

### PolyGram releases special 12-inch Triumph single

Montreal: PolyGram has released a special 12-inch single of the Triumph song A World Of Fantasy and is making it available at the same price as a regular seven-inch single.

The flip side of the special disc features a previously unreleased live recording Triumph's Fight The Good Fight.

While the Toronto hard rock trio's sixth album Never Surender moves closer to gold both in the U.S. and Canada, the company reports the band is presently in the midst of their most successful U.S. headlining tour ever.

The group has recently been firmed to play at the three-day U.S. Festival scheduled for the Memorial Day holiday in Los Angeles for the last weekend in May. The trio is to share top-billing with such names as Van Halen, the Scorpions and Judas Priest. Following the festival, Triumph is set for a crosscountry tour of Canada for the month of lune

# CBS launches major push on new Men At Work

Toronto: CBS Records has launched a major campaign in support of Men At Work's new album, Cargo, released to radio and retail April 18.

The Australian group's debut North American album, Business As Usual has passed the seven-time platinum mark, (700,000) showing no signs of slowing.

Meanwhile, radio stations across the country have been playlisting and charting Overkill, the first single from the new album.

Prior to the release of the new Men At Work LP, the company has put together for radio an advance release containing six tracks as well as interviews by the band from down under. The release can be dropped into a station's regular rotation and/or produced together as a special.

Also available to stations is a separate produced 50-minute in-depth interview of the group, plus customized IDs for all major radio stations. The interviews were taped both before and after the band received their Grammy Award.

The six-track disc containing the interviews, which is titled the World Premiere Weekend Album, includes the cuts Overkill, It's A Mistake, Dr. Heckyll And Mr. Jive, Highwire, Blue For You and Settle Down.

The catch for stations accepting the programming elements for the April 15 weekend was that they agree to promote, on-air, the Men At Work World Premiere Weekend and commence programming the event April 15, at 6 pm local time and not before that time nor after the 17th, and announce that Men At Work's Cargo album would be in the stores Monday, April 18.

Point-of-purchase material for the Cargo album includes two different 24" x 36" artist posters, jacket flats, special die-cut mobiles, double-width die-cut header cards, and Men At Work Cargo Cooler Bags for key stations and buyers.

Live dates for Men At Work in Canada are a possibility for the late summer.

Fight The Good Fight live was recorded in February of 1982 in Baltimore and initially appeared on Triumph's previous gold album, Allied Forces. The track was remixed at the band's 48-track Metal Works studio by David Thoener whose credits include work on LPs from Billy Squier, AC/DC and the J. Geils Band.

The LP has been a Top 10 airplay item in the U.S. for six of the first nine weeks of release while the video of the single is in heavy rotation on MTV.

# Bramson named to Board for Rock Radio Awards

Toronto: Len Bramson, President of Telemedia Broadcast Services, has been named to the Board of Governors of the North American Rock Awards. Mr. Bramson is the only Canadian member of the board. He will be an award presenter at the fifth annual Rock Radio Awards luncheon, the awards portion of which will be taped and broadcast by Toronto's O107 (May 11).

Established two years ago, TBS has captured a good chunk of the Canadian market for syndicated programming. Their most recent production, The Supertramp Special, aired on CHUM-FM (Apr. 1). They have also established joint ventures with ABC, Watermark and Mutual.

### Cougar's London shows to be an event - CJBK

Toronto: Like The Rolling Stones' legendary show at the El Mocambo or Led Zeppelin at The Rockpile, CJBK London Program Director John Rea has referred to John Cougar's forthcoming shows for the city as more than a rock show, but an event.

Cougar is scheduled to play two free shows (May 18), at the city's Piccadilly Palace, to be presented by CJBK.

Cougar reportedly promised to return to their city after sharing the billing last summer along with '60s artists the Beach Boys and Del Shannon. He believed the booking was a mistake and that he should not be appearing with '60s bands with whom he had nothing in common.

# Major Quality launch of Quintessence line

Toronto: Quality have targeted April as the official launch for the Quintesence line, a mid-price classical label that features repertoire pulled from European masters. Quintessence is noted for its quality pressing and label graphics and, because of its price, has enjoyed impressive sales, particularly for their workhorses.

