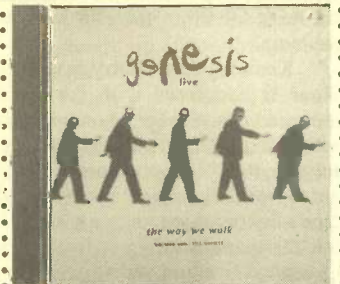

World's Bob Stone says indies should consolidate

Bob Stone has been an integral part of Canada's independent record industry for almost twenty-five years. His company, World Records was first launched as a release label. The company later moved into the more lucrative servicing sector.

Although Stone has become quite successful with institutional-type work from government and religious organizations, servicing the independent record industry still accounts for more than 48 per cent of his business.

Knowing the industry as well as he does, Stone is concerned with the future of the independents, most of whom are operating on a shoestring. "If the independents are going to survive, they'll have to consolidate. They've got to work closer together and develop some type of networking, not only for distribution but for manufacturing as well. They're all trying to do it alone, and no one is doing a very good job."

Stone does allow that there has been some movement with the majors this past year in picking up independent productions. "But I think that has come about because the majors haven't had the budgets and it's been a source of cheap product."

Stone is also concerned with the number of provincial recording associations that have been set up. "These organizations are fostering provincial protectionism. They're not looking at the record industry from a national basis. They're not competing nationally, only within their own borders. Sure, as an information source, they can be effective, but they're not

finding out what's going on across the country, and that's going to hurt the independents. In fact we see this happening now."

Independents, who have been somewhat reluctant to move into the CD mode, are now indicating more acceptance of the format over the cassette. "There are a lot of people who are still very hesitant to move into compact discs. Even though we're offering packages of 500 CDs to begin with."

Cassettes are obviously on the decline. "This is the first year where I've noticed a substantial downswing, and I'm not looking at gross numbers of units shipped, but of new releases.

"I think, over the years, cassettes have gotten a bad rap over quality that probably, in a lot of cases, isn't justified. But certainly in some it was."

Stone also faults the broadcasters for the declining cassette market. When vinyl became obsolete, broadcasters didn't want a single on a cassette. This resulted in the advent of CD compilations, which I think now has started to run its course."

Stone, who never became involved in CD compilations, is outspoken in his criticism

"It has taken a long time for us to finally have Lyman with us in an official, full-time capacity and we are very pleased to be announcing his appointment."

MacInnis, a native of Prince Edward Island, has been associated with Balmur and its artists in a business management capacity since its inception in 1971. Prior to his Balmur appointment, MacInnis was president and CEO of John Labatt Entertainment Group, responsible for such companies as TSN (The Sports Network), Toronto Blue Jays, Dome Productions, and Supercorp Entertainment.

While a senior partner at the international accounting firm Deloitte & Touche, MacInnis served as president and CEO of both the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ontario and the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants.

MacInnis also has an extensive history as an author (Get Smart, Make Your Money Count), columnist (Toronto Star, Financial Times), radio and television business personality (CFRB, CBC, CBC-TV, CTV), and as a public speaker, specializing primarily in financial economic and political matters.

of this configuration. "I think people are starting to realize that if the first three cuts are bad, probably the broadcaster won't look at the fourth one."

The independents are also going to have to deal with the new Digital Compact Cassette (DCC), and Sony Mini-Discs. With penetration of CD hardware still hovering around the 26 per cent mark, and the release of the DCC and Mini-Disc hardware set to pave the way for the software, Stone sees a growing problem. "When I started in this business, the hardware companies didn't run the record industry, and as long as we have the situation now where music has become secondary to the hardware, who knows what it will be next month or two years down the road?"

"These are all factors the independent industry will have to address. If they worked closer together and consolidated some of their operations, their chance of survival would be much greater. This is a very fast moving and highly technological business. The thinking within the industry, particularly with the majors, has changed noticeably over the past two years, and it's going to change even more."

Rita MacNeil's new album hits platinum in eight days

Rita MacNeil's new Capitol album, Thinking Of You, went platinum in Canada (100,000 units) only eight days after release. This is by far the fastest moving album in her six-album career.

MacNeil's previous albums, Flying On Your Own, Reason To Believe, Rita, Home I'll Be, and her Christmas album, Now The Bells Ring, all released on the Virgin label, have sold in excess of 1.3 million units worldwide.

