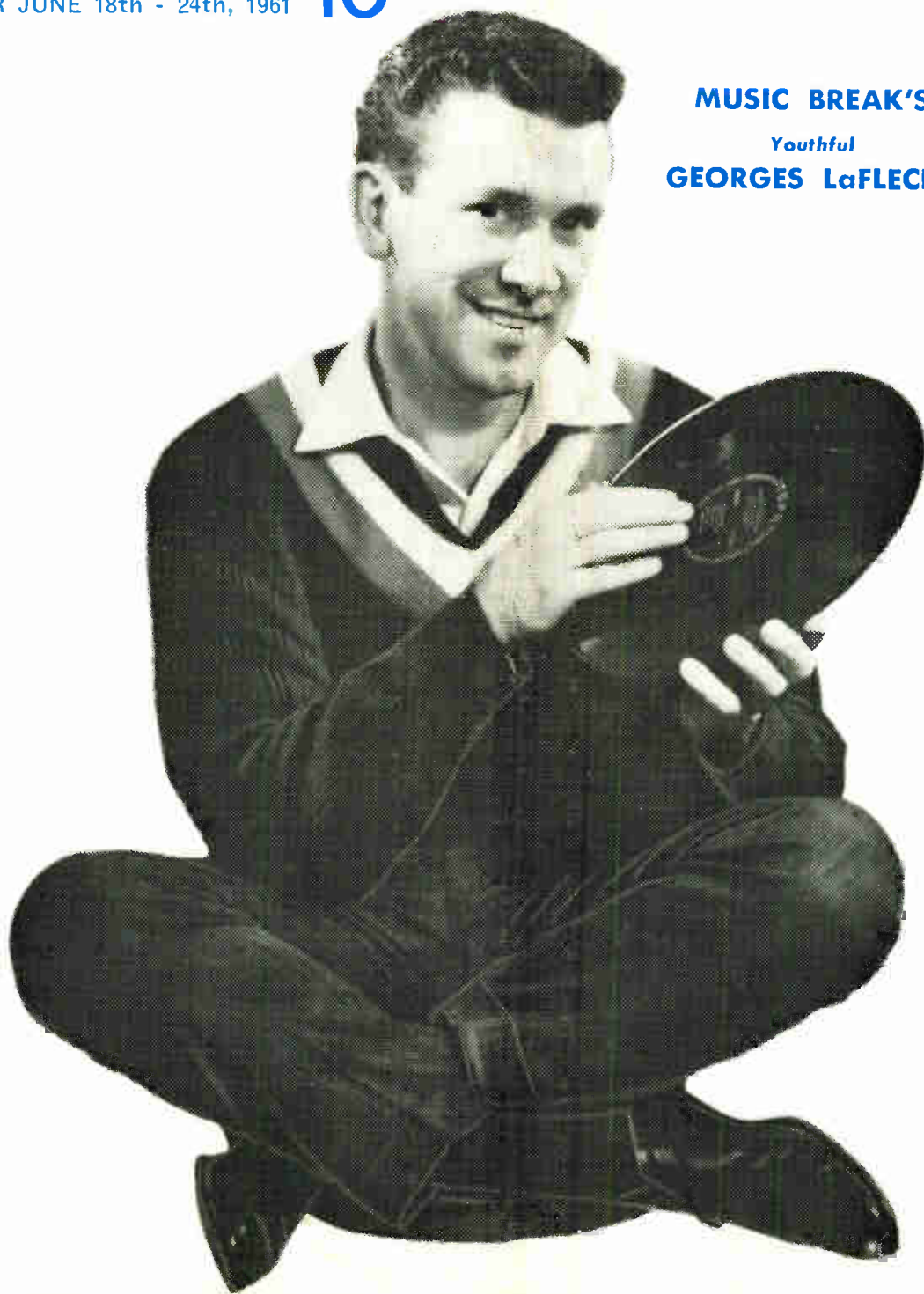

Psychiatry's Receding Frontier

THE MEASURE OF MAN, a 60-minute look at the techniques used to study the mind of man, will be seen Friday, June 16th, on CBC-TV's Camera Canada.