Stephen Tennant, National Sales Manager for Quality was quite familiar with the line's popularity when he was in retail and when he discovered the label was available he jumped at the opportunity to bring it into Quality's fold.

The early music workhorses represent Baroque and Renaissance repertoire and, when picked up by Quality, had 200 titles available. In the short time span of signing, an additional 30 titles have been added. Quality however, will concentrate on the Top 20 sellers, but will also stock in-depth, a further 80 titles.

A sampler comprised of bits and pieces from the best of Quintessence has been released to programmers and the press. These include works from the Masters as performed by the Berlin Radio Symphony Orchestra, The London Symphony, the Bukarest Radio Symphony Orchestra, The Czech Philharmonic and more. Ironically, and an indication Quality's manufacturing capabilities, the sampler was pressed by Quality.

The record company noted that it was the success of his album American Fool, which is about to go quadruple platinum in Canada, that ended Cougar's days of playing the bars, and that it's unlikely he will return to the bars

"That's where we started out," said Cougar. "We're good in nightclubs. We've been playing bars for 10 years, and in the last year and a half we've been playing big concert halls. When we decided to come back and do this, I said 'Well, let's go into a small club there. The people I think would enjoy it a lot more than going to see a free-for-all in some big hall.' So that's why we decided to do a small club."

"We feel tremendously excited and proud about the shows," said CJBK's Rea. "It's going to be the concert event of the year in London and we're even more excited about the fact that it's in a club setting.

"We certainly had been in touch with him since the incident at his last concert here and we really did feel that he would finally come back. That incident last year made the international press and he said that he'd come back. What really surprised us was the club setting and it's an exciting location."

CJBK is also giving away about 1,000 tickets for the shows through various contests. ### Fairlight computer poses threat to studio musicians

Toronto: The Fairlight computer, which was built and designed in Australia and is being billed as "the world's most advanced computer music system," has gained more than a foothold in the Canadian market. The first company in Canada to produce sound from this revolutionary computer is the Torontobased Computer Music International (CMI), with principals Robert Yale, Brad Mac-Donald and Frank Daller.

CMI, which is conveniently located upstairs at Sounds Interchange Studios, boasts as being "The first company in Canada dedicated to producing music and sounds wholly or partly by computer." The company began business the first of the year and have already contributed to album projects for S.R.O. and Anthem, Kosenic Lenz Productions and Wellhead Productions. They have also provided soundtrack and commercial programming for three radio and television spots as well as a Pay TV musical.

The star of the Computer Music show, of course, is the Fairlight computer which was used to create music and sound effects for the movie Tron as well as Peter Gabriel's Security album. Led Zeppelin, Stevie Wonder and the Bee Gees have also used the Fairlight.

Says Dollar, "One of the main features of the Fairlight is its ability to sample any instrument or sound, from a note on a saxophone to the sound of a raindrop," continuing with "Then, after digitally recording the characteristics of that sound, it enables the player/operator to recall that sound at any pitch, irrespective of what pitch the original sample was. The result is that a keyboardist can play any instrument once a sample note

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has been read by the Fairlight."

The Fairlight can play up to eight instruments at once and can store up to thirty minutes of continuous music. Daller explains that "Sounds may also be entered through an alpha-numberic keyboard, enabling a composer to type in his song or score and listen to it play back on any instrument or combinations of up to eight instruments."

CMI has taken delivery of its second Fairlight system this month, which makes it the only dual equipped production facility in the world to date. It's also interesting to note that either system can be moved to any loca-

There has been concern from some quarters that the Fairlight could add to the problems of musicians, particularly at the studio level where there has already been a slackening of employment for session musicians. The musicians' union was expected to challenge the Fairlight. "They haven't called us," says Dollar. "I'm sure there is resistance at that level, although we're not aggressively trying to keep musicians out of work. In fact, it's largely musicians and writers who are hiring us. It's not as though we're out to do something without them. Most of the sessions we are on are a combination of real musicians and Fairlight. There have been some that have been exclusively Fairlight, but that is the decision of the performer/musician who hires us. We're serving musicians, but if you want to regard it as putting musicians out of work -I guess that's true, but I guess computers in offices are putting bookkeepers out of work."

