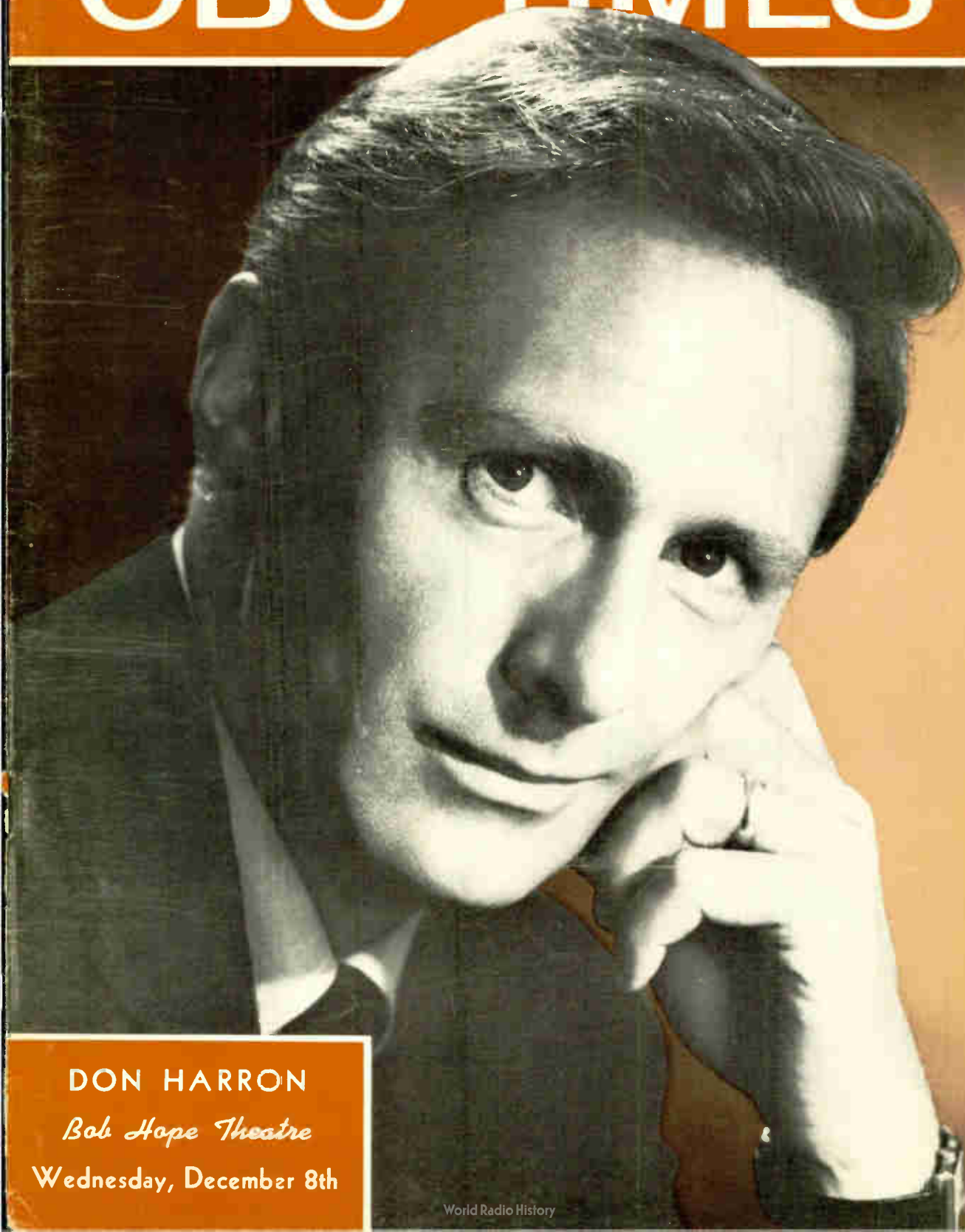

Assignment: Now fragmented into five-minute items is a poor substitute for the real thing—the 30-minute, several-times-week weekday eve program.

Venture: Unwisely scheduled now to compete with CBC tv's *This Hour Has Seven Days* on Sunday evenings.

University of the Air: The new *Best of Ideas* heard 10:30 p.m. weekly, is no real substitute for *University of the Air*. . . .

Critically Speaking: Now changed to something else (*The Arts This Week*, Sundays 10:03 a.m.) — is not as good as it was—and the best time is the former 4:00 p.m. (Alberta) Sunday afternoons. . . .

Pratley at the Movies: Flourished when it followed the excellent *Looking through the Papers* on Sundays just after noon-day.

Cross Country Check-up: Now often heard Sundays at 4:30 p.m. . . . is, to my mind . . . removable from CBC radio. Live open-liners, by their very nature, appeal to the very lonely and the very frustrated citizens. . . .

Court of Opinions: Long-time favorite with CBC radio enthusiasts should be put back on the weekday morning schedule as it was for so many successful years. . . . *Now I Ask You* deserves a better time for broadcasting too. These are marvellous spoken-word CBC radio programs. . . .

John MacLeod

WINNER for 1965 of the Cowhide Trophy, competed for annually by CBC farm broadcasters across Canada, is John MacLeod of CBR Calgary.

The trophy, fashioned of cowhide, was first put up for competition in 1951. Each CBC farm commentator submits a four-minute tape of an item prepared for a farm broadcast, and a panel of judges selects the best. MacLeod's item, heard on the Alberta Farm Broadcast, concerned the implications of the importing of Charolais cattle from France and the selection of breeders in Canada.

