New milestone album for Tom Cochrane

When we think of Tom Cochrane we think of a master of rock radio hits who has put out some of the most commercially successful pop music this country has ever heard. That's all going to change however, as Cochrane extends his all acoustic tour of last year into a full length album, released last Tuesday and titled Songs Of A Circling Spirit. The new record contains a twelve song retrospective


over the singer/guitarist's 17 year career, from the early Red Rider days of Lunatic Fringe to more recent hits like I Wish You Well all songs performed with acoustic guitar, mandolin, harmonica and soft percussion.

"I think it's something I've been waiting a long time to do but I didn't really know it," says Cochrane. "I became very aware on the Ragged Ass Road tour that my favourite parts of the show were when I strapped on the acoustic guitar. In the past, there was too much of an emphasis on strutting and not on strumming to use a corny turn of phrase. On stage sometimes things get so loud and so out of hand that everybody is listening to their own monitor mix and people don't have a chance to play with each other. There's not a lot of chemistry there after a while."

While the record enters into the crucial mediaresponse period, EMI has gone the distance at re-

Reid to chair PolyGram Group as Summers retires

It was announced last week that PolyGram Canada chairman Joe Summers will be retiring after forty years in the music business to be succeeded by

A&M president John Reid, effective October 1st. Summers, whose involvement with the company dates back to 1972, will continue as a consultant for PolyGram while Reid settles into his new shoes at the company.

While the two men refused to comment last week, speculation still remains over who will take over presidency of A&M/Island/Motown, which Reid has been heading since 1995. Previously, Reid had held position as marketing director of the London based London Records after having been responsible for the exploitation of London's repertoire outside the UK. As chairman, Reid will report directly to Alain Levy, President and Chief executive officer, PolyGram.

"I want to thank Joe Summers for his contributions to PolyGram Canada," commented Levy. "I am sure that John Reid will continue his enthusiastic contributions to the overall PolyGram results."

career retrospective with classic video footage and live excerpts from Cochrane's Words And Music tour of last year, from which the recording of the songs were culled. The disc also includes a full interview with the singer, talking from his home studio about the reasons behind his decision to pursue an acoustic album.

"Maybe it's the same phase that Lennon went through when he wanted to do Let It Be, he wanted the Beatles to get a live vibe off the songs," comments the singer/songwriter/guitarist. "For me, we spent a lot of time in the studio trying to contrive a live feeling and you get to a certain point where you realise it's never going to happen and there's a trade off. You get sonically perfect conditions where you can control things and make sure that everything is sonically perfect, but something gets lost. There's an intensity about live that you can't contrive in the studio; the audience breathes life into the songs."

While EMI is holding back on servicing a single in what will be a "low key" push for the album, they have nevertheless released a four song sampler to radio that includes Lunatic Fringe, Good Man Feeling Bad, All The Kings' Men and Boy Inside The Man. Roger Bartell, EMI's marketing manager, says that while the label is hoping Lunatic Fringe will be the highlight track, the sampler was introduced to give radio programmers the flexibility to choose for themselves.

"It's more of a grassroots kind of approach which is why we aren't doing a video and we haven't put out a single per se," says Bartell. "A lot of other stations are substituting any gold Cochrane that they are playing with these new versions. So when Boy Inside The Man comes up as a gold track they don't play the gold, they play the new version."

The label will be pursuing standard print advertising with spots in commercial magazines and dailies over the next while. Bartell says radio will get the same treatment but is gearing up to put the real emphasis on a television show which will showcase the singer in his new stripped down form.

"The television show will be a live concert

situation which will be filmed with footage of Cochrane backstage and interview footage," says Bartell who is still in negotiations as to where and when the show will air. "We anticipate this will air sometime in October which will be instrumental in helping to make everyone understand that there is the new Tom Cochrane record out there."

While last year's Words And Music Tour prepped audiences for a more tranquil side to the star, there is still some concern that the public at large have not fully understood that an important change has occurred in the singer's career. Ironically, Cochrane himself is non-committal as to the whether the album marks a new artistic course, at the same time maintaining that Songs Of A Circling Spirit is much more than standard unplugged fare.

"It will be interesting down the line to see what happens," he says. "I'd like to go back to a Bathurst Theatre and record new songs this way."

