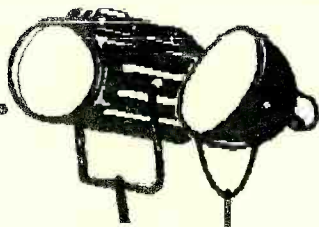

MARIANAS RADAR SYSTEM

First there was just *Over-the-Horizon Radar*...the next generation will be called *Relocatable Over-the-Horizon Radar*! Officially called the *Marianas Radar System*, the project, as proposed, would face northwest toward part of China, Korea and Japan. A second system would face southwest toward Vietnam, the Philippines and southern China. The third system would track northeast and scan parts of Japan and the waters east of Japan and south of the Kamchatka Peninsula in the far eastern Soviet Union. The system transmitters are to be built in Tinian. Up to three receivers and control centers are scheduled for Guam. These are considered *relocatable* because the transmitters and receivers can be moved to previously prepared locations. Fifty-eight acres are required for the transmitter sites, while 172 acres are needed for the receiver sites.

(Mike also sends in the following from the P.S.&S., August 17, 1989 edition...)

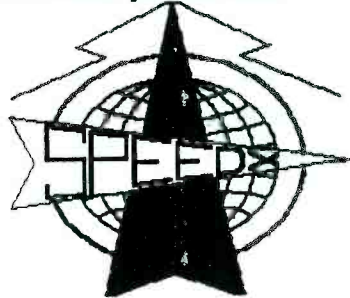
"Years ago, WMLK was a gas station surrounded by fields and cows.

"Today, the station's building has been painted a brilliant white, and at a spot roughly where the pumps once stood, two 240-foot towers rise over the station. The towers, along with a third 47-foot tower some 100 yards away, form a triangle that supports a V-shaped wire antenna.

"These days, the building is a radio station - a shortwave radio station, to be precise.

"For six hours, six days a week - three in the afternoon and three beginning shortly after midnight - WMLK broadcasts English-language religious and educational messages of the Assemblies of Yahweh, a religious community that has its world headquarters less than one mile east of the radio station, near Bethel in southeast central Pennsylvania.

"(Jacob O.) Meyer, for the most part, delivers the messages on WMLK. An author and world traveler, Meyer is a large, round man with a long beard and a kindly smile. He and his family live in a tidy white and green frame house on Bethel's quiet main street.



"Meyer and his family own a herd of dairy cows (ed note: I assume this is how the station got it's name...WMLK...milk???) and they produce and market organic cheeses. He also edits two monthly magazines, as well as leads the weekly congregational services."

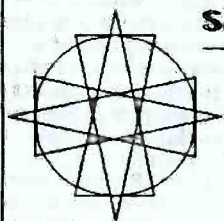

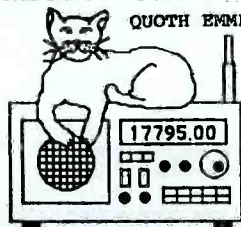

SPEEDX SELF-PORTRAIT, by Rolan Kunkel

I began SWling in 1953/54 with a homebrew and an S38A. I was also an editor for the Universal Radio DX Club, where I did no one any good, and I think Bill fired me! I was a crummy editor; although I tried hard, I was too young.

I fled the known world in 1959 and spent 10 years wandering. In 1971, I

stopped traveling for a while and attended San Jose City College and San Jose State University, majoring in Accounting. I traveled again from 1976 to 1979 and lived in the Seychelles Islands. Due to medical problems, I've lived in California since the early 1980's; I moved to Morgan Hill in 1987 and began SWLing shortly thereafter. I am a senior integrator for Ford Aerospace, responsible, with a team of fellow integrators, for the Air Force Satellite Control Network. I joined SPEEDX in 1988 and enjoy the club very much. The responsiveness of the editors has led me to take an active part in contributing to the club. To Bill, Jason, Al, and Bruce, thanks, it's nice to be here.

I have a DX-440, and eight "stealth" antennas (dead of night on the roof; I live in a condo). I'm living at the base of a hill which makes the South Pacific terribly difficult. Papua is like next door, Indonesia is moderately tough; India (I loved India when I was there; I can't imagine how they keep it all going, but they do!) and the Middle East are gang-busters, South America is very good, but best of all is Southern Africa, there in my living room, overloading my antennas. My biggest challenge here is AC power line noise--Arrrggh!

Fort Monmouth--gosh, I passed through Ft. Dix and Ft. McGuire a couple of times, and almost froze to death in Garden City....

