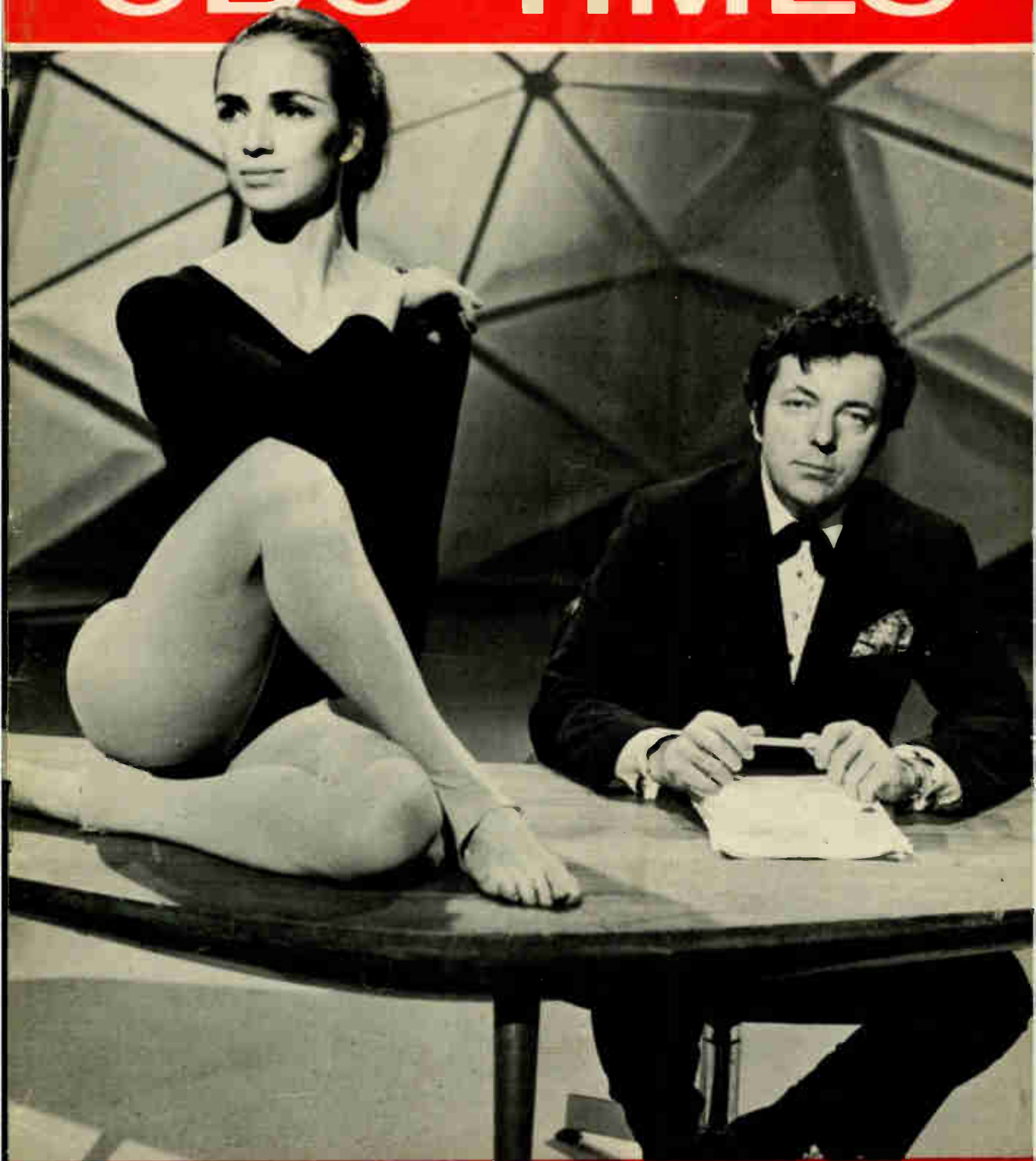

Dan E. Cameron

THE APPOINTMENT of Dan E. Cameron, of Winnipeg, to the position of Special Assistant to the Vice-President, Administration, Ottawa, for the CBC has been announced.

