# CMJ RAMS THE STATUS QUO

As foreshadowed at CMJ Music Marathon 2001, the CMJ Network is pleased to announce the launch of RAM (Realtime Airplay Monitor). RAM will provide the music and radio communities with a new and better way of monitoring radio airplay. RAM's state-of-the-art airplay tracking system is being developed in conjunction with Audible Magic ([www.audiblemagic.com](http://www.audiblemagic.com)), the leading provider of digital audio identification technology.

Through the RAM Network, CMJ will monitor college, non-commercial, and a variety of other "early adopter" radio stations, providing qualitative market information that will assist in the discovery and development of new and emerging music.

For the past 23 years CMJ has stood alone as the most steadfast partner and staunchest supporter of college/non-commercial radio and new music. At the same time, CMJ has consistently worked to be an innovator in music discovery, artist development and market analysis. The RAM project manifests many aspects of the CMJ corporate mission, which includes anticipating and responding to the music community's needs, embracing musical and technological innovations and generally working to positively influence the economy and culture of music.

In its most basic form, RAM technology will identify music by electronically "listening" to a song and generating a unique digital fingerprint. Unlike existing tracking systems, RAM has the capability of identifying both terrestrial and Internet radio broadcasts, either locally or remotely, and can be rapidly deployed to handle voluminous song content identification in real time.

Jay B. Ziskrout, CMJ VP Business Operations, whose online and offline music business career spans over 20 years in the U.S., Europe and Latin America, noted, "When I first came to CMJ it was with the vision of being able to definitively quantify the college and non-commercial airplay information the company has been collecting for over two decades. Now, in partnership with Audible Magic, we are on track to realize that objective and more."

Vance Ikezoye, Audible Magic CEO, added, "Our working relationship with CMJ comes at an important time for the music industry. This partnership will allow us to monitor stations in a more cost-effective and accurate manner."

## WHY RAM?

RAM will enhance CMJ's continuing efforts to quantify radio's relevance in the discovery and development of new artists. Instead of being limited to tabulating stations' Top 30 reports each week, RAM will track all music a station plays, regardless of whether a song gets forty spins a week, or just one. Thus, RAM will allow for the possible exposure of many thousands of previously overlooked artists and their music. It will also serve to accurately reflect and respect the unique identity of each individual radio programmer, DJ and station.

The ability to drill down deeper into station playlists is facilitated further by another unique feature of the Audible Magic technology employed by RAM. Although technologically complex, in short, this proprietary protocol actually enables RAM to learn the identity of repeated songs that may not be in the database at the time they are first monitored.

## HOW RAM?

RAM's patented technology allows a great deal of flexibility in radio monitoring. For each station CMJ invites to participate in the RAM

Network, a determination of the best monitoring method will be made, taking into consideration local conditions, station needs, and other factors. The

available monitoring methods include over the airwaves, over the Internet or through a local gateway placed on the station's premises by CMJ. This flexibility allows CMJ to provide the music community with a service of unmatched efficiency and quality, approaching 100% accuracy. Regardless of the monitoring method employed, every case is the same in one important respect. CMJ covers the costs associated with station participation and offers many additional benefits including free and discounted access to CMJ's full array of products, services, and events.

RAM will also change the manner in which stations report. In essence, instead of stations reporting to CMJ, CMJ will report to stations. In fact, RAM airplay data is updated and posted every 24 hours. Each RAM station will have access to an exclusive extranet site where they will be able to view and manipulate their station data. This will enable RAM stations to tabulate their own playlist and/or custom chart at anytime, for any time period, they want.

## RAM PROGRESS

For the past several weeks CMJ has been conducting BETA tests with 25 college and non-commercial stations across the country. In April, CMJ begins the second phase of the BETA, which involves escalated pre-release testing. Over the next several weeks, CMJ expects to have over 50 of the nation's top college and non-commercial stations as active RAM participants.

Current RAM Markets include Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Los Angeles, Houston, Miami, Milwaukee, Minneapolis, New York, San Francisco, Seattle and Tampa. WERS-Boston, WVUM-Miami, WTSR-Trenton, KXTT-Lubbock, KDHX-St. Louis, and KCRW are among the most well known stations that have already signed exclusive contracts to participate in RAM.

CMJ's RAM database currently holds the fingerprints for over 2.5 million songs and is continuing to grow on a daily basis. CMJ has implemented a system that allows for all music that CMJ receives to be entered into RAM's database maintaining the highest standard of timeliness and efficiency. Labels, managers and independent artists should make sure that they service 3 copies of each new CD release to NMR Reviews (151 W.25th St., 12th Floor, New York, NY. 10001). One of these copies will be automatically scanned for use in RAM.

