Oh What A Feeling reveals the caring side of CARAS

A memorable ribbon-cutting ceremony took place at Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children (Sept. 9) when the hospital's new Starlight Room became a reality. Through the sale of the Juno Awards 25th anniversary commemorative CD boxed set Oh What A Feeling - A Vital Collection of Canadian Music, the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (CARAS) was able to donate more than 1.2 million dollars to the Starlight Foundation to support their projects, one being the special room at the Hospital for Sick Children.

The special room, is described as "a fun-filled place where children facing haematology and oncology treatments can go to play, be entertained and forget about the harsh realities of the serious illness that is part of their daily lives."

In accepting a specially-engraved plaque, Daisy Falle, president of CARAS paid tribute to the songwriters, recording artists, record labels and music publishers who contributed their share of the royalties from the sale of the boxed set, noting that the plaque "will be proudly displayed in the CARAS lobby on behalf of everyone in the music industry who contributed." Attending the ceremony on behalf of the artists who took part in the project was Ellen Reid of Crash Test Dummies.

Also benefiting from the CARAS project was Safehaven, which received more than \$400,000 to build a respite house for seriously disabled children.

The CARAS Music Education Trust Fund was another recipient of funding from the boxed set. Since the trust fund was set up, grants have been made to two inner city music programs: Dixon Hall Music School and St. Christopher's House; the Coalition for Music Education in Canada, Music Education 2000, the Canadian Association for Music Therapy, the Songwriters' Association of Canada and Frontier School's Metis Fiddling

Program in northern Manitoba.

Scholarships of \$1,000 are awarded each year to 11 students in music industry arts programs across Canada with one-time donations being made to the Fraser MacPherson Scholarship Fund and the Hagood Hardy Protege Honours Program.

The biggest project of the fund has been the Band-Aid program which placed musical instruments in the hands of more than 1,000 students at schools across Canada last year. Jazz pianist Jane Bunnett says the program will be an ongoing project of the CARAS Music Education Fund. "We're working with the Coalition for Music Education in Canada to help us find another group of schools that needs new band instruments."

Lhasa scheduled for Trinity St. Paul's Church

World music artist Lhasa is scheduled to play an intimate concert at Toronto's Trinity St. Paul's Church on Oct. 7 next.

Lhasa has just returned to Toronto from a trip to New York City where she signed a deal with Atlantic Records. Her debut album, La Llorono, has sold more than 65,000 units in Canada and has chalked up sales of over 50,000 units in Europe, which is rare for a world music artist. The album is expected to go platinum in Canada by the end of the year.

Ted Seto of Jane Harbury Publicity suggests that Lhasa's Toronto date will most likely be only one of a very few engagements in Canada before she begins her extensive promotional schedule in Europe and the U.S. Seto can be reached at 416-466-5020.

Steve Klein launches syndicated radio show

Steve Klein, described as a "veteran entrepreneur, motivational speaker and success coach," has launched a nationally syndicated daily radio show under the banner of A Motivational Minute. The show is billed as featuring "motivational thoughts, inspirational stories and tips for successful living and happiness."

Klein produces and hosts the show which is nationally sponsored by Eagle Professional Resources, a burgeoning Information Technology (IT) staffing company based in Ottawa.

Klein gained national recognition last year for his first radio feature, Career Wise, a syndicated radio show devoted entiredly to personal and small business marketing and career management. Klein built a network of 23 stations from coast to coast in Canada with an estimated 500,000 listeners tuning in every week.

"Some people go through life with their brakes on," says Klein, "restraining themselves in procrastination, fear and negative thinking. Others release the brakes and drive forward -- positively, logically and successfully."

As Klein explains, he fired up his new endeavour "to help Canadians release their parking brake and get going. I believe in the power of positive thinking and positive doing. Everything we need to achieve success can start today."

"It's who we are," says Eagle president Kevin

Dee. "We live what Steve is saying in A Motivational Minute. We believe if our people are happy and motivated, they're more productive. Steve has a great message to share with others."

Beginning Sept. 21, A Motivational Minute can be heard on select AM and FM stations across Canada. Klein is also hitting the road on a promotional tour which includes Vancouver (Sept. 14-15), Calgary (16-17), Edmonton (18), Toronto (22), Hamilton (23), Ottawa (25) and Montreal (28).

The Children's Group switches to Warner Music

Canadian distribution of The Children's Group catalogue is now handled by Warner Music Canada (effective Sept. 1/98), with the exception of Classical Kids/Enfants Classiques, French Repertoire, which will remain with PolyGram.

PolyGram ceased shipping The Children's Groups' titles by Aug. 31, cancelling all outstanding backorders as of that date. Warner Music Canada began authorizing returns on Sept. 1. It was pointed out by Dave Tollington, Senior Vice President and Managing Director of Warner Music Canada that all returns "must fall within Warner Music Canada's allowable return percentages as set out in its General Terms and Conditions of Sale."

Warner Music Canada will be responsible only for those advertising claims which it approved beginning Sept. 1.