Since 1953, Mr. Cameron has been the Program Director for the CBC's Prairie Region for both Radio and Television. He joined the staff of the CBC in 1942 as a producer of Public Affairs and Schools Broadcasts in the Regional Office at Winnipeg. In 1948, he became Manager for Alberta and opened the CBC's first Alberta radio station, CBX, with offices and studios in Edmonton. He was appointed Regional Program Director and returned to Winnipeg when the Corporation was planning for the introduction of television in the Prairie Region.

During his period of service on the Prairies, Mr. Cameron has assisted in the development of CBC owned and operated radio stations in Winnipeg, Edmonton, Regina and Calgary, and television stations in Winnipeg and Edmonton.

His Ottawa appointment is effective November 1st.

WESTERN CANADA'S farmers are among the best in the world. This fact is proven each year at this time, when a creditable share of the awards at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto are garnered by Prairie residents. The world's largest agricultural exhibition, it attracts entrants from around the globe, seeking recognition on an international scale. But most of the championship titles stay at home.

CBC radio as usual is offering up-to-the-minute coverage of the fair with daily broadcasts at various times. CBC Winnipeg farm commentator Garth Taylor is on the scene to report on the latest results of the judging late each afternoon, November 10th-12th and 14th-16th on all Prairie stations. The broadcasts are repeated the following morning at 7:15 a.m. on CBW, CBK, and CBR. As well, Garth reports daily at 12:30 p.m. on the Farm Broadcast.

Dr. Melville Cooke, on the fifth broadcast. Producer: Bernard Deaville.

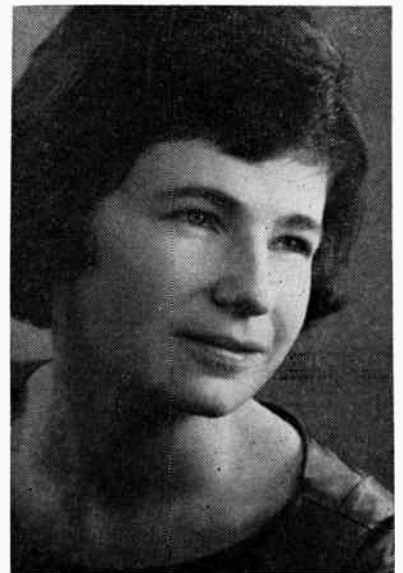
Beginning the series is a broadcast of Howard Ferguson's *Octet*, opus 4.

A YOUNG PIANIST of such stature that she may be said to be a real Canadian "find" is heard Tuesday, November 15th at 3:30 p.m. on *Prairie Concert*. She is Irmgard Braun-Baerg of Winnipeg, recently returned from three years of advanced study on an exchange scholarship in Detwold, Germany, with Kretschmar-Fischer and Gunther Wiessenhorn.

Born in Winnipeg in 1942, she began piano studies at the age of nine with Winnipeg teacher Wanda Dick, completing her A.M.M. performer's standing with first class honors at the age of 19. A year later, under tutorage of Helen Aubert, she completed her A.R.C.T. performer's examination, also with first class honors.

Her program includes compositions by Prokofiev and Dupont-Mozart. Benjamin Horch is the producer.

JULIUS CAESAR

Canadian School Telecasts presents a special production of Shakespeare's play.

ONE OF the most important presentations of this season's *Canadian School Telecasts* on CBC-TV is the special two-hour production of Shakespeare's *Julius Caesar*, which will be telecast this Thursday morning, November 17th, at 10:00 on the network. Budd Knapp appears in the title role, with Len Birman as Brutus, Chris Wiggins as Cassius, Peter Donat as Mark Antony, Dawn Greenhalgh as Portia, Moya Fenwick as Calpurnia, Ken James as Casca, and John Horton as Octavius.

This production, which was adapted and directed by producer Herbert Roland, is the largest ever undertaken by the CBC Schools and Youth department. It includes some spectacular battle scenes, filmed on location outside Toronto in suburban Scarborough. In his production notes Roland stresses three main points which he feels need to be brought out: "(1) Julius Caesar himself. Even though it is a comparatively small part, in my opinion the play is aptly named. The spirit of Caesar *must* predominate everything. Before and after his death he is the main

driving force—his deeds and actions are the cause of all happenings. We must understand him . . . ; (2) The crowd. This mass of human beings plays a vital part in this play. They set the mood, they are played upon, their emotions are stirred to fever pitch, they change loyalties with the wind, but they are there, strong and meaningful. Unless they do come through as a force to be reckoned with,

Brutus' and Antony's orations lose their meaning, and unless we see the man in the street there will be little contrast between them and the 'Nobles'; (3) As in any play, it is of the utmost importance that all of the characters live and become real human beings. Each conspirator must be unique and a believable person; in other words, we must be in Rome 44 B.C., amongst real, living people."

