Furor over singles a tempest in a tea pot

It would appear the "raging controversy" over the future of the vinyl single (45), has been blown out of proportion. Predicting the demise of the single has sent shock waves through the industry, particularly the independent field, where the one-song format is quite often the only link the new Canadian recording artist has with radio.

"Take away the single," said one independent record producer, "and you might as well say goodbye to the domestic recording industry."

Actually, there hasn't been any hint of removing the single from the market, it's a matter of adjusting its importance, when it comes to retail.

"We press a single with the first intention of going to radio with it," explains Don Oates, Vice President Marketing and Sales for CBS Records. "and, depending on

what the initial demand is of that single from retail, we make up singles to go to the street. Sometimes there's little if any product going to the street, because the act may be a complete unknown, and retailers aren't going to buy up front,

they're going to wait and see what radio is going to do with it. This is called Inventory Control, and we've been doing it for some time. The record goes to radio only, and until such time as we see some reaction, we're not going to make a consumer copy of it."

There was a time when record companies were forcing single product out on the street. They were guilty of pressing too many copies up front the first time, because of the 100 percent guarantee.

"We were forcing single product onto the buyers," continues Oates, "saying 'Hey, it's 100 percent guaranteed, and you can return it anyway'." This practice has since been altered. However, as Oates points out: "We've told our customers we will take full responsibility for all singles out in the marketplace. We've done that, keeping in mind that certainly we are never going to

allow, even from a promotion and sales standpoint, our singles to go over 50 percent for returns, and if they do go over 50 percent, we have to sit back and analyze our method of operation when it comes to singles,"

There are still thousands of singles being returned, but it's all relative to the changing market. "Sure, there are thousands of singles coming back," continues Oates, "but how many singles are record companies releasing this year, compared to five years ago? A lot of us, whether rightfully or wrongfully, are going after that 4th and 5th single, and in some cases, it worked, and we've been able to score gold, and even platinum singles, which says something about the importance of singles as a promotional vehicle for the album."

Interestingly enough, industry statistics for the month of June, supplied by CRIA, showed shipments of 609,000, over last year's 510,000, an increase of 19 percent. However, the year to date figures revealed a 23 percent decrease in shipments of singles.

For the month of June, there were 3 gold single certifications: Boom Boom (Paul Lekakis), (I Just) Died In Your Arms (Cutting Crew), and Final Countdown (Europe). Four singles were certified as gold in July: Lessons In Love (Level 42), Nothing's Gonna Change My Love (Glenn Medeiros), You

Keep Me Hangin On (Kim Wilde), and I Wanna Dance (Whitney Houston).

For the month of August, WEA has certified 3 gold singles: Who's That Girl (Madonna), La Bamba (Los Lobos), and Always (Atlantic Starr).

It's obvious the one-song format (single) will remain for some time, both as a promotional vehicle and, to a lesser degree, as a sales item. "Adjusting the price of the single, downwards, would increase its importance at retail, and would most certainly attract the cost-conscious consumer." said one industry observer.

Brian Robertson, President of the Video Music Licensing Agency, reports that a newly

restructured license for background/ foreground music services will be introduced Sept. 1st. "The revised licensing structure is designed to provide adequate protection for the copyrights of our member companies while allowing potential

licensees ease of access to their extensive music catalogues," explains Robertson.

Duke Street's Korven moves into film scoring

Duke Street recording artist Mark Korven has had his composition, The Open Window, included on the soundtrack of the film I've Heard The Mermaid's Singing, which was the "official selection" shown at the Director's Fortnight and was the winner of Le Prix De La Jeunesse Award at this year's Cannes Film Festival

The song is also contained on Korven's Ordinary Man album, from which the second single, Telephone, has recently been released.

As well, he wrote the original score for the film in collaboration with Fairlight's Rob Yale, upon the film's musical coordinator John Switzer (Jane Siberry) suggesting Korven's talents to the producer.

Directed by Patricia Rozema, Mermaids opens the Festival of Festivals in Toronto (Sept 10).

The new licence is reportedly based on the annual gross sales volume of the licensee and "represents a single payment per record company for the blanket use of their available catalogue for a 12-month period."

Robertson goes on to point out, "Our industry has been concerned about the widespread illegal exploitation of prerecorded music. With few exceptions, the majority of music you hear in retail stores, restaurants, shopping centres and other commercial establishments is illegally obtained, and it is important that the record companies be given the opportunity of protecting their copyrights."

Olympics Christmas LP released by A&M

A&M will release this October what they describe as "a very special Christmas LP." Titled The Special Olympics Christmas Album, the tracklisting shows 14 holiday favourites by today's top selling artists.

