# THE FIRST WORD

**Music Marathon '83** CMJ's Third Annual Convention is drawing near—so register now. Advance registrants will be invited to the **First Annual New Music Awards**, to be held at The Roxy Club in New York on Thursday evening, October 20. Performers will be announced shortly. The convention itself will be held at the New York Sheraton on October 21 and 22. In conjunction with Marathon '83, EMI Records will be hosting a party for Kate Bush on Saturday evening, October 22 at Danceteria in New York City. Featured at the bash will be the world premiere of a Kate Bush concert video recorded at the Hammersmith Odeon in London. Register now for the music event of the year—use the form on page 31.

**CH-CH-CH-CHANGES:** Perhaps inspired by the **Clash's** ousting of **Mick Jones**, **Bow Wow Wow** has kicked **Annabella Lwin** out of the group. They will continue without her, and she will be pursuing a solo career...The **dB's** have announced that **Chris Stamey** has left the group to pursue a solo career. Stamey will be touring solo in October, and the remaining **dB's** will be recording their first LP for Bearsville...**Fear Of Strangers** has called it quits after five years.

**Record News:** The oft-bootlegged and always collectable **Beatles** Christmas tapes will, courts willing, be finally available in LP form from a new label, Richey Records. The thirty minute long LP will simply be called **John Paul George and Ringo** and is scheduled for release November 15. These tapes represent a rare glimpse into the band through songs, poetry, dialogue and various bits of whimsy. They also vividly portray the changes in the band from 1963-66. It looks now as if Epic will not be releasing the new **XTC** LP domestically...A new 5 song **Echo & The Bunnymen** EP will be released 10/26. Included will be the current import hit "Never Stop (Discoteque)"...Look for a **Rodney Dangerfield** rap record on RCA...Cachalot should have two records out any day now. An EP from **Ja Ja Ja** will feature the three tracks "I Am An Animal," "Graffiti Artists International" and "Ja Ja Ja"; and **Lio** will have an EP called **You Go To My Head**. They also plan a French Sampler, **Made In Australia** by year's end...**Hall & Oates** are recording two new tracks for their upcoming "best of" LP. MTV will be premiering the corresponding videos on a Sunday Special 10/23...**Chaperone** has been picked up by USA Records in Los Angeles...Harvey Kubernik has compiled a second spoken word set by L.A. artists, **English As A Second Language (Talking Package)**. Included are members of the **DI's**, **Sheiks Of Shake**, **Black Flag**, **Minutemen**, **Gun Club**, **Surf Punks**, **Blasters**, **Blow Up**, **X**, **Plugz**, **Rain Parade**, **Jane Bond & The Undercovermen**, **The Brat**, **Dream Syndicate**, **Bangles**, **45 Grave** and **Reconstruction**. Contact Tom Johnson from Freeway at 213-787-0130...**Whitesnake's** new LP for Geffen is tentatively titled **Slide It In**.

## JACKPOT! SINGLES, TRACKS, ETC.

★ **JOHN ORSI "Can You Draw Attention" (Double Pack Single) (Lilith, P.O. Box 91, Allston Station, Allston, MA 02134)**—Record labels and programmers take note—John Orsi is a real find. The music on this single runs from straight-ahead rock 'n' roll to synthesized dance music to doomy-mood rhythm/music to jazzy freeform studio ramblings. Taken as whole, it's a striking portrait of a talented and eclectic new artist. Make it happen.

**JIMMY THE HOOVER "Tantalise (Wo Wo Ee Yeh Yeh)" (7") (Columbia, 51 West 52nd St., New York, NY 10019)**—Crisp, bouncy, Caribbean-inflected rock with great vocal and musical hooks—nothing more needed, except maybe a 12" dance mix. Could be a major hit. Who is this guy, anyway?

**FIGURES ON THE BEACH "Swimming" (12") Metro-America, P.O. Box 37044, Detroit, MI 48237**—A soaring dance track which should find major club and new music radio play. Nothing particularly new here—just straight-up dance rock—yet it's done exceptionally well. The 12" includes a "Wet Mix" by Ivan Ivan which further heightens the track's power.

