

# Toronto's CHFI-FM salutes The Beatles

It Was 20 Years Ago, a salute to The Beatles will be part of CHFI-FM's Chronicle from noon to 2 pm June 1st... "exactly 20 years after Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Heart's Club Band was released," points out Peggy Colston-Weir, Vice President, FM Programming, Rogers Broadcasting.

From noon to 12:30 the station's magazine show, Chronicle, will broadcast live from Toronto's Nathan Phillips Square, with the entire show devoted to the Beatles. The half hour will be buffered by a panel comprising Richard Lyttelton, President, Capitol Records-EMI Canada; The Toronto Star's Peter Goddard, Wilder Penfield III of The Toronto Sun, and RPM publisher Walt Grealis.

The remainder of the timed segment will include CHFI airing Beatles music which will be heard at the Square with FM 98's Sandy Hoyt as Master of Ceremonies. There will also be live entertainment by Beatles impersonators, which will not be broadast.

# Black Music Awards pays tribute to artists

The Black Music Association of Canada paid tribute to black artists through its annual music awards which were held at Toronto's Royal York Hotel (May 15). One of the big winners was A&M recording artist Kim Richardson, a 1986 Juno award winner for Most Promising Female Vocalist. Her BMAC wins were for Top Female Artist and Top Single for her Peek-A-Boo release.

Fellow A&M artist Erroll Starr won in the Top Male category. He won last year for Top Single.

The Top Group award went to Manteca, while C&C (Harvey/Otway) took Top Producer honours, and Leroy Sibbles won for Top Album (Meanwhile).

Inducted into the BMAC Hall of Fame were Dick Smith of Syncona, Kensington Studio, and The Lincolns. The latter's award was accepted by Prakash John, a veteran of the label/commercial fields. Recognition of The Lincolns has been a long time coming and one the audience obviously agreed with. jections." ### D'Arcy named President Chrysalis International

Chris Wright, Chairman of Chrysalis Group PLC, has announced the appointment of Doug D'Arcy to the newly created post of President of Chrysalis Records International. The appointment is effective immediately.

D'Arcy was formerly Managing Director of Chrysalis Records. International with responsibility for the label's activities in the world outside North America, where Jack Craigo is President of Chrysalis Records Inc., the U.S. domestic operation.

Under his new title, D'Arcy will, in addition to his current responsibilities, jointly oversee the company's activities in the U.S. and Canada together with Chairman and founder Wright. Milhan Gorkey, Director National Publicity for Chrysalis, points up up that D'Arcy, who has been with Chrysalis since its inception in 1968, "will also be totally responsible for the integration of Chrysalis Record company activities worldwide."

He continues with, "The appointment is intended to streamline the overall management structure within the Chrysalis group at a point in time when the group has just announced record half-year profits and is enjoying considerable success with both established and newly developed artists throughout the world."

The Chrysalis group has an expansion program currently underway, and in addition to corporate acquisitions in the U.K., is expected to expand its Air Studios subsidiary into the U.S. market through the construction of studios in Los Angeles and New York.

Says Wright, "The creation of this new position, to which Doug D'Arcy has been appointed, is expected to give a greater dynamic to the management of Chrysalis Records throughout the world," continuing with "Over the past 12 months, we have made major commitments to investment in A&R and I feel confident that we are set to take Chrysalis into a new dimension as the most aggressive independent record company in the world marketplace." described as their "answer to the standard concept/promotional video." It was originally intended for theatrical release as a "B" feature in Britain. The short form (30-minute) film is "the group's typically Style-ish, no-holds-barred audiovisual commentary on the state of America, dangerous English nationalism, the Pop Star game and videos themselves, done up as a satirical travalogue."

Also included are live versions from their like-titled album, In Visible Silence which includes Peter Gunn, Legs, Close To The Edit and Paranoimia. The latter features Max Headroom.

The 4-video series will be followed by the Cult's Electric, Level 42's Live At Wembley, and Hipsway, plus, later this year, Bon Jovi's Slippery When Wet, Cinderella's Night Songs, Group Of The Decade from Kool & The Gang, as well as releases from Deep Purple. New Order, Bananarama and The Communards.

