Surprise unplugged tour/Kumbaya dates announced for EMI's Tom Cochrane

EMI Music Canada has announced the return of Tom Cochrane on the road across Canada with a special acoustic performance tour, set to kick off on October 5th. The show, in which Cochrane will be solely accompanied on the stage by twin guitarists Bill Bell and Steve Worall, will feature unplugged versions of songs from the singer's lengthy career. Aside from a taping of the October 10 gig at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre for the CBC Television DuMaurier Concert Series, Cochrane will be performing live on MuchMusic on September 12 (6pm EST) as part of the 1996 Kumbaya Tour. He is to join the festival on the three dates that comprise the eastern leg of the tour and will be performing in Saint John, Halifax, and St. John's.

Cochrane's newest album, *Ragged Ass Road*, has reached platinum sales in Canada and has yielded three Top Ten hits at radio.

PEI musicfest dedicated to Gene MacLellan

A one-day musicfest, billed as the Gene MacLellan Song Festival, will take place at Victoria on Prince Edward Island's south shore on Sept. 21.

Organizer Jack McAndrew points out that the one-day event is "dedicated to the music and the memory of one of the Island's favourite adopted sons. It was here where the then unknown composer launched his career that would make him an international force in pop and country music."

MacLellan first gained international recognition as a composer with the writing of *Snowbird*, which launched Anne Murray's career, and which was covered by hundreds of other singers and instrumentalists, including Elvis Presley.

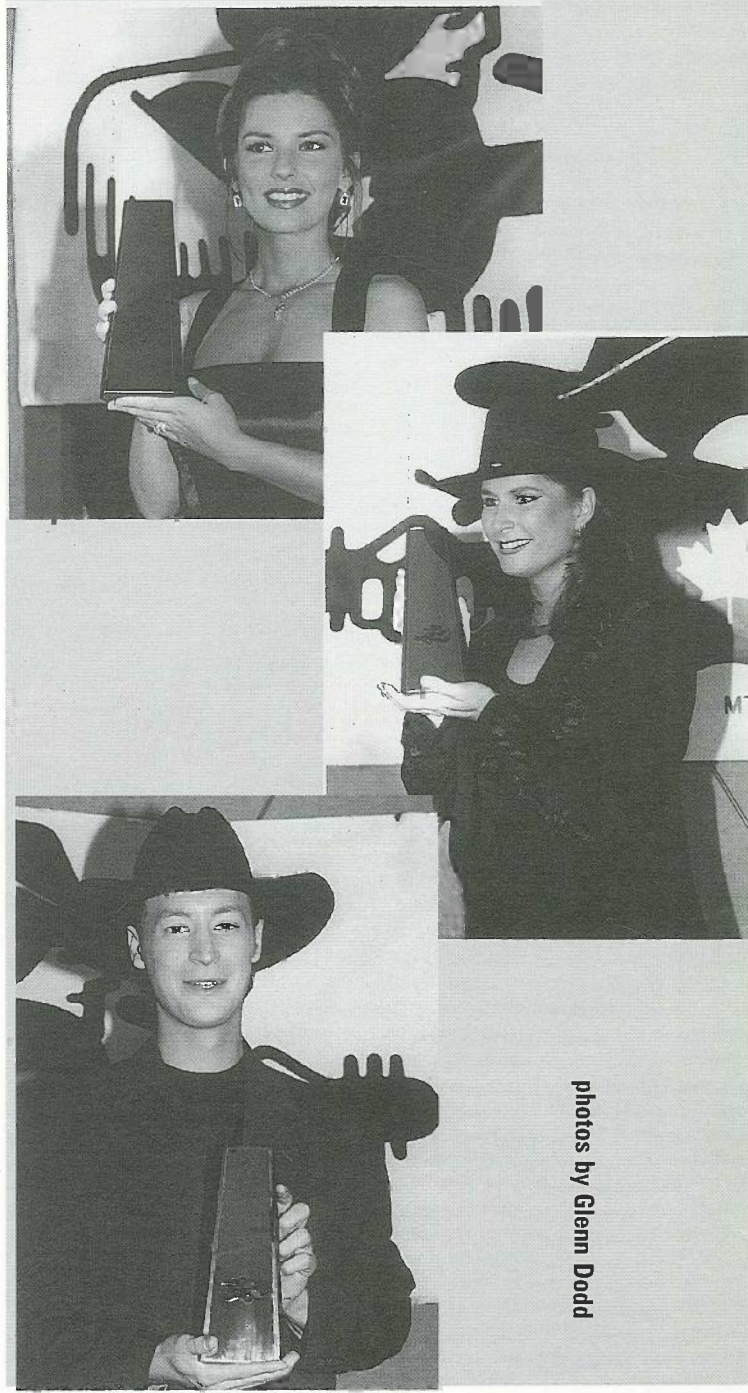
The second hit composition for MacLellan was the gospel hymn *Put Your Hand In The Hand*, which gave

international recognition to fellow maritimers, *Ocean*, and which reputedly sold more sheet music copies than any other song published in North America over the past 50 years.

MacLellan's songs will be heard during a two-hour Tribute Concert, emceed by Jackie Rae, which will close the day of homage to the popular composer who died a tragic death in his home in the rural area of western Prince Edward Island on Jan 19, 1995. He was 54 years of age.

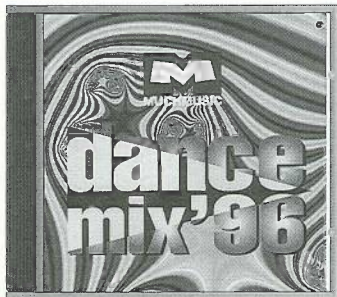

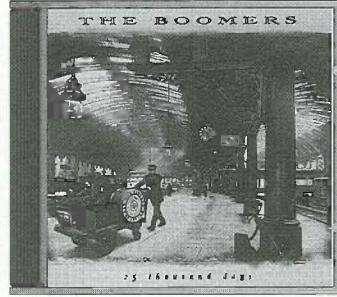

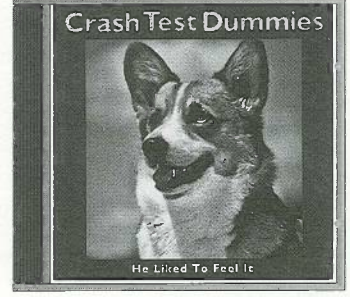

Canada's best in country music

It was a rewarding evening for the Mercury/Polydor crew, headed up by Doug Chappell, for the industry endorsement of their country side when Shania Twain and Terri Clark each scored three wins at this year's CCMA awards show held in Calgary (Sept. 9)

The dazzling, fast-paced television presentation, again produced by Gord James, paraded the best in Cancon country, both in performances and in winners to a television audience that's expected to top two million. Once again, James called on a humongous lighting system that turned the setless stage into a spectacular sea of colour.