PROCEEDINGS 1989: REVIEWED

DON THORNTON: I guess the best way to begin this review would be to repeat the warning in the pre-publication release: Although clearly written, it is not a primer; it is, in fact, written by senior DXers for senior DXers. A lot of the material is very technical.

David Clark's article about the auroral factor in transpolar DXing, for example, did not discuss the fundamentals of transpolar propagation--the author assumed you know that, so concentrated on more theoretical concepts. The series of antenna articles which followed was very interesting, but for anybody who doesn't have "hands-on" experience with anything more difficult than installing an Eavesdropper, the articles didn't provide a guide on how to fashion any particular one of these antennas.

Six articles on older and modern receivers followed, including one by John Bryant on the NRD-525, which, since I have one, was of particular interest. I found it to be objective, citing the high points as well as the flaws--including that notorious owner's manual!

Five articles on peripheral equipment were also featured: Audio filters, PLAM boards, synchronous detection, PLL detection, and multi-band AM pickup units. Very interesting, and very technical. General interest features on Java, Brazil, and the Arab world were the most interesting reading, as was a new section for this year--short, one- or two-paragraph, tips and advice for the advanced DXer. Worth the money? Yes, but don't be disappointed if you find it too technical.

ED CICHOREK: I was very surprised at the lambasting Gerry Bishop gave to the Yaesu FRG-8800.

I purchased my '8800 from Gilfer, with the narrow-filter modification. Speaking as a non-technical SWLer, I must say that I am quite happy with the performance. I've had no dust or dirt problems; it seems quite stable, and I haven't had any problem with drift. My attempts at DXing have produced the Solomons, the Cook Islands, and the Voice of Asia--not too shabby.

Before deciding on a receiver, I did some research and made a point of reading the Radio Receiver--Chance or Choice books by Rainier Lichte. His review of the FRG-8800 helped me decide, and I haven't regretted it.

EJ: For my part, I found the antenna articles impenetrable, the receiver reviews interesting, and the feature articles very good, overall. This year's Proceedings is less well printed and proofread than last year's (yeah, I know I'm a fine one to talk), but I have very little substantive criticism of the text or the presentation.

As far as the FRG-8800 goes: The only thing I can think of is that Gerry Bishop got hold of a lemon. He may have been inordinately perturbed by the receiver's eccentric front-panel controls, but that didn't seem to be a major factor in his criticisms.

Basically, this discussion illustrates that PROCEEDINGS 1989 is what it set out to be--the publishing event of the year.

Beijing, as an ancient city in China with splendid architecture and charming landscapes, attracts tourists all the year round. But autumn is the best season for traveling in the city. So, join us in October for an armchair tour of some of its spots of scenic and historic interests such as the Summer Palace, the Great Wall, the Fragrant Hills and so on. "Travel Talk" will be on the air on October 7th, 14th, 21st and 28th.

Quite a few foreigners like traditional Chinese music. But what is the most popular instrument used in a traditional Chinese orchestra? I bring this up as apparently there are 2 "Wei Hua's" one working at China Radio & TV and the other at Radio Beijing, so going by the meaning, it could be a common name taken by many people, and also announcers do not use their real name according to my friend, but this I have to take his word for. INTERNATIONAL WATERS - "The Radio Station, Radio Caroline was silenced on Saturday after a raid by Dutch officials, when the ship The Ross Avenger was in international water. It was boarded in a joint operation involving Dutch Coast Guard, Police and Trade Inspectors. The operation was apparently carried out after official complaints from Sweden, Hungary and Britain that broadcasts, from the ship, caused interference on an emergency frequency used by international shipping. The raid put Caroline out of action as well as Radio 819 and World Mission Radio, as they all transmit from this same ship. Reports in the 'Sunday Express' say that the boarding party dismantled the stations transmitting equipment..." (Excerpts from report on Sweden Calling DXers" on 8/23)

M into something like 'This Date in History'. A little hard to understand as noise picked up into music. No sign of CKZU, Vancouver. Wiped out by DW, Antigua IS/ID at 0857. A little noisy but otherwise fair signal to poor after Nelson Riddle and his orchestra on 9/2. Been looking for this one for over 20 years! (bmm) and at 0827 "Oh Canada" and second (Provincial?) anthem. S/on w/litany of CBC Newfoundland stations. 0830 news by W and weather and sports. At 0840 "Words of the Pioneers" host Don MacNeil with guest George Thurmond from Scarborough, Ontario. At 0857 DW, Antigua came on wipeout! on 9/3. I've tried since 1972 to log this. Strange I should get it with such noisy conditions. CKZU, Vancouver barely there. Maybe reduced power. Thanks to Bruce MacGibbon for the tip. (Eric Swedberg, OR). Note: I've noticed CKZU, Vancouver starts fading about 0815. (bmm)

