"One Christmas I will always remember was in Baltimore, in those days when I sang with Benny Goodman's band. There was a strike of hotel employees at the time, which meant that we had to take the best place we could find. It was a second- or third-rate hotel with sad furnishings and tired pictures hanging dejectedly on the faded walls. One look, and I didn't see how I could spend any day there—let alone Christmas Day!



"I stayed with it because we had a theater engagement, and because I wanted to make good at my job. The boys in the band were wonderful in trying to cheer me up. where I had my first job in radio. I wasn't making much money, but my wife, Leona, and I had been the proud parents of a baby boy for all of one month, and it was going to be a very special Yuletide for all of us. Or that's what we thought!



"It all began about a week before Christmas when Leona, several friends, and I took to the woods to select our Christmas tree—with an axe! We took the baby with us in a small sleigh. There were hundreds of beautiful trees but we passed them up—going deeper and deeper into the forest looking for that one perfect tree!

"Then we found it. Leona agreed it was exquisite. We cut it down with expert care, strapped it over the sleigh, and hauled our way home—baby, tree, and all!

"Back in our apartment, however, we discovered that although we had nine-foot ceilings our tree was almost fifteen feet tall! Our enthusiasm and the enlarged perspective of the woods had gotten the best of us. So my friends and I took the tree into the yard and began to cut it down.

"After my friends left, I decided we

written home so many times for money that I could not bring myself to do it again; therefore Christmas Day found me with eighteen cents to spend. My two roommates had gone home for the holidays; I had quarreled with my girl; and when the morning dawned drizzly and cold it was the final tug that brought my spirits to rock-bottom. 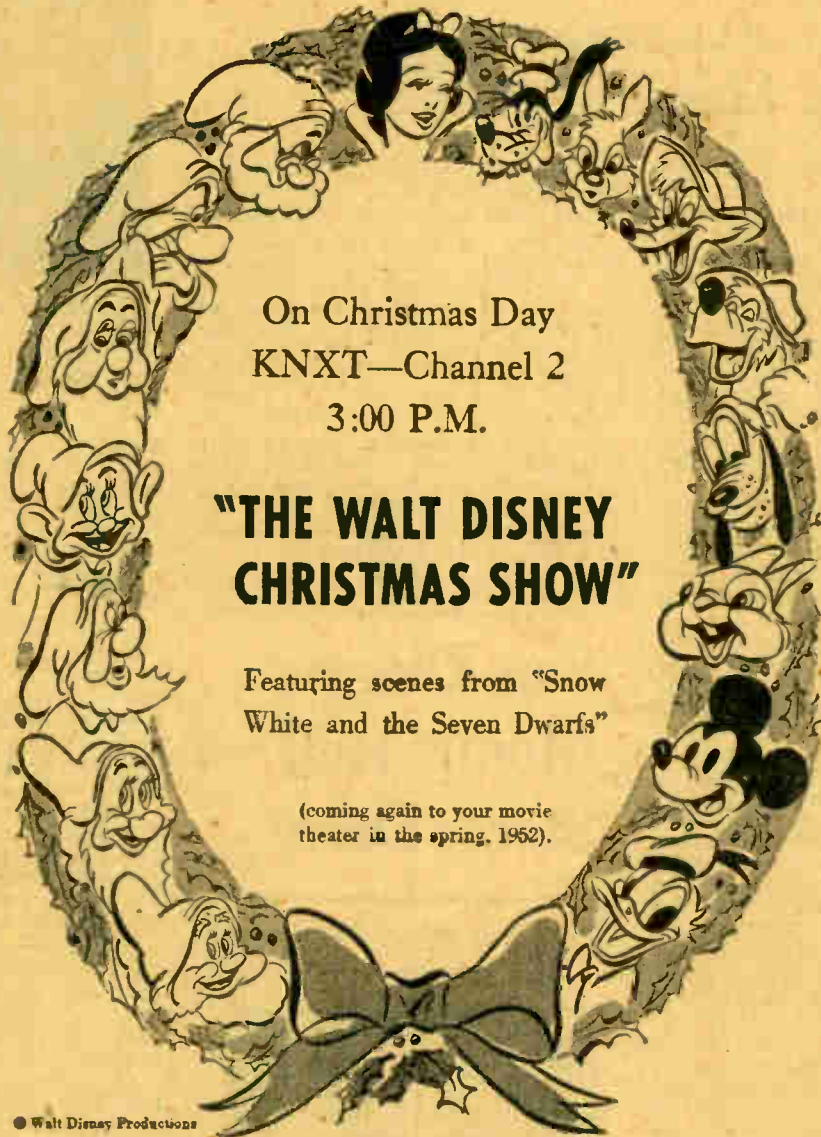

