



Byrd to Receive CBS Medal in Reunion Broadcast

Radio, the medium that kept the Byrd Antarctic Expedition in touch with the world during twenty long months at the South Pole, will reunite its members in a special program to be heard over the Columbia network on Wednesday, September 25, from 5:30 to 6 p. m., P. S. T.

During the reunion broadcast Rear Admiral Richard E. Byrd will be presented with the Columbia Broadcasting System Medal for Distinguished Contribution to Radio, awarded March 31, 1934. The insistence of Admiral Byrd's doctor that he rest completely has delayed the formal presentation. The medal has been awarded to only five other persons-Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, Sir John Reith, director of the British Broadcasting Corporation; Amelia Earhart, Leopold Stokowski and Nino Martini.

Mrs. Herbert Hoover, wife of the former President and long noted for her interest in Girl Scout activities, will speak in connection with the annual convention of the National Council of the Girl Scouts of America Tuesday, September 24, 1 p. m., P. S. T., over a nation-wide NBC-KGO network from San Francisco.

Tibbett to Stress American Songs for His New Series

AWRENCE TIBBETT, seeking the acceptance of American music on an equal level with the works of acknowledged European masters, will stress native compositions during his forthcoming series over the Columbia network. His broadcasts will be heard Tuesdays from 4:30 to 5 p. m., P. S. T., starting September 24.

The Metropolitan baritone will draw on the best works of Tin Pan Alley, negro spirituals and cowboy ballads, giving them equal prominence on his program with the best known operatic arias and classics of the concert platform. Tibbett advocates that artists of reputation should use their talents to convince his country's music lovers of the worthiness of our native music and intends prac-

ticing what he preaches.

"Nothing annoys me quite so much as the unthinking worship on the part of so many people of melody that comes from abroad just because it is written by a foreign composer and the unreasoning scorn that is turned by these same people on American works just because they are local products," Tibbett says. "We have every right to be proud of our best American tunes."

Radio Fans Page Rita Murray

Radio's "personality girl," Miss Rita Murray, returns to the air waves in a new series over KNX, every Wednesday evening at 8:30 p. m. Many times the question has been raised by radio listeners, "Where can we dial Rita Murray?"

BROADCAST WEEKLY found the answer when recently discovering Miss Murray making records for Australia. Her friendly chats won her a wide radio following some time ago, and her friends will be glad to welcome Miss Murray back to the air via the KNX air

lanes.

"Music Maker" to Appear In October

From advance notices received, this publication should prove of immense value to ambitious, talented composers, and a most welcome periodical for the music lover.

Mark Warnow, noted radio conductor and composer, will be musical director for Miss Hayes. He will work in close coöperation with the author of the scripts and a concert ensemble will respond to his baton.

Special tonal sequences will be composed

for the Hayes broadcasts.

Baer-Louis Fight on NBC

THE heavyweight prizefight between Joe Louis, the brown bomber of Detroit, and Max Baer, former heavyweight champion, will be broadcast exclusively over combined coast-to-coast NBC networks, including Canada and Honolulu, from the Yankee Stadium in New York City on Tuesday, September 24 at 6 p. m., P. S. T.

A complete, blow-by-blow description, to be given from the ringside by NBC's ace sports announcers, will be followed by a summary of the contest. The entire fight and summary will be broadcast regardless of the length of the bout.

The Baer-Louis fight, which promises to attract the first \$1,000,000 gate since the days of Promoter Tex Rickard, will afford the winner a chance at the heavyweight crown now held by James J. Braddock.

Glass Worker Walks 500 Miles To Sing on Major Bowes' Hour

Recently a 40-year-old glass worker arrived in New York with his 13-year-old son after walking most of the 500 miles from Pittsburgh. The glass worker, Alexander Roy, wrote a letter to Major Edward Bowes asking for a chance in the Amateur Hour. He got it Sunday night, sang "Softly as a Morning Sunrise," and another fine voice discovery was chalked up to the credit of Major Bowes' Amateur Hour.

Roy is the father of four children and he told the Major he "always wanted to sing but never had a chance." He talked the question over with his wife and they decided that he ought to come to New York and try for the Amateur Hour. It was the first time father and son had taken a trip together, but they described it as a "picnic," even though they walked most of the way.

Victor Young, maestro of the Chateau program, played a medley of Irving Berlin numbers in a recent program. Young was surprised when Berlin himself showed up for rehearsal. The composer was so intrigued by the arrangements Young had made of his numbers that he requested and

received an autographed copy of the score sheet from Vic. Incidentally Young himself is no amateur as a composer. "Sweet Sue" leads off a long list of hit tunes to his credit.