**NINE WAYS TO WIN "Close To You" (LP cut, 12") (Atlantic, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)**—A simple dance-rock track that gradually and completely works its way into your brain. It's reminiscent of A Flock of Seagulls with a hook that goes even further. A natural club as well as new music and college radio record.

- **BORN TO ADD: The Great Rock & Roll From Sesame Street (Sesame Street Records, c/o Distinguished Productions, 1 Lincoln Plaza, New York, NY 10023) and**
- **PETER ALSOP Wha'd D'Ya Wanna Do? (Flying Fish, 1304 West Schubert, Chicago, IL 60614)**—

Two records for "kids" that deserve attention from adventurous programmers or anyone for that matter with a sense of humor. **Peter Alsop** is a truly gifted performer who sings songs like "My Brother Threw Up On My Stuffed Toy Bunny" (a real gem), "Yecch!" and "I Am A Pizza" with lots of charm. The album comes complete with children but you are encouraged to bring your own, too. **Born To Add** is exactly what you think it is, and much more. Highlights include "Born To Add" by Bruce Stringbean and the S Street Band, "Hey Food" and "Letter B" by the Sesame Street Beatles, "Honk Around The Clock," "(I Can't Get No) Co-Operation" and lots more of the same. And it has a truly precious album cover.

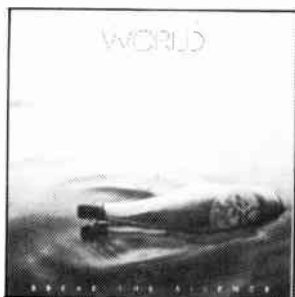

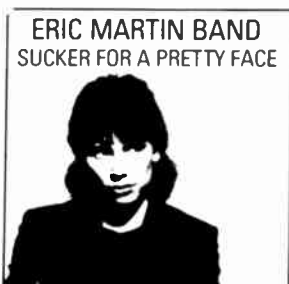

**ADRIAN BELEW Twang Bar King (Island) Emphasis Tracks: Down, Ideal, Twang**

Guitar whiz Belew gets great acceptance both college (14-6) and commercial (53-23) as "I'm Down" cracks the Top Cuts at #33. See this spectacular performer in concert if you can. Top 5 radio play on KCMU (#1), KCR (#1), KJHK, KRCC, KXLU, WCWM, WCWP, WEOS (#1), WFUV, WIDB, WKWZ, WMSB, WPGU, WPSC, WRAS, WRCT (#1), WSIA (#1), WUMF, WUNH, WUSB (#1), WUSM, WVIA (#1), WWSU, and WXYC (#1).

**BONGOS Numbers With Wings (RCA) Emphasis Tracks: Barbarella, Numbers**

**HUNTERS & COLLECTORS Hunters & Collectors (OZ—A&M) Emphasis Tracks: Talking, Tow Truck**

As predicted in NMR #24, H&C jumps 40+ radio notches 63-22, and deservedly so with their fine American debut. Looks like another solid wall of college radio support that should ultimately cross commercial. Emphasis play on KCMU #9, KCSB #9, KDVS #15, KRCC #6, KUCI #2, KUSF #8, KXLU #7, WHRB #13, WJUL #6, WSIA #15 and WVUM #3. Also #9 Radio Breakthrough.

**T-BONE BURNETT Proof Through The Night (Warner Bros.) Emphasis Tracks: Murder, Hefner**

T-Bone, with a little help from his friends Pete Townshend, Richard Thompson, Ry Cooder and others, has created a wise and wonderful piece of work. Progressive radio should crusade for this one. Proof positive on KBCO, KBLE, KDVS, KUSF, WCDB, WCVT, WFUV, WNUR, WUOG, WUSB, WXRT and WXYC. #7 Radio breakthrough, #5 Adventure Pick, #47 Radio debut.

**TOM TOM CLUB Close To The Bone (Sire) Emphasis Tracks: Hips, Pleasure**

College radio persistence does it again in the form of a true commercial crossover—the Tom Toms break the commercial radio top 20 (24-17). "4-Way Hips" is still the clear favorite (15-13 Top Cut) with "Pleasure" getting secondary emphasis. Key airplay on KBSU #15, KCSB #14, KJET #24, KROQ #9, KSPC #2, KYXX #31, WCBN #18, WFNX #4, WIUS #2, WPRB #19, WRAS #13, WRPI #15, WTJU #7, WUOG #8, WVUM #4 and WXRT #19.