WEEK OF NOVEMBER 5th - 11th, 1966

Because each issue of the CBC Times must be mailed so far in advance of the program week covered in it, some changes in scheduling and in program content are inevitable. These are noted below.

A FEW MONTHS ago, when a new recording of Wagner's music drama, *Götterdämmerung*, the last work in his mammoth Ring Cycle, was made in Vienna with a cast of celebrated performers, critic Alec Robertson spoke for many when he called it "the greatest achievement in gramophone history." This Wednesday night, November 16th, TV viewers will be taken behind the scenes to see how the record was made, in a 90-minute BBC documentary called *The Golden Ring*. It includes actual "takes" of many of the greatest portions of the opera, including the Immolation Scene, Siegfried's Funeral March, and the Vengeance Trio which ends Act Two.

The program is of almost Wagnerian proportions itself—is said to be the biggest production of its kind ever televised. It gives a clear impression of the enormous musical and technical resources involved in the making of the *Götterdämmerung* recording, which is the latest chapter in an ambitious project to record the whole Ring Cycle—17 stereophonic hours of music.

The opera is conducted by Hungarian-born Georg Solti, musical director at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, and one of the most dynamic and exciting of contemporary conductors. The cast is studded with world-renowned names. Brünnhilde is sung by Birgit Nilsson, acclaimed as the greatest living Wagnerian soprano; Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau sings the role of Gunther, and other famous artists seen in the documentary are Wolfgang Windgassen, Gottlieb Frick, and Claire Watson. The orchestra is the Vienna Philharmonic, which Solti calls "the finest Wagner orchestra in the world." Narration and production are by Humphrey Burton.

The program was filmed in co-operation with the Austrian Television Service. For the final eight days of the recording, a mobile television unit moved into the elegant Sofiensaal in Vienna, a gilded ballroom once lit by candles or gaslight, where the delicate strains of the minuet and waltz mingled with the swish of taffeta and the tinkle of laughter, but

The Art of Glenn Gould

A new FM series
starting next week
presents just one of the
opportunities CBC audiences
will have of hearing and
seeing our foremost pianist.

ONE GOOD THING about pianist Glenn Gould's dislike of live concerts and preference for working in the recording studio is the fact that it precludes his leaving the country often for long concert tours in foreign places, and gives his fellow Canadians more opportunities to hear his brilliant piano technique and enjoy his shrewd and witty comments about music. Besides being an internationally celebrated performer, he is a delightful conversationalist with wide interests which he approaches with a zestful combination of sophistication,

curiosity, and acute intuition.

This season he'll make many appearances on CBC radio and TV. An AM radio highlight will be his *CBC Tuesday Night* recital on November 29th. And on FM, beginning Sunday, November 20th, he'll be heard in an extended weekly series entitled *The Art of Glenn Gould*. Produced by Richard Coulter, it will present all Gould's recordings released to date, as well as several of his performances on tape which Columbia Records is allowing the CBC to broadcast before they are released on commer-

cial disks. From time to time Gould will turn up in the series with extemporaneous commentary about his recordings and other musical matters. The host will be Ken Haslam. During the first few programs listeners will hear the *Goldberg Variations*; *Fantasia* by Oscar Morawetz; *Partita No. 5* by Bach, and *Quintet in F Minor* by Brahms (with the Montreal String Quartet), three early recordings made for the CBC International Service; the Beethoven sonatas which constitute his second Columbia recording — Opus 109 in E Major, and Opus 110 in A Flat Major; and *Concerto in D Minor* by Bach, with Leonard Bernstein and the Columbia Symphony Orchestra. Early in the series there will be an hour-long documentary prepared by Gould, in which he explains how recordings are made and why, with specific details and illustrations from his own records.

