

On our cover . . .

Princess Grace of Monaco, formerly actress Grace Kelly, is hostess of a program Sunday afternoon, May 8th, marking World Red Cross Day.

CBC WINNIPEG graphic artists have again placed high in the annual competition of the Art Directors Club of Winnipeg. At a recent awards night, Al Dutcheshen was awarded a gold medal for his design of a promotional slide for *Festival*, and Dave Strang received a distinctive merit award for his *Roy Petty Show* graphic. (Both winning graphics are shown below.)

Design Director Stan Langtry expressed a great deal of pride in the talents of his staff:

"The complete show was judged by four highly qualified men," he pointed out, "all members of the Art Directors' Club of Los Angeles. To indicate the high standard of the judging, 432 pieces were submitted, of which 134 were accepted. Of these, only five received gold medals, and 12 received distinctive merit awards."

Of the 12 pieces of artwork submitted by Winnipeg's four graphic artists (Frank Mikuska and Bruce Head are the others), 10 were accepted for competition.

The annual awards of the Winnipeg Art Directors' Club are given for work submitted by commercial artists from the Prairie Provinces. The complete show was on view at the Winnipeg Art Gallery from April 3rd to 15th.

On *Jazz en Liberté*, a new CBC radio show heard Fridays at 11:03 p.m., host Henri Bergeron introduces in French and English a group of musicians representing both language groups. Leader is Nick Ayoub, one of Canada's most brilliant and successful jazzmen. Produced in Montreal by André Hebert, the program has been a popular feature of the CBC's French radio network for some time, and its bilingual format was devised so that it could be produced simultaneously for both networks.

A native of Three Rivers, P.Q., Nick Ayoub attended the Provincial Conservatory in Montreal to study saxophone and flute, then later studied oboe under Harold Gomberg of the New York Philharmonic. He has been a professional musician since the age of 17 and has worked on "thousands of radio shows." He is featured each week on two French network television programs. Ayoub has played many engagements with the Montreal Symphony under such conductors as Otto Klemperer, Bruno Walter and Sir Thomas Beecham.

Although jazz has been his first love, he says, "Nobody should stick to one thing. When I do Ravel or

Debussy, I can feel the goose pimples, but I get the same reaction out of jazz. It's really great to get off on a jazz kick and improvise on a theme."

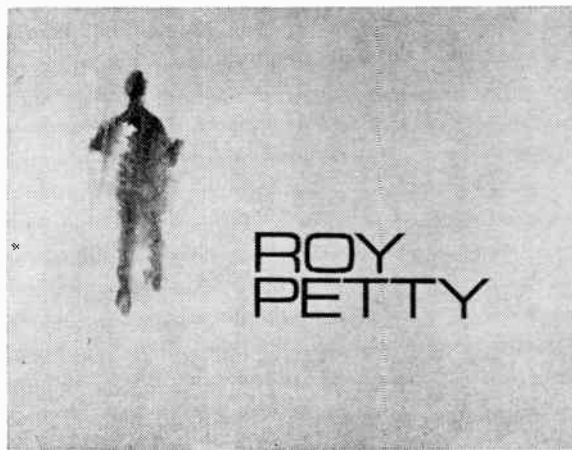
MALKA AND JOSO, talented folksinging duo of Canadian supper clubs and coffee houses, as well as recordings, will star in a new CBC-TV variety series, *A World of Music*, to debut next fall in the Saturday night time-slot which follows NHL telecasts.

As of October 1st, all programs in the series will be telecast in color. Prior to that date, starting mid-September, they will be in black and white.

Introducing songs and guests from around the world in a sophisticated half-hour format, Malka and Joso will be backed by a string orchestra directed by Ruth Toth.

Announcing the new variety series, CBC-TV supervisor of light entertainment Len Starmer says, "A *World of Music* will bring to Canadian audiences a whole new spectrum of music and popular recording stars from Europe and other countries, in a format that is modern rather than traditional. As guests, we will use singers and exciting dance groups who come to Canada for concert and stage appearances."

FIRST PERSON / Belief for the Space Age



IN A four-program series beginning Thursday, May 12th at 10:30 p.m. on CBC-TV, prominent lay people will speak about belief for a space age. Adrienne Clarkson, of CBC-TV's *Take 30*, is the hostess and she recently visited the Manned Space Craft Centre in Houston, Texas, to interview Col. Frank Borman for the opening program in the series. Colonel Borman is a licensed lay reader at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, where his two teenage sons are acolytes. As one of the astronauts on the Gemini space program, Col. Borman made the longest

space voyage yet undertaken. This opening program in the *First Person* series concludes with a review of some of the other personalities who will be seen on future editions.

