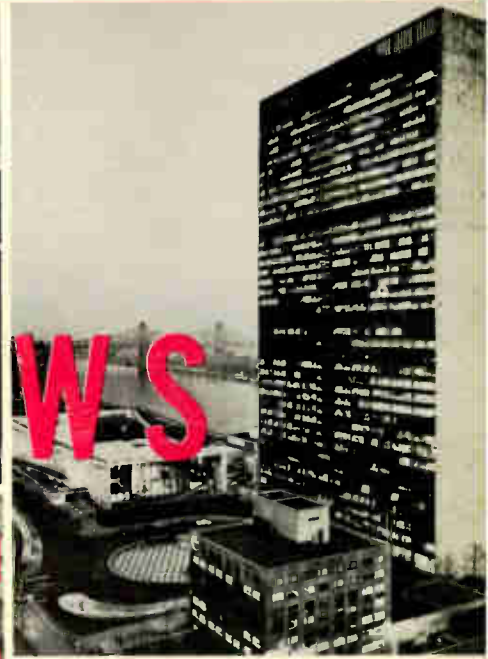
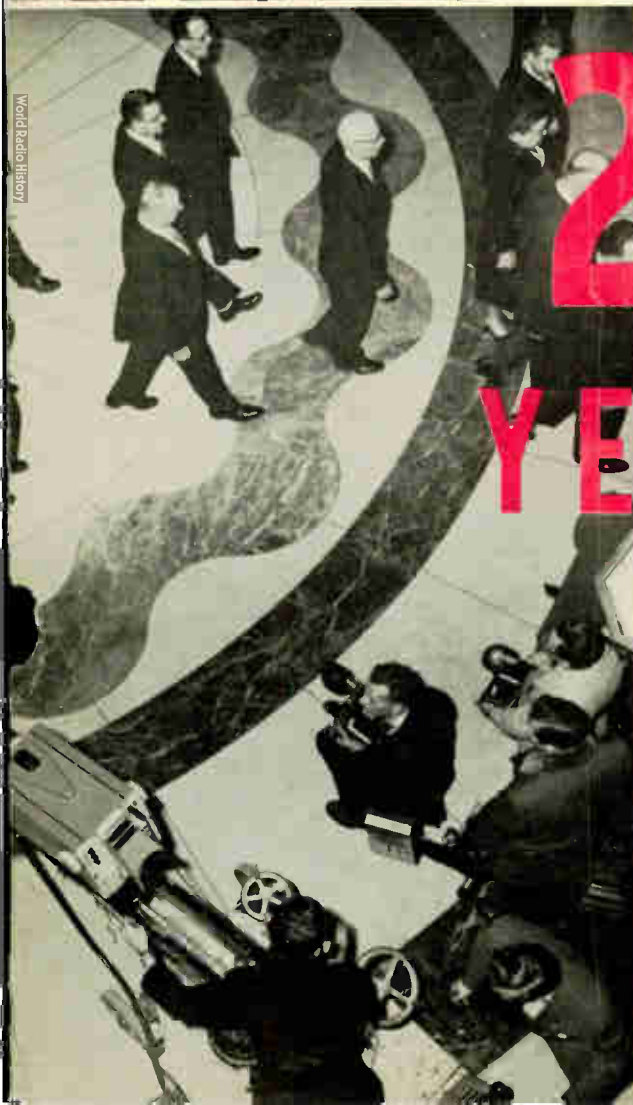

Festival

• I was deeply moved last night at your poignant portrayal of *Culloden* (Festival, CBC-tv, December 8th). My own ancestors of that date died there fighting for the Stuart cause, belonging to the Stewart and MacPherson clans. There were two points in the film I did not agree with. Most Highland, in fact most Celtic peoples have very curly hair, usually dark, sometimes a rich auburn. The children as a rule have very fair curls. In that damp climate it forms into tight rings close to the head. I think the horrible elf-locks depicted were wrong. Even uncared for curly hair forms a pleasant frame for the face. The second wrong impression I got was of the illiteracy of the crofters which was not 100 per cent so. The small village school was a fixture in Scottish villages even during the unhappy rule of Mary, Queen of Scots. The curriculum was simple, the Three R's, sometimes a bit of Latin was added, especially if the Parish clergymen supervised the classes. Those same unhappy refugees were able to write little letters back to wherever their kin found security, in France or Holland. Ah, well, Scotland's loss was the Empire's gain . . .

Not Worthy of Nova Scotia

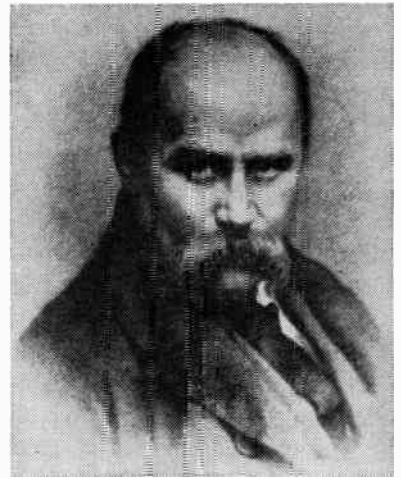

The World Of Taras Shevchenko

The Ukrainian poet is honored in a special broadcast on CBC radio Wednesday.