This is the second such award to John MacLeod. He was also the winner in 1962. A member of the CBC's farm broadcasts department since 1959, he began in Winnipeg and last year moved to Calgary with the establishment of CBR. Before joining the CBC, MacLeod was with the Canadian Wheat Board, and, prior to that, was a country elevator agent at Brunchild, Man. A native of Dauphin, Man., he studied for three years in the faculty of agriculture at the University of Manitoba.

John MacLeod is heard on CBR's daily farm broadcast and is seen regularly on CBC tv's *Country Calendar* (Sundays). He is also a regular contributor to prairie farm

broadcasts and *Country Magazine*, heard Mondays at 9:00 p.m. on CBC radio.

WILL MEDICAL science eventually reach the point of producing a "synthetic" man? What are democracy's chances in Southeast Asia? What are the prospects for re-unification of Germany?

These, and other interesting and important questions, will be dealt with in the 1966-67 series of programs produced by Intertel — the International Television Federation. The CBC, one of the Federation's five members, will contribute two programs — one about the implications of medical science's advances in controlling life, replacing organs and the possibility of eventually creating a more or less synthetic man. The subject of the second CBC production is yet to be decided.

Programs will also be produced for Intertel by the other four participants — the Australian Broadcasting Commission, Rediffusion of London, England, and National

Educational Television and Group W (Westinghouse Broadcasting Company) of the United States.

From Australia will come programs examining the political and economic complexities faced by Israel, its secularization of life, its refugee problem; and a look at the relationships between the different countries in Southeast Asia and the chances for democracy there.

A study of urban life in West Africa, where urbanization has been able to develop without many of the tensions that exist in East Africa; an investigation of split loyalties in Korea; and a look at the forces which unite and divide the Arab countries, will be the subjects of three programs produced by Rediffusion.

The U.S. members will produce a documentary report on the present and future of Germany — prospects for a re-unified Germany and future relationships with East and West; and a program examining the influences and relationships of India, Pakistan and Communist China following the war in Kashmir.

For the 26th Time:



'Met' Opera Returns to CBC Radio

Saturday afternoon broadcasts begin December 4th.

FOR THE PLEASURE of opera lovers across the country, CBC radio this month ushers in the 26th consecutive season of broadcasts direct from the Metropolitan Opera House in New York City.

The opening broadcast on Saturday, December 4th, at 2:00 p.m. will be a performance of Verdi's ever-popular *Il Trovatore*, with an all-star cast headed by soprano Gabriella Tucci, mezzo-soprano Biserka Cvejic, tenor Bruno Prevedi, baritone Robert Mer-

rill, and bass Bonaldo Giacciotti. The conductor will be Georges Pretre.

The second broadcast, on December 11th, will have special interest for CBC listeners, since Canada's internationally acclaimed dramatic tenor, Jon Vickers, will appear in the title role of Verdi's *Don Carlos*. The other principals will be Jerome Hines as King Philip II, Ettore Bastianini as Rodrigo, Martina Arroyo as Queen Elizabeth, Irene Dalis as Princess Eboli,

and Justino Diaz as The Grand Inquisitor. Thomas Schippers will conduct.

This will be the Metropolitan's last year in the old house at 39th Street and Broadway. The opera company is scheduled to move to its new home at Lincoln Center for the 1966-67 season. The current season began at the old house on September 27th with a performance of Gounod's *Faust*, the opera chosen to open the Metropolitan Opera on October 22nd, 1883.

The opera broadcasts will return with established features that have remained popular with listeners over the years. Once again "the voice of opera"—Milton Cross—will be at the microphone to set the scene for listeners, and narrate the story of the opera. Mr. Cross has never missed a Metropolitan Opera broadcast since they first went on the air.

Seven Days Presents Document:

BERYL FOX VISITS VIETNAM

*"The mills of the gods grind slowly—
and they grind woe" for the war-weary
people of Vietnam, says producer-director
Beryl Fox. In this article she sketches
background to her report.*

*THE MILLS OF THE GODS, seen Sunday,

IF YOU HAVE any kind of soul at all, Vietnam gets to you. The country itself is remarkably beautiful. The sun shines back at you from beneath the green of the rice paddies, the people smile with solid gold teeth from under their bamboo hats, the children are sassy and spontaneous, the young women are beautiful and graceful in their oudzai. Everything is petite, lush and fruitful. Puppies, babies, greenery—everything grows in abundance. It's difficult, as you fly over the sparkling beaches or walk along busy streets, to recall that this country is being wracked by a punishing, ugly, bitter war. A confusing war, where you can't tell the friendlies from the uglies until they shoot, and then you can't tell where they're shooting from. It's hide-and-go-seek with killing—a heartbreaking war, where old friends, cousins, brothers are drafted into opposing armies. One old couple who lived in Viet Cong territory saluted us as "most honored servants of the Americans." When we objected, they called us "brother," and told us this story. They had two sons. One joined the government army, the other was taken away one night by the Viet Cong. Their soldier son was killed in battle. His wife and children were forced to leave the village because the Americans bombed the rice paddies every day, and they had no food. Now the VC had mined all the roads. "We beg god and earth every day for peace. We wish to see our son and our grandchildren before we die."

