CANADA'S FASTEST GROWING MUSIC INDUSTRY PROVINCE

Alberta -

Few Canadians know much about Canada other than the area in which they live. It's extremely enlightening to travel this country to see what the rest of Canada has to offer.

Take, for instance, Alberta. "Except for the northeast corner, which lies in the Canadian Shield, and the mountainous fringe on its western border, the province is underlain by arable soil. Permanent agricultural settlement reaches its farthest northern point in Canada in the Peace River Valley. The northern half of the province has great rivers, lakes and forests



with broad tracts of open prairie; central Alberta is parklike country with belts of timber; the south is mostly rolling, treeless prairie with much of the land irrigated in the semi-arid far south and east. Winter climate is extremely variable. Within a few hours the Chinook wind may raise the temperature by as much as 60 degrees. So named because it always blows from the direction of the valley of the Columbia River where the Chinook Indian tribe once lived, this southwestern wind is always warm because it comes in over mountains and is compressed by the sharp fall."

Throughout the province there are varied music industry endeavours. From the recording studios, booking agencies, personal management firms, record companies and distributors to the musicians, singers, songwriters that all add to the fact that the province is growing as a music production centre.

Not too many years ago, the provincehad little to offer except talent that either went east or south in search of facilities to record and be recognized. Over the past few years, they have built their own industry and today, can even boast a pressing plant with mastering facilities and jacket design, fabrication and printing.

"Alberta was originally a part of the territory granted to the Hudson's Bay Company by the charter of 1670, sovereignty over which land was acquired by the Dominion in 1870. Law and order was established on the western plains in 1874 by the long ride of the North West Mounted Police from Fort Garry, now Winnipeg, to establish Fort Macleod, about 100 miles south of Calgary. The building of the CPR, which reached Calgary in 1883, opened up the area, first to cattle and sheep ranchers and then to homesteaders."

It was obvious Alberta had entered the

age of reality from the standpoint of the music industry. So, RPM went to Alberta to talk to the people who were making the music industry happen. These people went out of their way to meet with us and tell their story.

Westmount Records is the studio label of Sound West Studios. For two and a half years, they have been producing records in Calgary. Their current discovery is Roxanne Goldade, a 13 year old singers who has already shown regional reaction to her nitial single release. Another artist from the label is Tony White, currently holding chart positions on the RPM Country and MOR Playlists. The studio offers a 16-track facility and is as modern as any in other parts of Canada.

Doug Wong of Sound West is pleased with the progress the studio has made and feels they are ready for national distribution of their product.

Don Boas, of Underdog Productions, is promoting the soon-to-be released single by Fosterchild, a Calgary group that was recorded by CBS, in the east. James Foster fronts the group and, of the six sides cut by CBS, Boas feels the first release could give the group their start. They recently completed a western Canadian tour with Blood Sweat & Tears. Boas is also in parntership with Lou Blair in Calgary's Refinery, a new club designed to showcase domestic and internationally-known talent.

Damon Productions, established in Edmonton in 1969 is a production company with in-house studios. The 16-track facility

records jingles as well as record sessions and has recorded Stompin' Tom Connors, Doug Kershaw, Merle Haggard and a large number of local talent. It was just recently when the tracks for the CBC-TV series featuring Bob Ruzicka, were taped at the studios by owner/producer Gary McDonall.

The company has two labels for their acts; Damon is principally a country label and Mustard is their contemporary release label. Nancy Nash is one of Damon's current artists with a new group, Roxslyde, about to be released with a heavy promotion campaign to back the group.

Another act from Damon is Donna Adams who was nominated for a Juno this past year and is also a contender for a Big Country Award.

The publishing arms representing Damon are Petmac (BMI) and 3 PM Music (CAPAC). Tieing the complex into a tight full-service operation is their One Stop serving Alberta, Saskatchewan and B.C.

McDonall is of the opinion that Alberta shows tremendous potential in terms of talent and artists, with the finest musicians in Canada. The raw talent, studios, investment and technical expertise is there. Says McDonall, "All we need is to produce the hits"

Alberta's first 24 track computerized recording studio will soon be a reality and will be part of the full facilities of Lestra Electronics Industries. They are presently set up to master, press and package singles and albums, all under one roof.

Lestra produces recorded product on their own label, Maple Haze. They recently released product by the Bogart Brothers, Franco (their Italian Tom Jones), Harry Rusk and The Romanuik Family.

Holger Petersen is an Edmonton record producer making a mark in the province with his productions. He heads up the Stony Plain Recording Company which is also his label, distributed by London. Current product includes an album from Paul Hann, Another Tumbleweed, and an album by Will Millar, Making Believe Days. Current single release by Hann, I'll Be Your Antique Freak, is now beginning to make gains across the country.

