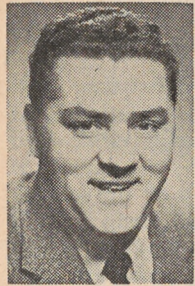

Perhaps it was a sportscaster who once said that some of the best sportswriters are those who were once professional athletes themselves.

Be that as it may, any standard applied to 34-year-old Ken Reeves shows that his versatile and successful experience as a professional athlete qualifies him for his position as CBK sportscaster in Regina.

He played pro-baseball for three years in the Mandak League. He played semi-pro basketball with the Winnipeg Paulins, one of Canada's outstanding teams during the 1947-54 era. In the 1956-57 season he coached the Regina Crescents Senior A basketball team, and earlier in his life he played minor hockey in Winnipeg.

Ken is a native Manitoban, being born and educated in Winnipeg, but having spent several years working and living in Regina with his wife and three children he has come to regard it as his second home.

"DEAR SANTA . . ." begin the letters, and there follows some of the oddest requests that the Old Gent has yet received. "Give Kenny Ploen enough money that he can retire, and give us a chance at the Grey Cup," might be the partial context of some of the open letters this year, as Prairie Sports Final holds its annual Christmas show, Saturday, December 23 on CBC Radio.

Sports commentators in Edmonton, Calgary, Regina, Vancouver, Winnipeg and Toronto—most of whom have outgrown their belief in Santa Claus—toss all reserve aside for this yearly 25 minutes of Yuletide yearnings that in past years has proved to be one of the most amusing sports features on radio. It's not too hard to predict what most of them will ask for—but you can be sure there'll be some off-beat twists to keep the listener chuckling. And Santa, if not entirely sympathetic to the requests, will be amused too.

The following week, Prairie Sports Final comes up with another special show—this one marking the climax of the year. Sports reporters from all over Canada will describe what, to them, was the most important sports happening or development in their area. Listeners will hear from Bill Good in Vancouver, Eric Bishop in Calgary, Glenn Bjarnason in Edmonton, Ken Reeves in Regina and Trent Frayne in Toronto.

SPORTS FANS can look forward to yet another special program on CBC Radio, planned to help them remember the exciting past year of sporting events. At 9:00 p.m. local time January 1 on CBW, CBK and CBX, Bob Moir will conduct listeners back through the 12 months in an exciting half hour highlighting most of the major sports events. Actuality broadcasts will be heard from the World Series, the Grey Cup game, the triple crown of racing, the Patterson-Johannson and Patterson-McNeely heavy-weight fights, the Stanley Cup playoffs, the Harmsworth Trophy boat races, Canadian Amateur and Canadian Open golf championships, the Grand National steeplechase, and many others.

To compile this special program, Bob Moir auditioned and edited ten miles of tape, snipping it into 30 minutes of high-key excitement. Ron Hunka is producer.

IF YOU'RE 25 years or younger, chances are that CBC Radio has always been an integral part of your Christmas Day. QUEST Presents

PICNIC on the Battlefield

ON CHRISTMAS EVE CBC-TV's *Quest* presents one of its most unusual productions this season: *Picnic on the Battlefield*, an amusing but disturbing mixture of cruelty and innocence characteristic of its avant garde author, Fernando Arrabal. Production is by Mario Prizek.

Arrabal is a short, bespectacled, bearded man who was born in Spanish Morocco in 1932. He moved to Madrid after the Spanish Civil War, and has lived in France since 1954. He writes in French, using extremely simple, almost childlike language. *Picnic on the Battlefield*, originally titled *Pique-nique en Campagne*, and published with three of his other plays in a volume titled *Les Lettres Nouvelles*, is his first play. He wrote it at the age of 20, when he was strongly influenced by news of the Korean War. Mario Prizek says this is its first production in English, as far as he knows, and possibly the first in any language.

The plot of *Picnic on the Battlefield* has nothing to do with Christmas festivities, but supervising pro-

ducer Daryl Duke has scheduled it for Christmas Eve because it is imbued with the Christmas spirit: peace on earth, good will to men. The situation is uncomplicated: the parents of a young soldier who are too simple to grasp the ferocity of modern warfare arrive to visit their son on the battlefield one Sunday afternoon, equipped with picnic basket—sausage, hard-boiled eggs, ham sandwiches, salad, little cakes, red wine—plus a camera, a phonograph, and a rug on which to spread it all out.

