

Boy Scout Jamboree Heralded in NBC Series

In observance of the twenty-fifth birthday celebration of the Boy Scouts of America and in preparation for the First National Boy Scout Jamboree from August 21 to August 30, when more than 30,000 scouts will encamp in Washington, a series of dramatic sketches dedicated to Boy Scouts of the nation will be broadcast over a coast-to-coast National Broadcasting Company network.

The series, entitled "Heading for the Jam-

The series, entitled "Heading for the Jamboree," will present skits depicting the adventures and efforts of Scout Tommy Webster in his plans to attend the gathering in Washington. The second skit will be presented on Monday, July 15, over an NBC-KGO network at 3:45 p. m., P. S. T., and remaining programs in the series will be heard on following Monday afternoons at the same hour

The Jamboree in the nation's capitol will be the largest gathering of boys ever held in any one place on American soil. The Scouts will erect a "tent city" of their own within the shadow of the Washington Monument which will have its own telephone exchange, newspaper, sewage and water system, and hospitals. All the resources of the Army and the Navy have been put at the disposal of the Committee on Arrangements and construction of necessary facilities is now well under way. More than 500 Scouts from foreign countries are expected to attend.

Professor Fiddle Dee Dee Is Wendell Hall

Professor Fiddle Dee Dee, originator and chief authority on seriology and what-have-you, is disrupting the NBC network airwaves with an as yet unidentified brand of foolishness each Wednesday morning at 7:15 a. m., P. S. T.

Before donning his mortar board (constructed of cement) and robes (of sack cloth), Professor Fiddle Dee Dee was known to NBC listeners as Wendell Hall, the Red-Headed Music Maker. A worm cant' turn overnight, so the dee dee's and dum dum's of the familiar ukulele, employed by Hall first as a music-maker and now as a singing comedian, are still an integral part of the new NBC series.

Music Hall to Offer "Concerts Intime"

A series of summer concerts known as "Concerts Intime"—and, which, living up to its name, will be in light, intimate style—will be presented in the Music Hall on the Air broadcast over an NBC nationwide network every Sunday, at 8:30 a. m., P. S. T.

The concerts will be offered as particularly appropriate to the warm weather season. In September the Music Hall of the Air will return to operatic and symphonic concerts. Viola Philo, dramatic soprano, and Jan

Peerce, tenor, will be soloists in the Concerts Intime, along with numerous other well-known radio entertainers.

Veteran Program in Series

The Atwater Kent program presenting eminent stars of the opera and concert stages, will return to the air again in September for its 1935-36 series of music concerts over a nation-wide network. Neither the chain nor the time has yet been decided upon, but the sponsor hopes to obtain a Sunday night spot. The tradition of "fine music by the best artists" will be adhered to, the announcement stated.

The Atwater Kent program first appeared on the air Sunday night, October 4, 1925, presenting Reinald Werrenrath, the baritone, with Josef Pasternack's orchestra. It was broadcast from WEAF over eighteen stations, the largest hookup then possible.

Grantland Rice in New Series



News and Comment

ITH leaders of the nation in stellar microphone rôles, the closing sessions of the 74th Congress will be broadcast about July 15, over both NBC and CBS networks to the entire nation.

In succeeding evening broadcasts just prior to the closing session NBC will present two interesting and educational programs. The first, a dramatic portrayal of the historical highlights of the most important sessions of Congress from the birth of our country to the present time, followed the next evening by a dramatic presentation of the highlights of the Congress soon to draw to a close.

The first program will originate in the Radio City studios with some of radio's best known actors taking the parts of the country's leading statesmen in re-enacting historical events in Congress during the past 160 years.

The presentation of the highlights of this session of Congress will feature the voices of the statesmen of today—distinguished members of the Senate and the House of Representatives—who have been invited to present discussions on the legislation which they have championed during the past six months. An announcer will introduce each of the speakers and the program will originate from the Senate wing of the U. S. Capitol Building in Washington.