On the second program (May 19th) Mrs. Clarkson talks with Dr. Jean Vanier, one of the Governor General's four sons, who is the founder of L'Arche (The Ark). Two years ago Dr. Vanier bought a house in the village of Trosly near Paris, France, and turned it into a home for mentally retarded young adults. In France the mentally retarded are raised in special institutions and on reaching the age of 20 are sent to asylums for the insane. The Ark was founded to help the

A FEAR OF STRANGERS

*Billy Dee Williams and John Vernon star on SHOW OF THE WEEK,

LEON GRIFFITHS is a highly regarded British TV and radio dramatist, but is not too well known in Canada yet, although his *Rasputin Was a Nice Old Man*, seen on CBC-TV over a year ago, made many viewers who enjoy off-beat psychological whodunits wish this interesting author would be heard from again. That occasion will be this Monday, May 9th, when *Show of the Week* presents another Griffiths TV drama with a police-and-suspect background. This one is an early Griffiths work, *A Fear of Strangers*, produced by Melwyn Breen. It stars Billy Dee Williams, distinguished young American stage and TV actor, and John Vernon, the Canadian who made a hit on Broadway recently in a production of *The Royal Hunt of the Sun*.

In *A Fear of Strangers* Inspector Dyke (Vernon), already on the carpet and facing suspension for his brutal interrogation of two young thugs and his rough methods of getting confessions, grills an itinerant Negro jazz musician (Williams) who has been picked up by the police as a prime suspect in a murder case. Others in the cast are Norman Welsh as Detective Sergeant Miller; Bill Kemp as

Superintendent Willis; Jay Shannon as Sergeant Joyce; Bruce McInnes as Detective Constable Turnbull; and Patrick Sinclair as Constable Chinnery.

Billy Dee Williams is a native New Yorker who originally intended to have a career as a designer. He attended the High School of Music and Art in New York, and won a scholarship to the National Academy of Design. His mother's employer, Max Gordon, cast him in a small role in the musical *Firebrand at Florence*, which had an unfortunately short run but which whetted his appetite for more. He had a few walk-on roles on TV, and was cast in the off-Broadway production of *Look at Any Man*. His starring role in another off-Broadway production, *Blue Boy in Black*, first won him the high praise he has been gathering ever since, in such roles as the sailor in *A Taste of Honey* and the lead in *The Cool World*, on Broadway, in *The Blacks* off Broadway, and on TV in such shows as the *Hallmark Hall of Fame* production of *Green Pastures*, and in the CBC-TV two-character drama, *I Ran Into This Zulu*.

FESTIVAL, Part 1: Victor Borge



EVERYBODY laughs when Victor Borge sits down at the piano, but that's as it should be, for the Danish-born pianist-comedian is a master at mixing fun with music. Destined for a career as a concert pianist, Borge could never resist turning every recital into a vaudeville act. Eventually, his puckish pianism made him one of the world's most successful comedians.

His routines are not necessarily always musical: witness his classic "phonetic punctuation." But his keyboard comedy remains his unique trademark; his name is synonymous with such nonsense as *The Beautiful Blue Danube* played upside-down.

He'll demonstrate both sides of his talent on CBC-TV's *Festival*, Wednesday, May 11th at 8:30 p.m. in an hour-long concert, videotaped at Toronto's massive O'Keefe Centre.

FESTIVAL, Part 2: *A tout prendre*



THE BEST Canadian feature film shown at the 1963 Montreal Film Festival was, the judges decided, Claude Jutra's highly personal *A tout prendre*, a re-enactment of Jutra's love affair with Negro singer Johanne. Jutra was 33 when he made the film, his first major production, and had already won a first prize at the international film festival in Cannes (1950) for a short, surrealistic film. Later, *A tout prendre* also picked up a Canadian National Film Award and a top prize at the Belgian Film Festival.

Written, directed, and edited by Jutra, *A tout prendre* took nearly two years to make, largely because of the financing. Although the final cost of the film was only about \$50,000, it might never have been finished but for an "angel" in the form of wealthy Montreal businessman Robert Hershorn. "Without him and his organizational drive," says Jutra, "we'd never have finished the movie. I cried for help—and we formed a kind of

COHEN'S CHOICE

Nathan Cohen has selected little-known plays by great playwrights for a CBC TUESDAY NIGHT series beginning May 10th at 8:05 p.m.

IF TORONTO'S Nathan Cohen has become known as the drama critic who hates drama, it's because so many of this century's best plays have, to use one of his favorite expressions, been "done to death." It makes him boil up over his glasses when a fine playwright becomes identified with only one or two of his plays, while his other works, some of them even better, gather dust, and most of the world is denied the pleasure of sharing them. So, when Cohen was sounding off on this topic some time ago, to two CBC radio network supervisors for whose talent

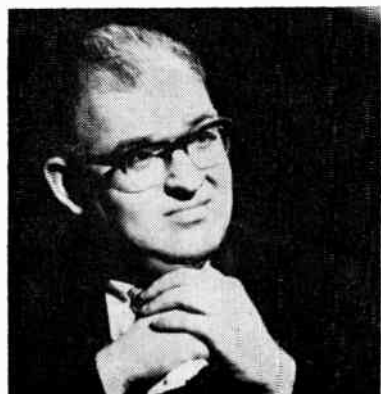
and judgment he has great respect: Robert Weaver (special programs), Esse W. Ljungh (drama), they called his bluff.