Glenn Gould is the sort of person who thrives on new ideas and new approaches to old concepts, so musical ruts are abhorrent to him. One of the main reasons he prefers the recording studio to the concert hall (apart from the absence of mass audiences, which he calls "a chilling force of evil," "a rule of mob law") is the opportunity the studio offers "for enormous concentration, exploring the many expressions possible in a

*A drama about the Spanish Civil War, and
a recital recorded at the University of Toronto
— on CBC radio Tuesday, November 15th.*

DRAMA

THIRTY YEARS ago this month, the siege of Madrid confirmed the start of a bloody era of savagery and disillusionment: the Spanish Civil War. *CBC Tuesday Night* at 8:10 recalls the shattering effect of the war on Spaniards of all beliefs, no matter what part they had in it. In a script called *The Zone*, Tony Ross of Winnipeg has dramatized Michel Del Castillo's moving novel, *The Disinherited*, translated from the French by Humphrey Hare. Produced in Montreal by Rupert Caplan, it will serve as a curtain-raiser for two programs on November 22nd: a major documentary about the war, and a performance of Benjamin Britten's *The Ballad of Heroes*.

"Castillo," Ross tells us, "was a child of the Civil War until six, when he made his escape to France with refugees after the 1939 Franco victory. The novel is his way of tracing his roots from memory and the reliable witness of friends. The story concerns only a billsticker, a young man of Madrid's worst slum, The Zone. At the outset of the war he joins the communist party to escape from The Zone. The party is his way of hope. Towards the war's end it has become for him, and all the main characters, the way of despair. The Zone remains. Castillo portrays fairly, indeed sympathetically, the communist encounters, but concludes that politics alone is not enough to cure poverty. It appeals to me because it's as fair an account of the holocaust as you can get at this distance, in terms of human values. Hugh Thomas'

MUSIC

AT 9:00, *CBC Tuesday Night* will present a major portion of a program in the Ten Centuries Concerts series, recorded at the Edward Johnson Building, University of Toronto, on November 13th. It features soprano Mary Simmons and an instrumental group consisting of Robert Aitken, flute and piccolo; Stanley McCartney, clarinet; Norman Tobias, bassoon; Eugene Rittich, French horn; Corol McCartney, violin; John Mair, viola; Ronald Laurie, 'cello; and Ruth Budd, double bass.

The broadcast includes *Frauentanz*, a 1924 work for soprano and five instruments by Kurt Weill; *Bassoon Quartet* by François Devienne (1760-1803); and *Machines Agricoles* by Darius Milhaud, a setting of words from a farm implement catalogue, each movement ending with the price quote! Milhaud, a strong, amiable man who has been wheelchair-bound for some 35 years, is one of the most witty and ingenious of contemporary composers. As a young man, he was a member of the famous (once infamous) group of French composers known as Les Six. He has written every conceivable type of music, and for many years has taught at the Aspen Music Festival in Colorado.

Kurt Weill was a tiny tadpole of a man with big eyes behind thick glasses, who wrote his first opera at 13, and at 18 was an opera conductor in his native Germany. After he began to concentrate on composing for the theatre, bridging the gap

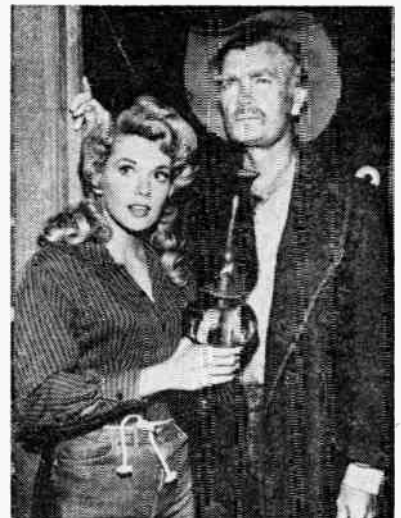

particular work, and gaining ideas as one goes along. If you come to the studio prepared for one 'take', as you *must* do in the concert hall, you can get only one conception of the work. But I feel that doing even as many as 16 takes, each one slightly different, and splicing the best portions together for the final disk, is a legitimate way of making a record, though it's not always necessary. For instance, last month I recorded Hindemith's *Second Sonata* for my *CBC Tuesday Night* recital, and the week after that I recorded it for Columbia—these were the first times I had done it. The Columbia recording was practically a recital, with not more than two inserts. I'm not persuaded that I get better results by forcing myself to do fewer

takes, but if not fewer, why not more? I get quite extraordinary ideas in working with several takes, comparing adjacent versions. Once I made two takes of a Bach *Fugue*, each a straight-through performance. One turned out lighthearted, cute and rather skittish, but not serious enough. The other was too leaden-heavy-footed and dull.

