

Exceptional Action for Steel River

Cockell and Syrinx to release on True North

Bernie Finklestein has moved full ahead into the recording industry and this time he's spread himself out so well he could just keep the ball rolling.

He first made the scene, this time around, with Bruce Cockburn, now nicely on his way with a True North single "Going To The Country" and album. Next, and shaping up as a group to keep an eye on, is Luke and The Apostles, who have just released their single with a follow-up album.

Almost completed is his next venture, John Mills-Cockell, who together with Doug Pringle, horn man, and drummer John Wells form the group Syrinx.

The Toronto Telegram's Peter Goddard did a piece on this trio in the Aug. 1st editions and explained the secret of Syrinx and what could, perhaps, be their success. The 27 year old Mills-Cockell is a Moog Synthesizer freak and has a higher than average musical background (for the rock scene). As Goddard pointed out, Mills-Cockell completed classical studies at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Music, studied composition under Dr. Samuel Dolan and taught at the Royal Conservatory of Music's electronic studio. He even hobnobbed, musically, with Kensington Market, another Finklestein find.

What Syrinx and their \$12,000 Moog are attempting is to bring their electronic beauty into more prominence and rid its image of the spooks responsible for the lack of success of the revolutionary new sound robot. Goddard, himself a musicologist, has obviously researched this electronic newie and explains: "Much the way the piano reflected the age that gave it prominence (the 19th century with its inclination towards abrupt contrasts in dynam-

"Ballet High"-A Pleasant Surprise

"Ballet High", which played to better than expected houses at Toronto's St. Lawrence Centre for the Arts (1-8), is an amalgam of diverse elements, the result is surprisingly complimentary to both. To be quite honest, I went to "Ballet High" knowing not a thing about ballet and caring little for Lighthouse. I came away enthralled by both.

"Ballet High" is one of the "must sees" that seems to come along more and more rarely. Featured are the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, choreographed by Brian Macdonald, and Toronto's thirteen piece Lighthouse rock/jazz/classical ensemble.

"Ballet High" comes in three parts. The opener is Lighthouse playing in the pit in front of the stage. The group slowly rises to stage level and is pushed to the back of the stage on a portable platform - performing while the moving is taking place. The complete Ballet Company then appears on stage with a few members going through exercises on bars while others lounge around and listen to Lighthouse. The Company's unofficial prima ballerina, Christine Hennessy, takes the lead in an interpretation of Kenneth MacMillan's "Solitaire". the point being, Christine of the black tights, is an outcast. Fol-

lowing an interpretation of Ravel's "Bolero", the Company leaves Lighthouse to work their efficient way through a couple of numbers before returning with the most impressive work of "The Shining People of Leonard Cohen". This is performed by two members of the Company, dancing to the poems of Cohen, read by Brian Macdonald. Highly impressive sculpture is provided by Ted Bieler.

Rainvilles Moving Toward Pop Charts

It was also pointed up that tone production by electrical means is not new and that attempts to popularize this type of reproduction go back to 1930 with the bowing of the Theremin, Spherophone, Croiz Sonore and electric organ. The only one which met with any real success was the electric organ.

Perhaps Mills-Cockell's comment to Goddard sums it up nicely. He noted: "Because of the instrument the music we play fits into many bags, jazz, classical, eastern, folk. The music goes through many changes. In working in a small room, the sounds become soft and dreamy. Now, we're exploring things using greater volume.

"Right now it presents a big challenge to keep our music structured. To make a musical entity out of all this potential."

With the release of their album, sometime in August, Syrinx will be the first group to feature a Moog.

True North is distributed by Columbia Records.

5 Man Electrical Band Bows on MGM

Ottawa's Five Man Electrical Band, who have been off the disc scene for several months, have moved back in with a powerful outing on their new label, MGM. Entitled "Moonshine (Friend of Mine)" written by group member Les Emmerson. the lid will be used in a forthcoming MGM flick, "Moonshine War". The group is comprised of Emmerson, Rick Bell, Mike Bell, Brian Rading and Ted Gerow. They will be playing several dates in Ontario and Quebec before heading out on a tour of the U.S. where they will finish up in California and a date in the studios for an album and another single release.