Weaver and Ljungh invited him to select a number of relatively unknown fine plays by noted 20th-century authors which would make good radio listening. Delighted to be put on the spot, Cohen chose 13 which he considers outstanding examples of the best of this century's contributions to the theatre, and they will be presented weekly on *CBC Tuesday Night* in a series beginning May 10th, with Cohen as host.

Most of the plays will be

making their first North American appearance, and will be broadcast from the major CBC production centres across Canada. Each play examines in extremely significant terms the artistic and social symptoms of the 20th century's travails and pleasures, in fresh, exhilarating terms. But they were not chosen for their provocative-ness, Cohen points out. While socially significant, all are theatrically valid, selected to show how varied, versatile and virile radio drama can be.

"I wanted to cover most of the trends on the European

Teach-In: The Vatican Council

A 90-minute examination of the results of the Second Vatican Council. Includes a discussion of three of its influences: the world in revolution; the relationship between Roman Catholics and other Christians; the role of the individual conscience. Chairman for the panel discussion is Dr. Lawrence Lynch, head of the philosophy department, St. Michael's College, University of Toronto. Panelists are: the Most Rev. Maurice Baudoux, archbishop of the diocese of St. Boniface, Man., and organizer for the Canadian Conference at the Vatican Council; the Most Rev. Alexander Carter, bishop of Sault St. Marie, who has already implemented many of the proposals of the Vatican Council in his own diocese; the Very Rev. Aelred Graham (OSB), prior of the Benedictine Priory at Portsmouth, Rhode Island and an authority on religions; the Rev. George Johnston, principal of United College in Montreal and member of the faculty of divinity at McGill University; Dr. Eugene Fairweather of Trinity College, University of Toronto, who was an observer for the Anglican Church of Canada at the Vatican Council. Participants on film are: Dr. Albert C. Outler who was an official observer at the Vatican Council for the World Methodist Church; Dr. Willem A. Visser't Hooft, general secretary of the World Council of Churches in Geneva; and Robert Kaiser, Roman Catholic layman and reporter for *Time* magazine at the Vatican Council.

In the studio is an invited audience of 200 guests who will have an opportunity to participate in the broadcast by questioning and commenting on the panelists' contributions. Across the country many church groups will assemble to view the program and debate the issues afterwards.

LESS THAN three months after he was crowned, Pope John XXIII announced early in 1959 that he would convoke a great assembly of Roman Catholic cardinals, archbishops, and bishops from all over the world. It would be the first ecumenical council since 1870 and the 21st in the history of the Roman Catholic Church. There were many reasons for Pope John's decision to hold such a meeting, some of which were contained in the text of the Vatican announcement, but to Roman Catholics and Protestants alike one of the most important was the movement towards unity in the Christian churches clearly indicated in the official statement of January 26th, 1959:

"On the occasion of the visit this morning to the Basilica of St. Paul's - Outside - the - Walls, Pope John XXIII, after attending the papal cappella, gave an allocution to the cardinals who were present for the ritual.

"His Holiness underlined the most important points of apostolic activity, suggested by the experi-

ence of his first three months of pontificate and pertaining to his responsibility as supreme bishop of Rome and supreme pastor of the universal Church . . .

"To meet the present needs of the Christian people, the Pope, taking inspiration from secular custom of the Church, has announced three events of the greatest importance: A synod of the diocese of Rome; celebration of an ecumenical council for the universal Church; and the modernization of the code of canon law, preceded by the forthcoming promulgation of the code of the oriental law.

"Regarding the celebration of ecumenical council, this, in the thought of the Holy Father, looks not only to the edification of the Christian peoples, but is intended as an invitation to the separate communities to seek unity which so many desire in all parts of the world."

The Second Vatican Council opened nearly four years later, on October 12th, 1962. No one knew

The View From Geneva



Grace Kelly is narrator of a film about the work of the International Red Cross, Sunday at 4:00 p.m.

IT IS THE world's most readily recognizable flag, yet it belongs to no nation. A simple red cross on a white ground, "the flag of mercy" is known and honored by all nations. Reverse the colors and the banner becomes the national symbol of Switzerland, the country where the International Committee of the Red Cross was founded 103 years ago. It was a Genevese, Henri

Dunant, who started it all. Dunant, a banker and philanthropist who also contributed to the founding of the Y.M.C.A., had set out from Geneva in 1859 to meet Emperor Napoleon III (then engaged in a war with Austria) in Italy to put before him a petition for building mills in Algeria. When Dunant arrived in Solferino on the 24th of (Please turn to page 15)

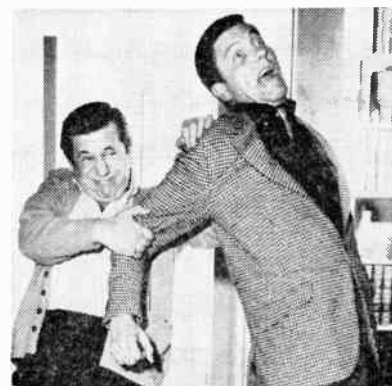

June a fierce battle had just taken place between the French and Piedmontese and the Austrians.