The latest album entered the Top 20 of the RPM Albums chart only three weeks after release.

Bring It On Home To Me, the first single from the new album, has scored major crossover action and is charted on the RPM Country 100, the RPM 100 Hit Tracks and AC charts.

MacNeil recently made box office news, grossing close to half-a-million dollars for seven dates (RPM - Nov. 21/92).

Ladies and Grapes dominate 1992 CASBYs

There were no major surprises among the winners at the 12th annual CASBY (Canadian Artists Selected By You) Awards at Toronto's Showline Studios on Nov. 15.

The Barenaked Ladies, who smashed records with sales of their independent cassette before signing with New York-based Sire Records and hitting the top of the album charts with their debut disc *Gordon*, took honours for Favourite Live Act, Favourite Debut Album

Alanis hitting the road to promote new MCA album

After burrowing away in the studio for months writing and recording with producer Leslie Howe, Alanis has emerged to promote her new MCA album, *Now Is The Time*.

The album maintains the same dance/pop sound that propelled her self-titled debut to platinum-plus status, but the 18-year-old Ottawa native says the disc also displays her broadened vocal abilities. "I feel a lot more in control of my voice," she says.

Alanis has also been working on her acting and dancing, as evidenced by her video for the current single, *An Emotion Away*. The

video, shot in Rome, has been getting good play on MuchMusic. Alanis also played herself in an upcoming made for TV movie starring Corey Haim as an aspiring songwriter.

The 1991 Juno award winner for Most Promising Female Vocalist also hosted a YTV special called *Borderline High*, which urged kids to stay in school. Alanis herself graduated from high school in June and has plans to go to university after taking a few years off to concentrate on her music career.

Alanis is an avid hockey fan. She performed at the 1992 NHL Hockey Awards last spring and also took part in week-long activities in her home town leading up to the opening game of the Ottawa Senators, where she had the honour of singing the national anthem. She will also be singing the anthem at the All-Star game in Montreal.

After completing her promotional duties, Alanis will begin assembling a band that will tour with her in the spring and summer. She has been talking to people about the possibilities of opening for a couple of well-known international performers.

and Favourite Group/Artist. Michael Phillip-Wojewoda took the prize for Favourite Music Producer for his work on *Gordon*.

On a night dominated by acts with the money and hype afforded to them through a major label deal, the Ladies were quite generous in heaping praise on three other lesser-known groups. They paid tribute to the Rheostatics (who were shut out in the Favourite Writer/Lyricists and Favourite Album categories), The Waltons (among the three acts claiming second prize for Favourite Debut Album), and The Lowest Of The Low (who were inexplicably left off the ballots altogether).

"We're not biting the hand that feeds, we just realize that there is room for talented, young unsigned acts out there," said Ladies' lead singer, Steven Page.

The Grapes Of Wrath, signed to Nettwerk Records (distributed by Capitol), took two of the most coveted awards: Favourite Song for *I Am Here*; and Favourite Album for *These Days*.

Blue Rodeo's Greg Keelor and Jim Cuddy won for Favourite Writer/Lyricists, and the brother and sister team of Rebecca and Kenny Baird were awarded the trophy for Favourite Album Art for their work on Blue Rodeo's current Warner album, *Lost Together*.

Sloan, DGC's next big thing, were voted Favourite New Group/Artist from Eastern Canada. Pure, signed to a juicy international deal with Reprise (Warner), were named Favourite New Group/Artist from Western

The Original Lightfoot released by Capitol

Capitol Records has released a three compact disc or two cassette boxed set called *The Original Lightfoot*.

Containing 59 tracks, the material was taken from five albums released by Gordon Lightfoot on the United Artists label from 1965 through 1969.

These were the years when Lightfoot established himself across Canada and the United States as one of the decade's top folk singers. In 1965 he was voted Folk Singer of the Year in the RPM Gold Leaf Awards, an annual magazine poll that went on to become the Juno Awards. He won in this category for five successive years.