So YOU Think YOU'VE "Got An Idea for a TV Show"

What to Do and What Not to Do

By Margie Olofson

OH, FOR heaven's sake, I could think up a better TV program than that! And with one hand tied behind me, too!" you say as you switch off your set and stomp back to your good book.

All right! Do it! Tie one hand behind your back, and think up a fresh new television program. Not another Western show that went that-a-way! Not a panel of inexpert experts! Not another quiz that doles out information you always wanted to know—but not much.

And that's just the beginning of the "nots," according to Joy Russell-Smith, who screens new programs and program ideas through the fine mesh of local station needs for station KNXT, the CBS-owned TV station in Los Angeles. Joy is representative of the story editors of the seven L.A. TV stations to whom you'll be handing your genius-type idea with the hand which is not tied behind your back.

As a set-switcher-off-er and stomper-away-er, you find the local station is more easily accessible to you. The networks usually create their own ideas, or buy them from an experienced "packager." Or, often, the commercial network program is created by the sponsor's advertising agency. So the local TV station is your best bet.

"But remember," twinkles Miss Russell-Smith, "the station is not going to buy an idea that it can easily think up for itself, and probably already has.

"Nor is it going to pay good money for just one more Western, quiz, panel, disc-jockey, homemaker, amateur-talent, or handy-hint program with a 'twist' which only serves to wring an old format a little dryer. We don't need more of the same. What we need is truly fresh, truly different program ideas."

Simple enough! Just think up an idea as fresh as a Marine's whistle, and as strong as a taxi-dancer's perfume!

"And please . . . oh please . . . think in terms of small-budget shows," pleads Joy, pointing to a pile of show ideas on her desk as if they were greasy fried eggs on the morning after. "These shows with casts of eighteen or twenty, we simply can't use. Few local stations can. Keep casts . . . and costs . . . down. Sets . . . props . . . music . . . sound effects . . . should be few and simple! Sets, for example, only have to be indicated. No need for

a Louis Quinze drawing room complete with snuff box, when just a period couch and window will suffice.

"To come up with a fresh television show requires . . . not high budgets . . . but a high degree of imagination. The imagination to use television as the brand-new medium it is. Not simply use it to allow the audience to see as well as hear a radio show . . . nor to catch up on old movies . . . nor see stage plays done in cramped quarters.

"Some of the program ideas I receive are quite frightful," grimaces Joy. "For instance, the quaint children's show about a little milkmaid whom the author thought should be *one-legged* 'to make her more interesting.'

"Or the man who thought we should

show plain line drawings on camera, to let the viewer piece a piece of onion-skin paper over his TV screen and trace a drawing. Or the husband and wife who wanted to put on scenes so that viewers could see old friends and relatives on 'The Other Side.'"

Ideas to Begin On

Joy, a producer with the British Broadcasting Company for seven years before coming to America, tosses out a few suggestions as thought-starters.

"How about a show teaching children 'how to do' and 'how to make' by means of interesting dramatizations?"

"Or a show to foster new writers—TV's crying need. We have shows for would-be singers, actors, song writers, dancers, variety artists, comedians . . . why not give the new talented comedy, drama, or sketch writers a boost?"

"And how about a show teaching the various fields of art, drawing, painting, ceramics, metal work, wood-work . . . taught so as to be of equal value and interest to the healthy, and to patients in hospitals and at home."

So, you *do* create a fresh idea for a television show, what then? Type it in an organized form. But don't *send* it to a television station. It will only be returned unread. Very often, an idea similar or even identical to yours has already been under consideration by the station, and it must protect itself against lawsuits. For this and other reasons you will be asked to sign a release before your idea is even accepted for reading.

You can call your local station story editor for an appointment, arrive a few minutes ahead of time to sign the release, and proceed with the interview. In presenting your ideas, be friendly but not obnoxious, informed but not overbearing.

