PolyGram ups prices of compact discs

Dieter Radecki, Executive Vice President and General Manager of PolyGram Canada, has announced an increase in the price of compact discs. The increase will add \$1.00 to the base price, which 'will work out to about \$2.00 or a little more per CD at retail. The increase takes effect Apr. 1.

CD prices at retail range anywhere from \$19.95 to \$25.00. Radecki isn't too happy with the increase, for obvious reasons, but as he points out, "The state of the deteriorating Canadian dollar against the German Mark, made it impossible to continue with the old price."

This is the second increase in the price of CDs in only 3 months - the first being in January of this year to accommodate the increase in provincial sales taxes. "I'm very unhappy about these price increases," continues Radecki, "Only government gains, but on the other hand, you have to look very closely at the world situation, and quite frankly, I

Lanois co-produces Gabriel's new LP

Daniel Lanois, a Canadian, and former owner of the Grant Avenue Studios in Hamilton, Ont., co-produced Peter Gabriel's new album, Sledgehammer. The set is Gabriel's first studio project since Security (Shock The Monkey), released over 3 years ago.

The album will be preceded by a single, an extended mix of the title track, which will carry Don't Break This Rhythm, and I Have The Touch, on the flip.

Lanois is known for his work with U2, as well as M⁸M, Luba and The Parachute Club.

Michael Godin to manage Paul Janz

Michael Godin, Vice President A&R for A&M Records Canada, will leave this post the end of May to become worldwide manager for West Coast recording artist Paul Janz. Godin, his wife and young son expect to be settled in Vancouver June 1st.

Prior to joining A&M 10 years ago, Godin had carved himself a recognizable niche in the broadcast industry, both from the programming and on-air sides of the mike. He was associated with CFQR, CFCF, CFOM and CJFM, most notably as Music Director. He was also involved in the early stages of foreground programming for CJFM, which was in advance of the CRTC regulations regarding this new FM information dialogue.

Since joining A&M, Godin has been in on the ground floor for the majority of A&R decisions that resulted in the label becoming the leader in Cancon releases.

Paul Janz, who won a Juno last year as Most Promising Male Vocalist, is currently on release with his High Strung album, which spawned 3 singles, the title track, Don't Cry Tonight, and Go To Pieces.

Godin reports that Janz is undertaking production work on his new album at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound. He will have engineering/mix assists from Bob Rock and Mike Fraser. don't think the international community has reacted to the monetary problems that exist today."

PolyGram is, by far, the lead supplier of compact discs and Radecki is predicting that CDs will become a major part of overall sales for recorded product. He expects that PolyGram alone, will sell next year what the industry sold in 1985, which is 1.2 million CDs. Interestingly enough, Radecki had predicted that the industry would sell 1.3 million CDs in 1985 - so he wasn't too far off. Even of the 1.2 million CDs sold last year, PolyGram's share was 49 percent. It's also interesting to note that almost half of PolyGram's sales are for classical releases - and the majority of these sales are dealer re-orders.

The major age group buying CDs "are adults", says Radecki. "Buyers like soft rock and pop - like Dire Straits. We've sold over 35,000 Brothers In Arms compact discs."

Radecki also points out that jazz has taken on a new character insofar as CDs are concerned and that PolyGram is enjoying exceptional sales with this music form. They will shortly announce the signing of 2 more jazz labels.

As well, Radecki has discovered an increase in optimism by dealers with regard to hardware. It had been predicted that 150,000 CD players would be sold during 1985, and as it turned out, this figure was closer to 200,000.

Radecki concludes with, "I firmly believe that at retail prices, CDs may have an impact of \$70 million dollars next year."

Honeymoon Suite firmed to tour U.S. with Heart

Honeymoon Suite, currently making national chart gains with their WEA album, The Big Prize, have been firmed to open for Heart's tour dates in the Eastern and mid-Western U.S.

These dates include St. Louis (Apr. 8), Madison (9), Bloomington (11), Peoria (12), Iowa City (13), Pittsburgh (15), Buffalo (16), East Rutherford, New Jersey (18), Baltimore (19), Worcester (20), Tampa (22), Pensacola (23), and Jacksonville (25).

CBS and Jive pact distribution deal

CBS Records and the German-based Jive label have negotiated a distribution pact. The licensing deal is effective immediataely and covers the exclusive distribution of Jive product in Canada for current as well as catalogue titles.

The Jive label features Billy Ocean's current hit, When The Going Gets Tough from the Jewel Of The Nile soundtrack.

