SYDNEY LIPTON MAKES CHANGES IN BAND

Dispenses with strings and . . . NEWS BREAKS THIS WEEK THAT COMMENCING JUNE 9 SYDNEY LIPTON WILL ALTER HIS COMPLETE ORCHESTRA AT THE GROSVENOR HOUSE

With the exception of three of his present musicians, LIPTON informs us that he is dispensing with strings completely as he feels that the many visitors from abroad who are expected at the hotel during the summer season, and the younger patrons, require more music in the pop and dance idiom.

We understand from Mrs. Macconnell, Public Relations Officer of the Hotel, that by June 9 they expect to be keeping the restaurant open until 2.30 a.m. under the new order.

The new band will consist of ten trumpets, one trombone, four saxes and three rhythm. The Shakespeare, that will have instrumental will play first trumpet and Harry Hayes first alto. Bobbie Mickelburgh will be doubling trombone and trumpet and the three members of the present orchestra who will remain are Peter Knight pianist and arranger, Ivor Beynon alto and Arthur Lerher bass.

This new combination will be the lines of Lipton's pre-war Grosvenor House band and remembering the excellent broadcast which we heard from him then, it is to be hoped that we shall have the chance of hearing the new band in the very near future. The singer will be that glamorous twenty two year old vocalist Pat Hutten.