And you'd better not keep that one hand tied behind your back. You'll need both hands . . . either to defend your idea or to receive congratulations on a really brand-new television show!

On the Ball

with Bob Kelley

Just the other day, the Coast Conference released figures which would indicate that television helped football during the 1951 season.

The final sum-up showed that areas on the Coast which had television during the past season were 13 per cent ahead of their 1950 attendance. On the other hand, areas which did not have TV were off about two per cent.

Ostensibly, this should prove that video helps attendance. But that isn't the whole story. Actually, the areas which had television used the medium only to a limited extent. In fact, UCLA had no teevee at all, while the Trojans televised just one home game—the one with Notre Dame.



Such sports as wrestling and perhaps, in the future, boxing, are better off with the advent of TV. They were games that were dying, had become unknown to most sports fans. Baseball is another sport which has made many new fans through television. In fact, the Los Angeles Angels, televising nearly all of their home games in 1951, actually outdrew Hollywood, which teeveed just two contests a week.

But the problem of football is something else again. President Dan Reeves of the Rams feels the same way I do. Television is very apt to hurt your attendance. Last year in his contract with KNBH and the sponsors, Reeves came up with the first sensible arrangement and solution to this thing.

In essence, Dan said: "OK, boys, you claim TV won't hurt my crowds. If you're right, you can have the Rams' games for practically nothing. But if you're wrong, you must guarantee to pay for every fan that stayed away because of video."

As it turned out, the attendance was far below what KNBH and the sponsors had estimated. So they had to pay Reeves the balance.

Carrying the idea even further, the Rams have just concluded their most successful season—attendance-wise—in history. They had no television. Crowds for the eight Ram home games up to last Sunday, averaged more than 55,000. Compare this with the 52,000 for the Trojans and 42,000 for the Bruins and you get a better idea.

All of which goes to prove that the Rams have done better without television. This does not preclude the possibility that their games will be teeveed next season. In fact, they well might be.

But as I said before, they will be televised under the first sensible plan brought into football . . . the sponsor or station must assume any possible loss of attendance.

For Love o' Mike (General Comment)

On Our Cover

A program of family life completely authentic—even down to a small boy's choice of words to describe a situation—sums up "The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet," acknowledged topflight domestic comedy aired each Friday at 9:00 p.m. on KECA and the ABC radio network.

Since they began co-starring on their coast-to-coast show in 1944, Ozzie Nelson and Harriet Hilliard Nelson have brought a higher rating and more enthusiastic praise from columnists and listeners alike. There's a reason. The show exhibits good taste and comedy with a final touch of realism. That's understandable since "The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet" is the only network radio show with a real-life family cast.

Ozzie and Harriet are ably assisted by their sons, David, 14, and Ricky, 11. Even before the boys joined the show to play themselves, they were an integral part of their parents' show—behind the scenes. Where the youngsters were involved in a script, they became the final arbiters as to the exact language, gag or situation.

Even today, Harriet will tell you, David and Ricky are their severest critics.

"The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet" is a family affair in more than one way. Everybody contributes to the script writing, including Ozzie's brother Don. However, Ozzie writes the final script based on the best elements of ideas submitted. Then he and Harriet carefully edit it—with assists from David and Ricky—to make certain the conversation sounds natural.

Fundamentally, "The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet" is based on situation humor. As each Friday's chapter unfolds, there's a plot replete with comic angles in themselves—thus avoiding constant use of gags for gags' sake. In the middle of the song the doors exploded inwardly and near-silence was rent by a shriek as Jerry Lewis leaped in, followed closely by his partner, Dean Martin. They literally "dropped" in to be Bing's guests. Bing kept on singing, with an involuntary shudder, as Lewis untied Bing's shoelaces and slipped one shoe off his foot. John Scott Trotter, the orchestra leader, paid only slight attention when Jerry grabbed a spare baton and tried to misdirect the orchestra behind his back. And things only got a little more out of hand when Bing tried, with Dean's assistance, to teach Jerry the rhythm and the lyrics of the song. Finally, in the control booth, Producer MacKenzie reached for the telephone to call the recording room. Jerry Lewis saw him and shouted, "Lookit! I'm through. He's calling in somebody else."