J.R. Prods to Manage Graham

Rodeo recording artist, Mike Graham, who splashed across the national country scene with his initial release, "No Pity For A Fool", has been signed for personal management by J.R. Productions Ltd.

Graham's follow-up single, "She Always Lets Me Down So Easy", also produced by Gary Buck, is showing signs of getting the flip treatment. "These Things", a Graham penning, is gaining the favour of country jocks.

London's Ontario sales and promotion manager, Ken McFarland, sees good pop potential in the disc, whose only country reference would seem to be the steel.

George Taylor, president of Rodeo Records, also sees a widening acceptance of the Graham sound and refers to it as "Mike Graham and Mod-Country music are synonomous". Graham's first album for Rodeo, "Canadian Country Explosion" is now being readied for Fall release.

Coming up for Graham is a promotion in conjunction with CHEX radio, in Peterboro and he is skedded for an engagement at Toronto's Horseshoe Tavern, Sept. 7th.





"As the Years Go By" -A National Hit

When Columbia Records first bowed the Mashmakhan album, there was much concern over a possible single release. The label's A&R Director, Johnny Williams was certain the group could become a hot item for the top forty outlets. CHUM FM had already proven Mashmakhan were extremely strong with the free formers. It was just a matter of taking a couple of cuts and trimming them down for single play. 'Days When We Are Free' was the plug side with 'As the Years Go By' making the flip. No sooner was the single released than the chart action began. Programmers seemed to have some difficulty in picking a side. Most went with 'Days' but there was a growing trend for the flip.

"As the Years Go By" finally won out and the group took hold nationally. Being "ploked" on the Maple Leaf System brought a few more major markets into play. In Montreal, Roger Scott at CFOX noted 'most requested song in Station's history'. It was number one for four weeks. In Vancouver, CKLG's Roy Hennessy said, 'Started slow..now moving fast..ton ten next week..looks like biggest Canadian record ever'. CHUM's Chuck McCoy tagged it "Biggest Canadian record since "These Eyes" '. The single has even received token play in Edmonton.

"As the Years Go By" Sam's Free Gigs Boost Disc Sales

Bob Sniderman, who looks after the Sam The Record Man franchise stores, has found an unusually high, record buyer interest following free concerts in the plazas where franchise stores have just opened or where they are already established.

One of the most successful free gigs was held in the Newtonbrook Plaza, located in Willowdale, a suburb of Toronto. The group involved was Columbia's Robert E. Lee Brigade. The crowd that gathered, created a traffic tie-up but also resulted in an overall increase for plaza merchants and a decided effect on sales of the group's single, "You Can't Always Get What You Want" and their recently released album. Frank Lee's solo single, "She" also experienced a sales gain.

Fred Trainor Marries

Saturday July 25, practically the whole town of Liverpool, Nova Scotia (Hank Snow's birthplace) invaded Uxbridge Ontario to watch their favourite son, Fred Trainor, exchange vows with Barbara Brunne, of Uxbridge.

The delegation was headed by the Mayor of Liverpool, who happens to be Fred's father.

There was also many well-wishers from the town of Barrie (about 60 miles north of Toronto) where the Trainor name has become a household word. Sniderman has thrown similar promotions with the opening of each new store and intends to increase this type of activity. Record companies have expressed interest in the promotions being as they have seen an increase in sales of the groups involved.

In summing up the performance of the Lee Brigade Sniderman noted: "If you have any doubts about the presence of Robert E. Lee, be well assured he is alive and well in the personnage of Frank Lee, and his 'Brigade' of four musicians."


Sniderman also found that "under the leadership of Frank, blending an ensemblage of Jaggerish-Cocker, with his own original vocal style, make this another of the fine young groups headed for the top."