CBS will present the closing session of the House of Representatives and a word picture and review of the work of the Senate from just off the Senate floor. The famed "Fourth Estate"—the press galleries—will take part this year under arrangements now under consideration by Thomas L. Stokes of the New York World Telegram and chairman of the Standing Committee of Correspondents. Newspapermen who have "covered" Congress during the session will be asked to give their impressions of the accomplishments of the membership and of the closing hours of Congress.

Each year at the end of the Congressional session, throngs of sightseers jam the halls of the Capitol and Capitol Plaza. CBS microphones will bring a word picture of this color-

ful scene from positions on the East Steps overlooking the Plaza and from the South Corridor on the first floor of the Senate wing of the Capitol, patterned after Columbia's "Man in the Street" programs. The Speaker of the House of Representatives, Joseph W. Byrns, will be asked to review the work of his chamber from his office and both Vice-President Garner and Majority Leader Joseph T. Robinson of Arkansas, will be asked to speak from the office of the Secretary of the Senate on the work of the Senate.

Announcement of the exact date of the program cannot be made at this date, but the broadcasts of both NBC and CBS promise to outshine anything ever done in connection with airing the opening or closing of a session of Congress.

Benay Venuta in New CBS Series

Benay Venuta, glamorous golden-haired singing star who within a few brief weeks has scaled the ladder of radio fame, is launching her own series of programs over the Columbia network each Sunday from 6:30 to 6:45 p. m., P. S. T., preparing to take a movie test for a picture with Bing Crosby.

Kaltenborn from London

H. V. Kaltenborn, famous world traveler, author and news commentator for the Columbia Broadcasting System, will be heard in a series of broadcasts from Europe on Saturday from 4:45 to 5 p.m., over a CBS network.

The programs have been especially timed for America's evening radio audience, making it necessary for him to face the microphone in London at 1:45 a. m.

During the summer months Kaltenborn will visit the capitals of Europe by special plane, interviewing government officials and observing the political scene generally. He will fly back to London each week in time for his Saturday evening broadcasts. His first visit after the broadcast about England will be to Berlin, and the following week he will go to Rome.

NBC To Begin Construction of New Hollywood Studios

THE National Broadcasting Company has just completed arrangements for a group of Hollywood studios for presenting motion picture stars and features to the air audience, it has been announced by Don E. Gilman, vice-president in charge of the Western Division.

"After many weeks of investigation and study of suitable locations in Hollywood," Mr. Gilman said "arrangements have been made with officials of the Consolidated Film Industries. Inc., to reconstruct the laboratories of Consolidated on Melrose Avenue into modern and efficient broadcasting studios.

There will be constructed on this site immediately a group of four studios, two of which will accommodate small audiences for those radio performers who require attendance to add interest to their performances. Two other studios will be efficient broadcasting units constructed along the most modern studio design.

"The need for adequate studios in Holly-wood has long been apparent," added Mr. Gilman. "The growing importance of Holly-wood has caused us to prepare ourselves to take advantage of that great reservoir of tal-

ent. It is expected that many more programs of national interest will originate in Southern California when we have provided proper facilities."

O. B. Hanson, Chief Engineer of the National Broadcasting Company, spent three weeks in Hollywood with Mr. Gilman. Mr. Hanson said:

"The building of the Consolidated Film Industries, Inc., is admirably adapted to our purpose and with the alterations necessary for our occupancy will become another of the great engineering plants which have been established by NBC to provide the finest radio programs to the American listening audience.

"These studios will be equipped with broadcasting equipment of the latest design and will have the advantage of all of the developments and experience we have gained in building Radio City."

The NBC Hollywood studios undoubtedly will become the radio showplace of Southern California and will be unmatched in appearance and attractiveness in the West. Programs are expected to originate from these studios on October 1 of this year.