The mind of man is like an ever-receding frontier. All of the vast range of scientific effort and achievement is, after all, the achievement of the mind of man.

Throughout the history of medicine, the study of illness has often served not only to throw light on the roots and beginnings of diseases but also has brought with it a clearer knowledge of the functioning of the human body. So it is in the study of the mind. Research into mental illness has often led to a better understanding of the workings of the mind.

The Measure of Man will show what research is going on in Canadian laboratories and how this research is being turned into practical use. Leading Canadian psychiatrists, biochemists, physiologists and others who deal with the study of man's mind will be interviewed.

A portion of the program will be devoted to the Third World Congress of Psychiatry, being held in Montreal June 4 to 10. More than 3,000 psychiatrists from 62 nations

are expected to attend the conference. This is the first time it has been held in the Western hemisphere.

Because of the great advances being made on the frontiers of psychiatry and of the great intricacy, complexity and the almost unlimited variety of disorders of the mind, the Congress will deal with the study of the whole broad spectrum of psychiatry rather than with one particular theme or segment.

Expected to attend the Congress are three Nobel Prize winners — Lord Adrian of Great Britain who, along with Sir Charles Sherrington, was awarded the Prize for Medicine in 1932 for discoveries of the formation of the neuron; Dr. Albert Szent-Gyorgi of Hungary who won the 1937 Prize for Chemistry for his discoveries on biological combustion; and Dr. Linus Pauling of the United States, awarded the 1954 Prize for Chemistry for his study of the forces holding together protein and other molecules.

Most of the film to be used on Measure of Man was taken at the Allan Memorial Institute of Montreal, affiliated with McGill University and the Royal Victoria Hospital.

COLOUR TELEVISION

A Statement by **Alphonse Ouimet**,
President, Canadian Broadcasting
Corporation

THE CBC HAS BEEN keeping in close touch with all aspects of colour TV developments in the United States in order to be prepared to develop a Canadian service when the proper time arrives. The Corporation's engineers are keeping abreast of the latest technical developments. The CBC and the communications companies have worked closely together since the inception of the microwave network on preparations for distributing Canadian and U.S. programs to more than 50 affiliated stations of the national television service.

In considering the appropriate time for introducing colour to its TV networks, the CBC must keep in mind the fact that until very recently the progress in the U.S. has been disappointingly slow. However, the conversion to colour by many U.S. TV stations plus increased interest and activity in the receiver manufacturing industry suggests that there are more reasons for optimism than have been apparent for some time. There may not be any fast growth, but it seems likely that there will be a fairly steady development of the industry over the next few years. As receiver sales increase, manufacturing costs will drop and this should give added impetus to sales.

In considering the possibility of colour, the Corporation must keep in mind that the point of significant colour acceptance by the U.S. public has not yet arrived, although this was expected some years ago. This is undoubtedly due, in part, to the price of colour receivers. Prices in Canada will certainly not be any lower, and in addition, it seems obvious that Canadians today would hesitate before purchasing colour receivers for the same reasons that make the American public cautious. These reasons are

still somewhat of an enigma to the industry. Whatever the reasons, colour cannot develop without viewers.

The introduction of colour into Canada on any basis will unavoidably involve the CBC in large expenditures. Those who make the relatively large investment in colour receivers will expect the CBC to provide them with colour programs. In order to fulfil its obligations as a national service the CBC must provide not only the U.S. programs but Canadian colour programs in both languages. Moreover, the Corporation must plan to serve a coast-to-coast audience, rather than the residents of a few large centres. This overall requirement will be further emphasized by the national market requirements of Canadian sponsors and receiver manufacturers.

Although colour TV is expensive, Canadians will expect this service from the CBC when colour starts here. To provide such a service the Corporation will require additional public funds.

On the present level of financing the CBC does not have the money to go into colour. The Corporation has to devote all its resources and energies to the development of black and white television, in order to meet the public demand for an extension of national TV service to all parts of Canada.

The CBC would like to provide a national service in colour when all factors make the time appropriate, not only because of increased enjoyment for the Canadian viewer, but for the sake of the general buoyant effect on the electronics industry and the resulting effect on the Canadian economy.

