We are living today in an era of accomplishments and it was indeed a pleasant revelation to find a Canadian radio station who had accomplished 47 years of broadcasting and were still very actively involved in "doing their own thing" with a great deal of teamwork. It's for this reason that we at RPM have designated the following pages of this issue to the 47th anniversary of radio station CKOC in Hamilton, Ontario.

There is much to be said concerning an operation of this type in a market that could present a problem. Blue collar and white collar workers, a heavy concentration of

teenagers and a variety of races have kept CKOC management continually on their toes and apparently making with the necessary format.

From their extremely knowledgeable music director Nevin Grant who makes up the effective production team with Gary Summers through their all important on-air personalities: Randy Dewell; Jack Stephens; Bob Bratina; Dave Charles; Roger Ashby; and Mike Kramer to their ingenious engineer Art Todd, CKOC is a beehive of excitement. They excel in public relations and have done much to create an excellent "good citizenship" image.

THIS IS THEIR "NOW" SOUND by Gary Summers

CKOC does not try to be every-thing to everyone....but we try to "do" the best of things for the largest segment of the population....and we try to do it, with the top people possible to hire.

Mr. Jack Burghardt....a 14-year veteran of T.V. experience to the Hamilton audience, is our authoritative news voice from 7:00 AM til noon each day. Jack also does an "On The Line" talk-show from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM each week day. We do not screen the calls....our only precaution against possible trouble occurring is a 5-second delay on

what goes on the air. We feel that if a caller has to explain to a "screener" what he or she wants to talk about and then has to repeat the entire thing when he or she finally gets on the air, a lot of the "fire" or "interest" is sometimes lost.

Besides the talk show, we do many other "community service" type of broadcasts.

Music cannot win on its own. Our philosophy is that "music is the most important ingredient" of a good radio station but there are countless other important areas as well.

We give the most "immediate" sports results....CFL.....NHL....and other "major" scores, faster and more

CANADIAN TALENT AND CKOC

CKOC has tried to play a Leading Role in providing encouragement and airplay for contemporary Canadian artists and their recordings. In the past, it was not always the easiest role to pursue, as - while the talent was always there - CKOC felt that the sound often wasn't! They feel that recent technical advancements. improved production facilities and recording techniques have all but done away with this problem. The record industry is also winning back and retaining some of Canada's better production personnel, and that today's Canadian pop releases are able to compete with American and European recordings on a sound footing!

CKOC, in co-operation with the ANAVIC (Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans in Canada) run the Night Quarterback Club here in this "foot-ball hotbed". In the four years of operation, we have attracted over 12,000 fans to our meetings.

Bob Hanley, the top sports columnist in the city, and one of Canada's finest, reports twice a day to our sports listeners. Stewart Brown, the Hamilton Spectator's entertainment critic, is also on twice a day, with his one-minute capsule.

Our philosophy also is "get involved in anything and everything in our community that fits our 'sound'...or involves 'our audience'.

"CKOC is striving to reflect the interest of our audience in Hamilton and region, be it in the area of news, sports, open line programming or music.

When hiring new people and given the choice between two prospects of equal talent and ability, one from our area and one from outside, our policy is to favour the one who is "locally grown". In the majority, our communicators fit this pattern and are better able to sense the pulse of Southern Ontario.

Our music is selectively and tightly controlled to fit the audience composition of each part of the day. We subscribe to several music services, but we also place a great degree of emphasis on local record store sales and audience reaction and requests in compiling our "Now 40 Sound". We have no outside music consultants, nor do we intend to. Our theory is that our people are our specialists."

While the students and their businessmen advisors concentrated on the registering, checking, firstaiding, transporting of the hoped for thousands, CKOC, as a station, and even more importantly, it's staffers as individuals, pitched in with a will on other facets. Hundreds and hundreds of on-air announcements urged

Hamiltonians — particularly students — to participate as walkers, or to sponsor generously someone who was walking. The station erected route and checkpoint signs to keep walkers on their 35-mile course; it provided banners, staging, the public address systems for city hall square the official start and finish area. ▶

MILES FOR MILLIONS continued

CKOC supplied entertainment for the participants and spectators with 5 hours of live music by 2 Hamilton groups "The SMILE" and "THE BRASS UNION", in the morning and evening of the marathon march, and 'OC jocks spun records on stage between times. JACK STEPHENS

CKOC'S JACK STEPHENS is one Morning Man you KNOW is destined to come out on top! Jack is used to winning — whether on Radio....or at the track, where he owns several Pacers & Trotters and is known as the ''Voice of Harness Racing In Ontario''. Jack is Track Announcer at the Three Jockey Club Tracks — Greenwood, Garden City and Mohawk.