Songs Of A Circling Spirit landed in stores Tuesday, July 8 and will be the subject of Cochrane's public appearances up until the year's end. The album's track list also includes Paper Tigers, Brave And Crazy, Dreamer's Dream, Human Race, Napoleon Sheds His Skin, White Hot, Washed Away and I Wish You Well.

Says Bartell: "We have a lot of hope in this record, it could end up going way past what our expectations are. At the end of the day it could go platinum and make people aware that Tom Cochrane is not Tom Cochrane the rocker at this point in his career. If the critical response is positive then I think we will have achieved our goals."

Rhona At Night to make U.S. debut

On July 21, Rhona Raskin will become the first Canadian woman to have her Canada-wide radio show syndicated into the U.S. Rhona At Night will make its U.S. debut at KIRO-FM's 100.7 The Buzz in Seattle.

"Radio listeners love Rhona's brand of advice because it's unique, humorous and entertaining," says Chuck McCoy, vice-president of Rogers Broadcasting.

Tom Clendening, program director of KIRO-FM mirrors McCoy's sentiments with "We've been searching for a program like this for a long time."

The move to take Raskin into the U.S. comes as the result of Conrad Black's Hollinger International and Rogers Broadcasting independently deciding that U.S. audiences were ready for the show.

Raskin deals with the issues of love and relationships. Her show is billed as "Canada's hottest interactive radio show", and is heard in Vancouver, Toronto, Montreal, Victoria, Calgary, Saskatoon, Regina, Winnipeg, London, Kitchener and Ottawa. She has already made an impact in the U.S. with her syndicated column Ask Rhona which is now published in Hollinger's flagship newspaper the Chicago Sun Times. "Rhona speaks to a young, sophisticated reader," says Chicago Sun

Times executive editor Larry Green. "She has made a strong impression on our readership and is a valuable addition to our columnist lineup." The column is also syndicated across Canada.

WALT SAYS ...!

Returning calls??? Voice mail has made it easy for the procrastinators to duck out of most everything. Even their assistants use the system to buck the system. Ain't nobody here but us voice mailers. What ever happened to goodwill, public relations and market share? (EC: The lawyers and accountants took over!!!)

Growing up??? Interesting news filtering back from the industry golf tournament. Seems there weren't too many head-of-the-line executives attending this year, although JS did show up with a few yuks. Every year he plays the tournament he throws his back out, so this year he made an appointment with the chiropractor before he went. He got a laugh with "Maybe I can go on medical relief until October." Interesting too to see all the old guys from the past, sitting down together with JS. There was GL, DC, RW, BO and LS. But there was a quieter mood among the hackers this year. Someone was overheard saying, "I think the industry has grown up!" It wasn't an overly happy crowd this year. (EC: Well WG, they haven't invited YOU back, have they???) By the way, this was the first year in the tournament's 24 that it rained. (EC: Is that an omen of some kind???)

Burns didn't much care for radio promotion people or record companies in general, and he let it all hang out in that interview. We asked Burns to interview some of the great radio people of that time, and he did. First it was Dan Williamson (RPM - Sept. 13/80) and then it was Jay Nelson (Nov. 8/80). And then it was all over for RPM. We actually had to close down. The advertising dried up and we were shuttered for awhile, until the industry asked us to resume publishing. Anyway, to make a long story even longer, I was curious as to what happened to Donny Burns. He lived the good life . . . to the extreme, which probably was his undoing. We're going to catch up with him and maybe he'll give us some tips on when you're hot in radio, how to stay hot. What a boon he would be to a radio station today. The guy knew his music and knew how to get to his listeners. (EC: If you're burned out, it's time, again for Donny Burns!!!)

How we miss Fran!!! Using the initials of FR a few weeks ago, I made a short mention of the retirement of Fran Rob, who has been baby sitting Stan Kulin and Garry Newman for all the time they've been with Warner Music. The day after she left, and they had a nice going-away party for her, I dropped by the office, and it was like a tomb. Fran actually baby-sat the whole operation. She knew who was having an anniversary, a birthday, and even knew the first names of some of the employees' grand parents. Fran worked with Barry Stafford at Quality Records before going to Warner, but that's a different story. Nice to see that "Box Car" Barry was at the going-away party. I was in the office the week Fran left to say goodbye, when Kulin walked in. Fran joked, "Well, I guess you'll have to get a part-time secretary for awhile," In his usual offthe-cuff manner, he replied, "I thought that's what you were." It was a big happy family, and it'll take a while to get used to Fran not being there. (EC: She made it possible for Stan to be part-time!!!)