The boy tries to get them to leave, but they insist on staying. "Are you trying to tell your father what war and danger are all about?" demands middle-aged M. Tepan. "For me, all this is only a game. How many times do you think I've jumped off the subway while it was still moving? . . . I know perfectly well what goes on. In the beginning, it's all new and exciting. You enjoy the killing and throwing grenades and wearing a helmet—it's quite the thing; but you end up bored as hell. In my day, you'd have really

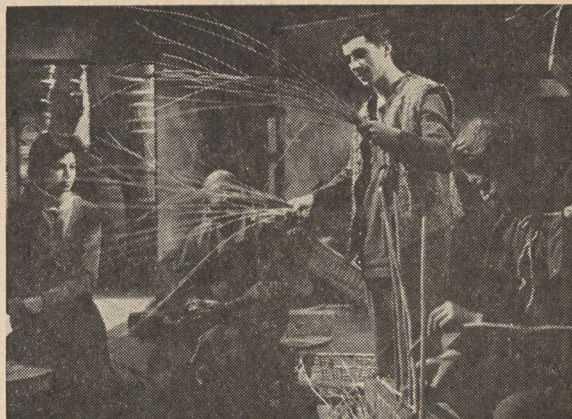

A Cradle of Willow



A NATIVITY PLAY set among an engaging group of master basket-makers in the English countryside will be seen on CBC-TV's *Festival* series on Christmas night. Titled *A Cradle of Willow*, it was written by English playwright Dorothy Wright. The 90-minute production by Eric Till stars Dino Narizzano and Leo Ciceri, with Eric Christmas and Tony Van Bridge.

Written in 1952, the play was first performed in Cheltenham, England, and later presented on BBC TV and Radio, with distinguished casts.

In her introduction to the play Miss Wright says "It doesn't matter" where it is set. The locale is nameless and dateless, but it is obviously somewhere in the West country, because of the dialect the author uses for her characters—a part of England rich in the osiers (willows) necessary for basket-weaving, and full of the dampness that invites ague. There are still families of basket-weavers there today, plying their centuries-old trade. Sets by Robert Lawson and costumes by Margaret Lurnet maintain the quality of timelessness desired by the author, while vaguely suggesting medieval England.

Miss Wright's collection of characters, with appealingly normal foibles and difficulties, is headed by the master weaver, Breague (Geoffrey Alexander). His good-natured but simple-minded cousin and apprentice, Will (Dino Narizzano), is in love with Tansy (Toby Tarnow), the local innkeeper's daughter, who is expecting his child. Martin (Leo Ciceri) is a craftsman embittered because blindness has cost him his livelihood as a falconer. Randall (Eric Christmas) provides comic relief as a skeptic; and Hoad, the foreman weaver (Tony Van Bridge), has a madwoman (Moya Fenwick) for a wife. Master Breague's delicate wife (Hilary Vernon) is dying from an illness made worse by the damp, unhealthy marshlands in which the weavers must live and work.

The community is continuously bothered by tax collectors, and there is the threat of a census, the purpose of which the weavers question. Each longs for the inspiration and protection of a Messiah, for his own special reasons.

At length the Messiah really does come to them, but in the least-expected way. A number of strange, miraculous signs announce His coming. Then the community is tumbled into confusion when mad Mistress Hoad mistakes young Will for Him, as he stands against a post with a sudden ray of sunlight striking his head, and falls to her knees to worship him. She brings the halt, the maimed and the blind to Will, bearing gifts, and he offers them comfort in his clumsy way. Eventually it is another man who discovers the true Messiah and returns, jubilant, to tell the rest.

Others in the cast are Ivor Barry as Argent, the wealthy merchant, and Hugh Webster as Clampett, the innkeeper.

Background music for the play includes the theme of a familiar Italian carol, *Jesu Bambino*. In the last scene the cast sings new words to the melody of an old English carol, *I Saw Three Ships*.

To learn authentic basket-weaving techniques, members of the cast visited workshops of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind in Toronto, and during rehearsals received on-the-set instruction from W. J. Spencer, one of the Institute's expert basket-makers. Spencer's lightning-quick hands will be seen on the screen at work on a basket under the opening titles of the show. The CNIB supplied the baskets and other weaving materials used in the production.

Producer Eric Till says: "Never before have I worked with a cast who enjoyed themselves more in a production, from first rehearsal to the videotaped performance. The play has many moods, from broad comedy to great tenderness."