With close to a dozen productions behind him, Peterson, a former radio producer for Edmonton's CKUA, is excited over the talent and production capabilities in his province.

With the unveiling, this year, of the ultramodern 24-track Sundown Recorders, the Alberta production picture appeared to be complete. With the news of the opening many easteners came west to inspect the

new studios. Veterans in the world of rock and country sound, Wes Dakus and Barry Allen, the former as president, have laid the foundation for Edmonton to become the Mecca of the west, insofar as recording studios are concerned. Booking for label and commercial work is now "very heavy", with out of province bookings on the increase. An out-of-province act, Fustukian, is currently being recognized across the country through his Sundown production of (Phyllis) Wait For The Wagon, released on the Vancouver-based Casino label.

"Alberta has 70,000 square miles of occupied agricultural land; about an equal area of unoccupied land is considered suitable for cultivation. The discovery of oil at Leduc, near Edmonton, in 1947, began a basic change in Alberta's economy. Alberta oil is now carried by the world's longest crude oil pipe line (1,930 miles) from Alberta to Ontario. Another line carries oil 718 miles over the Rockies to

refineries near Vancouver. Also, pipe lines carry natural gas from Alberta to markets in British Columbia, the western States and eastern Canada. Until recently, vegetable and animal products dominated in manufacturing but petroleum products are gaining.

In the midst of this wealth of natural resources is a human resource called talent. Alberta has their share of talent, ready to

break out nationally and internationally. Most people in the industry are convinced it will happen soon and they are working toward that end.

Wildrose Recorders is a studio in the northeastern part of Alberta that also serves the northwestern part of Saskatchewan. Roy Ward heads the operation which also releases on the Wildrose label. They record jingles and label sessions and have current releases by Ronnie Burla and Winterwood. The studio's recording engineer, Tony Lewis, has a background in engineering and production.

The studio is 150 miles northeast of Edmonton and Robert R. Ward Music of Bonnycastle has the best representation of musical instruments in the area. So, it isn't all Edmonton and Calgary. The Alberta music industry stretches the length and breadth of the province.

Robbie Campbell is a new talent to the recording scene in Edmonton. An ex-football player (Edmonton Eskimos and B.C. Lions) he is now launching his recording careers with guidance from Herb Tate who has already made the Taitums a well-known group throughout the province. Robbie is booked by Banks Associated Music of Ed-

Tommy Banks is a nationally-known

television personality who has, over the years, launched a successful music industry enterprise in Edmonton.

Involved in television production, his current endeavour, Celebrity Revue, is syndicated throughout the U.S.

In the past he was Music Director of the ITV In Concert series and was part of the production of the Aretha Franklin and Roger Whittaker specials that were produced in Edmonton.

One of the first full-length feature motion pictures ever made in Alberta will be premiered in Edmonton in October. The music score was recorded at Edmonton's Century II Studios with Banks conducting.

Ida Banks (Mrs. Tom Banks) runs the booking end of the enterprise with the assistance of Tish Soley. The agency, started in 1956, has booked televison shows, conventions, radio shows, show rooms, lounges and exhibitions from Vancouver to Winnipeg. Represented by the agency are such well-known artists as Blake Emmons, Debbie Lori Kaye, Tony White, Jack Hennig, Larry Gustafson, Doug Rutledge, The Original Caste (One Tin Soldier was their international hit) and Eastwind.

Ida feels that Alberta is ready. "The growth and opportunity has been encouraging over the last five years. I'd like to see a more cooperative approach from the east and the west." It's her belief that it's coming and, after a short time in Alberta, you're bound to agree.

Ernie Castle heads Diecast Records in Calgary. He also fronts one of the most popular jazz-oriented dining lounge groups in the province.

Ernie began playing the western circuit in 1966 and has played Calgary's White Spot this past summer and will return to the Calgary Petroleum Club for his ninth year this fall.

There are two album releases on Diecast by the Ernie Castle 4 and a single release, Walkin' After Midnight, by Joyce Sturn. The latter is picking up good regional play and Diecast is looking for national distribution.

ACTS and Music Consultants is a new company in Edmonton. They book music acts throughout the west. The enterprising new firm has close to two dozen acts which they book exclusively as well as cooperating with agencies and promoters across Canada, to provide a complete service to anyone looking for talent.





Dale Edwards and Jack Raskin front the agency and only recently held a large showcase in Edmonton to show what they had to offer.

From the television standpoint, Dr. Allard's ITV, with the help of producer Doug Hutton, brought a new country dimension to Alberta. Integrating local acts with internationally-known recording artists like Anne Murray and Charley Pride, among others, they showcased this talent

in front of the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra and offered these superbly produced shows for syndication around the world. TeeVee's Ed LaBuick recognized the potential of this Alberta endeavour and parlayed his investment into a sizeable profit. MOR acts were given similar treatment.