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

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## IMPERIAL TEEN

### On (Merge)


From the opening chord thrusts and the pulsating happy beat permeating *On*, it's apparent that Imperial Teen is taking no prisoners and having a blast doing so. Like kids raiding a candy store, the Bay Area band reaches for the Starbursts in the corner, the sweet Twizzlers in the back and gleefully throws Pez at the store owner as he stands disarmed by the unexpected and jovial attack. The 'Teeners take off from the get-go, fresh from a sugar high and screaming, laughing, whooping and applauding their con. As if training for the next school pep assembly, *On* is a jumping-jacks-skipping-rope-romp replete with tweeny boy/girl vocals, winsome keyboards and infectious melodies that perfectly belie some of the subversive sentiments beneath it all. The 'Teen expand and let loose with go-go chants, new-wave drones and blissful harmonies that are more persistent than chewing gum on the bottom of your shoe. While the driving licorice rush of "Million \$ Man" is entertaining and bubbly, the meditative "Captain" and the dynamic building grooves of "The First" leave a longer-lasting impression than the purely wink-wink sugar-pop snippets. In the end, it all goes down quicker than a sinful treat. Ruining your appetite never felt this good.

## NINA NASTASIA

### The Blackened Air (Touch And Go—Quarterstick)

Since her richly dark 2000 debut *Dogs*, New York City-based performer Nina Nastasia has been brewing a second batch of succulent forest-folk portraits. On *The Blackened Air*, her simple haunted melodies swirl and swell like familiar folk songs around a campfire. She alternately carries the voice of a little girl who's been spooked by ghost stories and that of a sighing grandmother who's heard it all before. Nastasia's latest effort makes use of an accordion, cello, viola and the cries of a singing saw, but the orchestration is never heavy-handed; it's sprinkled in like pinches of pungent seasoning, with the intensity based in her restraint. Whether she's singing a brief and stirring ballad like "Been So Long," about the weathered and necessary love that remains long after passion has faded, or ferocious lyrics like, "I'm toppling houses, trees and towns/ My crying makes everybody drown," Nastasia's voice is never obtrusive or maudlin. Song titles like "This Is What It Is" and "That's All There Is" signify her straightforward approach. *The Blackened Air* is the meat and potatoes of folk, and without any ruffled tablecloths and fancy napkin rings to distract from the main course, Nastasia confidently sets it all out on the table. — Kara Zuario

**My House In Montmartre** (Astralwerks)

Ever dream of being a guest at one of those parties where the champagne flows like crap beer at a keg party and folks decked out in designer clothes are grinding against each other in orgiastic delight? Well, *My House In Montmartre* could be your invitation to such a soiree. Whether you've had the dream or not, this new compilation will have you saving those pennies for a one-way ticket to Paris to seek out the source of these great beats. House music may have originated in the U.S., but the French have made perfecting it their *raison d'être*. The track listing reads like a who's who of the top French dance artists: Daft Punk, Cassius, DJ Mehdi, Phoenix, Stardust, Air and others unabashedly add their touch of pop and funk to the mix(es). This album is guaranteed to get the most reserved wallflower on his or her feet, hands in the air, silently begging to be freed from their involuntarily moving limbs. You may not be able to transport yourself to one of those fabulous parties in Paris, but *My House* will guarantee you'll be dancing your ass off — even if you're just dancing around your living room in your underwear. — **Lisa Hageman**

## MEDESKI MARTIN AND WOOD

**Uninvisible** (Blue Note)

John Medeski, Billy Martin and Chris Wood have spent almost as much time on other people's records in the last 10 years than they have on MMW — from Chocolate Genius to Chris Whitley to Susana Baca — so it's no surprise of late that they've been welcoming more musicians into their own sessions. With guest appearances by DJ Olive and DJ P Love, *Uninvisible* shares some common themes with 2000's *The Dropper*, which glimpsed the trio asking deeper questions about the true meaning of groove by mutating the beat with samples and turntable trickery. Olive's slippery scratches on "Your Name Is Snake Anthony" helps keep the backdrop sinister as Col. Bruce Hampton recalls (in spoken word) a tale of life on the road with the enigmatic Snake Anthony. DJ P Love throws some twists into the greasy "Pappy Check," which stands out as one of the finer, funkified MMW joints in some time. Still, the most exciting collaboration occurs when the horn section from Antibalas Afrobeat Orchestra sounds off on the title track, its rippling, brassy riffs sparring against Medeski's bold B3 jabs. For being such masters of their instruments, MMW are remarkably generous players, which is exactly why they make all of their guests and hosts sound that much better. — **Steve Ciabattoni**



