CBC news telecasts are always conducted tastefully and calmly, no matter how dire the circumstance, or how wrong the act. No bias is ever shown, and we believe this to be a very high standard of reporting, and hope that you can always maintain it.

We hope, also, that no slips occur again, like those that happened one night when the Munsinger case hit Canada. True, it seemed to imply scandal in high places and a security risk, but at the time, these aspects were merely insinuated. Did this give the CBC News Department the right to go gleefully hog wild over the case, and to berate our ears for almost 10 minutes with what could only be called scandalmongering gossip; material acceptable on such programs as *Seven Days* (CBC-TV, Sundays) and *The Sixties* (CBC-TV, Mondays), whose style it is to inquire, inquire, inquire, to the point of near rudeness, but because of the very nature of the programs, may get away with it? Surely what we saw on the TV screen, and which thoroughly disgusted us from start to finish, was not good reporting?

IF FELLOW panelists on the weekday afternoon panel show *To Tell the Truth* were to ask the real opera singer to stand, they'd find Kitty Carlisle leaving her seat — and she wouldn't be trying to fool them.

Although the panelists are constantly confronted by impostors, Miss Carlisle can now truly say she's a member of the Metropolitan Opera Company.

Miss Carlisle, known to television viewers through her appearances on *To Tell the Truth*, seen Monday through Friday at 3:00 p.m. on the CBC-TV network, has been assigned the role of Prince Orlofsky in *Die Fledermaus*.

She will appear in the Johann Strauss opera for six performances at the Met starting December 31st. Before that, on August 24th, she will sing the role at the Saratoga (N.Y.) Performing Arts Center with Eugene Ormandy and the Philadelphia Orchestra.

Although Miss Carlisle has performed before in opera, her singing credits primarily are in musical comedy: *Kiss Me Kate*, *White Horse Inn* and *Walk with Music*. In opera, she has sung the title role in the Britten work *The Rape of Lucretia*, as well as Prince Orlofsky in a Broadway adaptation of *Die Fledermaus*, titled *Champagne Sec*.

## INTO AN UNKNOWN LAND

Excerpts from Dag Hammarskjöld's *MARKINGS* are heard Friday at 8:03 p.m. on CBC Radio's *THE HUMAN CONDITION*

IT IS NOW 4½ years since Dag Hammarskjöld, Secretary-General of the United Nations from 1953 to 1961, died in an air crash in Northern Rhodesia. Shortly after his death, friends found among his personal possessions a manuscript entitled *Vagmarken* to which was attached a letter to his friend Leif Belfrage, the Swedish Permanent Under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs.

*Vagmarken*, Hammarskjöld explained in the letter, was a diary, "... a sort of 'White Book' concerning my negotiations with myself—and with God.

"It was begun without a thought of anybody else reading it. But, what with my later history and all that has been said and written about me, the situation has changed. These entries provide the only true 'profile' that can be drawn. That is why, during recent years, I have reckoned with the possibility of publication, though I have continued to write for myself, not for the public."

Published in 1964 under the English title *Markings*, the journal enjoyed a wide circulation and as "the only true 'profile' that can be drawn" was a revelation to most of its readers. Nevertheless, the poet W. H. Auden, who undertook the translation from the original Swedish, thought Hammarskjöld's statement about the only true profile was both false and misleading. In his introduction to the book Auden wrote:

"Even if the book were as extensive and detailed a 'Confessions' as those of Boswell or Rousseau or Gide, this statement would still be false. No man can draw his own 'profile' correctly because, as Thoreau said: 'It is as hard to see oneself as to look backwards without turning round.' The truth is that our friends—and our enemies—always know us better than we know ourselves. There are, to be sure, a few corrective touches to their pictures of us which

## A DOLL'S HOUSE

Henrik Ibsen's great social  
drama is performed on  
CBC-TV's FESTIVAL, Wednesday,  
May 4th at 9:30 p.m.

IT WAS a theatrical masterpiece, infinitely touching, yet a forceful, rallying cry for women's freedom, an intriguing piece of entertainment offering the meaty characterizations a performer dreams of, which grip theatre-goers at curtain time and never let go their heart-strings and their consciences. It frequently shocked them, too, with its argument that women are people with the right to achieve an identity of their own beyond that of wife and mother.