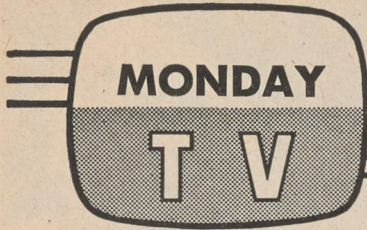

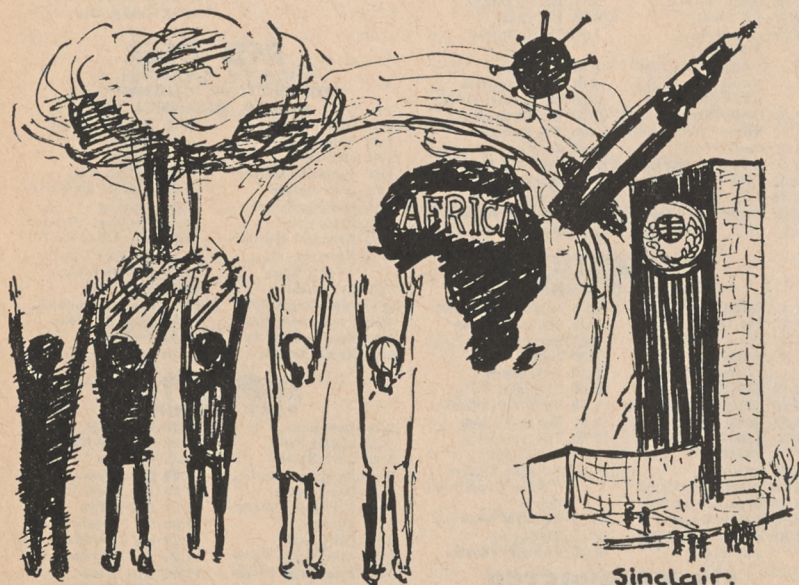

didn't use horses any more, and I asked him if I could take along my fiancée. He said no. Then I asked him could I take along my aunt to make me custard every Thursday. I like custard. Again he said no. And ever since then, here I am, nearly always alone in the trench here."

As the young soldiers struggle to grasp the meaning of a moral law which is forever beyond their comprehension, their conversation, and the remarks of the two parents and of a couple of corporals who later come on the scene are often hilarious, but underneath lurks a deep seriousness, an almost frightening tearing apart of some of the pretences of our social and political system, pointing up the futility of warfare.

Jeremy Wilkin will be seen as Zapo, the young soldier visited by his parents: Gillie Fenwick as Monsieur Tepan and Jane Mallett as Madame Tepan; Peter Brockington plays Zapo, the enemy soldier; and Art Lorne and Jonathan White are two corporals.

Fernando Arrabal insists that his writing is the expression of his personal dreams and emotions. His first volume of plays was published in Paris in 1958, and two of them, *The Automobile Graveyard* and *The Two Executioners*, were published in English last year by Grove Press. This year Grove published his first novel, *Baal Babylon*, translated by Richard Howard. The publisher describes it as "one of the most haunting and terrifying evocations of childhood since Joyce's *A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man*. Written according to a new principle of composition which might be likened to a new pointillist technique in painting, the novel is composed of a series of short

passages—litanies—each of which transcribes or evokes a highly charged emotional experience or sensory impression. From these juxtaposed litanies there emerges the devastating picture of a young boy raised in an environment of bigotry and hate. The child symbolizes the conflict of contemporary, middle-class Spain, where vestiges of the medieval still linger in everyday life."

Arrabal acknowledges a great respect for such literary heroes as Beckett, Kafka, St. Teresa of Avila, de Sade, and W. C. Fields. In all his writing Arrabal is preoccupied with the problem of goodness in modern society, and the close relationship between love and cruelty. There is violent death in all his plays. He questions ethical standards from the point of view of an innocent man or woman who wants to accept them but can't really understand their real meaning or practical application. In his characters' search for freedom, ridiculous but insistent, there is both comedy and stark truth in the displacement between what they pretend to be and what they really are, between what they say and what they signify.

"There is in his work an incredible hunger for hope, an appetite we do not find, for example, in Beckett, or find no longer," says critic Genevieve Serreau. "Yet Arrabal is certainly locked in the lion's cage. And he is afraid. And he acts like a child: when he is afraid (like Chaplin), he laughs, both to humour the ferocious creatures and to escape his own fear. This rather creaky laugh, which forces the audience to confront a weakness too evident to be disguised, gradually becomes conscious of its own power and effectiveness. At first, in fact, it is enough merely to laugh, in any way at all, for that laughter—faint at first, growing more confident—ultimately can become a formidable weapon."

Channel 6—CBWFT

A number of Christmas specials highlight the week's schedule on CBWFT, Channel 6. Readers will note also that several programs have been scheduled at new hours in order to accommodate these specials.

Saturday, Dec. 23

Replacing *Tribune libre* at 6:30 p.m. for one occasion is a special 30-minute recital of religious and popular Christmas songs titled "*Yoland Chante Noel*." It features basso Yoland Guérard with several choral groups from Quebec. This is a repeat performance of a program seen last year at Christmas.