The peasant is trapped between two god-like ideologies—each claiming to fight for his welfare. In this fight for the hearts and minds of the people of Vietnam, the communist Viet Cong use terror and assassination; the democratic forces use fragmentation bombs and napalm. Both sides deplore the fact that civilians live integrated with the enemy and therefore must die with them. No one deploras it as much as the peasant, who represents 85 per cent of the population and wants only to be left alone to bring in his rice crop.

First it was war against the French, then it was against each other. The toll of 25 years of war is heavy. Villages are run by women and old men. The country is full of young male amputees. Saigon is overrun with orphans. Children from the age of five live in the streets—begging, selling day-old newspapers, shining shoes, soliciting for prostitutes. They work the streets from six a.m. to midnight and sleep in parks, doorways, culverts, or the foul slit-trenches that criss-cross the shopping boulevards. They fight like game-cocks for a penny, steal when they can, and outsmart most GIs for their money. Municipal services have broken down and Saigon, once considered the Paris of the Orient, is now dirty, chaotic, and dangerous. Americans have learned to scramble off a stalled vehicle and to avoid bunching up at bus stops. Both have been targets for VC grenades.

The Vietnamese people are exhausted by war, but afraid to complain. One man said privately, "Is impossible to struggle, is only to wait," and refused to speak on camera. He led me to an English-speaking monk, Tich Quang Lien, who lives *(Please turn to page 11)*

MAJOR ROLES FOR BUDD KNAPP

THREE OF the major dramas on radio and television this week will star Budd Knapp (shown below), one of this country's most distinguished veteran performers, who has also successfully sampled the green pastures of radio, tv, stage and films in Britain and Hollywood, but who prefers his old stamping ground in Toronto and Montreal, and now spends most of his time in this country.

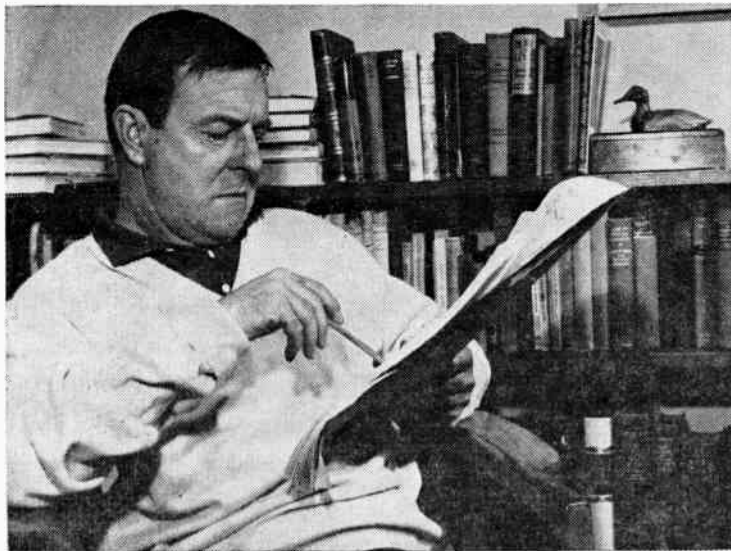
On radio Sunday, December 5th, at 1:00 p.m., Knapp co-stars with Barry Morse in a *CBC Stage* production of *A Dream Within Time*, an unusual play in blank verse by a Toronto psychiatrist, Dr. Ian Malcolm, whose avocation is writing plays that probe the psyche. This one reflects existentialist philosophy to some degree, and is concerned with the basis of most human conflict: frustration over the inability of one person to communicate with another. Malcolm presents Man as a faceless object manipulated by society, too unperceptive and unintelligent to resist the forces that are crushing his individualism. In *A Dream Within Time* he tells what can happen when a man is an independent and self-respecting thinker, but is unable to communicate his feelings. Barry Morse appears as The Man, with Budd Knapp as The Examiner, the first of several agents who visit him and are dealt with in a way completely new to them. The play will be directed by Esse W. Ljungh.

Ian Malcolm was born in the Lac St. Jean district of Quebec, studied medicine at the University of Toronto, and became a specialist in psychiatry.

On Monday night, December 6th, Budd Knapp will be seen on CBC tv's *Show of the Week*, playing a starring role in *The Powers of Darkness*, an eerie, gripping tale adapted by Joseph Schull from a short story by Canadian novelist Thomas Raddall. Production is by Mervyn Rosenzweig, with sets by Robert Lawson.

The play is set in the 1930s, in a part of the Nova Scotia backwoods where 150 years of poverty and isolation have bred a deeply rooted superstition and belief in witchcraft. The arrival of a stranger one cold and stormy night triggers an explosion of emotion that brings death and terror to the community and bewilderment to the young RCMP constable who is trying to get to the root of the situation. He finds that the step from handling drunks and parking tickets to dealing

The writer of CBC radio's *A MAN FROM WESTMINSTER* and *AS TIME GOES BY* has won a rare position as a top writer and actor in Canadian broadcasting.

IN THE JUNGLE warfare of showbusiness, you have to be tough as well as talented to survive. Alan King, on top of the heap as actor-writer for 30 years, is tough—but of fibre, not of attitude. He's a man of great warmth and charm who has sold 850-1,000 scripts for radio and tv, and has acted in hundreds of radio plays.

Recently, when we talked to people who have known and worked with him over a good many years in broadcasting, we found that long after they finished praising his fine craftsmanship, scholarship, artistic gifts and professionalism, they went on discussing his qualities of spirit, and the words "steadfast friend" kept recurring. Which confirmed what we had long suspected—that it is his fine sense of human values that sets him and his work apart in the sometimes cut-throat avenues of showbusiness.