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## EMI TO AXE 1,800 JOBS

In an expected announcement, EMI President/CEO Alain Levy and Vice Chairman David Munns have announced their restructuring plan, which will see close to 1,800 employees worldwide lose their jobs. The bulk of the pink slips will be handed out this month,



with the remaining to come by the end of September. The job losses reflect a 20 percent reduction in staff, saving the company an estimated \$140 million annually. Expect annual shareholder dividends to be cut in half as well. In his webcast statement to employees worldwide

([www.emigroup.com](http://www.emigroup.com)), Levy stated, "We are shaping EMI Recorded Music for the future and positioning it for revenue growth from a much lower cost base and with much better practices. There are some real challenges facing the music industry at the moment.

However, we are firmly on target to improve EMI's performance and we are optimistic about our ability to attack the broader challenges." The CMJ family's thoughts are with our many, many EMI brethren worldwide. We urge you to reach out to these folks in any positive way you can during this very difficult time.

## MORE LABEL NEWS

Meanwhile, there is some good news to report on the label front this week. After posting \$400 million in operating losses in fiscal year 2001, BMG says it will turn in a \$100 mil-

lion-plus profit for 2002, according to a recent article in



the *L.A. Times*. Credit hit releases from J Records' multiple Grammy award-winning artist Alicia Keys, plus other BMG big sellers such as Alan Jackson, Pink and Usher for BMG's optimistic financial future forecast. • Eagle Rock Entertainment, a global entertainment media company based in the U.K., with offices in London and

New York, has announced the appointment of Mike Carden as president of Eagle Records. In his new role, Carden will oversee the North American operations of both Eagle Records and Spitfire

Records. Carden, who has logged over 30 years in the music industry, joined the company in 2001 as GM of Spitfire and Eagle. Prior to that, he was GM of CMC International and also held the National Director Of Sales Accounts position at Atlantic Records. • Century Media Records VP/GM for the past two years, Marco Barbieri, has been promoted to president. Barbieri has been with the label since 1995. • Word has it that Loud Records (home to the X-Ecutioners) is in the middle of letting go as many as 50 percent of their staff and

will cease to operate as a standalone label. Look for Sony Music, which owns a majority stake in Loud, to take over marketing, promotion and sales through its Columbia Records. • Island Def Jam Music Group has announced Laura Tamburino as its new Sr. Director Of Creative Services, while Tara Podolsky is named Manager Of A&R Administration.

With VH1/CMT President John Sykes recently being promoted to Chairman/CEO of Infinity Radio by Viacom

President/COO Mel Karmazin, MTV Group President/Chairman Interactive Music Judy McGrath has been promoted to MTV Networks Music Group President. In her expanded role, McGrath

will now oversee MTV, MTV2, VH1, CMT and all of the company's digital music services.

# You Wanna See Them Fail? You Won't Get Your Chance.

In just the past four years, **Hatebreed** has survived an ugly breakup with its former label, incessant touring, line up changes, numerous album delays and still managed to put out what many are already calling the hardcore album of the year. The aptly named *Perseverance* shoves hardcore to the forefront of the musical landscape and shows that there's still plenty to be enraged about. Story By Louis Miller • Photo By Dean Karr

**H**ince its inception seven years ago, Hatebreed has almost single-handedly turned around the hardcore and metalcore scene in the Northeast. These five men — vocalist Jamey Jasta, guitarists Sean Martin and Lou Richards, bassist Chris Beattie and drummer Matt Byrne — came together with the purpose of becoming a band whose brutality and intensity would demand respect. Their relentless touring and willingness to play any basement, garage, backyard or other hole-in-the-wall that would have them has created legions of converts and a stripe of street cred that is about to usher the band into bigger and better things.

Uniting hardcore's aggression-packed deliverance with metal's thunderous guitar riffs, Hatebreed has vaulted to the front of the scene with a passion and integrity that can be matched by few. "We always wanted to take the best of the New York hardcore sound and add the brutality of the early-'90s death metal and thrash, making it more catchy and less abrasive," reflects vocalist Jamey Jasta. "We wanted simple songs with simple song structures. All out brutality, 30 seconds and it's done."

Talking with Jasta is a surprisingly laid-back experience, especially when you consider he is the man who penned such potent lyrics as "I fucking hate you/ Every bone in my body will ache/ Till I destroy everything you love/ The only cure for your sickness lies within your grave" (from "A Call For Blood"). Aretha Franklin he's not, but if Jasta doesn't get the respect he feels he deserves, don't be too surprised if he comes up and takes it from you. "I think mainly it's just wanting to have that release and wanting to deal with certain issues," he muses. "Have it be the release of a hateful or negative energy but not aimlessly, having a solution in sight. Feeling like no matter what problems you're facing in life, you can always try to change it for the better."