An #83 radio debut is not nearly indicative enough of the raw drive and energy of this talented Champaign, IL trio. For some jumpy American R&R don't pass this one by. Early movers: KCMU #20, KJET #7, WORT #4, WUCF #1, WUOG #35, WUSB #24, WVIA #7 and WXRT #25.

**SOUTHSIDE JOHNNY AND THE JUKES Trash It Up (Mirage) Emphasis Track: Trash**

One of New Jersey's finest creates his finest effort in years and it appears that radio will finally embrace him. Early attention on KBCO, KKKX, KTIM, KUNV, WBRU, WMEB, WMMS and WXRT with the LP bubbling under the radio chart.

**ADDITIONAL EMPHASIS TRACKS:** Peter Schilling "Major Tom (Coming Home)," Juluka "Scatterlings Of Africa," Nena "99 Luftballons" (try to pick up a copy of the English-speaking version—it's superb), Oingo Boingo "Wake Up (It's 1984)," Baumann "Strangers In The Night," Altered Images "Don't Talk To Me About Love," Fleshtones "Screaming," Tim Finn "Fraction," Genesis "Mama," and Suicidal Tendencies "Institutionalized."

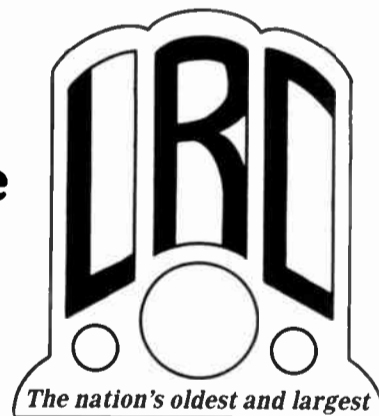

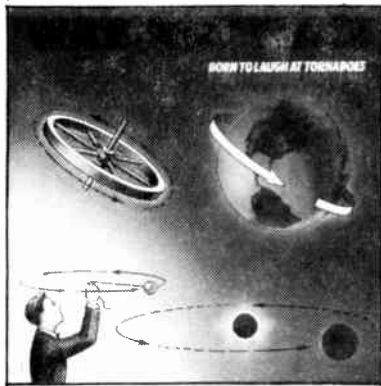

**TOM WAITS** *Swordfishtrombones* (Island, 444 Madison Ave., New York, NY 10022)—Waits' debut for Island Records is nothing short of a modern American masterpiece—an anthology of gin-soaked, graphic tales of pleasure and pain. The trademark gravelly (make that rock-filled) voice is still present but Waits sounds more melodic and tuneful than ever before. His rabid cult following will eat this one up without a doubt—yet it's about time that Tom Waits receives the widespread recognition he deserves. He's witty, poignant and powerful—and a master storyteller to boot. Open your ears and minds. Top cuts: "Shore Leave," "Johnsburg, Illinois," "16 Shells From A 30.6," "In The Neighborhood," and the title track.

**JACKPOT!**

**MIDNIGHT OIL** *10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1* (Columbia, 51 West 52nd Street, New York, NY 10019)—Truly inspired rock 'n' roll. Midnight Oil is something of a fusion of styles: the quirky pop sensibility of Men At Work; the soaring guitar and atmospherics of the Psychedelic Furs; and the grand passion and wit of the Kinks. It's striking, powerful, provocative and adventurous, and sure to be one of the fall's top new records. Start with "Power And The Passion" (already top ten on KROQ from the 12" advance) but dig deeper: "U.S. Forces," "Read About It," "Tin Legs And Tin Mines," and "Outside World" are all superb.

**RAINY DAY** *Rainy Day* (Llama, c/o Enigma, 20445 Gramercy Place, P.O. Box 2896, Torrance, CA 90509)—LA's best (members of the Bangles, the Rain Parade, Three O'Clock and the Dream Syndicate) have graced us with a true labour of love. Not merely a recollection of the sixties, Rainy Day is a loving tribute to an era, a style of music and a feeling—all part and parcel of the psychedelic rock 'n' roll of the late '60s. And all participants wear their hearts squarely on their sleeves—and demonstrate via these emotion-packed covers how much their roots mean to them. Highlights include "Soon Be Home," "I'll Keep It With Mine," "Holocaust" and "Flying On The Ground Is Wrong."