Included in the release are tracks from *Lightfoot* (*I'm Not Saying*, *Steel Rail Blues*, *Ribbon Of Darkness*, *Early Mornin' Rain*), *The Way I Feel* (*Home From The Forest*, *Rosana*, *Canadian Railroad Trilogy*, *The Way I Feel*), *Sunday Concert* (*Ballad of Yarmouth Castle*, *Boss Man*, *Bitter Green*, *The Lost Children*), *Back Here On Earth* (*Long Thin Dawn*, *The Circle Is Small*, *The Gypsy*, *If I Could*), and *Did She Mention My Name* (*Black Day In July*, *Pussywillows*, *Cat-tails*, *Did She Mention My Name*, *Does Your Mother Know*).

Now in the stores, the boxed set carries a suggested list of \$29.98 for the cassette package and \$39.98 for the CD configuration.

Canada. And Moxy Früvous, the quasi-cappella group that seems to be popping up in one way or another all over Toronto these days, won the hardware for Favourite New Group/Artist for Central Canada.

The Moxies also provided one of the evening's highlights with a sarcastic little ditty about the recent staff cuts and changes at the CASBY's host radio station, CFNY FM102. Pure and Sons Of Freedom also checked in with a couple of energized two-song sets during the ceremonies. Sara Craig, a finalist for Favourite Female Vocalist, had jaws agape for her stunning rendition of Joni Mitchell's *This Flight Tonight*.

Despite Craig's performance, Sarah McLachlan (Nettwerk/Capitol) was named Favourite Female Vocalist. The Favourite Male Vocalist prize went to The Tragically Hip's Gord Downie. The Hip are currently in the midst of a sold-out national tour so Downie's award was accepted by Rick Wharton, MCA's Ontario promotions and marketing representative. Wharton thanked the packed studio soundstage on behalf of the band and got an early plug in for next year's awards by saying Downie would "appreciate it Fully Completely."

King Apparatus came out on top in the hotly contested race for Favourite Reggae/Ska Group/Artist. A band that wasn't nominated this year in that category, Newfoundland's *Pressure Drop*, entertained people with their infectious reggae from the Rock during a mini-concert in the studio lobby before the awards presentations began.

Teenage Head, who stole away the Favourite Group and Favourite Album honours back at the inaugural event in 1981 (when the awards were known as the U-Knows), received a standing ovation when they were given the Special Achievement Award. Frankie Venom even wore dress pants to mark the occasion.

Halifax's Sloan, whose members later displayed a keen knowledge of the life and times of Donnie Most (Ralph Malph from *Happy Days*) at a post-CASBYs bash at the SkyDome Hotel, did their best to get a relatively listless crowd aroused with their hour-long set to close off the evening. They had mixed success.

With the rumours of CFNY changing its format that have been swirling around for the past few months, this could have been the last CASBY evening -- at least in its present form. But let's keep our fingers crossed that it wasn't.

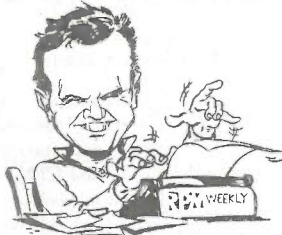
Subway Elvis showcases to promote his album

Glen Stace wants long career like his veteran producer

Since moving to Vancouver from his native Saskatoon a couple of years ago, and being nominated as most promising male vocalist for a handful of different awards, Glen Stace has become someone to look out for on the Canadian music scene.

Stace is signed to Warner Music Canada through Bumstead Productions, the company run by his manager, Larry Wanagas. K.D. Lang, Mo'Nique (Pursuit of Happiness) and Colin James are other Wanagas discoveries, so his profile and experience in the industry should serve well to further the 31-year-old singer/songwriter/guitarist's career. But just up to a point, Stace says.

"I've still got to make my own mark based on the merits of my songs and performances. He can't get up on stage and perform for me every night and he doesn't write the songs."

The songs Stace writes tackle issues and deal with emotions that most people have faced in their lives. This 'everyman' style of writing comes naturally to the low-key Stace, who was born the son of a preacher.

"I don't like writing songs about myself," he says. "I like writing about people who I think are interesting and situations that are interesting. My little old world isn't important."

The songs on Stace's 1991 debut, *Buddha Hotel*, were written over a period of three or

Bobby Brown to Toronto for new album promotion

Bobby Brown swung through Toronto recently to talk to the media, receive some hardware and take part in an autograph signing at HMV's flagship store.