UKRAINIANS love and honor Taras Shevchenko as their own great national poet just as the Scots honor Robert Burns, not merely as a poet but as a spokesman for freedom-loving people everywhere in the world.

To mark the approach of the Ukrainian Christmas (January 7th), CBC radio's *Regional Features* Wednesday, January 5th at 8:00 p.m. will carry a program of Ukrainian music, including some of Shevchenko's songs. The Ukrainian Male Chorus of Winnipeg, directed by Walter Bohonos, and the Ted Komar orchestra will perform, interspersed with biographical material on Shevchenko written by

Jack Hutchinson. Dan Wood is the producer.

Ironically (Shevchenko's life was filled with bitter ironies) the Ukrainian poet of freedom was born a serf in the tiny Ukrainian village of Morinty on February 25th (March 9th by the Julian calendar), 1814, and had little personal experience of freedom during his lifetime. When he died at 47, he had been a serf for the first 24 years of his life, a Russian soldier in a disciplinary battalion in Central Asia for ten years, and under close police surveillance for another four years; and even his nine years as a free man were severely circumscribed by the op-

pressive political and social conditions of mid-19th century Russia.

But Shevchenko's poetry speaks constantly of freedom, especially for the freedom of his native Ukraine from Russian domination, which had brought with it to Ukraine the degrading institution of serfdom. Another irony: the poet died in 1861, the very year that serfdom was finally abolished throughout the Russian empire.

It is also ironic that the man honored as the great Ukrainian national poet had remarkably little formal education, and that his freedom was bought for him by a group of Russian artists who saw

CBC Tuesday Night:

A Portrait Of Bruno Walter

*A tribute to the late conductor, pianist
and writer is heard January 4th on CBC radio.*

THE WORLD LOST one of its supreme musical interpreters on February 17th, 1962, when Bruno Walter died in California at the age of 85.

As a memorial to the great conductor, *CBC Tuesday Night* presents a two-hour documentary entitled *A Portrait of Bruno Walter*, January 4th, 8:05 to 10:00 p.m. on the CBC radio network. Produced by Robert Chesterman of CBC Vancouver, the program was first presented on the CBC-FM series, *Encore*, in October, 1965.

During the last four years of his life, Dr. Walter directed

the series of recordings with the Columbia Symphony Orchestra which today represent his final legacy. These recordings, made in Hollywood between 1958 and 1961, were supervised by John McClure of Columbia Records, New York City, and it was with the special co-operation of that company that the CBC documentary was made.

Taking part in *A Portrait of Bruno Walter* are: John McClure; Neville Cardus, the distinguished music critic of the *Manchester Guardian*; and Madame Lotte Lehmann, the famous singer and a close friend of Dr. Walter. Also



heard is Bruno Walter himself, recorded in conversation with Albert Goldberg, music correspondent for the *Los Angeles Times*. This interview was originally recorded by CBC television in the summer of 1958 at the conductor's California home.

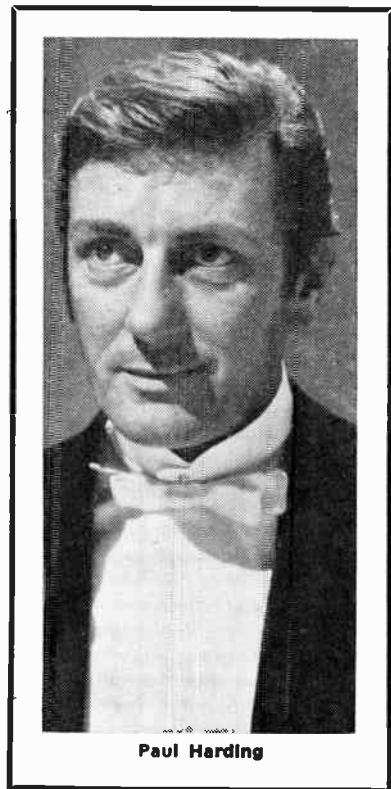
ONCE ANDRE GIDE said of Oscar Wilde: "People do not realize how much truth, wisdom and seriousness are concealed beneath the mask of a jester." And on Wednesday night, January 5th, CBC tv viewers will see what he meant, when *Festival* presents one of Wilde's wittiest, most polished comedies, *An Ideal Husband*. Beneath the fluff and melodramatic situations in elegant salons, with epigrams so swift that the gaslight flickers, there is a core of realism as solid as any "kitchen sink" drama. Production and direction are by Mario Prizek. The play stars Leo Ciceri as Lord Goring, a society dandy, and Paul Harding as his friend, Sir Robert Chiltern, the "ideal" husband, with Moya Fenwick, Hilary Vernon, Susan Clark and Gillie Fenwick.