Shocked by the condition of the wounded and dying who lay all around the battlefield with little being done to relieve their suffering, Dunant abandoned his business plans and organized immediate medical attention.

"For three days," he wrote home, "I have been looking after the wounded from the battle at Solferino and I have tended over a thousand of these unfortunate men. We have had 40,000 in all, both Allies and Austrians. There are not enough doctors . . ."

Dunant later wrote a book, *Un Souvenir de Solferino*, that became a world-wide best seller, bringing home to people the necessity for voluntary aid societies to help the army medical service. A committee of prominent "international citizens of Geneva" under General Dufour joined Dunant's cause and set up two international conferences, one in 1863 and one a year later. On August 22nd, 1864, the first Geneva Convention was formed and 12 nations signed the Geneva Convention for the Amelioration of the Condition of Wounded in Armies in the Field. Dufour's committee became the International Committee of the Red Cross, composed of Swiss citizens, and has served since then as the neutral intermediary implementing the terms of the Geneva conventions.

The chunky red cross is composed of five squares (Dufour's committee was five in number) which represent: 1) care of the sick and wounded; 2) improvement of health; 3) prevention of disease; 4) mitigation of suffering — all bonded together by 5) the spirit of goodwill and service.

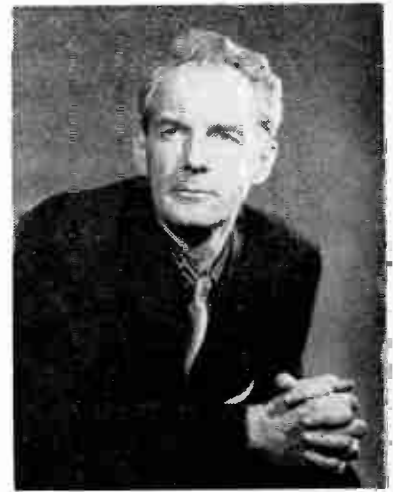

strange coalition of oppressed minorities: Johanne, he, and I."

In the streets and apartments of Montreal, Jutra, Johanne Harrelle, and a friend named Victor, played out a love story that had already taken place in real life between Jutra and Johanne. Victor, a friend and neighbor of Jutra, witnessed the romance from the lovers' first meeting, their discovery of love, and finally their parting. Mostly unscripted, *A tout prendre* (*All Things Considered*) is set against the background of Montreal's bohemian/intellectual community. English sub-titles are used when the characters speak, but English is used for the interior monologues. Jutra's original narrative is spoken by him from an English translation by the Canadian poet-novelist Leonard Cohen.

Claude Jutra is a doctor's son who graduated from medical school but has never practiced. He decided against continuing the family profession because "I have no intuition for diagnosis" and because "I was interested by my internship in psychiatry, but in completely the wrong way. I shared the patient's insanity and nearly became insane myself."

A tout prendre was first seen on CBC-TV on a *Festival* presentation last year.

Marching to Glory

The Salvation Army's
chaotic founding is recounted
Sunday in a special radio program.

A MUSICAL ACCOUNT of the founding of the Salvation Army a century ago, prepared for the BBC by Charles Chilton, will be presented on radio Sunday, May 8th, at 6:03 p.m. CDT/5:03 CST/4:03 MST. The program will feature singers and actors, the George Mitchell Choir, and a brass band conducted by Alfred Ralston.

Except for the very fashionable districts, the London of 1865 was a dirty, sooty, foggy place of ancient cobbled streets, narrow alleyways, and incessant noise. Privacy was almost impossible, and individual dignity was hard put to maintain itself. Conditions were worst in the East End, where many children were emaciated, barefoot, and riddled with disease. There

was little free education, no social services, and virtually no religion. Thousands of the London poor had never been inside a church, and had only vague ideas about God.

Into this morass of humanity, relates Charles Chilton, came William Booth, bringing the word of God and a message of comfort and salvation, both spiritual and physical. How he achieved his aim, and how his little East End Mission grew from a tent into a vast, worldwide organization, is told in *Marching to Glory*.

When he formed the Salvation Army, Booth was a Methodist minister. But he found the church too restrictive. His Christian Mission movement had to find its own way.

He was helped by a small band of devoted volunteers, but opposition was strong: churchmen accused Booth of irreverence, self-seeking, fanaticism; Rationalists saw him as a medieval figure leading men back to superstition; liquor magnates encouraged young toughs to break up Army meetings and parades.

But opposition only strengthened Booth's resolve. When he died in 1912 he was hailed by many as one of the great men of 19th-century England. And today the Salvation Army's activities, in addition to its Christian teaching, include the giving of valuable help in running missionary hospitals, welfare clinics, leprosy centres, and agricultural settlements in developing countries.

and American scene," Cohen says, "but the big problem was that the rights to some of the plays I considered were not available. I think there are 4½ giants in 20th-century drama: Ibsen, Strindberg and Chekhov are the greats, Shaw makes four, and the half is O'Casey, because after *Juno and the Paycock* he never really fulfilled his promise. Chekhov has been done to death. I couldn't choose two Scandinavian playwrights who were roughly contemporary if I were to cover the whole drama scene. All the great Ibsen plays have been done many times, so, to open the series I choose Strindberg's *To Damascus*, which, though written half a century before Albee and Tennessee Williams, surpasses them in dealing with marital tensions and the commitment of the artist who feels that what he owes his art supercedes that which he owes his fellow men. *To Damascus* is autobiographical to a large extent, but it is great art. I adapted it myself. It was a real challenge, but a true labor of love."