Twain was obviously overcome at the audience reaction to her winning best female vocalist, best video for (If You're Not In It For Love) I'm Outta Here, and for the topping, the NCN fans' choice entertainer of the year.

Medicine Hat-born Clark was in her element, and she too was almost at a loss for words as each of her three wins were announced. Dressed in black, with her traditional black stetson, she was close to tears when she accepted her first award, best single for Better Things To Do, and continued to show emotion as she picked up the award for best album for her self-titled release, and the Vista rising star award.

A somewhat reserved Charlie Major proved that in spite of the much younger competition that has come along, he still reigns supreme in the male vocal field, once again capturing this prize, as he has over the past several years. Major's latest Arista release, Waiting On You, bullets into the #15 position this week on the RPM Country 100.

Prairie Oyster also weathered the youth storm, again being endorsed as Canada's best group. This was the band's sixth win in this category. Fittingly, the band's fiddle and mandolin player John P. Allen, dedicated the award to the memory of the father of bluegrass, Bill Monroe, who passed away the day before in Nashville at the age of 85. Oyster has also continued to maintain constant chart status over their 20-year career. Their new Arista release, Unbelievable Love, moves into the Top 30 (#28) after only four weeks on the chart.

Newcomer Paul Brandt won the SOCAN song award for his Reprise debut, My Heart Has A

History, which he co-wrote with Mark Sanders. Calgarian Brandt, who was nominated in six categories, has already gained industry and fan interest on both sides of the border. At a party at Teatro's in Calgary the night before the awards show, Warner Music Canada executives presented Brandt with a gold award for his album, Calm Before The Storm. His SOCAN award winning song hit #1 on the RPM Country 100 (April 29/96) and his current release, I Do, also hit #1 (August 26/96).

The CCMA artist hall of honour award went to veteran country songstress Myrna Lorrie, who graciously accepted, paying tribute to those who paved the way for her early career in country music.

Larry Delaney, publisher of the Ottawa-based Canadian Country Music News, was honoured with the Stan Klees industry builder hall of honour award. The award was presented by Sylvia Tyson. The highly-respected Delaney was unable to attend, but sent along a videoed thank you.

Garth Brooks, who won the top selling album award (foreign or domestic) for Fresh Horses, also took part in the Calgary awards by way of a satellite feed from his concert in Saint John. True to form, when the country superstar was handed his award, in his blatantly honest manner, he said "Nobody sold more albums than you, Shania, As long as I know that, and you know that, I'll accept this award in your honour." He then went on to meticulously pay tribute to all the nominees up for the NCN fans' choice entertainer of the year award (Terri Clark, Charlie Major, Prairie Oyster, Shania Twain, Michelle Wright), before opening the envelope revealing Twain as the winner.

Among the performers on the Calgary show were Paul Brandt, who opened the show, Michelle Wright, Lisa Brokop, Duane Steele, Prairie Oyster, Terri Clark, Charlie Major, Patricia Conroy, a medley of songs by the Poverty Plainsmen, Stephanie Beaumont with James Owen Bush, Farmer's Daughter, and the Johner Brothers, and Twain, who closed the show. Celebrating its tenth year on television with the CTV network, the show was hosted by Paul Gross of the weekly TV series Due South.

The show, which will be edited down, is scheduled to be rebroadcast Sept. 14 on TNN (The Nashville Network).

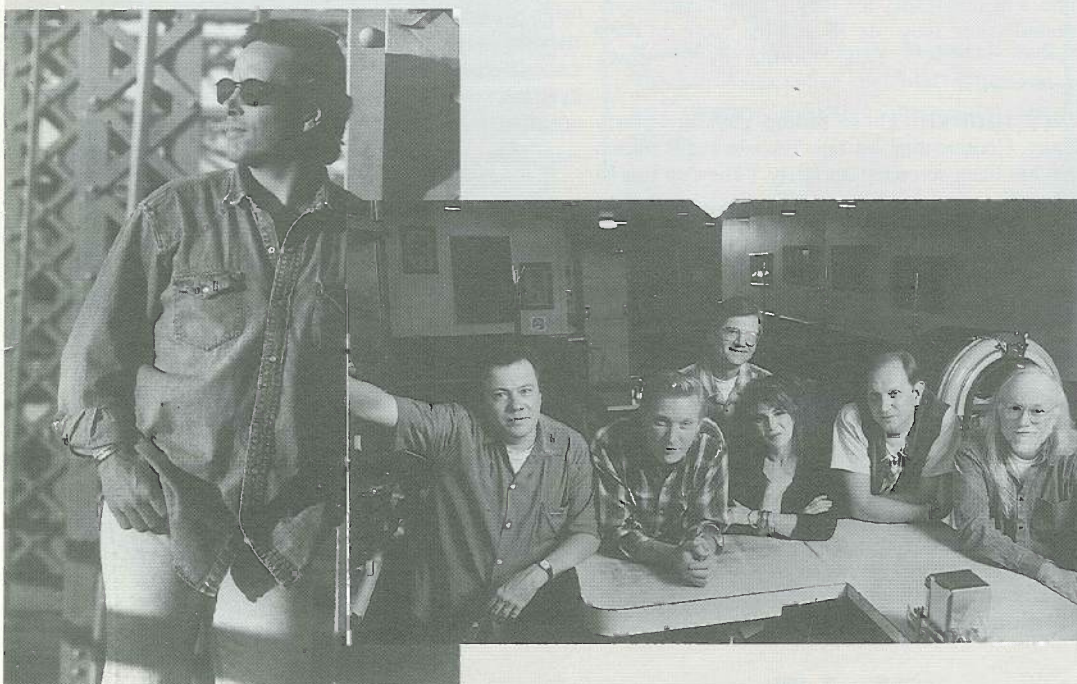

WALT SAYS . . . !

Calgary hits a nerve!!! Canada's country star system was brighter than it's ever been as producer Gord James, bathed performers, presenters and winners in a sea of colour. Last year's Hamilton audience paled in comparison to the enthusiastic rush of energies displayed by the Calgary audience.

The excitement was electrifying. Have we ever looked so good? I'll be surprised if the ratings don't top the two million mark. Opening with Paul Brandt, the bright-faced youngster from Calgary, set the pace that wound down too soon with an incredible performance by Shania Twain. You've got to hand it to the CCMA people. They know how to put on a show, and the country music week that preceded the show? Again, it was that Calgary attitude that made the four days so successful. I hope they can get that same enthusiasm in Hamilton next year. (EC: Move it east about 35 miles and you'll see enthusiasm!!!)