Also important in Alberta television is CFRN-TV in Edmonton, a part of the Sunwapta Broadcasting Ltd., which has always

been committed to showcasing local talent; Calgary's CFAC-TV, now an independent, offers well produced packages of local talent as well, as does CFCN-TV, a CTV Network station. One mustn't overlook the importance of the smaller television stations throughout the province - all contributing much to the local talent character of Alberta. These include CKSA-TV Lloydminster, Medicine Hat's CHAT-TV and CKRD-TV in Red Deer.

There is much excitement and action throughout the province. New companies

and new and exceptionally talented people are entering the music business. New studios have been built and the established studios are always being updated. Everywhere you go there is a feeling that the big breakthrough is coming - that one record or act that will open the door to the rest of the world. The comradery within the industry is incredible. There is a togetherness that prevails among record companies, recording studios, booking agencies and artists and groups. They know that the best way to build an industry is through a united front.

Unfortunately, the Alberta music scene

is cut off from the rest of Canada and this point is made quite clear by the people you talk to in the province. They would like to have a closer relationship with the east. You are constantly reminded that the talent is here, the studios are here, but Alberta is waiting for a hit.

Many of the groups only work regionally and most of the Alberta record releases have no national distribution. The industry admits to being young and new to the record industry and hope to become a working part of the total Canadian industry.

It wasn't too many years ago when there was little to talk about. Now, there is more and someday there will be plenty. That's the

day the music industry in Alberta is waiting

The whole scene is impressive. It's a powder keg about to explode with a sound that will be heard across Canada and eventually around the world. There is one thing they aren't short of in Alberta, talent, time and patience - and one other thing oil. All of these are important to Canada.

Alberta Canada's oil shiekdom jingling with country money

When did Alberta's music industry first emerge? Most observers will probably bow to the year 1976 as being the most significant in the history of the province. Old-timers in the music industry shouldn't get too upset but should, instead, look at the burgeoning music business that has become one of the most important industries in the province. Even head Sheik, Ali Baba Lougheed, has shown an interest in the music industry, particularly the country music scene, and had his advisor, Horst Schmid,

Minister of Culture, bestow Provincial Achievement Awards on local talent.

Alberta, you would think, is a natural for country music, what with the Blue Canadian Rockies, the Banff Trail, the Calgary Stampede that allows the showcasing of some Canadian acts, and the equally famous Edmonton Klondike Days. Why, even back in the good old days when the threat of Sitting Bull was just so much bull and the Riel Rebellion ran out of gas, there they were, just a-reelin' and a jiggin' and a weepin' to the songs of the day as they hewed out their existence. It was country - big country and they made it even bigger when the folks of the Alberta territory decided to become a province in 1905.

There was much-to-do about a lot of things in the years that passed and country music was the salve that took the burn out of the hard living. The gigs were few and far between where, quite often, the setting was the local church, probably the reason country folk singers adopted that "nearer to God" attitude that seems to have prevailed over these many years.

As the years progressed, so did the number of local performers and, with the advent of radio stations, another and even greater avenue of exposure was made available to entertainers of the province. Why, some radio stations programmed Canadian

country recordings even before the prophet Juneau carved out his 30% epistle.

The west, and in particular Alberta, was adding to the cultural being of Canada and western Canadian programmers were showing up their eastern cousins. Get this for a quote: "We would like to bring to the attention of our readers that the mail from the Lakehead and west is substantially greater than from the rest of Canada. With a few exceptions, the west is more Canadian-minded than the east. This is true particularly with the low watters and there are many many more of these and they influence a larger segment of the population. The Canadian west is probably the most rapidly developing part of Canada." Yessir, that was in an RPM dated Aug 9, 1965.

Looking even further back in RPM, to the week of Sept 1, 1964, the first issue of RPM, in a magazine format, a western Canadian gentleman name of Wes Dakus had a chart item with his Quality single, Sidewinder, and a couple of weeks later (Sept 14) Barry Allen hit with his Quality single, Over My Shoulder. Well, Dakus and Allen weren't country back then, but they're sure contributing to the Alberta country scene now, which we'll get into a little later on.

Still leafing through RPM, look what we found for the week of Sept 8, 1964. Scotty Stevenson taped a show for CFTO's Country Music Hall and while he was in Toronto he dropped into CFGM and gave a copy of his single to Gord Symon. His London single was Where Was My Blue Eyed Baby, which was culled from his album, Variety in Country Style.

Now, stay with us. This is the first

time we've had the opportunity to take a look at the Canadian country music history as chronicled by RPM. Here's an interesting item: "Upon completion of a five month tour around Alberta and B.C., Dick Damron took time out to cut some new sides for the Canadian RCA

Victor folks in Montreal. His latest offering is Hitch Hikin' coupled with Stop Feeling Sorry." That was reported in the Nov 16, 1964 issue of RPM.