Too hot to handle!!! Shock! Yes, the very walls of the industry shook with shock at the changes that were first leaked and then announced last week. The phone lines were burning and the conjectures rampant. The face of the industry has changed drastically over the past couple of years, and it will change even more over the next couple. It's also been a devastating time for the guys at the top who have to make the changes. After working with people in such a fun business for 10, 12, and 15 years, getting to know their families and often becoming emotionally involved through deaths in the family or births, how do you say "we have to make changes, and unfortunately you're not included in those changes?" Neill Dixon fumes at Star's attack

Neill Dixon, Managing Director of Canadian Music Week International (CMWI), was incensed over the piece in the June 12/97 edition of the Toronto Star's What's On section, particularly on writer Betsy Powell's suggestion that "NXNE or Canadian Music Week... one of them's got to go." In a letter to Powell, which is reprinted below, Dixon interpreted this as "a nod toward us to do the right thing and call Dr. Kervokian."

In his letter, Dixon goes on to pose two questions. "One is why does one of them have to go? And why didn't Betsy (Powell) call us to see how we felt about being put to sleep? After all, I'm in the phonebook.

"We are the original, and we still do it better. Going by the attendance figures in Ms. Powell's article, it appears our CMW Festival is more popular with local music fans than NXNE. By virtually every measure, the Canadian Music Week Festival is thriving, thank you. Only in Canada would someone seriously recommend culling the healthy from the herd.

"But more importantly, there is no reason why the Music Week and NXNE Festivals can't both thrive. Apparently, Ms. Powell and some of the record label people she interviewed find it a nuisance to have to hit the pubs and check out bands in March and then in June, poor babies. They seem to forget that what is merely extra work for them is a godsend to Toronto music fans.

"If NXNE is finding it a rough

go, that is to be expected in this sort of enterprise and we encourage them to hang tough. Whether cynics believe it or not, we wish NXNE the best. Success, even someone else's is a good thing. Failure, meanwhile, can be contagious, and the last thing the live music scene in Toronto needs is a setback of the magnitude of the cancellation of Music Week.

"Ms. Powell asks, 'Why do we need two full-blown new music showcases?' I might ask why do we need three major league sports franchises? Why do we need two differently -- scaled jazz festivals -the duMaurier and the Beaches? Why do we need a Fringe Of Toronto Festival and a Summerworks Festival? Why do we need so darned many movie theatres? Answer: because we're a big city and the audiences are there. (don't get me wrong, I don't want to get Betsy started on a mission to downsize the entire Toronto entertainment scene).

"Austin, Texas -- with a population of 780,000 -- has its legendary South by Southwest Festival. Surely Toronto, with three times the population, can handle two. At least no one said there's a shortage of great Canadian talent.

"In the meantime, we're not going to fall on our swords just because Betsy Powell says so."

Dixon is now preparing for next year's Canadian Music Week Festival, which will be held in Toronto from March 5 through 8.


On an executive-exchange basis, she worked for Telefilm Canada, Atlantis Films and Channel Four in London, England.

Lhasa: evoking the spirit of La Llorona

There is an old Mexican story about a woman who died crying for her children, all of whom were felled by the holocausts of an ancient Aztec war. So much sadness not even death could quell, so the story goes, and though death did eventually claim the woman, it could not wrestle her weeping ghost from the earth. It remained, restlessly tossing in the upper air between the sky and the earth, filling the wind with lamentation and sorrow... and vengeance. Legend has it that on Mexican nights when things are unusually quiet, La Llorona's mournful sighs bewitch the ears of men to take them to the river's

edge where her noxious kiss turns them to stone.