King could have made a first-rate con-man. Not because he moves and thinks so swiftly and smoothly, but because he has the sort of face you'd trust with your last dollar. Usually his brown eyes look like a friendly spaniel's. But they can flash black and beady with impatience when he trips over someone who doesn't pull his weight around a studio. Producer J. Frank Willis, who has known him for 27 years, says: "Alan's a pretty nice, agreeable chap, but he has a very short temper with clowns who don't take their work seriously." But he is unusually generous-spirited with serious performers. Actor Barry Morse, with whom King collaborated for six seasons in the radio series *A Touch of Greasepaint*, says: "Alan's extraordinarily kind and free of all traces of pettiness. The first time I had a sizeable success in the U.S., in Shaw's *Man and Superman*, Alan and his wife made a long, inconvenient detour to go to Boston to share most generously in a friend's triumph. For a man who has been so successful for so long, he has an engaging modesty, a keen generosity about things new in the world. He's not sealed off by an awareness of his own importance."

While King's imagination has wings, he's about as unarty as the Harris tweed he wears, and he hasn't built up his career by sitting around night-spots *talking* about doing things, like a Chekhov character. He's a hard worker who keeps to a strict, nine-to-five schedule at his electric typewriter. He says: "When I found myself lying awake in bed sorting out dialogue and scenes for the next day's work, I said to myself: This won't do. I realized it was all a matter of discipline. Now after I stop work I don't think any more about the script until the following morning. But I never stop writing when the going is difficult,

in relative security from government reprisal. The monk welcomed me to his study, proudly brought out the Mountie doll and Canadian flag he had bought in Niagara Falls, and agreed to speak his mind about the war. As we left the monastery, two police cars arrived. The next day, the interview was cancelled.

So we flew to Hue, the ancient and proud cultural centre, where student groups traditionally protest for peace and civil reform. The students enthusiastically agreed to an interview. That week, three of their leaders were executed for communist activities. The students became unavailable.

But most of the people do not hate the American; they are astonished by his size and amused at his hairiness. There is not the resentment one might expect for the "bullets from the sky." Civilians wounded by American air-strikes go to the American run hospitals to be fixed up. Nor is there hatred for the Viet Cong, despite the grinding taxes and the heavy draft. There is, among the peasants, a feeling of enormous sorrow and resignation. There is no ideology at the rice roots level, only the sense that "the mills of the gods grind slowly, and they grind woe."

The Battle of Culloden

A reconstruction of the last battle fought on British soil:
on FESTIVAL, Wednesday, December 8th, at 9.30 p.m.

AFTER JAMES II died in exile at Saint-Germain, the Jacobites made four attempts to restore the House of Stuart to power in Britain during the lifetime of James' son, James Francis. They called him James III and VIII, but to the broad mass of the British at that time he was "The Old Pretender." The Jacobites' final bid, and the most agonizing of all, was made in 1745-46 under "The Young Pretender," James Francis' son, Prince Charles Edward—the Bonny Prince.

Charles landed in Scotland in June with only seven followers, confident that he could rally the Scots to his cause. In the High-

lands where the clans lived a feudal life and loyalty to the Stuarts was fierce, he was successful; but in the Lowlands, where the population was greatest, the people were apathetic. A whole generation had grown up under Hanoverian rule and had come to accept the idea of "Britain" resulting from the Act of Union of 1707.

Nevertheless, there was discontent among many Scots and Charles was able to defeat a Government force of about 3,000 troops at Prestonpans. Before September ended he claimed most of Scotland in the name of his father, "King James (Please turn to page 31)

She sings her prize-winning number, *Mon Pays*, written by the Montreal composer-singer Gilles Vigneault; and *L'Hiver* (also by Vigneault), *Tout mais pas ça* (words and music by Michel Conte) and *Try to Remember*, from the *Fantasticks*. The orchestra is conducted by Miss Leyrac's accompanist, André Gagnon. Produced by Franz Kraemer.

Act 1. The guard room in the castle of Luna. Ferrando, an old and trusted vassal of the count, orders the guards to keep watch while Di Luna wanders restlessly beneath the windows of Leonora, whom he loves. Luna's heart is torn with jealousy against his fortunate rival, the troubadour Manrico.

Ferrando narrates the history of the count to the guard. It appears that a gypsy of dreadful aspect had once exercised her magic arts upon the little brother of the count, making the child weak and ill, and for this had been burnt alive as a witch. Dying, she had commanded her gypsy daughter to avenge her, which vengeance had been partially accomplished by the carrying off of the child. Although no news had been heard of him, the father refused to believe in his son's death, and dying, commanded his other son, Count di Luna, to seek for the gypsy.

The scene changes to a garden in the palace of the princess. Leonora confesses her love for Manrico to her confidante, Inez. When they have gone, Count Luna hears the voice of his rival. Leonora in the darkness mistakes the count for her lover: then Manrico himself enters the garden, and she rushes into his arms. The count recognizes Manrico as his enemy, who has been condemned to death, and endeavors to compel him to fight. When they cross swords Leonora intervenes.