"In timing them we discovered something most unusual. Almost always, although the mood differential in each was different, the tempo differential was not. They had the same pace. Only the phrasing was different. We spent almost an hour listening to them, switching from one to another. Then the producer suggested amalgamating them. So we used the pompous one for the opening statement and, when relief was called for, we cut to the lighter one. In retrospect the final product sug-

gested both sides of the theatrical mask. I think it was one of my best shows."

Gould tells us that his recordings are about a third Bach, and probably he won't be finished recording the composer for another 10 years! We asked him about his own composing, and he said he hasn't done any for a year because he has decided to re-think his whole attitude to 20th-century music. This season he'll be giving several Centennial recitals; he has video-taped two programs for CBC-TV; on Wednesday, November 30th, he'll be heard discussing improvisation in music, in the FM series *Ideas*; on November 9th he appeared in a CBC-produced program for *Intertel* about the Culture Explosion; and he's doing a lot of writing, mainly for *Hi-Fidelity* magazine. Next month's edition will include two Gould articles.

The 'Underground' Cinema

THERE IS A part of the North American art scene of the '60s that we in Canada rarely, if ever, have the opportunity to see and evaluate for ourselves — the so-called "underground" cinema, formerly the New American Cinema. Even in the United States the work of this school is seldom seen outside its birthplace, New York City. The few films which did travel outside New York to play the equally few "art" houses can be counted on the fingers of one hand — John Cassavetes' *Shadows*, Shirley Clarke's version of the stage play *The Connection*, Lionel Rogosin's *On the Bowery*, and the Mekas brothers' *Hallelujah the Hills*.

The chief spokesman and organizer for the underground cinema in New York is Jonas Mekas, who not only makes films, either on his own or in collaboration with his brother Adolfas, but also writes a column of film criticism in the magazine *Village Voice* and publishes the official organ of the whole movement, *Film Culture*.

Mekas is also responsible for the formation of the Film Makers' Co-operative, which rents and releases the work of its 80 or so members, and the Film Makers' Cinematheque, a place where subscribers can see "the newest works and also study the old masters without the dust of history and the stuffed shirt."

The kind of films one is likely to see at the Cinematheque include the frankly erotic, like Kenneth Anger's *Scorpio Rising* or Jack Smith's *Flaming Creatures*, and

the frankly boring, like Andy Warhol's Pop pictures *Empire*, or *Sleep*, or *Haircut*. *Empire* is, of course, the celebrated static motion picture of the Empire State building in which absolutely nothing happens. *Sleep* is an uninterrupted eight-hour close-up of a man asleep (the devotees of this film claim the excitement comes in waiting for the subject to turn over), and *Haircut* is a film of — a haircut. Warhol recently made his first sound picture, *Harlot*, in which, finally, something does happen and people actually talk, but by all accounts this is every bit as static and monotonous as his previous films.

In between these extremes, the shock pictures and the tedious oddities, there are some films and film-makers of genuine worth. Some even follow quite conventional forms of the cinema.

On CBC-TV's *The Umbrella* this week (Sunday at 5:00 p.m.), we meet two practitioners of the underground cinema who make experimental films that have a logical structure, films which tell a story with a beginning, a middle and an end. William Ronald, host of *The Umbrella*, introduces the Kuchar brothers, Mike and George, and their film *Mosholu Holiday*, which was commissioned by *The Umbrella*. This comic film takes its title from the name of a park in the Bronx, where the twin brothers live, and features in the "cast" William Ronald and his wife.

The Umbrella is produced by John Kennedy.

NEWSMAGAZINE THE PUBLIC EYE

ON THE FIRST of this month, CBC-TV introduced a new News and Public Affairs program, *This Week*, which combined the elements of two established series, *Newsmagazine* and *The Public Eye*. Last season these two programs shared the 10:00 to 11:00 p.m. time slot on Tuesday nights and complemented each other in the coverage of events, *Newsmagazine* specifically treating hard news, *The Public Eye* analyzing current affairs.