Jack started his radio career in 1956 with Radio Station CKSL, London, Ontario. "They hired me as an assistant Librarian, which meant filing records, dusting shelves, sorting mail & running for coffee' Eager to free himself from the grasp of the CKSL Coffee Machine, Jack worked after-hours making audition tapes and distributing them to radio stations throughout Ontario. Persistence finally paid off! In August 1957, Jack Stephens became an announcer at CFOS, Owen Sound! Everything went smoothly until Jack broke up a fellow announcer who was reading the Daily Obituary Notices on the air. At a meeting with the Station Manager, Jack was urged to go on to greater things - "Like pumping gas or whathave-you! I picked myself up and headed for the Chemical Valley which I thought would be a GAS and joined the staff of CHOK !"' Jack

FROM THE COMPO COMPANY parents and children for fours on end in the start-finish crowds that numbered well over 20,000.

Every CKOC Personality not on the air when Miles For Millions moved off on its fund-raising trek joined in the walk. The eight jocks and newsmen had found themselves cents-and-dollars per mile sponsors like all the others. While some of the CKOC crew had to drop out because of broadcast shifts later in the day, three of the eight — Randy Dewell, Bob Bratina, and talk show host Jack Burghardt completed the full 35 miles.

Stephens had worked at CHOK for a year when he was approached by home-town station CKSL, London. "This was quite a thrill...the station that gave me my start calling me and offering me a job." Things moved rather quickly. In December 1958, Jack became host of the CKSL



All-Night Show. In March of 1961, he was moved to the Mid-Day 10 AM to 2 PM shift.....then, finally, became host of a special "Housewives' Coffee Club" Mornings from 9 to Noon! "CKOC called me in January of 1965, suggesting that this feature might also be successful in Hamilton. We joined forces on March 1, 1965, and ran the program in the 9 AM to Noon slot for just about three years" Then, a Momentous Day -- as Jack tells it: "It was on APRIL 1ST, 1969 (April Fool's Day) that I became the CKOC Bright & Early Man (well, Early anyway) on the 6 to 9 AM run and have been featured there since. And the way things are going, Jack Stephens is apt to be there for a good many more years....right on Top in Hamilton!!!!


RANDY DEWELL

CKOC's newest announcer - RANDY DEWELL - is no stranger to the airwaves....he used to fly them as a member of the RCAF! For three years Randy served in Northern Quebec and Europe. It was during his stay in Germany that Randy had his first taste of broadcasting - with CKOC technical people put in 12 to 20 hour days of their own time to help the organizing committee run everything smoothly.

With these efforts, and those of ordinary citizens, Hamilton's 1969 edition of Miles For Millions set new records in money raised for the benefiting charities.

It's this kind of enthusiasm and community involvement that helps make CKOC and its people – both on and off the air – so much a part of the metro-Hamilton area – personal friends to so many.

same year he switched to QS's sister station CKLB, where he started as a copy writer — later becoming Promotion Director and hosting the midmorning show from 10 AM to 2 PM.

BOB BRATINA

BOB BRATINA has his birthday fixed for all time: "It was July 20th, 1944 --- the day they tried to blow up Hitler....." And the tremors keep happening; as the day he announced: "Tapes of the Bob Bratina Show are being sent to our fighting forces.... in the Whitmore Hotel."

That's just one example of the personality that springs on an un-



wary world every CKOC afternoon from Noon to 4. "I enjoy people and try to talk with them on the air in language that's familiar to them. Humour plays a big part...because Joe Average gets enough editorializing and speechmaking from the rest of the world. I figure he or she turns to the radio for entertainment, and that's what I attempt to provide. But NO joke books....humour must be essentially spontaneous."

And spontaneous it is; which as far as CKOC is concerned is just great. Bob's Cash Call telephone game provides him with direct listener contact on the air, helping both Bob and the station establish a friendly personal relationship with Hamiltonians. CKOC feels there couldn't be a better, more genuine man to do it.

As a boy in Hamilton's east end, Bob wanted to be a locomotive engineer. Listening to his show, you would never believe it. But then you discover him last week building a model railroad in the station basement, and wondering where to put a real live caboose he was considering buying. There go those tremors again.