Record Notes to You

THIS WEEK'S NATURAL SEVEN: Lola Ameche's "Rag-time Melody" (Mercury), King Cole's "Here's to My Lady" (Capitol), Bing Crosby's "Weaver of Dreams" (Decca), Bob Crosby's "Savoy Blues" (Capitol), Eddy Howard's "Christmas Tree in Heaven" (Mercury), Ella Mae Morse's "Tennessee Saturday Night" (Capitol), and Billy Williams's "Busy Line" (MGM).



Long overdue is the album "Christmas With Patti Page" (Mercury) with its eight sides ranging from seasonal hymns to boogie, and with Patti adapting her style to the mood of the selection. Especially effective is the multiple-recorded "Christmas Choir."

"Masterpieces by Ellington" is one of the year's best jazz items (Columbia LP) in that it presents uncut jazz concert arrangements of "Mood Indigo," "Tattooed Bride," "Sophisticated Lady" and "Solitude"—definitely a must for collectors of Ellingtonia.

"Le Sacre du Sauvage" (Ritual of the Savage) on Capitol combines jungle drums and rhythms by Les Baxter and his orchestra in a forceful tone picture of the Dark Continent. It's unusual, primitive, expressive, and must be heard to be appreciated.

Tommy Dorsey (Decca) is featured as trombone soloist with Victor Young's orchestra in eight superb sides of standard and original selections. In light-concert vein, TD once again demonstrates his unquestioned artistry as one of the all-time great trombonists.

Amos 'n' Andy's annual Christmas highlight with Amos explaining The Lord's Prayer to his little girl is available for the first time on Columbia. Impressive in its simplicity, yet one of the loveliest of Christmas items.

Helen O'Connell (Capitol) again goes Western for "Crazy Heart" and "Anytime"; Cliffie Stone's music provides the necessary backing for O'Connell's top vocals which almost belie her reputation as one of the nation's top pop artists. . . . Folk singer Burl Ives (Columbia) has a jolly holly tune in the yodeling "Grandfather Kringle" and traditional "Twelve Days of Christmas," both with Percy Faith orchestra and chorus.

"On Christmas Day, 1945, I was in an Army General Hospital in Tokyo, Japan. The war was won, and many of the boys had gone home months before. Everyone in uniform was enjoying the occasion—all except us guys in the hospital. And no matter how kind everyone was, it didn't seem like Christmas to us. The whiteness of the hospital ward seemed to merge with the snow-covered ground outside. We were in an antiseptic isolation, with no connection whatsoever with the rest of the world or with Christmas.



"Yes, it was a white Christmas all right... white and bleak. Suddenly the door at the end of the ward swung open, and in marched about a dozen of the cutest kids I've ever seen. They were little Japanese boys and girls, dressed up as angels. None of them could have been over ten, and they were singing Christmas carols with all their might. They had those high-pitched voices that Oriental children have, and they sang a bit off key, but it was the sweetest Christmas music I have ever heard, before or since. We all listened in attentive silence, our spirits completely lifted in what seemed to be a Christmas miracle."

"It was during the last war. Bond drives followed one after another, and people of America responded generously. I bought a few bonds too. Then suddenly I felt not proud of what I had done, but a little guilty.

"Christmas was approaching and a thought came to me. I started counting how many people I personally knew who were then somewhere in Europe or the Pacific fighting my battle too. There was the boy who used to deliver groceries to my house, and the young son of the kind lady who had helped me learn English, and three or four other boys. I thought, why not buy bonds for them and deposit them in a bank in their names to await their return? The next morning I did just that.

"Then came another idea. Why

don't I tell the people to buy bonds for soldiers this Christmas instead of for themselves? With the help of many friends in show business and finally with that of the Treasury Department, this was done. As the movement grew, so did my inspiration. I gave it a slogan and a song. The slogan—'Put a bond in the bank for a Yank.' The song, written with the help of two famous songwriters, became the official song of the sixth war-bond drive. Its words were: 'Buy a bond for a soldier for Christmas... Put a bond in the bank for a Yank... It's the least you can do to bring happiness to that soldier you wanted to thank...'

"That Christmas I heard my song and my slogan on 100 radio programs and broadcast all over Times Square. Moreover, I heard that hundreds of thousands of bonds had been bought for soldiers.

"It was my happiest Christmas."