Jasta is serious about empowering all who listen to his music. "I've tried to address topics that I think were painful for me in the past in some songs," he notes. "But at the same time I feel like I should keep the lyrics open enough and tangible enough so the listener cannot only identify with it, but interpret it the way they need to. You know, there are certain songs I have that, growing up listening to, would inspire me or just give that feeling that you can't describe. There's something about music that can take you to a different place. I want to make records like that."

After releasing 1997's *Satisfaction Is The Death Of Desire* on Victory Records, the band decided it needed to tour for three years in order to really give the album the support it deserved, and to give it the chance to sell. This vehement dedication led Hatebreed down a path that included stints on Tattoo The Earth and Ozzfest tours with such icons as Slayer, Black Sabbath, Motörhead and Danzig. "We learned a lot from those bands," Jasta reveals. "[They] are amazing, just in the sense that after all these years they're still doing what they're doing. They've never let me down. I've always looked forward to their records coming out and I've always felt that they were never going to disappoint me. We try to base our band off of that."


In that same vein, Hatebreed is poised to release its major-label debut, *Perseverance*, on the colossal Universal Records. Four years in the making, this album does not disappoint. "On this record, there [had been] so many changes in my life and so many different issues that I needed to address; it was really real and it was what I was feeling and something that I really felt was true to myself," Jasta admits. That sincerity shines through on all of the 16 gut-wrenching tracks on the album. When the band finally got a copy of the long-awaited album, it was almost cathartic. "[The album] came to our hotel, and the hotel ended up being about 30 miles away from the club we were playing. So we paid a cab driver to go get the CD from the hotel and bring it to the bus. When we got it we all sort of huddled around it. Sean was like 'Damn, I feel like I'm going to cry.' It was such a team effort finally getting this record out. We're just really proud of that."

The band members aren't the only ones who see this album as something special: in the last two weeks, *Perseverance* has reached No. 1 on CMJ's Loud Rock chart, Loud Rock Adds, Loud Rock Crucial Spins and Crucial Spins Adds. "I'm really appreciative of all that's going on," says Jasta. "We're getting a lot of press, we're getting a lot of radio, we're getting a lot of offers for bigger tours and stuff, so I'm psyched that people think it's going to be an important record for this year."

Hatebreed has no intention of hoarding all this attention. The group has a strong commitment to its genre, and is determined to bring others along for the ride. "I'd like to have people think of us as the band that brought the metal-core or the hardcore/metal movement back to the forefront. I'd like to change a lot of people's opinions on what a hardcore or a metal band should be and what they should be about. And especially within the industry, prove that [the genre] can sell records and prove that it is a form of music that is important to people and that people want and need."

Whether the world is ready for Hatebreed or not, one thing is for sure: Hatebreed isn't going anywhere. "We're still gonna tour, we're still gonna put out records," Jasta promises. "And I think we'll always be one of those bands that goes to those places that no one else will go and plays those clubs that no one else will play. We'll just keep forging our own path like we have, not accepting anybody else's limitations or standards and try to pave our own way. And hopefully in 20 years, people will say 'They did it, they did things differently and achieved a lot of things that other bands couldn't.'" **NMR**



## 764-HERO

### Nobody Knows This Is Everywhere (Tiger Style)

In Seattle, where the city's rich (if sludgy) musical legacy still vibrates, 764-HERO has made its home out of bits and nuances, the kind of indie music that rests as well as it rocks. Recorded by Built to Spill maestro Phil Ek, *Nobody Knows*

*This Is Everywhere* debuts on Tiger Style as a worthy follow-up to 2000's *Weekends of Sound* (Up). Singer/guitarist John Atkins sings in dutifully brooding boyish tones, encasing his cut-above-the-heart emo-pop ballads in hazily precise guitar melodies and drummer Polly Johnson's concise beats. With Modest Mouse touring member Robin P. replacing James Bertram on bass, noisier numbers like the Elvis Costello-spirited "Photographic Evidence" take a back seat to songs a few shades darker and slower than earlier 764-HERO output. "Satellites" even includes some dapper piano touches, while "Confetti Confessional" slinks along on a crunchy blues riff that's sexier than BTS. Through it all, Atkins faithfully laments, "When I fell in love with the sound, that's when I knew it / I've been falling asleep with the walls staring me down."