### CBS launch for Best of Times cassette line

CBS Records has made available a new cassette line flying the banner of the Best of Times. The line will revive many of their best sellers from the past including musicals such as Annie Get Your Gun and My Fair Lady, and artists like Andy Williams, Doris Day and Bobby Vinton. Eye-catching packaging, including the image of a jukebox on each cassette graphic is expected to be a major consumer attraction.

The new line is priced the same as the recently introduced Nice Price series. Release date has been set as the week of June 8th, consisting of 30 titles. More titles will be available in July, expanding into country and pop releases.

Included in the 30-title release are Greatest Hits by Frankie Laine, Patti Page, Harry James (w/Frank Sinatra), Liberace, Andy Williams, Peter Nero, plus Barbra Streisand's Album and People, Neil Diamond Classics, Sing Along With Mitch Miller & The Gang, and more.

### Cancon continues as major priority at CBS

Gowan and Dan Hill are currently bulleting up the RPM 100 with their respective singles and albums, the result of obviously well-laid plans by the A&R, Marketing and Promotion Departments at CBS Records. Cancon has been priority at CBS for several years, in particular the last seven, during which time Jeff Burns has headed up A&R operations for the company.

As Vice President of A&R, it is Burns' responsibility to bring new acts to CBS and to retain those still on the roster. One of the first he signed was Loverboy, a Vancouver-based band that became internationally-known in a very short period of time.

"We've been lucky," says Burns, "coming up with Canadian chart acts every couple of years. There hasn't been a shortage of signings, and most of the acts we've signed became nationally known. As a matter of fact, in the almost eight years I've been here, there have only been four acts that we've let go." There are seven Cancon acts currently active on the CBS roster. They are Gowan, Loverboy, Dan Hill, Platinum Blonde, Billy Newton-Davis, Molly Johnson & Aldo Moda, and their recent signing of Vancouver

### Mother Nature lays off and CJMO is set to rock

After a winter that saw several record snowfalls set in the Maritimes, Mother Nature is once again smiling on the delayed project to put CJMO-FM (ROCK 103) Moncton back on schedule. The studio facility is almost complete and the transmitter site is just about there with the Leblanc and Royle tower crew topping the project. Now, technical wizard Mike Leaman is taking deliveries of both studio and transmission equipment.

Needless to say, station boss Rick Gordon and his partner/shareholders Dr. Mike Cripton, Charles Lawson, Doug MacDonald, and Gary O'Neil are now optomistic that ROCK 103 FM "will hit the airwaves fullforce on June 19th."

Most of the staff for the new FM album rocker is in place, although Program Director Larry McCaw isn't revealing all his players just yet. He does admit to Al Roberts for morning drive, joining the station from Sherbrooke's K-900.

Newsroom operations will be tinder the command of well-known local newsman Gerry Proctor, who returns to private broadcasting after a stint with the CBC. Sports duties will be handled by Monctonian Marty Kingston, who returns home after an association with Toronto's CKEY. The "totally computerized artist biography and statistics chore" for the station is being handled by Paul Wiggins, who left Vancouver's CFMI-FM for the trip east.

On the sales side, Dave Manship, formerly of Handleman Records is now pounding the pavement for the station while traffic and accounting tasks will be the responsibility of Heidi O'Brien and B.I.A.S. broadcast software system.

The station, once in full operation, will employ between 25 and 30 full and part time employees. artist Barney Bentall.

Burns does check out some performances by acts recommended to him for consideration, but this is just a small factor in signing artists. He stresses that he looks for strong management - plus the vocal and instrumental quality of the band or artist and their repertoire.

Burns receives on average 100 tapes each week, but CBS has a policy whereby they won't accept unsolicited tapes. This doesn't mean the door is closed entirely on new bands or artists who don't have the luxury of a manager or a lawyer, but as Burns explains, "We are fine tuning the label . . . trying to keep it down to a small, high quality roster, where we can concentrate more on the acts we have signed."