For some time the executive producers of these series, Donald Cameron of *Newsmagazine* and Richard Nielsen of *The Public Eye*, had felt that better results could be achieved in this area of programming through co-operation. Last August they received clearance from the News and Public Affairs Departments for a co-operative arrangement between the two shows on an experimental basis.

The new arrangement combines News facilities with those of Public Affairs for the first time, and theoretically achieves the best of both worlds. By their nature, Public Affairs programs have lacked the capability for actuality coverage of fast-breaking events, while News programs, by the same token,

Writer, Stegner

"THOSE FIVE YEARS in a really rough and unregenerate frontier hamlet are more important to me than any five years in my life." Wallace Stegner speaking, recalling a time nearly half a century ago when he spent a part of his boyhood in Eastend, Saskatchewan, in the Cypress Hills. Stegner, the novelist and short story writer has written about the prairie life in the early part of the century in several books — *Big Rock Candy Mountain*, *On a Darkling Plain*, and *Wolf Willow*. He says that the prairie country is "more impressive to the senses than any other kind of country I know. It's much simpler and much less complicated to take in and ultimately more overpowering. I really think that's the most impressive country I know, and I've seen some pretty impressive countries since."

Today Wallace Stegner teaches writing at Stanford University in California, where he is head of the Creative Writing department. Among his non-fiction works are

The Gathering of Zion, the history of the Mormon Trail; and *The American Novel — from James Fenimore Cooper to Faulkner*, a compendium of literary essays.

Stegner was visited at his home in California recently by Fletcher Markle for this week's *Telescope* program, *Stegner of the Cypress Hills* (Thursday, November 17th at 9:00 p.m.), which, incidentally is written by another prairie writer, W. O. Mitchell.

There were quite a lot of things Markle wanted to discuss with Stegner, most particularly the Canadian West in the first decade of this century, which Stegner has so vividly re-created, and the practice of writing while at the same time teaching it.

This edition of *Telescope* was directed by Fletcher Markle. It includes scenes of Stegner's Saskatchewan, during which the author reads passages from his books set in the prairie country. *Telescope* is produced by Peter Kelly.

Berlin, during the Second World War and at present, is dealt with on two programs of the PROJECT '67 series.

BERLIN

THIS WEEK CBC radio's *Project '67* series begins a two-part documentary program on Berlin, prepared in that city by freelance broadcaster Charles Wassermann and CBC producer Dita Vadron. The first part, *A Pile of Bricks*, traces the life of Berlin as a beleaguered war-time city, through its destruction and then reconstruction, to a time when a new crisis appeared — the Wall. Part two, on Sunday, November 19th, is entitled *The Conscience of Germany* and deals with the city today, the reactions, opinions, and prognostications of the people who live on both sides of the wall.

Charles Wassermann has prepared the following program notes about the documentary and some of the things listeners will hear:

"When Dita Vadron, my wife Jacqueline and I recently drove into Berlin, we were as unlikely a trio of 'workers for co-existence' as you might expect to meet. Our assignment was to record material — interviews and sound effects — for the *Project* documentary on this divided city. On the surface it appeared to be an interesting but by no means unusual job — a mere matter of finding representative and interesting people to talk about

Berlin past and present, and to place these conversations into a framework of recorded sound effects, some from existing archives. It turned out differently.

"Gathering material for the first part, the atmosphere of Berlin during the last few days of the war, proved to be an exciting opportunity to present to Canadian listeners some extraordinary documentary material which has rarely, if ever, been heard in the West. This material, some of which the Soviet army had captured from the Nazis and then turned over to the East Germans, includes speeches by Goebbels and Himmler.

"The second part of the program turned into something of a unique effort at practical co-existence. Due to our Canadian citizenship, it was possible to move freely back and forth across the Wall. The high point of this work was a series of interviews with students at East Berlin's Humboldt University and others at the Free University and the Technical University in West Berlin. We were able to succeed — at least in part — where politicians have failed miserably: we could arrange a meeting of minds, despite the Wall."