With the Symphonists

THE Symphony continues to hold the spotlight with an ever-increasing cross section of the radio audience. There is good reason for this. Symphony Halls of the air dispense with works that are academic and marvels of musico-mathematics for pure music that drenches the ear with soul-moving

melody.

Among the week's music of particular interest is the seldom heard "Surprise" Symphony by Haydn. This was written as a joke. The genial Haydn noticed that his listeners dozed contentedly during his melodious andantes, so he wrote a slow movement that would lull his audience to the gates of slumberland, and then, suddenly, with a crash from the orchestra wake them up. This sprightly symphony is scheduled for Tuesday, July 16, over CBS, at 8 p. m. Other numbers include Mozart's sparkling overture to the "Marriage of Figaro" and the Bach "Ave Maria." William Van Hoogstraten will conduct the Portland Symphony Orchestra in this and the Thursday CBS concert; also

at 8 o'clock, when the overture to "Oberon," Wagner's Good Friday Spell from "Parsifal," and Weber's "Invitation to the Dance" are featured numbers.

For the Standard Symphony Concert on NBC, Thursday evening at 8:15, Gaetano Merola presents a highly diverting and con-

trasting program.

The classicist, Cherubini, is best remembered for his overtures, of which that to "The Water-Carrier" opens the Standard Symphony program. Tschaikowski was a composer of many moods. One of his lighter and ever-delightful compositions is the "Sleeping Beauty Waltz" that virtually tells its own story in strands of tone. Two parts of Godard's "Scenes Poetique" follow, after which the opening movement of the Franck D minor Symphony furnishes the serious note to the program. The concert closes with the Suite to "Les Erinyees" by Jules Massanet, which contains the famous "Elegie" in its original form.

Roy Frothingham Opens Own Office

Roy Frothingham, sales promotion manager of the Western Division, National Broadcasting Company, is celebrating the completion of eight years' sales and promotion work by going into business for him-

He has opened an office in the Claus Spreckels Building, San Francisco, and will specialize in radio advertising and sales promotion.

He will be retained by the National Broadcasting Company to handle sales promotion and research work in the western states in cooperation with Don E. Gilman, vice-president, and Harry Anderson, sales manager.

Lionel Barrymore Signs Five-Year Contract to Play "Scrooge"

Lionel Barrymore has been signed by a sponsor for five years, to portray each Christmas day the role of "Scrooge" in Dickens' well-loved "Christmas Carol," beginning next December 25 over a nationwide Columbia network.

The Barrymore "Christmas Carol" presentation will be a special and traditional offering

each Christmas Day.

Barrymore's time has been so completely occupied these last few years that his radio appearances have been very few and far between. However he has developed a great interest in radio and in a recent interview expressed the belief that broadcasting may contribute much to the theatre of the future.

Lum and Abner Still at It

Lum and Abner, the Ozark philosophers, will be kept on the air for the duration of the summer via a powerful four station group, including WGN and WLW in the Middle West and KNX at 6:30 p.m. and KFRC at 8 a. m. on the Pacific Coast. Plans are already being made to make the program available on a more extensive network as soon as the fall broadcasting season opens. The new fourstation set-up was effective July 1.



SEVERAL interesting sporting broadcasts will be released over shortwave this Saturday and next week, and will be heard on the Pacific Coast via stations GSC, 9.58 meg., and GSD, 11.75 meg. On July 13, Captain H. B. T. Wakelam, famous sports commentator of the British Broadcasting Corporation, will describe the first day's play in the third cricket test match between England and South Africa. The contest will be relaved direct from Headingley Cricket Ground in Leeds and will reach San Francisco at 7 p. m.

On July 20, running commentaries will be broadcast on the final stage of the rifle-shooting competition for the King's prize at 4 p. m., and on the Davis Cup Inter-Zone Finals at 7 p. m.