Prizek says, "*An Ideal Husband* is peculiarly contemporary, from a moral view. It's about a man in a public position, admirable in all his dealings, who in his past has committed a fraudulent act because he felt that the end — which put him in a position to do enormous good — justified the means, and who is threatened with blackmail. In desperation he seeks the advice of his loyal friend, Lord Goring, who was once engaged to the blackmailer, and who holds a trump card. It's an ironic study of appearance versus reality. They all wear masks — Chiltern's put upon him by both his ambition and his love for his wife. He's a bit square, so it was necessary to play up all his warm, human qualities, and this Paul Harding does well."

Harding was last seen on TV opposite Frances Hyland in a *Festival* production of *Silent Night. Lonely Night*, in which he gave a sensitive, restrained performance as a lonely man on Christmas Eve. He's tall and lean, with a casual, well-tailored look, and a deep, pleasantly timbred voice with a mid-Atlantic accent that allows him to play a much wider range of characters than most British-educated performers can. He has a serious, penetrating expression that can look sad and thoughtful when his face is in repose — he brings to mind Rembrandt's *Man in Armour* — but his smile, which is mostly in his eyes, suggests a lively sense of humor and curiosity about the world around him, and a highly tuned awareness of the fleeting nuances of mood and tempo which are an actor's best props. Frances Hyland, who has worked with him on two CBC tv productions, and knew him in England, sums him up pretty well when she describes him as "a most amusing man and a real gentleman."

Harding paints (his impressions of African tribesmen were exhibited at the Royal Institute in London) and he's a voracious reader — devours books "almost as fast as Gillie Fenwick, and that's going some" — particularly those about colonial history. He has a quick intelligence and expresses himself easily and modestly. He says, "I prefer playing historical characters, and feel happier in costume, as I think most English actors do. I've always wanted to play Sidney Carton in *A Tale of Two Cities*, and — don't laugh — I would like very much to play a bad man in a Western." Another thing he wants to do is perform in French. He thinks all actors should learn French — he's starting lessons this month.

THE GREAT CASA LOMA PURCHASE

Writer Leslie McFarlane has written another comedy that demonstrates his close attention to the Canadian scene. It is featured Monday, January 3rd at 9:00 p.m. on SHOW OF THE WEEK

ONE OF Canada's most prolific writers is represented on CBC television this week in two major productions — the third episode of the six-part *McGonigle Skates Again on The Serial*, and the comedy *The Great Casa Loma Purchase on Show of the Week*. It would be difficult to give an accurate figure for the number of television plays Leslie McFarlane has written. By the time a count is made, Mr. McFarlane usually has rendered it obsolete with the creation of several new plays. It's safe only to say that he has written scores of comedies and dramas that have been included on almost all CBC series — *Playdate*, *Festival*, *Eye Opener*, and others.

The Great Casa Loma Purchase stars Hugh Webster, Jack Creley, Franz Russell, Deborah Turnbull, Diane Buchan, and Sally Jones, in a tale about some Bunco artists who finally get their comeuppance in a rather ironic way. There's a deal cooking to sell Toronto's famous Casa Loma and erect a new apartment hotel in its place, but some Toronto ladies who call themselves the Friends of Casa Loma want to save the castle, so they offer to buy up the option. In the meanwhile an unassuming little ex-bank-clerk, visiting Casa Loma on a guided tour, finds a wallet with a letter outlining the deal. In gratitude for returning the wallet and keeping quiet about his plans, the New York wheeler-dealer arranging the purchase (Jack Creley) offers to cut in the bank-clerk (Hugh Webster). A con-job, you might say. But who is conning whom?

McFarlane's long history of writing goes back over 40 years to when he was a young reporter on the Cobalt *Nugget* at the age of 17. As a reporter he worked in both Canada and the United States for several years until his fiction began to sell and he was able to free-lance. Under a variety of pseudonyms he has published over 30 books for children, including the first 20 volumes in the Hardy Boys series. In the '30s he turned out more than two dozen radio plays for the *Canadian Theatre of the Air*, and in the war years worked for the Department of Munitions and Supply, later transferring to the National Film Board of Canada, where he spent 14 years as a writer, producer, and director.

With the arrival of television in Canada he joined CBC as a story editor until 1960, when he decided to free-lance again.

At an age when many men are thinking about retirement, McFarlane is as busy as ever and looks like he will stay that way for a long time to come. Part of his success as a

The Guinea Pigs' Reunion

THEY CALL themselves members of the world's most exclusive club, for the price of admission is too high for most people. It's a club to which several hundred servicemen, mostly airmen, from all parts of the Commonwealth belong. Canada has about 170 members. They have their own emblem (a rodent with wings), their own anthem (largely unprintable), and their own pub near the place where the Guinea Pigs formed their association.