The initial release under the new distribution will be Mozart's Magnificent Voyage. Among the more popular titles are Mr. Bach Comes To Call, Beethoven Lives Upstairs, Mozart's Magic Fantasy, Vivaldi's Ring of Mystery, Daydreams and Lullabies, Tchaikovsky Discovers America, Hallelujah Handel and more.

Classical Kids originator and producer Susan Hammond was recognized by the Canadian government with an Order of Canada for her contribution to the arts.





PolyGram's got the hits!!! It could go down as the biggest and noisiest industry party of the year. PolyGram's huge blowout at Toronto's Court House was mindful of the old fall plan days. The two floors were packed with food and bubbly and lots and lots of bodies. The demographics were interesting as well. From 85 all the way down to the late teens, an indication of the product about to be presented to the crowd by way of video. PolyGram has a huge chunk of rock, pop, urban, classical and country. It was pretty awesome. JR was looking pretty confident with his fired-up troops pumping up the crowd. A very healthy record company... I would say! (EC: It's about time we heard something positive!!!)

Biting the hand!!! Whining and bitching on a radio show about the lack of support from fans for their new album didn't win this particular group any brownie points. They just came off a multiplatinum album and because the new album didn't kick in right away they took to the airwaves to chastise their fans. There seems to be more of that. Success breeds contentment which leads to resentment if there's a blip in their careers. By the way, this wasn't a Canadian band. Their big day is coming up with witches and goblins. (EC: Hey! A clue!!!)

The day they stop listening!!! Radio is going through one of the worst periods in broadcasting history. According to Stats Canada, the tune-out factor is critical, with time spent listening to radio in Canada falling, and it's been falling for the past four years. A government agency can say it and everyone yawns, but when a spokesperson for a major private radio chain admits it, you have to snap around and pay attention. In a report in the Toronto Star (Sept. 9/98) Duff Roman, a vice-president of CHUM Ltd. and chair of the CAB, acknowledged "the downward trend." Interesting too is that the largest share of listeners -- 38.7 per cent -- were for the adult contemporary and oldies

rock music formats. And, look at this, according to the report, country music was second with a feeble 13.4 per cent, which doesn't say much for the rockers does it? "I think it's going to take some real diligent effort on the part of my colleagues in radio broadcasting to win back the young listener," Roman told the Star. Just as a footnote, some record companies have noticed this trend and have been directing their A&R expertise to that older demographic. (EC: Even the rockers have cooled it!!!) Now if someone could invent a single format and a hit mentality . . . we could get some excitement going! (EC: The day the music stopped???)

Shania will be a go-show!!! It was rumoured a few weeks ago that Shania Twain would be a no-show at this year's CCMA awards presentation. Apparently she WILL be attending and presenting, but not performing. Disappointing the couple of million CTV viewers, plus the five or six million TNN viewers, wouldn't have been a smart career move. By the way, Twain's first live pay-per-view TV special was to air the Saturday night of Country Music Week, which means she lost at least a couple of thousand viewers in the Calgary area. But it's the giant U.S. market the special is directed at, which should boost her record sales. (EC: And then TNN a few days later . . . WOW!!!) Shania knows where her roots are! (EC: ROOTS? Where's my jacket???)

Keep 'em waiting!!! At a recent benefit concert where tickets ranged from \$450 up, there was an uncomfortable delay in bringing on the star. Rumour has it, the artist's manager was backstage counting the money, every penny of the \$150,000, before he would let the curtain go up. It was also rumoured that more than \$900,000 was raised for the charity which got \$500,000 and the rest went for expenses, which included the star's fee. You gotta spend money to make money, right? (EC: Right! That's \$500,000 the charity might not have got anyway!!!)

Hang onto your money!!! For you EmmyLou Harris fans, her first independent album, Spyboy, has been released on her own label in the U.S. It's being imported into Canada with a price tag of \$29.00. The album will be released in Canada on the Stony Plain label in October, which is only a couple of weeks away, and you can save big. (EC: We can wait!!!)

Truly Canadian!!! I liked walking through The Bay looking for Anne or Celine . . . even Cher! I like to look through that Sears catalogue with the pictures of Michelle Wright! (EC: Beautiful!!!) Although I'm a great Eric Braden and Martha Wright fan . . . I really feel that the Truly Canadian Zellers should look at some of the emerging Canadian artists and personalities and do something . . . truly Canadian! (EC: Like The Bay did with Celine and Anne!!!) Don't cut up that credit card!

In defense of Howard Stern??? The Globe and Mail's television critic John Allemang had an interesting column in the Sept. 10 issue which he headlined "In defence of the offensive Howard Stern . . . sort of," and his spin on Stern is somewhat provocative . . . sort of! He touches on the farting thing, Richard Gere's penis and his gerbil, calling Val Kilmer "a prick", getting horny over the exploits of a hooker with Jerry Springer and more. Allemang writes that "Stern only exists because so much radio and TV is unbearably bland, and a surprisingly large part of his schtick consists of tell-it-like-it-is denunciations of media figures." The video of the single also garnered Adams a nomination for People's Choice; Favourite Canadian Artist for the upcoming MuchMusic Video Awards show (Sept. 24).