This powerful story, full of heavy melancholy and mythical radiance is the chosen fount for a fiery phenomenon recently discovered in Montreal. Charged with the quiet fury of a haunted wind, Lhasa de Sela has introduced herself to North American audiences with a ruinously seductive Spanish voice bewitched by the striking pose she assumes in the unassuming stages of smokey barrooms where she first performed. Waif-like and



commandeering, this twenty-four year old treasure is the authentic gift from a people whose music dates to time immemorial, captured in her first full-length AudioGram release titled La Llorona.

"I've always loved a certain kind of sad song," comments the singer/songwriter. "In Mexico there are these kind of Ranchero ballads and most countries have a tradition somewhere of melancholy music. That's what I've always loved and what I always wanted to do."

A daughter of Mexican-American parents, Lhasa travelled the continent, gypsy-style, throughout her childhood and adolescence. Schooled by her parents (her mother was an actress, her father a professor of literature), she became influenced especially by her mom's love of the arts, particularly drama. Lhasa began a tentative singing career at 13 years of age, taking up jazz classics and Mexican folk songs under the tutelage of a teacher who taught her "to interpret and respect the lyrics." Arriving in Montreal in 1991 brought her into the orbit of the arts community there, where she met and began working with quintessential musician Yves Desrosiers. Along with bassist Mario Légaré, Lhasa and Desrosiers began fashioning an approach to the recording experience, most of which took place in a common kitchen and which employed an array of natural instruments -- the percussive sound of a heavy rainfall included -- to conjure the spirit of La Llorona.

"Yves is like a chameleon or a wizard," explains Lhasa. "He has an amazing ability to assimilate things and then make them his own. We started out playing very simple Mexican songs and

he learned that and the basic style and took off with it and the rest of the musicians kind of formed around the nucleus of Yves and I. There's some kind of bending in what we did and all of it brought this whole new different style into the music."

The result was a quietly hypnotic album which has infiltrated the music scene with its warm Mexican balm in the several momths since its release. Overwhelming media response -- from Billboard Magazine to The Globe & Mail -- has landed the singer praises of a "stunning debut" and "riveting and beguiling stage presence." It is an effect that is difficult to ignore: surmounting the boundaries of format and era, Lhasa marries the simple beauty of an ancient music in the soft tread of a contemporary sound. It is, for all of its exotic allure, a not unfamiliar sound echoes of which will be recognised by anyone who has ever been exposed to a Mexican folk song.

"Life has forced me to accept the fact that I will never be just one thing," she says. "That I will never be, for instance, just Mexican or American, that I will never be able to settle comfortably into a slot, that in a way I have to juggle a lot of contradictions and that's what I consider myself to be. I try to keep my eyes open and be a lucid about that and everything that it implies. I think people often have to deal with those contradictions inside of themselves even if its just having to do with self-destructive parts of oneself and creative parts of oneself which everyone has to deal with. My primary material is contradiction."

The buzz for this multi-faceted artist continues, with appearances at the Lilith Fair Festival and performances in Toronto (Aug 8 opening up for Dr. John) and the US.

Nornet Network operations relocates to Edmonton

Nornet Broadcasting Limited has announced plans to relocate the company's Network Operations to a new facility in Edmonton. The new 6500 square foot facility will house Network Management, On-Air Programming, News, Production, Creative, Engineering and Data Services.

It was further pointed out that the new facility will "better suit the needs of the group of 15 radio stations owned and operated by Nornet in Alberta and British Columbia, which will allow for future growth in Canadian broadcasting."

Vancouver's 99.3 The Fox, wrapped up its Santa Fox Food Drive in July after 99 hours of live broadcasting from a downtown Safeway location.



RANDOM -Alternative Various Artists Beggar's Banquet BBQCD 195-Koch

While Gary Numan might have enjoyed precisely fifteen minutes of fame, his songs outlived him by years because their contribution to the pop musical universe was so distinctive. And not surprising; mechanical, neatly groomed, manikin serious, Numan was one of the original New Wave visionaries, standing out like a synthetic thumb in a musical form still obsessed with the fleshy realities of rock and roll's good time milieu. Now, some seventeen years after that short but far from minor blip on the screen of modern experimental music, Numan becomes the subject of this flattering two CD compilation of his best material covered by new voices. Among them St. Etienne, Gravity Kills, Jesus Jones, Underdog, The Orb, Chris Holmes, Republica and Pop Will Eat Itself, a list of names with a penchant for off centre leanings and barely a whit of resemblance to the performer. It's hard to mess with Numan's songs to any great length but the artists involved make the best of it, bringing out the muted alternative rock, dance pop or electronica that has apparently lain dormant within Numan's material all these years. The results, which include a solo piano version of Are Friends Electric? and banjo on I Die You Die are a hit and miss affair but are certainly never uninteresting. And we think papa Numan would be proud: while he might have been disappointed that his star did shine but a little, the spirit that gave him what he got certainly didn't die with the album sales. Worth several real cool singles if radio decides they can hack it. -RG