That place was the Queen Victoria Hospital at East Grinstead, Sussex, England, where severe burn-cases were sent for treatment by plastic surgeons, who included the late Sir Archibald McIndoe of New Zealand and Dr. Ross Tilley of Canada. In his book *The Last Enemy*, Richard Hillary, a Battle of Britain pilot, described in detail what it was like to be a "Guinea Pig," a patient undergoing dozens of agonizing operations to reconstruct faces and hands either totally or partially destroyed by fire. In those days, the early war years, surgeons were being confronted with a new type of war-wound that was both physical and psychological, and there were few, if any precedents for it. Aircrew trapped inside a blazing aircraft were being transformed, in less than two minutes in some cases, from normal young men into disabled and often unrecognizable persons. The process of rebuilding faces, breaking and re-setting fused-together fingers, to enable them to do simple tasks, and putting together again the bits and pieces of a shattered psyche was long and frustrating for patient and doctor alike. Skin-grafts, after many careful operations, often failed to take, necessitating yet another operation, until, as Hillary wrote, they began to feel like rodents in a series of experiments.

What saved the Guinea Pigs from permanent disability and shrinking from normal activities was their tremendous sense of humor and their irreverent attitude toward life in general. The chief Guinea Pig, Group Captain Tom Cleave, describes on *Telescope* this week how the Guinea Pig club came about. They have an annual reunion in England, usually over a weekend, which was attended this year by director George Ronald and the *Telescope* crew, who went along with Dr. Ross Tilley and Dr. Norman Parks. Tilley headed the Canadian Wing at the Queen Victoria Hospital as chief surgeon and Parks was the anaesthetist.

It was the first reunion the Canadian doctors had been to since the end of the war. As Dr. Tilley explained in an after-dinner speech, the tradition is difficult to maintain in Canada where Canadian Guinea Pigs are scattered over great distances.

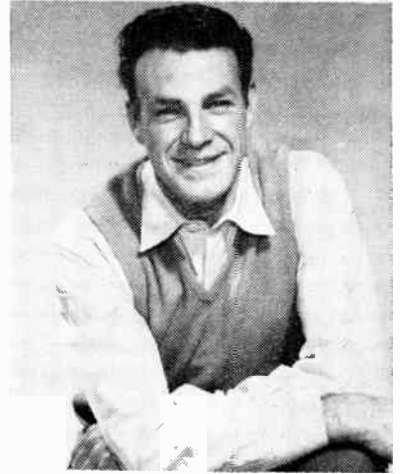

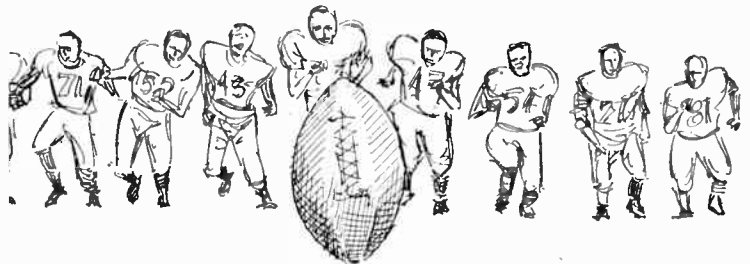

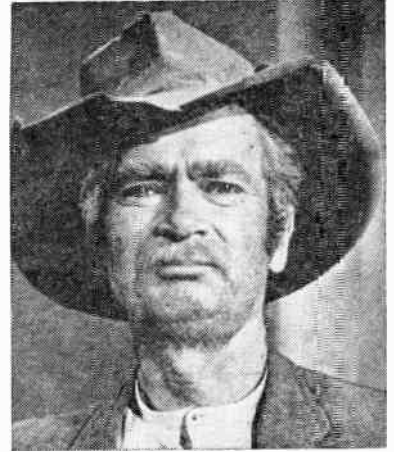

CBC News Service:

25th ANNIVERSARY

ON JANUARY 1st, 1966—the occasion of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the CBC News Service—there will be a special two-hour program on CBC radio, dealing with the top news stories in Canada and abroad during the past year and anticipating future possibilities arising from the year's developments.

Entitled *The Year '65*, the program will be presented in two parts. Part I will review Canadian events in the news in 1965, and will have Tom Leach as host-reporter and John O'Leary as announcer. The producer of the program, Angus McLellan, also plans to include year-end interviews with provincial premiers, or their deputies, provided by CBC newsrooms across the country. Part II will concern itself with the year's international news highlights and will have Norman DePoe as host-re-

porter and Bruce Rogers as announcer. Listeners will hear from CBC news correspondents Tom Gould, Stanley Burke, Michael MacLear, Ron La Plante, Phil Calder, David Levy, Knowlton Nash, James M. Minifie, and Peter Reilly.

On January 3rd, 8:00 to 9:00 p.m., the radio series, *As Time Goes By*, with host J. Frank Willis, will salute the 25th anniversary of the CBC News Service with a program that goes back to the inauguration of the Service and recaptures its early days. CBC News announcers during World War II included Earl Cameron, Marcel Oimet, and Lorne Greene, all of whom will be heard on the program, reminiscing about their experiences.