Politics? Noooo!!! Looking straight into the camera on the satellite feed from his concert in Saint John, Garth Brooks summed up his winning the best selling album award with, "Nobody sold more albums than you, Shania. As long as I know that, and you know that, I'll accept this award in your honour." It was good television to have Brooks present the NCN fans' choice award, which went to Twain. But it was obvious he knew he hadn't outsold Twain. (EC: It was all in the envelope!!!)

Speaking of Garth Brooks!!! This guy is so popular, selling out major-size arenas everywhere he goes, howcum music directors at other than country formatted stations don't play his stuff? Not everybody who goes to his concerts are country radio listeners. I did a short survey at his Toronto concert. Of the people I talked to 48 per cent listened to country radio. Now, get this, 52 per cent said they listened to the MIX 99.9, CHUM-FM, CHFI-FM, and even Q107. Now, what does that tell you. (EC: Survey says!!!) And, like any good researcher, I'll even reveal the numbers that represented my survey. I asked 12 people if they listened to country radio. So, there you go. Isn't that revealing? Now, if I had conveniently left out how many people I had asked, wouldn't those figures be devastating to country radio? (EC: Well, 12 out of 23,000 ain't bad!!!)

Freak-out time!!! After a record executive, who will remain unnamed, at least in this column, caught the showcase of a female trio at the Calgary country bash, he was pissed off that his A&R people hadn't even talked to them, and that they may sign to a major right under his nose. (EC: What's new???)

NCN is now CMT Canada!!! The CMT folks came up in force from Nashville to take part in a real swell party at The Docks on Toronto's harbour. It was changeover time, NCN bows out for CMT Canada, which went to air Sept. 14. Now, this was a party to beat all parties. Looking at the ragged looking bunch of country people who had tumbled off the plane from Calgary only hours before CMT's showtime, it would have been better to have

the party in Calgary. Most of them were in the bag, but they partied just the same. Everybody was there. Shania Twain, Charlie Major, Prairie Oyster, Jimmy Rankin, Jake Leiske of Farmer's Daughter, Lisa Brokop, Terri Clark, Jason McCoy, Lawnie Wallace, Duane Steele, and a whole bunch more. It was kind of tough on them too. They made themselves

available for photos and autograph signings, and most stayed for the whole three hours. Gord James was there with his camera guys, taping a special for CMT, to be part of the launch. Lots of laughs too. NCN president John Wright was so nervous in making a presentation to Shania Twain, he forgot where the award was, and Paul Alofs and Deane Cameron, who came to his rescue, weren't much better. (EC: There's something about that Shania!!!)

Celtic humour??? Shared a limo from the CMT party with Jimmy Rankin. Get him away from his sisters, and he's one funny dude. Roving Gypsy Boy . . . that's him. We discovered we have something in common. We have the same people. (EC: That's Cape Breton humour!!!)

Only in America??? Rumour has it that the Wal-Mart stores in the US, have turfed out Sheryl Crow's new album. Apparently, one of the tracks, Love Is A Good Thing, didn't sit too well with some of the people at the giant discounter. The lyrics in question are "Watch out sister, watch out brother, watch our children as they kill each other with a gun they bought at the Wal-Mart discount stores." Hot, newsy stuff, right? We have Wal-Mart in Canada, which doesn't sit too well with most of our established record store retailers, but they don't sell guns, I don't think. So, being curious, I called Wal-Mart's Canadian head office, to see if they were going to ban Crow's album, not if they sell guns. Well, as is the norm in big business today, I got the voice mail of Tom Irvine, on which I posed my question. He didn't get back to me at press time. I'm sure if they try, they'll have a quick turn-around when they see JS and his crew on their doorstep. (EC: That would be a nasty confrontation!!!)

Very funny!!! Those promo guys are pretty funny. Commenting on one Toronto radio station that has been screwing up lately. "They've lost so many listeners, every time the jock makes an announcement, he says 'over to you'." (EC: That's the guy they should get to emcee the next Canadian Music Week awards show!!!)

A blast from PolyGram!!! Michael Kuhn, president of PolyGram Filmed Entertainment was the keynote speaker at the recent Toronto Film Festival, and he came out swinging. It was a pretty lengthy broadside at Canada's film industry. Here's a sample. "Canada's film industry has the worst of all worlds -- a protectionist government policy which aims its protection at the wrong target -- the Hollywood film business, instead of the Canadian cultural film activity; that tries to dictate how satellite revenues be split; that has under-funded the cultural sector; that doesn't welcome non-American companies willing to help-Canada get a

share of the Hollywood film business and thereby keep its hand on the tiller of broadcasting. And a private sector which is monopolistic, reactive, incapable of properly accessing funds which are available and unwilling to invest a fair share of its distribution profits into local production." Let's think that one over. (EC: Bet he won't be invited back next year!!!)

Speaking of the film festival!!! Have you ever seen so much press salivating over movie stars who aren't? Grovel! Grovel! Grovel! And the fans are worse. Every once in awhile, Torontonians like to remind the world that Toronto is really "hogtown". (EC: You'll be quoted!!!)

A fading star??? A one time, top-of-the-heap recording star, found out the hard way, that out-of-sight, out-of-mind, means just that. Calls to radio stations about a new release, aren't returned. Watch for the same thing to happen to a trio that once was, but punked off their fans by resting on their millions. (EC: Money can't buy love!!!)

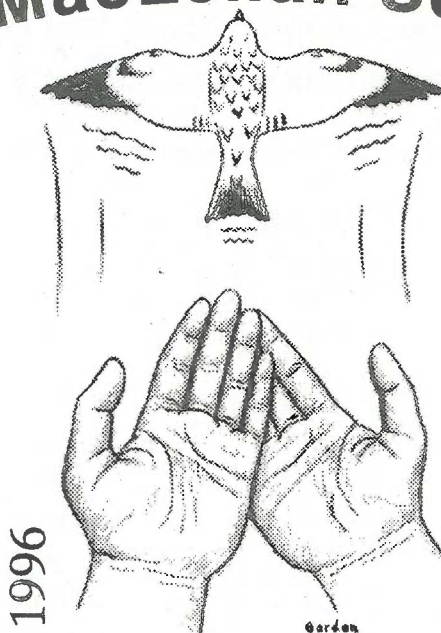

Toronto artist expands EMI's domestic roster

Angels and an extraordinary woman

Wendy Lands is prone to speak about angels these days. Not because she has gotten to reading about them (she insists her religious training was minimal, if at all), or because she is under the impression that she has seen one, nothing like that. She is prone to speak about angels simply because she is confronted with their existence, their struggles, failures and triumphs on a daily basis. Come again?

Lands is speaking metaphorically of course; the angels she speaks of are one and the same with the human beings referred to by the title of her debut EMI album *Angels & Ordinary Men*. The album is as important for Lands as it is for EMI Canada, who are promoting the singer as their newest big domestic act. All of the talk about angels has not gone unnoticed amidst the excitement though, curiously, the metaphor seems to have been overlooked.

