





The Origin of our Club Name: [The issue of the pronunciation of our club name was raised last month by Arthur Frietsche-CA. Founding member of SPEEDX, David Thorne, enlightens us on this bit of club history. ds] ...I noted with interest the letter...regarding the correct pronunciation of SPEEDX. Since I was instrumental in the founding of SPEEDX I will offer my comments on how the club got its name, and how it is to be pronounced.

Sometime in 1970, Art Glover (who was then the elected President of ASWLC) and myself (who at that time was Secretary-Treasurer of ASWLC), along with several other officers of that club began to discuss resigning from ASWLC and forming a new club. This was due to severe problems with some other officers within that club. Early in 1971, a decision was made to resign en masse and start a club where the membership really had a voice in the running of the club. Our target date was July 1, 1971.

Several names were kicked around, and Art Glover suggested "The Society to Preserve the Engrossing Enjoyment of DXing" or "S.P.E.E.D.X." Since all the initial planning had been done via mounds and mounds of letters, back and forth across the country, and with very few phone calls, no one really ever pronounced the word, at least between club officers.

I for some reason liked the sound of "SPEED-DX" and so on the first issue (which was assembled on a Saturday afternoon on my kitchen table and sink), I simply laid it out as "SPEE DX" to try and convey that pronunciation. I couldn't use "SPEED-DX" because it had too many "D's" in it. Shortly thereafter a consensus of opinion became obvious that most, if not all, of the staff liked the word "SPEEDX" better, and it came into common usage and almost universally was pronounced "spee-decks," except for in a few foreign places who had not been able to hear the common pronunciation. [Many thanks to Dave for sharing this with the membership. I personally found it very interesting! ds.]

Updating the AFRTS: Although the AFRTS uses up-to-date distribution systems, until recently, the studios represented more historical than modern technology. The AFRTS network relies on satellites, AM and FM broadcast stations, closed-circuit feeds, audio-tapes and videocassettes for program distribution. AFRTS has the unique responsibility of serving a worldwide audience with U.S.-based programming. The audience is primarily made up of military and Department of Defense civilians and family members located in 44 countries and 15 territories and possessions.

Although it operates similar to other networks, there are two significant differences in AFRTS. First, the network produces little of its own programming; most of it originates from other networks. Second, AFRTS programming is commercial-free. Programming from commercial networks is monitored, and authorized announcements are inserted in place of the commercials prior to broadcast.

AFRTS originated during World War II to distribute entertainment programming to U.S. troops around the world. The original production and broadcast facility was in Hollywood, CA. As sometimes happens with government agencies, the network was under-funded for many years. consequently, much of the network's equipment and studios dated back to the early days of broadcasting. The challenge to AFRTS was to modernize the network by providing better acoustic and electronic facilities.

After a careful analysis of the current facility, it quickly became obvious that the optimum solution was a new building. Not only was the current facility too small, but

renovating the already cramped quarters while maintaining the demanding broadcast schedule was deemed impossible. To keep construction costs as low as possible, planners decided to look into the possibility of renovating an existing building.

A 60,000-square-foot building was found in suburban Los Angeles. The initial architectural plan divided the available space into two areas: administrative and broadcast. The broadcast portion of the building consists of four main areas: TV broadcast center, general broadcast center, general broadcast areas and the administrative area. The radio broadcast center simultaneously originates several network feeds. Incoming programs are switched live to one of several outgoing networks operated from radio master control. Also, the incoming programs are automatically recorded on computer-controlled automated tape recorders and an array of 36 cart machines. The cart machines record small segments of network material from up to 20 different networks. Later, these recorded segments are automatically integrated into an outgoing AFRTS network feed.

The radio operation is more automated than TV. All recording, playback and erasing tasks are prescheduled and controlled by an automation system. Two radio studios with a separate control room provide equipment for major program productions. Smaller, combo operations provide disc jockeys with space to record their programs for later broadcast. Live DJ shows are not usually broadcast.