Scheduled for release over the next couple of months is the new Ocean album, Love Zone, as well as a new LP from Flock Of Seagulls (Dream Come True), Whodini (Back In Black), and a debut album from Jonathan Butler - a South African new age/jazz artist. Also expected later in the year is a new Tangerine Dream.

MuchMusic firmed for Montreux's Golden Rose

Canada's MuchMusic is among the number of record and media companies firmed to attend the first International Music & Media Conference. The conference is scheduled for May 7 through the 10 in conjunction with the Golden Rose Television Festival in Montreux.

Joining MuchMusic will be Sky Channel, BBC Radio and TV, Music Channel, Europa TV, MTV, RTL (Luxembourg), Radio Veronica (Netherlands), WEA, MCA Records, RCA/Ariola, Chrysalis, Sonet (Sweden), Westwood One, Swiss TV, David Zard Promotions (Italy), Antenne-2 (France), Piccadilly Radio, RIAS (Berlin), Wienerworld (U.K.), Europe 1 (France), RadioVision Int'l, Capitol Radio, Second Vision, and Formal Eins (West Germany).

There will be 2 days of radio and TV panels, discussing topics covering station management, programming, international broadcasting rights, games and syndication. There will also be a music video festival recognizing both videlips and longform videos.

Bonaire's One To One to Warner Bros in U.S.

Following quickly on the Canadian success of One To One's (Ottawa natives Leslie Howe and Louise Reny) first single, There Was A Time, WEA has announced the release of the follow-up, Angel In My Pocket. The release will coincide with Warner's U.S. release of Forward Your Emotions, the album that contains both singles.

There Was A Time made impressive gains up the RPM 100 singles and A/C chart, peaking at No. 14 (Mar. 8/86) on the former. However, hometown Ottawa stations were giving the single top exposure - No. 1 for 2 weeks running at CFGO and No. 1 at CFRA. CKOI in Montreal gave the single a No. 11 berth, considered an excellent rating at this top Montreal listening post.

Comments from several Canadian programmers indicate that Angel In My Pocket is the track that will break this act. WEA is re-recording Angel, and it will be the first U.S. single as well.

And when it comes to cooperative advertising, there are a couple of dealers/suppliers who prefer a euphemism, which means they don't pay anything.

An industry YUPPIE??



Luck plays only a small part in breaking records

Current Records/Management

As The Toronto Sun's Wilder Penfield III put it, "With a little luck in 1986, Little Current could quite suddenly emerge as the country's most important label." Quite a glowing

prognostication by Mr. Penfield III, but not without a modicum of reason or substance. In chronological order, I'll try to take you through the Current months of 1986. M^sM gets the ball rolling with The World Is A Ball in April, distributed by

RCA and produced by M^sM and David Lord (Tears For Fears, Peter Gabriel, Icicle Works). The first single will be Song In My Head with the video being shot by Total Eclipse, led by Michael Rosen and friends. Scheduled release date for the single is Apr. 4, with the video being distributed on Apr. 11, and the album itself, Apr. 21. The band will be touring this summer, including already confirmed Ontario Place Dates.

Double Dare is second at the gate with their self-titled debut LP, distributed by PolyGram, and the first scheduled single, Can't Hold On. The album was produced by Chris Barbosa and Mark Ligget (Shannon), and the video is being directed by Deborah Samuel out of Champagne Motion Picture

Vancouver kick-off date for Simple Minds tour

Simple Minds will begin their tour of Canada with a Vancouver date (Apr. 29). This will be followed by Edmonton (May 1), Calgary (3), Winnipeg (6), and Montreal (17). Other dates will be announced as they are firmed. The Call will be opening these dates.

Simple Minds is currently enjoying chart action with their Virgin album, Once Upon A Time, which spawned 2 hit singles, Alive & Kicking and Sanctify Yourself. Company. Video completion date is Apr.10. Release dates tentatively scheduled include the single at the end of April, and the album by mid-May. The band will begin touring by early summer.

A band in the development that we will be showcasing on Mar. 25 to various interested distributors is the much-reputed Alta Moda. Led by Molly Johnson and Norman Orenstein, this Queen Street R&B/funk outfit should see a release by mid-summer.