Why, it seems just like yesterday when RPM's Star Line of May 24, 1965 centred on Calgary's Ray Griff. The story of his life unfolded and revealed that the young Calgarian caught the ear of the late Jim Reeves who recorded one of his sacred songs, Where Do I Go From Here. The door flew wide open for the young Griff as he had his songs recorded by Marty Robbins, Stonewall Jackson, Charlie Walker and many more and this was many years before he wrote his now famous Canadian Pacific for George Hamilton IV.

You westerners must remember Billy Stoltz. RPM remembers Billy back in 1968, May 4 to be exact. That's when we reported that he had just finished up a good year during 1967. Remember the Battle Of Queenston Heights, Blue Is The Colour and Walkin' With The Blues? They were all charted on RPM during that year. Billy now has his own label in Alberta.

The year was 1968 and on April 4 of that year, Alberta's newest radio station went on the air - CJYR in Edson was being programmed by Chuck Benson, winner of RPM's Top Disc Jockey of the Year Award for the year 1965. Chuck's format was rock and pop and a lot of country. On-air jocks were Waxie Williams, Charlie Brown, Rick Raesler and Sandy Brown.


Herb Tait isn't countryfied but he's sure part of the Alberta music business. In a story datelined New York City, Herb, who

Some of the great veteran stars - men like Wilf Carter, the late Don Messer, Stu Davis, and Hal Lonepine - have long been part of CAPAC.


CAPAC continues to represent their investments, just as it represents those of a new breed of Canadian country star - people like Gordon Lightfoot, Murray McLauchlan, Stompin' Tom Connors, Roy Payne, the Family Brown, Colleen Peterson, Julie Lynn, Tom Gallant, Stevedore Steve, Harry Hibbs, the Good Brothers and countless more.

CAPAC continues to grow in both size and influence. As Canada's first performing rights organization, its main role is to collect performing rights royalties from the organizations which use music in Canada, and distribute the money to the people who wrote and published it.

Last year, CAPAC members - and members of foreign societies affiliated with CAPAC - shared more than \$10 million. That, as they say in the country, ain't hay.

If you write or publish country music - or any kind of music - you need to know more about CAPAC and how it helps you. Before you make decisions about performing rights, talk to CAPAC. We're here to help.

The Canadian performing rights organization





was the father and manager of "Edmonton's sensational small fry group, The Taitums, had made a trip to New York where he was touting his talented brood. That was reported in RPM, April 6, 1968. That same week we wrote about another Edmonton music figure, Harry Rusk. At that time, Harry had released two albums on the Point label and was waiting for the release of his third, Northern Memories, on the Apex label. Harry was gigging around town and appearing regularly on CFRN-TV.

Remember when big Bev Munro signed with Capitol Records in April of 1967? RPM was there and we told our readers about some of the accomplishments of this giant from CFCW, the 50,000 watter out of Camrose. Did you know that he was voted Mr. DJ. U.S. at WSM Nashville in 1959? His Capitol single, Let's Have A Bluc For The Blues, which was written by Bev and Jimmy C. Newman, was one of the most popular of Canadian country recordings to come out of the west. All this was reported in the March 23, 1968 issue of RPM.

Whatever happened to Shirley Ann of Drumheller. It was reported in the March 16, 1968 issue of RPM that she cut her first single at Calgary's Warhurst Studios which was released on George Taylor's Rodeo label. Remember too, that was the year when Shirley was voted Number Two, Most Promising Country Female Singer, in the RPM poll.

Well, that's a little nostalgia and we could go on with many more names that contributed to the growth of the music

industry in Alberta, but lef's move up a


The seventies saw a clear cut picture of advancement for country music in Alberta. It was the January 23, 1971 issue of RPM that pointed up the contribution that Hank Smith had made to the country music scene. Up to that time he had released eight albums and 32 singles and was working

on his new Quality single, Sweet Dreams Of Yesterday, already charted on the RPM Country Playlist. Smith went on to win recognition from the Alberta Province (Achievement Award) and became the first president of the Academy of Country Music Entertainment (ACME). He is currently on release with his Quality single, Give Me A Country Song, very appropriate for this year's Big Country Meet.

Merv Smith, almost an institution in Canadian country, was charted in the Oct 10, 1970 issue with his Quality single, Checkmate, a self-penning published through Manitou (BMI). Another voice emerging that year was Jack Hennig who was charted with his Dick Damron composition of Pappa Told Me and published through Beechwood (BMI). Of course, you

can't overlook one of the province's big big talents, Jimmy Arthur Ordge, who now records for R. Harlan Smith's Royalty Records. It was during October of 1970 when Jimmy Struck gold with his controversial recording of The Ballad Of Muck Tuk Annie, released on Gary McDonall's Damon label. Dick Damron was still plotting chart trips to the top and that same month was doing it with his Apex single, Countryfied.