This beautiful work, a powerful combination of realism and fantasy, was derived from Strindberg's almost nightmarish view of his experiences during various crises in his strange life. The first two parts were written in 1898 when he was recovering from a bout of madness. The third, written six years later, was inspired by the brief happiness of his marriage to Harriet Bosse, and ends with a promise of spiritual peace. It will be produced in Toronto by Esse Ljungh.

Cohen says: "As I finalized my choices for the series, I became

aware that they had a theme running through them—the yearning of men and women to be whole, to be accepted as full-bodied, psychological and social entities, no longer isolated in the crowd, or on the outside of society looking in. This theme was not intentional on my part, but it revealed a lot about me and about society in general."

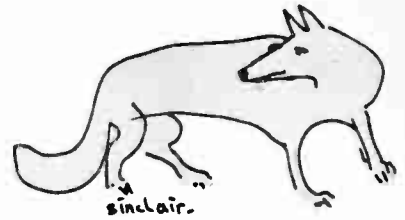
The second play of Cohen's Choice is Harley Granville-Barker's *Madras House*, adapted by Andrew Allan. "Shaw wasn't the only one writing witty plays of social conscience at the turn of the century," Cohen says. "Granville-Barker was just as witty, civilized and intelligent, writing plays heavily criticizing the British class which gained money and pleasure from exploiting factory girls working for pennies a day, and then was shocked when the girls went on strike. *Madras House* is a very good play and extremely funny."

The third choice in the series, to be produced in Montreal by Rupert Caplan, is Pirandello's *Tonight We Improvise*, adapted by George Salverson. Cohen says it's "brilliant."

"Of course I had to pick an Irish play," he goes on, "and I'm sick and tired of all the overexposed ones, so I chose Synge's *The Tinker's Wedding*." Joseph Schull has adapted it.

Cohen says he has a high opinion of Jean Anouilh, but he has no Anouilh favorite, so he picked a play characteristic of the author's dark comedies he admires: *The Rehearsal*, adapted by John Bethune and produced in the Vancouver studios by Gerald Newman. "We all know Brecht and his Marxist theme," Cohen points out, "but I think his earlier works are better, such as his highly surrealistic *In the Swamp*, about the secret pressures that rock our security, about the fragmentation of personality as two sides of self-struggle to come together or to destroy each other." Cohen has adapted it for the series, as well as *The Killer* by Eugene Ionesco, which deals with the problems of the artist in a mechanized world.

Cohen has also chosen Giraudoux's *Judith*—"because *Ondine* and

The Madwoman of Chaillot have been done to death, and because I don't like *The Trojan War Will End Tonight*." *Judith* has been adapted by John Bethune.

Of all the American playwrights, Saroyan will last longest, Cohen feels, because "for years he has been writing romantic plays about the way life ought to be, rather than about what it will be. *My Heart's in the Highlands* is a gorgeous play, probing deeply into the American conscience with great simplicity." Tommy Tweed has adapted it, and it is expected to be produced in Halifax by Peter Donkin.

The June 14th selection for Cohen's Choice is *The Awakening of Spring* by German expressionist Frank Wedekind.

Cohen has also chosen *The Making of Moo* by Nigel Dennis, "because in the 20th-century world, religion as we know it doesn't function reliably, and this is the only play I know which says so—a genuine atheist play. "It will be produced in Winnipeg by Tony Ross. Cohen wanted to present two American plays by white authors, dealing with the "most crucial single socio-cultural problem in the American experience—the Negro-white question, which is really a sexual problem, a deep fear. I wanted one play summing up the attitude to this in the '30s and '40s. I settled on *All God's Chillun Got Wings* by Eugene O'Neill, adapted by Len Peterson—and another to compare it with, offering a picture of the situation today. I thought of Leroy Jones's *Dutchman*, or Albee's *The Death of Bessie Smith*, but couldn't get the rights. So I'm still looking."

exactly how long it was to last; it could have continued for a decade. The Council of Trent, the 19th council, held during the Renaissance, continued for 18 years. The council of 1870 (which was not concluded in the eyes of the Vatican) was suspended after six months, when Rome was occupied by the forces of Victor Emmanuel II, seeking to unify Italy.

Pope John XXIII did not live to see the 21st council complete its work. At the time of his death, in June, 1963, only the first session had been accomplished. Pope Paul VI continued the council and opened the second session on the 29th September, 1963. Vatican II ended three years after it had begun when the fourth and final session was closed by Pope Paul VI last December.