At a news conference at Klub Max, MCA president Ross Reynolds presented Brown with a triple platinum award for 1988's *Don't Be Cruel* album, and a platinum award for his current disc, *Bobby*.

Brown promised that he would be touring through Canada in the spring and that he and the other members of his former group, *New Edition*, would be recording an album when all of the work surrounding their solo projects was completed.

Brown also talked about how his highly publicized marriage to Whitney Houston. "We help each other with each other's careers," he said. "Just being in love helps us."

After the success of *Don't Be Cruel*, Brown invested a lot of his money in a state-of-the-art studio in Atlanta. The studio has already seen the recording of *Arrested Development's* and *Kriss Kross's* albums, and Brown himself plans on producing a number of acts for his Triple B (MCA) record label there.

four years. Three of them -- *Runaround*, *What Do You Do* and *Runaway Train* -- became Top 20 hits at Canadian album radio. For the new album, *Road to Damascus*, Stace didn't have the luxury of choosing the best songs he had written over an extended period. Seven of the album's 10 tracks were written after the release of *Buddha Hotel*, and that suits Stace just fine.

"When I write songs, I write a bunch. I get into this zombie, mythical state of mind where you hear everything and see everything differently.

"So there's fluidity in the record. The sound has sort of matured. It's a little more focused I think."

Stace also surrounded himself with some talented people while recording the aggressive guitar-based rock music on *Road to Damascus*. Drummer Pat Steward used to play with Bryan Adams, while guitarist Kurt Scheffer has gained notoriety through his work with Alannah Myles. "He was the guitar player I've looked for all my life. He's sort of a clone of myself, only better," says Stace, who plays guitar, mandolin and keyboards in addition to singing lead and background vocals on the album.

Veteran producer Barry Beckett, who first made a name for himself with the Muscle Shoals rhythm section, also brought impressive credentials to the recording sessions. Stace says he was intimidated by Beckett at first, both because of his imposing physical presence and his past work with such artists as Bob

National Film Board releases Peterson video

The National Film Board of Canada has announced the video release of *In The Key Of Oscar*, an intimate portrait of Oscar Peterson.

The video charts Peterson's rise from a Montreal teenage "boogie woogie" sensation to an international celebrity as one of the jazz world's most accomplished musicians.

Many of those whom Peterson met along the way through several difficult years share their memories. These include Ella Fitzgerald, Dizzy Gillespie, Quincy Jones, Norman Granz and Herbie Hancock.

The film was produced by Elitha Peterson Productions Inc./Vocal Vision Productions in association with the National Film Board of Canada and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. Executive producer credits go to Sara Levinson, Sylvia Sweeney and Dennis Murphy (NFB), with Sylvia Sweeney and Michael Alder (NFB) taking producer credits.

The video is available through all National Film Board outlets, and is being offered for a special introductory price of \$19.95 plus taxes until Jan. 31.