The Parachute Club is set to go into the studio the first week of April to begin their third album. At the moment, we are involved in delicate negotiations with a couple of highprofile U.S. producers, but until an agreement is reached, it would be premature to

reveal their identities. We're looking for a June release on their LP and it will be followed by live dates at Ontario Place (Aug. 3/4/5) and Expo '86 (Aug. 12/13). A tour of Germany is also planned for this summer to follow up on their success in that market with the recent release of At The Feet Of The Moon.

Last, but definitely not least, will come Strange Advance. Drew Arnott and Darryl Kromm are in Vancouver writing, what I promise to be their strongest album to date. Considering that their latest album, 2W0, hit close to platinum sales, that's saying an earful. Two of the first cuts written for their new record, Hold On, and Endless Nights, have Top 10 written all over them. We're looking to get into production on the album sometime in June with a scheduled October release.

With 5 acts of this calibre, the sky is the limit for Current and its bands around the world in 1986.

Mr. Mister: visions of big cars and beer parties

Described, in early 1982, as "White R&B", Mr. Mister signed a recording deal with RCA and have since released 2 albums. Their latest, Welcome To The Real World, spawned 2 hit singles - their first wasn't so lucky.

Broken Wings topped the RPM 100 singles chart on Dec. 14 cf. last year, and Kyrie reached that position on Mar. 8 of this year, a position it retained for 2 weeks. Despite these back-to-back No. 1 singles, the No. 1 album berth still eludes the band. However, their 15-date Canadian tour, currently underway, "should change that," says lead singer Richard Page.

Welcome To The Real World took at least 12 weeks to break. The visual medium is given credit for breaking the single. "Yes," agrees Page, "the video for Broken Wings was given heavy exposure, but I think our tour with Tina Turner had a lot to do with it . . . and, of course, the tenacity of our record company.


"Even though most records are dead after 12 weeks, RCA wouldn't give up on the song. They stayed with it, and pretty soon it started to catch on. I'm not sure how it happened," he continues, "Radio may have discovered that 'hey, wait a minute, there's a hit happening without us knowing about it.' I really don't know how it went down, but it caught on and pretty soon we had a hit."

Page and Steve George (keyboards) formed Mr. Mister after performing as backup singers for artists such as Al Jarraeau, Donna Summer and Quincy Jones. Joining to complete the group were guitarist Steve Farris and drummer Pat Mastelotto. Their first album, I Wear The Face, was released in the spring of '84, and promptly stiffed. They re-entered the studio to record Welcome To The Real World that fall.

Explaining the inspiration and the changes Mr. Mister underwent, Page points out that Real World "is about my daughter, and when she was born. It's also really just looking at the world - how cold and weird it is. Looking at this fragile child and how somebody's responsibility could easily be hurt by it.

"So, waking up to responsibility and taking charge of your life is kind of the statement the album is making. Not to sound like a therapy group or anything like that, but it

Chatham & London acts win Country Roads final



has a big part of what we are about. Certainly, I spent a lot of time spinning my wheels and partying a lot - I really didn't get anything done to the point where it was getting pretty serious. It was getting pretty bad.

. . I could've easily died . . . I didn't and managed to pull this off and get more responsibility into my life. I'm still working on it -and that's a big part of where the album comes from."

Mr. Mister produced Real World themselves, but a good engineer was most important Page stresses. "We hired Yes' Paul DeVilliers. He's got the objective ears that we don't have. He was willing to listen to us and to be our guide because none of us are engineers - and he's exceptional at it. He came up with the 'sonic' and made it sound the way it does, which we were really thrilled about."

When asked whether that's what was missing from their debut, Page replies, "Yes, that was part of it, but again, it was like the title - it was not us taking the entire responsiblity. We had an outside producer the first time and he got his sound for our music and that wasn't acceptable to me or the rest of the guys. We wanted it to sound like the way we heard it and Paul made that happen."

Although the songwriting duties are shared, the lyrics are handled by Page and his cousin John Lang. "We write from emotion," explains Page, "about what's happening in our lives. I think Real World had a lot to do with a rebirth within ourselves, not our lifestyles."

He continues with "I've always been influenced by R&B music. Steve George and I were in a band that played all black, dance music - we were an all-white band playing black clubs. That's a big part of my past, and perhaps that shows through as well, but I really don't think that Mr. Mister has an R&B sound."

The band is currently working on their next album, but as Page points out "Nothing really concrete has come up yet. We have a couple of songs, but as far as a vision of the whole thing is concerned - that is still in the works."

Page concludes with "We have to live it first and then we write about it - it will be songs about buying big cars and living on the beach and drinking beer - the only vice I have left. I love beer."