It was on January 1st, 1941, that the CBC National News Service (Please turn to page 33)

Mostly, he says, he has been cast as "ordinary, rather nice men," such as in *An Ideal Husband*, and "in England was stuck in semi-romantic things," but in the next few weeks CBC tv viewers will see him in two strikingly different roles. On January 26th, in a Peter Boret-ski production of Albert Camus' *The Just*, Harding plays a sinister chief of police, which he hopes will open up new avenues for him. And on February 2nd he plays a bumbling ad agency man in Eric Till's production of Marc Brandel's *Ashes to Ashes*, an off-beat comedy thriller. Till describes Harding's performance in this as "very funny. He's a type of actor we don't have too many of around here."

Harding says "In my three years in Toronto I've learned so much, especially from directors such as Eric Till and Ron Weyman, and from the camera people, who are so much more approachable and willing to help the performer than in Britain. When I'm in New York or Britain I hear a great many people say that some of the best television drama in the world is being done in Toronto, and actors tell me they envy me my chance to perform here."

He says he feels a great obligation to his audience, and believes that a one-occasion tv performance should be as good as a stage performance after a show has been running for three months. That's a challenge not always possible to meet in the rush of tv production, but the fact that he aims for it emphasizes the maturity of this sensitive performer who, after many years in greasepaint, realizes that he still has much to learn about his ancient profession, and that its real purpose is to make playwright, actor and audience one. Few achieve this consistently, but the experience gained is the reward of trying.—*June Graham.*

people. The marriage contract is signed and the guests drink a toast to the young couple. The Bonze, a religious fanatic and uncle of Butterfly, comes in and utters imprecations against her for renouncing her faith. He induces her relatives to abandon her. Pinkerton, annoyed, hurries off the angry guests. With loving words he consoles the weeping bride and the two happily enter into their dwelling.

Act II. Part I. Three years later, Pinkerton is absent in America, having promised to return, "when the robins nest again." Suzuki, Butterfly's faithful servant, rightly suspects that this means never, but is upbraided for want of faith by her trusting mistress. Butterfly is the mother of a fair-haired child. Pinkerton has instructed Sharpless in a letter to tell Butterfly that he has an American wife. Seeing her wonderful faith, the consul cannot bear to destroy it and departs sadly. The guns salute the newly arrived man-of-war, the Abraham Lincoln, Pinkerton's ship. Butterfly and Suzuki deck the house with flowers and array themselves and the child in gala dress. All three peer through the shoji to watch for Pinkerton's coming. As the night passes Suzuki

and the child fall asleep, but Butterfly, alert and sleepless, never stirs.

Part II. At dawn Butterfly is still watching. Suzuki awakens and brings the baby to her. She persuades Butterfly to rest. Pinkerton and Sharpless arrive and tell Suzuki the sad truth, but the lieutenant is deeply moved and cannot remain. Sharpless tells Suzuki that Mrs. Pinkerton will care for the child if Butterfly will give him up. Butterfly appears, expecting to see Pinkerton, but is confronted instead by his wife. She receives the truth with pathetic calmness, politely congratulates the new wife, and asks her to tell her husband that in half an hour he may have the child, and that she herself will find peace. Then, having bowed her visitors out, she is left alone to her sorrowful fate. At the appointed time Pinkerton and Sharpless return to find Butterfly dead by her own hand after having bidden farewell to her child.

Project '66:

SOUNDS of the CENTURY

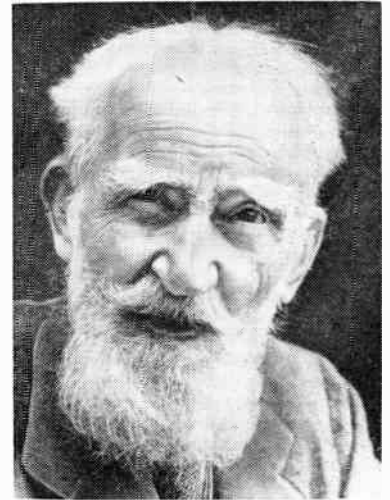
NO CENTURY has known faster and more devastating world changes, nor more miraculous unfolding of knowledge than has our own. It was easier in other eras for men to forget history and so be forced to relive its sorrows, but we do not have that excuse for not learning the lessons of war and privation, because many of the sounds and the voices that have shaped history in the 20th century are preserved for us on recordings as vivid and eloquent as at the moment of their making. Some of these sounds of the century, from the priceless collection of journalist Wolf Mittler, one of Germany's most respected radio and television personalities, will be presented on radio's *Project '66* on Sunday, January 2nd. The program was written and produced by Tony Thomas, with narration by John Scott.

It begins with the voice of Kaiser Wilhelm, recorded in Berlin in August, 1914, and continues with highlights of the 1930s, including Hitler announcing a purge, European ministers calling for help, Chamberlain going to Germany. Listeners will hear the crash and whine of battles and air raids, the bombing of Berlin and London, Goebbels whipping up war frenzy at a rally in Berlin, Rommel addressing his Afrika Corps before Tobruk, British artillery fire on the night Rommel was pushed back, British soldiers on a landing craft going to Normandy

before D-Day, and a padre saying a prayer for their safekeeping, Australian soldiers on the African desert singing *Lili Marlene*, Hitler announcing the plot against him in 1944 (and the judge shrieking at the conspirators when they were brought to trial), and the Nuremberg Trials, with Nazi big-wigs vigorously denying their guilt.