The first issue of RPM for the year 1972 saw Balzac's favourite son, Lee Roy, making good inroads with his RCA single, My Soul Sings out, followed by Hank Smith's Where Do We Go From Here and Shirley Ann's Big Chief single, Turn Me Around.

The year was looking good and in February, R. Harlan Smith bounced onto the charts with his GRT single, Cold Day In October. By the end of the year (1973) Alberta had chalked up one of its most impressive years. That famous Edmondon dentist, Bob Ruzicka took the year out with his single, Cardboard Cowboys, R. Harlan Smith was doing it with I Remember

Love, Ray Griff with Darlin', that big man of song, Tony White, had made chart impressions with his Columbia single, I'm Going Back (To Lovin' You) and Royalty introduced their latest signing, Whitehayes MacKenworth, with his single, Mr. Highway.

The year 1974 was looking even better. Russell Thornberry brought the year in with his Century II single, Ramona, to join an already successful Dick Damron with Bitter Sweet Songs and Ray Griff's That Doesn't Mean I Don't Love My God and R. Harlan Smith's I Remember Love. As the year progressed, albums and singles from Alberta were showing a commanding lead, in spite of the fact that much of the product was lacking national distribution. Recording artists were beginning to break through the eastern, club apathy, which added to the image of the west.

The year 1975 has seen an almost 70 percent increase in productions and chart

happenings for Alberta recording artists. One of the most significant contributors to this increase has been R. Harlan Smith's Royalty label, which is currently showing MOR and Country Playlist action for Chris Nielsen, R. Harlan Smith, Danny Hooper and Glory-Anne Carriere and Jimmy Arthur Ordge, bubbling under. Smith and his partner, Jack Dubasz, have succeeded where many have failed. Their roster of recording acts have travelled the country and, whereever possible, made themselves known personally to country radio programmers. They just recently firmed a deal for releases of Royalty product in the U.K., a rare happening for a wholly-owned Canadian label.

A very important happening for Alberta was the unveiling of Edmonton's Sundown Recorders, one of the most modern studios

on the North American continent. Heading up this complex is one of the pioneers of Alberta music, Wes Dakus. Barry Allen, another name that contributed to the talent scene of the province, is now lending his knowledge of engineering to the established and new acts now booking time. With the advent of this 24-track facility, Edmonton became a Mecca, of sorts, drawing not only from the province but from bordering provinces and from the U.S. as well. Out of Sundown came (Phyllis) Wait For The Wagon, an established hit for Fustukian on Ray Pettinger's Casino label.

Country music has always been well represented on Alberta radio stations including Blairmore's CJPR (Daryl Ferguson), CKBR Brooks (Don Kristianson), Calgary's CBR AM and FM (Mac Bell and Bruce

Evans), CFAC (Larry Kunkel) and CFCN (Bob Gibbons), CFCW Edmonton/Camrose (Curly Gurlock), CJDV Drumheller (Carmen Cosford), CJCA-FM Edmonton (Barry Hawkins) CJYR Edson and CKYR Jasper (Wayne Woolett), CJOK Ft. McMurray (Kim Harrold), CFGP Grande Prairie (Patrick Nicol), CKSA Lloydminster (Don McGuire), the Canadian Armed Forces base radio, CHCL Medley (Bud Hunter and June Thompson), CKYL Peace River (Ken White) and CKRD (Dick Bell) which adds up to a very impressive list of radio stations playing anywhere from 10% to 100% country music.

Bringing all these acts to the attention of the public is also very important, insofar as booking is concerned, Alberta is well looked after in this respect as well. One





of the mainstays of the province's booking business is Edmonton's Banks Agency which is kept active under the direction of Ida Banks. The Edmonton-based Studio City Musical Ltd. also serves the province. Under Greg Thomas, the firm has offices in Calgary and Spokane and is represented in Vancouver. Toronto, Montreal and Halifax. As well, Associated Canadian Talent Services of Edmonton is very important when it comes to booking acts in and out of the province. ACTS is headed by Jack Raskin and Dale Edwards.

The prairie provinces represent approximately 12% of the total Canadian market (record business), at last count. More astute observers are of the opinion that this percentage has doubled over the past year and the biggest contributing factor would appear to be Alberta - a believable assumption.

There was only one to top Dan's first album, it's here now, and it's called HOLD ON.





Intended as a supplement to record company promotional mailings, the service would ensure that all of the week's single releases be sent to the subscriber along with a kind of 'tip sheet' that would outline any rele-

CBC - net press launch unveils new TV season

Dozens of Canadian media writers and CBC promos from across Canada gathered with network brass and production people from CBC's 1976-77 TV shows at the network's Toronto studios for CBC's national media press launch Sept 15-17.