"I guess my most memorable Christmas occurred during the year of 1949. We had just moved to Laguna Beach from Northern California so that I could be near Hollywood to do my shows. However, we had a big barbecue in the back yard and then my wife and our two boys went for a swim in the ocean. We had such a wonderfully relaxing time on that particular day that we all fell in love with Southern California for the first time and have felt really at home ever since."

HOW OFTEN we say, "You know, I never see certain friends, friends of whom I am very fond, but somehow I just never get around to calling them." This New Year's Eve should old acquaintance be forgot? NO! This is the time to remember and these times are rugged and friends need cheering up a bit and nothing is more friendly than a grand buffet supper. Let's make it simple and easy on the purse.

Let's dress up the living-room table not far from the TV set—your gayest cloth, a punch bowl for mulled hot cider. Use pink hibiscus and silver Christmas-tree balls for decorations, use a large cannalily leaf to hold the hibiscus without water. With your mulled cider serve garlic popcorn (popcorn sprinkled with garlic salt), a bowl of cheese and liverwurst spread to dunk your pretzels, crisp crackers or potato chips.


For supper let's plan a tray of cold sliced beef tongue. (My friends say they have never tasted anything so

good. It's the way you cook it; it's not expensive and the recipe is yours.) With the tongue, sliced homemade ham loaf (sliced not too thin); garnish with a lavish hand of green sprigs of parsley, pimiento strips and spiced crab apples. Around the edge of the tray arrange your most glamorous small bowls. In one, homemade mustard pickle (the recipe is easy and a treasured one). In another bowl, chili sauce and mustard combined with horseradish and grated lemon peel. In your third bowl, sour-cream dressing—fold Hampshire sour cream into your favorite salad dressing, add grated onion and season with salt. This dressing is elegant to keep on hand all the time for sandwiches, vegetable salad, etc.

Make Plenty

For your hot dish—a casserole of large lima beans baked with a special seasoning. Have plenty—your guests will love them. (This dish is a favorite at Hollywood High.) For bread—assorted breads—dark rye and French bread buttered and heated in a paper bag. (Sprinkle

with water on the outside of the bag.) Add a few onion rolls (purchased from a Kosher bakery). They are wonderful.

For salad—your best tomato aspic in a ring mold or individual molds. I like a high ring mold, not a flat one. May I tell you I use an angel-cake pan. Garnish with the leaves of hearts of lettuce and big black olives. The color contrast is good.

For dessert let's be a bit snooty and different. A lush bowl of assorted cut fruits. We are quite famous at Hollywood High for "This Fruit Bowl." Yes the recipe is given with a little pride. With the fruit bowl, angel-food cake iced with seven-minute frosting, sprinkled generously with chopped chocolate-mint wafers. It may not be elegant, but I like to tear nice hunks of the cake with a fork rather than to cut the cake. And let's have lots of coffee, and best of all let's have fun. It does something very wonderful for us when we do something extra special for someone else and we all like to be asked to a TV New Year's Eve Party.

Mulled Cider (for 8)

- 3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. cloves
- 1 tsp. allspice
- 3 sticks cinnamon
- dash nutmeg
- 2 qts. apple cider

Add first 6 ingredients to the cider. Simmer 10 minutes. Strain through cheese-cloth. Reheat—steaming hot. Serve with rings of onion and orange peel.

Cheese Spread

- 2 pkgs. cream cheese
- 1/4 lb. smoked liver sausage
- 2 Tbsp. sour cream dressing
- Dash of Tabasco and Worcestershire sauce

Whip up with a fork to a spreading consistency. Make the day before, store in a jar.

Garlic Popcorn


Sprinkle popcorn with garlic salt.

Corned Beef Hash Supreme—Service for 8

- 3 cans corned beef hash
- 1 can mushroom soup plus 1/2 can water
- 2 tsp. chopped chives or four green onions sliced thin, a little of the tops added
- 8 hard-cooked eggs, sliced

Fold all together in a buttered baking dish. Bake 35 min. in a 325-degree oven. Cover

last 10 minutes of baking with a piece of waxed paper.