"I think that is so interesting," she muses, "people keep saying that. I've been asked if it's a Christian record. Whoa! Is it ever not! I think my songs have become the ways that I do my soul and spiritual searching, but it is not religious, it's just personal. The word religion really doesn't have anything to do with my album. The word spirituality has everything to do with it."

That seems fair enough, though the spirituality the artist entertains hasn't prevented her from elaborating her own particular theology. As the album title intimates, divine and human worlds convene in pleasant society of forgiveness and redemption.

"I think I am fascinated by redemption and the second or third chance," she says. "There are people in my life in whom I've witnessed an enormous change. You know how they say that you can't change, but I've witnessed human beings redeeming themselves. It's an unbelievable strength; it takes a great deal of courage. I like to explore that in myself and in humanity. I like to explore the balance between good and bad... sort of forgiveness. *Angels And Ordinary Men* is all about forgiveness."

The interest is logical for an artist who has had her share of emotional turmoil on the stormy waves of the music industry. Having grown up in a family who strongly encouraged the arts --("My dad painted abstract paintings; my grandmother's an artist and a pianist and her whole family were composers; my mom was an actress," she says)--Lands began writing at an extremely early age. When most girls were dreaming of marriage, she was falling in love with the marriage of culture and music. It came as no surprise when a sort of explosion of artistic interests marked her entry into adolescence.

"I started off wanting to be an actress and a singer and a writer and sort of went full force trying to do it all and then I realized that you really do have to focus and decide," she says of that period in her life.

Her talents were recognized early on and for a glorious moment it seemed that the entertainment world was going to be a comfortable place to grow as an artist. A deal was struck with Polygram for a vocal duet called *Double Dare* in which Lands shared star billing as one of the lead vocalists. But just as suddenly as she had achieved the deal, the singer realized that there was more to artistic satisfaction than what was brought about by ink and paper.

"It just wasn't me, it wasn't me at all; that was the whole problem with it," she says of that particular outing. "It wasn't a great experience but it sort of taught me what it was that I wanted to do eventually, though it kind of left me feeling a little insecure about my skills."

A period of dark introspection followed, a dark night of the soul, in which Lands questioned her artistic capabilities and especially her



abilities as a songwriter.

"You know how sometimes a horrible job experience can leave you feeling like 'what is it I do? Do I do anything well? MY GOD, WHO AM I?! I went through that horrible stuff for a while and it took meeting collaborator [Jim Gillard] and playing him the songs [from the new album] and for him to hear it and say 'Wendy, let's get to work, this is good stuff.' That gave me a great deal of confidence to begin again."

Though unpleasant, that period of insecurity proved also to be a period of gestation out of which her own creative spirit emerged. It took some four years and a few psychic bruises to break out completely, but Lands managed well enough, releasing *Angels & Ordinary Men* to the full light of day sometime last year.

The album staked its claim on the indie market almost immediately and not surprisingly. Lands had solicited the help of producer Greg Kavanagh, Toronto's own guitar alchemist Kurt Swinghammer and a collection of highly coveted musicians to record what *Billboard* magazine was to later call "one of the most impressive Canadian recordings in years." It was not long thereafter that EMI noticed the album was retailing well on indie racks, gave it a spin and decided they had better do something about it.

"I have to give Bonnie [Fedrow] credit, I have

to, because I don't read about Bonnie enough in my story and I really feel like she started the whole EMI interest," says Lands. "She was aware of me; she had heard some other songs that I had written and she came to a Cameron House gig. And then she dragged Tim [Trombley] and then Tim dragged Deane [Cameron] in and that's how it started. But it was definitely Bonnie's interest that started me off."

A little weary at first of the interest that had renewed itself from the direction of the labels, Lands turned down a few offers she felt were dubious before her meeting with EMI.

"When EMI came along, there was a great simpatico; it was just boom! I love you guys!" she says. "I felt so funny, I thought, you're not supposed to be this crazy about your record company, are you?"

There seems to be little talk now about artistic capabilities. Once EMI got a hold of it, they had the album re-mastered and arranged for a few rockier tracks to be recorded to guarantee cross-over potential. Their combined effort has not gone unrecognized by radio and video, who have unwaveringly promoted the first single titled *Little Sins* and pushed it to #30 after two months on RPM's Hits 100 chart.

But the ever turbulent waves of the music industry seldom abate for long, and Lands has certainly realized as much. There has been issue with a certain Ms. Morissette, with whom Lands has suffered a few carefully aimed comparisons at the heels of the wide release of her album.

"I have and I did suffer for a couple of weeks and then I said this is not worth the suffering," she says. "If you do listen to my record a few times, I think you'll hear that Alanis and I have an entirely different agenda. I guess we have a similar look, but what

do I do? I've looked like this longer than she's looked like this! So what do I do? Do I change who I am or do I just wait and have some confidence?"

The answer, like the writing on the wall, is pretty clear from where she now stands; no one denies that Wendy Lands has released an extraordinary album or that the rich poetry in her music lingers long after the critics have stopped arguing.

BIG SUGAR -Rock/Alternative
Hemi-Vision
A&M 314 540 600-Q

Sure, there's a harmonica and a sax poking its head in places on this album but Big Sugar's Hemi-Vision is Big Guitar Rock of the classic type. Agreed, the staple R&B, reggae and funk messing around is still here, but then comes that guitar which just imposes itself in a way that only rock and roll can tolerate. The band has certainly paid their dues since their arrival on the Canadian independent scene in 1992, having spent the greater part of the time since then in bar-room trenches and perfecting their full blown sonic attack. The live off the floor sound acquired in those bars has seeped into the band's pores and made Hemi-Vision as live as live albums get; little surprise that those tracks which communicate a live show climate are the standouts. They include a nine minute jam which goes by the name of Joe Louis/Judgement Day, a funky guitar driven jig called Tommy Johnson and, of course, that cool mess of junk guitar and bawling harmonica titled Diggin' a Hole which is doing just that at radio. In all, Hemi-Vision's stylistic innovations and hip technique (NB: this band wears Hugo Boss) ought to pile drive the release to the heart of alternative radio without jeopardizing its chances at CAR or CHR... and by the by make frontman Geordie Johnson the next face of Canadian rock. -RG