Are Kings Going Out of Style?

THERE IS A prophecy—attributed, ironically, to ex-King Farouk of Egypt—that in 50 years the world would know only five kings: those of England, hearts, clubs, diamonds and spades.

When Farouk supposedly made his prophecy 25 years ago, George VI sat on England's throne, a symbol of one nation's majesty just as Hitler personified another nation's madness. The madness swept away seven of Europe's thrones (Farouk's besides) but seven more still survive.

Background's special presentation, *The Crown and the Crowd*, Sunday, June 18, attempts an evaluation of Europe's remaining royalty and the role of the monarchical system in contemporary democracy.

Farouk's prophecy still has 25 years to run but its expiry date, post-1984, provokes an grim Orwellian vision of super-states, endless war and oppressed proletariat.

Monarchy itself once stood for all these things (feudalism is the twin of totalitarianism) and perhaps it is because of these very visions, past and future, that monarchy has changed in form, reflecting on the one hand the social accomplishment of our age and on the other hand the challenge it faces.

Perhaps this explains why the institution of royalty survives in an age when modern theories of government and social equality would seem to render it obsolete. *Background* shows how the system of monarchy has survived democracy by serving it: how the crown has become the symbol of a nation's unity, above party and politics, the embodiment of family and religious life, and the mirror of popular aspirations and standards.

"The crown, in a very deep sense, is the most sacred aspect of the people," a churchman explains.

"It is a mystical attachment, from far back, embodying the life of the tribe," suggests a writer on the subject. "It is important because it is permanent," says Lord Robert Boothby. "Aristocracy must keep in touch with the people: no time for being pompous, potting pheasants," proclaims the Duke of Bedford as he conducts *Background's* cameras through his state-home and its Sunday circus of paying visitors.

"Snobocracy!" counters outspoken Malcolm Muggeridge. "Royalty is a dream, and dreams delude and at last destroy," and he suggests the monarchical system has served merely to increase class distinction in an age when it has theoretically been abolished.

We see it all, the symbol and the status, in the hypnotic rapture of the palace crowds—the glamour of a gilded coach, and the pageantry and heraldry, the after-glow of past glory that has its echo in the clink of swords of the passing cavalry.

What impels them — the crowd seeking a glimpse of the crown? Is it to see a vision of themselves transfigured? Is it, as critic Muggeridge maintains, a case of "the Joneses being glorified because of Armstrong-Jones?"

Or is it simply, in the words of a staunch supporter, that the crowd sees in the crown a "great abstract august symbol," a practical convenience as well as an embodied ideal.

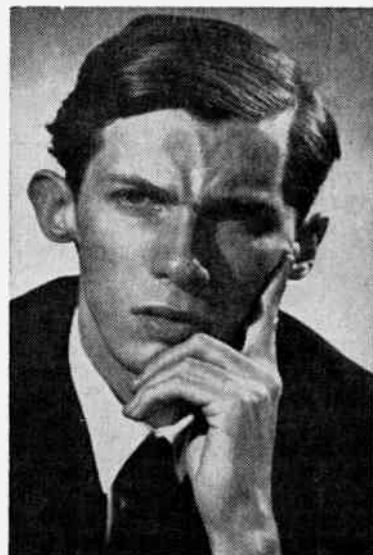
Glenn Gould, Composer

IN SPITE OF his wide horizons as a performing artist, Glenn Gould, the brilliant, eccentric young Canadian pianist who, at 29, is celebrated all over the world through recitals and recordings, has said on several occasions that his main interest in life is composing. He has even hinted that he would like to retire at 35 and devote himself to writing rather than interpreting music. Although so far his name has been associated with serious music, he said not long ago that he would like to try his hand at writing popular music — not the *Hound Dog* variety, of course, although his catholic tastes and good sense of humor make this possible, but something more like Leonard Bernstein's *West Side Story*.