Act 2. Camp of the gypsies. Manrico at the bedside of his mother, Azucena, who is the daughter of the gypsy burnt by the count. She is old but still nurses her vengeance. The gypsies break camp while Azucena confesses to Manrico that after stealing him she had intended to burn the count's little son, but had thrown her own child into the flames instead. Manrico realizes that he is not Azucena's son, but loves her as if she was his mother, as she has always been faithful and loving to him. A messenger arrives and reports that Leonora, who believes Manrico dead, is about to take the veil. Manrico hastens to prevent this. Before the convent, Luna and his attendants attempt to abduct Leonora. Leonora and the nuns appear in procession, but Manrico prevents Luna from

carrying out his plans.

Act 3. At Luna's camp, Ferrando brings in the captured Azucena, and she is recognized by Luna and sentenced to be burnt.

The scene changes to a chamber in the castle which is besieged by Di Luna. Leonora and Manrico live only for each other. Ruiz, Manrico's comrade, reports that Azucena is to be executed, and Manrico goes to her aid.

Act 4. Before the dungeon, Leonora attempts to free Manrico, who has been captured by Luna. Leonora begs Luna for mercy and offers herself in place of her lover. She promises to give herself to the count but intends to poison herself before the marriage.

Scene changes to a dungeon in the prison, where Manrico attempts to soothe Azucena when her mind wanders, and at last the gypsy slumbers. Leonora comes to Manrico and tells him that he is saved. When he discovers she cannot come with him he will not leave his

prison. He believes Leonora to be a traitress, until he hears that she has taken poison to remain true to him. As she dies in agony, the Count enters and orders Manrico to be led away to execution. Azucena arises from her couch and when Luna, dragging her to a window, shows her the dying Manrico, she cries out: "He was your brother. Now are you avenged, mother?" Then she falls dead at his feet.

THE SOUNDS of clanking keys, boots on cobbles, shouted challenges and costumes of the Guard are almost unchanged in the Tower of London since the days of the Tudors.

PROJECT '66 tells the story of an organization working successfully to free political and religious prisoners. The program is heard Sunday at 10:30 p.m.

PETER BENENSON is a British lawyer in his mid-40s who was educated at Eton and Oxford, had a good practice in the Temple, London, and who came into an inheritance a few years ago that enabled him to give up the day-to-day business of the law courts. He might have been content to become a gentleman of leisure. Instead, he has devoted all his time and energy since 1961 to helping people he hardly knows, people deprived of their freedom by authorities afraid of views that conflict with those of the state.

Benenson founded, in 1961, an organization called Amnesty International to aid "prisoners of conscience." A prisoner of conscience is "any person who is physically restrained (by imprisonment or otherwise) from expressing any honestly held opinion which does not advocate violence." There are many such prisoners throughout the world and unless they are particularly famous — like Cardinal Mindszenty in Hungary or Garfield Todd in Rhodesia — their cases may pass unnoticed or, once heard, be quickly forgotten by the rest of the world.

Amnesty International came about after Benenson read a news item in the London *Times* about a couple of Portuguese students who had toasted "freedom" over a drink and were reported by an informer. For this indiscretion they were sentenced to seven years' imprisonment. Realizing that a formal protest to the Portuguese Embassy would have little or no effect, Benenson discussed the possibility of an agency to help such victims of tyranny with a member of the Society of Friends. Subsequently he published an article in the *Ob-*

server, entitled "The Forgotten Prisoners," and announced that he had opened an office to collect information on political prisoners and to publicize individual cases.

Benenson's appeal for help in the fight brought an immediate response from people everywhere when newspapers reprinted the article. Today there are Amnesty International groups in Australia, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, the United States, and West Germany. Membership varies from about three to 70 persons in these countries, drawn from all walks of life (though in every group there is at least one lawyer).

Supporters of the organization are kept in touch with developments in the cases they tackle by a weekly review published in English and French (*World Conscience*). The movement also publishes a quarterly journal (*Eustomy*), an annual report, and various booklets outlining its aims and ideals.

"The principal object of *Amnesty*," says its 1963-64 Annual Report, "is to mobilize public opinion in defence of those men and women who are imprisoned because their ideas are unacceptable to their governments. . . . The method by which the movement focuses attention on those imprisoned in violation of Articles 18 and 19 of the Universal Declaration, is that of 'adoption.' Members of the movement in different countries form themselves into Groups willing to adopt these 'Prisoners of Conscience,' one from the East, one from the West, and one from the Third World. The Group uses every endeavor to induce the govern-

VIII," and prepared to march to London, expecting to swell his ranks along the way. In London panic began to spread as the Highlanders occupied first Carlisle, then Penrith, Lancaster, and Preston. But still there was no great rallying of forces. Hoping to pick up additional forces at Manchester the chieftains sent on ahead a drummer boy and a drab, which tactic brought them only two or three hundred volunteers.

Most of the British Army was abroad in Flanders at this time, but was recalled as Charles' march progressed, while in London recruits were being offered a six-pound bonus to join the Guards. By the time Charles reached Derby, in December, his military advisors could see disaster awaiting if they continued and urged a withdrawal to Scotland. The Prince gave in and ordered the retreat.