Of course the play was violently discussed wherever it was performed. No one who saw *A Doll's House*, the first of Henrik Ibsen's social dramas to be widely performed, or knew anything about its theme, could be indifferent to it, and arguments became so heated whenever the play was mentioned that hostesses frantically barred it as a topic of conversation at social gatherings. Today the

## A RETURN TO THE SHRINE

*Richard Wagner, much-maligned genius of the opera, is honored at the Bayreuth Festival, visited by CBC TUESDAY NIGHT, May 3rd at 8:05 p.m.*

THE FIRST program (at 8:05) on radio's *CBC Tuesday Night* this week is *A Return to the Shrine*, a radio study of the Bayreuth Festival by Christopher Sykes. Admirers of Bach, Mozart, Beethoven, or any other of the immortals of music do not have a special name to indicate their preference, but, writes Sykes, lovers of Wagner are Wagnerites, "a title bestowed on us in derision or borne by us defiantly. We are in a perpetual war. 'What! You like the *Ring*?' When people say such things, it is difficult to restrain ourselves and reply calmly, 'Oh yes, very much indeed,' as we would if someone were similarly surprised at our going to *Don Giovanni*. 'Yes,' we roar back, 'I should darn well think I do like the *Ring*!'"

Wagner is a cult, as Handel used to be. Handel is just an immortal today, but Wagner remains a cult, in part because the cult is persecuted. This cult, of which the Festspielhaus in Bayreuth may be called the main temple, is absolutely unique. Ernest Newman went too far when he described Bayreuth as the only

true festival in the ancient sense of being an act of passionate contemplation akin to the religious, but there is undoubtedly a great degree of truth in his exaggeration.

Sykes goes on to say "In *A Return to the Shrine*, for which Geoffrey Skelton and I gathered material in a delightful week during rehearsals at Bayreuth, I try to give an impression of what goes on in the temple, of the masterly organization and the devoted toil behind the Festival productions which are directed by Wagner's grandsons, Wieland and Wolfgang, to whom we are grateful for hospitable co-operation. Some of the main singers are interviewed, and Bayerischer Rundfunk, which made the program possible, has allowed us to take extracts from some of the operas performed."

Listeners will hear the voices of the master's two grandsons, the directors of the Festival. Their revolutionary style of production, completely abandoning the style originally initiated by Wagner himself, has caused a great deal of comment

**FRIDAY NIGHT Movies** will be pre-empted this week by a special television presentation: live coverage of the 18th Annual Canadian Film Awards. This year the awards will be made at the Queen Elizabeth Hotel in Montreal and will be preceded by a variety show featuring top Canadian performers. Rich Little is the host for this 90-minute program, heading up a cast that includes singer Peggy Neville, ragtime pianist Alex Read, singers Andrée Champagne and Catherine McKinnon, Doug Crosley, the folk-singing quartet Les Cailloux, the singing group La Famille Brassard, Montreal ballad singer Fernand Gignac, and an orchestra under the direction of Lucio Agostini.

Within the framework of the Canadian Film Awards, presentations will also be made by the Directors' Guild of Canada and by the Canadian Society of Cinematographers. The Canadian Film Awards are sponsored by the Canadian Film Institute, the Canada Foundation, the Canadian Association of Motion Picture Producers, and the Canadian Association for Adult Education.

The CBC, which last year won two top awards, one for the best television entertainment film (*The Open Grave*), and one for the best television information film (*Summer in Mississippi*), has entered a number of films this year in various categories.

Coverage of the 18th Canadian Film Awards begins at 9:30 p.m. on Friday, May 6th. Bob Jarvis is the producer, Thom Benson the executive producer.

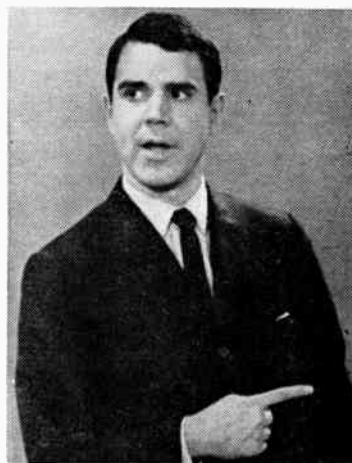

## *Alan Jarvis, Patrick Watson and Gordon Sinclair:*

WILLIAM RONALD, host of CBC-TV's new show on the arts, *The Umbrella*, has in the studio this week a trio of personalities. They are: Alan Jarvis, lecturer, sculptor, and former director of the National Gallery of Canada (1956-59); Patrick Watson, executive producer of the television series *Document* and co-host of *This Hour Has Seven Days*; and Gordon Sinclair, journalist and broadcaster, and panelist on CBC-TV's *Front Page Challenge*.

