Janik exits CFNY-FM a twelve year association

Liz Janik, Director of Canadian Music Development for Toronto's CFNY-FM102 has left the station to pursue "several personal projects currently in development." She joined the station twelve years ago in a variety of activities on and off the air and was among the original lineup of announcers when the Spirit of Radio campaign was launched in 1979.

As part of her duties as Director of Canadian Music Development, Janik was the Executive Director of the 1988 CASBY Music Awards and the Executive Producer of the 1988 Modern Rock Album. She also hosted The Independent Modern Rock Spotlight, a nightly feature program.

As well, Janik, along with co-producer/host Peter Goodwin, created The Streets of Ontario, considered a "pioneering radio program", in Canada. This program will continue Sunday evenings on the station with a new host to be announced shortly.

"No other radio station in Canada has supported Canadian talent with the same conviction and passion CFNY has demonstrated over the years," said Janik. "My twelve years with CFNY-FM have been the most exciting and fulfilling years any broadcaster could hope for." She concludes with, "It has been a privilege and an honour for me to work with the high calibre team of talented and dedicated people who have made the station part of North American radio history."

Janik and Goodwin will continue to support independent artists through The Independent Network, their feature column in Music Express Magazine. promotion. In 1984 he became Special Project Coordinator in charge of I.R.S. and when I.R.S. initiated its affiliation with MCA Records in 1985, Orescan left A&M to direct the label's growing commitment to the Canadian market.

As Orescan points out, "These are exciting times for I.R.S. The expanded staff, new offices and new long-term MCA distribution agreement provide exciting opportunities for development of the current roster and acquisition of vibrant new Canadian talent." He concludes with, "Whether breaking international acts such as Concrete Blonde or developing domestic projects such as Candi and the Rick Moranis comedy album, we can offer an innovative and aggressive approach to the unique Canadian market."

Fanfare to celebrate fifth anniversary

Fanfare Records will celebrate its fifth anniversary on July 28th. This is a major accomplishment for the small classical label that literally "beat the odds" and survived in an industry that is so rock and pop oriented, there isn't too much room for other music forms.

However, aggressive music industry veteran Julian Rice familiarized himself with the territory and although he started the Fanfare label on a shoestring, he quickly turned heads in the industry, discovering and producing new, classical and serious/pop artists. He also supplied a much-needed vehicle for established artists who had nowhere to to turn for label support. Many artists in the Fanfare roster are now internationally acclaimed. These include cellist Ofra Harnoy, conductors Andrew Davis, Erich Kunzel, Boris Brott and Paul Freeman, contralto Maureen Forrester, flutist Jeanne Baxtresser, pianists John Arpin, Anton Kuerti and Catherine Wilson. the Orford String Quartet and more.

As well, Rice took a successful trip into nostalgia-land, packaging The American Legends, a series of recordings by entertainers of the '20s and '30s, which he parlayed into a top seller for his label.

The preparation of customized releases has also proven to be a viable diversification for the company. This includes a three-year series of educational/musical anthologies produced for the Canadian Music Educators' Association and a Best Of collection of compact discs and cassettes manufactured for the giant A&A Records & Tapes chain.

As Rice nudges his label into its fifth year, he will shortly introduce a new, independently distributed Fanfare International series, expected to offer even more diverse material to the marketplace.


May certifications down drastically over last year

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) reports only nine certifications for May 1989 as opposed to 26 for the same month last year.

The Bon Jovi album, New Jersey leads the way with quintuple platinum. Solo platinum certifications were registered for John Cougar Mellencamp's Big Daddy LP and for Tone Loc's Loc'ed After Dark.

Mellencamp also registered for gold along with Leonard Cohen (I'm Your Man), Yves Duteil (La Langue De Chez-Nous), Sass Jordan (Tell Somebody), Living Colour (Vivid) and New Kids On The Block (Hangin' Tough).

In spite of the low registration, it was interesting to note there was an increase in Cancon, three gold albums (Cohen, Duteil and Jordan) as opposed to one last year where there was one double platinum (Marjo for Celle Qui Va) and one gold (Johanne Blouin for Merci) for French-language acts.