The Perceiving Self

THE PERCEIVING self creates a world. Each one of us selects, rejects, or modifies the overwhelming sensory information which assaults us hour by hour. The selection itself can be a creative act, or it can select out to the point of denial and deprivation. We live with what we can live with, and see the world in our own terms — and call it existence. The dominance of the individual's subjective experience has been especially valued in Western culture, criticized in less personalist societies.

Ideas is presenting the current series on The Perceiving Self in an attempt to confront and bring into the open the priorities given to the first person singular, "the I" which possesses, obsesses, directs, and enlightens each one of us, and gives us our sense of being. (The programs are heard on CBW-FM Monday through Friday at 6:30 p.m.)

But the catch-phrases of recent years — "the crisis of identity," "the lonely crowd," "alienation" — show that somehow we feel our uniqueness threatened. The existentialists insist that the anxiety, emptiness, and dread that go along with loss of meaning cannot be glossed over. And here the catch-phrases are different — "encounter," "becoming," "dialogue." As Dr. Rollo May writes in his Introduction to *Existence, A New Dimension in Psychiatry and Psychology*: "The existential psychologists and psychiatrists do not at all rule out the study of dynamisms, drives, and patterns of behavior. But they hold that these cannot be understood in any given person except in the context of the overarching fact that here is a person who happens to exist, to be, and if we do not keep this in mind, all else we know about this person will lose its meaning." Dr. May's six-week series of talks on Existential Psychotherapy will enlarge on the ways some American and European psychologists have found the most significant philosophical movement of our

time useful in the understanding and treatment of disturbed individuals.

The analysts' consulting room can, of course, be seen as the end result of indulged subjectivity. There the patients file in one by one for retreats on life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. The problem, we feel, is more complex than that. Paul Goodman's analysis of the present state of American democracy, in the Massey Lectures, will perhaps provide some clues. The title he has chosen is *The Moral Ambiguity of America*. It is precisely Goodman's intense moral concern, his stripping away of sham and illusion, that has endeared him to the present generation of young Americans, and in these talks Dr. Goodman is speaking directly to young Canadians. The United States is the one nation in the world where the dogma of individualism has found its richest expression, the nation which has enshrined in its Constitution the right to "Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." Why then should Goodman, one of the country's most important social critics, call his first lecture *The Empty Society* and another *The Psychology of Being Powerless*? Paul Goodman's concern is with the human possibilities in what has become an overwhelmingly technological, bureaucratic, and intrinsically anti-human system.

Mao's China slants away from our theme of subjectivity in a conscious effort to present a counter-theme as we shift perspective to the new China, where a collective effort of the 700 million has transformed an entire country. Perhaps the Chinese haven't found too much difficulty in forsaking individuality for collective goals. Self-transcendence has long been a part of China's religious and cultural heritage. In religion, transcendence has a spiritual goal, but something very like the self-denial of transcendence is also required for the

CBC RECORDINGS '66

LAST MARCH the CBC embarked on a large project: the making of 22 music transcriptions, exclusively for its own use, featuring only Canadian artists and much Canadian music, as well as works by well-known composers from Purcell to Ives. These disks are being given their first exposure on *CBC Tuesday Night* this month and next, and later will be heard from time to time in the music schedule, says Carl Little, assistant radio network supervisor, serious music department. They will serve not only to give some fine Canadian music a national hearing, but in this introductory series will also help to impress on Canadian listeners the wide variety of solo and group talent in this country that is attracting attention at home and abroad.

This Tuesday, November 15th, mezzo-soprano Phyllis Mailing and the CBC Vancouver Chamber Orchestra conducted by John Avison will be heard in a performance of *Socrate* by Erik Satie; and bassoonist George Zukerman and the CBC Montreal Chamber Orchestra conducted by Avison will play *Divertimento No. 3* for bassoon and string orchestra by Canadian composer Jonn Weinzweig. On November 22nd pianist William Aide of Winnipeg, who was a *CBC Talent Festival* winner several seasons ago, plays *Sonata No. 48* in C by Haydn

and *Six Intermezzi* by Brahms; and Winnipeg tenor Peter Koslowsky sings *Liederkries*, Opus 39, by Robert Schumann. The November 29th program features the Halifax Trio, now on the staff of the University of Brandon but retaining their Maritime name, and young baritone John Boyden.