The last part of the program contrasts the sounds of war and aggression with the voices of great humanitarians giving their hopeful viewpoints on peace for mankind — Gandhi stating his firm belief in Divine power, which is confirmed by Einstein, and George Bernard Shaw denouncing the folly of war.

Mittler, who was born to a wealthy Munich family, became highly fluent in English, and British-oriented in thought and

manner. During the Second World War he incurred the wrath of the Germans for his pro-British broadcasts, particularly for his admiring report on the 1942 Dieppe raid, and had to leave the country in a hurry and seek refuge in Switzerland.

in him a painter of great promise but had no inkling of his poetic gifts. And so it was almost without warning, and yet at the age of 26 already displaying his mature poetic style, that Shevchenko burst into prominence as a poet in 1840 with the publication of his *Kobzar*, a slender volume that included some of the poetry best-loved by Ukrainians even today. Shevchenko gained recognition as a member of the Russian Imperial Academy of the Arts late in life, but from 1840 onward he was recognized primarily as a great national poet who spoke for the aspirations of his people and his homeland.

In the 19th-century Russian empire, of course, the Ukrainians were by far the most numerous of the many non-Russian national minorities. But they were officially called Little Russians and considered part of the one great Russian nation, while their language was regarded as a mere dialect of Russian. Even the most liberal of contemporary Russian critics, Belinsky, therefore heaped scorn upon Shevchenko's poetry because of its "vulgar and commonplace words and expressions." But the qualities that most irritated Russians like Belinsky were in fact the very qualities that endeared Shevchenko's poetry to many Ukrainians and made the poet a great national hero. Shevchenko was the first to give poetic expression to the Ukrainian language as spoken by the common people of Ukraine; and his themes, recalling the glorious period of freedom of the Ukrainian Cossacks before their domination by Moscow, expressed the aspirations of the rising Ukrainian national movement then growing with its main centre in the University of Kiev.

Russia's first great poet, Alexander Pushkin, declared that all the Slavic rivers must flow into the great Russian sea, but Shevchenko glorified the differences between Russian and Ukrainian history and culture, pleading that his homeland was a separate country which must

The Best of Ideas:

History of Civil Disobedience

A SERIES of seven talks by the Canadian writer George Woodcock on *Civil Disobedience* begins this Monday night at 10:30 on the radio series *The Best of Ideas*. (It will be repeated on the CBW-FM version of the same series, beginning Wednesday, January 12th.)

The object in this series is to establish the philosophic basis of civil disobedience and to discuss some of its varying manifestations from early historical times to the present. The first 20 minutes of each broadcast will be Mr. Woodcock's talk with the remaining 10 minutes of the half-hour period given over to a discussion of the topic between Mr. Woodcock and a special guest.

The Early European Tradition of Civil Disobedience is the subtitle for the first program, in which civil disobedience among the early Christians in their conflict with Imperial Rome, and later, among the heretical sects of medieval Europe (particularly the Cathari and their offshoots) is examined. Dr. Donald Brown of the department of philosophy, University of British Columbia is the guest.

The following programs then trace the background of civil disobedience in Asia, with reference to Gandhi-ism and the examples of

contemporary Buddhist monks in south-east Asia (January 10th), with guest Professor Joseph Richardson, department of religious studies, UBC; civil disobedience in England in the 17th century, guest: Dr. J. H. Winter, department of history, UBC (January 17th); the strike as a classic form of civil disobedience, beginning with the Owenites in the early 19th century, guest: Professor Walter Young, department of political science, UBC (January 24th); the non-violent philosophy of Leo Tolstoy in 19th-century Russia and the dissenting sects like the Doukhobors and their resistance to Tsarist militarism, guest: Dr. Ivan Avakumovic, department of political science, UBC (January 31st); the Congress movement in India and Gandhi's early career in South Africa, with the development there of Satyagraha as a philosophy and a method of applying moral force to political problems, guest: Professor William Holland, department of Asian studies, UBC (February 7th); and developments in the United States, from the early anti-slavery groups up to the present civil rights movement, guest: Dr. Warren Tallman, department of English, UBC (February 14th).

Louis Quilico in Recital

The noted Canadian baritone, in great demand for international performances, is heard in a recital Tuesday at 10:35 p.m. on CBC radio.

SINCE HIS two-year contract with the Paris Opera expired in September, Canadian baritone Louis Quilico has been busier than ever. He has some 80 performances scheduled for this season, including at least 40 in major Italian opera houses, singing Rigoletto, Falstaff, and the elder Germont in *La Traviata*, one of his personal triumphs of last season. His repertoire includes 75 operatic roles, and he has recently added two more operas to his list: Manuel Rosenthal's *Hop Signor!* and the four baritone roles in Offenbach's *Tales of Hoffmann*.

