change, however, never did and never has come about to "Tennessee Ernie" Ford. The man himself.

On stage, and even more in person, Ernie is unique in show business. We could go on and run the gamut of cliches and tell you how easy-going he is; how unspoiled; how fame has not given him a big head or changed his sense of values, etc., etc. But this press-agentry trick, even though true in some cases, makes pretty tired reading after a while.

The best way we can explain what the real Ernie Ford is like is to let him speak for himself. So imagine yourself sitting with Ernie at a restaurant. You've just finished eating and you're relaxing over a couple

of puffs of smoke and a cup of coffee.

There's been the usual friendly and jovial chit-chat about his work and family and activities in general. (Even on the most serious of subjects, Ernie can't help throwing in a few descriptive lines in his typical home-spun humor.) Then, after a few leading questions, the mustached "professor" gets down to the subjects he likes to talk about most of all: his family and his hunting and fishing.

"Don't get me wrong, man. I love show business. Why shouldn't I? It's given me everything I ever wanted. But in many ways I think I look at things differently than a lot of other people around Hollywood.

"When I start working for show business instead of working for me, then I've had it. Some people take their work much too seriously. Even in their own homes, they've got phones in every room in the house. They never have a minute's peace of mind.

#### Ambition: Successful Father

"When I'm with my family, I forget about everything else except them. More than anything else in the world, that's what I want to be: a successful father. I like the money I make now, but I don't ever want too much. I don't believe in unnecessary luxury for my children. When I give them \$1.50 to spend for something, I want them to know the value of it. I want to give things to my kids that will give them responsibility."

Ernie and his wife, Betty, whom he

met while he was in the Air Force in California during World War II, have two boys: Jeffrey Buckner, age four; and Brion Leonard, twenty-three months old. They live in a large, comfortable house on the outskirts of Whittier.

"When I tell people where I live, they say to me: 'Whittier! Where's Whittier?' It seems that you're just not doing the right thing in Hollywood these days unless you live in The Valley. Well, I like The Valley and the wife and I looked around there for a while and almost bought a few places, but when we saw our present house we fell in love with it immediately.

"I just finished recently building a fence around the place. The darnedest thing you ever saw. A neighbor of mine had some old telephone poles he was going to get rid of, so I made good use of them. It was a job sawing those big poles into smaller pieces, but it sure was worth the effort."

#### Retirement Plans

In addition to their Whittier home, the Fords have recently purchased a cabin-like home at Clearlake, eighty-five miles outside of Sacramento.

"That's where I'm heading at about two o'clock this morning. I'm just taking off with the wife and the eldest boy and going to do some hunting and fishing and some loafing. I have to work all day today and tonight, right up until about one-thirty in the morning, doing records and taping radio shows. I'll

still be wide awake when I'm through. I'll go home then, wake the wife up, pack the gear in the car, drive until dawn and then let the wife take over the wheel.

"This spot of ours is the greatest in the world. Nothing fancy. And none of those big resorts nearby. It's just perfect for my wife and family, and for my hunting and fishing."

Unlike many other entertainers, Ernie Ford has no intention of dedicating his life to show business.

"I'd retire today, if I could, and I'm not kidding. As soon as I make enough money, and it doesn't have to be a whole potful, I'm going to quit.

"Some folks in the business couldn't retire if they wanted to. It's in their blood. I'm not like that. Even if I became one of the biggest names in Hollywood, as soon as I felt I had enough security to provide for my family during my lifetime, then I'd head for the hills.

"Oh, I might still record a few tunes here and there, but I wouldn't keep up the daily grind as I'm doing now."

As busy as he is with his TV and radio shows and his recording sessions and personal appearances, "Tennessee" takes time off for his family and fishing whenever he possibly can.

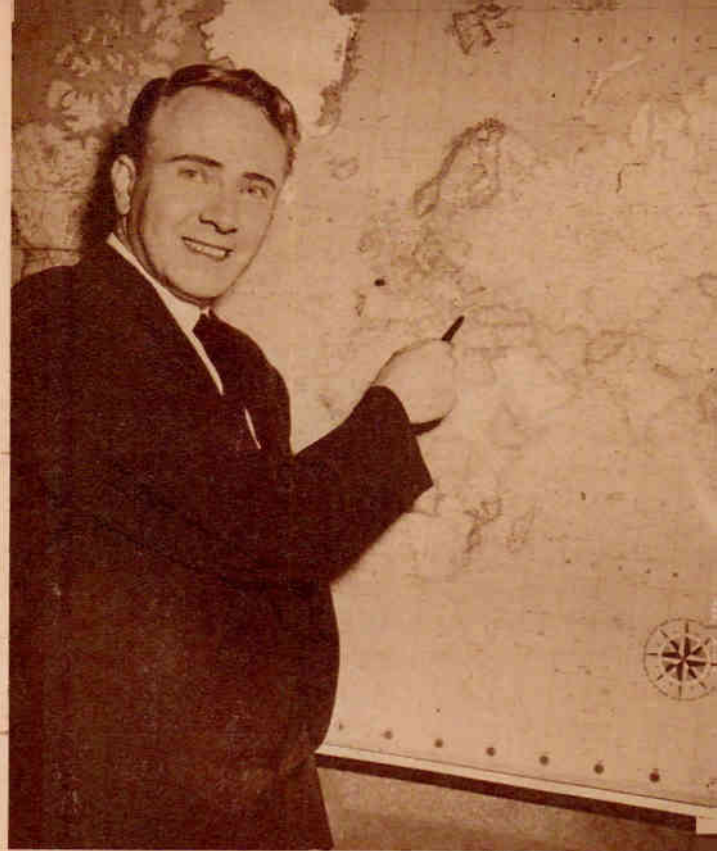
"I do the very best I can on my shows and for the people I work for. But when they interfere with my hunting and fishing then, brother, they've got the orneriest piece of talent in the world on their hands."



