Dufresne launches production firm

Montreal: Well-known producer/publisher Yvan Dufresne has resigned as General Manager of Discotel to launch his own production/publishing complex, flying the banner of Les Editions Blue

Rivage (104,214).

Dufresne was one of the early producers of Quebec stars, and in particular Michel Louvin who was a Quebec superstar of the 60's. Dufresne is also credited with bringing many of Quebec's recording stars into the Apex roster, a leading release label for the province. Apex was part of the Compo Company which is now MCA.

Scott Richards, who was General Manager of the Canadian operation of MCA, called on Dufresne to put together Grafitti Quebec, a composite album of "nostalgic Quebec". to reintroduce the Apex label. The album, which included cuts from Louvin, Pierre Lalonde, Ginette Reno, Donald Lautrec, Guy Roger and Jenny Rock, was an instant success in the Quebec

Dufresne, who has been actively involved in negotiations with European contacts, made over his years of attending MIDEM, is expected to become highly visible in the Quebec market over the next few weeks.

Radio Action heralds Barry return

Montreal: Claudja Barry's new single, Radio Action, from her new album In Hong Kong is being released domestically in both 7 and 12 inch versions.

The song is being distributed in Canada through PolyGram on the Lollipop label. Barry's first album was a Greatest Hits Package which included her fifth LP which also marks her fifth collaboration with the writer/producer team of Jurgen Korduletsch and Jorg Evers.

In 1980 Barry won a Silver Prize at the Japan Music Festival. She now makes her home in Munich, Germany. Radio Action qualifies as two Parts Cancon.

In 1979 Pringle headlined his own CTV Network Special, and has appeared on major TVers Merv, Dinah, Al Hamel and Allan Thicke. In addition he's participated with such artists as Linda Ronstadt, Emmylou Harris, and Mason Williams. He is scheduled to star with Robert Goulet and Juliette on the CBC-TV Special, Return Engagement, set for the fall.

Pringle was born in Halifax but raised in Toronto. He studied classical piano and went on to be a singer in the Canadian Opera Company. His opera career came to an abrupt halt when his voice changed from a soprano to baritone at the age of 13.

Pringle studied Indian music with Ravi Shankar and plays a wide variety of instruments including the surbahar,

flute and tin whistle.

Phillips to work on Carter production

Toronto: Arthur Phillips, winner of the 1981 Genie Award for Best Musical scoring of The Lujcu Star, has been signed to work on the major National Film Board production, Ken Carter.

The film documents the dream of Canadian stuntman Ken Carter, to fly an 11,000 horse-powered automobile

across the St. Lawrence River.

Phillips is one of Canada's leading film, TV and record industry composers. He is responsible for several Canadian musical successes but is probably best known for composing, arranging and orchestrating the ceremonial theme music for the Montreal World Olympics in 1976.

Phillips received an ACTRA nomination for the National Film Board's Henry Ford's America, a telecast on

Toronto: True North recording artist Murray McLauchlan recently completed writing the theme song for the featurelength drama Alligator Shoes, which car-

ries the same title.

The film centres on the struggle of two Acadian brothers to keep their working-class Toronto family together amidst inner-city pressures and the arrival of an emotionally troubled relative. The film is to be completed by the end of April. Executive producers of the film, are listed as Don Haig and Barry Shapiro with John Phillips as director of photography and Clay Borris director, and co-producer and also writer and one of the principal actors.

Borris and Phillips have received several awards, most notably for Rose's House which won the silver Hugo at the Chicago International Film Festival.

Playboy playmate signed to Smile

Toronto: Brandy Stanford, a Playboy model, has signed a recording deal with Smile Records. Her initial single release, My Guy, the Mary Wells classic, written by Smokey Robinson, was produced by Bernie LaBarge at Hamilton's Grant Avenue Studios. A March 28th release has been scheduled.

The Newfoundland-artist is well known in the commercial/jingle field, having appeared on TV commercials for Molson's Canadian, Dici Nova, Peoples Jewellers, and others. She has also been featured on several TV shows including the CBC-TV series The Royal Canadian Air Farce. Her greatest claim to fame however, was the October '80 Playboy where she was showcased as "a very special girl from Canada."

Diamond launches nostalgia powerpak

Toronto: Dave Harding and Stephan Hawkins, who head up the Diamond label complex, have launched a new series of mid-priced album and tape products, already showing indications of opening a whole new dimension of consumer interest. Numbering 140 titles, the series goes beyond the nostalgic euphemism and comes close to the sacred ground of collectors.

Release labels in the series are King, Hollywood, Starday, Power Pak, Federal and Gusto, with the latter supplying

the majority of titles.

The Diamond series covers all aspects of popular music from the fifties and sixties including, rock and roll, pop, gospel, country and trucking songs.