Christmas Eve

At 3:00 p.m., CBWFT presents a conference titled "*Mystère de Noël*" (*The Christmas Mystery*) on the divine origins of Christmas and its too-often pagan celebration today. Guest is Reverend Father Congar, Jesuit priest and a renowned orator. Immediately following this, at 3:34 approximately is a story by Maureen O'Sullivan titled "*L'agneau de la crèche*," relating the birth of Christ. Before putting them to bed, a mother tells her children the tale of "*The Little Lamb of the Manger*." During a particularly dark and lonely night, three shepherds seek a lost lamb. A brilliant star suddenly illuminates the sky and guides them to a lonely manger where they find, with the lamb, a sleeping child . . . the newborn Jesus.

At 4:00, "*Télégramme perdu*" (or *Tchouk and Guek*) tells of the adventures of two brothers, sons of a geophysicist, who are invited by their father to join him for Christmas in a remote outpost in the Ural mountains. The pair set out for their holidays but realize on the way that they have not told their father of their coming, and worse, have lost the telegram telling them where to go. They are soon caught up in a series of extraordinary adventures.

Replacing "*Music-Hall*" at 8:30 is an opera by Gian Carlo Menotti titled "*Amahl et les visiteurs du soir*" in a production by Jacques Blouin. Guest star is mezzo-soprano Réjane Cardinal; choirs are under the direction of Marcel Laurencelle, and the orchestra is conducted by Roland Leduc.

At 9:30, "*Bethléhem en Provence*," a story by Yves Audouard, is a trans-

"IT'S A HAPPY accident," says J. Frank Willis, "that the last broadcast of *Matters of Record* falls on Christmas Eve, because Christmas is a special time for looking back, first to the Nativity, of course, but also back to the start of various Canadian Christmas traditions that we hold dear. One of the most popular of them is the custom of having gala broadcasts on and around the 25th, linking this huge country of ours in music, drama, song and greetings. And in this final program, which we call *Christmas Past*, Ronald Hambleton and I are taking a nostalgic look at some of these festive shows over the last quarter-century."

For the last 12 weeks, on *Matters of Record*, Willis who has been with the CBC right from its start, and

Hambleton, a Canadian writer who has contributed many plays and other features to CBC radio and TV, have been presenting recorded highlights from 25 years of CBC radio shows. They have offered extracts from important dramas, let us hear what sort of gags we used to laugh at, helped us live over some great occasions in Canadian and international history, and included liberal samplings from CBC music programs.

The highlight of the Commonwealth Broadcast on Christmas Day has long been the personal message spoken by the sovereign. *Christmas Past* includes a portion of the address King George V broadcast to

Perhaps the most unexpected sports story of 1961 was released from St. Louis last week. President Walter Wolfner of St. Louis Cardinals of NFL announced that head coach Pop Ivy had resigned his position with a year still to run on his contract. I talked to Ivy only a few hours after his resignation was made public. Here are some of the interesting comments he made when I asked him to set the record straight.

First of all, Pop made it clear that there was absolutely no pressure on him from club owners. "I want it to be known that no one was after me, nor was I under the gun." He said, "As a matter of fact, Mr. Wolfner offered to renew my contract for a longer period. He was always very fair and honest with me."

Then why, I asked, did you choose to leave such a good job at a time when everyone felt you were making headway? Ivy paused for a few

seconds and then gave his answer. "There comes a time in every job I suppose, when you feel your efforts have not been justified in your own mind. I worked hard for almost four years, and was not able to get the desired results from those efforts. I felt the time had come to step out, and give some other man a chance." In other words, Ivy was not in St. Louis just for the top money that went with his job. He was there for a purpose . . . to win . . . and he couldn't make it within his own set limit of time. I didn't hang on this question because he didn't seem to want to go into detail. A man has his reasons for doing things and Ivy felt he was making the right move.

After chatting for a few minutes on the NFL, Ivy began to talk

Program Notes

METROPOLITAN OPERA

Die Walkure

Music drama in three acts by Wagner. The Walkure are the offspring of the love of Wotan and Erda. They are the shield maidens of the god who lead the heroes to Walhalla to battle for the future power of the world. Wotan has ascertained from Erda that the gods will perish if Alberich again obtains the ring. Wotan cannot take the ring from the giants without breaking his word. He descends to earth and founds the family of Walsungs predestined to produce the hero who will accomplish his purpose.