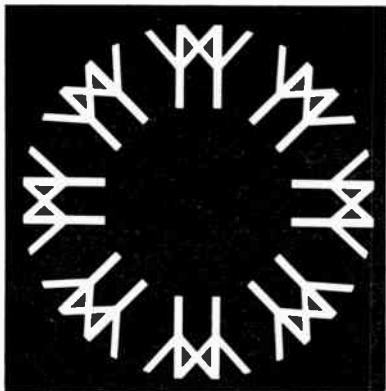

being "like a Hollywood premiere." Politicians, music critics, actors, artists, and socialites flocked to Le Drug to see and be seen.

Dallegret's reputation as a way-out designer started in Paris, where he exhibited his designs for "Astrological Automobiles." These were fantastic creations for "dream cars" based on signs of the Zodiac. For those born under the sign of Scorpio (who are, according to Dallegret "uneasy and shifty; they make good spies") he designed a car in which "the driver sits in an iron bandstand provided with a periscope and surrounded by foliage cut out of seven different red metals and a balustrade of Indian almandite. The car is amphibious for strategical purposes." Dallegret claims that while such cars may look fantastic they are perfectly feasible.

only we can add, and these, as a rule, are concerned with our vulnerabilities and our weaknesses."

In life, Hammarskjold was an enigma, a remote and seemingly austere figure. The circumstances of his death and his private thoughts made public in *Markings* seem only to have added to the mystery. This week the radio series *The Human Condition* presents an intimate portrait of the late Secretary-General in a program entitled *Into an Unknown Land*.

Prepared by Gilles Couture and Professor George Whalley of the English department of Queen's University, this program is based on Hammarskjold's writings and takes its title from an early poem, (*Thus It Was*, 1925-30) included in *Markings*:

I am being driven forward  
Into an unknown land.  
The pass grows steeper  
The air colder and sharper.  
A wind from my unknown goal  
Stirs the strings  
Of expectation.

*The Human Condition*, a series of eight programs first broadcast earlier this month on CBC-FM, is heard on the AM network Fridays at 8:03 p.m. Gerald Newman, of CBC Vancouver, is the co-ordinator of the series.

in Germany, most of it approving, but inevitably arousing a great deal of conservative opposition. In the program, says Sykes, "the idea behind this artistic revolution is represented." In his opinion an interesting contribution to this is in a frank discussion with Friedlind Wagner, the composer's granddaughter, who is indirectly associated with the Festival through the Master Classes, the student groups she brings to Bayreuth every year from North America. Other interesting details about the Festival, which was founded in 1876, are contributed by people closely associated with it. They include Dr. Wirz, head of the foreign relations department of Bavarian Radio, who is in charge of all broadcasting from the Festival; Wilhelm Pitz, chorus master; Count Gravina, a great grandson of Liszt, who has worked at the Festivals since 1912, and has known them since 1900; Rudolf Kempe, the distinguished conductor; and Johannes Steinweg, a violinist (formerly a 'royal musician') who plays regularly in the orchestra.

# How our Novels Reflect our Morals

SOCIETY'S changing attitude towards morality, as revealed in the writings of six famous novelists, is the subject of a series of lectures entitled *Novels and Morals*, currently being given by Dr. Dennis Duffy on radio's *The Best of Ideas* (Mondays at 10:30 p.m.). This week, in his second program, Dr. Duffy will discuss Samuel Richardson's novel, *Pamela*.

Dr. Duffy is a lecturer in English at Trinity College, University of Toronto. In the series, he examines the six novels — ranging from 1740 to 1916 in their dates of publication — from a particular point of view: how they exhibit the changes that have taken place in our concept of society's moral validity and the individual's moral norms. The novels are *Tom Jones*, by Henry Fielding; *Pamela*, by Samuel Richardson; *The Heart of Midlothian*, by Sir Walter Scott; *Vanity Fair*, by William Thackeray; *Tess of the D'Urbervilles* by Thomas Hardy; and *A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man*, by James Joyce.