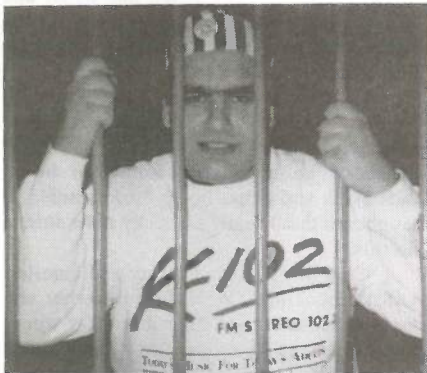

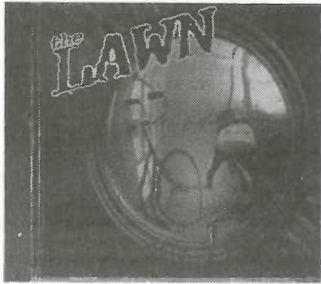

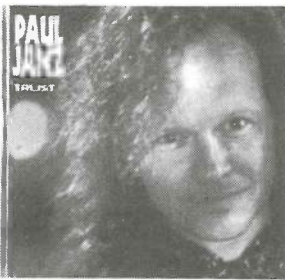

THE LAWN - Rock

 The members of The Lawn, in one form or another, have been well-respected members of the independent Toronto music scene for the past decade. And now they've finally released their first album with the benefit of distribution by a major label. Lead singer Gord Cummings' singular vocal style has been compared to bagpipes, but that's not a negative thing. And his slide guitar playing gives the music a bit of a country edge and acts as a perfect complement to Patrick Gregory's many guitar talents. Richard Gregory is rock solid on bass and both former drummer Mike Bush and current stick welder Lonnie James ensure a steady, pounding beat on their respective tracks. Driving guitars propel the first single and video, Light Pours. Thinking About Nothing, Catwalk Slip, Hey is for Horses, Debts, Rain and, especially, #51 are all winners. Two instrumentals, F# Instrumental and (I Work in a) Hotel, are effective in breaking up the album and allowing you to ponder what has gone on before. This is a collection of very strong songs that are even stronger in the group's entertaining live shows. I hope this album makes The Lawn rich and famous but, because their music is difficult to categorize (as radio programmers so dearly like to do), I doubt if they will. - SM



PAUL JANZ - Pop
Trust
Attic - ACD 1365-Q
 Janz has been one of Canada's most successful singer/songwriters since releasing his solo debut in 1985. Radio has picked up on the first single, Wind Me Up, but sales of Trust have been pretty soft. Too bad, because Janz has assembled another above average collection of mainstream pop songs. Workin' For My Baby is an energetic R&B-influenced number. Janz's children, Colin and Kelsey, sing background vocals on Calling My Personal Angel. King Pin Cool is a tongue in cheek poke at rock stars' egos. On Prince Of Pain King Of Fools, a song about being burnt in a relationship, Janz sounds like Glenn Frey. Take Me Back (On The Docks) is a classic pop song about trying to relive an early romance. Get Arrested decries crooked politicians. You're Never Alone, a song of reassurance inspired by his work for World Vision in Brazil, was co-written by Janz and his wife, Elizabeth. Praying is a devotional ballad which features a high school choir from Abbotsford, B.C. - SM

raucous first single, Twister, a great party tune featuring the slide guitar mastery of Jimmy Amason. The ubiquitous Ken Greer contributes some deft pedal steel playing to complement Ross Nykiforuk's keyboards on All This Man Can Do. Believe, a slower song about love gone sour, and the bluesy Black Cat are other album highlights. Bassist Jay Semko, guitarist Bryan Potvin and guitarist Merl Bryck trade off on lead vocals and all three (plus drummer Don Schmid) also get their share of writing credits. With 15 songs clocking in at around 65 minutes, this is a long album. Perhaps a few less songs might have been a better idea because it can sometimes be hard to sustain a degree of consistently high quality for that long a period. - SM

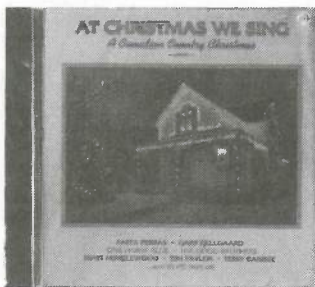

 Young has always been one to skip from one style of music to another from album to album and, after the heavy guitar and feedback of his last four albums with Crazy Horse, you had to expect that he'd pull another change of direction on us. On Harvest Moon, Young goes back to the sounds of 1972's Harvest, his most commercially successful album ever. And beyond playing the same brand of country influenced folk rock, Young is also using the same backing band that he used on Harvest, the Stray Gators. Linda Ronstadt, James Taylor, Nicolette Larson and arranger Jack Nitzsche also make their presences felt. Radio has already picked up on War Of Man. Ben Keith's steel guitar is the focal point of Unknown Legend. Young shows that he hasn't lost his chops on the harmonica on the heart-felt From Hank To Herdica. You and Me is an update of Harvest's Old Man and features Young on guitar and singing in harmony with Larson. Old King, a campy country song about Young's dearly departed dog, and Dreamin' Man are two other songs of note. But overall, while many people will enjoy comparing Harvest Moon to Harvest, the former unfortunately can't match the overall excellence of its predecessor. - SM



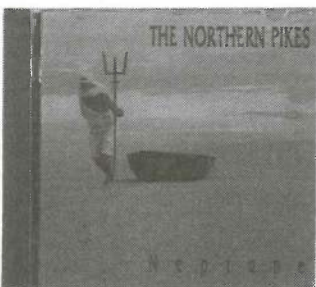