Act I. Hunding's Hut. In the centre is a mighty ash around which the hut is built. Siegmund, weaponless and exhausted, staggers into the hut and sinks upon the hearth. Sieglinde, Hunding's wife, tends the stranger while her husband is absent and when he returns prepares the evening meal. Hunding asks the stranger's name, and he replies *Wehwalt*; he is a Walsung and is pursued because he has slain a man whose wife he had protected. Hunding recognizes him as his enemy but allows him refuge for the night. Sieglinde is much attracted to the stranger. She gives her husband a sleeping draught and returns to the hearth. She shows Siegmund a sword embedded in the mighty tree which a one-eyed wanderer (Wotan) had thrust there at her marriage feast. She tells him the sword will be the property of the man who succeeds in withdrawing it from its place. He succeeds in freeing it and Sieglinde recognizes in him the valient hero who can be no other than her brother. They rush into each other's arms and fly into the forest.

Act II. A Wild Region. Wotan calls upon his favourite Walkure, Brunnhilde, to protect the Walsung in the coming fight between Hunding and Siegmund. As protectress of marriage, Fricka asks for Siegmund's punishment for having joined in love with his sister Sieglinde. Wotan's protests and warnings are in vain; he must do as Fricka bids. He directs Brunnhilde to take the strength from Siegmund's sword and give the victory to Hunding. As Sieglinde, exhausted from the flight, sleeps, Brunnhilde announces his fate to Siegmund. He goes to fight Hunding. Brunnhilde disobeys Wotan and takes the part of Siegmund, but Wotan himself interferes to protect Hunding and the sword is split in two parts. Siegmund is slain by Hunding, but Sieglinde who is to bear a child is saved by Brunnhilde.

Act III. The Rock of the Walkuren. Brunnhilde brings Sieglinde and claims protection from the sisters, but nothing can save her from the anger of Wotan. After predicting the birth of a hero son to Sieglinde, Brunnhilde gives her the pieces of the shattered sword and sends her into the forest. Brunnhilde then awaits the god. He deprives her of her godhead and causes her to fall into a magic sleep. It is decreed by Wotan that she shall belong to him who shall find and awaken her. Moved by her pleading, Wotan summons Loge and causes flames to surround the peak of the mountain so that only a hero without fear can penetrate them and awaken her to a new life.

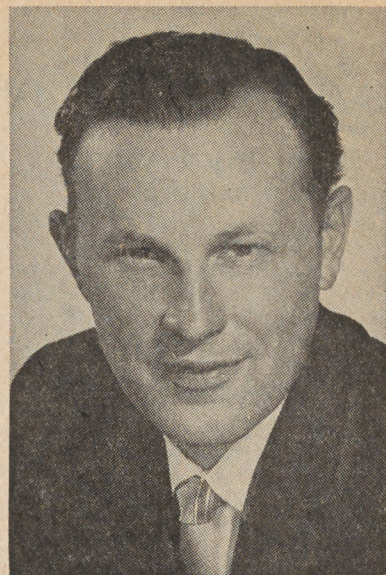

However, I still feel Sam will make it in the NFL, his arm is not gone, and he still calls a smart game. As a matter of fact, he's as smart as most of the quarterbacks I've seen. There are quite a few boys in Canadian ball that could make it in the NFL," he said. A good sound player will show up in the best of leagues. . . . Jackie Parker for in-

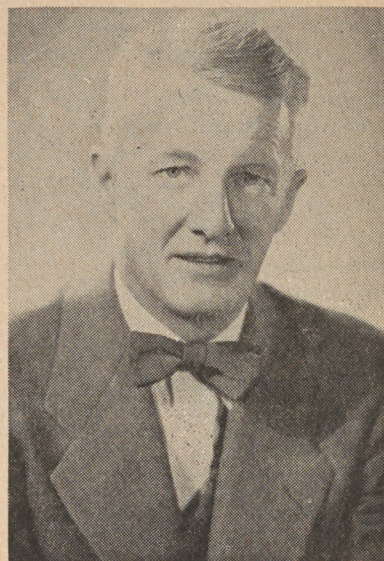

A. I haven't seen him play, but my staff scouted him for quite awhile . . . they feel he's an exceptional prospect. From their reports, this boy can do everything, and rates with Jackie Parker. As a matter of fact, coaches who know both players feel Wright is a bit better if you compare them as college

seniors. Wright has speed, he can pass, and could make the NFL on his defensive ability alone. I suppose only time will tell if he's in Parker's class or not . . . if he turns out half as good, he'll be a great one."

Q. Who will win the Eastern Division of the NFL?

A. The New York Giants have a good chance . . . they have balance and hustle, but the Eastern Division is hard to predict.

Pop Ivy was his usual casual self. He was quite confident of the future, he felt he did the right thing, and his conscience was clear. "Say hello to all my friends up there," he said, "and give my best to Eagle."