Gould's first opus, a romantic String Quartet (completed in 1955 and published the next year) took him 2½ years to write. It is a mahogany-coloured work, with an intensely beautiful grain and richly

coloured shadings, written in one movement that takes a little over 30 minutes to perform. Following its premiere at the Stratford Festival

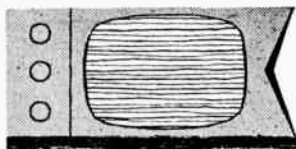

val in 1956 the *New York Times* described it as "moving and impressive." The Symphonia Quartet of Cleveland gave it its first American performance late in 1959, and the *Cleveland News* reported next day that the work was "lyrical, romantic, suffused with a delicate glow."

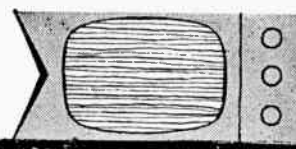
Later the same group—Kurt Loebel and Elmer Setzer, violinists; Tom Brennand, violist, and Thomas Liberti, 'cellist—recorded the Quartet for Columbia. This recording, with a special introductory talk by Gould, will be presented on CBC Wednesday Night on CBC radio.

Gould says he wrote the Quartet at a time when he was preoccupied with the avant-garde movements, when he never lost an opportunity to wave the flag for 12-tone music and its exponents, notably Schoenberg. That makes the Quartet so surprising, because it would have pleased a turn-of-the-century audiences as much as it does contemporary ones. He says: "To find in the mid-20th-century a work by a young composer that seems to evoke reminiscence of Viennese romanticism was a rather startling experience. And the first read-through of the work astonished me and even shocked friends who had expected from me, perhaps, a work of pointillistic precision. How could I, they protested, with all my

Q for Quest

Viewers Eavesdrop On Phone Call

THE WORLD television premiere in English of Jean Cocteau's *La Voix humaine* (*The Human Voice*) will be presented on CBC-TV's *Q for Quest* this Tuesday.

This unusual drama consists entirely of a telephone conversation made by the play's sole character, a woman, played by Norma Renault who talks to her ex-lover.

"It is just brutal on the actress," says Ross McLean, executive producer for *Q for Quest*. "The emotional requirements for the role are strenuous and extremely taxing. After the program had been taped, one of the crew members told me that he had never known any crew to be so silent and attentive during a performance. And Norma was completely exhausted after the rehearsals and taping because she put so much reality into the role."

The Human Voice is really a television experiment in the sense of intimacy of production, says McLean. It is an intertwining of the work of one actress, one cameraman and one producer (Basil Coleman).

Cocteau, one of the surrealists who dominated the French theatre during the period between the First and Second World Wars, finished *La Voix humaine* in 1930. It was first performed at Comedie Francaise, Paris, February 17, 1930. In 1947 it was made into a motion picture, directed by Roberto Rossellini. It has also been turned into an opera by Poulenc, the opera receiving its North American premiere and world television premiere on CBC-TV's *Concert Hour*, in December, 1959.

The translated version to be used on *Q for Quest* was obtained from Maximilian Ilyin.

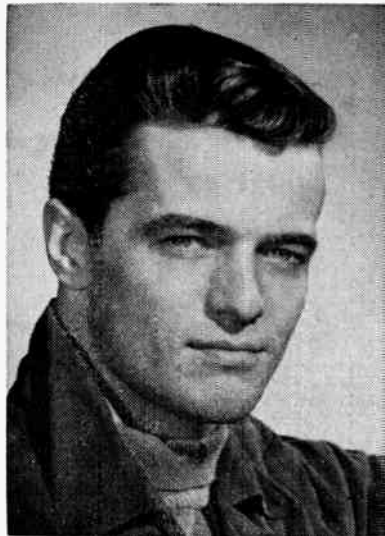

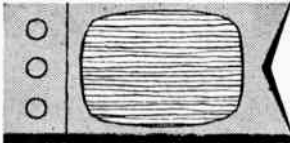

Four's Company

Are Oddball Beliefs Harmless?