Although there has been criticism from some major labels and producers over the attitude of radio towards Cancon, Burns hasn't really seen any major shift in this area. "I don't have any problems at all," he points out. "I've never experienced any negatives toward Canadian content, generally speaking. The act I signed 7 years ago, got the same shot at radio as any of the acts I've signed since. Radio is important to Canadian talent. but the onus is on us to produce world class product, and that's what we're doing. I'm quite happy with our current roster and what's dramatically brought this realization to all of us at CBS is the fact that this is the first year, since I've been with the company that we've had a release from every artist, all in the same year "

Production costs, plus the spiralling costs for videos is a major problem for the industry as a whole, and Burns addresses this problem with, "Videos are still a very important promotion vehicle for establishing an act, but we're going to have to be more discreet in the future." He continues with "We're looking at budgets which are pretty

### New Juno category for classical work

A new category for Best Classical Composition is to be included in this year's Juno Awards, marking the first time Canadian classical music has received special attention from CARAS.

It was revealed that the need to recognize Canadian classical composers was expressed by several artists on the CARAS board, among them Ian Thomas and Bill Henderson. "Canadian composers in the serious music field have been well respected internationally for years," says Thomas, "and it's time Canada honoured its own." Henderson adds, "Many musical materials used by today's pop composers were developed by Canadian classical composers."

The Junos already recognize Best Classical Album: Solo or Chamber Ensemble, and Best Classical Album: Large Ensemble or Soloist(s). All three categories will be judged by panels of experts.

The new award will be presented to the composer of the chosen work, and will be based on a composition written during the last 50 years, recorded either by a Canadian or foreign label. much the same as in the U.S., and our local market is only one tenth the size. Therefore, we need an international hit to make a profit, and that means selling a lot of records."

Burns goes on to point out, "We have to be pretty sure of the market and how best to approach it, and we have to be sure of the act we sign, and how it's going to shape up in the marketplace." He concludes with "The competition is pretty stiff out there, and to gain a foothold in the international market requires a lot of planning, and an even greater belief in your act."

### Drunk drivers - target of Steer Clear concert

The City of Toronto (Department of Public Health), The Toronto Star, The Metropolitan Toronto Police, and Milk will present a Steer Clear concert at Toronto's Nathan Philips Square (May 29). The concert, which is free, is designed to "increase young peoples' awareness of the hazards of drinking and driving."

Hosted by Howard 'Studmuffin' Busgang, of CBC-T's Switchback, the concert will feature performances by New Regime, an RCA recording group, and Somersault's Vis-A-Vis. On-air personalities from Q-107 and CFNY-FM will be on hand along with VeeJays from MuchMusic, plus a few surprise guests.

### Rock And Hyde firmed for Ontario Place Forum

Rock And Hyde will interrupt their U.S. tour, to play 3 nights (May 25 through 27) at The Forum of Ontario Place in Toronto. The Capitol duo have been on tour since late April, playing to packed houses in Victoria and Vancouver, as well as dates throughout the West.

It's expected that by the time they hit Toronto, their new single, I Will, the followup to Dirty Water, will be released. Both Dirty Water, and their album (Under The Volcano) have bulleted into the Top 10 of U.S. tip sheets, R&R, and Album Network.

Their Toronto dates will be followed by Ottawa's Grand Central (29 & 30), and Montreal's Spectrum (June 1). MuchMusic will tape the latter for one of their Big Ticket specials.



#### Come on . . . pull the plug out!!

I've gone out on the limb and predicted that one and maybe two Toronto radio stations will get back to "rock" basics. Everyone's denying it . . . but watch out . . . radio in Toronto could become exciting once more. I understand the same sort of excitement is in store for Vancouver listeners. Today's variety of rock and roll just limps along, wouldn't you agree? Unfortunately some of the on-air personalities have become banal as well (EC: I know one who thinks he's the Top Banal!!)