**WAS (NOT WAS)** *Born To Laugh At Tornadoes* (Geffen, c/o Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—Detroit's Was Bros. (Dan and David) have concocted a marvelous pop LP, bringing in a pretty eclectic (make that bizarre) entourage of guest vocalists and musicians. Guest stars include Mitch Ryder, Doug Fieger, Ozzy Osbourne, Marshall Crenshaw, Chris Blackwell (?) and Mel Torme. Favorites: "Knocked Down, Made Small," "Bow Wow Wow Wow" (vocals by Mitch Ryder, and better than anything on his recent solo LP), funkazoid pieces "Shake Your Head" (Ozzy on lead) and "Man vs. The Empire Brain Building," and "Zaz Turned Blue," Mel Torme's tour-de-force.

**DEPECHE MODE** *Construction Time Again* (Sire, c/o Warner Bros., address above)—Depeche Mode shows a more serious side when they proclaim in the opening track: "There was a time/When all on my mind was love/Now I find/That most of the time/Love's not enough/In itself." *Construction Time Again* digs deep into present day life and society. It's a bold and unexpected step (who would've thought Depeche Mode had depth?) which works more often than not, and bodes well for the future. Top cuts: "Everything Counts," "Love, In Itself," "Pipeline," "The Landscape Is Changing."

**C.S. ANGELS** *Land* (Jive, c/o Arista, 6 West 57th Street, New York, NY 10019)—Britain's C.S. Angels (formerly Comsat Angels but changed due to legal hassles) come up with a superbly danceable, accessible, synthesizer-bottomed pop LP. Clubs and new music radio will jump on this one out of the box (the 12" of "Will You Stay Tonight" is off to a great start) with AOR sure to follow later. Also try "Independence Day," "Alicia (Can You Hear Me)" and "Island Heart."

**JEFF WARYAN** *Figures* (Twin/Tone, 445 Oliver Avenue South, Minneapolis, MN 55405)—Superb guitar work and fine tunes highlight *Figures*, Waryan's debut release. It's an unpretentious rock 'n' roll record, which sinks in slowly but is, in the end, very satisfying. Waryan comes off at times like a Midwestern Richard Thompson, and demonstrates the potential to develop to Thompson's level. Top cuts: "In The Shadows," "Whose Side," "It Sounds Like Thunder."

**GANG OF 4** *Hard* (Warner Bros., address above)—The new Gang of 4 (slimmed to a trio since drummer Hugo Burnham was replaced with synthesized drum/dance tracks), delivers a slimmer, more controlled sound. The lyrics are lighter as well (even some love songs!), which together with the music leaves the group much less intense and more primed for commercial breakthroughs. "Is It Love" will probably see urban radio crossover play, with "A Piece Of My Heart" a good follow-up for AOR. We also like "Independence" and "Silver Lining."

**CHAZ JANKEL** *Chazablanca* (A&M, 1416 N. LaBrea, Hollywood, CA 90028)—As long as people need to dance, we will be thankful for artists like Chaz Jankel. He brings a lot of charm to the often repetitive and overproduced disco world. These tracks are beautiful in the simplicity of the rhythms and production, yet they are catchy and *perfectly* danceable. Top cuts: "Without You," "All I Want To Do Is Dance," "I Want You Back (Thank You Very Much)."

**JAMES HOUSE** *James House* (Atlantic, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—Sacramento-based House has a sensational set of husky rock and roll pipes and has crafted a solid debut LP chock full of jumpy straight-ahead rock nuggets. His vocals bring to mind pieces of Andy Pratt, Boz Scaggs, Richard Tarrant and Wet Willie but his rollicking style is entirely his own. Produced by Gary Katz (Steely Dan) with help from Rick Derringer (in sizzling form), Steve Khan, Jimmy Haslip and David Sanborn. Top cuts: "Cool Boy In Spain," "Steal Your Love Away," "Talk To My Machine" ("leave your name, number and intentions.").