The three-day event included pre-season screening of dozens of CBC shows to be aired this fall and discussions of policy and programming aims of the network.

CBC-TV network program director Jack Craine opened the launch by explaining that CBC programmers were seeking an "integrated approach" to programming: "where the whole is better than the sum of its parts."

The network is airing an average of only one prime-time hour a night of U.S.-produced programming; the rest a mixture of network variety, drama, and public affairs programs. There is at least one network music or variety show aired every evening except Monday.

vent information about each disc. The service includes only records released in this country, Canadian and American. Records are shipped every Thursday, but Camroux explained that unusual situations, like very important releases or heavy volume of releases, could warrant shipments sooner or more often.

Through Camroux Enterprises Incorporated, Camroux has been involved in syndication of radio programs like 20 Years Of Rock (in collaboration with Footprint) and the Wayne Dion Show. The record service was arranged to start September 1. Camroux explained that over the years, he has received a few complaints and has had several programmer friends ask his help in obtaining new releases. This led to the idea of a mailing service which would solve the complaints and fill a possible gap, particular-

ly for smaller stations, in record company mailing systems. Camroux cites an example where a major company might be servicing the Maritime region through a Montreal office. "The regional rep probably gets out to the stations every several weeks," Camroux said, "and he does a good job. But we can supplement them with weekly mailings of all the product. The programmer could get it sooner and more often."

Camroux says he's not looking for a profit in the first year or so, and that he'll be happy just by breaking even. The cost for the service is very low. About a dozen stations have become subscribers since it began a month ago, and Camroux figures that the number will increase to about 30 by the new year.

Camroux Enterprises Inc. recently moved into a new Toronto office.

Diamond postponed in Toronto

The Toronto stop on the Neil Diamond tour has been postponed. Reasons given centre around the scheduled date of October 14, which is also the date set aside by the Canadian Labour Congress as the official day of protest against federal government wage increase limitations. Stan Obodiak of Maple Leaf Gardens Attractions explained that many of the workers who would be involved in setting up the show are members of IATSE, the stagehand union which may

be taking part in the protest. Also, although the Toronto Transit Commission has not confirmed that they will also take part, Obodiak explained that there was concern that patrons would have trouble getting to the Gardens if they did.

Apparantly Diamond's management agreed to the postponement to avoid any possible complications. Tickets for the show had not yet gone on sale. A new date had not been set at press time.









GRT makes radio specials for its acts

GRT (Canada) is getting into radio production to help promote some of their major Canadian recording acts, and to make it easier for FM stations to comply with the new FM broadcast policies of the CRTC.

They've already completed a one-hour program on Klaatu, their background and their music, set to be aired in full by CHUM-FM September 25.

A one-hour show featuring Dan Hill is set to be completed soon. It's timed for broadcast during the peak of the label's promotion of his new LP, just released this

GRT promotion manager Jeff Burns told RPM that the idea for the project grew out of the success of the live radio concert programmes for contemporary and progressive FM stations which GRT pioneered in Canada with their Canadian recording acts. Last spring GRT promotion distributed a U.S.-produced radio show on Alan Parsons when his LP (now almost gold in Canada) was released.

The shows are distributed free to stations along with promo spots to advertise them. GRT is offering the packages first to the major contemporary FM stations in each market, then to any other local, campus or commercial station, AM or FM, who chooses to air it.

Burns said that the project is part of GRT's "total FM approach.

"We try to do our best to help the FM

stations. I believe we were the first with live concert broadcasting, and we're first with this now."

GRT plans to produce a Moe Koffman hour soon, to be available for broadcast when Koffman's newest GRT LP is released in November. Burns-expects this show to have appeal among a wide range of FM and AM radio stations.

Though the program is FM oriented, and recorded in stereo, it is not confined to FM stations. All shows are produced to be one hour long with commercial breaks.

Alan Bleviss is the narrator on the Klaatu show, and Tim Thomas narrates Dan Hill's hour.

GRT's Canadian and foreign catalogues are heavily weighted in favour of artists with strong FM radio appeal. Burns and his promotion staff have had a keen eye to developments in FM broadcasting with the new broadcast regulations which require FMers to air more "up front" and original programming along with a higher proportion of Canadian-produced shows.

CBC's Here Comes The Wolfman is in production in Vancouver, and they're booking about as many acts as any TV variety show has ever booked for a half-hour series.

Canadian acts already lined up for fall tapings are: Gloria Kaye, David Clayton Thomas and his Blood Sweat and Tears, Debbie Lorrie Kaye, Susan Jacks, Patsy Gallant, Dianne Brooks, The Stampeders, Blake Emmons, and The Famous People Players. Regulars on the show include the band of Vancouver musicians led by Jimmy Dale and comedy actors Peter Cullen, Sally Sales and Danny Wells.