Al Pearce in Matinee Series

THREE half-hour matinees a week have been set for Al Pearce and His Gang in their new program series. Beginning Monday, October 7, Al and his sixteen singers and comedians and guest artists will be heard Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 2 p. m., P. S. T., over an NBC network from coast to coast.

Pressed for details on the new series, Al said only, "It's just goin' to be the same old show we've always given—diff'rent every day. When we go on the air I'll just stand up to the microphone, like I always do, and introduce any one in the Gang who happens

along."

The following artists will appear regularly: Mabel Todd, comedienne; Morey Amsterdam, world's greatest egoist; Arlene Harris, the Human Chatterbox; Harry Foster, romantic tenor; Lord Bilgewater, played by Monroe Upton; Andy Andrews, singing comic; Tony Romano, singer and guitarist; the Three Cheers, William H. Wright, and Tizzy Lish, dizzy cooking expert.



Alexander Semmler Solos Greig Piano Concerto

Appearing with the CBS symphony orchestra on Sunday, September 22, at 11 a. m., Alexander Semmler, noted pianist, will play the Grieg A Minor Piano Concerto with the orchestra under the baton of Victor Bay.

It will be an all Grieg program. Other numbers include the suite "Aus Holberg's Zeit" for orchestra, and the Norwegian Dances Nos. 1 and 3.

CBS also announces the return of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra on or about October 13, with Otto Klemperer conducting. Arturo Toscanini returns later in the season. Detailed plans of the Philharmonic Society will appear in an early issue of BROADCAST WERKLY.

Husing to Broadcast Major Football Classics During Coming Season

EVERY sectional football center of the United States is represented on the tentative schedule of football broadcast to be heard this fall over the nation-wide network of the Columbia Broadcasting System.

For the first time, Columbia will go into the Southwest to bring one of that region's major grid tilts—the game between Rice and Texas Christian at Fort Worth on November 3—to the CBS audience.

Ted Husing, Columbia's rapid-fire sports announcer, will describe 12 or more games during the season.

On September 28, Husing and Quailey will be at South Bend to report one of the strongest early games of the season—the Kansas-Notre Dame contest.

In the event the World Series in baseball is not going on, Husing will be at the mike in Evanston, broadcasting the game between Northwestern and Purdue.

One of the season's most promising games will be brought to the Columbia fans on October 1. On that date Husing and Quailey will man the microphones in Brooklyn for the clash between Louisiana State University and Manhattan.

On October 19, CBS will broadcast from Minneapolis where the University of Minnesota. last year's national champions, will meet Tulane, one of the South's strongest teams.

And one of the East's major contests—the annual game between Army and Yale—will be described by Husing from the Yale Bowl at New Haven on October 26. The game to be broadcast on November 2 has not as yet been decided on.

Other games on the tentative schedule are: November 9—Fordham vs. St. Mary's in New York, by tradition one of the most colorful intersectional games of the year.

November 16-Notre Dame vs. Army in New York.

November 23-Rice vs. Texas Christian at Fort Worth.

November 28—Pennsylvania vs. Cornell at Philadelphia.

November 30—Army vs. Navy at Philadelphia.

Ozzie Nelson's arrangement of "Tiger Rag" is being hailed all over the country as the raciest version of that torrid tune yet presented. Ozzie introduced the arrangement in the Bakers' Broadcast last spring and then had to repeat it by popular demand. When he comes back to the air October 6 for another radio season the tune will probably be heard again.

There are no deep throated voices on San Francisco's ether today. The reason being that psuedo athletes, representing all ends of radio, are "stealing the bases" each weekend. Baseball has corrupted the idle hours of musicians, singers, actors, producers and now—editors and publicity men. The league, up to date, included the "nines" of NBC, captained by Meredith Willson; KFRC with Bill Pabst, as "clean-up man," the "bunterouters" from Eddie Fitzpatrick's orchestra! Paul Pendarvis' "tooters" and Griff Williams' aggregation. These bands are heard via NBC. KFRC's "fence busters" vanquished the Willson "hole-in-the-bats" by a score of 24 to 7. Now the scribes are up in their "mitts" and have lured All-American Lloyd Yoder. press chief from the Sutter Street nine. With questionable aid from radio editors, press agents and free "lancers," including this writer (who has seen second base only from a distance) they hope to uphold their motto. which is "nobody is more batty' than we."

A society matron once remarked that "to broadcast was simpler than lifting a tea cup." A radio executive friend suggested that she, in the spirit of fun, speak before a "dead" microphone. She agreed and did so for several minutes. However, during this bit of bravado, a whisper from an announcer informed her that she was really on the air. The poor woman collapsed. Most things appear "simple" from the sidelines.