"Radio-Coloniale" seems to have shifted its frequency slightly in order to avoid interference with the powerful CJRX of Winnipeg, Canada, during the late afternoon and early evening. Incidentally, the best reception from France at the present time is coming from this station in the morning between 10 and 11 a. m. A frequency of 11.90 meg. is used at this time.

A general improvement has been noted in German reception during the past week. DJN on 9:54 meg. was heard with good volume until 7:30 p. m. on several occasions, and DJD on 11.77 meg, reached the coast with slightly less strength at the same time. DJB on 15.20 meg. showed a fairly steady signal when first coming on the air at 12:05 p. m., but faded out rapidly after that hour.

No doubt a good many listeners on the abbreviated wavelengths have wondered why strange South American stations are often picked up on a certain frequency, only to change or vanish completely within a few days. In Latin-America, there are no restrictions on amateur or broadcast transmitters such as we have in the United States, and the owner may choose his wave at will, broadcasting records or whatever happens to suit his fancy. He may choose any wavelength and transmit on any schedule. Furthermore he is at liberty to change the wave of his station at any time and without notice. The latest new Spanish-speaking trans-

mitter to appear on these short waves unfortunately chose a frequency which was exactly the same as that now used by Cincinnati's W8XAL. The serious heterodyne which resulted from this action has almost ruined reception from both stations until after 8:30 p. m., and it is believed that the newcomer is HJ4ABL of Manizales, Colombia, which operated formerly on 6.11 meg.

Another unknown Latin-American, which was mentioned last week in this column, has been identified as COHD of Havana, Cuba. The station relays programs of CMHD every day until 8:45 p. m., and transmits on a frequency of 6.13 meg.

A new Javanese broadcaster has now appeared in the short wave spectrum. latest addition to the famous NIORM chain releases its programs on about 3:15 meg., and is usually on the air near 4 a. m.

So many fans have never heard an English announcement from the member stations of Java's network, that it might not be out of order to mention that these transmitters give English announcements now between 3:25

and 3:30 a. m. daily.

The Saturday night dancing parties from Barranquilla, Columbia, which were discontinued temporarily a few weeks ago, have now been restored and are being heard in all parts of the Pacific Coast until 9 p. m., every Saturday evening. Tune to HJIABB on 6.45 meg.

3LR of Melbourne, Australia, is now broadcasting regular programs in the evenings only on Fridays and Sundays, but occasional test transmissions are carried out on other days. It is interesting to note that these Friday sports-casts and Sunday musical programs, which are received betwen 9:30 and 11:30 p. m., usually come in with considerably more volume than 3LR's daily releases between 12:15 and 4:30 a. m.

HI4ABB of Manizales, Colombia, evidently intends to broadcast programs every day in the future, rather than just on Wednesdays and Sundays. Mr. Van den Enden, who handles the station's English announcements, states that the power of the transmitter will be raised to 3500 watts within the next month. At the present time, programs are broadcast between 8 and 9 p. m., and the genial Senor Van den Enden barely has time to make his closing announcements before the powerful W9XF of Chicago comes on the air using the same frequency of 6.10 meg.

The DX Corner

TIRCC of San Jose, Costa Rica, now comes on the air at 6 p. m., every Thursday and Sunday, relaying the bells of La Soledad Church, and following with a talk or musical program under the direction of that famous short wave pioneer, Amando Cespedes Marin. The frequency is 6.55 meg.

A new mystery station was reported three times on 11.67 meg, betfeen 5:30 and 6 a. m., playing a program of popular music and preceeding each item with announcements in what seemed to be French, Italian and English. The call was not given in English, but in the foreign tongues it sounded like XGW, XEW or XBW.

Moscow was heard on 12:00 meg. calling LSN between 5 and 5:30 a. m., and announcing both as RNE and RKI.

JVH, Japan's "Voice of the Pacific" often carries out test transmissions on 14.60 meg. before transferring controls to Tokio for the daily international broadcast between 9 and 10 p. m.

Havana's well-known COC failed to broadcast its regular Saturday program of Typical Cuban Music last week, and it is hoped that they have not been permanently discontinued.