DAVE CHARLES

DAVE CHARLES has changed very little with the years. His mother re-ports that at birth he had blond fuzzy hair....he still does. At age twelve he fell in love with radio ... he still is. This love affair with music and microphone started with p.a. annoucing for junior hockey games at Hamilton's Forum and spinning discs for the public skating nights - time cribbed from his homework as a student at Hamilton's Hill Park High. After YMCA Dances and hockey games came graduation and ... REAL RADIO....in Belleville. There, for three and a half years Dave did it all. He learned what announcing was about....he wrote a weekly newspaper music column....he got an assist onto the CBC "Action Set" radio show which ran coast to coast ... he turned out monthly articles for Canadian High News on the Canadian music scene and then "Hometown Here I Come!"

Dave returned to Hamilton and CKOC. The 4 to 8 slot fitted like a



glove. The hometown boy was making it like good. Those same high schools where he carved his initials, he's now entertaining every day on air and most every weekend in person; as well as helping the Board of




Education's Marketing Courses by speaking to individual classes all over the city.

ROGER ASHBY

Most Beavers frequent the Canadian Woodlands and build dams. CKOC's "BEEVER" frequents the Hamilton airwayes from 8 PM to Midnight and



builds an audience! His name is ROGER ASHBY.

"When I was eleven, I decided I wanted to become an announcer.... so I practiced announcing in my bedroom from age 11 to 17! Everyday I'd

play records, read news and commercials from the newspapers. I actually pretended my station was located in an empty field near Home". Though this hardly sounds like the Ryerson System of Instruction Roger credits this experience of his imaginary station with landing him his first real job in radio — as an operator at CKKW AM — CFCA FM in Kitchener! Roger also did some FM announcing on weekends. This all happened while Roger was still attending high school. "On completing Grade 13 in 1968, I was intending to goto Waterloo Lutheran University until I heard about a full-time opening at CKOC. I applied for the job and was hired". He loves TOP 40 MUSIC and hopes someday to become a Music Director. As for now, from 8 PM to Midnight CKOC is quite happy to "LEAVE IT TO BEEVER"!!!

MIKE KRAMER

We asked MIKE KRAMER for his life story. Just a few facts, you know, that we can write around. He began to talk..... ''Kramer started out as a child

"Kramer started out as a child (why not, Cosby made a fortune on it!). Because of a rough boyhood he aged rapidly, and in only sixteen and a half years was a sixteen and a half year old caddie on the U.S. professional golf circuit. Imagine, a mere kid with a fistful of bucks! "Even such an impressionable

young whelp realized that toting

golf bags around was not a permanent vocation for a stellar graduate (well, a graduate anyhow) of Hamilton's Delta High. Soon, hitch-hiking thumb worn to a nubbin, he scented the familiar aroma of cooling slag. Home! And a job at the first place he applied - CHCH-TV. A camera man no less....okay, after lugging sets around for a while. Imagine, a mere '17^{1/2} year old with a fist full of dollars. Just like Clint Eastwood

like Clint Eastwood. "While still at CHCH our young hero turned on a tape machine, read the back of a magazine into it, and sent the tape off to CHWO. They must have seen more than was there, thank goodness, and Michael Kramer wound up on the air.

"Again, imagine if you will, a 19 year old announcer with a fist full of...callouses...from keeping his '57 Chev roadworthy. No dollars. "Then....HOME!....Again! CKOC called. Golf Bags and TV cameras forgotten, Kramer responded....and man, is he loving it. If you're in Hamilton, drop by and see this 21½ year old 1150 Jock...with two fists... full of dollars."

OVER A DRINK....at a cocktail party recently, the comment "There's only one of those guys at RPM ETC ETC ! Old elephant ears doesn't miss a single signal. WATCH OUT !!!/// THE CANADIAN FILM INDUSTRY is also feeling the pinch. The film bus-iness in Canada is "all but dead" according to one authority. The National Film Board is still very busy./// THE GREAT CANADIAN MUSIC FARCE"..... is becoming a very popular expression in Canada. It simply implies that although there is a great deal of action, there is very little progress. There will be a great many "let down" people.///I GOT A MEMO

....about a conspiracy that is being launched that threatens the livelihood of many young musicians. The threat is