Buffet Baked Ham Loaf

(Makes two meat loaves)

- 1½ lbs. canned pork luncheon meat—put through the grinder twice
- 1 lb. ground beef chuck
- 2 cups of fine bread crumbs
- 1 cup finely chopped onion
- 1 cup finely chopped celery
- 1 cup milk
- 2 tsp. sage or poultry seasoning
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1 scant tsp. salt
- 4 eggs

Mix all together. Shape well—by doing this your meat loaf seems to hold together nicely. Bake in a 300-degree preheated oven for 1½ hours. Cover with a piece of waxed paper. This keeps your loaf juicy. Make the day before—your loaf slices easily then.

Mustard Pickle

(an old and treasured recipe)

- 2 jars mixed sweet pickles. Drain and add to the juice:
- ½ cup vinegar
- ½ cup water
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1 full tbsp. pickling spice (tied well in cheesecloth square)

Simmer for 20 minutes.

Bring to a boil and remove spice bag. Add well blended:

- 1 tbsp. dry mustard
- 1 tbsp. turmeric
- 3 tbsp. flour
- ½ cup water

Cook until clear and smooth. Remove from fire, fold in sweet mixed pickles. Cool and store in refrigerator.

"Lazy Susan Fiesta"

Chicken, Brown Rice and Cashew Nuts
Cook 1 lb. of brown rice in boiling water

with a tsp. of salt until just tender (about 30 min). Drain.

Drain one 4-oz. can of mushroom pieces and stems (save the juice). Saute the mushrooms in a little butter.

Have ready-cooked the day before one stewing hen. Pull the meat from the bones in nice size pieces. Cover with 2 envelopes of chicken base (from your store). Over the rice add mushrooms and chicken. Fold together lightly with a spoon.

Fill a buttered casserole with the chicken rice, over the top pour the mushroom liquid, over all coarsely chopped cashew nuts. Bake 30 to 35 minutes in a 325-degree oven.

Beef Tongue—The way we cook it at Hollywood High School by our wonderful cook, Mrs. Foster.

- 1 4-lb. beef tongue
- 2 gal. cold water
- 1 large onion cut in half
- 2 bay leaves
- 2 stalks of celery cut in half
- 1 carrot cut up
- ½ cup vinegar
- 2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1 can beef bouillon

Boil slowly for 3 hours. Remove tongue from broth and remove skin while hot. Strain.

Large Lima Bean Casserole with Celery Seed—(Our favorite at Hollywood High).

- 2 lbs. large lima beans with water to cover
- ½ lb. salt pork or bacon ends cut in squares
- 1 large onion cut in quarters
- 2 stalks celery cut up
- 1 button garlic finely grated
- Salt to taste
- 1 cup brown sugar
- ½ cup honey or white sugar
- 1 tsp. dry mustard

1 tbsp. celery seed.

Boil all together slowly until beans are medium soft, pick out celery and onions. Bake in a casserole for 1 hour in a 300-degree preheated oven until golden brown.

Ice-Box Maple Coffee Twists—(We are famous at Hollywood High for these).

Have all ingredients room temperature.

- ½ pint just warm milk
- 1 oz. yeast
- ¼ cup shortening plus 1 tbsp.
- ¼ cup sugar plus 1 tbsp.
- ½ tsp. salt
- 3 eggs

Cream sugar, salt, shortening together. Add the eggs unbeaten. Mix well. Add yeast dissolved in a little of the warm milk, add part of the flour, the milk and the rest of the flour, to make a soft dough. Work into shape on lightly floured board. Place in greased bowl with room to raise. Grease the top of the dough, cover with a tea towel, place in refrigerator. When ready to use, roll out as you would cinnamon rolls, brush with butter or oleo flavored with a little vanilla and almond flavoring. Roll up firmly, then flatten out with a rolling pin about 3 inches wide. Cut into strips. Dip some in butter, roll in cinnamon sugar. Twist. Make some plain twists. Set to raise in warm place on a greased baking sheet. Bake in a 400-degree oven until golden brown.

Brush the plain twist with the following icing:

Maple Topping

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup water
- ⅛ tsp. butter or oleo.
- ⅛ tsp. salt

Bring to a boil. Boil 10 minutes. While hot beat in ½ cup sifted powdered sugar, add ½ tsp. vanilla.

Brush your plain coffee cakes with this icing, sprinkle with nuts if you desire.

"The Christmas I remember best, and always will, took place over 20 years ago in Seattle, Washington. I had come to the United States practically penniless, and, in a few short years, I was fortunate enough to have a factory of my own and a comfortable home for my wife.