Dollar went on to explain, "I don't want to sound callous about it, but I feel we're part of something that's irresistible and I can't say I'm proud of the fact it's displacing musicians in some cases, I just have to accept it."

### Flock Of Seagulls cassette to contain 3 bonus cuts

Toronto: Quality reports that the cassette of the forthcoming Flock Of Seagulls album Wishing, scheduled for a worldwide May 5th release date, is to contain three more tracks than the LP.

The company is launching a campaign in support of the release. Quality will be cross marketing cassette sales by stickering the album with the note, Cassette Contains 3 Bonus Tracks. Both the LP and cassette are to be released simultaneously.

Quality Records National Sales Manager Stephen Tennant stated that Quality is putting a major push at retail and radio in support of the new album under the general marketing theme, "They're back...

Also to be utilized in the Flock promotion are specially-designed posters, header cards, buttons, stickers, flying seagulls, T-shirts, seven-inch picture sleeves, radio time buys, plus AOR and 12-inch club samplers.

Key tracks on the forthcoming album include the first single Wishing, Nightmares, Transfer Affection, The Traveller, and the re-mix of the band's first British single from 1981 - Talking.

tech revolution, which can add to the woes of the music industry or enhance it. As Dollar explains, "The Fairlight does do the work, literally, of hundreds of musical instruments. However, it doesn't replace all the solo instruments, but in some cases it does replace what was done traditionally by musicians."

Len Lytwyn who, as President of the 7,500 strong Toronto Musicians' Association, which is part of the 32,000 member national body, is obviously concerned over the use of the Fairlight computer. "It's pretty scary," he admits. "we definitely feel the Fairlight is a threat to the livelihood of musicians and yes, it is part of the computer revolution that is displacing musicians." Lytwyn went on to point out that "What to do about it is one of the things we are looking at. It has been brought up at our meetings by our membership but we haven't thoroughly addressed the problem as of yet." Lytwyn admits there is nothing in the way of legislation to stop the Fairlight from coming into the country nor to stop its application. "I've heard a couple of demonstrations on what it can do," he went on, "and it's mind boggling - what it can reproduce when it's programmed properly."

The union does have some protection where they have signed agreements with recording studios. In view of the influx of the synthesizers, mellotrons and stringed instruments of a few years ago, a clause was added to the agreement prohibiting an electronic device from being used to displace a traditional type of instrument. "The clause was included," says Lytwyn, "to hopefully stop the errosion effect of taking the work away from what normally would be done by live musicians. That clause still exists and we do intend to apply it."

The union has a fairly sound agreement with producers of television shows, primarily with the CBC. This agreement does protect musicians and states quite clearly that musicians can not be displaced through electronic means.

A major problem for the union however, is that not everyone in the studio business nor in the production field has signed an agreement with the union, which could make the Fairlight initial thrust, a major invasion.

# Latest CBS sampler highlights mystery song

Toronto: CBS Records Canada has released a new CBS Music sampler, a double compilation set for retail containing a wide spectrum of singles from their most recent albums, from country to new music.

Unlike their last sampler, this package contains a mystery song from a mystery artist, a reggae-influenced rock track sung by a female vocalist who may be Bonnie Tyler. The two discs contain 24 tracks in all.

Songs on the new sampler include Love Me Today by Corect Spelling, Young Guns Go For It by Wham, Cash Flow from Leisure Process, Sheriff by the Tenants, Edge Of The Blade from Journey, The Trouble with Normal by Bruce Cockburn, Desperate But Not Serious from Adam Ant and more.

played such key locations as the legendary Marquee Club and went on tour as a support act for David Essex.

Shortly after Dallcorte opened its Toronto office, label head Bernard Solomon, at the suggestion of the London-based Carlin Music publishing company, went to check out the band in a Croydon club.

"The thing that got me were the tunes and that everyone in the audience knew all the words and were singing along," he said. "I got on the phone and called Toronto, shouting over the band. I think I told them that I'd found the act I'd been looking for."

He explained that right from the beginning of the label, they knew they would need strong artists who wrote "great pop songs," noting "That's what we were looking for when we went out to sign our first acts."

"It's rock-pop goodtime stuff," said band member van Eede describing the Drivers' sound. "Our music is fresh and a lot of fun. The LP tries to capture all that.