I hope he's as good at intrepretation (of guidelines and procedures) as he is at both official languages, but something tells me he will evolve into an "absentee" chairman, once he discovers how tedious the job is. Watch for the "relegating" of authority for the "unimportant" hearings, but he'll be there for the big, media-attracting hearings. (EC: The odds are that he won't last long enough to understand the Broadcast Act, nor the workings of the CAB . . . !)

I did a quick check of a few Mall outlets and a couple of street stores and I've gotta tell ya ... it's SOFT! The staff are sure catching up on their reading. There hasn't been enough big interest releases to bring the customers into the stores. (EC: If the May stats were shattering ... wait till they show us the June stats ... !)

Speaking of which...! I've heard it more than a couple of times this year . . . press hysteria . . . which causes buyers to panic. I'm up to here with Batman hype. No doubt it's going to be the film of the year, but after the retail pipeline has been stuffed with album product . . . I wonder how much will really be sold. It was probably the number one selling album the first week out, thanks to the dailies . . . but it will take a few weeks for the real sales story to be told. *(EC: So what's wrong with hype . . . if it brings them into the stores?)*

Dave Broadfoot ... a very funny man! I only caught a few minutes of Dave Broadfoot's "uncensored" opening night performance of his Comedy Crusade at Toronto's Bayview Playouse, but what I witnessed was "vintage" Broadfoot. It was a Broadfoot audience, which can be a little unsettling at the best of times, but flying solo, without the Royal Canadian Air Farce, he passed with flying colours. His skits were topical and what timing. He's one of the few Canadian comics who doesn't make me squirm . . unlike that Yuk Yuk's crowd! (EC: Did someone say something . . . ?)

Cancon . . . uhhgh! Little did I realize that when RPM coined the word Cancon, back in the early seventies, that it would become such a source of irritation . . . to broadcasters. The initial feeling by broadcasters when the 30 percent Cancon legislation was brought down was CanCUSSION, and some of them haven't gotten over it yet! What a shock it must have been. Mention Cancon to a broadcaster and it's like waving Bill in front of Harold Ballard. Can someone come up with a more suitable description of what it is we do in this country with our own music. (EC: I've heard it called Beaver Music!)

Toronto's AM 1430 bows new Entertainment Guide

Toronto's AM 1430 launched a new entertainment feature, Doin' The Town, on June 22. The show hosted by 21-year radio veteran Bob Durant, is heard five times each week, at 7:52 am and 4:45 pm Thursdays and Fridays and at 111:15 am Saturdays.

As Durant explains, "The show is designed to bring listeners right up to date on the entertainment scene . . . when it matters the most, heading into and during the weekend."

Durant, who has wide experience in reporting on show business events and wellknown personalities, adds, "We plan to go beyond that and look at the best values available in terms of both money spent and time invested," concluding with, "We'll talk about a broad spectrum of entertaining, commercial and non-profit events, ranging from the best in theatre, dance and music to events like Caravan and others."



"YO Frankie" could be the soundtrack to the movie of Dion's life, the occasionally harrowing details of which are described elsewhere in this issue by Mat Smith, For sure, this LP has a profound autobiographical bias - Dion looking back down the years, evoking memories of growing up tough in the Bronx, his early success with Dion And The Belmonts and the personal disasters that followed, his eventual rehabilitaion, and, most vividly of all, his enduring belief in the sheer glorious abandon of great rock'n roll, the timelessness, the transcendence of this music, its vibrant power and persuasion, its celebratory hump and live, its stinging, immortal resonance.

"Yo Frankie" should be listened to on bright summer days, its music pouring out the windows, into the streets, its melodies and rhythms carried on the air, the sound of an eternal magic, sparkling, clear and free. The star of the show is inevitably Dion's voice after all these years, still one of the most stirring sounds in white pop music, as urgent, breathtaking, hip and wonderful now as it is was on "The Wanderer", nearly three decades ago. Just listen to the blistering phrasing and syllable-stretching vocal acrobatics on the effortlessly bouyant "And The Night Stood Still", the strutting bravado of the title track, the sleek sexiness of "I've Got To Get To You", the poignant intimacy of Tom Wait's lovely "Serenade", which Dion here turns into a hymn to New York.