On *CBC Tuesday Night* this week (January 4th) Quilico will be heard on radio in a CBC University Celebrity Recital recorded at the University of Ottawa. His accompanist will be his wife



and coach. Lina Pizzolongo, to whom he gives full credit for his success. "I wouldn't have had a career of any sort if I hadn't met her and half-heartedly began taking voice lessons in Montreal — I really didn't know I had a voice at that time," he told us in an interview in Toronto. "She has taught me everything I know about music and acting, and has developed my personality on stage and in private life."

Since Miss Pizzolongo recognized the young baritone's singing potential, his career has blossomed into an international one that has drawn wildly enthusiastic response from both critics and audiences all over Europe and North America — not just for his singing, but also for the unusually fine acting talent he brings to his roles, and for the warmth of his down-to-earth personality. He says he enjoys exploring the depth of an operatic characterization and bringing out the full emotional flavor of concert pieces — thinks there's a lot of the ham actor in him.

Greater Efficiency For Prairie Farms

FOR THE FARMER with three sections of land, and the farmer with three quarter-sections, success comes from good planning and efficient methods. To help prairie farmers have greater profits through better planning and methods, CBC tv and the provincial agriculture departments and universities present the fifth annual short-course, *This Business of Farming*.

Five daily programs, Monday, January 10th to Friday, January 14th, will deal with varied topics: on Monday, farmstead planning; Tuesday, wintering the beef herd; Wednesday, enterprises for the small farmer; Thursday, farm income stabilization; and Friday, farm business organization.

Each day, experts from the prairie universities and departments of agriculture will talk, illustrating their points with film of actual farm operations.

This Business of Farming began in 1962 in Manitoba, and by January, 1964, had proved so successful that it spread throughout the Prairies. Now, Eastern farmers as well are benefitting from a similar course designed for their needs.

Lionel Moore, CBC Farms and Fisheries Broadcasts Supervisor for the Prairies, again is host of the series. Program organizers are Vern McNair of the Manitoba agriculture department, John McConnell of the Saskatchewan agriculture department and Warren Wismer of the Alberta agriculture department.

BRUNO WALTER

The recollections of Bruno Walter pay particular attention to the last recordings and include excerpts from rehearsals with the Columbia Symphony Orchestra not generally available to the public.

Lotte Lehmann, who speaks from her home in Santa Barbara, recalls her many associations with Dr. Walter — associations which began at Covent Garden in London in 1924, when *Der Rosenkavalier* was presented with a star-studded cast, including Lotte Lehmann, Elizabeth Schumann, and Delia Reinhardt, who were three of the finest singers of the day.

Born in Berlin on September 15th, 1876, of poor Jewish parents, Bruno Walter showed a marked musicality at an early age and subsequently studied at the Stern Conservatory. At 17, he became a vocal

coach at the Cologne Civic Theatre and was soon conducting there and in other European cities. He moved to the Hamburg Opera in 1895 and while there met Gustav Mahler, the great composer and conductor, whose friendship was to be a major influence on his career and whose music so profoundly affected him that he became its most famous interpreter and champion.

Triumph followed triumph in the years that followed as, successively, he conducted at the Vienna Court Opera; was appointed musical director of the Munich Royal Opera; visited the U.S. in 1923; was named head of the Berlin Civic Opera; conducted the Vienna Philharmonic and the Vienna State Opera; helped organize the Salzburg Festival and appeared there annually, and visited Moscow in 1936.

Then, in 1938, as the tide of Naziism steadily advanced, he resigned as director of the Vienna State Opera, going first to the Netherlands to fulfil a conducting engagement, and then to France for a year. Both countries honored him: France made him a Commander of the Legion of Honor; the Netherlands decorated him as

Grand Officer of the Order of Orange Nassau.

Dr. Walter went to the U.S. in 1939, serving first as guest conductor of the National Broadcasting Company in the absence of Toscanini, whom he greatly admired as an embodiment of "true greatness." He made his Metropolitan Opera debut in 1941, and received over a dozen curtain calls. Thereafter, his guest appearances with leading U.S. orchestras were numerous and memorable, and he became particularly closely associated with the New York Philharmonic, both as conductor and musical adviser. In 1958, he conducted at the Vancouver Festival of the Arts, and the following year revisited Europe where he was given a great reception. Vienna awarded him the Karl Renner Prize, and he also received the Cultural Prize of the City of Munich.

As well as being a great conductor, Bruno Walter was a gifted pianist (his recording as conductor and soloist, in a Mozart piano concerto, is a collectors' item) and a fine writer (he published three books: one about Gustav Mahler, and two about his musical convictions and experiences).

develop freely in accordance with its glorious Cossack tradition. There was no question of complete political independence from Russia, at least not in Shevchenko's earlier writings, but he approached the Ukrainian question in a spirit of romantic idealism, seeking cultural autonomy for Ukraine in a free federation of all the Slavic nations.