Harding and Hawkins have both been heavily involved in the direct response business and believe, through this Diamond series and other projects, soon to be announced, they will bring a different kind of consumer into the store. Actually it's the forgotten consumer. Says Harding, "We're creating new business, but in actuality we're bringing back that record buyer who isn't into today's hit product but rather looking for product that hasn't been on the market for five years or more. We've got that product and at a price that will be attractive to the buyer who remembers when."

Records and tapes (8-track and cassette) carry a suggested list of \$5.99 and include The Drifters Greatest Hits, Sam & Dave's Sweet & Funky Gold, Super Hits packages from the forties through the sixties including cuts by Danny & The Juniors, Carl Perkins, Otis Williams, the Coasters, Bobby Edwards, B.J. Thomas, Chuck Berry, Jerry Lee Lewis, Del Reeves, and more, as well as com-

posite bluegrass packages, gospel greats and a Jimmy Dorsey package.

Dealer and major chain demand has created a backorder situation however, the series is now top priority at the pressing level with an 80% fill expected shortly. Chains carrying the line include Woolco and Woolworth's, Towers, Zellers and selected rackers with advance orders now numbering 250,000 units. Diamond is expected to top \$2 million dollars in sales for their first year of operation.

The defective rate of the Diamond series is reportedly zero. "We use heavier board," explains Hawkins, "which keeps the tight shrink from warping the record. The sound quality is excellent, considering the era from which these recordings come and today's sophisticated sound systems."

Response from country buyers has been particularly heavy. Each album displays a sticker advising that a free catalogue will be mailed to those supplying name and address, which has prompted requests and letters from many parts of Canada. An example "I'm interested in bluegrass and there aren't too many record stores that carry a good line of bluegrass so I'm interested in ordering from your catalogue." or "I like trucker music but until I saw one of your records I didn't know where to get this type of album."

The power behind the Gusto line is Nashville-based Mo Lytle, somewhat of a legend in rockabilly, country and gospel music. Canadian distribution rights for the lines were negotiated with Lytle by Harding and Hawkins. Both Hawkins and Harding were previously associated with TeeVee Records, Hawkins joining the company as Finance

Manager in 1976, going on to be Vice President and General Manager of Tee-Vee U.S. through 1977-78. Harding is a 15 year veteran of the record business beginning with CBS, moving on to A.R.S., then on to his own Haven Enterprise firm and finally to Tee-Vee where, after a few years as second in command, took over the reins as President, the position he resigned to partner his new venture with Hawkins.

West Coast distribution for the Diamond line is handled by Robert Gallo's Lago/Kareena Music of Vancouver with Diamond's central warehousing in Markham looking after the rest of Canada. Diamond is currently looking for a strong distribution base in the

Maritimes.

CITY's Reggae T.O. captures award

Toronto: CITY-TV's New music special, Reggae T.O. won the Gold Medal Award for Best Variety Series at this year's CanPro '81 competition for Canadian Television Productions.

The 60-minute Reggae concert was originally simulcast with CHUM-FM and featured such artists as Leroy Sibbles, Carlene Davis, Ernie Smith, Ital Groove and Truths & Rights.



Our record industry under scrutiny

The recent announcement that the federal government was going to investigate the record industry has resulted in much speculation. This close scrutiny by the Secretary of State is not to be confused with a study into culture in Canada which will also be asking if recordings qualify as art and culture or are part of a cultural industry. Just where do records fit into Canada's culture? The latter study is rather vague and the industry has become aware of this very recently.

Just how does our industry look, under close scrutiny? Many in the business have waxed concern that such an investigation is needed, in view of the Ontario study of 1976 by Peter Klopchic Ph.D of the Ontario Ministry of Industry and Tourism. This study was very thorough and not much has changed since then. Although it was prepared for the Ontario government it does cover the Canadian industry well. Statistics Canada has also been doing an ongoing survey which is also thorough and answers most questions.

So naturally, the industry is worried and anxious that another look at the industry is necessary and that the approach has been played down. And so it might very well be concerned and many believe that it might well have good reason to be. There were many questions being asked about the record industry in Canada as the year 1980 came to an end.

For years the sleeping dogs were left to lie. The industry functioned, was laid back and low key. No one was pushing, and little was done by, or asked of, the industry. The image of the industry was, as one executive admitted at the recent RPM/JUNO Conference, "a shuck and jive business", and no one cared. A few companies had displayed their corporate goodwill in Canada, while others apparently believed there was no need in a free enterprise system, and they have every right to feel that way.

So now the question confronts us. Just why is the federal government interested in looking so closely at the record industry in Canada? Well, they'll tell you they aren't. That this is just

another study of an industry. Or they will tell you that the industry is looking for assistance, and a study is necessary to find out "how the government can be of assistance."

Why do you feel the industry is being looked at? Perhaps that's the real purpose of this comment. Perhaps we should step back and take a long and thorough look at our industry ourselves. What is it doing? What should it be doing? Who is participating? To what extent? How does the political climate of the country effect our industry? Does the image of the industry shine like an angel's halo?