DALBELLO -Alternative
Whore
Spin/EMI 37985-F

Despite the tireless efforts of promoters and product managers to find the kernel of originality in the morass of product on the market, it must be admitted that artists rarely live up to the hype. Lisa Dalbello is the exception to the rule, something which people in and outside of the industry have known all too well. With a career spanning thirteen years, Dalbello has demonstrated enough original talent to appeal to a group



of artists ranging from Alice Cooper to Bryan Adams. Having cocooned herself in other people's work since 1994's brilliant Whomanfoursays, Dalbello has occasioned the rejuvenation of her solo career by collaborating with her brother Stefan, whose accidental entry into matters musical cannot rid itself of a degree of innocence. Whore avails itself of the type of regulated anarchies that characterise Nine Inch Nails while leaving behind its overblown drama, making itself a little more in texture like the American pop band Garbage. The comparisons are merely indicative of what sort of sounds Dalbello is entertaining these days and by no means describe what she has achieved. That task is left to the overly imaginative or the pathological liar. Possibly too outrageous and risqué for CHR, Whore will make Dalbello the long awaited Goddess of alternative radio. Especially take note of tracks Eleven, Whore and Yippie. Recorded in Toronto. -RG

WHITE ZOMBIE -Alternative
Supersexy Swingin' Sounds
Geffen 24976-J

In line with remixes from Nine Inch Nails and Cypress Hill comes White Zombie's own treatment of their highly lucrative Astro Creep 2000. Barely a week on the racks, the group was already benefiting from the retail success of Supersexy Swingin' Sounds, mirrored in a high debut on RPM's Retail Albums chart. Unlike other works in this vein



which do little more than double off staple riffs in a series of endless loops, Supersexy Swingin' Sounds manages to extract something that was muted, if absent, on the original album. The obvious difference on the remixes is a softening of the music, which crossed the line of thrash on the album, but here only insinuates its origins amidst a heavy and positively dancy vibe. Retakes of Electric head Pt. 2, I, Zombie, Blur The Technicolor and Super-Charger Heaven choose mood over attitude and bring out the Thrill Kill Kult that has obviously lain dormant in between Astro Creep's grooves. Some intricate arrangements of classic tracks, a cupful of sin-sex and a bevy of scantily clad women give this all it needs to have the retail power of a new release without actually being one. Also includes a remix of I'm Your Boogie Man. -RG

BUG! -Alternative
Bug!
Iron Music 77876 51006

We are not too sure just who or what the name Bug! designates, but once the music is on, the omission, intentional or unintentional, seems as irrelevant as the colouring book that accompanies the CD seems appropriate. Bug! the music is a colourful brew of techno, disco, metal and lounge, meted out with cyber-pulse precision in small digestible portions. A splash of multi-layered vocals ranging from rap to ethereal blow the crucial third dimension into Bug!'s tiers of sound. Though relatively new to the local indie scene, Bug! manages to communicate a little of each of its influences without giving itself over to any one of them. Consequently the group's insistence to keep things on an uneven keel is what will save it from falling the way of the product-in-search-of-a-market. We would peg this thing as

dance-techno if we had to but who says we do? Certainly not Bug! itself, whose adjustable antenna could make it a cross breeder between core genres or cheerfully belch it out into an alternative fringe all its own. Highpoints on this thoroughly happy release include On The Southside, Faith In Love, Prophet Speaks and Wake Me. Produced by Blron. -RG

FOXFIRE -Alternative

The key to the great growing up film, much like the great road movie, is in the soundtrack and Foxfire's producers have obviously grasped as much. Foxfire is a movie about five teenage girlfriends who get angry and



get even when one of them gets sexually harassed. Forming a posse of "girls just sticking together," the friends manage to get inspired, get rowdy, do some stupid and not so stupid things and generally grow up. Niche audience, sure, but then picture the likes of Wild Strawberry's I Don't Want To Think About It, L7's Shirley, The Cramp's Let's Get Fucked Up, Candlebox's You and Luscious Jackson's Energy Sucker somewhere in the background and the film suddenly stands a chance at being great. How could it not be? Through the music, we understand that Foxfire has achieved a degree of distinctiveness on the outset. Rebellion changes its face from goofy youth to intelligent social consciousness while attitude changes its typical sound from mainstream rock to gems from the alternative ghetto. Shampoo, a favourite of these cool girl movies, make a welcome

appearance with Trouble, undoubtedly the anthem of the piece and indicative of the film's lighthearted gloss despite a serious look at contemporary issues. -RG

EELS -Alternative
Beautiful Freak
DreamWorks 50001-J

The first official outing from DreamWorks label, Eels has rapidly slithered its way into alternative and contemporary hit radio with a thoughtful single called Novocaine For The Soul. That tune charts out the musical territory covered by the release which remains a softly executed bit of alternative pop achieving lighthearted beauty in the best of moments. Singer songwriter E is the young Kane behind keyboard and guitar and orchestral arrangements that drive Eels' poignant pop all the way to the heart without tripping over the bass and drum backup. All things said, this trio is stitched together seamlessly. The net result is that Beautiful Freak is probably one of the most artistically powerful works to hit the market in a while. There is not much more to tag on to this review by way of an introduction; suffice to say that radio will have follow ups to Novocaine with Not Ready Yet, Flower, Guest List and Mental. It's still too early to see how the public will take to it, but the industry here and abroad is already buzzing with excitement. -RG

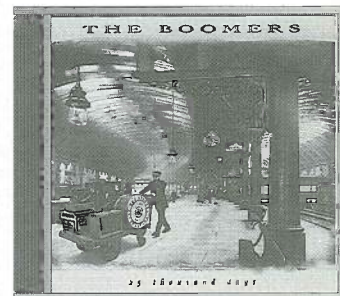

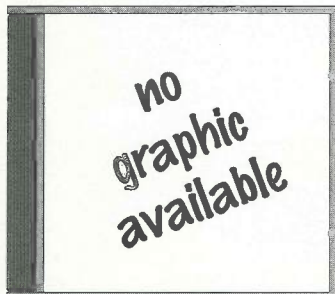
THE BOOMERS -Rock 'n Pop

Ian Thomas gained a large following, both fan and industry, for his oft-times reckless methodology in the studio. In fact, these excesses were recognized more in Europe than they were in Canada. Thomas has obviously had his way with this release, which he produced with bassist Peter Cardinali, who also supplies vocals. The title reveals what's in the package, a travelogue "a journey -- a long one, 25,000 days more or less; adding up to an average human lifespan." The other two on the trip are guitarist Bill Dillon and drummer Rick Gratton. Thomas, of course, doubles on guitar and piano, and does the vocal thing. The bumps are in the lyrics. The vocals and music are smooth, uncluttered, but still very compelling. Take your pick. The album is an A/C programmer's dream. I Feel A Change Coming, written by Thomas and Dillon and taken as the first single, has already caught the attention of A/C programmers. There's a lot of imagination at work here from Thomas and the Boomers, which will have an immediate impact on listeners. Thomas has written a couple of solo gems; Saving Face, and Stuck In Between. But don't overlook Balloons, which could be a left-fielder. And Old Diamond Ring isn't too shabby either. That's Melanie Doane on fiddle and vocal support. There's also a quiet magnetism on While I'm Learning You, which Thomas wrote with Eddie Schwartz. Great in-store play material here. Should bring the Boomers up where they belong. -WG