I Mother Earth signed to Mercury/PolyGram

I Mother Earth, an established multi-platinum act in Canada who are managed by Steve Herman and Keith Maryanovich of Core Audience, have been signed to the Mercury domestic roster. The band also has a substantial fan base in the U.S.

The band comprises brothers Jag (guitar/vocals) and Christian Tanna (drums), Bruce Gordon (bass) and lead vocalist Brian Byrne.

Pre-production of a new album is scheduled to begin next month for release early next year. The band has just completed a number of dates on the Summersault tour, which took them east from Ontario to Newfoundland.

Warner Music gold to fiddler Natalie MacMaster

It's very rare when a fiddle album can go gold in Canada. Natalie MacMaster did it earlier this year with No Boundaries, an album released in 1996, and she just recently did it again. Her second album, Fit As A Fiddle, which was produced at CBC Halifax, has been certified gold. But it wasn't a retail happening. Her manager André Bourgeois, suggests in a Halifax Herald story (Sept. 3/98) that "roughly 40,000 of those were sold 'off-stage' to audience members."

Interesting too is that since No Boundaries was certified in February, sales continue to the point where she just might make the platinum plateau (100,000 units) by the end of the year. Her third album, My Roots Are Showing, released earlier this year is closing in on gold.

The energetic Troy, Inverness County (Cape Breton) fiddler is constantly in demand and has tour dates pencilled in to the end of the year. Her September dates included Whitehorse in the Yukon, the Brandywine Mountain Music Festival in Woodstown, New Jersey, Rhode Island's Rhythm and Roots Festival, Campbellton, New Brunswick, Antigonish, Ottawa, Sault Ste Marie, the Petrillo Band Shell in Chicago, and Judique, Cape Breton.

October dates include Halifax, Ottawa, Calgary, and Boulder, Colorado. November is filling up nicely as well and includes dates in Texas, California, Oregon, New Mexico, Washington, Vermont, Maine and Pennsylvania. as well as a number of Canadian dates.

MacMaster's presence will also be felt at the Canadian Country Music Association's award show (Sept. 14) where she has been nominated with Cookie Rankin in the Vocal/Instrumental Collaboration category for the release of The Drunken Piper.

MacMaster, of course, is no stranger to awards, having wons several East Coast Music Awards.

Paddy Moloney's Fire goes gold in Canada

Chief Chieftain Paddy Moloney's latest project for the Wicklow label (BMG Classics), Fire In The Kitchen, has been certified gold in Canada. The album, which is a virtual who's who of Canadian celtic artists was released two months ago (RPM New Releases July 6/98).

Included on the album are The Rankins, Great Big Sea, Laura Smith, the Barra MacNeils, Mary Jane Lamond, Bottine Souriante, Leahy and Natalie MacMaster, who has two gold certified albums (see separate story).

Various members of the Chieftains are also on the album and were special guests at the Great Big Picnic which took place on Citadel Hill in Halifax on Sept. 12.

VAL LEROY Val Leroy Lonetree - oo1

A new and very polished voice from the west, Val LeRoy has the vocal property of a seasoned performer, which isn't too difficult to recognize being that she has been performing since she was three. There's a matter-of-fact delivery that LeRoy has mastered that gives urgency to her song material. A perfect example of this is Do You Have One More Night, a song she wrote with well-known Vancouver songwriter Ron Irving and producer/songwriter Tony Rudner, who also produced this album. The same trio of writers also wrote Who Knew, which is also a key track. But don't overlook the Phil Swann/John Blaylock penning of From The Looks Of You Now, which could be a left-fielder. All tracks are either two or four-parts Cancon. Recorded at Vancouver's Baker Street, Crosstown and Soltone Recording studios. Session musicians included drummer Randall Stoll, bassist Miles Hill, Dave Pickett on piano and organ, guitarist Robbie Steininger, Jesse Zubot on fiddle, pedal steelman Jim Dorin and Michael Norman on keys. Gordon Maxwell and Joani Bye supplied background vocals.

THE TILLER'S FOLLY The View From Here Way Cool-01 (Festival)

Put your dancing boots on and get ready for a toe-tapping, hand clapping celtic surprise from Canada's west coast. That's right, the west coast. And hearin' is believin'. These guys have a handle on celtic music that makes one wonder if they aren't in fact a resurrection of the real thing. There's an incredible fusion of the traditional with the new, all of the new written by lead Tiller Bruce Coughlan, who is also heard on acoustic guitar, wood flute and whistles. The band is reviving B.C.'s culture with songs from the Pacific Northwest that reveal a very exciting and almost forgotten heritage. There isn't a clunker in the lot. But wrap your ears around The Ghosts of Read Island, Mormond Braes, John Antle with backing vocals by Tatiana Hancheroff, Mission Ships and The Musical Priest. Priceless gems. The other Tiller guys are Laurence Knight on vocals and acoustic basses who also produced the album, Craig McGregor on acoustic and



electric guitars, mandolin and octave mandolin. fiddleman Mike Sanyshy who also doubles on mandolin, and Victor Smith on fiddle, silver flute, whistles and vocals. Recorded at MagicLab Recording in Surrey, B.C.