The new Spanish-speaking station on 6.40 meg. has been identified as TIPG of San Jose, Costa Rica. TIPG formerly operated on 6.55 meg., but was not heard with nearly as much volume as on the new frequency.

Because Parson Josiah Hopkins, leading spirit of the "Country Church of Hollywood," is taking a much needed vacation, this tremendously popular sustaining feature is taking a vacation from the airlanes of the Columbia Don Lee network. This, of course, means that the five morning broadcasts and the Saturday evening "service" as well, will be discontinued until further notice.

Lanny Ross "State Fair Concert"

Lanny Ross, famous radio tenor, and a thirty-five piece semi-symphonic orchestra under the direction of Howard Barlow, one of the country's foremost orchestral leaders, will be featured in a new series of radio programs over an NBC-KPO network beginning Sunday, July 21 at 7 p.m., P.S. T.
The new program, to be called "Lanny Ross and His State Fair Concert" will take

over the time made available by Jack Benny's vacation from the air. The program will continue to occupy the period until Benny resumes his broadcasts seven weeks later.

American Album of Familiar Music Resumed

Thousands of radio listeners who heard and loved the American Album of Familiar Music broadcasts for more than three years have their wish granted. This popular feature has resumed its original form over an NBC nationwide network on Sunday, at 5:30 p. m., P. S. T.

The radio audience, however, was not tiring of the semi-classical and popular songs that generations have loved. Letters began to pour in requesting that Frank Munn, Vivienne Segal and Gus Haenschen's orchestra sing and play the well-loved favorites again and again.

Gladys Swarthout is enjoying a vacation for the first time in three years. The NBC singing star, and her husband, Frank Chapman, are acquiring deep tans, plenty of exercise, and lots of rest during their current stay in Hollywood, where Miss Swarthout is soon to begin her first film, "Rose of the Rancho," at Paramount.

Song Contest to Be Weekly Feature of "National Amateur Night"

An amateur song contest designed to encourage anyone with a desire to have his original lyrics, song title, or even a basic song idea, printed and broadcast is soon to be instituted as part of the weekly "National Amateur Night" broadcasts

teur Night" broadcasts, Starting with the "National Amateur Night" broadcast over CBS on Sunday, July 14, from 2 to 2:30 p. m., P.S.T., Arnold Johnson's orchestra will present the winning song, with Master of Ceremonies Ray Perkins adding his glib observations. Each week thereafter another winning song will be presented, and, supplementing this, a winning song will be selected each month for publication by a well-known music publishing company. Many prizes, in addition to royalties on the songs published, will be given to the winners.

Entrants in the contest will be asked to submit either lyric, song titles, or letters describing their basic song ideas. One entry will be selected as the winner each week by a committee of judges. This winning entry then will be given to a nationally-prominent composer, who will incorporate the lyrics, title or song idea in an original song. A different composer will take the creative job in hand every four weeks.

The winner in the weekly contest will receive a cash prize of \$25 and a silver loving cup. Those whose entries are adjudged second, third and fourth best, will be awarded silver loving cups. The winner of the monthly contest will be given a cash prize of \$50 and also will receive one-third of the royalties derived from the published song. Twenty-five other contestants will be given awards of \$5 each month.

Armand Girard Returns After Triumphs in New York

The golden voice of Armand Girard is now heard again from the San Francisco studios of NBC.

Less than a year ago the New York office of NBC asked that Girard come east. He appeared on several important commercial programs, participated in the Stars of the Future contest, and answered a summons from the White House to sing before the President. Although his popularity in the east grew rapidly, Girard and his family longed for California.

Girard first came to fame in the West when he made his first appearance on the air in 1924. A few songs by him on NBC networks in transcontinental programs commanded nationwide attention. He was the first western singer that the East liked well enough to demand to hear regularly on a series of coast to coast programs from San

Francisco.