Tia is the new dance sensation heating up the dance floor with a sexually charged first single called Slip N Slide. It's an irresistible track with a clever metaphor that seems to have been fashioned meticulously as a summer hit. It works. Maybe too well, which is why we here

THE MUTTON BIRDS -Alternative Envy Of Angels EMI 14922-F

You were mildly introduced to this New Zealand quartet a short while ago through a very conservative cover of Blue Oyster Cult's Don't Fear The Reaper (for a film called The



Frighteners). It was a pretty low key intro to a band that has a lot of natural songwriting talent, mainstream alternative crossover stuff that is so easy to crank out but difficult to make memorable. The Mutton Birds succeed in both camps with tunes like She's Been Talking, April and Ten Feet Tall which, though they don't stray far from an interest in orthodox rock pop, don't lose themselves in the format.But it's tracks like Trouble With You (with it's three dimensional chorus which doesn't require a second listen to hit home) that really throw the covers off the songwriting talent residing here. EMI are giving the Mutton Birds a hefty promotional push in Canada via a spot on Another Roadside Attraction and the tactic seems to be a sensible one. Taking into account the altrock commercial crowd that the Mutton Birds are a natural fit for, there couldn't be a better introduction. That having been said, it's a shame that the overwhelming majority of bands that go for this market early on get lost in the cracks. It takes something really special within the stark familiarity of the music for it to avoid the little spaces; that, and a little luck. North Of The Ridges

Rodeo International-502 (Holborne)


It's tough to put a tag on this Newmarket, Ontario band. They're certainly alternative, but not in the restrictive sense. They're a little bit country, a little bit rock, a little bit pop, a little bit roots and it's all straight-ahead, pure entertainment with an edge. And that's perhaps the band's key to gaining a large campus audience and an even wider audience at country, particularly with new country programmers. A number of these programmers and even contemporary country programmers have given the nod to Harness The Wind, the first single taken from this album. All the material was written by the Ducks, who are Justin Renwick (drums, percussion, vocals), Duncan Swain (guitar),



and Andrew Walker (vocals, harmonica, guitar). The album was recorded at Toronto's Studio 306 and Puck's Farm in Schomberg, Ontario. The fiddle work by Graham Townsend on the title track is an attention getter, making this a key track. Also key is Maybe When with a piano intro by Hennie Bekker. But don't overlook Simpler Things, which could be a leftfielder, and watch for crossover action on all three of the above tracks. The vocal approach is intense, almost impatient which adds a spontaneous freedom of spirit to the lyrics. Nice pacing and excellent balance. The door has already been opened for the Ducks, who have also gained an audience in Europe, and this release could swing it open even wider. Besides Bekker and Townsend, the band's sound was augmented by Jason Wilson on keys (Hammond B-3) and vocals, and Jeff Quick on bass and vocals.


KENNY DRISCOLL If You Believe In Me Gen-Mac-1202 (Page)

Driscoll, a Prince Edward Islander, adopted the title of this record from the late Gene MacLellan's Shilo Song, a key track here and a song that shows the direction Driscoll is heading. And, it's pretty evident in his own writing. He wrote all the other songs on the



album. Driscoll has a unique vocal styling, almost haunting, that creates a solid listening base for his message. There's a vocal

correctness that shadows each song, making all tracks key because of the overall listening entertainment. So, it's tough to recommend what would click at radio. All of it is great summertime, lazin' in the sun material. Take your pick. Producer Jackie Rae's touch is also evident. The session people are the best in the business, providing a lush orchestral, almost big band backing. The balance between vocals and instruments is also superb, a credit, no doubt to the Dave Audio studio. There's also an appealing, gospel-aire feel to the background vocals, supplied by Patsy Richard, Shawne Jackson, Sharon Lee Williams and Vivienne Williams. Driscoll has a lot going for him and any one of the tracks, released as a single could provide the vehicle to bigger happenings. Available through Page