Commonwealth Broadcast From Canada This Year

THE CBC LINKS the diverse nations of the Commonwealth in a unique radio communion this Christmas. For the first time since the program was established by the BBC in 1932, the CBC is producing the annual Christmas Commonwealth Broadcast. Leaping oceans, seas, continents and islands, the program offers the Yuletide greetings of member nations within the Commonwealth to each other.

Following this broadcast on Christmas Day, Canadians from coast to coast will hear H.M. Queen Elizabeth II broadcast her own Christmas wishes to the Commonwealth. Canadian Prime Minister John Diefenbaker will also be heard following the Queen's broadcast. The President of the CBC, J. A. Ouimet, will broadcast his season's greetings on the French and English television networks of the CBC, and on the internal and Northern Messenger radio services.

The theme for the 1961 Commonwealth Broadcast is *The Gift of the Young*, a particular salute to the young people of the Commonwealth whose enthusiasm, strength and vision the world must look to for the future.

The broadcast, produced in Toronto by Keith MacMillan and organized by Dick Halhed, will include the voices of 24 young people from 16 Commonwealth nations, speaking of their interests, their aspirations, and offering their greetings at Christmas.

While the theme of the program is Youth, one of the oldest "voices" in the world will also be featured. The Talking Drums will be heard from Ghana and their message is by and directed to Youth: "The children of Ghana salute you all . . . the children of Ghana wish you all a merry Christmas and a happy new year. Almighty Creator that precedeth from time immemorial, give us peace and prosperity—long, long, long life . . . may we live to see many more years."

The 30-minute program will be heard in some 40 nations throughout the world by those countries'

own internal networks and by short wave radio. The CBC, and before it the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission, have contributed to all the previous programs.

Now a tradition among Commonwealth nations, these broadcasts were inaugurated when the Royal address given by the late King George V was preceded by exchanges of holiday greetings among Commonwealth nations.

The 1961 CBC broadcast will feature messages from points as far distant as Alert on Ellesmere Island, only 450 miles from the North Pole, to Vincent's Bay at Wilkes Base in Antarctica; from the slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanganyika, to, appropriately enough, Christmas Island in the Pacific Ocean—where in 1777 Captain James Cook spent Christmas Day.

Special music for the broadcast has been composed by Louis Applebaum, the CBC's music consultant, and will be heard bridging segments of the broadcast voices of contributing nations. Narrators for the program are John Drainie and Susan Fletcher.

Since Canada is producing and directing the broadcast this year, special emphasis is placed on the youth of this the Commonwealth's oldest independent member.

The first youthful voice to be heard from, and almost the last, is that of little Jane Goslin, an 8½-year-old resident of Brantford, Ontario, 65 miles from Toronto. Jane goes to a special school in Brantford, because she is blind. She tells of her hopes for the future, which she has said includes her wish "to try to get married to somebody . . . I don't know who yet." Jane will be heard singing the first solo at the start of the program in a choral and instrumental version of "The First Nowell."

Canadians to be heard from in the program, other than Jane Goslin, include John Edwards, youngest member of a four-man Canadian team at Alert, where there has been no sun since October 10; Ken Cavin, 21-year-old rancher from the Diamond C Ranch in southern Alberta; and Michel Dusseau, 18, a talented young pianist from Montreal.

A feature of the broadcast is the final, rousing choral version of "The First Nowell" in which a Canadian choir is joined by five others from the Commonwealth. The Canadian choir to be heard is the CBC Youth Choir, under the direction of Lloyd Bradshaw. It is joined by choirs in Jamaica, Nigeria, New Zealand, Malaya and the United Kingdom.

The broadcast opens with greetings from the four points of the compass—the Arctic, Antarctic, Africa and the Pacific. Then will be heard a montage of many of the voices and sounds of the program that follow. Ten-year-old Eta Baro from Rewa, Fiji, wishes a Merry Christmas in the Fijian language and tells of Christmases past; Melanie Rewegi, a young Maori girl and Lorraine Cameron, of Scottish ancestry, will speak from New Zealand; Dennis Doughty speaks from the Snowy Mountain Irrigation Scheme and 15-year-old Ross Martin on the Willario Sheep Station in New South Wales, bring greetings from Australia; Rose Nanang of Kuching, Sarawak, a nurse, wishes "Salamat ari Krismas" to the Commonwealth; Roshan Seth, a history student from India, and Ifitkhar Yaqoob and Reginald de Sousa, a Scout and Cub respectively, speak from Pakistan, offer their Christmas greetings; from Tanganyika, Alexander Nyirenda, and Doctors Valentine Eykuze and Sylvester Mdachi, who are combating children's diseases, will speak; the Talking Drums from Ghana offer greetings; Lance-Corporal Glyn Watkins, 22, and Sylvia Randall, 23, speak from Gibraltar; Rodney Webb, a recent graduate from the University of Toronto, now back in Trinidad, tells of the changes he sees for his country and the West Indies generally; English- and French-Canada is represented by Ken Cavin, Michel Dusseau, and Jane Goslin; from London airport, nine-year-old Nigel Stewart will tell how he flies back home to Bombay for his school holidays—and Christmas dinner this year; the program closes with the vicar of the Church of All Saints, in Old Buckenham, Norfolk, England, addressing his congregation. During the program itself, choirs, soloists and orchestras from England, Trinidad, Gibraltar, Ghana, Pakistan, India, Australia,