Brilliantly managed by Lord George Murray, the retreat brought fresh victories to Charles as the Highlanders beat back their pursuers in rearguard actions. At Falkirk in January, 1746, the Scots

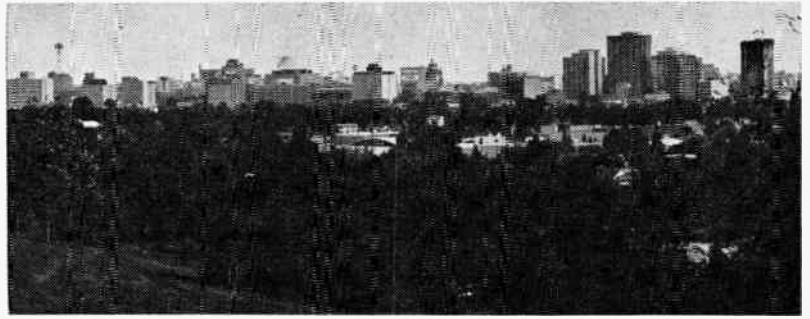

enjoyed their last major success over the Government forces. Three months later the uprising was ruthlessly suppressed at Drummoissie Muir, Culloden.

It was here that William Augustus, Duke of Cumberland, son of George II, earned the nick-name that was to stick for the rest of his life—"Butcher." At 22 he was a Major-General during the Battle of Dettingen, where he was wounded. Later he was appointed Captain-General and commanded the Allied army in Flanders, only narrowly missing a great victory over the French at the Battle of Fontenoy. Now, at the age of only 24, he was recalled home to head the Government forces and stave off the threat to his father's throne. Thus far his military career was honorable and unblemished, but when he consolidated his forces after Falkirk and went to meet the Scots on Culloden Moor he determined that no quarter would be given the Highlanders.

The episode of Bonny Prince

Charlie and his cause has been filtered down through time as a somewhat romantic incident in British history but the last stand at Culloden wasn't in the least romantic or glamorous. It was bloody and savage, particularly the aftermath when the Highlanders were mercilessly persecuted. Cumberland had the advantage of cannon and grapeshot and a two to one edge in numbers over the Scots.

The reconstruction of this battle that *Festival* viewers will see is completely authentic and was filmed on Culloden Moor with the participation of the local people. There are no professional actors in the cast and no dummy weapons in their hands. Peter Watkins, the producer, has attempted (with great success, most British critics felt) to recall this event as if the medium of television existed at that time, so that the spectator feels a sense of involvement in the action. *Culloden* is a BBC production, first televised in Britain last year.

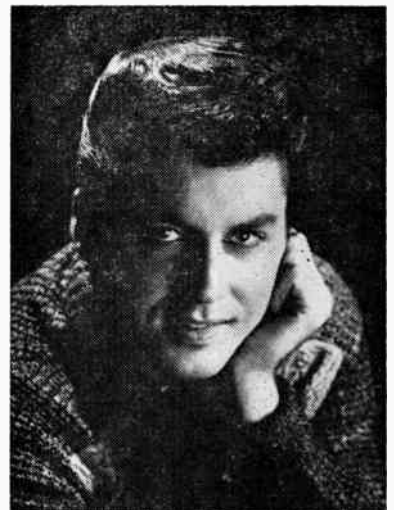

ence to Lanark County. The second program (on Monday, December 13th) will also include interviews with U.S. sociologist Saul Alinsky and an Italian priest, Fr. Borelli, who discuss the problem of poverty in their countries and what is being done to relieve the poor.

While the United States and Canada lead the world in material wealth and benefits, there are still millions who exist at the bare subsistence level. A report by the Ontario Federation of Labor, released last year, stated that more than 13 per cent of the population in Canada live in destitution (abject poverty) with another nine per cent living in poverty (subsistence level). A further 2,500,000 persons, claimed the report, lack the comforts or some of the necessities of life.

The subsistence level, according

to this report, is an income of about \$3,000 a year for a family of four, and \$1,500 for a single person. Families with incomes less than these figures can be said to be living in destitution. In rural areas, the report noted that 25 per cent of Canadian farm families in general and 27 per cent of Ontario farm families in particular are living in destitution, while 46 per cent across the country and 43 per cent in Ontario live in either poverty or destitution.

In Lanark County *The Sixties* visited a number of farm families who fall within the two categories referred to above. One father is attempting to support six people on an income of only \$1,500.

One of the most important aspects of the problem is how to get action on behalf of the poor and bring these people into the mainstream of Canada's prosperity. Lieutenant-Colonel Edward Lisle talks about the campaign he is heading to provide the community with a health unit and other services needed there.

These two editions of *The Sixties* are written and directed by freelance writer/director Ed Reid. Charles Lynch is the host for the series, which is produced in Ottawa by Cameron Graham. Christina McDougall is the program organizer.

ments involved to work for the release of these 'adopted' prisoners, and in the meantime works to improve conditions and to alleviate any financial distress among dependents."

In Canada, where the movement took hold in November, 1963, there are three Groups — two in Montreal and one in Toronto (at York University). Between them they have over a dozen members and have adopted a half-dozen prisoners. Some of the Canadian members will be heard talking about their work for *Amnesty* on a radio program prepared by Nan Dobson for *Project '66*. Miss Dobson also visited the headquarters of *Amnesty* in London, England, where she recorded a lengthy interview with founder Peter Benenson.

Next week, on December 10th, *Amnesty* members throughout the world will observe one of the most important days on their calendar — Human Rights Day. On that day the name of the symbolic 'Prisoner of the Year' is publicized by all members in all countries.

In the first three years of its work, *Amnesty* was instrumental in bringing about the release of many hundreds of prisoners, including each of those named 'Prisoner of the Year.'