#### Awards! Awards! Awards!

I love 'em . . . the more the better. I can remember, not too many years ago, when there weren't any awards shows in Canada. When Stan Klees and I started the Juno Awards, away back when . . . we did it very cautiously . . . and classy . . . if I do say so myself. We also paid all the bills ourselves. One of the biggest evenings of the early Junos was at the Inn on The Park's Centennial Ballroom, when we squeezed in over 1500 invited guests. Marci McDonald, who was writing for the Toronto Star at that time, wrote that "it was a ceremony that lasted not quite an hour, lagged not a second and was carried out with such simple panache and despatch that it made all those interminable bigtime glory shows, the Grammies and the Oscars and even the Canadian Film Awards, look like amateur night at the highschool gym." Quite frankly, I haven't read anything quite like that in any of the dailies since. when it comes to reporting on Canadian awards shows. Just how many awards shows do we have in Canada now . . . ??

#### Sean Eyre remembers it well!!

I read the "Country Nostalgia" per CIGV-FM's Carl Harris (Apr. 18/87) regarding "A Saga of Canadian Country and Folk Music (Late Forties through the Fifties)" which was one of Mr. George Taylor's innovative creations. To have "The Saga" recognized and referred to as "A Golden Memory" brought back some personal memories of its production.

My involvement in the project was, I believe, "accidental", as The Taylors were scouting this area to take up residence. I was the only country D.J. for a good number of miles in any direction, and I think Mr. Taylor chose me because of some urgency (which never has come clear to me) in the release of the double LP set.

The manner of its production led to some errors, the most noticeable, and as far as I am concerned unforgiveable on my part, was the mispronunciation of Gaby Hass' name.

However, I do feel proud that the "Saga" is one of the Canadian Country Historical references on "active" file in the library of the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville for students of early "Canadiana" and continental country music to experience and study.

I will be ever indebted to George Taylor for giving this country D.J. some measure of lasting, contributory, worth.

Three cheers to Carl Harris for recognizing and programming such a Golden Memory, historical yet entertaining in its concept.

### The Goods - still touring after 15 years

Long before Alabama set the stage for a revolution in country music circles, The Good Brothers were achieving crossover hits that eventually landed the band with a gold record for their double live album in 1980. By 1984 they had won 8 consecutive Juno Awards, and had toured with Gordon Lightfoot and Neil Young, among others, along the way. They won their first Big Country Award as Outstanding Group in 1976. "Every album we've ever done has certainly

### CBC-TV bows new series It's Only Rock 'n' Roll

CBC-TV will launch their new 13 week 30-min series of It's Only Rock 'n' Roll with a pilot episode June 19. Hosting the series will be CFNY-FM's Ted Woloshyn, who will co-host with well-known record producer Fred Mollin. The latter will also act as Music Director for the series, which is being sponsored by CBC, Telefilm and Labatt's

Featured in each half-hour segment will be live and on-location performances, news, interviews, Not The History of Rock 'n' Roll, Kill That Tune, and a Quote of The Week.

The pilot will feature Kim Mitchell in a studio setting, an inteview with David Lee Roth, a performance by Pursuit Of Happiness, an interview with Sam Sniderman on the state of compact discs, and a quick tour of Praxis Technologies, a Toronto-based CD manufacturing plant.

On tap for the follow-up segment will be performances by and interviews with Blue Rodeo, The Partland Brothers, Jennifer Warnes, and China Crisis.

had what you'd call crossover or countryrock," says Bruce Good. "But what I really find frustrating is nowadays, people say 'You guys are like Alabama . . . you do their kind of stuff.' We were doing that crossover country long before Alabama was even a band."

Enjoying such hits as Fox On The Run and How Long, Good says their style of music hasn't changed, nor can it be called "original" enough to obtain a U.S. release. "The only Canadian country artists who have ever broken in the U.S. were Wilf Carter, Hank Snow and Anne Murray," he continues.

"What we run up against is the old adage 'You can't sell refrigerators to the Eskimos.' Americans feel they are the very essence of country music. Therefore, they make it very, very difficult for any foreign acts to break in their market."