Included are Bruce Springsteen's Merry Christmas, Baby, Whitney Houston's Do You Hear What I Hear, Run, Run Rudolph by Bryan Adams, Madonna's Santa Baby, John Cougar Mellencamp's I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus, U2's Christmas, Baby Please Come Home, and more.

An A&M spokesperson reports that 85 percent of all funds raised will be put back into the country of release through sales of the album, and that 75 percent of the funds will be placed with the Special Olympics programme. As well, 10 percent will be set aside for training, equipment, and travel assistance for Special Olympics atheletes and coaches in that country.

It didn't have the overtness and boasting of the Academy Awards . . . Maybe as Canadians we should boast a little bit more than we do. But not a hell of a lot more'." It might be time to take a look at the Junos and make sure we haven't got to that "overtness and boasting" stage.

For Bon Jovi fans only . . . ??

Bill Paige, of Playboy Magazine, sent me a copy of the latest edition and points out "The Dirty Little Secret That's Bon Jovi", written by Timothy White. Says Paige, "It's a story that may shock some of Bon Jovi's fans, and best of all the names haven't been changed to protect the innocent." (EC: As long as it sells more records!!)

Can you make money in this business? To quote one person I know very well, "Yes, you can make money in this business." It took Bernard Chevry almost a couple of decades to build MIDEM into the most important international music meet in the world, and he sold it for \$5 million. Now, I hear that bunch of disorganized New Yorkers, trying to do the same in the U.S., in a much shorter period of time, have been offered \$2 million by a U.S. trade (EC: I still prefer MIDEM!!)

Jackson's Bad hits the stores Aug. 31

It would appear that "Mister Entertainer" has done it again. The long-awaited Thriller follow-up will be hitting the retail racks along with the majority of the airwaves Aug. 31st.

Al Fletcher and Dave Deeley of the Toronto Branch of CBS, held a listening party for the new Jackson LP (Aug 20) at Toronto's Sutton Place. They requested however, that all reviews been held off until after Aug. 31st., but it would be a crime not to let the industry know what to expect.

Anyone who doubted Jackson's brilliant comeback, may soon be eating their pens. Obviously with a multi-million seller like Thriller the odds of repeating this phenomenon might be difficult. But that's what most critics said after Off The Wall. It's not whether Bad outsells Thriller (I'm predicting it will be a big seller), it's the Michaelmania (dolls, shirts, and posters), the over exposure that may have turned the consumer off.

Bad shows a new Jackson. Like everything else he does, there is an element of surprise, a new look, a new sound and there wasn't any outward signs of disappointment from the more than 200 retail and media listeners. On the contrary, there were signs of complete amazement, with even the anti-Jackson fans swaying and moving their bodies and feet to the dynamic sound of the new material.

The session consisted of 5 tracks from the Bad album (not including the previously released single, I Just Can't Stop Loving You, now Top 10 on the RPM 100 singles chart).

The icing on the cake was the viewing of the video for the second single to be released early in September (I'm not at liberty to let you know the title). The video, along with the single, are definite competitors for anything released from any previous Jackson material, and if the 4 other tracks are any indication of how this new LP should fare, Thriller could be in trouble.

It seems fitting that only Jackson could release an album that could threaten his already multi-million selling record for Thriller. It may be too premature to report, but Bad looks like a real contender, with an appeal encompassing all musical tastes. He has every base covered. Now all that's left to do is watch the charts. And after talking to a few retail and radio personalities (who were lucky enough to attend the listening session), they all agreed on one thing "This LP should be on the top of the charts well through Christmas."

In the Sept. 12 issue of RPM, there will be a more indepth review of the LP, along with retail and radio's initial reaction to Bad.



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

Taking chances pays off for New Regime's new set

"Who was Chris Hughes before Tears For Fears?" asks New Regime's lead vocalist Kevin Connelly. "At some point you have to go against the standard 'track record' thing and trust your instincts," he adds. "It would have been just ridiculous to have somebody come in and rearrange the groundwork that we had already laid with Steve (Webster)."

New Regime have released The Race, their second album, and if the action on their first single is any indication, the band's forthcoming year should be a big one. Producing the set at the Phase One facilities was Billy Idol's ex-bassist Steve Webster, who actually provides the bass throughout, relates drummer Neil Taylor, a co-founding member of the Toronto-based band.

With one minor exception, Webster has indeed no track record, originally hired to work strictly on pre-production. But, as Taylor says, he has something to prove. "Obviously, he wants to do more 'large budget' albums. This is basically his debut." Not only did Webster assist with song structures, but also suggested many guest musicians, and the replacement of several members.

Since the release of their debut, several changes have been made. Joining guitarist Norm McMullen to complete the lineup, are bassist Rob Laidlaw and keyboardist Jim MacDonald; from Johnnie Lovesin and Rational Youth respectively.