New Zealand, Christmas Island and Canada, will be heard.

his people, on the eve of the formation of the CBC, at Christmas 1935.

"In those early days," says Willis, "the CBC used its own facilities, sometimes, for electronic trick effects. They seem old hat to us now, but we've included a recording of one of them—when George Taggart organized a sing-song across Canada in which men and women in various centres joined in a round of *Three Blind Mice*."

Often a special part of the CBC's Christmas festivities has been the presentation of a children's classic, dramatized for radio. Willis includes an excerpt from a noteworthy Andrew Allan production of the Lewis Carroll classic, *Through the Looking-Glass*. There will also be an excerpt from *Santa Had a Black, Black Beard*, a play by Canadian writer-actress Claire Drainie. Another item on the program will be a germane speech from a special Christmas Day play by another Canadian writer, Fletcher Markle, called *Christmas Is a Promise*.

Markle wrote the scripts, and Andrew Allan produced them, for *Baker's Dozen*, the 1942 experimental drama series which gave rise to the popular *CBC Stage* series, still a Sunday night feature. For the last 15 years Markle has been a writer-director-producer for the CBS radio and TV networks. This year he is directing the news CBS comedy series *Father of the Bride*.

From the CBC's first Christmas on the air, Willis offers a French carol sung by a mixed chorus in Montreal, with a response in French by a children's choir in St. Boniface, Manitoba.

Montreal folk-singer Alan Mills will be heard giving his interpretation of a carol for children called *The Friendly Beasts*. And there will be an extract from a dramatization of Hans Christian Andersen's *The Snow Queen*.

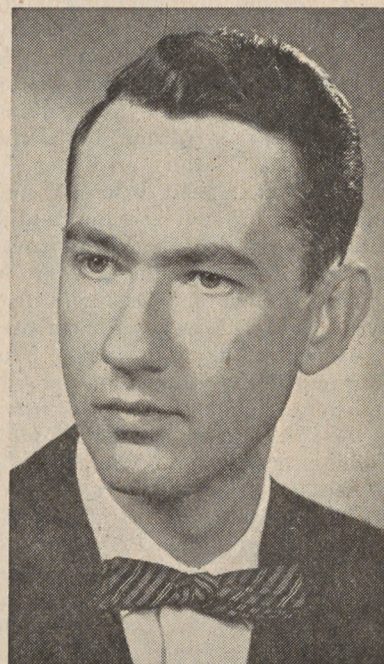

At 7:30-"*Le chemin de l'étoile*" will star Billy Beck, Louis Courtet, and Lucien Frigis in a play based on the novel by Alexandre Arnoux. Alone in Paris on the eve of Christmas, a foreign author meets a Negro singer and, together, they stumble across a lonely hostelry where they have been led by a mysterious force. A child has just been born, and the friendly strangers will re-live the miracle of Bethlehem.

At 9:30 p.m.: "Visiteur de Noel" is the story of a shoemaker, who has had a strange dream about meeting the Lord in his shop. Obsessed by his dream, he devotes his whole day to extra little attentions and charities towards his visitors, in the hope that Christ Himself will be among them. Somewhat disillusioned at the end of the day by the miracle that wasn't, the shoemaker picks up his Bible for his evening reading and stumbles on the verse that begins: "I was hungry and you have given Me bread . . ."

Although not a Christmas selection, the feature movie at 10:30, titled "*La maison du souvenir*" will put a cheery ending to CBWFT's Christmas Day programming with the story of the Ricordi house of Rome, editors and publishers of the music of some of the best-known and best-loved opera composers: Rossini, Donizetti, Verdi and Puccini.

CHEESE BALL

- 6 oz. *blue cheese*
- 10 oz. *cheddar cheese (spready)*
- 12 oz. *sandwich cream cheese*

Have all cheese at room temperature at least 24 hours. Cream all cheese together and add—

- 2 *tbsp. grated onion*
- A *few drops Worcestershire sauce*

Shape into ball. Line a coupe-shaped bowl with Saran, put in cheese ball, bring Saran up over cheese ball and fasten with elastic band. Refrigerate about 36 hours. Remove from refrigerator about 6 hours before using and roll in a mixture of—

- ½ *cup ground pecans*
- ¼ *cup chopped parsley*

Serve on cheese board with crackers. May be frozen to keep.