In any broadcast facility, especially one the size of AFRTS, different acoustical needs are encountered. In order to achieve the desired acoustical properties for each type of area (administrative, broadcast, storage, etc.), separate criteria were developed. Each of the areas required different isolation, reverberation and other acoustic specifications. To meet these, different door types, surface absorption materials, mechanical system isolation and localized baffling were developed for each type of area. The keys to the effective design and implementation of the AFRTS facility were planning and expertise. The network, staffed by broadcast professionals, worked with outside experts in developing a modern technical center. The challenge to the planners was to incorporate the technical requirements of live radio and TV broadcast and a large-scale duplication operation into a single efficient facility. Mother Nature Wreaks Pacific Basin (Again): Typhoon Kim slammed into Saipan during the early part of December, with winds gusting to 198 MPH. According to a press release from FEBC, their transmitters and buildings were severely damaged by the storm. Apparently, the landfall of Typhoon Kim took the Saipan residents by surprise. FEBC director on Saipan, Doug Campbell, awoke the morning of 12/2/86 to the sound of a fierce storm. He then went to KSAI (the local FEBC AM outlet), where he was trapped for 48 hrs until the storm passed. Inspection of the ravaged area revealed destroyed antennas, power supplies and buildings. In fact, much of Saipan remained under water for days after the storm. FEBC estimates that they will need \$380,000 worth of parts and supplies to restore operation. (Via Guy Atkins-WA. I saw a similar article on FEBC-Saipan in Religious Broadcasting magazine, and the destruction was widespread and of the worst magnitude. Too bad the pictures they had weren't of the quality to reproduce here! ds) In other Pacific news: A typhoon also devastated Vanuatu on 2/7/87, and took Radio Vanuatu off the air. Damage in Vila was in the thousands; half of the population thought to be homeless. On 2/9, a powerful earthquake shook Papua New Guinea; initial shock over 7.0...on 2/10 there was an aftershock of 5.1. Over 1,000 people thought to be homeless. No word on possible damage to regional PNG SW outlets. (Via Ron Trotto-FL and Radio Australia and David Sharp-FL and Mutual Network News.)

Soviets Switch-off Jammers, Turn-on the BBC: According to BBC officials, their Russian-language broadcasts have not been jammed since 1/20. The broadcasts began in 1946 and have been jammed systematically on-and-off since 1949. Jamming most recently resumed in August 1980, after a seven year absence, with the emergence of Solidarity in Poland. According to a BBC spokesman, Russian broadcasts from Radio Liberty and the VOA continue to be jammed. The spokesman also noted that the Soviets stopped jamming Radio Beijing last year.

John Tusa, managing director of the BBC's external broadcasting division, said that the apparent end of the jamming "means that our persevering 14 million-strong audience inside the USSR can be joined by many more listeners, now that tuning into programs is less of a challenge." The BBC estimates that the USSR spends at least \$900 million/year to prevent its citizens from hearing Russian-language services from other countries. The BBC broadcasts news bulletins every hour or two, along with current affairs and feature programs, at a cost of \$1.5 million a year. BBC World Service English-language programs have never been jammed. [Edited from the Philadelphia Inquirer. Contributed by Fred Tresser-PA. ds]

Sweet Clarity: At last-- freedom from static and interference in any type of broadcast signal. It will dramatically improve radio and TV reception...and increase the sensitivity of military surveillance and guidance systems. How can this be accomplished?

According to Breakthrough magazine, elimination of interference can be accomplished through the use of supersensitive, superaccurate device filters. The secret: a microchip that distinguishes information [the broadcast signal...ds] from noise by looking at a signal's regularity. Information is conveyed through a consistent pattern of signals. Noise, on the other hand, is random and shows no regular pattern. Also encouraging is that the chip does not need to be adapted for each new application. Noise will always look like noise to the chip, no matter what kind of signal is being broadcast. [Via Bob Moser-II. Can you imagine the possibilities? Should this new chip be introduced to the shortwave market, we could possibly see a whole new generation of receivers. Needless to say, though, these new receivers would probably be quite expensive at first. ds]

Mike Agner informs Maryland area SPEEDX members that he will be establishing a "Listening Post" net on local Sundays on the Baltimore 147.03 repeater. There will be brief equipment notes, DX tips and other surprises. Listeners with scanners will also be welcome to listen/contribute. Independent Radio Stops Broadcasting: Asuncion, Paraguay: This country's main independent radio station, Radio Nanduti, has gone off the air due to what its director said was constant jamming, and he called on the government to end the interference. At a news conference, station director Humberto Rubin said interference that had marred Radio Nanduti's broadcasting since last May worsened in December to the point it was affecting advertising time.