John Reeves, producer of the weekly program with the Toronto Drama Quartet, here introduces the script for June 17th

"FACT OR FANCY" is, in the main, a collection of cranks, culled from the fields of science and religion—or rather from cults which are often mistaken for science and religion. The collection ranges from the respectable and the accepted simulacra of sanity to the wildness and the wooliness of the extreme lunatic fringe: one factor unites it, the common motive of wishful thinking; the cranks all share, in some degree, so strong a wish to prove their pet dogma that illogic ceases to be a barrier to belief. Another trait which is common among cranks, though not universal, is what one might call "the Galileo syndrome": faced with criticism, nearly all cranks cite the case of Galileo and imply, quite falsely, that new scientific ideas are always repudiated by established scientists; this is a convenient device for ignoring all inconvenient arguments.

At first glance it may seem unkind to draw public attention to the delusions of a few harmless oddballs. Why not let them be dotty in peace and quiet? Well, one has to ask if they *are* so few, if they *are* so harmless. The cranks themselves are more numerous than one might think, and some of them make so strong an appeal to human gullibility or so powerfully impress others who share their wishful dreams, that they collect a following that runs into millions. In a note accompanying his script when he sent it to me, Mayor Moore wrote: "It is easy enough to dismiss these fads and fallacies as harmless

fun, fooling only those foolish enough to believe them, until we recall that thousands of mentally and physically ill people suffer untold damage from their misadvice; that some world leaders still plan war or peace according to instructions received from their astrologers; that on this continent hundreds of high school teachers dare not yet teach the facts of evolution; that the late Prime Minister Mackenzie King repeatedly submitted to the advice of spiritualist mediums known to be outright fakes; and that hundreds of thousands still follow Nazis and the South African Afrikaners in a superiority based on scientific nonsense.

The trouble is, to the layman, that scientific nonsense and scientific truth are often undistinguishable, because the argot of science is meaningless to all but scientists and has to be paraphrased into common English for untrained readers. The result is a cumbrous jargon that sounds no different from the jargon used by pseudoscientists, so that the untrained reader often cannot judge what is true and what is not. A handy example is quite topical: most of us know that the earth is a spheroid; but such knowledge is really only the taking on trust the word of reputable scientists, for few of us could actually prove the fact; few of us could refute the fluent and technically involved arguments of a member of the Flat Earth Society who proclaimed that Major Gagarin could not have described an orbit

around the earth because the earth is not round.

Nowadays, of course, there are far fewer people than there used to be who have an emotional need to believe that the earth is flat, so such a creed is not likely to win very many adherents. But equally false beliefs will win people over by the thousands if they exploit widespread fears, appetites, or needs: should a prophet arise who will "prove" life after death, he will not want for disciples; should a magician arise who will turn trouser buttons into silver dollars, he will not want for customers; should a healer arise who will "cure" advanced cancer, he will not want for patients; should a sage arise who will guarantee happiness, he will not want for pupils. And there are few to listen when the priest derides a faith that needs proofs, when the chemist demolishes alchemy, when the doctor admits that advanced cancer cannot be cured, when the philosopher insists that happiness cannot be reached by short cuts.

"Fact or Fancy" tries to show up some of the short cuts for what they are. It deals in turn with a Russian psychoanalyst who re-wrote the physical history of the universe to conform with the miracles in the Old Testaments; with the recent cult of dianetics which re-wrote psychology to conform with the quirks of its author; with some of the hoaxing which goes on in the sphere of spiritualism; and

"THE TROUBLE with us Canadians is that we're too solemn about ourselves," says Tommy Tweed, actor, playwright and irrepressible wit who has been trying to remedy this regrettable situation for years, both on his own light-hearted and lightheaded hook, and in collaboration with other humorists like Dickens, Leacock, Hiebert, Gilpatric, etc.

Recently, Tweed and conductor Lucio Agostini, CBC sound-effects expert Fred Tudor and producer Doug MacDonald put their heads together, and with the help of some hilarious verses by American satirist Laurence McKinney, concocted a plan to give the symphony orchestra the "full treatment." Says Tweed: "We all know what a symphony orchestra is like, and heck, it can take a ribbing as well as the next one."