The other star of this particular show is Dave Edmunds' production, itself a work of no mean genius. Edmunds here contrives some of the most spectacular settings of his illustrious career. The sound of "Yo Frankie" is huge, lush, fantastic; epic without being bombastic, full of ravishing detail. Check the neo-Spector wall-of-sound on "Always In The Rain". the thrilling cascades of "Written On The Subway Wall/Little Star", where Dion's street smart slur is set brilliantly against a cameo vocal from Paul Simon of almost unnatural purity, further illuminated by the producer's own kleig-bright guitar dazzle.

Best of all, though, on an outstanding collection, is the anthemic "King Of The New York Streets", a masterpiece of swaggering melodrama, driven by Terry Williams' battering drums, strafing guitars, pneumatic piano, Dion's utterly delirious lead vocal and Lou Reed's ultra cool backing vocals.

"Who could be hipper than Dion?" Lou asks in his sleeve notes. On this evidence, only a legendary few. "Yo Frankie" is one of the year's great records.

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
Willie P. Bennett makes vinyl return

After twenty years of songwriting and performing, Willie P. Bennett sees the release of his fourth album, The Lucky Ones. His debut effort for Duke Street Records, this album is his first in ten years, and his first to see major distribution.

Bennett previously released on Woodshed Records through a handshake deal with David Essig until, in 1980, Woodshed's publishing arm, Posterity, went into receivership. "When they went under, Posterity held all the publishing on the songs that were on those records," he relates. "Obviously they weren't doing anything with them so I went after them and asked for the publishing back and they wouldn't even reply to my letters. Eventually a friend of mine, who's not an entertainment lawyer, wrote them a letter that said, 'Could you please send us back proof that Willie P. Bennett has signed a contract with you.'

"When it came time for Woodshed to sign over publishing to Posterity, I guess David committed a faux-pas by signing in lieu of me when, in fact, he actually needed my name on the contract," informs Bennett. "They couldn't produce a contract because I'd never signed anything and so, at that point, everything reverted back to me."

Prior to shopping a deal, Bennett began sessions for The Lucky Ones. "The publishing had to get split up in order for me to raise financing for the record," he states, "so Topside Charlie owns 50 percent of the publishing and, at this point, I own 40 percent and the producer of the album

Additional funds were expected from FACTOR, but never materialized. 'One of the reasons I went ahead with the record was that they said, 'Yes, we'll be giving you your money,' and they sent us a letter about a month later that said, 'No, you won't be getting your money, because we don't have any.'

"That was a little bit of a piss-off," declares Bennett. "We were basically right in the middle of recording and I had borrowed all this money from friends and relatives to make the record," he continues. "Essentially I was going to pay them off with the FACTOR money, so basically there's a lot of people sitting around . . . out of their own pocket."

Bennett's tour of A&R departments was a frustrating saga with a happy ending. "We went to all the majors," he remarks, "They're just looking for a sure thing and, of course, there never is a sure thing, not in this business.

"I think that Canadian music executives are very short-sighted," he asserts. "I don't think they look at the long term at all. That's the difference between the Canadian music industry and the American music industry. Perhaps the American music industry can afford to be a little long-sighted. If they believe in you as a product, they will put lots of money, or at least lots of records, behind you.

"Look at The Cowboy Junkies; it's a travesty," he professes. "Bands like Prairie Oyster and Lori Yates have to go down to the States to get signed and the sibling company up here in Canada says, 'Don't tell anybody that you brought it here first and that we refused it'.

"Then we found Duke Street here in Toronto," he reports, "and they said they would love to manufacture and distribute the record for us." Consequently, a one album deal was struck, a deal that has given Bennett the marketing push he lacked previously. "I think they're very supportive of what I'm doing in terms of their dealings with MCA, some of the ads that they're placing and the singles they're putting out," he affirms. "They're working hard."

Bennett also stresses the importance of his recent management agreement with Joanne Smale Productions. "Me trying to do the record and me trying to do the bookings and me trying to keep on top of everything, it just got to be too much," he admits. "I looked back and I hadn't written for six months.

"Joanne is taking care of profiling and getting a lot of the radio things that were out of my reach, getting a lot of radio interviews," he elaborates. "I think that management, at this point, has been really instrumental in getting the kind of promotion we've been getting on this release."

The reduction in his personal workload has given Bennett time for reflection and to develop a five year business plan which provides for four albums, including the current project, over a five year period. "I feel that I've proven myself with this particular record," he states. "Whatever record company gets involved at this point, it will have to be an equal responsibility in terms of economics. I want them to pay for the making of the record because I know that they can get their money back."