JIMMY WIFFEN - Country Chances Are **Entertainment Unlimited-50643**

Not too many of today's young country recording artists have the ability or the talent to write and perform original or new works in that convincing manner that sets the traditionalists apart from the pretenders. Newfoundlander Wiffen makes entertainment his priority with this package of delightful, down-to-earth and memorable offerings of the country side of the rock. Wiffen's vocal character adds to his personna, which



conjures up memories of the good old radio days of the Grand Ole Opry. He has a message and he knows how to set it up so that it connects immediately. Wiffen's musical signature is established here. Key are Boulevard Of Broken Dreams, Caught in The Rain, But Your Feet Are Too Big and the title track. Also patch into Line Dancin' and She Shook Me (Just To Shake Me). Great stuff. Produced by Wiffen and recorded at Nickel Sound Works. The professional backing goes without question. Too many to give proper kudos to. 100 per cent Cancon.

- Country/Blues ARTHUR FAIR Pass The Winter Arthur Fair-1001

This Bonnyville, Alberta singer/songwriter has a story to tell. In fact he has ten memorable experiences, all of which paint pictures of joy, happiness, a little funky despair, and all memorable. Fair is a master storyteller, a troubadour who paints an aural picture of the old west with his emotionally-driven and descriptive lyrics. That husky vocal property with its R&B influence impacts immediately and captures the very essence of these tales. The production is simple and very pristine and Fair's balance of instruments is extraordinary to say the least He used the MIDI program where he plays one instrument and has electric synchronization from whatever other instrument or instruments he wants, keyboards, percussion, guitar et cetera. His talent with the guitar is exceptional, like he was




born with one in his hands. His first guitar was given to him at age three by an old blues player in the Grand Cayman Islands. By the time he was 12 he was teaching lessons. He refers to Pass The Winter as "cold, bleak, stark and so alone," a bit negative, but a hook nevertheless. All 10 tracks are Fair originals. The title track is key, but so is She Keeps The Music In My Song and I Took The Back Roads Home. The

JUAN TOMAS The Guitar Player Martin Records-102

Many North Americans believe that flamenco guitar is either blazing hot or dramatically languid. Of course it can be but it can also be gentle, even laid back in approach. Torontobased Juan Tomas seems to have elected for the last named in a pleasant programme of new recordings and others from the eighties. We stress the former release dates because, truth to tell, we were unaware of Juan Tomas until now and are annoyed that we've missed the pleasure of his playing all this time. Anyway, we're also grateful for an album filled with grace and even a soupcon of humour. Among the 14




tracks we have a brace of personal favourites both sambas, probably because that's the dance we most enjoy doing. The titles are Coco and Sugar Bread. As Old Blue Eves put it. "Nice and easy does it every time." Produced by Tomas and recorded at Rich Dodson's Marigold Studios in Toronto. It's assumed that all tracks are Cancon although there is no -BW MAPL logo visible on the artwork.

JACKIE TERRASSON TRIO - Jazz Alive

Pianist Jackie Terrasson is one of the many stars scheduled to appear at this year's Toronto stop of the J.V.C. Jazz and Urban Rhythm Festival. He appeared recently with Jon Ballantyne and Dewey Redman in a FREE afternoon concert at Harbourfront's Molson Place. While you're anticipating, give an ear to this satisfying album recorded live at NYC's



Iridium Jazz Club. There are only seven tracks one of them, Love For Sale, goes by 9.37 minutes with relentless vamping -- but each one is like a fine cocktail that quenches but leaves one wanting more. Terrasson's improvisational skills are beyond question but we suggest he's equally well served by his sidemen. Leon Parker on drums can be dramatic or gentle; Ugonna Okegwa on acoustic bass is stellar either in rhythm. accompaniment or in solo flight. Both seem able to anticipate Terrasson's every time and key change. Quite remarkable by any standard and most pleasurable to the ear. -RW

ROBERT WYATT Nothing Can Stop Us Old Rottenhat

Hannibal Rykodisc-1434

We see where one of the US glossies has given an A rating to Wyatt's earlier albums, Rock Bottom and Stranger Than Richard which were recorded shortly before an accident left him a paraplegic about twenty years ago. Evidently buoyed by their success these two further albums of originals and covers have been issued. One wishes it were possible to give them an A also, even though RPM doesn't rate that way. The fact is though, that there's not really that much to them except what sounds like whining over the injustices of the world. One realizes that it isn't a perfect world and one also sympathises with Wyatt's misfortunes before or after his accident, but it remains that protest though necessary, if that's what is intended, isn't entertaining.