## BEFORE BRAILLE


### Before Braille (Aezra)

If California's Vagrant lays claim to the finest roster of hook-laden emo-core and D.C.'s Dischord has a strong hold on the cutting edge of angular post-hardcore, it kinda makes sense that the two sounds would meet some-

where in the middle on Arizona's Aezra label, where a band called Before Braille brews its own unique blend of rock for the new millennium. Seething with salt, sweat, honey and asphalt (not unlike seasoned AZ contemporaries Jimmy Eat World), this foursome delivers a positively commanding performance that betrays its relatively recent appearance on the radar. Each track on this sampler of songs from the upcoming full-length is brimming with texture and taste. Like Get Up Kids without the sentimentality or Fugazi with an eye toward the mainstream, Before Braille deftly delivers the best elements of both sonic camps. In one convenient package, you get not only a highly melodic, pop sensibility but also a challenging,

rhythmic stutter that keeps the whole affair from ever getting stale. — Jason Kundrath

## LOW FLYING OWLS


### Low Flying Owls Take The Scenic Route (Americans Are Coming)

## CHRISTY MCWILSON


### Bed Of Roses (HighTone)

### Lost In Revelry (Misra)


A modified version of the melting pot vs. salad bowl argument about America's racial composition could also be applied to the Mendoza Line's fourth full-length, *Lost In Revelry*. Nearly two-thirds of the songs on the Athens, Georgia collective's

album were penned by Dylan-esque singer/guitarists, Timothy Bracy and Peter Hoffman, while the remaining third belong to the band's cooing chantenuse, Shannon Mary McArdle. Both sets of country-folk tunes are bathed in glowing organs and twangy pedal steels, but the differences in songwriting are exceptional. Bracy and Hoffman opt for hook-driven rollicking, whereas McArdle's less immediate share is more atmospheric and barebones. Some might seek a sort of anti-cohesive cohesiveness within the discord, but the album works best as a sum of parts. However, "What Ever Happened To You?" is the prettiest slice of indie folk since the Shins' "New Slang" — Bracy and McArdle harmonize and the convergence is dazzling.

Mendoza Line's ability to stay varied while occasionally integrating is what America (and Americana) is all about.

## FIVE QUESTIONS WITH... DOWN'S PEPPER KEENAN!

*As sure as dildos are to be found at the Adult Video Awards, Loud Rock fans will unearth nothing but Rock on an album by Down. The New Orleans-based group, comprised of members of Pantera, C.O.C., Crowbar and Eye Hate God, recently unveiled its second opus, christened Down II: A Bustle In Your Hedgerow, and the band's guitarist (and C.O.C. frontman), Pepper Keenan, checked in with CMJ's Loud Rock department to discuss recording the album and what it's like to drink 35 gallons of beer.*

### OK, who's holding?

[Laughing] If you gotta ask, you don't know, fool!

I've never been to New Orleans but from what I gather it's all about strippers and bourbon. With those distractions, I'm fucking surprised it only took six years for you guys to follow up the first album. How does the city influence Down's music?

It's an insanely musical city; everything revolves around music. When you grow up in a place like that, you're enveloped with this fucking groove — from the way motherfuckers walk down the street, to the way the food tastes, to the way the music sounds.

**Pepper, tell me about "Nodferatu's Lair," the barn in southern Louisiana that you guys lived and worked in throughout the process of making this album.**

We had this genius idea that instead of going to a studio, we'd try to do it in Phil's barn on his property in the middle of fucking nowhere. Down just works better in a situation like that. We weren't interested in being in a stuffy studio. Down jams in a circle and we go at it. We were hammered the whole time — we had cases of beer, liqueur and whatever else we needed.

**OK, wait. It took 26 days for you guys to record this album. How many cases of fucking beer did you go through?**

We went through \$6,000 in booze. We actually broke it down one night and we figured out that Kirk [Windstein, guitar], Rex [Brown, bass], one of the techs, and myself each drank 35 gallons of beer. We had a fucking mountain of beer cans outside. Hell, how could we not? It was sunny as shit, we were sitting' in a barn and jamming loud as hell, and the fridge was packed all the time. Sure enough, if you get up, you're gonna crack one open; you ain't got nothing to do but rock. We really pushed the parameter of what a human being is able to do in a 24-hour period.

**Why don't you contribute any vocals to Down? Is Phil a mic hog or what?**

Phil does what he does well, so my main thing was to try to write songs that would force him to sing. He comes up with melodies that I wouldn't think of in a million years and, by being just the guitarist, I can write crazy, intricate shit that I probably couldn't sing and play in the first place. Down just functions that way. I got plenty of things of my own that I could sing on. If he had any problems covering shit, I would say something.