This irreverent collection of humor is described by the demons who put it together as a diabolical dissertation on the big orchestra. Comical verses from the book *People of Note* by Laurence McKinney, in which he humanizes the various orchestral instruments with tongue-in-cheek lyricism, will be read with glee by Tweed, and illustrated with wild abandon by Agostini and Tudor, with MacDonald trying to keep the high-jinks from getting out of hand. So enthusiastic were these old friends and pranksters in their plans for *People of Note* that announcer Lamont Tilden came all the way into town on his day off to record the show, because he didn't want to miss the fun. It will be heard in the *Variety*

Showcase slot on CBC Trans-Canada Thursday night.

Have you ever sat in a concert hall and wondered why in the world the harpist had gone to all the trouble of having an early supper, putting on her best black dress, hiring a truck to cart her instrument to the hall, and then sitting on stage in front of everyone hugging her harp and tuning up all alone for ages before the show, while the rest of the orchestra were probably making whoopee backstage—and all for a couple of little plunks in the middle of a bar? If the answer is yes, then you're in the right mood for the Tweed-McKinney frolic.

Tweed begins with a roguish inspection of "this Backward Man, this View Obstructor, known to us as the Conductor. He beats the time with grace and vim and some-

times they keep up with him. But though they're eloquent and snappy, conductors always seem *unhappy*. Their strange grimaces on the podium suggest bicarbonate of sodium may be, perhaps, the proper diet to keep their inner fires quiet. They have to think up countless capers to keep them in the daily papers, which help them in financial strictures or fit them for the motion pictures."

Then, having cut the conductor down to size, Tweed introduces the various instruments with music, sound and verse. The violoncellists with "their strange sex appeal," and the men who have the saddest

professed admiration for Schoenberg and for von Webern, have turned so violently from the cause?"

The answer, he says, is simple. Right from the start of his career he has felt strongly that just because he has a deep attachment for the moderns like Schoenberg and von Webern, it does not mean that he has to reject the romanticism of an earlier era, or to apologize for either of them. In fact, he sees in Schoenberg a logical development of the techniques of the last century.

He says: "Sadly, today it seems almost inevitable that admiration be the parent of snobbery and one sees on every hand superbly informed and historically oriented young musicians who are only too eager to tell you what is wrong with all music between 1860 and 1920, who seize every opportunity to isolate the development of 12-tone writing from 19th-century tradition. I have never been willing to admit that any love must be balanced by a concurrent disaffection."

The Quartet, he says, represents something he had wanted to do for a long time: to write within the boundaries of an harmonic language used by composers he greatly admires, but with a contrapuntal independence learned from masters of another era.

GoULD says the Quartet "represents a part of my musical development which I cannot but regard with some sentiment. It is certainly not unusual to find an Opus 1 in which a young composer inadvertently presents a subjective synthesis of all that has most deeply affected his adolescence ('influenced' is perhaps too determinate a word). Sometimes these prodigal summations are the harbingers of the true creative life. Sometimes the brilliance with which they reflect the past manages to excel all that their composer will do thereafter. In any event, though the system must be cleansed of Opus Ones, the therapy of this spiritual catharsis will not remedy a native lack of invention. It's Opus Two that counts!"

faces—"those who play the Double Basses. Though deep in misery their cup they have to take it standing up . . . and spying in the distant offing, they spot the man who does the coughing, the school girl in expectant dither, the wife who dragged her husband with her." The Flutist with his squirrel-like expression whose "task is the pursuit of toot and nothing but the toot." The Trombone, causing "consternation because it seems regurgitation is necessary when you play, to make the fool thing act that way. But there's no need for one to fuss about the guy's esophagus, for if you closely follow it, you'll find he doesn't swallow it." The melancholy surges which make "an English Horn cadenza sound fearfully like influenza."

Next, Tweed ducks through the thrashing fiddles and meets the tympanist who, "pots encircling him about, stands prepared to dish it out, and from his tubs the flavour floats of tickled beats and hot rolled notes, as from these mammoth soup tureens come thunder storms and battle scenes."