But such ideas were anathema in the Russia of Nicholas I. The obvious connection between nationalism and liberalism, national liberty and individual liberty, alarmed the Russian authorities. In 1847 the Ukrainian patriotic organization, the Society of Saints Cyril and Methodius, was closed down by the Russian police, even though its purpose was cultural rather than political. Its leaders were either

imprisoned or exiled; and Shevchenko, although he was not officially a member of the society, was treated especially harshly. Because his poetry had attacked Peter the Great and Catherine, the two Russian rulers most responsible for ending Ukrainian self-rule, Shevchenko was condemned to serve as a Russian soldier in Central Asia, "with a prohibition of writing and painting" added in the Tsar's own hand to the judgment.

Shevchenko survived exile, but his health was broken. And though he continued to write until his death and to author a Ukrainian grammar for use in the schools, there was for the rest of his life a parallel between his own thwarted career and his frustrated aspirations for his homeland.

was inaugurated. Up until then the CBC had relied upon Canadian Press for its news, the latter for a number of years having provided specially prepared bulletins for transmission over the Corporation's English-language radio network.

With the outbreak of the Second World War, however, it was felt by the CBC Management and Board of Governors that the CBC should, like other national networks, provide its own service, of news—not only of Canada, but of Britain and other countries—and so a major step in the development of the CBC was taken by the formation of its own News Service in 1940. Following a thorough survey, CBC newsrooms were established at Halifax, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, and Vancouver.

The Montreal Newsroom was already staffed with French-speaking editors providing a full news service in French to the French-language network in the new National Service. Toronto operated as the Central Newsroom for English-speaking Canada, with all national news bulletins originating from that point.

There are basic differences between writing for the eye and writing for the ear. For this reason, many meetings and special personnel training preceded the broadcast of the first CBC English-language network bulletins on New Year's Day, 1941.

In the ensuing years the CBC News Service has expanded and moved ahead steadily, using the speed and flexibility of radio and, more recently, the pictorial power of television to provide Canadians

with a truly comprehensive news service, to keep them informed promptly and accurately of events at home and abroad, in peace or war, in depression or boom.

Today, the CBC News Service is heard in English, French, and 14 other languages, over four national CBC networks and the CBC International Service; it receives about 2,000,000 words of news every week from the world news agencies, in addition to the material from its own reporters and foreign correspondents; it handles in Toronto and Montreal, more than 6,000 feet of newsfilm a week from three newsfilm agencies to supplement the work of staff and free-lance cameramen; it transmits 150 radio and 50 television news broadcasts a day, including a full schedule of radio news for the Far North; it provides local and regional bulletins in radio and tv; it carries daily radio and tv reports from Ottawa by its seven-man Press Gallery staff; it employs 12 foreign correspondents—seven English; four French, one bilingual; it originates Canadian news from its 15 newsrooms at major CBC production points, plus five other one- or two-man bureaus; it provides 15 per cent or more of radio network time, and seven to eight per cent of tv network time.

From the outset, the policy for the CBC News Service has remained unchanged: "to report all the significant and interesting happenings of the day, in Canada and abroad, in a straightforward manner, without bias or distortion, without tendentious comment, and in a clear and unambiguous way."

JOIN THE acting profession and see the world—that might be Larry Hagman's advice to the person who wants to travel.

Thanks to his theatrical abilities, Larry, who stars as Tony Nelson on the half-hour comedy series, *I Dream of Jeannie* (Thursdays, 9:00 p.m.) has covered a large portion of the globe.

The Texas-born actor broke into acting with theatre companies in Texas, Florida, and New York. His first overseas role was a nine-line part in the London production of *South Pacific* at Drury Lane Theatre. He fattened his income—\$42 weekly—by performing at a late night revue.

A four-year sojourn in the Air Force brought more theatre-linked travelling. As a special services producer-director of camp shows, he staged productions at bases all over Europe, North Africa, and the Middle East. After his discharge, Larry went to Paris for "walk-on" appearances in *Skin of Our Teeth*. His purpose, however, was to visit a member of the cast, his mother, the illustrious Mary Martin.

Next, in his only non-acting trip, Larry visited his mother's large Brazilian ranch before returning to New York. A well-received performance in an off-Broadway play launched Larry on a successful career.

He appeared in four Broadway productions, starred in the daytime serial, *Edge of the Night*, and appeared in numerous tv guest roles. He has been cast in such movies as *Fail Safe*, *Ensign Pulver*, *The Cavern* and *In Harm's Way*.

Larry attended school in Texas, Los Angeles, New York, and Vermont before entering Bard College at Annandale-on-the-Hudson, New York.

After majoring in drama for a year, Hagman decided that the way to learn this business is to "go out and do it." His own advice soon worked, as theatrical commitments followed rapidly.

In his spare time he likes to hunt, fish, and ski. He met his wife, Maj, a Swedish dress designer, during his service days in England. The couple were married in 1954 and have two children. They live in Santa Monica, California.