Though *Pamela* was published before *Tom Jones*, Dr. Duffy chose to discuss Fielding's novel first (last week) because it so fully and consciously represents a panorama of the society of its time.

The years between Richardson's *Pamela* and Joyce's *Portrait* span a time of sweeping cultural change. "These years witnessed the American and French Revolutions,"

says Dr. Duffy, "as well as the transformation of every facet of Western life by the phenomenon of industrialism. When *Pamela* first appeared, Bonnie Prince Charlie had not yet made the last romantic gamble of the Stuarts for the British throne; by the time of Joyce's novel, the West had returned to a suicidal warfare more widespread, savage and degrading than anything since the washing away of the Roman Empire. Across this period of time flash such names as Napoleon, Marx, Washington, Bismarck, Victoria Regina — the titles almost of icons rather than individuals. In 1740 the great age of the stagecoach had not begun; by 1916 the age of the motorcar and airplane was underway."

By looking at the six novels from the point of view of morality, Dr. Duffy shows the various means by which a novel reveals a vision of society. In pointing out that this approach tends to exclude elements in the work which are of great aesthetic importance, he refers us to Saul Bellow's character Moses Herzog and his admonition that we must not forget how quickly the visions of genius become the canned goods of the intellectuals. Dr. Duffy warns: "Don't mistake my vacuum-packed hash for the novels

themselves. I want these talks to return you to the works with some sense of how they reveal, as well as delight."

Dr. Duffy was born in Kentucky in 1938. He received his A.B. degree at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C., and his Ph.D. from the University of Toronto in 1964.

SUCCESS STORY

CBC TUESDAY NIGHT—10:35 p.m.

A GENERATION ago a young Irishman named Anthony Walsh arrived in the South Okanagan, B.C., to teach at a day school on the Indian reserve at Inkameep. A sensitive man, deeply concerned about the Indians' way of life and their culture, he encouraged the children to develop skills in their native arts. Under his guidance and with the help of the chief on the reserve Inkameep witnessed a renaissance of Indian culture.

The children sent paintings and drawings, some of them on buckskin, to various exhibitions in Europe, where they won prizes and international recognition. They revived native songs, made up their own plays and dances, and performed them in public. When Thunderbird Park, in Victoria, was opened in 1941 the children were invited to perform at the ceremonies.

Anthony Walsh, now engaged in social work in Montreal, will be heard this week on CBC-FM's *Saturday Evening* series recalling the story of Inkameep in the decade 1932-42. With him on the program will be a number of the people who helped make it a success story.

Interview with Alan Sillitoe

OF ALL THE young Britishers who began to write in the late 1950s, Alan Sillitoe is one of the few who have kept up their standards and grown more technically accomplished and mature. Some critics consider his first book, *Saturday Night and Sunday Morning*, about pub and factory life in Nottingham, to be the best novel about the working-class since Lawrence's *Sons and Lovers*. Ironically, five publishers rejected it before he found one who recognized its potential. Three film companies turned it down before it was finally made into a movie that was one of the most powerful Britain has produced in many a year. Two paperback firms refused it before Pan Books accepted it and sold over a million copies.

Sillitoe's next book, *The Loneliness of the Long-Distance Runner*, a collection of short stories about the spiritual isolation of the British working-class from the main body

of British society, won him the Hawthornden Prize, presented annually in England to the writer under 41 who produces the best imaginative work in prose or verse. Like his first novel, the title story was filmed, with a scenario by Sillitoe and became a masterpiece of class bitterness. It concerns a Borstal boy who defies his warden by refusing to win an Athletics Day prize in competition with public school boys.

Since then Sillitoe has published a long political poem, *The Rats*; *The General*, a drama about the conflict of ideologies in the struggle of civilization against barbarism; and of art against authoritarianism; and *Key to the Door*, a proletarian novel set in Malaya and Nottingham.

Sillitoe will be heard on *CBC Tuesday Night*, May 3rd, at 10:35, in an interview with Barry Callaghan of York University.

defiant gesture of its young heroine as she bangs the door on her past and seeks her individuality away from the cosseted atmosphere she has known all her life, seems small cause for general furor. But the basic interest of the situation — a pampered, innocent human being's sudden awakening to the harsh realities of life and to herself as a person with responsibilities — is an order of experience, both emotional and intellectual, that is as compelling today as when Ibsen first introduced his fascinating, heedless little skylark, Nora, 87 years ago. He was less concerned with feminism in this play than he was with the plight of an individual against society, of personal honesty against the phalanx of convention, and so it has withstood the test of the years rather well.