"Our biggest following is in Canada really. The crazy thing is that we're from the London, Sussex area. It's a very stylized sound in England. They're very image concerned. In England it's how good your videos are and what colour your hair is."

Van Eede noted that the band is hoping for a new album by September and are already excited about the next LP.

"I think we're going to move slightly on the next album. Not quite so much pop, but with more to say."

van Eede explained that if the band does

break big in Canada, he can't see the point of keeping England as their homebase.

"It will be sad if we have to leave England. Before we got signed here, there was nothing for a record in England. We got offered a deal with Polydor who said, 'oh all right, we'll sign them', but we didn't want it that way. It's too bad that the kids over there who knew us can't get our album.

"We're very proud that we got a Canadian label. They've worked hard. Record companies are much more discerning here."

The Drivers are presently on a crosscountry tour of Canada with future plans for dates in England, France, Germany and Belgium.

## Whittaker scoring with Bilk's hit of the '60s

Toronto: Acker Bilk's Stranger On The Shore gets the Roger Whittaker treatment with indications that this classic hit from the '60s could soar to greater heights. Bilk's original release is considered one of the top selling instrumentals of all time.

The Whittaker single, produced by Chet Atkins, was released in the U.K. four weeks ago (Mar. 21) and was an immediate add by the BBC resulting in a chart position two weeks later. The single was taken from Whittaker's first album project by Tembo Music Canada, All Time Heart Touching Favourites which has been the best selling TV package in the U.S. this year. Distributed in the U.S. by Suffolk Marketing, the album exceeded 400,000 units sold by the end of the first quarter, and is still a mail order only item.

We sent the computer a nasty telex and the answer we got back read "to err is only human, what about us computers?"

### Comstock scores again

How about that U.S. label, Comstock? They've picked up another Canadian act, Reg Watkins and Lori Kristin and are currently giving this talented pair of Newfoundlander's a heavy promotion trip on their single, Oklahoma Memory. Comstock's Frank Fara is also looking good with another Canadian, Anne Lord and her single, Hung Up On You.

### Natale follow-up set

Barry Kaplan reports that his follow-up production for Lou Natale is in the final stages for release by Dee Communications. Titled For Losin' At Love, the single is being presented in a rather unique way, billing Natale as "This man is a real winner" a "First Prize Winner (For Losin' At Love)". Natale's printed thanks begins: "I can't imagine any prize I'd rather win. There's so many folks to thank, where should I begin? First my best friend and my brothers. My exwives and their mothers. Without them, this is one contest I'd never be in." - a rather timely promotion in view of the recent acceptance speeches by Oscar and Juno award winners. The next single follows the chart success of Natale's Come January (You're My June) which scored well on country stations and enjoyed some crossover action as well.

### Gold and platinum to Oaks

The Oak Ridge Boys have scored gold for their album Oak Ridge Boys Christmas and double platinum discs for Fancy Free. The awards were presented to Duane Allen, Joe Bonsall. Richard Sterban and Bill Golden, (the Oak Ridge Boys) at their sold-out opening at the MGM Grand in Las Vegas. The Oaks are currently making impressive chart moves with their current single. American Made.

### Impressive gains for Coleco in video game market

Toronto: In just eight months of entering the home video game market, Coleco has scored an impressive 15% to 20% share of the Canadian market, and April is shaping up to be a record month. CBS distributes Coleco hardware, software and accessories in Ontario only.

"The penetration is growing," boasts Maurice Kissell, Director of Sales, Video Enterprises for CBS Canada. "Overall, last year, video games penetrated in total 6% of the households in Canada and the experts are anticipating an 11% penetration by the end of the year."

Major unit manufacturers have reportedly set a target of 400,000 units for 1983. Average cartridge buy per unit is conservatively set at 5, in the course of a year, which gives an overall projection of more than 2 million cartridges expected to be sold by the end of 1983.

ColecoVision is fast becoming one of the most popular consumer products available. Coleco Industries has, in fact, made the most impressive gains of any in the home video game market. Their timing was perfect. entering the market last year when Atari and Mattel were doing battle with each other through "We're the best" TV advertising campaigns. By the time Christmas rolled around, it was almost impossible to keep Coleco hardware and software stocked. Coleco Industries ended the year, according to Fortune's March 7, 1983 issue, as the new York Stock Exchange's best performer in 1982, moving from \$6.87 to \$36.75 a share. Coleco made further penetrations into the market by introducing an interface module accessory which makes Atari games playable on the ColecoVision unit. Needless to say this was a boon to Coleco's business, brought about through a high-energy marketing campaign.

