PRODUCTION AND PROGRAMMING NEWS

FILM DIGEST: If, as West Coasters insist, westerns and mysteries are about at the end of the trail in terms of sponsor and audience interest; then the dramas and situation comedies have to take over the top rating spots. Actually, there's more than one truth in the story. It all depends on the sponsor and agency wishes for specific time spots; the age group wanted for an audience and the ever-tightening schedules. When the price is right, an agency or a station will feed the audience any suitable program. Maybe no one pointed it out, but the highest residuals are coming from Class A and B drama series because they can be slotted any place in the schedules; witness Ford, Fire-side and Schlitz re-runs under various names. Some of the situation comedies have yet to demonstrate the same kind of staying power..... In the kid appeal category, some series now being shot indicate that packagers feel that if westerns won't go, adventure series will, with a wider age group appeal.

The Screen Actors Guild has named Mrs. Florence Marston to the newly-created post of Eastern and Midwestern Regional Director, with headquarters in the New York office of the Guild's New York branch. Harold M. Hoffman has been named to succeed Mrs. Marston as executive secretary of the New York branch of the Guild. Increased need for supervision of television film activities in Eastern states led to the changes.....Beginning Oct 14, Ford Theatre will present all color films thru Nov 25 over its net lineup, the largest of any drama series.

NEWS & COMMENT: The National Broadcasting Co will change the call letters of several of its over-the-air stations, effective midnight Oct 17.