# Who Is Criswell?

*Just how much on the level is Criswell? What is his background? Is he another TV "character" or is he really a man who can foresee future events? And what are his predictions for the future of TV?*

▲ **CRISWELL IS QUITE THE CONTROVERSIAL MAN ABOUT TV.** His predictions, however, have been amazingly accurate and his following is increasing on his KCOP show.

**C**RISWELL, his first name is never used, is a debonair gentleman who predicts coming events on KCOP. He has been tabbed a fake, he has been called one of TV's most interesting new personalities, and he has received wide recognition for many of his forecasts. So what is he really like? Just what is he?

It seemed best to let his answers to questions thrown at him during an interview decide the issue. You can be the judge of this man who is certainly offering something different to TV.

**What do you think of those who have tabbed you as phony?**

Criswell: "You cannot doubt the prophet—you can only disbelieve him. Each and every forecast I make is well-founded on incidents which will cast definite shadows—and all coming events cast shadows. I base my predictions on trend, pattern of habit, on human behavior, and the unalterable laws of cycle."

**What is your background?**

Criswell: "I was raised in a family-owned hotel and my first jobs were errand boy for the hotel guests and newspaper carrier for the two newspapers my uncle owned—'The Daily Democrat' and 'The Clarion News.' I was always able to keenly and unemotionally analyze problems and to look into problems of the future. I learned that the best student of the future is the best student of the past—and if you know the past and can be unemotional you can predict the future. Every word uttered on my program and every word written in my syndicated columns can be pegged on some established fact or incident. At one time I had a job in public relations for a financial firm. I gave talks and found I was being widely quoted, especially on my forecasts of financial conditions."

**What is your forecast for the political future of this country?**

Criswell: "I won't predict who will be the next president, although in 1946 I predicted that Eisenhower would be elected in 1952 by a landslide and I have a printed column to bear this out. I feel the trend now is for conservatism. People again want to be practical and this is reflected in a great surge of home ownership and suburban development. Even food is more practical since we are getting back to the old-fashioned three meals a day routine—and all good, substantial meals."

**What is the future for TV?**

Criswell: "I predicted over three years ago that the sponsors would demand a great deal for their money and that many of the high budget shows would be found most impractical and that the public taste would change to simple formulas and to one-man shows with low budgets but with wide appeal. Within five years everything on TV will be on film and shows will be instantly filmed and developed through a new Swiss invention that will revolutionize motion picture making as we know it today. There will be great strides in color TV."

**What is the future of top stars like Lucy and Jack Webb?**

Criswell: "They will find they must continue to change their formats and will introduce more and more new members into the casts. There will

be a great turnover of writers too, for TV can burn up more material than a fire in a wheat field. Many stars will soon exhaust their bag of tricks and I predict that guest stars will lose in favor because of careless handling. If guest stars are used they will be used as an integral part of a series for more than one time and few will be allowed to play themselves but will have to assume another identity."

**Do you see many new stars hitting TV?**

Criswell: "TV is not a place for youngsters and no teen-ager or even one under thirty-five will be able to crack the top crust. Years of experience are necessary for TV success. TV belongs now—and will belong even more so in the future—to the experienced personality."

**What is your prediction for future of magazines like TV-Radio Life?**

Criswell: "I predict that similar TV-Radio Lives will not only be distributed to Southern California but to larger metropolitan centers and will become the most quoted and most referred to magazines. Over the years Radio Life, and later TV-Radio Life, has proven it has a definite public and has met the needs and requirements of readers. I see only unprecedented success for this magazine."

You've heard Criswell. Now you be the judge.

**C**AN YOU remember your first day at school? It was probably kindergarten . . . a hot September day . . . Mama buttoning you into your new pink dress or laying out spanking new jeans for you, yourself, to zip into . . . you clutching her hand and trudging into this strange room, with strange youngsters eyeing you speculatively while a strange new lady called "teacher" tried to put you at your ease by interesting you in some crayons?

Those were the days B. T. (Before Television). Along has come a very pretty TV teacher named Eleanor Hempel, with a program called "Little Schoolhouse" on KTTV, eagerly watched by 400,000 small boys and girls.

In this enormous "classroom," pre-schoolers not only get their first real taste of nature, study, simple craft, stories, poetry, rudimentary arithmetic, and ABC's; but they also learn how to adjust to the big wide world outside the intimate, protective family circle.

Mothers, too, watch "Little Schoolhouse" for its interest and to gain a notion of what the child is being taught. An alert mother is able to latch onto many pointers as she observes TV teacher's techniques. For example, Mrs. Hempel explains things gradually in an effort to orient the child to the outside world. She pauses frequently as she story-reads to explain words or situations too tough for a small mind's grasping.