ALBUM PICK

ROY FORBES Crazy Old Moon AKA-1004 (Festival)

This is vintage Bim, as we remember him from the early '70s when he released on the A&M label. That was then, Crazy Old Moon and Roy Forbes is now. But that off-the-cuff folksy and soulful traditionalist bent impacts immediately as Bim's musical signature. One might wonder aloud why this incredible talent from Dawson Creek isn't a member of this country's recording elite? There's no pretension with Forbes. He writes from the

heart and he sings from the heart, displaying a vocal agility that few of his peers can match. Forbes wrote all the material here and picking a favourite track is impossible. Powered By Love certainly sets the pace for what follows. If I Were A Raven, a gift to his mother on her 75th birthday, is classic, as is I'm On The Edge, Green Emotions, Nothing Like Lonesome and the title track, all of which add to his personna of being a one-man show. There's no mistaking his guitar work on both acoustic and electric guitars. That's Cindy Church doing the harmony vocal work on No One To Talk To But The Moon. He's got some great session musicians

with fiddleman Calvin Vollrath, trumpeter Brad Turner, John Reischman on mandolin, soprano saxophonist Claire Lawrence, Robbie King on organ and piano, Miles Hill on acoustic and electric bass, percussionist Salvador Ferreras, Doug Edwards with electric bass on Green Emotions and I'm On The Edge, and drummer Jerry Adolphe. With that kind of backing you can well imagine the entertainment value here.

Canadian Country Music Week Spotlight



A country star system recognized around the world

Calgary is setting for Canadian country love-in

Canada's country music industry is on display in Calgary Sept. 11-14) with four days of seminars, showcases, networking, and industry citation awards, culminating with the grand finale, the Canadian Country Music Association's annual awards show. The CTV telecast is expected to attract an audience of over two million in Canada and with the Nashville Network (TNN) airing the show two days later, viewership of the biggest night in Canadian country music could conceivably reach six million around the world.

This year's show is being emceed by Medicine Hat's Terri Clark who, in her very short career, is already an established star in both countries. The best in Canadian country music will be paraded before the television audience as performers and presenters in what's expected to be a benchmark production under the director/producer guidance of Michael Watt, Howard Rosen and "the voice" of the awards Cliff Dumas who partnered Roadhouse Productions.

Traditionally, radio and music square off with heated discussions; and some name-calling but, in the end mutual respect for each other prevails which adds strength to both industries in general.

As we close in on the new millennium, discussion between radio and record people should be paramount. The broadcasters have a full plate and they'll let it all hang out with two seminars: Living with the new Cancon requirements and From the trenches; a report from the front lines of American and Canadian country radio. Country broadcasters and country recording artists will have the opportunity to go head-to-head with a panel of distinguished guests from both industries, a seminar expected to become very heated.

The seminars have been designed to be both educational and informative with the emphasis on the independent sector. Seminars are panelled by seasoned and knowledgable artists, record executives, performance rights and radio people, who will dispense valuable hints for the new and established artist on protecting copyrights, keeping the voice in shape, recording sessions, promoting releases, important hints on songwriting and what to do with the finished product.

For new and established artists, independent label people, up-and-coming A&R and record executives and doubting Thomases from both industries, these seminars are invaluable. The very glitter of Canada's country star system is proof there's room at the top for more players to gain national and international fame.

Take, for instance, Shania Twain, the most popular female country singer in history, having sold more albums than any other female singer. This year,

she has been nominated for eight CCMA awards: Female Vocalist, the Fans' Choice Award, Album and Single, SOCAN Song of the Year and Video of the Year awards (for Don't Be Stupid), and Vocal Collaboration. Twain's album, Come On Over is the only Canadian record listed among the five top selling country albums. Ironically, Twain is still considered a newcomer.

Also regarded as newcomers are Universal recording artist Jason McCoy with six nominations; ViK's Julian Austin with five, Universal's Farmer's Daughter and Columbia's Lisa Brokop with three each. Although "newcomer" would appear to be key this year, established artists like Michelle Wright and Paul Brandt retain their popularity with three nominations each, as does Charlie Major who has been nominated in two categories.

The fan vote is also key and through telephone voting right up to midnight the day before the awards show, they will decide who will win the CMT Maple Leaf Foods Fans' Choice Award. The nominees are Paul Brandt, Terri Clark, Farmer's Daughter, Jason McCoy and Shania Twain.

The Wrangler Rising Star opens the door for young artists and for A&R people looking for newcomers who have potential. This year's nominees are Chris Cummings, Gil Grand, Bruce Guthro, Beverley Mahood and Rick Tippe.

Of particular importance is the industry recognizing itself through its Citation Awards which honours the behind-the-scenes people and organizations, without whom there would be no country music industry. The categories cover record company person of the year, artist managers, booking agencies, radio stations, music and program directors and on-air personalities, music publishing, record production, retailing, record companies, country clubs and individual musicians and more.