If there is nothing wrong. If we score well in each area, and if we are beyond reproach, we have nothing to fear. It may very well be time well spent, to take a good look at our industry - and hold it up to our own close scrutiny.

du Maurier hunting for new talent

Toronto: Audition applications are now available for the 1981 du Maurier Search For Stars, now in its fifth year of nationwide talent hunting. The talent search is open to amateur and professional Canadian performers over the age of 18, and covering every music form. Auditions are being scheduled to be held in seven cities this fall.

Deadline for applications has been set as Sept. 11. Live auditions will take place from Sept. 21 through Oct. 23, and will be held in Toronto, Halifax,

Vancouver, Calgary, Regina, Winnipeg and Montreal.

Eighteen semi-finalists will be awarded \$2,000 cash bursaries from the du Maurier Council for the Performing Arts. In addition, each will be featured in one of three one-hour CBC network TV specials to be televised early in 1982.

Six winners will be chosen from the semi-finalists, and they will each receive a further \$5,000 in council bursaries plus TV exposure on a fourth CBC-TV network Search For The Stars special



Toronto: Country artist Marie Bottrell's most recent album The Star just keeps on shining. The album was re-

leased in May of 1980.

Several singles have been culled from the album including the title track which won in the Best Single category in the Big Country Awards. Other single releases were Flames Of Evil Desire, The Ballad Of Lucy Jordan, and her current single Wonderin' If Willy.

The London, Ontario artist claims that as far back as Grade Three she had one interest in mind - to be a singer and songwriter. When she was only three she used to sit on the kitchen table and sing Puff The Magic Dragon to any one who came in the house.

By the time Bottrell was 11 she was performing in a weekend family group playing dance halls and partys in her hometown. The young singer was seen

Hamilton IV sets British tour record

London: George Hamilton IV has set a record by undertaking the longest

British tour by any artist.

The three-month long tour is set to wrap up at the Silk Cut International Festival of Country Music at the Wembley Arena April 18. This tour coincides with Hamilton's 25th year as a recording artist. The silver anniversary tour continued virtually non-stop from January 11 to April 12 with the only break being a two-week period in mid-March when he had to return home to fulfill a number of U.S. commitments including Nashville's Grand Ole Opry.

While in the U.K., Hamilton met the Hamilton clan in Scotland. On February 23, at the personal request of the Dowager Duchess of Hamilton, he and his roadshow played a charity concert in Haddington, East Lothian, on the outskirts of Edinburgh. Following the show, Hamilton dined and spent the evening at the Lennoxlove estate with the Duke and Duchess of Hamilton with

other family members.

"It was one of the great thrills of my life, as well as being an honour and privilege," said Hamilton. "It was a marvellous day and I guess it goes without saying that I was quite in awe, being in the presence of the chief of the clan.

So far Hamilton has played over 50 dates and there are more to come including, Stockholm, Rotterdam, Frankfurt and Zurich. He and his band the Numbers will be playing these dates as part of Mervyn Conn's International Festivals of Country Music.

His latest album titled 20 Country Classics on the Warwick label is part of a heavy promotional television campaign. There is no Canadian release at time of

writing.

Her parents had a love of country music but Bottrell credits her brother Glenn as being the guiding light. She later began sending demo tapes to the Mercey Brothers in Elmira. Two long years went by before the Mercey's responded. They wanted to hear her sing. Apparently, the country group's reaction was that Bottrell sounded better live than on tape.

At the age of 16 Bottrell released her first single titled Reach Out And Touch Me. She worked on her debut album of the same title at MBS and signed with them after its completion. It was also at this time that she decided to quit school knowing that what she always wanted to do was to

get into country music.

As difficult as it might have been, her decision to quit school didn't prove to be so bad. Other recordings followed such as Always Having Your Love, This Feeling Called Love and Oh Morning Sun Shine Bright. Awards and award nominations followed plus many concerts and TV appearances.

She credits Larry Gregson formerly of MBS and now of In Tune Produc-

ing her career.

In August of 1980 Bottrell left the Mercey Brothers organization. Gregson left about two months after Bottrell.

What education Bottrell didn't get in school she learned on the road and in the bars. She spent most of 1980 on the road with her band Cottonwood. The singer is hoping that her next LP will really establish her and says she's after both the country and MOR markets. Despite the fact that the bar circuit sometimes brings her down, she still insists she loves it and lives until the night comes so she can get on stage to do what she does best - entertain.

Marie Bottrell and Cottonwood are sharing the bill with the Marty Robbins tour which opens April 9 with two performances in Kitchener, followed by Oshawa (10), and two performances in Ottawa (11).

The Bottrell group then heads east for their first tour of the Maritimes and an important date at Johnny Gold's Country Room in Dartmouth/Halifax.

It's also interesting to note that Bottrell's version of The Star is being used in the soundtrack of the Paramount feature film, My Bloody Valen-