## SOILWORK





Remember the time when hip-hop was fun, entertaining and didn't take itself so seriously? Well, the boys of Madd Nation (Kuu-layd, Tron and Trooly) are here to remind you. With catchy hooks and a touch of quirky vocal freakiness à la Outkast and Snoop, Madd Nation has put together a fun, beat-driven album that, even

in its most reflective moments, is more about good times than expanding your mind. With their independently-released sophomore album, Infectious Organisms have taken numerous influences and pared them down to create their own blend of music and rhyme. Richly organic, the group has taken the very best qualities of live drum, bass, guitar and keyboards,

filling an empty canvas with deep shades of jazz and sweeping melodies that by themselves would give pause to the most cursory of listeners. If some of their melodies sound like they would fit right in on adult contemporary radio, MCs Jean Koaume and Felton Martin bring listeners' focus back to the hip-hop element as they are no less ambitious with their message and their ability to use their one-dimensional instrument (their voice) in a multi-dimensional way. Perhaps best described as Sade crossed with the Fugees (that guitar line in "Comfort In The Swell" sounds *really* familiar). Vastly atmospheric, *Human Experience* is an album to be heard while lying down in a dark room, rendering them the hip-hop equivalent of Sigur Rós or Radiohead. Don't take our word for it; experience it for yourself.

## ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

### BADLY DRAWN BOY

**S**ince the release of *The Hour Of Bewilderbeast*, Badly Drawn Boy (a.k.a. Damon Gough) has been keeping himself busy, and it doesn't look as if things will be changing anytime soon. His latest release, *About A Boy*, was added at nearly 200 college and non-commercial radio stations across the country its first week out, and is only the first of two albums he will release this year. CMJ recently had a chance to talk with Damon via phone from his home in Manchester, England.

#### How have you been keeping yourself busy since *The Hour Of Bewilderbeast*?

Well, it has been almost two years [since *Bewilderbeast* was released], and I did a big tour of the States, a big tour of England and Europe, and then back to the States again. When I am touring I very rarely do anything else but play the gig. I really don't have time to do anything; I don't even write songs when I am on tour — I just can't be bothered. All the energy goes into making the gig on that night the best I can do.

#### How did this soundtrack record come to take place?

Chris and Paul Weitz, the two directors, and Nick Hornby, the novelist, all wanted me to do it. I think Nick was a fan of *Bewilderbeast* and the Weitz brothers picked on me as well. Once everybody realized that coincidence I was like the number one, and I think only, choice. I got the script while I was in the middle of touring, but I set it to the side — I tried to read it but it was just difficult to grasp the flow.

Eventually I got around to reading the book instead, which gave me a

fuller idea of the story that I was dealing with. I then went to meet Chris and Paul when they were filming in London, and they were all waiting for me to sign off, so I did and then went back and wrote songs. The songs are inspired by the story on a loose basis. It was sort of a trial and error; I just tried to do what I can and tried to follow a few basic guidelines. In the end it was just like making a record, only with a huge pre-made video ready to promote it.

#### So what happens now?

I am going to be doing a little touring in a bit, but proper touring will be after the next record, around September.

#### I read somewhere that you were not going to be rockin' your hat in public anymore. Is that true?

The hat thing has just been attracting too much attention. People have tried to steal it, I have been punched in the face, so publicly I am not going to wear it anymore. It has just come to a point where I get hassled too much, and there is always some drunk idiot somewhere that always wants to take a go at ya. I will still wear it for personal appearances and such. It is my comfort blanket, when I am on stage especially; it feels like it is me.

#### What is your favorite part of the music-making process?

If I had to pick, it would be the moment when you have established the beginnings of a new song, 98 percent of the time, for me, I am at home, and at that moment things are going really well. That is what I do when I get to the studio: I just put down a bunch of those moments, real rough-like, then chip away. When I am at home, that is the most rewarding moment. The other stuff is great. Making a record, hearing it on the radio, going on tour — it all happens because of the moments that happen at home. — **Christopher D. Ward**

#### How long have you been and will you be MD? How do you abuse your power?

I've been the MD at WWEC for the past year. I don't like to say that I "abuse" my power; I just try to create a medium for independent music to be heard — and if I have to beat DJs until they cry to achieve that, so be it. The bleeding stops eventually and it's much better than listening to Britney Spears.

#### What was your most successful fundraiser?

It depends on how you measure success — money or creativity. This past year, we wanted to get T-shirts to sell on campus for an event but it never happened, so we got creative. We got white-trash undershirts and fabric markers and had WWEC stenciled on the front and let people create their own shirt for \$2. They were so low budget that everyone loved them and it turned out to be a huge success, one we might do again!