U.S. acts booked for the show include: Johnny Rivers, Jose Feliciano, Kenny Rogers, B.J. Thomas, J.P. Morgan, The Miracles, Manhatten Transfer, Fifth Dimension, Gladys Knight and the Pips, Paul Williams, David Cassidy, Freddy Cannon, Little Anthony and others.

Mark Warren is directing the production, set to be aired on the CBC network at 7:30 on Tuesdays, beginning October 5.

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

16 million tickets for CFTR listeners

CFTR Toronto has launched its biggest and most expensive promotion contest ever. An estimated one million "Super Tickets" will be distributed each week to Toronto area McDonalds and Loblaws stores to be given away free to anyone requesting one. Each ticket has a number, and about every hour a number will be called at random. If a person holding the ticket with that number hears it being aired, he has just over eleven minutes (or 680 seconds, which is the station's number on the dial) to call in and claim his prize.

CFTR's promotion director Clive Cor-

coran explained that the prizes offered varied, and included cash prizes, products, and trips to New York and Disneyland. Corcoran explained, "a DJ might say that the prize was a pocket calculator to help you figure out your bank balance . . . and \$1,000 to put into your bank account."

The station is hoping to have hundreds of thousands of listeners glued to their radios wherever they are, waiting to hear their number being called.

Distribution of the tickets begins every Wednesday, and those million tickets become valid beginning the following Monday, and remain valid until the stores' last day of weekly business. A new series begins each week, and 16 series are planned before the end of the year. That's 16,000,000 tickets. Corcoran said that if at year's end the contest has proved a great success, the station will consider continuing it further. "And right now its doing phenomenally well".

Rush returns for cross - Canada tour this month

Mercury artists Rush will begin a monthlong tour of Canada, the end of September, playing centres they missed on their North American tour last spring.

The tour begins in Moncton September 28, moves on to Charlottetown (29), Sydney (Oct. 1), St. John, N.B. (3), and Halifax (4). Those dates will be opened by WEA's Wireless. The Ian Thomas Band will share the bill in North Bay (8), Sudbury (9), Ottawa (10), Kingston (11), and Sault Ste. Marie (13), and Max Webster will open the show in Thunder Bay (15), Winnipeg (18), Brandon (19), Regina (20), Saskatoon (21), Edmonton (22), Calgary (23), Lethbridge (24), Vancouver (26), and Victoria (27).

A live album, recorded in Toronto on their last tour, is expected to be released this fall. Rush's last LP, 2112, is still in the RPM top twenty after 24 weeks.

CHUM produces "History Of Rock"

Toronto's giant CHUM has produced a mammoth 60-hour radio documentary entitled The History Of Rock, a project almost two years in the making. The station will begin broadcasting the documentary in 20 segments, each three hours in length, this fall beginning Sept. 26 on Sundays at six p.m.. The first segment deals with industry beginnings and the years 1955 and 1956. The following 19 segments each deal with one year through to 1975. The series is said to include exclusive tapes of certain interviews and incidents. CHUM is planning to offer the production for sale this fall throughout North America.

CHUM commissioned rock writer Ritchie Yorke to research the project. After

20 months, Yorke had produced a 250,000 word script.

Methuen is publishing a book condensed from the original script October 15. Also titled the History Of Rock 'N' Roll, the 176 page book will be printed in an 8½ x 11" paperback format. It will include a 32-page colour photo section plus hundreds of black and white shots, and will be designed by Hollywood album jacket designer John Kosh. The book will follow the success of Yorke's Led Zeppelin Biography, and Methuin plans to promote heavily in association with TeeVee Books, who will distribute to record and chain stores. The book will retail for \$5.95. It will be simultaneously published in the U.S. and Britain.

CBC intros new current affairs show

"We just want the world to know we're alive," declared Gail Goldman, talent coordinator of CBC Current Affairs' upcoming late-night talk show 90 Minutes Live.

The talk show, which ran in live pilot form locally in Halifax and Winnipeg and nationally from Vancouver, will hit the coast-to-coast-TV airwaves November 29, five nights a week, with host Peter Gzowski.

Goldman's challenge is to book more live acts on a TV series than CBC has ever booked on one show before - but from her position in the current affairs department, known more for its documentaries and information shows.

She's looking for two acts a night to perform live with the studio band - no live to track or lip-syncing records - and to participate in the show with other guests.

CANADIAN ACTS NOT YET KNOWN

What she's really looking for are the Canadian acts she doesn't yet know." I did a mailing to all the agencies and management firms and got responses from the ones I expected to respond. That's not good enough. And the American acts are easy to book. What I need is the local talent, especially in cities outside of Toronto."