Radio Nanduti's problems began after it started broadcasting programs with a political and social emphasis, sometimes featuring opposition politicians. Almost a quarter of the country's population was listening to the morning talk show when it was cut-off in May. Problems with government officials started escalating in 1983 as the radio station became bolder and as more Paraguayans started tuning-in. President Stroessner's press secretary issued a list of politicians and topics that could not be aired. The station was later closed by the government for 30 days.

The radio, in its 20th year in operation, will continue to be silent for 90 days or until the state identifies the interference and ends it, to allow Radio Nanduti to exercise press freedom without constraints. [From Marc Schlossman-CA and LA Times. ds]

Board of Directors News and other reminders: Club President, Jack Sanderson, informs us that it's BOD election time again! This year, three BOD seats are available (Tom Kephart and David Sharp have two more years on the BOD). Nominees must be Full Members and no seconding of nominations is required. Nominations are due at Tucson HQS no later than midnight 15 June 1987. [Now is the time to get in your ten credits and earn Full Membership. Anyone that is a FM is eligible for BOD elections. ds] From CDE Peggy Thompson: Please send your logs cut, and in a business size envelope. Many members fold their logs into tiny envelopes, and guess what happens? They come mutilated because they won't fit through the P.O.'s LSM's [I dunno what LSM's are, but I'd guess they're "Letter Shredding Machines," hi. ds], or they come postage due with a 10¢ surcharge for being too fat! [Those of you that contribute through Peggy please keep these guidelines in mind! ds]

Expanding Service Coming From Radio Finland: Ed Soamre-MA says Radio Finland, with the future use of their 500kW transmitters, will be introducing a French service. The sched: Daily 1430-1500 to US/Canada: 11945, 15400. To Middle East/Europe/Africa: 1630 to 1700 on 11755, 11850, 6120. To Europe: 1830-1900 on 9530, 6120. To West Africa and Europe on Saturdays: 11935, 11755, 9655, 6120. (Via Media Network.) From Ron Trotto-FL comes word that Radio Finland will begin evening broadcasts to North America. Ron says that Radio Finland will announce the details on-air, so keep listening!

AM Radio Applications Frozen: The FCC has put a temporary freeze on applications for daytime radio stations on AM, the first step toward a permanent ban. "It does not contemplate ever again issuing a new license for daytime only operations," James McKinney, chief of the FCC's mass media Bureau, said. "It was a service that was needed and served its purpose, but not a service that is needed as we approach the 1990's."

The estimated 2,200 AM daytime only stations operating nationwide have had a difficult time competing with AM stations that have longer hours and with FM stations. There is also the problem of interference from outside sources which hinder AM broadcasts. These problems have prompted audiences to defect to FM in large numbers. FM stations are holding 72% of the listening audience, even though there are more AM stations than FM. McKinney said daytime only stations have existed since World War II. (From Jack Heaton-FL and the St. Petersburg (FL) Times. Perhaps the possible extension of the AM band, & growing use of AM stereo will help stop or reverse the trend. ds)

DON'T BLAME THE CDE: Jean Burnell's loggings for November were postmarked 12/2 and received 1/10 with the notation stamped on "found in supposedly empty equipment." Automation requires more than artificial intelligence. Sorry, Jean. A bientot.

This month's format is only an experiment, but it is an effort to present more useful information in a more readily available form. As it is assumed that all reports refer to reception within the current reporting period, two to six weeks before publication, dates will not be shown unless they have special importance. When they do appear, they will be in the usual month/day digital format. Time will be reduced to 3 categories, (a) morning, (p) evening, and (d) daytime, at the station site. When time of reception is especially important, it will appear in the usual 4-digit UTC form immediately after the station name. Program details will be kept to a minimum except when unusual programs are involved or for those stations that are difficult to identify otherwise. Reporters will be given a sequence number keyed to a list at the end of the column. To maintain the very useful data on the location of each reception report, four lists will be used; E1, E2, etc., for the eastern US; C1, C2, etc., for the Central area, W1, W2, etc. for the West, and X1, X2, etc., for other areas, but with Canadian QTH's included in the appropriate US area. As almost all reports deal with reception good enough to identify the station and the program, the S10 rating will not appear unless it indicates marginal or exceptional reception.