Coleco also distribute Intelevision cartridges but there are apparently no plans for an interface module accessory, similar to that for the Atari cartridges.

Bringing the Canadian picture up to date, Kissell reveals that "By the end of May we will have released 15 Coleco cartridges, 10 Coleco/Atari packages, 8 Coleco/Intelevision cartridges, and 11 cartridges that are compatible with the Atari 800, 400, and the Commodore VIC 20. From the accessory standpoint, we have 7 items in the product line plus the master component."

Coleco's three big sellers for this week (Apr 18) are Donkey Kong Jr., Space Fury and Space Panic, all of which are compatible with Coleco. Also released the first week of April were Smurf and Zaxxon, both of which Kissell reports are doing very well. The latter are Atari compatible.

Coleco is now eyeing the home computer market and are readying a module that will turn ColecoVision machines into personal computers. The new Coleco system is reported to have the capabilities to match the Atari 400, Texas Instruments 99/4A and the Commodore VIC 20.

# **Quality Records to issue Spring Sampler Cassette**

Toronto: Quality Records will be releasing a 12-track "Spring Sampler Cassette" highlighting singles to be released over the next six weeks.

The cassette is to contain new product from A Flock Of Scagulls, The Maisonettes, Blue Peter, The Extras, Roman Holliday, Q-Feel and others.

This marks the first sampler of new pop/rock material compiled strictly for promotional use by Quality Records.

### **April Fool at Q107**

Toronto FM rock station pulled a fast one on their listeners (Apr 1), for an April Fools joke by announcing they had changed their format to one of comedy, beginning at 6 am. Listeners were told they could pick up the station's rock records at their offices at 11 am. Many of the station's faithful however, didn't find the announcement funny. As a result about 100 listeners marched on the station, some carrying signs. Station Program Director Gary Slaight, who came up with the idea along with news announcer Ted Woloshyn, said that they didn't expect that reaction to the joke. "It was interesting," said Slaight. "Some phoned in and said 'nice joke' but others didn't catch on because they didn't connect being that April Fools Day fell on Good Friday. It was nice to see their enthusiasm, but I feared for my life when I saw the crowd at the station. Many were carrying radios. So I went on the air and told our audience that we were just joking while announcer Scruff Connors went out at II am and gave away albums. Then we played Long Live Rock."

### Heavy demand for CHUM card

CHUM Toronto Promotion Director Suzette Legault reports that over 584,000 of their CHUM Cards were distributed in one month through McDonald's, and thousands are now being given out each week at Black's Camera stores. The CHUM Card can be used for such prizes as cash gifts, concert tickets, discounts and more. Just recently there were 62 different \$100 winners and Kay Chisolm of Downsview has just won \$1,000 on the CHUM Thousand Dollar Day.

### H. Dougall announces donations

H. Fraser Dougall, President of H.F. Dougall, 580/CKPR, 94FM, Thunder Bay Electronics, CKPR-TV and CHFD-TV, recently announced three major donations by

his broadcasting companies to the Thunder Bay Community Auditorium. The first was a cash contribution of \$50,000 to the capital budget which is to be matched on a two-forone basis by Wintario grants, for a total benefit of \$150,000 to the capital fund-raising campaign. The second donation was to the operating budget. In order to reduce the projected operating deficit of the auditorium, Dougall announced that his radio and TV stations have agreed to provide the auditorium with \$300,000 in advertising services over a three-year period. Air time is to be allocated to advertising and promotion of the auditorium and events. Since the proposed operating budget includes a substantial sum for advertising services, Dougall said this contribution "should result in a major reduction in the projected deficit." For the third donation, in the event of an operating deficit, Thunder Bay Television is to provide, for a period of three years, a major annual televised fund-raising event. The auditorium is to cost an estimated \$14 million.