90 Minutes Live will originate live from

CBC studios in Toronto (week of November 29 and December 6), Halifax (December 13 and 20), Toronto (December 27, January 3), Edmonton (January 10), Toronto (January 17, 24), St. Johns (January 31), Toronto (February 7, 14), Winnipeg (February 21), Toronto (February 28, March 7), Vancouver (March 14), Toronto (March 21, 28).

There were many criticisms of the show's sound during its nationally-aired pilot series from Vancouver. Since then musical director Jack Lenz has tightened up the band. The show will now pick up all musical audio on 16 tracks and remix the output for each; the band, the live audience and, of course, the transmission.

All shows will be with a live audience with tickets on a first-come, first-served basis. All shows will be taped live, 11:35 Atlantic Time; they'll be broadcast directly live in the east, and delayed for broadcast in each city until 11:35 local time.

When in Toronto Lenz will play key-boards and lead a band of guitarist Hugh Brockie (Ronnie Hawkins, Barefoot), bassist John Toulson (Tomny Banks Trio), drummer Gordon Neave (Ian Tyson), and horn and woodwind player Simon Stone. In other cities Lenz will vary the band with local musicians.

It costs about a thousand dollars a night to put a five-piece group on the air, and Lenz and Goldman are working within a tight budget. The budget is also the reason the show will start so late in the season.

In the pilots, the band backed performers varying in styles from jazz to rock to country and Lenz intends to work hard in the next eight weeks to build the confidence in the band and sound system needed to attract the best acts and make a good show.

All guests, as with U.S. talk shows, are paid union scale.

VARIETY INTEGRETED WITH TALK

90 Minutes Live producer Alex Frame told RPM the variety is going to be well integrated with the talk part of the show; there are no separate budgets. He's looking for the sort of close co-operation between record companies and the show as with the labels and the U.S. shows; he hopes the personable national exposure is a major attraction.

Patsy Gallant, for example, sang her current hit (New York To L.A.) live on one of the Vancouver shows in the pilot run, before she had recorded the song or even signed her current contract with Attic Records.

Frame hasn't yet set any Montreal sessions for the show because of the unavailability of studio time there. He hopes to get a few nights in during the winter and set a week or two there in the late spring.

No. Those responsible for the show want the same thing; a solid Hunter-style middle-Canadian show to keep its almost 2 million regular viewers tuned in and an entertaining representation of country music today

The country music Koyle wants to get back to, is contemporary country music which today means a music moving in many different directions as well as bringing out its own traditional sounds more than ever before. Properly used, country music today is a variety show.

"We don't want to temper with the 'Waltons' value system of the show," Koyle told RPM in an interview; Hunter's audience is rural, smalltown and middle-size city; with a surprisingly high proportion of ethnic viewers. And it's heavily weighted to the over-49-year-olds.

"Maybe those people have stronger family values which are reflected in the show," commented Koyle.

Koyle's plan is to build the Hunter


audience by attracting more young people as they say in the business, lowering the demographics - without disturbing the present audience: "That's the name of the game in television," McAndrew explained.

To enhance the small-town values of the Hunter audience, Koyle is introducing an Our Town feature; a special Anywhere, Canada set which Hunter visits during each show to meet regulars and guests acting out the humour and life of middle Canadiana -Tommy Hunter Country.



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



native people - the possibilities are almost endless.

Hunter will retain his regular readings and the popular request sections of the show.

"We don't want to take Hunter off his



mark," Koyle stressed.

Though Hunter himself will sing a lot of the new country hits, the new look will come largely from the acts around him.

Koyle is lefting the singers and band stray into some of the new Eagles and Waylon Jennings country styles: "If Al Cherny plays a good old-time, stompin' riddle tune," Koyle explained, "nobody is going to mind if he follows it with a Bob Wills or Willie Nelson melody."

Almost 25 years ago country music developed its first female stars; but it has been only recently that many of the restrictions and expectations of female country performers have been shattered. Koyle is quick to pick up on that, and he's booked a string of Canada's top female country singers like Myrna Lorrie, Gloria Kaye, Carroll Baker, Colleen Peterson, Elaine Overholt, Marg Osburne, Marilyn Jones, and Nancy Ryan.

Koyle is trying to capture some of the

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new life coming to country music from the live club acts. He's hired Lee Roy and Donna Ramsay as regulars to sing that role on the show, and they, with other regulars and guests, often will be playing in more intimate, club-like sets.

Hunter himself feels the show has to look as though it's made by people who believe in country music - just like the latenight rock shows are made by people who are selling rock music: "The idea is to get anyone who watches the show, interested in country music."

To try to make all of this work, Hunter Country has an all-new production team; Dave Woods (who arranged and directed the Juno awards music) is musical director; Hal Misha a Canadian with broadway experience) choreographer; Kate Elliot, researcher; Tina Lipp, sets; and writers Clarke Wallace and Matt Segal all join Koyle and his associate producer Brian Ellis.