Not content with poking fun at the music-makers of gut, skin, wood and metal, Tweed next takes a playful look at some flesh-and-blood Encumbrances of the Symphonic Stage. The Wagnerian Sopranos, "built on monumental lines and while their voices rise, methinks, the stage indubitably sinks." The Piano Virtuosos: "Surrounded by a hundred men like Daniel in the Lions' Den, the Virtuoso takes his seat preparing to resist defeat. A few stray shots, with unconcern he ducks, and coolly waits his turn, it comes, and shooting flats and sharps, he knocks them for a row of harps." The Mixed Chorus: "Sopranos, Altos, Tenors, Basses, are rarely chosen for their faces, but for the strength which they employ in shrieking out *The Hymn of Joy*."

with the new theory of extra-sensory-perception which converts more easily than it convinces. The main sources for these exposures have been two books: "Fads and Fallacies," by Martin Gardner, which is largely an attack on the bogus propounded in the name of science; and "Illusions and De-lusions of the Supernatural and the Occult" by D. H. Rawcliffe. They are bound to tread on some corns and it cannot be claimed in their support that they are wholly objective themselves for, not content with simple refutation, they indulge in irony and allow themselves the luxury of having fun (which I hope will help to make the broadcast entertaining as well as revealing). But even if the tendentiousness they detect in others is occasionally present in themselves, even if they are partisan rather than objective, they are partisan for a worthy cause and the general spirit of their work, as of the script, is one that most men would honour, including even the cranks; it is "Let the truth prevail."

Summer Television Fare**"Specials" to Highlight Monday Night**

Top programs in the Camera Canada series, from the National Film Board and specially produced in the CBC's studios, are included in the series of outstanding one-hour shows to be seen this summer, each Monday on CBC-TV.

A POTPOURRI of hour-long specials will be presented on Monday evenings during the summer, starting July 3, on the CBC-TV network.

Ranging widely in subject matter and format, the specials will include several editions of Camera Canada, a CBC-TV documentary series; National Film Board documentaries under the general title Comparisons; a BBC feature, After Supper, with Peter Ustinov in a conversational mood; a special edition of A Case for the Court (a 90-minute program on a criminal case); as well as drama and ballet.

The 13-week summer series will include a Camera Canada program on Upper Canada Village, the early Canadian village reconstructed near the site of the Battle of Chrysler's Farm in the Cornwall, Ont., area. A highlight of this filmed program will be a re-enactment of the battle, a major event of the War of 1812, to take place late in June.

Two more Camera Canada programs are included in the series—one about the Banff School of Fine Arts, on August 7; and another, The Changing Island (about Newfoundland), on September 18.

Two documentaries from the National Film Board's Comparisons series will be seen—Courtship and Marriage, on July 10; and Sport and Man, on July 17.

After Supper, a BBC program, in which actor-writer-producer Peter Ustinov reminisces in witty conversation with three interviewers, will be telecast on July 24. The 90-minute special edition of A Case for the Court (which begins at 9:30 p.m. EDT) is scheduled for July 31.

On August 21, a videotaped program from Winnipeg will present the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. Another ballet program, on September 25 (the last in the series), will feature the Royal Ballet of London, England, in a performance of Cinderella.

In the drama field on August 28, the series will present a British-produced performance of a classical drama by the German playwright Schiller, the title of which will be announced. The following week, September 4, a CBC-TV production of The Long Night, a drama by Canadian playwright Joseph Schull, is scheduled.

Two films from Vancouver—Goom Sahn (A Portrait of a Chinese Community) and Man Against Nature—will be telecast on August 14 and September 11, respectively.

GAZPOCHO (SOUP SALAD)

- 1 cup chopped onions (Spanish)
- 1 small chopped green pepper
- 1 small chopped cucumber
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 4 large tomatoes

Scald peel and chop tomatoes. Add other ingredients with 1½ teaspoons salt, ½ teaspoon Tabasco, ¼ teaspoon garlic powder. Simmer gently for about 10 minutes. Chill. Serve with chopped chives. Serves 8-10 people.

ONION RELISH

Peel and finely chop 2 medium Spanish onions. Mix with grated peel of 1 lemon and the juice of 2. Add ¼ cup sugar, ½ tsp. salt and 2 tbsp. green peppers, 2 tbsp. pimento. Mix all together and chill for 1 hour. Drain well before serving. Serves 8-10 people.