The Good Brothers' new Savannah album, Deliverin The Goods, was produced by Stacy Heydon and contains the controversial song, 'A' Tom Bomb. "There are mixed emotions about that song," says Good, "We were trying to be topical when we were writing it, trying in essence to write a country protest song.

"The song gets a lot of reaction. Some people say it's their favourite song, while others say they don't like what it's about. Nobody really likes some of the hard realities of life, but the song was written tongue-incheek. It wasn't meant to bum anybody out like it seems to have done though."

Although the band is certainly grateful

### for Canada's enduring support, Good relates, they are hoping to crack the tough U.S. market. "I think, as does every Canadian artist, and although we're not banking all of our success on the fact, we're hoping to get a U.S. release."

Because they're not considered traditional country, Good admits the route will be a lot tougher. "There are other groups that are having a lot of success with traditional country music, but we've always done this. We have always been trying to cross over since our first album . . . right up to the new one."

The Goods, through their live performances, which include touring Czechoslovakia in 1985, are known for their "high energy" and Good says they have had problems capturing their intensity in the studio. "Yes," he agrees, "that's the way it was until we did our first live album.

"Consequently, and because of the feeling we have when we perform live, it was our first gold record. As a matter of fact," he continues, "we're probably the only Canadian country group ever to get a gold record here in Canada.

When asked why subsequent albums have not fared as well, Good replies that "Canadians weren't ready to be the first to accept crossover country. That was our problem, especially from a Canadian act. It seems Canadians are more into accepting American crossover rather than Canadian. It's just the way it is ... I guess.

"But when I say this," he concludes, "I'm not saying it in a bitter tone either, because again, I have to emphasize that everything we have we owe to our Canadian audiences."

### A red-hot spring for Canadian talent at CBS

It's been a warm spring for all of us, but a red-hot one for CBS' Canadian talent. While Gowan has been touring the country, his single and album have been 'touring' the radio charts, from bottom to top. Moonlight Desires has led the way for Great Dirty World, earning early gold for the album and reaching the magic 100,000 unit mark, just 60 days after release. Awake The Giant will be the next single, due for release in June.

Dan Hill has seduced radio with Can't We Try, the beautiful ballad duet with Vonda Sheppard, charting and playlisting countrywide. Dan's self-titled LP is his first in four years.

But it's not just the Canadians enjoying the weather. British powerhouse Alison Moyet's Is This Love, has received heavy AOR support in its first week out - a strong indication that Raindancing, due here in two weeks, will do as well (if not better) for her than Alf.

Primitive Love Rites, the first single from Australians Mondo Rock, has also received strong AOR recognition, a great base for Boom Baby Boom, out this week.

Meanwhile, a few 'older' LPs continue their steady success stories: the Psychedelic Furs, touring this June, have just achieved gold status with Midnight To Midnight, still mainly on the strength of Heartbreak Beat. The Bangles' fourth single, Walking Down Your Street, has a lock on radio, and has taken Different Light to 2½ times platinum. Eddie Money launches into single No. 3, Endless Nights, racking up steady sales increases on the road to platinum for Can't Hold Back.

A warm spring so far, but the heat is only beginning: Jennifer Rush returns to the airwaves this week with Flames Of Paradise, a duet with Elton John. Heart Over Mind is the new LP, and it's a winner. Gloria Estefan and Miami Sound Machine will insist that Rhythm Is Gonna Get Ya in a couple of weeks, kicking off Let It Loose, a bright, well-produced successor to the platinum, Primitive Love.

New LP's from the Hooters, Outfield, Fabulous Thunderbirds, Cock Robin, and Roger Waters are just around the corner, as well as a brilliant LP from newcomers Omar & The Howlers, a Mississippi band in the mold of Stevie Ray Vaughan.

Our Canadian stars Platinum Blonde and Loverboy will be along with new releases in the summer, as will the pre-concert LP from Pink Floyd, being recorded right now in Los Angeles.

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



#### 16 Avenue release for Charley Pride




### Priscilla Wright set for Children's Miracle TVer

### Sue Medley debuts on Pacific Wave