Although the above may, at first glance, appear somewhat arbitrary, they are based on the following generalizations. Most Latin American stations are of relatively low power. When one in a particular area is coming in, the others in that area are probable. The most important factor controlling propagation is the sunrise/sunset situation at the station and at the receiving location. Hence the north-south orientation. Because some of the data may be used as much as two-thirds of a season after the report, morning and evening "windows" instead of exact time are indicated. A generalized data presentation would, in many cases, fail to communicate the required information, so some stations, rare, unusual, or interesting, must appear in a partially expanded or full data format. I hope that I, as editor, can make the proper choices.

Now to the reports. The language will not be indicated unless it differs from the normal language of the country.

ARGENTINA

None of the regionals were reported this month. Bob Ress, E1 (p) reported a soccer match on R Rivadavia's feeder, 4588 kHz USB. They were also reported from the Pacific Northwest in the CMDX Club Monitor with a good signal. If your receiver has SSB capability, it's a chance for a better signal during sports events.

ECUADOR

The big news was, of course, the Presidential kidnapping. Radio Quito did a fantastic job of covering the event although most reports came over the line from R Caravana, a MW station in Guayaquil. The Atalaya sistem was silent, probably because the Navy had taken control of the town. R Quito came up with a new ID for their cadena "La Sistema de Ecuador Radio, LA CADENA DE TRIUNFO" after the President had been released. At the end of the broadcast, they listed the foreign stations that had carried at least part of their program. These included Chicago, New York, Los Angeles, Miami, New Orleans, and Washington in the US, as well as the BBC, Spanish Radio, Cuba, Nicaragua, Peru, Panama, Chile, Argentina, Colombia, and Venezuela. When you add in over 20 stations in Ecuador, it was quite a feat for a 60-meter band station with only 5 kilowatts. Clearly, it was a case of people who understood the potential of electronic communication and didn't waste time on political or financial negotiations and agreements.

Now to fill the space that I should have used for program data, some general comments on Mexico's shortwave stations.

The first group is the University stations. At present, every University and branch University has a radio outlet as a communications laboratory, some are on MW, some on FM, but the SW stations are familiar, Radio University de Mexico, de San Luis Potosi, and de Sonora. Radio Education was originally under the Secretariat, but is gradually being phased in as a station for the downtown branch of the University. These stations generally broadcast classical music with brief periods of student-oriented programs. Radio Mil has signed a contract for part-time programming by the Politecnic Institute, but their SW outlet continues to operate at less than low power. Radio Huayacocoatla is operated by the Ibero-American University with cultural programs directed toward the campasinos.

La Hora Exacta is now a government operation continuing their time signal/ad format, but with PSA's and ads for government-owned companies substituted for the previously commercial ads. It is operated as a branch of Radio Mexico International.

XEUU in Linares is unique in that it is a privately-owned commercial station operating solely on shortwave.

As I mentioned earlier, XEW has reactivated shortwave. They are owned by Televisa and sometimes ID as Televisa Radio. They and XEQ are MW relays.

La "U" de Veracruz and Su Pantera in Merida are little more than 49 meter relays of MW stations. I've yet to hear an ID or program intended for more than the local area of either station.

Radio Mexico International is, of course, the official international voice of Mexico. Years of budget difficulties and lack of agreement on what the voice should say have stunted both growth and innovation. There seems to have always been plans for broadcasts in languages other than Spanish, but none have ever materialized.

It's not many stations for a country of this size and importance, and undoubtedly the status quo will continue into the next administration. Perhaps then, someone will realize that shortwave offers a ready solution to their internal and external communication problems.....



As mentioned last month, I have been working on a new A/O column format which would include all contributor's loggings as well as DX news received from various sources in my allotted six pages. So, with tentative approval from the Managing Ed. and the Publisher, I am introducing a major change this month. All loggings will be in frequency order, as opposed to the standard SPEEDX by-country format. By using this system, I won't be utilizing valuable space to type in the A/O country names. In an attempt to save even more space, some country/station names will be abbreviated as in previous A/O columns. These abbreviations will be of only the larger A/O SW broadcasters, and to avoid confusion among A/O readers, I will now list them: PRC=People's Republic of China; BBC=British Broadcast Corp; AIR=All India Radio; RRI=Radio Republik Indonesia; VOTRI=Voice of the Islamic Republic of Iran; RJ=Radio Japan; VOA=Voice of America; FEBC=Far East Broadcast Co; BSKSA=Broadcast Service of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia; VOCF=Voice of Free China; RM=Radio Moscow and RA=Radio Australia; PNG=Papua New Guinea.