### London Citizen of the Year

CKSL reports that Carol Johnston was named London Citizen of the Year and has become the first recipient of the award. Johnston became well-known in the city for using her training as a nurse and a public school teacher to create Canada's first Regional Children's Museum, and now serves as Chairman and Director of the museum which has moved into the permanent headquarters on the city's Wharncliffe Road. Johnston was informed of her unanimous selection by the Chairman of the Selection Committee, Captain Joseph Jeffery, O.B.E., C.D., Q.C., LL.D. The formal presentation was made in the Children's Museum. Johnston is also heavily involved in fundraising campaigns for Parkwood Hospital and sits on the Board of Directors of the Women's Christian Association. In addition, she has a long distinguished record of community service. The London Citizen of the Year Award was established last year by CKSL as a method of recognizing "the unselfish service to the community of a London citizen."

### **CHFI-FM Swings Into Spring**

Toronto FM station CHFI recently presented Swing Into Spring at Sparkles in the CN Tower. Hosted by Paul Fisher, the event featured the Swing Revival Band of York University and was held in support of the Canadian Stage Band Festival. Also featured were lucky draws and more. In addition, CHFI recently presented the film Gregory's Girl along with Astral Films, for the Community Folk Art Council. The film is reported to be the first major motion picture to be entirely filmed in Scotland. The Toronto premiere, which took place at the International Cinema, was hosted by CHFI personality Stuart Hill.

### CKX-FM is back with new format

It can be called the second debut for Brandon. Manitoba's CKX-FM, also known as KX-96. The station officially went on the air in 1963 as CKX-FM but changed their letters to CJCM in 1978. After market studies and public enthusiasm, Western Manitoba Broadcasters decided to change to a contemporary Adult Rock format and switch the call letters back to CKX-FM. In addition, the station was granted a power increase to 100,000 watts. To kick off the re-birth of the station with the new format, KX-96 celebrated with a giant bash at a local nightspot which included on-air ticket give-aways, as well as providing food and entertainment. The station reported that the debut wasn't without a number of setbacks, one of which being the collapse of their tower during a recent ice storm.

### Anik Award to Switchback

CBC-TV's Halifax Switchback has won the Anik Award as Canada's Best Regional Entertainment program. John Nowlan, Producer of the Sunday morning show (8:30 to 10 am) credits the Canadian music industry for much of the show's success. Labels arranged for quality videos of the top groups as well as setting up live on-camera interviews with name recording acts. Says Nowlan, "In spite of the ungodly hour, performers have been more than willing to appear on the show and take calls from young people."



MEN AT WORK - Rock
Cargo - Columbia QC-38660-H

Men At Work's initial album release, Business As Usual, has now surpassed the 700,000 units sold mark, an unbelievable accomplishment considering the difficult beginning the album had. Business must be classified by the CBS people as one of the most successful work records of the '80s, which sets the stage for Cargo. The energies are still there, but producer Peter McLan, who recorded this session in Sydney, Australia, may have had a hand in a musical change that is quite obvious, and material that is a far cry from their '81 single success, Who Can It Be Now. This production takes a stab at the market as a whole and although Overkill. the single taken from this album, is a good illustration of their change, there are even better cuts including Blue For You, and No Sign Of Yesterday. There's more than one single on this set, and much more in keeping with the rock of North America that is more pop than rock. Colin Hay (vocals and guitar), supplies most of the material, although Ron Strykert (guitar

and vocals) wrote the words and music for Settle Down My Boy and I Like To. The sax and flute work is supplied by Greg Ham, who also gives an assist with vocals; drummer Jerry Speiser also helps out on vocals as does bassist John Rees - and that's the lineup of this talented Australian five.

Q-FEEL - Rock Jive - JV-8605-M

Produced by group members Martin Page and Brian Fairweather, both of whom double on keyboards and guitars and who also co-wrote all the material, Q-Feel have made an initial impression on Canadian programmers with their single, Dancing In Heaven, included here and which was a finalist in the 1982 Eurovision Song Contest (it reached the Top 8). The other two members of this British rock quartet are drummer Trevor Thornton and keyboardist ChrisRichardson.Q-Feel are another in the successful high-tech British groups to invade North America, but they will perhaps have a much wider penetration, displaying here more of a futuristic approach to contemporary music and synthrock that's heavy on dance, yet designed for the AOR, CHR and pop programmers. Dancing In Heaven

is the better cut at 6:07 but also choice are Cross Talk at 3:38 and the 5:45 Go For It. The vocals are crisp and punchy and the instrumental work borders on genius. Should be popular at the dance club level. Unfortunately the liner notes are lacking in information, so who is featured on what cut, vocals and/or synthesizer, is a secret, although we do know that Page and Fairweather share the lead vocals.