These included the staff of Barrie's radio-TV station (CKBB) where Trainor is program director, and members of the Civitan Club, with whom Fred frequently produces country shows for charity.

"Walking" Jimmy Simms, whose "Shoes Keep On Walking" is still popular in Barrie, hiked in from Toronto to watch his buddy walk his last steps as a bachelor.



neglected to mention that it was the Harris Agency who had booked this tour.


The Harris agency has just completed a tour of dates for Canora, Saskatchewan thrush, Gracie Dee.



CMS Bows Stompin' Tom's Folio No. 1

Fresh from a triumphant "Welcome Home" celebration in Charlottetown and a return to headline the Island's "Old Home Week", Stompin' Tom Connors continues to make Canadian country history.

His latest Dominion release, "Ketchup Song" is still one of the big sellers on the label and has brought much attention to all of his released product. Canadian Music Sales have released Con-



nors' first Folio of Songs, which includes: "Bud The Spud", "Big Joe Mufferaw", "Black Donnelly's Massacre", "Don Valley Jail", "Sudbury Saturday Night" and 12 other compositions that are fast becoming popular across Canada.

Luke and Apostles in Special Mailer

Columbia Records have shipped the new Luke and The Apostles' True North single, "You Make Me High", in a special DJ mailer with both the long and short versions. The mailing is particularly heavy and twofold, because of the expected reaction to the disc and the rekindling of the popularity of the group, which goes back to 1964. The quartet, as they are now, have played both "live" and on sessions with some of the top names in the business. These include: David Clayton Thomas, Van Morrison, Buddy Miles, Andy Kim, Felix Papalardi and Wilson Pickett. They are comprised of: Luke Gibson, lead vocalist, harmonica and guitar; Pat Little, drums: Jack Gusenger, bass; and Wally Rossi, lead guitar.

Besides his four singles, still available, Dominion are pushing four album releases plus a special 5 album set (suggested list \$9.98) containing several of his own compositions, well integrated with foreign material including: "Mule Skinner Blues", "The Big Rock Candy Mountain", "Wabash Cannonball" and others. This set (STC 1) also contains "Prince Edward Island Is Heaven To Me".

It should be noted that the artwork on the front cover of the Connors' Folio was submitted by Steve "Newfie Screech" Foote.

MCA's Native Artists Moving Up

MCA is experiencing some good activity with its roster of native talent. Christopher Kearney, whose Apex single, 'Theme for Jody' is getting good exposure from programmers across the country, put in an appearance at the Mariposa Folk Festival, following which, sales of the single increased appreciably. Barry Allen, experiencing good returns on his deck of 'Wednesday in your Garden', just wound up a recording session in Chicago, with producers Randy Backman and Wes Dakus doing the honours. The resulting album will appear on the newly-formed Molten label. And Finally, Apex's Sebastian makes a tube appearance in Montreal on the 'Like Young Show', following which is the release of his first album on the new MCA label. The session was produced by Ron Dykhof and features some Sebastian originals plus his last two singles.

MCA Reviving Oldies

MCA is experiencing renewed interest in some of its product released over the past few years. The rock opera 'Tommy' by the Who is undergoing a resurgence of popularity, thought to be a result of the group's exposure in the 'Woodstock' flick, their new release of 'Live at Leeds' and heavy exposure of Summertime Blues' across the country. Another factor in the new interest may be the Assembled Multitude's version of the 'Overture from Tommy' on Atlantic which is being aired throughout Canada. Another artist coming on strong with an old release is Burt Bacharach and 'His Hits'. Bacharach's numerous television appearances coupled with the enormous success of his compositions, has created a demand for recordings featuring him- The 'Burt Bacharach Plays His Hits' album is being ordered by record stores and being aired extensively by MOR and FM stations. The set, originally released in October, 1968, is being reserviced by the company.





Feliciano -No Gimmickry

Some performers have it. Some don't. Jose Feliciano, who appeared at the O'Keefe Centre (July 20), is one of the very few with that rare gift of reaching the audience. You could say his show

is polished, but, perhaps, wellthought-out is more appropriate.

