
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



NOEL HARRISON: 1 Just Can't Wait (Decca).

This isn't the official follow-up to "Windmills," but a track Noel Harrison waxed some months ago for his previous label, cheeky lyric, engagingly delivered by Noel, and set to a tango rhythm — it reminded me, in fact, of "New-Fangled Tango."