Furthermore, Bennett cites his ultimate goal as "some kind of decent publishing deal where I can have my songs recorded by other artists. It's not so much that it's lucrative. In its own way it provides a certain amount of immortality. It's like approvals from your peers.

"When someone else thinks they can sing one of your songs," he concludes, "It means that not only have you said this thing for yourself, but you've said it for a lot of other people."

All the artists donated their time and talent to the Hall of Fame.

Throughout the evening, top country radio personalities from CKGL Kitchener, CHAM Hamilton, BX-93 London, CKNX Wingham, CKTY Sarnia and CHOO Ajax announced the acts.

Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame T-shirts, hats, founding sponsorships and buttons were offered for sale and donated records and tapes from MCA, RCA/BMG, Quality Records, and Capitol Records were used in promotional packages.

June bookings heavy for Mushroom studios

New Jersey's Skid Row booked time to record a song for an upcoming anti-drug album titled Make A Difference. The song, Holiday In The Sun, was produced by Bruce Fairbairn and engineered by Mike Fraser. Tilde Fiorda assisted. Other bands lending an assist to this project were rockers Bon Jovi and Russia's Gorky Park.

CRIA's May statistics indicate downward trend

Although the net value of sales for Year To Date show a 6 percent increase (\$130,042,000 over last year's \$122,334,000), the Canadian Recording Industry Association's statistics for May of 1989 show a definite and worrisome decline in across-the-board shipments of all configurations except compact discs. In spite of an increase of 32 percent in net shipments for compact disc product over the same period last year, and the same percentage gain in Year to Date shipments, the dismal showing of vinyl product and cassettes resulted in a 28 percent overall loss for the same period this year and a 4 percent increase for Year to Date shipments. Dollar value for the month was down 17 percent (\$19,048,000 as opposed to \$22,848,000 for the same period last year), but up 6 percent (\$130,042,000) in net value of sales for Year to Date figures (\$122,334,000 in 1988).

The future of vinyl is very questionable, and with the poor showing by album, 12'' and 7'' single shipments, down 86 percent, 24 percent and 39 percent respectively over last May, it's expected that one and perhaps two majors may shortly announce the discontinuing of the manufacturing of some vinyl product. Gary Rhodes booked time to produce We Are Proud, the Celebration '90 Theme song. This single will be promoted in twenty-two countries with proceeds being donated to Aids Vancouver and the Persons With Aids Society of B.C.. The Celebration '90 Cultural Festival and Gay Games III is being promoted under the auspices of the Pacific Foundation for the Advancement of Minority Equality. Al Rodger engineered the session with Tilde Fiorda assisting.

Valdy also booked time in the studio for a country folk session with engineer Keith Stein. This self-produced song will be included on a future album release.

Engineer Si Garber of Goldrush Recording Company was in the studio with local artist Bill Costin, who wrote, produced and performed vocals and piano for an album session of contemporary and traditional Yukon music. Entitled Secret Of The North, the album will be released on Dogwood Discs, an independent label, and will be marketed primarily for the Yukon territory.

Seattle filmmaker Alec Carlin was in with composer Robert Mindon to record what Nicol describes as "an unusual score" for an experimental film shot in 16mm. All the sounds were created using homemade and non-traditional instruments such as kitchenware, beer bottles, hoses, etc.

Local band Bolero Lava were in to record a four song demo with engineer Greg Reely. Paul Hyde produced. He also wrote, and co-produced with Terry Frewer, a song for Sandy Wilson's film California Dreaming (a sequel to her Canadian film My American Cousin). The song is titled On The Day That I Go and was engineered by Greg Reely.

Barney Bentall & The Legendary Hearts were asked to write another song for California Dreaming and returned to the studio to record Restless Dreamer. Rob Porter and Ken Marshall engineered.

Roy Forbes (aka Bim) booked time to demo several country songs with top local musicians Chris Nordquist, Laurence Knight, Dan Smith and Sue Leonard. Rolf Hennemann engineered.

Local industrial dance rock band Skinny Puppy is currently in the studio working on their fifth album for Nettwerk Productions.



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
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Q-100 FM Victoria rockin' with RockToria

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
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
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