To study and discuss what Vatican II accomplished and what it has meant to Christians throughout the world, CBC-TV is presenting this week a special program entitled *Teach-In: The Vatican Council*. Organized by the Rev. B. D. Freeland, assistant network supervisor of religious broadcasts,

A FEW MONTHS ago a group of young radical theologians in the United States announced a startling proposition that shocked Christian traditionalists: the church must face up to the fact that God is dead and try to get along without him. The chief proponents of the "God is dead" movement are Thomas J. J. Altizer, associate professor of religion at Atlanta's Emory University; Paul Van Buren, associate professor of religion at Temple University, Philadelphia; and Dr. William Hamilton of Colgate Rochester Divinity School, New York.

Dr. Hamilton was in Toronto recently to speak at a meeting of theological students held at St. Joseph's High School, and what he

had to say to them was recorded for radio's *Christian Frontiers* (sub-titled *The Post Mortem on God*), Tuesday, May 10th at 7:30 p.m. Hamilton's visit was sponsored by the Toronto Theological Students' Association as part of a program of events planned by that body. The audience represented various denominations, principally Anglican and Roman Catholic. The students, most of whom are in their early 20s, were generally critical of Dr. Hamilton's point of view and did not let him off lightly in their questioning of some of his statements. Debating the issue with Dr. Hamilton was Dr. William Fennell of Emmanuel College, University of Toronto.

and produced by Vincent Tovell, the *Teach-In* will be broadcast before a studio audience, which will be invited to participate by questioning a panel of clergymen and laymen after the discussion period. It is expected that many church groups across the country will meet to see this program and debate the issues afterwards.

On television the *Teach-In* begins at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 7th, and is divided into three parts, sub-titled *The Vatican Council in a World Revolution*; *The Vatican Council - Roman Catholics and Other Christians*; and *The Vatican Council - The Individual Conscience*. The chairman is Dr. Lawrence Lynch, professor of philosophy, St. Michael's College, University of Toronto. The Rev. Dr. Albert C. Outler of Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Texas (who was official observer for the World Methodist Council at Vatican II) will deliver the opening statement on Part I, which will be followed by comment from the Very Rev. Aelred Graham, O.S.B., Prior of the Benedictine Priory at Portsmouth, R.I.

Panelists on the first part are: the Most Rev. Maurice Baudoux,

Archbishop of St. Boniface; the Most Rev. Alexander Carter, Bishop of Sault Ste. Marie; the Rev. Dr. Eugene Fairweather, Keble Professor of Divinity, Trinity College, University of Toronto (an official observer at the Vatican Council for the Anglican Communion); the Rev. Dr. George Johnston, United College, Montreal, member of the Faculty of Divinity, McGill University; and Robert Kaiser, a Roman Catholic layman who was assigned to cover the Vatican Council for *Time* magazine and who is the author of several books on Roman Catholicism.

Following questions from the audience, Part II opens with a statement by the Rev. Dr. William A. Visser't Hooft, General Secretary of the World Council of Churches. The comment on this will be given by the Most Rev. Maurice Baudoux; the topic *Roman Catholics and Other Christians* is then discussed by the panel and the audience. The opening statement on the last part of the program will be made by the Most Rev. Alexander Carter.

Accordion For Serious Music?

YOUNG DANISH musician-composer Mogens Ellegaard, one of the few internationally famous concert accordionists, for whom several world-renowned composers have written special works, will give a recital on *CBC Tuesday Night*, May 10th, at 10:35. His program will continue the Scandinavian flavor established earlier in the evening, at 8:05, with a performance of the August Strindberg drama, *To Damascus*. When he appeared with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra earlier this year (to give the North American premiere of Bentzon's Accordion Concerto, composed for him) Ellegaard talked to the press about the problems he has encountered in trying to convince some conductors and concert-goers that the accordion is a serious instrument. The main difficulty, he said, is that "usually people who like serious music are not fond of the accordion, and those who like the accordion are often not interested in serious music."

The Danes have long been fond of the instrument, and the orchestra in Odense, Hans Christian Andersen's city, is the only one in Denmark, Ellegaard says, that won't admit that the accordion has a place outside a beergarden.

May 7th - 13th

MANY CRITICS think an American, Robert Lowell, is the greatest living poet, tapping the core of our being as no other poet has done for years. He has a shimmering gift for language passionate but taut, a lively inventiveness that can blend the tragic and lofty, the past and future so vibrantly that time stands still, and it is possible to see the whole picture of the way we have come and the way we are going as if they were all one piece, remote and yet as close and warm as our breath, ominous yet somehow comforting.

One of his most talked-of works, which has just been published, after an off-Broadway success two years ago, is *The Old Glory*, a trilogy based on stories by Hawthorne and a short novel by Herman Melville, examining the American character from three aspects in its historical development. The third of them, *Benito Cereno*, set in 1803, uncovers some of the seeds of present American unrest, as it looks into the horror of slavery and violence. Gerald Newman will produce and direct a radio performance of it in the Vancouver studios on Friday night, May 13th, in the series *The Human Condition*.