ADVERTISING in a publication in or the promise of airplay on a certain radio station. The powers that be...are aware of this "'USE'' of their enterprise and steps should be taken to STOP this misuse of a very cherished privilege. A RADIO STATION COULD GET ITSELF INTO SERIOUS TROUBLE !!!///I HAVE BEEN TOLD TO STAY MUM....about a plan to use FOREIGN CANNED MUSIC at a very CANADIAN event !!!! I won't be joining the rest of the "do-nothings" that want to see an INCIDENT occur regarding this matter. The whole thing is too important for the matter to be left to the last moment.///AN ARTICLE....by an RPM contributor on "pot" was very well timed in view of the problems that are occurring in the young musician area...plus the in-tended "crackdown" !!!///MY COLUMN HAS BEEN BUMPED ... by SPECIAL issues, TAPE issues and an article about a record producer and a dog. LET'S start looking at this whole thing in its order of importance. UP-STAGED BY A DOG???(Ed: Be careful or I'll get him to bite you!!!)///ONE BOOKING AGENCY has supposedly laid down the law and if you read carefully, this is a BUY & SELL arrangement which I don't think is allowed by the powers that be???//, WATCH FOR.....a "Canadian SUPER GROUP" that will record in Canada. The guy behind this group is well versed in the industry and has international connections !!!///WATCH FOR action from the CRTC in the area of "CANADIANISM" !!!!!!/ QUESTIONABLES Q. Why do stations program and chart Canadian content before they are going to ap-proach the CRTC for a renewal or extended privileges? A. Have you ever heard of any instances of PAYOLA in the Canadian disc business? A. There is nothing and no one who has any jurisdiction of even the most flagrant payola practices in Canada. There is no law or ruling that applies in this case, and if payola was rampant, then there would be no reason to discuss the cause or effects because there is no remedy! IT JUST ISN't DISCUSSED by NICE people. (I can see that this whole idea of answering questions will just lead to all kinds of embarrassing areas that will bring about threatening letters. These are things that are not my concern (or anyone elses) and should be swept under the carpet where they belong.)



Grant Park. The Airplane show was the first public gathering of any type in that city since last summer's Democratic Convention turmoil. The group received permission from Mayor Daley himself to have the concert.

The Airplane described the event as "a present to Chicago". The cost to the group of giving the concert was



over \$6,000, which makes it a nice present but not at all unusual for the Airplane. They were the first to initiate free concerts in the early days of the San Francisco group quake. The Airplane, however, are the only top group to continue the free concert policy and at the same time, to sustain their position as top draw rock musicians.

While leaving town after the con-cert Jack Casady's bass guitar was lost. The instrument was a specially constructed, custom built guitar and it could not be replaced. The group immediately offered a reward and Casady got his bass back some hours later and hasn't let it out of his sight ever since.

Dennis Yost and Wally Eaton of the Classics IV were in an auto accident last week. Yost suffered cuts and bruises on his face but will be able to return to work with the group within a week. Eaton, who was on the critical list when he entered the hospital, had multiple injuries and will be out of the group for six months. Billy Gilmore, a member of The Candymen, will tour with The Classics IV until Eaton is able to return.

Joe Cocker's next single is an original George Harrison composition written especially for Joe by George ... Ex-Traffic member Dave Mason has joined Herb Alpert's A&M Records as a producer....Booker T. and The MG's will be recording other's hits for their

next album. Included on the LP are "Light My Fire", "It's Your Thing", "Love Child" and "Lady Madonna"Curtis Mayfield and The Impression make the first underground appearance of their careers next month when they play The Fillmore West in San Francisco.....Bob Dylan, who wrote Johnny Cash's new single, "Wanted Man", will appear on the first Johnny Cash television show (ABC June 7). Dylan will sing two of his own songs, "I Threw It All Away" and "Livin' The Blues", followed by a duet with Cash of "Girl Of The North Country", an early Dylan song that they recorded together and appears on Dylan's new album.

The Kinks will make their first American tour in July. Ray Davies of the group left Los Angeles this week to return to London after attending a recording session with The Turtles. Ray, a first rate musician, is also becoming an author. He's signed a contract to do a book about The Kinks Rumour has it that Eric Clapton is playing bass on The Beatles' "My Guitar Gently Weeps" on their last album and that George Harrison is playing guitar on "Badge" on The Cream's last album The Vanilla Fudge were in New York this week finishing up work on their fifth album. The LP will be released at the end of June and the Fudge are keeping its contents a carefully guarded secret until then.

The latest Apple Records single release in London has been described as "obscene". The record, called "King of Fuh", is sung by American Brute Force, and was found in New York City last September by George Harrison. "King" was produced by The Tokens, under George's supervision. EMI, the company which distributes Apple Records, refused to touch it, objecting to the message it contained. The Beatles mailed copies to their friends, including Herb Alpert, The Beach Boys, The Rolling Stones, and The Mamas and The Papas, hoping that the talk among pop people would help the record.