Through all his numbers, Feliciano remains indefatigible. His punning with audience is a seldom, if ever, part of any show. He is consistently cheerful, tongue-incheek at times, sincere always, and his playing reflects this happy state of mind.

His is a most astonishingly broad repertoire, ranging from country to classical and everything in between. His guitar mastery is not just lightning quick and full of fireworks, but also emotive, rich. and sensitive, whether the instru-ment is acoustic guitar or "quatro"? guitar (Puerto Rican).

As an example of his wide selection of material, one might just glance through the program: "Hey Jude", "Sunny", "Satisfaction", "Zorba The Greek", his own compositions, totally different from each other; "Destiny" (rock), "Once There Was A Love" (ballad).

His rendition of "Windmills Of Your Mind" was captivating; his classically performed "Malaguena" is a gem.

The fact the he cannot fully discern the dramatic effect of the lighting around him proves that the musical result is genuine Feliciano - no gimmickry.

Preceding Feliciano were the Edwin Hawkin Singers, a mighty exuberant gospel group of 16 musicians and vocalists. Their communication with the audience is also 100%, although in a different manner. Their program begins slowly enough, building up to a rousing climax at the end which involves the audience - totally.

Melanie Takes Powder Ridge Fest

Melanie is an artist whom you admire or dislike intensely. At least that is the feeling of many of the press people in New York. She has a tremendously devoted group of fans however, over 200,000 of them bought her latest album, "Candles In The Rain". Melanie made many more fans



this past weekend when she appeared unannounced and perhaps illegally to perform at the **Powder Ridge Festival.**

I was at Powder Ridge this past weekend, and the news reports of what happened there and what actually did go down were quite different. Many of the newspapermen whom I talked with were overly concerned with finding "bad trips", and pointing out the drug abuse. I didn't really see that. What I saw was a bunch of kids whose music had been snatched away from them because of political reasons, who instead had preferred to turn the three days into a true People's Festival; they generated their own electricity from Mister Softee trucks, built their own alternate stages, set up sound systems, and had a good time. Local bands played, the vibrations were good and the entire experience was tremendously reassuring.

For the first day or so, the kids really believed that if they held the land and remained in Powder Ridge, Connecticutt, they would have their Festival, with all of the top acts. However, the injunction against the Festival was enforced all along, and it was somewhat depressing to see these kids really believing their rock heroes were hiding out in the vicinity, just waiting to entertain them. The stars were far away, both physically and spiritually, I believe. It is unfortunate that in a situation where there are so many villains, no one thinks to question the rock super heroes who demand huge fees for playing, operate on a purely capitalist system of profits, and then walk away with the adoration of the people for being part of the "revolution". But that's another story.

The real villains, in my opinion, at Powder Ridge, were the promoters who implied (up until the last day before the concert, when they fled) that the Festival was still being held and encouraged kids to buy tickets. The people who were involved with the advertising, publicity, and promotion must be made to account for some of this. What is happening to the money? Who will be making money on T-shirts sold with the Powder Ridge emblem?

Anyway, when the kids realized that no stars were coming, they managed to create their own music and used their energy for that purpose. Then Melanie arrived. When she was recognized, kids were so happy because they felt they had "made it" and it would really be a Festival after all. Melanie sang to about 7000 people or more on a sloping hillside right beside the free kitchen. It was very appropriate of the whole idea of free kitchens and Festivals of life to have her there. Melanie sings songs about love, peace, beautiful people, healthy food, and life. The crowd went wild when she sang that "she wouldn't have come here if she didn't care a lot". She introduced a new song, "Peace Will Come", which had everyone chanting along, and sang Mungo Jerry's "In The Summertime". It was a joyous, moving performance, and made many people, who came to Powder Ridge expecting to receive something but instead gave it much more, very happy.


Future plans for the Happy Feeling includes a trip eastward as soon as they can fulfill all commitments in Alberta.