The play opens when an idealistic, kindly Yankee merchant captain, Amasa Delano, pays a visit to a mysterious slave ship anchored off South America. The ship is in a disgusting state of squalor and the crew terrified. Its captain, Benito Cereno, a noble Spaniard now tremblingly vague and semi-hysterical, is dominated by an unctuous, officious slave named Babu. Gradually Delano unravels a horrible tale of rebellious brutality, and witnesses the humiliation of some of those on board in several degrading rituals, until his love of freedom and justice forces him to further bloody action that ends the play on a high note of anguish.

Walter Marsh is heard as Captain Delano; David Hughes as John Perkins; Robert Clothier as Don Benito Cereno; Derek Ralston as Babu; Lee Taylor as Atufal; Peter Brockington as Francesco; and Eric Schneider, Sam Payne, Merv Campone and Rae Brown as Negroes.

The program will also include a performance of Bela Bartok's lyrically introspective *Quartet No. 6*, by violinists Arthur Polson and Campbell Trowsdale, violist Smyth Humphries, and 'cellist Ernst Friedlander.

Winnipeg Children's Home

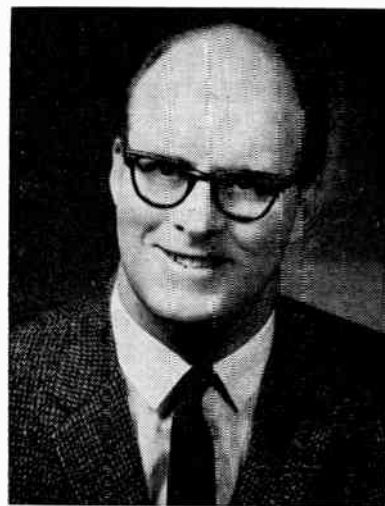
IN WINNIPEG the Children's Home has been helping children in need of care and attention for over 80 years, ever since it was established in 1883 by the Christian Women's Union of Winnipeg. At that time its chief purpose was to provide a home for destitute and homeless boys. Four years later it was set up as a separate body from the CWU (it was officially incorporated on June 10th, 1887, as The Children's Home of Winnipeg) and continued as a refuge for homeless children until the 1940s. After the Second World War fewer children needed the help of the Home, as adoption and foster care became more widespread. The Home then revamped its services to concentrate on care for disturbed adolescent girls, later opening a second institution to treat younger children of both sexes.

By 1964 it had become apparent that still another service was needed — counselling for the parents for the disturbed child. Today, the Children's Home provides: individual, family and group counselling for the parents of children undergoing treatment; a Half-Way House for boys and girls who no longer need the intensive treatment available at the two Homes; a summer camp for 30 disturbed children (some of whom are not resident at the Home); a limited and experimental day treatment program; treatment following discharge (where indicated); a field work placement for students from the University of Manitoba School of Social Work.

The executive director of the Children's Home is David Critchley, a graduate of Mount Allison University and the University of Toronto's School of Social Work. Before joining the Children's Home he was community secretary at Broadview Y.M.C.A. in Toronto; youth organizer for the Bermuda Social Welfare Board; department supervisor at University Settlement in Toronto; and associate executive director and co-ordinator of youth services for the Welfare Council of Edmonton. He is married and the father of four children.

David Critchley and the parents and children who look to him and the Children's Home for help will be heard on radio's *Soundings* series Thursday at 7:30 p.m., in the second half of the two-part program *Trouble on the Home Front*.

To parents who approach the Children's Home for help, Critchley says: "First, and I can't stress this too much, we stand for you and your child. Children's Home is here for one reason — to do all within its power to help disturbed children and their parents. Most parents have misgivings about whether they are doing the right thing when they seek our help.

"... you won't find blame."

Some parents have more than misgivings and are plain angry. They feel that have been pushed from one expert to another with lots of opinions given but very little help.

"Whatever you find at Children's Home, you won't find blame. As far as we are concerned, words like blame, judge, and condemn erect barriers between people. We are here to locate and remove obstacles to human understanding and the enjoyment of life. We know we are far from perfect and we don't expect it in others. To those parents who worry about mistakes they have made, we say: 'What makes you think you have to be so different from all the other parents in the world?'

"Parents wonder what we have to offer that they cannot provide. There is no one answer to this. Most disturbed children, because of their problems, are not able to cope with life on an equal footing with other children their age. Children's Home can provide a more protected setting than is possible in most homes, especially where there are brothers and sisters. Also, it is usually comforting for the disturbed child to realize that there are other children with problems and also to see children who have made progress in overcoming their problems."

30 Years Since Radio's Big On-the-Spot Story

ON EASTER SUNDAY, April 12th, 1936, at exactly 11:00 p.m. Atlantic Standard Time, one of three Toronto men at the 141-foot level of a worked-out gold mine in Halifax County, N.S., pulled a thin, wire signal-cord to summon a skip to take them to the surface.

For some reason that has never been explained, the slight movement of that strand of wire brought the whole shaft crashing down. Thousands of tons of broken rock and rotting timbers fell in a matter of seconds, completely choking the only escape route to the surface.

The Moose River Mine story had begun; and radio history was about to be made.

As news broke that the men were still alive, Canadian and American newspapers rushed in reporters to wait through what turned out to be a 10-day vigil before the trapped men were brought to the surface, one of them dead.