Another highlight of Canadian Country Music Week '98 is the honouring of those who have dedicated their lives and careers to country music. Ray Griff, who has been a mainstay in country music for almost 40 years on both sides of the border will be inducted into the Canadian Country Music Association Hall of Honour. Griff recently returned home to Calgary where he has set up a production and consultation company. He first headed for Nashville in 1962 when he was 20. He became a popular fixture on Music City Row as a songwriter and in Nashville proper as a producer and performer.

Also stepping into the Hall of Honour arena is veteran broadcaster Bill Anderson who will receive CCMA's Stan Klees Industry Builder Award. Anderson was the original conduit between radio and the record industry back in the '70s when radio was warring with the CRTC over the 30 per cent Cancon regulations. Through his syndicated radio shows, Opry North and Big Country, Anderson carried the Cancon country message to radio listeners across Canada.





Canadian Country Music Award Male Vocalist Nominees

JASON McCOY

Born in Minesing, Ontario 27 years ago, Jason McCoy's good looks, power-packed singles and hectic tour schedule has created a fan base that stretches



from ocean to ocean in Canada. McCoy has been working with Nashville writers over the past year, He is currently charting with I'm Gonna Make Her Mine, a song that came from that Nashville connection. Born Again In Dixieland, a hardhitting single that peaked at #3 (Sept. 29/97), has been nominated for the SOCAN Song of the Year. McCoy wrote the song with Naoise Sheridan and Dennis Carr. The single was released on his Universal album Playin' For Keeps. McCoy is nominated for five other CCMA awards this year: CMT Maple Leaf Foods Fans' Choice Award, Single and Video for Born Again In Dixieland, Album for Playin' For Keeps and Male Vocalist.

DUANE STEELE

A native of Hines Creek, Alberta, Duane Steele became a solo artist after paying his dues in the Rock 'N Horse Band, which he founded and which won a Juno nomination as Best Country Band in 1992. After deciding to go solo, he showcased during Canadian Country Music Week '94 in Calgary where, much to his astonishment, he found himself signed directly to Nashville's Mercury label. Anita Got Married, the first single from his debut album, P.O. Box 423, hit the top of the RPM Country 100 on July 8/96, spawning several other hits.



He recently completed his second album for Mercury titled This Is The Life. Right From The Start, a song written by Steele and Tim Taylor, has been taken as the first single. Steele is nominated for a CCMA award this year as Male Vocalist and his song, Tell The Girl, which he wrote with John Robbins, has been nominated for a SOCAN Song of the Year award.


JULIAN AUSTIN

There's no denying it, ViK/BMG recording artist Julian Austin can take a bow as being the fastest-rising new star in Canadian country music. The Fredericton, New Brunswick-born Austin enjoys the tag of "bad boy" of country music and has the muscle power to back it up, which is a great hook and door-opener into radio. With his first single release, Little Ol' Kisses, an Austin original, he scored a #1 hit (RPM - July 27/97), and he hasn't looked back since. This song won him a nomination this year for SOCAN Song of the Year. He has also been nominated in four other categories: Male Vocalist, Video and Single for Little Ol' Kisses and for Album of the Year for What My Heart Already Knows. Last year he won the CCMA Rising Star Award. Austin is currently charting with Hard Time Loving You, another Austin original taken from his album What My Heart Already Knows. The album was produced by Austin's longtime friend Daniel LeBlanc who has been nominated this year for a CCMA Industry Citation Award in the Record Producer category.





GIL GRAND

Newcomer, Sudbury, Ontario native Gil Grand impacted almost immediately on the release of his first single, Famous First Words, which peaked at #6 on the RPM Country 100 (Aug. 10/98), an indication of Grand's potential. Rarely does a new artist get into the Top 10 of a national chart with a debut single. Grand's first break came after a showcase during Canadian Country Music Week in Calgary. His talent came to the attention of TMP Music publisher Frank Davies, who introduced the young songwriter to Nashville legend Byron who produced Hill,

Grand's album and co-wrote eight of the songs on the album, which is released on the Monument label out of Nashville. His follow-up single, Let's Start Livin', is now at country radio. This year Grand has the distinction of delivering the first words at Country Music Week with the opening concert on Sept. 12 at 10:15 am. Grand has been nominated as Male Vocalist and as Wrangler Rising



PAUL BRANDT

Born in Calgary and now living in Nashville, Paul Brandt has paid off his believers and supporters in spades. Brandt sidestepped the frustrating and



sometimes lengthy process of releasing first as an independent artist, signing directly to the Reprise label in Nashville in 1996. Each of his singles released that year topped the RPM Country 100 and he became a favourite with country programmers on both sides of the border. Brandt is breaking nationally with his latest single, Outside The Frame, the title song of his Reprise album which has enjoyed 50 weeks on the RPM Country Albums chart. His new single was the most added, entering the RPM Country 100 at #74 on Sept. 7/98. Brandt won three CCMA awards last year: Male Vocalist and Single and Video for I Do. This year he has

again been nominated for three awards: CMT Maple Leaf Foods Fans' Choice Award, Album for Outside The Frame and Male Vocalist.