As yet, I'm not sure if this new format will actually save space, but the only way to find out is to try it, so here goes...

My doubts turned out to be unfounded-this "by frequency" listing format does use much less space. To be honest, I'll have to admit that I prefer the previous "by country" system, but with increasing contributions during the active DX months and with the decreasing number of pages with which to work, this new system worked out quite well. Now I am asking you, the membership, to let me know which format you prefer. Please cast your vote when you send in your April & May A/O loggings or even if you do not contribute. Of course, the SPEEDX BOD may have the final word on this matter, but I really want to know your opinion. The new system will give me extra space for A/O DX news and other features, but if you prefer just the loggings by country, so be it. Because of the large number of excellent loggings found in this month's column, it should come in handy as a reference guide while you are scanning the dial for that elusive A/O DX.

I recently added a new book to my SW reference library, one that I consider to be among, if not the best: SHORTWAVE RADIO LISTENING WITH THE EXPERTS edited by the well known DXer, Gerry L. Dexter. This large book, over 500 pages, includes info on almost every aspect of DXing imaginable, written by some of the top names in the field. Among the topics covered that should be of special interest to SPEEDXers are: SETTING UP YOUR SHACK (by Fred Osterman & Larry Cunningham), ANTENNAS FOR SW RECEPTION, PURCHASING THE RIGHT SW RECEIVER (by Lawrence Magne), FUNDAMENTALS OF SW RADIO PROPAGATION, RECOGNIZING LANGUAGES (by SPEEDX editor Dr. Richard E. Wood), THE VERIFICATION GAME (with some of the best info I've ever seen on the art of QSLing), COMPUTERS & DXING, UTILITY MONITORING (by former SPEEDX Utility editor Mike Chabak), DOMESTIC SW BROADCASTING ACTIVITY IN THE ANDES, and GRAYLINE DXING THE TROPICAL BANDS. Two chapters that will prove of even more particular interest to A/O DXers are DXING THE USSR (by Roger Legge, editor of the USSR High Frequency Broadcast Newsletter-UHN) and DXING INDONESIA (by William S. Sparks). Along with Latin America & China, the USSR and Indonesia constitute, in my opinion, the most complex and hard to understand areas of SW DXing. These two chapters will answer most of your questions on how to DX the large number of SW stations found in the USSR and in Indonesia.

Many other aspects of DXing are covered in this book as well (25 chapters total) including MW-FM, VHF/UHF, PIRATE RADIO, NUMBERS STATIONS, OTH RADAR (in depth), etc. In short, I highly recommend SHORTWAVE RADIO LISTENING WITH THE EXPERTS for all beginning and medium level DXers. I have been involved, on & off, in the SW hobby for about 20 years and I'll tell you-I sure learned a lot from this book! My only complaint is the absence of info on SW broadcasting in Africa & China, but so far, this is the best book yet published that covers almost every aspect of the SW Radio listening hobby. It is published by Howard W. Sams & Co. and has a list price of \$22.95. Miller Publishing (3 Lisa Dr., Thorndale PA 19372) is offering the book at \$19.95 including shipping.

More RCI/NHK News

RCI and NHK are about to extend and amplify their present agreement by which NHK broadcasts 1 hour daily to the USA from RCI's transmitters in Sackville. Beginning April 1, 1987, R. Japan plans to expand to 4 hours daily using RCI's transmitters....A bill to amend Japan's current communications law so that foreign broadcasters such as RCI can make use of NHK's shortwave transmitters will be laid before the Diet (Japan's parliament) soon. Before Canada can broadcast to Asia from Japan, serious obstacles must be overcome. First, the bill introduced by the Japanese Government must be passed. Secondly, RCI will not be able to begin (these broadcasts) before April, 1988. And finally, with RCI intending to broadcast in Chinese, English, French & possibly Russian, considerable financial resources will be required. And these are lean times in Canada. (via Koji Yamada)