JOS VAN IMMERSEEL - Classical

 It has been written of Beethoven and his contemporaries that "the more modern the piano, the more old fashioned the music sounds." Fortunately, some period instruments still exist as do the designs of their original builders. The pianoforte played by Immerseel was built by Christopher Clarke



(no mean artist himself), after the design of Anton Walter (c 1795-1800) with F some three and a half octaves above middle C. Bruno Weil conducts and Jeanne Lamon is musical director of Tafelmusik on period instruments. The result is a more powerful yet still lyric reading of the two concerti than one has ever experienced before. Most surprising is the sustentation and even, in some passages, the increase in dynamic values. No doubt Messrs. Immerseel and Weil share some credit for that, but the greater portion must be allotted to the instruments. The music itself is familiar and little comment upon it is necessary. Let it suffice that it continues to revive flagging spirits. But, oh my! The reading it receives here. Wunderbar!

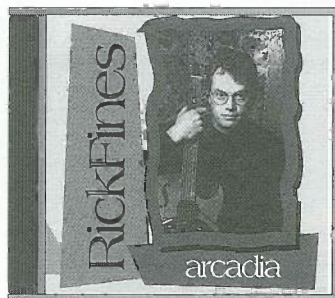
THE COCKRUM SISTERS - Country

 Lorraine, Laura, Bonnie and Carol, the Cockrum Sisters are the four youngest sisters in a family of 12 children from Meadow Lake, Saskatchewan. The warm, sometimes provocative and compelling vocal approach creates a unique niche in the recording field. They take turns at supplying lead vocals, and each reveal their own signature, braced with tight harmonies. The title track, taken as the first single, a duet by Bonnie Cockrum and Brad Johner of the Johner Brothers, is already attracting country programmer attention. Produced by Bart

McKay, who doubles on piano and accordion, the album was recorded at Saskatoon's Sound Edge Productions. Great instrumental backing. That's Brad Johner playing acoustic guitar on She Don't Cry, and Rob Hewes on dobro. A key track, the song was written by Carol, who is also featured on lead vocals. Randle Currie was the steelman on the session, with impressive sax treatment by Sheldon Corbett. The other session people were drummer Phil "Buckwheat" Nelson, Jay Buettner on electric and acoustic guitar, Rick Reithmeier on bass, and Brad "Wheel" Missura supplying percussion. Other key tracks include Can You See Me, written by Bonnie, who also supplies lead vocals; Lean On You, a Dawn Thomas original with Laura on lead



vocals; and the Charles Gabriel penning of His Eye Is On The Sparrow, with Carol on upfront vocals. There's no MAPL logo identifying the Cancon properties, but it's safe to assume that all tracks meet at least two of the criteria.

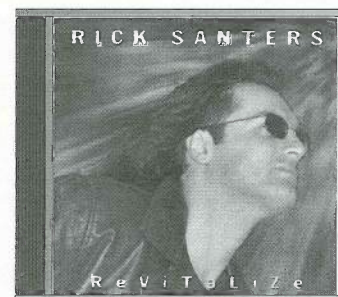
EARTHTONES -R&B

 Talk about unexpected. Usually Alberta conjures up images of cowboys, rodeos and country music. Definitely an off-base image when it comes to Calgary-based band the Earthtones and their latest offering, Blindfolded and Ready. This, their third CD, is a blend of pop, soul, R&B, hip-hop and



dance. The previously a cappella band, provides rich, smooth vocals that shine through on this slickly produced effort. With several tracks produced by Kirk Anthony Johnson (of the artist formerly known as Prince fame) and Giorgio Moroder, this album has a contemporary style which lends itself well to mainstream music buyers. It features 11 original tracks, four of which the band had a hand in producing themselves. The first single release, Mary (There's Nobody Like You), is bound to chart well, but two to watch for are Why Must I Fall (which has a definite Paisley Park sound) and Not Ever Give Up (a ballad that nicely blends acoustic guitar with some incredible vocal harmonies).

Not only has he shared writing responsibilities on two tracks, Break Down The Walls and Love Don't Come Easy, with former Triumph front-man Rik Emmett. But current Triumph front-man, Phil X, lends a hand with some backing vocals on Do You Remember Me and Celebration. Look for The Dream to work its way up the charts.

Canadian artist targeted in US-Cuban skirmish

Juno Award winning Canadian jazz flautist Jane Bunnett may be the victim of bad US-Cuban relations after several Fall tour dates at U.S. universities and a record deal were cancelled. The cancellations followed the March signing of the Helms-Burton bill into law by President Clinton after Cuba shot down two aircraft, killing four Cuban-Americans.

The law, which permits lawsuits in US courts against foreign firms that own or operate former American properties seized in the 1959 Cuban revolution, does not restrict Canadians connected with Cuba from entry into the US or otherwise cite them.

Bunnett and her record company, EMI Canada, maintain that the law has occasioned its first Canadian cultural casualty.

"Immediately after the Helms-Burton Bill was signed, I received notice that five of the gigs had been cancelled in the States," said Bunnett from her home in Toronto. Though no reason was given for the cancellation, Bunnett is sure that her interest and work in Cuba provided the motivation. Bunnett, whose latest CD is titled Jane

Bunnett and The Cuban Piano Masters, has recently travelled to Cuba with her husband trumpeter Larry Cramer to help repair instruments at the island's music conservatory.

George Rioux, press secretary at the Canadian Embassy in Washington denies that there is any formal or organized response against Canadian artists or products as a result of Helms-Burton.

"[Bunnett] is not a direct victim of Helms-Burton, strictly legally speaking," he was quoted as saying.

Bunnett is also convinced that an impending record deal with Sony Music was spoiled as a result of Helms-Burton connections.

"We'd been speaking to them for about nine months about this [Cuban] group that we had recorded with and they were all very excited. We had meetings, the contract had been drawn up and then the same week they pulled out too."

Sony contends its decision was driven exclusively by corporate interest and related strictly to the company's artist and repertoire departments.

Bunnett won a Juno Award for her 1992 recording titled Havana Spirits.

CRTC approves Citytv in Ottawa

Citytv continue in their quest for omnipresence after The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) approved the station's application to rebroadcast its signal into Ottawa. Citytv Toronto will be making its entrance into the Ottawa market on over-the-air Channel 65 as early as November. Ottawa viewers will join the nation and a growing community of 130 countries from around the world in watching groundbreaking Canadian shows that include Fashion Television, Movie Television, Media Television and The New

Music.