J. Frank Willis, stationed in Halifax as the only reporter east of Montreal for the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission (forerunner of the CBC), was sent to the scene of the disaster. At 4:30 p.m. AST on Monday, April 20th, he broadcast the first radio network news report from Moose River.

From that time, Willis, with the help of Arleigh Canning, Halifax studio operator at the time and still with the CBC today, delivered

two- to three-minute bulletins every half hour to the network and continued until 2:00 a.m., Thursday morning, April 23rd, with only one two-hour rest period during the small hours of Wednesday morning.

All 58 radio stations in Canada carried the Willis reports of the rescue operations. So did 650 stations in the United States—a record for those days.

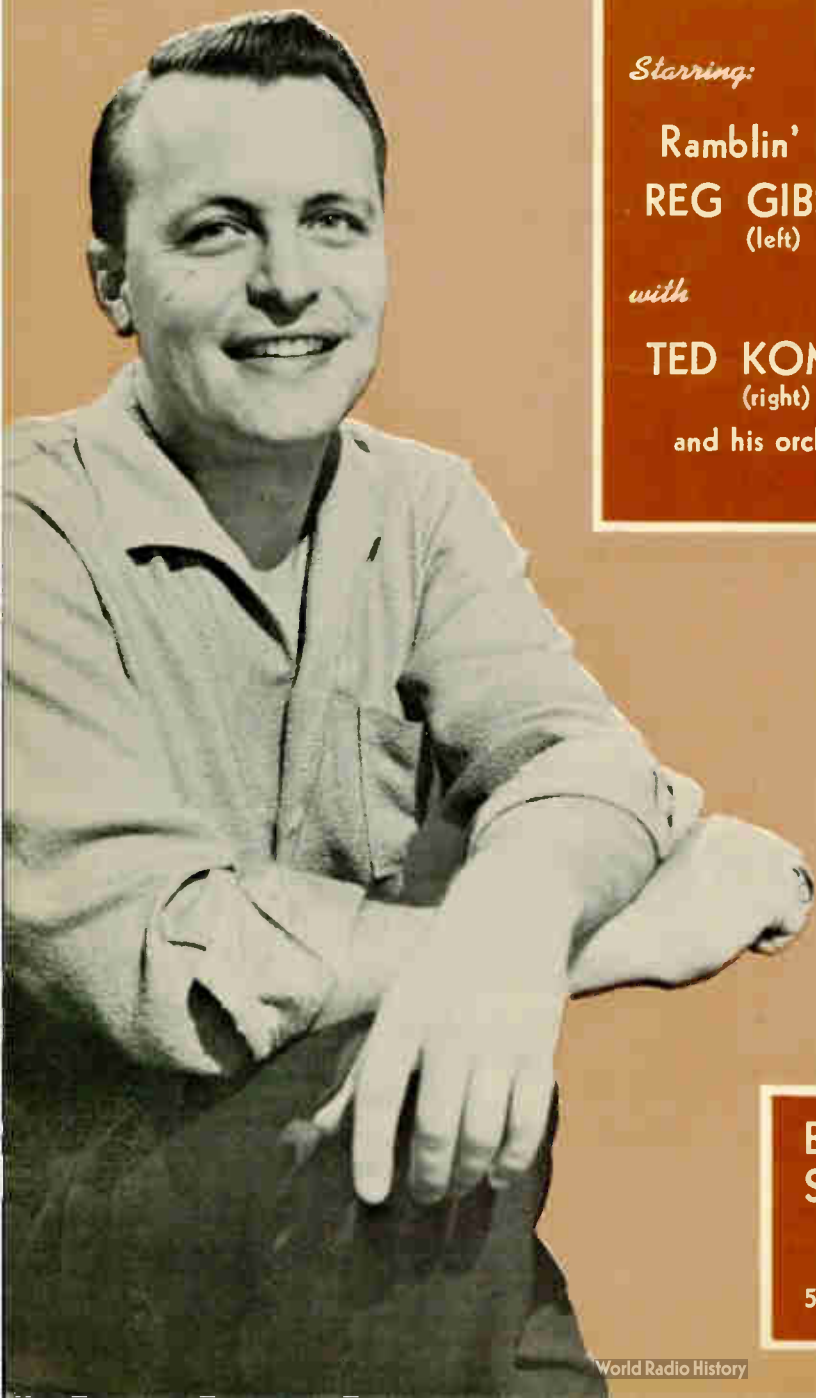
There were other records, too: 99 consecutive broadcasts without a single operating error, made over rural telephone circuits. And the whole operation was carried out without any remote equipment, except for a borrowed remote amplifier, which Canning describes as “an antique even in those days.”

There were a few strange reactions to the marathon broadcast. “The mayor of Winnipeg,” recalls Willis, “apparently wanted my head for keeping people up night after night—ears glued to their radio receivers. But the first envelope I opened after arriving home contained a kind, thoughtful letter; for some reason this released the nervous tension which had built up within me. I began to cry, and I couldn't stop for two hours. It was something like 120 hours since I'd been to bed, and I sometimes feel I've never caught up on my sleep since.”