#### Who are you most proud of bringing to the station to perform and why?

Last semester I brought Spookie Daly Pride into the studio for a little jam session during my show. We promoted the show the entire week before and had a pretty decent response from it.

#### What's the most fucked up thing that ever happened to you while you were on-air?

Two years ago, I was on-air and three of my

guy friends busted in on me with a roll of duct tape and bound me to my chair while I was trying to do the weather. I think I ended up saying something lame like, "I'm a little tied up right now..."

#### What was your most embarrassing radio-related moment?

Way back when I was a freshman, I had to do the Sunday morning religious broadcast, which meant that I had to turn the station on in the morning. I had never heard the station opener prior to this point. So, I'm alone at 8 a.m. on a Sunday morning and I went to play the opener and this loud and obnoxious alarm started going off the second I pressed the on-air button. So I freaked out and turned off the digicart. Of course, then the dead air alarm went off. I did this about seven or eight times until I finally realized that the annoying alarm was part of the opener itself.

#### What's the best line a promoter ever used on you to get you to play a record?

They don't really use lines but I usually encounter a few sexual propositions... all talk and no show!

#### Name one CD you're embarrassed to say you own.

Milli Vanilli, but it is a total shame that I got rid of my Snow CD. (R.I.P. *Informer!*) If anyone out there has Snow and feels like doing me a nice favor and sending it to me, I'd be extremely grateful. Just kidding, I love all of my CDs equally.

#### Why did you go into college radio? Free CDs?

I love music and I never shut up. Seems like a perfect match, does it not?

#### When will you be graduating?

Provided that I pass senior seminar this

semester, I will graduate in May. Only 64 more days, but who's counting?

#### If you could see anyone live (dead or living), who would it be and why?

I would give my left arm and my right leg to meet New Found Glory because they are my favorite band of all time, and as sad as it is, I have not seen them play live *once*. If anyone out there has any connections, feel free to have a heart and hook me up!

#### Are you interested in going into the music industry? Doing what?

What I'd love to do eventually is establish my own honest and pure indie-based trade magazine. But anything I can do in the music industry to preserve the true essence of college radio and independent music would be an incredible opportunity.





## COPE WITH IT

**W**ell, I'm following up a week on the road with NARM with a week on the road in NYC. Nice way to see the world — airports, cabs and hotels. Welcome to the music business. But there have been advantages to these two outings. First has been the opportunity to visit retailers in other markets. It's not that the Tower stores or the Virgin Megastores are that much different from city to city, but it's nice to see they are somewhat microcosmic of the neighborhood they're in (check out Virgin Times Square compared to Union Square or LA/Sunset to Virgin San Francisco store). The most interesting part, though, has been going from market to market visiting the independent stores.

For those who were in San Francisco for NARM, I'm sure many were blown away by the Amoeba Records store down in the Haight/Asbury district. I know when I walk into that store it was completely overwhelming — where do I start? What am I looking for? Did you see all those box sets? Did you see the section of Black Metal that apparently does quite well here? Then there is Amoeba Berkeley and Amoeba Hollywood each with different personalities. But what do all these independent stores have in common? They are full of music consumers spending time and money because these retailers stock what people want at reasonable prices, and because they would rather support the small indie stores than the larger chains. It's called loyalty,

something uncommon in much of today's business. This morning (Sunday), I spent some time in NYC's Other Music — much smaller than the Amoebas, but still a store that was pretty jammed at 11:30 on a Sunday morning with people shopping for and buying music.

The point is that the Vintage Vinyls, Electric Fetuses, Arons, Kiefs, Desirable Discs, Rasputins, etc. are all run by people that are true entrepreneurs who are passionate, dedicated, intelligent business people. While we as a business try to search for the way to spread and increase sales, these stores continue their business of selling new music to loyal customers and ultimately helping the labels break artists that range from Ryan Adams to Staind. These are the stores that got *O Brother, Where Art Thou?* first, and sold it first. Whether these independent stores are part of coalitions or not, they are as much a valuable tool as they are the first flicker of hope in the process of breaking artists. We all know the chains will get the big-time ad support, the exclusives (you know the drill), but as a label please ask yourself if you've done what you could to support those stores that are breaking your bands. If you don't support them you are taking away the two most important elements for breaking your artists: passion for the music and an ability to spread the word.