THE JIMMY BRUNO TRIO - Cool Live At Birdland With special guest Bobby Watson Concord Jazz-4768

No doubt we're dating ourself with that cutline, but it seems to be the only one that properly applies. Oh, this is jazz alright, but it's quiet jazz. Yes, it can be fast-paced, almost frenetic but it's always quiet. Jimmy Bruno is a masterful guitarist especially strong with his finger work. Craig Thomas is quietly authoritative on bass and Vince Ector's drum support might well have been modelled after that of Guy Lombardo's original drummer. That's not meant as a pejorative, it's only to point out that his support is palpable, but almost unheard. The trio works well on a string of standards, but gets even with the addition of Bobby Watson and his alto sax. They groove on Parker's too rarely heard Segment and are almost airborne on his Anthropology but, always quietly, even in challenge passages. Oh, and don't worry about sound. It's a live recording but the sound is almost studio like. Only the applause of the appreciative audience lets -BW vou know otherwise.

While anticipation for the newest album from Prodigy was high, we don't think the industry as a whole actually thought that the arrival of The Fat Of The Land would debut this as a whole actually thought that the arrival of the Fat Of the Land would occur this English bad boy quartet at #1 retail. But there it is: two weeks and counting for this huge out of the box success story and landmark album for Canadian distributors Koch International, their first #1 debut victory in Canada. The reasons the disc has enjoyed such tremendous success even in the face of poor radio representation (admittedly more

than made up by MuchMusic) is obvious from a cursory spin of the record. The retail magic is in Prodigy's whirling ecstatic mix of techno, hip hop, funk and alternative rock that has been given a colourful face and attitude at the hands of bandmembers Keith Flint, Maxim, Liam Howlett and Leeroy. The truth is Prodigy haven't so much as lived up to the hype as they have single-handedly created it. The sound is unmistakeable to anyone who has had an ear in the industry for the last while, irrespective of whether they are familiar with the band or not; enough to say that Fat Of The Land is the stuff Bono was fantasizing about during his Pop sessions. Expect prodigy to work the album long and hard with a sizeable international tour and shenanigans at publicity junkets which will make them the

new gods of subversion. And if radio ever wakes up, may we suggest Firestarter, Breathe or Fuel My Fire. -RG







particularly his reworking of the Beatles' Things We Said Today. "A really beautiful song that should happen at A/C and country," he predicts. The first focus track off the album however, is Claudette, an old Roy Orbison song that gets a country spin from Yoakam. A number of pick hitters have already scored this one a hit. It's been a long time between hits for Yoakam, and this album, which was produced by Pete Anderson, has a lot of surprises. The Reprise people are really pushing the Yoakam image. Scheduled for a July release is Yoakam's Come On Christmas album. Included is his recording of Santa Claus Is Back In Town, a track that has appeared previously on compilations but makes its first appearance on one of his albums. Berry also dropped off Michael Peterson's self-titled album. The Seattle native caught country programmers by surprise with the great attention-getter, Drink, Swear, Steel & Lie, his debut single. which literally flew up US charts and has kicked in on this side of the border as well, bulleting up to #18 after only eight weeks of charting.

Montana Sky has kicked in with their new single, Heat Of The Night, that bullets up to #79 this week in its second week of charting. The band has a busy summer schedule playing fairs from Parry Sound to Windsor. They are firmed to play Agri-Fest '97 that takes place in late September or early October at the CNE in Toronto. A new album, titled Underneath The Moon, is currently in the works with producer Randall Prescott.

Danny Hooper chalked up another success when he hosted Bud Country in Grande Prairie, Alberta. During the weekend event, he sold 600 units of his new album, He's Buying Roses Again. Royalty, the Edmonton-based record company, reports pre-orders for the album were as high as "30 units per individual retail outlet." The album was available in stores on July 14.

Greg Hanna was in Toronto shooting the video for Ain't No Justice, his latest release. Bill Geffras, who is working with Hanna and tracking the single, reports a strong secondary base for the release that should become a chart item next week.