SEYCHELLES - Eric Swedberg, Portland, Oregon is hearing FEBA Radio on 15325 in English only identifying itself as "Network". He first heard it at 1540. Program was in progress, played "Love Beyond Reason" by Randy Stone, "Miss You Like Crazy" by Natalie Cole. News update and 1600* on 9/4. I checked on 9/6 and the Woman announcer gave this address: Network, Box 25111, Bangalore, 25 India. Women announcer gave her name, and gave Indian Standard Time when the program would be on again. I didn't catch it due to co-channel QRM//9590. Sked is *15-16. (bmm)

TAIWAN - "New Star (?) Broadcasting Station" - History:
First noted in April 1977 on 7200 Khz with jamming from China. And also noted on 17050v (2nd service), 10725 (1st service) and 5995 Khz (1st

service) around 1977-1978. However 7200 and 5995 Khz have disappeared soon.

In March 1980 it added a freq of 8400kHz to the 1st service. And in August 1980 it started a new service named as the 3rd service on 8400kHz, sharing transmission time with the 1st service.

Most of the services had been jammed by transmitters in mainland China before 1982, when all jammers in China has been stopped at the same time for half a year.

This station had broadcast a new pgm named as "Selections of Song" about 1 hour/day around May 1985. Broadcast songs were of popular songs and patriotic songs of Taiwan. However this special program disappeared soon.

8400kHz was QSYed to 8300kHz and moved again to 8410kHz in Oct through Nov 1985. And 9725kHz was added to the 3rd service in Nov 1985.

In Jan 1986 this station absorbed BOT/IOK Radio, which was also #s station in Taiwan, that station was first noted in Feb 1977 on 11310kHz and 8300 kHz, but 11310kHz has been off the air since July 1985. The absorbed pgm has been named as the 4th service, operated on 8300kHz.

8410kHz has been discontinued since Jan 1986. On the 2nd service 15388kHz has been heard since May 1986. And on the 1st service freq change has been done as well. 11430kHz was added in July and 10725kHz has been off since Oct 1986.

5995 and 7200kHz are ex freqs of V. of Rightousness. This station, whose office was based on Tapei, had broadcast to China with 5995(BEC77), 7200(BEC76) and a MW before around 1975-1976. New Star(?) BS may be broadcast from this facility.

Content of Broadcast: 4 or 5 digit \$s in Std. CH. Broadcast by several female announcers. Sometimes by male announcer. The #s is believed to be a code message with a special purpose. The conversion chart is identified out of regular one for telegram in mainland China. It sometimes broadcast a short message in Std. Chinese with #s code, however it is presumed one kind of cryptogram.

TONGA - Chris Hambly, Melbourne, Australia called me and said Tonga back on the air and in subsequent followup said the frequency was 5030 and heard at reasonable strength at 0800 on 8/29.

UNITED KINGDOM - Some October BBC Programs: The Chinese People Stand Up - Centrepiece is the six-part series The Chinese People Stand Up, the title reflecting the words of Mao Zedong in 1949: "The Chinese people have stood up". In 1989, the Chinese people have once again stood up. The series was made in collaboration with the BBC's UK Current affairs unit. Its

presenter, and writer of the accompanying book is Elizabeth Wright. A diplomat in Peking during the Cultural Revolution, she returns to running World Service's Chinese section this month after a spell in current affairs. Suns 1401 rep 2330, Mon 0630, 1001.

Chinese Lives - Sang Ye, a journalist, and Zhang Xinxin, a writer best-known for her fiction (and regarded by some as alarmingly frank about her generation's attitudes) set off together in 1984 on a journey around China. They went to interview its people and form a picture of the descendants of the age-old remains of Peking Man. Sat 21st 1901 rep Mon 0101, 1515.

Behind the Wall - Another chance to hear Colin Thubron's account of his travels across China, first heard on World Service in April last year. Thubron's book is adapted for radio in 12 parts and is read by John Rowe. Sat from 30 Sep 0130 rep 1115, 2115.

No Life for a Child - Six Part Series Wed from 4th 0130 rep 0945, 1945.