KELITA HAVERLAND - Country Kelita - Boot BOS-7235

Produced by Glen Sutton, Alberta native Kelita Haverland makes an impressive entry into the record business. Her vocal charm exudes professionalism, perhaps best illustrated with her own material, particularly It's Almost Over and My Love. The latter is a powerful musical message that has exceptional crossover qualities. Initial single release, the Mark Wright penning of Where Is Love, is already making good gains up charts and playlists and this week takes a giant jump up the RPM Country 50 to No. 32. Haverland's timing and projection is more in keeping with a performing musician, which perhaps gives her an edge over the vocalist only variety. Her

RICK SPRINGFIELD - Rock Living In Oz - RCA AFL1-4660-N

Produced by Springfield and Bill Drescher, the Rick Springfield image is still retained as a powerful messenger of rock. There's a bit of a change in direction where his guitar work has become a little more of a purr than a snarl, which may be due the synthesizer influence - and that's not all that bad. Springfield wrote all the material and the range is pretty well in keeping with what Springfield fans are used to, although he does appear to be attempting an unflattering physical change. He is already scoring well on the RPM singles chart with his new single, Affair Of The Heart, one of the better cuts on the album, however, Me And Johnny will be picked up as going along with his new "biker" image, but Like Father, Like Son and Souls, will ease the listener back to the more popular Springfield. Watch for this retired TV doctor to star in a movie to be released this fall. He will be scoring the soundtrack with well-known musician Tom Scott.



DAVID BOWIE
Let's Dance - EMI America SO-17093-F
Bowie's first for EMI America should immediately establish him as a signing that has the greatest potential. He has been somewhat off the scene but has been building his image in other areas which should dovetail into the label's hefty promotion campaign on this release. Initial single,

tion campaign on this release. Initial single, the title track, has already scored Top 5 on the RPM singles chart, after only five weeks of release. This track is indicative of what the rest of the package offers. If Bowie fell out of favour with his dance/cultist fans, Let's Dance should bring him back into prominence and with an even larger following. Bowie co-produced this session

with Nile Rodgers, and perhaps this is the key to what must certainly be Bowie's turnaround. Canadian dates, now being set up for Bowie's first tour in five years will bring him and his album into even greater visibility. Programmers will also attract listener response with China Girl, Shake It and Ricochet.

### AT PRESS TIME

Leonard Kennedy has scored a major coup for his Saturn Distributors. Add to his singles operation the supplying of product to 80 more outlets in Ontario and the Maritimes. These include Flipside and Sounds Insight, which makes Saturn the major supplier of single product in Canada.

# Cassettes on increase in latest Stats Canada report

Toronto: Statistics Canada released its advance report on the Canadian record industry for the month of February showing a monthly increase in the net shipment of 7-inch discs of 58 percent and a revised year-to-date rise of 71 percent for 7-inch records.

Production of 7-inch discs however revealed a monthly decrease of 21 percent and a year-to-date decline of 14 percent.

The year-to-date net shipment of 12-inch discs showed a 20 percent increase with a slight decrease of two percent for the month. The production of 12-inch records revealed a 13 percent decrease for the month and a year-to-date decline of three percent.

The year-to-date net value of sales of both 7 and 12-inch records showed a revised increase of 13 percent and a slight monthly decrease of one percent.

Pre-recorded cassette tapes continue to experience healthy increases with a 44 percent increase in net shipments for the year-to-date in a revised figure, while net shipments for the month showed a 25 percent rise.

The production of pre-recorded cassettes also showed increases with a revised year-to-date increase of 36 percent and a revised monthly rise of 32 percent.

Pre-recorded cartridges continue on their downward direction with a a 71 percent decrease in production for the year-to-date and a 72 percent decline for the month. This was a 62 percent decrease for the year-to-date in net shipments and a 47 percent decline for the month.