"We're very happy!" exclaimed Moses Znaimer, President/Executive Producer of Citytv, MuchMusic, Musique Plus and Bravo! "Finally, we get to bring modern, urban, new-style television to a city that figures large in our fortunes. Citytv will directly link Canada's Capital City, Ottawa, with Canada's largest city and Ontario's capital, Toronto."

The award winning station, Canada's largest buyer and presenter of movies on television, is a division of Chum Limited which owns and operates eight television and 20 radio stations across Canada.

DJ Dance guru Chris Sheppard has been forced to cancel all public appearances for the next month following an accident on Friday, August 30 that shattered much of his right knee. The fracture, which was designated by doctors as severe and caused Sheppard to endure four operations in five days, will keep the DJ in hospital for at least another week.

Plans for a national tour of major dance clubs this Fall have been postponed and personal appearances at the MuchMusic Awards and at the NAC in London, Ontario have been cancelled. Two veteran Toronto DJs have been slotted to fill in for Sheppard on his two weekly radio shows. Don Berns from Hot 103 is to temporarily helm Sheppard's nationally syndicated Pirate Radio program and Scott Turner will broadcast live on Toronto's Energy 108 from the Joker nightclub Friday nights while Sheppard recuperates. The circumstances of the accident were not publicized.

Mindy McCready, who jumped into the #1 position last week from #27, continues to hold fast. McCready's BNA album, *Ten Thousand Angels*, is making the same impact at retail.

CKDM's Bruce Leperre is the first country programmer to give the "pick" nod to *Take It From Me* by Paul Brandt. Nothing official from Warner Music, but, Leperre has a habit of "picking" early and correct.

Clint Black has the big mover this week. Like *The Rain*, which entered the chart modestly last week at #96, makes up for it this week, jumping 33 points up to #63.

Joan Kennedy, after a long hiatus from the chart, bounces back with the most added single this week. *Wild And Free*, written by Jess Leary and Jody Alan Sweet, enters the chart at #83. Released as a CD single, the track was taken from her upcoming CD, *A Dozen Red Roses*, a retrospective CD, which takes the listener "on a journey through the first 12 years of her recording career; from the nurturing environment detailed in *Family Pride* to the fun-loving optimism of *Wild And Free* -- 12 songs -- 12 years in the making." Kennedy continues to devote much of her time to the Children's Wish

Foundation. It was because of this dedication that in 1995 she was awarded the C.F. Martin Humanitarian Award.

Shania Twain further showed her independent attitude by announcing in Calgary that she had decided on who will look after management chores for her. She has hired John Landau and Barbara Carr, who also work with Bruce Springsteen. Twain, who won three CCMA awards this past week (see separate story), has been without management since she parted ways with Mary

Citation awards honour the moulders of country

The behind-the-scenes movers and shakers of Canada's country music community were given the opportunity to share the spotlight during this year's Canadian Country Music Week, which was held in Calgary.

The evening prior to the CCMA awards show, a number of leading industry personalities were honoured with Citation Awards at the annual President's Dinner.

Along with two inductees into the Canadian Country Music Association Hall of Honour, Citation Awards honoured the musicians, radio personalities, managers, agents, club owners, promoters, video producers, and radio stations, all of whom were directly, or indirectly responsible for the ongoing structuring of Canada's country star system.

Myrna Lorrie, a pioneer Canadian recording artist who, during the late '50s, expanded her

Canadian star status to the US, was inducted into the Hall of Honour during the CTV Network airing of the country music awards.

Doug Delaney, editor and publisher of Country Music News was presented with the Stan Klees Industry Builder award and inducted into the Hall of Honour. Delaney was also honoured, for the eighth time, as Country Music Person of the Year.

The C.F. Martin Humanitarian Award was presented to actor/singer Tom Jackson in recognition of his ongoing initiative in creating and organizing the Huron Carole, a series of concerts in major Canadian cities to raise funds for food banks and the homeless. The award was presented by last year's recipient Joan Kennedy.

BMG opens doors for Wiggett and Austin

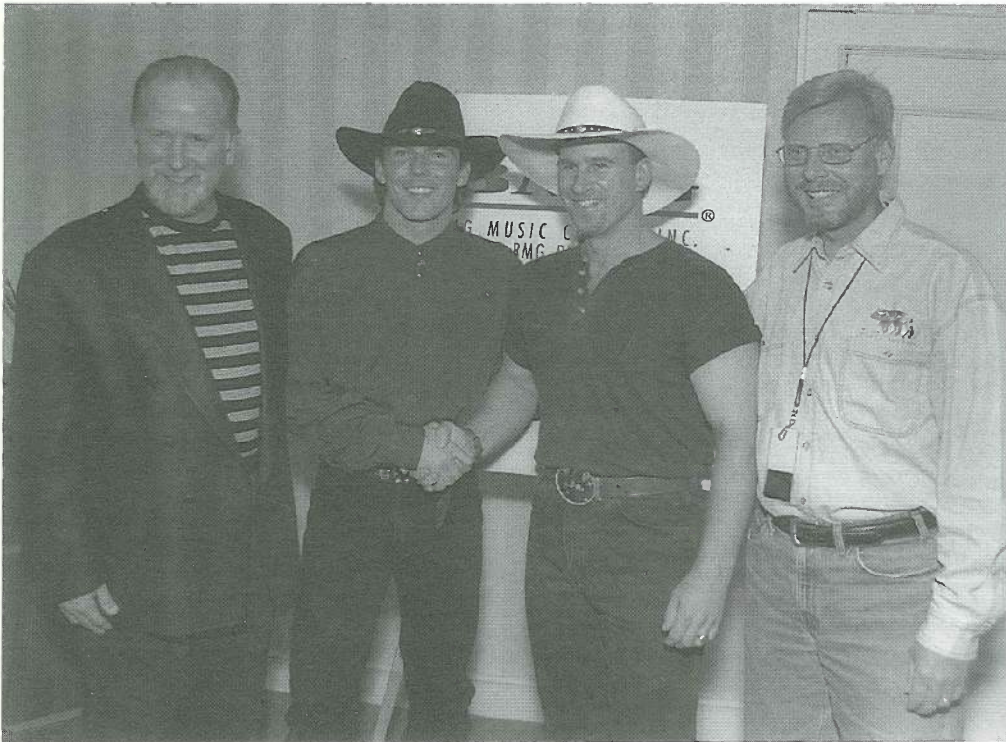
BMG Music Canada president Paul Alofs and Tim DuBois, president of Arista Nashville have jointly announced the signing of major label recording deals for Canadian country artists Calvin Wiggett and Julian Austin.