"Not to slag Russell," Connelly explains, "but the concept of using the players we had beforehand... I tend to want to give somebody a chance until they prove themselves absolutely incapable and sometimes it takes an objective opinion, like Steve's... to point out the fact that it's just not happening. The idea of trying to accomplish what we did on the album with the players we had, was quite difficult."

With Webster's help, New Regime have matured and become more focussed in their objectives, which has had a pleasant effect on their music, having "toughened up" considerably. The redefining and rehoning process took over five months of preproduction and a further three months of recording. To say the least, the band went "way, way, way over budget," Connelly reveals.

Yet, in order to "maximize the potential of each song," again Connelly's words, guesting musicians included Lisa Dalbello, Peter Fredette and Fonzi Thornton, and more. "We don't think in terms of player's egos," he elaborates. "I have no reason to feel threatened by any other player because I only stand to learn by watching other people do what they do, which may be good or better."

Perhaps the greatest advantage however, accidentally discovered, was their guest's objectivity.

Over the course of recording, the band, as did the record company, lost their own objectivity Connelly continues, something the new faces constantly corrected. "When you

start to lose your objectivity, you start to overscrutinize. When you start to overscrutinize, you can't hear the value of the product. All you can hear is the idiosyncranitic things from one point to another," he maintains.

From the outset, a rock 'n' roll record had been decided upon, ironically at a time when Tears For Fears were dominant on the airwaves. However, it was a decision that caused no apprehension for either Connelly or Taylor because now the music was "coming from within," the latter stresses, "from the heart." Even though the record company expressed some degree of trepidation, "Fear," answers Connelly, when asked what their reaction was during the recording.

"We had to do a 'rock' record. We had to establish ourselves as credible songwriters. We had to find a uniform direction and follow it, whether it's a little scary or not." he concludes. "But, of course, it's going to be scary... if you don't take a chance, then what good are you?"

New Regime have been confirmed to play Toronto's famed El Mocambo (Sept 9), which will be taped by Q107, to be aired two days following the show.

SBK Songs Canada touts Chipkar material

SBK Songs Canada have introduced a unique, direct approach to radio to bring attention to the writing/performance talents of Glenn Chipkar, one of their recent signings. They have mailed Chipkar's single, Need Another Girl, which is housed in a colourful picture sleeve, to radio stations and the press across Canada. The sleeve also contains "a quick biography" of Chipkar, who looked after guitar and keyboard parts on the single which he co-produced with Tim Thorney at Toronto's Metalworks and Manta Sound. "This is a professionally-produced single," stresses Wayne Patton, who heads up the Canadian operation of SBK Songs. "It's ready to go . . . and I'm confident we'll get enough programmer positives on the single to

influence a major label."

Patton is one of the more aggressive in his field and he has been instrumental in guiding several of SBK's Canadian signings to international recognition.

The 25-yr. old Chipkar also funded a video of the song, which is being given good rotation on Video Hits and MuchMusic. "The video only cost me \$12,000." says Chipkar. "I've taken the businessman's approach and trimmed all the fat. I'm quite happy with the video, and I think it does the job . . . clean and neat, and I think that's a major priority with video."


Need Another Girl is, as Chipkar 'describes it, "clean and neat" - a commercial



summer pop song, and his youthful vocal delivery has the necessary charm and impact to attract a following.

It was during 1978 through 1980 when Chipkar was actively involved with various projects at The Fanshawe College of Music. He was studying at the time, at the University of Western Ontario in London where he was accepted into medicine after only two years of pre-meds. He has since passed on the medical profession, and is now pursuing a highly successful career in the real estate business. His priority, of course, is that of a songwriter/recording artist.

It was in 1982 when he first tried his hand at the record business, releasing L.O.V.E. Love Is A 4-Letter Word, which reached No. 5 on CKOC's (Hamilton) chart.







CIRPA again organizes booth at MIDEM

For the 7th consecutive year, the Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA) will organize a booth at MIDEM. This annual international record and music publishing festival will take place in Cannes, France from January 25th to the 29th. There were more than 6,000 delegates from 52 countries registered last year, with over 60 Canadian companies, representing well over 100 Canadian acts.

"Mary Vrantsidis, Program Coordinator, who can be reached at 416-593-1665, notes that those with "finished masters available for licensing or looking to buy or sell songs, or wanting to make international contacts, should consider attending MIDEM '88."

The fee to participate in the Canadian booth is \$2,400 for CIRPA members and \$2,600 for non-members. This covers registration and booth costs. It's expected more than 25 companies will participate in this year's booth. Applications with a deposit of \$1,000 are being accepted now.

It should be noted that financial assistance is available for eligible companies from the Department of Communication's Sound Recording Development Program. Deadline for applications is six weeks before the January date. Those interested should contact the program at 514-283-2873.