## SPEAK OUT

*In the wake of NARM, many CMJ reporters wanted to speak out about this year's convention. We'll start with:*

### CARL SINGMASTER Manifest Discs

For the past several years at NARM, independent retailers (surely the closest to the consumer of all NARM's attendees) have warned that certain industry practices would come back to haunt the practitioners if perpetuated: specifically the continual increase in CD prices beyond the perceived

value of the consumer, upsetting the playing field by offering exclusive content to select retailers or retail channels, and the elimination of the single in an effort to force consumers to buy higher priced albums. For the past few years our cries have been countered and contradicted at every turn by the supplier community, who trotted out revenue growth to prove their point. But NARM 2002 was the first time I recall that not only were virtually all retailers separately voicing the same concerns, but there was

an admission by the supplier community that something is wrong and they need to work with retail to fix it. There were holdouts to be sure, with questions such as "Don't you think if we put some DVD content with the album consumers will buy it for \$19.99 instead of burn it?" and those steadfast in their convoluted justifications for not offering consumers the songs they want in the versions they want at a sensible price. But most suppliers now recognize that change is in the winds. Most on both sides

realize that the much touted copy protect schemes are flawed in that they either are too easily defeated or restrict the consumers' fair use of a product that the consumer already believes is overpriced. And most acknowledged that equal content to all serves the consumer best. I hope this NARM represents a turning point from which we can move ahead and grow the music business. There was little time to focus on music this NARM. Let us hope that next year the music shall reign.

# PROFILE: VINTAGE VINYL

**W**hile working with Jim on this profile of Vintage Vinyl, I found someone with a very similar beginning to my own retail entrepreneurial story — someone who took a path from peach crates full of used records to legitimate retailing.

St. Louis based Vintage Vinyl has been going strong since 1979, when founders Tom "Papa" Ray and Lew Prince took their love of music and their frustration with the music industry and created a new concept for St. Louis retail. First, they began with 450 records and an outdoor stall in the city's produce market; then graduated to hawking blues, soul, jazz, gospel, and rock over the cries of vegetable sellers in St. Louis' busy Soulard Market. After nine months of produce, they opened a 750 square foot store in the Delmar loop of University City. Though they were optimistic, 1980 was not only a year of recession in the music industry, but their new location fit squarely between two other retailers. They soon bought out one of the stores and did business that was decidedly contrary to corporate music standards. VV bought and sold used records, cut-outs, and hard to find titles and the customers loved them — record industry hacks didn't. There were, perhaps, PR mistakes they made along the way. One of the owners quoted by St. Louis media said: "Banks are whores — the morality of corporate music is like pumping heroin into infant children and selling them to deviant couples!"

Over the years, Vintage Vinyl has grown, outlived its '80s detractors, become a two-store 7-day a week operation with 60 employees, and is recognized by music lovers the world over. Its main location at 6610 Delmar is nearly 8,000 square feet in one of St. Louis' most vital neighborhoods (adjacent to Washington University). The Granite City, IL store opened in 1990 and is just as committed to educating willing listeners about the foundations of recorded music as they are to turning them on to new artists and trends — "ancient to the future" is a fitting slogan.

Vintage Vinyl wants to remain the touchstone for the St. Louis' music scene. This includes maintaining its role as promoter of the city's crucial and all too often forgotten place in American musical history. VV hosts over 100 in-stores from local and national

artists a year and are the exclusive music retail sponsor for several high-profile clubs (giving them online sales opportunities).

Programs include 62 listening posts, window displays, endcaps, radio and print packages (all of which come with P&Ps).

Keith Richards' "The Harder They Come."

Aerosmith's *Toys In The Attic* at Co-op Records & Tapes in 1976. The store was the classic indie store/headshop. I was seven with money I got for my first communion.

### Favorite Weekend Party Disc?

Depends on the party — could be Motörhead's *No Remorse*, Prince's *Dirty Mind* or Wu-Tang Clan's *Enter The Wu-Tang (36 Chambers)*.

### Favorite Sunday morning disc?

Primal Scream's *Screamadelica*.

### First Concert? Where? When?

Beach Boys at the Mississippi River Festival in the mid-'70s: Brian Wilson came out and played half a song before getting up and leaving. I was about six.

### Best concert ever attended?

Too many, but the best show to blow me away unexpectedly was Unwound in Austin, TX at Emos, July 1996.

### What artist (past or present) would you like to see live?

Ike & Tina Turner opening for Rolling Stones in 1969; Stevie Wonder opening for Rolling Stones in 1972; or Captain Beefheart anytime.

### Currently reading?

Iceberg Slim's *Mama Black Widow*, with Noam Chomsky's *9-11* on deck.

### What do you collect?

I collect live recordings and have over 5,000 tapes ranging from the Minutemen to Ornette Coleman to Alejandro Escovedo to AC/DC. Also I obsessively archive and collect TV shows I enjoy. I have complete volumes of every News Radio, Chris Rock Show, The Norm Show, etc.


**Norah Jones Takes Waterloo by Storm**