John Landry will be networking the CCMA's

Montreal native John Landry will be in full networking force at this years CCMA's. The lanky framed 29 year old who feels at home in a Stetson, has decided to play guitar and sing for a living rather then pursue a career as flight medic which he trained so hard for. Once you hear his voice, you'll understand

When an artist is asked who influenced their career, most talk about those in the music industry whose accomplishments have paved a trail for others to follow. With no exception to the rule, Landry is happy to say that one of his biggest influences is Canada's own Jamie Warren. He met Warren while performing in the opening spot for Julian Austin at a fundraiser. Taking some

good directional advice from Warren, Landry made an appointment to meet with Richard J. Hutt of Cedar Tree Studios. Landry showed up with no demo tape, yet he did bring his guitar and magical baritone voice. Hutt was instantly interested.

Now in the final stages of production for his debut CD produced by Hutt, Landry has completed a video ready for CMT to coincide with the first single, There You Were, already at radio

Music was the career route Landry wanted to pursue, a decision he made quite easily. "I wrote a song about a friend who was having a hard time dealing with some issues," Said Landry. "The song affected her in a way simple words couldn't have. That was the first time I realized the power of music and that I want to spend the rest of my life making it."



Canadian Country Music Award Female Vocalist Nominees

SHANIA TWAIN


This has been a big year for Shania Twain. The Mercury recording star mounted her first ever tour that drew capacity crowds to her dates in Canada and the U.S. The Timmins, Ontario-born Twain has sold more records around the world than any other female country artist. Earlier this year she set a record by having three singles on the RPM Country 100 at the same time: From This Moment On, a #1 single (Aug. 3/98) You're Still The One, a #1 single (April 13/98) and Don't Be Stupid (You Know I Love You), which also topped the chart (Jan. 19/98), the first female country artist to do so. Twain is now making her way up the chart with her latest single, Honey, I'm Home, another song she wrote with her husband Robert J. (Mutt) Lange. Twain has been nominated for six CCMA awards: CMT Maple Leaf Foods Fans' Choice Award, Single for You're Still The One, Album for Come On Over, Video for Don't Be Stupid, Top Selling Album for Come On Over and Female vocalist. She has also been nominated in the Vocal/Instrumental Collaboration category for From This Moment On, a duet with Bryan White





MICHELLE WRIGHT

Being the cover girl of Sears Catalogue didn't do Michelle Wright any harm. Born near Chatham, Ontario and now living in Nashville, Wright gained national recognition almost immediately with her first single, I Want To Count On You, released on the Savannah label in 1986. She began winning awards in 1989 continuing right through to 1995. Wright's fan base continues to grow both in Canada and the U.S. After her highly successful Chevy Truck tour, Wright and her longtime manager Brian Ferriman went back on the road this year, playing a number of smaller centres "places we might not play in a touring year," says Ferriman. It was the right move at the right time, giving a larger number of her fans the opportunity to see her in concert. She played dates in B.C. and Alberta and Saskatchewan including the Big Valley Jamboree and in Ontario at the Festival of the Islands in Gananoque. Wright's most successful date was the Corn Festival in Tecumseh, which is close to her hometown. Fans numbering more than 20,000, set a record to see their favourite country music star. In the pre-production stages now for the Arista recording star is a Greatest Hits package. Wright has been nominated this year as Female Vocalist and her release, Your Love, a collaboration with Jim Brickman has been nominated in the categories of Vocal/Instrumental Collaboration and Video of the Year.






TERRI CLARK

Besides emceeing this year's Canadian Country Music Awards, Terri Clark has made 1998 a memorable year in her career. The Medicine Hat, Alberta native, now living in Nashville, has just completed a hectic tour schedule of both Canada and the U.S., which has expanded her fan base in both countries. The Mercury recording artist has also made good inroads in the U.S. with her most recent single, Now That I Found You. Clark is beginning to break nicely in Canada with her latest single, You're Easy On The Eyes, a song she wrote with Tom Shapiro and Chris Waters. Both tracks are included on her Mercury album How I Feel which was produced by Keith Stegall. The album has enjoyed 15 weeks on the RPM Country Albums chart. Besides being nominated for a CMT Maple Leaf Foods Fans' Choice Award, Clark has been nominated as Female Vocalist and in the Vocal/Instrumental Collaboration category for Love Of My Life, a duet with Sammy Kershaw.