BEFORE HE died last month, Edgard Varese the extraordinary French-born rebel composer who refused to submit himself to "sounds that have already been heard," and sought "music that explodes into space," recorded an introduction to a CBC radio program of some of his works. It will be heard on *CBC Tuesday Night*, December 7th, at 10:35. *Octandre*, *Density 21.5*, and *Integrales* will be performed by a CBC Vancouver Chamber Ensemble conducted by Victor Feldbrill.

Varese was always ahead of every new trend, but he was a painstaking worker — insisted that

"the first instrument is the wastebasket." For many years he was a leader in the field of electronic music, of, as he put it, "sound set free."

A stocky, vigorous person, even at nearly 80, with a determined, fighter's chin and an aureole of undisciplined grey hair, he lived in New York for almost 50 years, latterly in an old brownstone house in Greenwich Village, where his studio looked like a monster magician's lair, teeming with weird instruments, odds and ends of metal and string, and scores that resembled graphs of human heartbeats.

only when the next scene is easy. As for inspiration—I'm convinced it's something you have to induce. If you wait, it'll pass you by. I've found I can pretty well solve any writing problem by concentrating on it."

Morse tells us, "Alan can take almost anything that swims into his ken and put it into entertaining shape. He's not a narrow specialist. He casts his net widely, combining an extraordinarily compassionate sense of human values with a highly developed technical skill. And he's been a steadfast friend for 15 years."

King is a three-time transplant, and his accent has some soft, intriguing flavors because of it. He was born in the south of England, but spent nine years of his youth in China, mostly Shanghai, where his father was an importer. When the elder King offered to pay his way "to the colonies," he leaped at the chance, and chose Canada, picturing himself spending his days "on horseback in a smart riding outfit." He enrolled at the Ontario Agricultural College in Guelph, and found that he was required to spend three months as a hired man. His elegant dreams collapsed in a welter of milk pails, hoes and calluses, and a serious illness the following spring lost him his college year. But his months at OAC gave him his first taste of show-business. A rousing initiation song—in pajamas on the city hall steps—brought his entertaining ability to light, and gradually he was involved in dramatics. "The first time I drew applause," he recalls, "I was *sunk!* After leaving OAC I sold appliances door-to-door, and grabbed every chance I got to act with amateur groups. Meanwhile my parents had retired to Victoria, B.C., so when my last job folded I joined them for the next six years. I suppose mother got a bit fed up with my talk of the theatre, because one day she said to me: 'Now what do you *really* want to do?' I told her I wanted to be an actor. 'Yes, but seriously, Alan, what do you want to *do?*' she insisted!"

King says he served his real apprenticeship with the Victoria Little Theatre and the operatic society there. Then he decided that if he were to make any headway towards becoming a professional actor, he'd better go where there *was* professional theatre, so he headed for Britain, paying his way as far as Toronto by guarding a group of Chinese laborers being taken across the country in bond. He planned to stay in Toronto only long enough to earn the cost of his passage overseas. He got a job as a dictaphone operator for a firm of court reporters, and developed an interest in the law that

he later shared with CBC audiences in many fine scripts on legal topics, including the three-season tv series, *A Case for the Court*.

He also applied to the CBC for an audition. "Edgar Stone was the producer who auditioned me," he recalls. "I pretended to have had radio experience, but made the mistake of walking up to the dead side of a 44 mike, and gave myself away. Stone was very kind, and gave me a part in a play, which led to more, so I gave up my idea of going to England."

King met his charming wife, Donna (Dick) in a CBC studio. They were married in 1939. "Two years later," he says, "I decided to risk freelancing as an actor. Then, in 1942, when we were having trouble paying the rent, someone suggested I write a radio script, and Dick said: 'Go ahead, I know you can do it.' So I did, it sold, and I just kept on writing. Every time things looked difficult and I was tempted to take a secure job, Dick held out for freelancing. She has always been the most tremendous support to me, and a good critic of my work. When you have someone who believes in you, you can't go far wrong."

The Kings travel whenever they can, especially to get away from ragweed, with which Alan does not see eye to eye. They've had several delightful freighter trips to Ireland. The first time, as the ship drew in to Cork harbor, a friend of Alan's from the Abbey Theatre shouted with glee from the wharf: "Alan, me boyo, they're doing your play on Radio Eireann. How'd you like to narrate it?"—a happy introduction to a country of which King has grown very fond. Sometimes he combines travel with research. Two years ago, when the Kings were in England, he did considerable delving into the history of the House of Commons for his current radio series, *A Man at Westminster* (Saturday, 9:30 p.m.). Now he's up to the ears in nostalgia, as editor-in-chief of the new radio series *As Time Goes By*, which offers memorable moments recorded in the great decades of radio (Mondays, 8:00 p.m.).

with rural hexes is a long one. Even old Doc Jarvis, who has been practicing there for years, and is rarely surprised by anything any more, admits that it's a tough and confusing case.

Thomas Raddall knows the Nova Scotian outposts intimately. Just after the First World War he served as a wireless operator for the Marconi Company at stations along the coast and on Sable Island. Then, in 1923, after taking a course in accounting, he became a bookkeeper in a small pulp mill on the Mersey River in Nova Scotia, where he got to know lumberjacks, river drivers, mill hands, hunters, trappers, Indians and others far from the outside world who accepted as normal many strange events which, to most city-

bred newcomers, seemed too far-fetched to be believed. But Raddall's creative instinct and vivid imagination thrived in this atmosphere, and he soon realized how easily superstition could take over from logic in a condition of intense isolation and poverty. He began to weave the characters and situations he encountered there into stories, which appeared in the periodical *Blackwoods* and were highly acclaimed by such distinguished writers as Rudyard Kipling and John Buchan. By 1938 Raddall had decided to become a full-time author, and has since piled success on success with his novels and stories.