CBC-TV viewers will see this for themselves on Wednesday night, May 4th, in a performance of *A Doll's House*, produced and directed with moving delicacy by Paul Almond. Translated by Eva Le Gallienne, and adapted for *Festival* by Fletcher Markle, host of TV's *Telescope* series, it stars the winsome young Montreal actress, G nevi ve Bujold, as Nora, and Peter Donat as Torvald, her husband; with Paul Massie as Dr. Rank, Michael Learned as Kristine Linde, Gerard Parkes as Nils Krogstad, Gertrude Bradley as Anne Marie, and Edwina Follows and Simon Tully as the children. Sets are by Nikolai Soloviov and costumes by Horst Dantz.

Ibsen was not only breaking ground in his choice of story material for this play, but also in the way he handled it dramatically. In the well-made 19th-century play the action had traditionally built up slowly on stage and had ended happily. But Ibsen broke the chains of custom by introducing the drama of retrospective analysis, in which the play opens right in the midst of action which has been determined by a crisis already past, and which is gradually revealed as the play pro-

gresses, giving added strength and excitement to the situation.

JOSEPH ROULEAU, a tall, rugged bass from Quebec who has sung with the Covent Garden Opera Company for eight years, and is now one of its stars, will sing the title role in Moussorgsky's spectacular Boris Godunov in Russian at the Bolshoi Theatre this spring, as well as leading roles in three other operas in Moscow, Leningrad, and Kiev. On a hunch, 18 months ago, he learned the role of Boris in Russian and sang it in a Montreal production last fall. The Russians heard about his success and invited him to Moscow.

"It's a most difficult part," says Rouleau. "The whole opera revolves around him but he only appears three times. It's a short role for a lead, but there are three magnificent scenes."

British audiences have been applauding Rouleau's operatic interpretations from the start of his Covent Garden career. He has unusual gifts for characterization —

in a lavish revival of Puccini's *Turandot* in January he drew wildly enthusiastic bravos as Timur, a nearly blind, former Tartar king reduced to poverty.

Unfortunately, Canadian audiences outside Quebec have had few opportunities to hear this fine singer, so his appearance Wednesday at 10:30 p.m. in radio's *Distinguished Artists* series is of special interest. He will sing the *Ten Biblical Songs* by Dvorak, accompanied by pianist John Newmark.

Born in Matane, Quebec, in 1929, Rouleau studied political, economic and social sciences at the University of Montreal, with a view to a diplomatic career. More or less by chance, he tells us, he began voice training at 17, studied at the Montreal Conservatory, and in 1952, after winning a Quebec scholarship to study in Milan, decided on a singing career.

Nora, the frolicsome little squirrel who has been pampered by her father and then treated like a doll by her husband, is still, after eight years of marriage, as unaware of the realities of life as one of her children's toys. She chirps and flutters and babbles of macaroons, and gaily dances the *tarentella* (the traditional dance of the victims of the poisonous spider). All her illusions about life are still intact.

When her conscientious lawyer husband becomes ill, she forges her father's signature to a cheque to enable her to borrow money from Nils Krogstad at the bank, to save Torvald's life. Later, when Torvald becomes head of the bank, he fires Krogstad, who then holds the forgery over Nora and threat-

ens to reveal her secret unless she persuades her husband to reinstate him. Meanwhile, Torvald's attitude in placing ambition before love has opened her eyes to the man she had committed a crime to save. She had once boasted that he "wouldn't hesitate a moment to give his very life for my sake." But when he discovers the truth about the cheque, he turns on her angrily, and she realizes their relationship all the years of their marriage has not really been that of mature husband and wife, companions as well as lovers. She has seemed to him just a pretty little toy. She rebels against his domination, her own silly sentimentality, and the theft of her identity, with a dramatic gesture that has echoed around the world and symbolized the emancipation of her sex from centuries of bondage.—*June Graham.*

ELWY YOST, a regular member of the CBC-TV *Flashback* panel, and host of *Passport to Adventure*, was born in Weston, Ontario, in 1925. Prior to his entrance into the world of entertainment, Elwy served with the Canadian Infantry in 1944-45 and in 1945 was a member of the Canadian Army Show.