The Circle of Chalk - The Circle of Chalk is probably the greatest of all Chinese plays known to the Western world. Sun 15th 0101 rep 1201, 1901.

U.S.S.R. - Grodno Oblast Radio observed on 7140 kHz. Monitoring research 21 Aug 89. On 21 August a relay of Belorussian Radio's First Programme was observed on 7140 kHz from sign-on at 0200 gmt. From 0240-03 gmt a local news programme in Belorussian for Grodno Oblast was carried and the frequency reverted to relays from Minsk at 0300 gmt. A further programme from Grodno Oblast Radio was carried at 14-1440 gmt. (WBI 8/25)

Radio Kiev Sked from 9/3 (1 Hour later from 9/24): 18-1830 Eur 7150, 7205, 7240, 9600; 23-0000 & 02-0230 NA 9610, 9800, 11675, 15180, 17665, 17690. (Kraig Krist, VA)

Radio Vilnius will be broadcasting news from Latvia and Estonia on Wed and Sat beginning next week. Per announcement by W on 9/16. Excerpts from Radio Vilnius DX Pgm on 9/16: M Well this is rather sad news at least for our European listeners. "...The reception in this art of the globe has become very poor but let's start from the beginning. "As you know the programs on foreign service of Lithuania Radio are transmitted by Radio Moscow facilities which are operated by the USSR Ministry of Telecommunications. This authority plans the frequencies and the beams and our station has nothing to do with this matter. What we receive from them is only the list of new frequencies which is not always exact. As of September the 3rd our programs in EE at 22 and Lithuania at midnight are aired on 9610, 11675, 15180, 17665, and 17690. In a few minutes at the end of this broadcast, you will hear the announcement of the frequencies supplied by the Ministry of Telecommunications and you will notice the difference yourself. And now the reception conditions. The 16 and 19 mb outlets originate from the transmitters based in the Soviet Far East and are beamed to the Western Part of North America. The 31 and 25 mb outlets originate from the European part of the USSR and are beamed to the Eastern Part of North America. Besides the frequency of 11675 suffers heavy interference from the co-channel Radio Moscow transmission in Chinese both at 22 hours and at midnight. On 9610kHz the reception at midnight is better but still the SINPO rating is not above 33433. Can any listener verify or deny my pessimistic thoughts?"

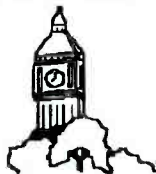

John also passes along confirmation from RNZI's Station Manager, Rudi Hill, that the new 100 kw xmtr will be in service this ooming January.

Last month, we mentioned that the PNG station Radio Enga "is currently off the air due to equipment problems." Well, on the 9/10 "Communicator" px on RA, Gordon Darling filled in a bit of the background of the problem. It seems that the new 10 kw xmtr, which was installed at R. Enga earlier this year, totally blew out the station's generator. It was then decided to hook the station into the national power grid, to provide a reliable source of electricity. This, however, is easier said than done. A person claiming to own a piece of land in the right-of-way of the power lines to the station has claimed a very high payment for the use of the land; furthermore, other people claiming to own the same land have come forward, also claiming payments for use of the right-of-way. It sounds as if the legal wrangles on this one could stretch out for a long time.

Yukimasa Matsushita in Japan did some monitoring for A/O of the RCI relay via Xian, China, in late August/early September. He found them on the air in EE 1300-1329 UTC on 15285 (ex-15435) and 11955 kHz. This is not parallel to the Yamata relay, which, as mentioned in last month's loggings, is now running the series of EE lessons for CC speakers. The new RCI schedule is now out, for the period 9/24/89-3/24/90, so here are the frequencies for the Asian relays of RCI:



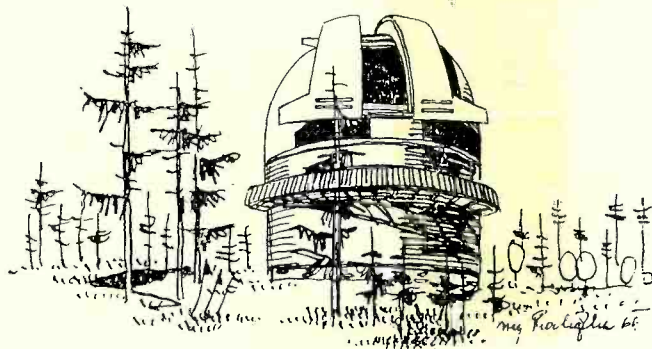