CRAB DIP

- 3 oz. *package cream cheese*
- ⅓ *cup mayonnaise*
- 2 *tbsp. catsup*
- 2 *chopped green onions*
- 1 *tbsp. chopped parsley*
- ½ *tsp. salt*
- ⅛ *tsp. pepper*
- 1 6-oz. *tin crab meat*

Drain and flake crab meat. Mix together cream cheese and mayonnaise. Add catsup to crab meat with green onions, parsley, salt and pepper. Combine cheese and crab mixtures. Beat until light and fluffy.

- 4½ oz. *can devilled ham*

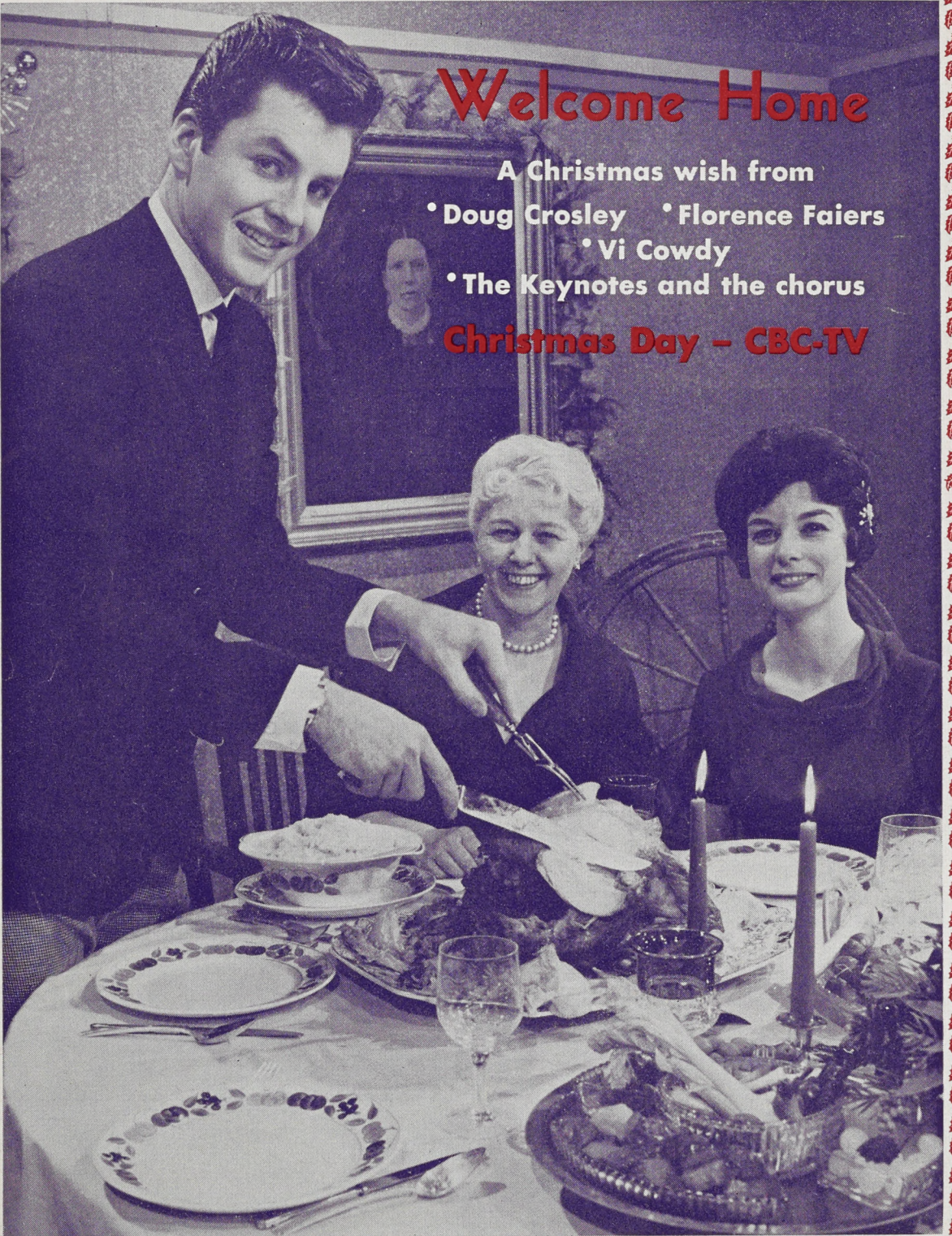