Other artists and groups represented in these transcriptions include Jean Deslauriers conducting the Toronto Symphony Orchestra in works by Canadian composers Oscar Morawetz, Robert Turner and Clermont Pepin; the CBC Chamber Ensemble and the CBC String Orchestra conducted by Boris Brott, the young Montrealer who has been winning high praise in Britain; violinist Marta Hidy, formerly of Winnipeg and now on staff of McMaster University, Hamilton; pianist Sheila Henig; contralto Patricia Rideout, singing *Evocations*, a new work commissioned by the CBC from Harry Somers, who accompanies her on the piano; Vancouver pianist Robert Rogers; the CBC Winnipeg Orchestra in a program of music from the Mannheim period; mezzo-soprano Joan Maxwell; and the University of Manitoba Consort of Ancient Instruments.

This last group took Britain by storm last spring on a tour that included London, the Edinburgh and Aldeburgh Festivals, Glasgow, Durham, Manchester, Devon County, the BBC and a "stately home" where, reports the group's director, Christine Mather, "we played in a gallery built in the early 16th century, and dined afterwards where Henry VIII had dined." Everywhere they went they were showered with praise and ovations, and recall that often they "could hardly get through the program for having to bow so often!" After a Glasgow concert *The Scotsman* reported: "It is indeed rare to have the opportunity to hear at first hand such a battery of ancient instruments so expertly and convincingly played."

have been unable to provide the desired depth of treatment.

The theory is put into practice thus: *News magazine* will continue its emphasis on hard news and features, while *The Public Eye* concentrates on comment and analysis, but planning of subjects will be closely co-ordinated; on weeks when the two programs retain their separate identities, they will use a common studio set, and both programs will be produced by the same director; the host of *The Public Eye*, Warner Troyer, will appear from time to time on *News magazine*, whose reporters will also be seen occasionally on the companion program; once a month the staffs of the two programs will be totally integrated for the production of *This Week*.

The first *This Week* program, seen on November 1st, gave a preview of the U.S. Elections. Close co-operation, but separate identity of programs, marked the November 8th programs from New York on the night of the Elections. This week (November 15th) the programs will deal individually with related topics — *News magazine* will cover the Conservative Party Convention, and *The Public Eye* will

monumental work, *The Spanish Civil War*, now held to be the bible of the war, lacks this, and the reader is left prejudiced. For once, here is a work written from within the Spanish mind, not from Fabian tracts as spoken by English poets of the '30s. It's free of Hemingway's false romanticism. He thought the bull fight was about bull fighters. But the Spanish pay to see the bull. Castillo knows the Spanish Civil War fighting wasn't about communists and fascists, and blames neither. It was about poverty—The Zone."

collective life. The series focusses on the role of Mao Tse-tung in the Chinese revolution, whose great leadership proves that a collective philosophy does not negate the significance of an individual's unique power of self-assertion.

Whether a society is personalist or collectivist, it is made up of individual members of the family of man, man the human animal. He sees, he hears, he touches — he has his senses about him. He perceives. Scientists, especially psychologists, are increasingly devoting their time to investigating exactly how the perceptual processes work. This specialists' approach to perception is revealed in the series by Bill Whitehead, who is interviewing a number of distinguished McGill University psychologists who are In Search of the Senses. But there are many avenues to the continuous human search for knowledge. The long-haired boys and girls in their Carnaby gear risk the flip of LSD and the wide world of expanded consciousness. Musicians seek out an elusive proof in spontaneous improvisations, theo-

logians and philosophers walk "the narrow ridge," as Martin Buber puts it, and great eccentrics and actors create character to hold their world together.

But it is in literature that we find bound together the manifold concerns of the perceiving self. Though one could trace a course from anonymity and universality as a mode in literature to the personal limited world of the individual, the first person in literature has actually taken a more tortuous course. In our series on The First Person in Literature, Professor Louis Dudek, well-known Canadian poet and critic, follows that course, showing how the ego now retreats into coverts, now ranges into the dramatic or the mystic self, now assumes the disguise of an ingenuous "I." It is in literature that we most clearly encounter the self of the senses. It speaks of colors, tastes, touch, pain, pleasure, sounds. The mind receives these riches and speaks of worlds within worlds, of essence and existence, of "I and thou."