Joseph Schull, who has adapted some of them for the CBC, is the author of a new biography of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, published in October by Macmillans.

In *The Powers of Darkness* Budd Knapp plays Dr. Jarvis. Others in the cast are Colin Fox, Chris Wiggins, Norman Welsh, Henry Ramer, Aileen Seaton, John Davies, Toby Weinberg, Eric Clavering, and Adam Ludwig.

On Wednesday night, December 8th, at 8:30 p.m., Budd Knapp stars with Donald Harron and Helen Conway-Marmo in *The Betrayal*, adapted by Alvin Goldman from the novel by Henry Kreisel. Production is by Paul Almond. This is the first of several CBC-produced dramas to be seen on *Bob Hope Theatre* this season.

The play is set in Edmonton, where Henry Kreisel is head of the English department at the University of Alberta. His theme, which he presents in a style decidedly reminiscent of Conrad, whom he greatly admires and has studied thoroughly, is that even the most independent, free-thinking and suspicious of us must needs live by trust and hope, and that leaves us wide open to betrayal, by others and by ourselves. The time is 1952, but the story harks back to Austria just after the Anschluss, when Nazi persecution of the Jews began. To escape an imminent roundup of Jews, Theodore Stappler had placed his own and his mother's lives in the hands of a fellow-

countryman, Joseph Held, who promised to see them to safety, but who betrayed their group to the Germans to save his own family. Stappler escapes, and although he has time to warn his mother and get her away, he is too full of fear to take the risk, and she is arrested and later dies.

Stappler spends years trying to track down Held and eventually discovers and confronts him in Edmonton, where he is living with his daughter, a young college student. Consumed with the need for vengeance, Stappler decides to punish Held obliquely. In a way he won't anticipate. As the theme of guilt and betrayal is examined, the story looks into the darkness of man's heart at the horror of evil that undermines good intentions, and at the deep-seated power of good that can turn vindictive beasts into men of good will. Knapp appears as Held, with Donald Harron as Stappler, and Miss Conway-Marmo as Katherine Held.

Henry Kreisel knows the Austrian situation he writes about at first hand. He was born in Vienna in 1923. After the Anschluss, relatives helped him flee to England, where he worked for two years as a laborer in a Yorkshire clothing factory, discovered Shakespeare, and developed a great admiration for the English language. During the Second World War he was interned as an enemy alien, and was moved to a camp in Quebec, until it was decided to find sponsors for young internees whose education had been interrupted by the war. The plan enabled him to enter the University of Toronto and to acquire a master's degree in English in 1946. The following year he joined the staff of the University of Alberta.

Alvin Goldman, who adapted *The Betrayal*, is a Montreal writer who has prepared a great many adaptations for CBC tv's *Festival*, including *The Magician of Lublin*, *The Private Memoirs and Confessions of a Justified Sinner*, and *The Endless Echo*, and he has written a four-part series, *The Firing Squad*, based on books by Colin McDougall, for CBC tv's *The Serial*.

What it's Like to be a

15-YEAR-OLD TV STAR

Maybe the break from school-work routine would be appealing to most youngsters, but it's a strenuous life for RAZZLE DAZZLE'S new hostess. She agrees she has fun, though.

IT WAS just three days after her 15th birthday (October 15th) that petite, blue-eyed Trudy Young began her first full season as co-host, with Ray Bellew, of CBC tv's *Razzle Dazzle*, the popular show for young people seen Monday to Friday at 4:30 p.m.

Trudy, a Grade 10 student at Toronto's Alderwood Collegiate, first appeared on CBC television in 1963, after her dancing teacher, Gladys Forrester, recommended her to the producer of *Time of Your Life*. She became a regular on that show for a season and played the leading role in one of its dramatic productions, *Mystery at Loon Lake Lodge*.

Trudy first joined the *Razzle Dazzle* gang in the fall of 1964, becoming a regular on the show after Christmas. In order to keep up her school work, she maintains a fairly strict week-day schedule. "I don't mind, though," she says. "I always have the weekend free to spend with my family and friends or go to the country."

Trudy attends school classes for three periods in the morning, then goes to CBC Toronto's television Studio 2 for rehearsal of *Razzle Dazzle*. There are three run-throughs before the audience arrives for the 4:30 show. Learning scripts comes easily to her—"except for commercial cues"—and she enjoys working with Ray

Bellew, whom she describes as "a real ham, but nice."

Shows usually run smoothly, but Trudy remembers the time someone brought a live lobster into the studio and everybody broke up. "Every time we tried to say something, we'd burst out laughing. People who weren't in the studio must have thought we were crazy."

In her free time, Trudy enjoys horseback riding, and last summer she took up water skiing. One of her favorite books is *Anne of Green Gables*; in music she likes the modern sounds, especially the Beatles.

Trudy's ambition is to be an actress—she played in summer stock at Vineland, Ont., last summer—and is also interested in fashion modelling. This season, she'll also be seen in *The Forest Rangers* on CBC tv.

Trudy has a brother, 18, and a sister, 12 years old, but so far she's the only one in the family with showbusiness ambitions. Summing up her attitude towards her *Razzle Dazzle* work, she says she feels it is important to keep the program "on a level kids can understand. And I think if they know we're enjoying ourselves, they will too."