TRACEY BROWN

From 1976 right through to 1990, Ottawa Valley's Family Brown was the dominant force in Canadian country music. The youngest member of the family, Tracey, continues in the Brown tradition. Joining brother Barry and Randall Prescott, now her husband, the trio released under the name of Prescott-Brown. Tracey moved into the solo artist field with the release of Woman's Work that entered the RPM Country 100 on June 8 of this year, bulleting up the chart in succeeding weeks and up to #13 this week. The quick response by country radio programmers opened the door for Brown to be nominated in the Female Vocalist of the Year category this year. The single is the title track of Brown's debut album, released on the Popular label. The album was produced by Prescott with Jon Park-Wheeler and Stewart Harris. Two of the songs on the album were written by Barry Brown. The album is dedicated to the memory of Tracey's brother Morgan who died in November of





1996. His voice is heard on the track Farewell Old Friend, a song he recorded in hopes of raising awareness for the fight against AIDS. The publishing royalties from this track are to be donated to Casey House in Toronto in his honour. Brown and husband Randall Prescott recently crossed the country on a promotion/performance trip re-acquainting Brown with her many friends in country radio.

LISA BROKOP

Born near Vancouver in 1973, Lisa Brokop made her impact on country music when she arrived in Nashville in 1992 where she almost immediately became a teenage country star. Much has happened to Brokop over those six years, during which time she released three albums. But the most important happening

was signing this year to Columbia. Her debut album for the label, When You Get To Be You, was produced by Paul Worley and Dann Huff and the initial single How Do I Let Go, which she wrote with Karen Taylor-Good, made impressive inroads up the charts in both Canada and the U.S. The Columbia people on both sides of the border realize Brokop's potential and expect to bring her back into the mainstream with her follow-up single What's Not To Love, a song she wrote with Canadian Cyril Rawson and Nashville writer Ron Harbin. Brokop has been nominated for a Canadian Country Music Award in the Female Vocalist category.



Canadian Country Music Award HALL OF HONOUR INDUCTEES



RAY GRIFF CCMA Hall Of Honour Inductee

Calgary-born singer/songwriter Ray Griff will be inducted into the Canadian Country Music Association Hall of Honour this year during Canadian Country Music Week '98. Griff moved to Nashville 36 years ago at age 20, where he was one of the first Canadians to make an impact on Music City U.S.A. He was also one of the first Canadians to discover that making it in Nashville wasn't a cake walk, and returned home to Calgary. However, when one of the big names in country music, Jim Reeves, recorded one of his songs, Griff went back to Nashville to try again. In between working as a piano repair man and in a record pressing plant, he managed to shop his songs and got a job with a music publisher in exchange for \$30 a week and a place to sleep in the back office. Griff has written more than 2,000 songs and scored 50 singles in the Top 100 of the RPM Country 100. His first Top 10 single was Don't Lead Me On (RPM - March 22/ 65). He wrote Canadian Pacific which topped the chart for George Hamilton IV (RPM - Aug. 2/69) and Dirty Old Man,

another #1 hit (June 2/73). He has also had his material recorded by Loretta Lynn, Wayne Newton, Dolly Parton, Porter Wagoner, Jerry Lee Lewis, Faron Young, Mel Tillis, Johnny Horton, Dave

> Dudley and more. Griff has now returned home to Calgary where he has established a production and consulting service, but will maintain his Nashville connection.

He was also one of the architects of the Canadian Country Music Awards, working with other members of the awards committee, mapping the rules, defining categories and setting voting procedures. Although he hosts the morning show for Toronto classic music station CFMX-FM. he continues to act as a national host on the country format of the Pelmorex Radio Network, which is heard on 35 radio stations across Canada.

Canadian Country Music Week and the CCMA awards show are not just a once-a-year-happening. CCMA president Tom Tompkins and executive director Sheila Hamilton along with a number of year-round employees and volunteer members of various committees to improve on each year's event. As the curtain goes down on the awards show, work begins almost immediately on next year's industry extravaganza which returns to Hamilton.

BILL ANDERSON Stan Klees Industry Builder Award

Veteran broadcaster Bill Anderson will be inducted into the Hall of Honour when he receives the CCMA's Stan Klees Industry Builder Award. Anderson was a leading radio programmer during the mid-'70s in the promotion of Canadian content at a time when it wasn't fashionable or acceptable by his fellow broadcasters. It was while he was at CFGM, then a major

country listening post in Canada. Anderson helped structure Opry North, a radio program created by the late Dave Johnson, syndicated service that took live country music Canada. across Moving to Toronto's CFRB, he launched Big Country, a program that was heard on more than 100 stations across Canada which, over its 10 years, attracted a weekly audience of a million listeners. Anderson wrote, produced, handled interviews and hosted the show. Interesting too is that the show which was designed to present



country music to people who thought they didn't like it, was carried by a number of non-country stations, including poppy CFRB. The industry rewarded Anderson by voting him Canadian Country Radio Personality six times from 1977 to 1985. Anderson was also a major player in the creation of the CCMA awards, who, with a group of members, mapped the rules, defined the categories and set voting procedures. In 1991 he helped transform KEY 590, a Toronto oldies station, into Country 59, which became Canada's most listened-to country station of the time. Although hosting the morning show at Classical 106-FM in Toronto, Anderson continues as a national host on the country format of the Pelmorex Radio Network, which is heard on 35 stations across Canada.