Wiggett, a native of Regina, has signed a worldwide record deal with Arista Records in Nashville (distributed in Canada by BMG). Wiggett is no stranger to country radio programmers, making his mark last year with Missing You, his debut for the Edmonton-based Royalty label. The single peaked on the RPM Country 100 at #18 after 12 weeks of charting (Dec. 18/95). The follow-up, Loves Music Loves To Dance, made it to the Top 15 (#13) on July 22/96. His latest release, I Know What It's Not, entered the chart last week and bullets up to #85 this week. All three tracks culled from Made For Each Other, his Royalty album.

Based on his chart success, Wiggett was nominated for a Big Country award this year in the male artist category and his producer R. Harlan Smith was nominated as producer of the year, which contributed to the label being nominated as independent label of the year.

Wiggett is managed by Gillie Crowder of Mary Bailey Management. It was Bailey who guided the career of Shania Twain from its early stages up to last year.

New Brunswick native Austin has signed a deal directly with BMG Canada. Alofs and his A&R team flew to Fredericton earlier this year and were so impressed with Austin's performance, they signed him as their first domestic country artist in more than four years. He joins a distinguished roster which includes Michelle Wright, Charlie Major, and Prairie Oyster. - See photo below

Bailey last year, although there were strong rumours that her husband and songwriting partner Robert (Mutt) Lange, has been actively engaged in structuring her day-to-day promotion activities.

Greg Hanna continues to move up the chart. His latest release, *Natural Born Thriller*, which was produced by Jack Richardson, bulleted into the #74 position last week and this week bullets up to #66.

CJVR's Bill Wood was obviously pleased that the Melfort, Saskatchewan country station won country music station of the year for a secondary market at the CCMA's awards ceremony in Calgary this past weekend. Wood, who is the program director at the station, pointed out that "CJVR's Saskatchewan and Canadian country music support, combined with our local community support were the main factors." As well, the station's music director, Cal Gratton, placed in the top five for music director of the year.

19-year old Joe Nichols has caught the attention of Canadian country programmers. His Intersound debut, *Six Of One, Half A Dozen (Of The Other)*, makes a chart entry this week at #97. Nichols, a part-Cherokee native of Rogers, Arkansas, made his mark in Nashville this past June with an appearance in front of 2,000 country fans at an Anderson Merchandising/Wal-Mart convention. This led to his being invited to appear on TNN's Prime Time Country and live at the Wildhorse Saloon. The first single was written by Keith Follesé and Doug DeJoe. The album was produced by Tod Wilkes, Lee Ogle, and Randy Edwards, a seven-year veteran of Shenandoah. Ogle and Edwards are president and vice-president respectively of the Joe Nichols Corporation.

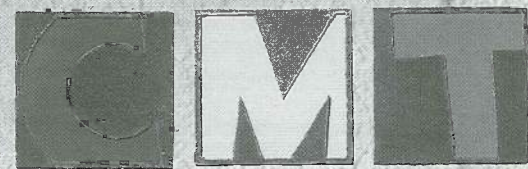
Curtis Blayne is getting a helping hand from TMP (The Music Publisher) on his new release *A Tender Heart (Is The Strongest Part Of A Man)*. The song was written by Blayne and Odie Blackman and produced by Blackman. There is no MAPL logo on the artwork, and no indication of where the track was recorded, although it is safe to assume that the record is at least two-parts Cancon (AP). Blayne was born in Irma, Alberta, and now lives in Vancouver. He had a Top 10 hit with *Winchester Cathedral* when he was four years old, which was recorded at CFRN in Edmonton. He is no stranger to awards as well, and has been a consistent winner of BC country music awards. These include his 1994 wins of the Ray McAuley New Horizon award and the male vocalist of the year; the male vocalist the following year, plus video of the year for *Georgia Rain*; and this past year, awards of new single and video for *A Tender Heart Is The Strongest Part Of A Man*, his current single. Blayne's last trip up the RPM Country 100 was with *Georgia Rain*, which peaked at #54 on July 3/1995.

Kiley Joe Masson has a new single, *It's Been Six Years*, the fifth to be taken from his debut album, *In The Key Of Country*. Written by Masson, the new track is included on the latest Hillcrest CD compilation (Volume 32). Masson has been slowly, but effectively building interest in his career, both in Canada and abroad. He recently appeared at the Zevenbergen International Country Music Festival in Holland, where his album received much attention.

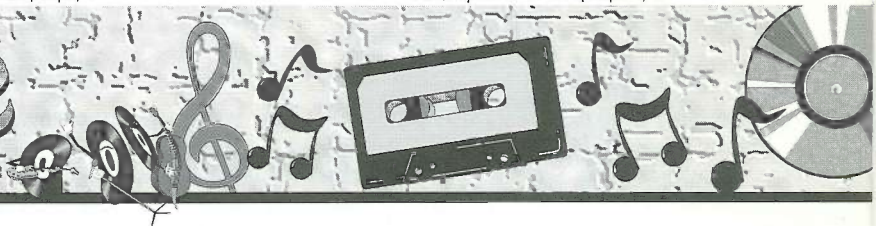

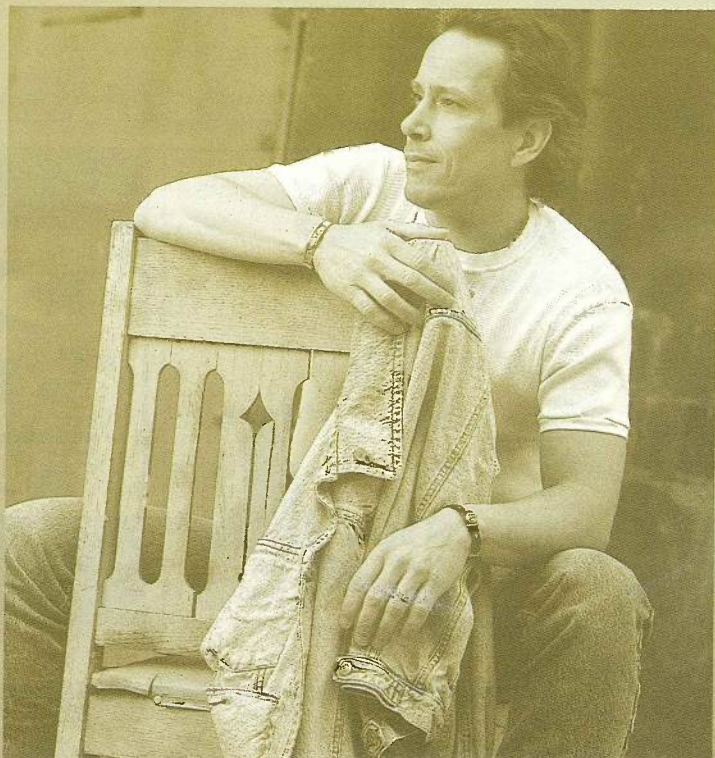