Characters heard on NBC's One Man's Family program are to follow the long conspicuous trail of posterity. Several manufacturers are naming articles of clothing after these ether personages. It must be gratifying to the author, to have his brain children become such a definite part of every-day life. (Even if his name isn't attached to a linen shirt.)

KNX Inaugurates Additional News Edition



THE Broadcasting Corporation of Japan is preparing to shift stations for broadcasting during the winter months. For a period of several days station JVN on 10.66 meg. was used to broadcast the international programs simultaneously with JVH on 14.60 meg., and it is expected that the former transmitter will probably take over this broadcast in the near future.

On Monday and Thursday afternoons, JVM on 10.74 meg, is now operating simultaneously with JVH, and will probably re-

place it within a few weeks.

Station JVT on 6.75 meg., which carried the daily 1 to 4:40 a. m. broadcasts last winter, has been heard testing near 12:30 a. m., and will undoubtedly resume these transmissions in place of JVM before long.

3LR of Melbourne, Australia, has now adopted a new identification signal to rival that of 2ME's "kookaburra." The management of 3LR went deep into the Victorian forest of South Australia to record the peculiar call of the "lyre bird," a fowl similar to a peacock, with tail feathers in the shape of a lyre. The new identification is put over the air at 11:55 p. m. daily, and at irregular times during the 12:15 to 4:30 a. m. broadcast.

If present reception is any indication of what may be expected during the coming months, this fall and winter will bring some of the best shortwave receptions ever experienced on the Pacific Coast. Many South American broadcasters, which are heard with maximum volume in midwinter, have already attained a strength equal to that which was recorded in December of 1934, and it may safely be predicted that signals will continue to improve as the days grow shorter. At the present time, a great many Latin American transmitters may be heard every evening on the 49 meter band (5.80 to 6.80 meg.) between 5 and 7 p. m.

Not to be outdone by its sister station on 5.78 meg., station OAX4G of Lima, Peru, has added six days to its schedule, and is now broadcasting daily until 8 p. m., and Wednesday until 9. The frequency is 6.25 meg., and excellent reception has been reported in all parts of the Pacific Coast.

The Powerful transmitter on 5.89 meg, has now been definitely identified as HCK

of Quito Ecuador. Musical programs are released daily until 7 or 8 p. m., and the station has often been heard after 9 o'clock testing and phoning with YV4RC and TIGP.

The Thursday evening broadcasts from "Estacion El Prado" in Riobamba, Ecuador, have improved remarkably, and are now being received as far north as Seattle with good volume. Letters from listeners are read over the air during the "Mail Bag" period at 8:15 p. m., and not a few have been from California, Washington, and Oregon. PRADO operates on 6.66 meg. every Thursday from 6 to 8:30 p. m., and test broadcasts are often released on other days, but on no regular schedule.

The new Venezuelan station, reported in this section last week as YV8RV, has been identified as YV8RB of Barquisimeto. The transmitter works on an announced fre-

quency of 5.88 meg., and uses the identification slogan "La Voz de Lara." The daily schedule calls for operation until 7 p. m., but programs frequently run overtime as much as forty-five minutes.

HC2ET of Guayaquil, Ecuador, seems to have increased its power, and now reaches this country with good volume during its Wednesday and Saturday broadcasts from 6:30 to 8 p. m. A set of chimes is employed to precede every announcement, and the English language is used occasionally to facilitate identification. The frequency is 4.60

meg

YVQ, a 20 kilowatt phone transmitter in Maracay, Venezuela, is reported to have a regular broadcast period every Saturday afternoon from 5 to 5:30 o'clock on 6.67 meg. Similar transmissions are also scheduled for Sunday between 8 and 9 a. m., and are relayed by YVR on 9.14 meg.; but it is doubtful if either station will reach out very far at that time of day as long as they use such high wavelengths.

The DX Corner

Positive identification of a station on 6:40 meg. which signs off irregularly between 6 and 7 p. m. is still lacking, but it is believed to be YV9RC, "Ondas Populares" of Caracas, Venezuela.

HCJB, Ecuador's famous "Voice of the Andes," has considerably improved its signal during the past two weeks, and is now being received well on a daily schedule, except

Monday, from 4:30 to 7 p. m. HCJB operates on 8.21 meg.

HJ3ABF of Bogota, Colombia, which sometimes uses the old call letters, HKF, will increase its power to 1,000 watts in the near future, according to information divulged in a recent test with W2XAF. This well-known Colombian broadcaster employs a frequency of 6.17 meg., and is on the air daily between 4:30 and 8 p. m.

New Cuban stations are now appearing in all parts of the dial, and although most of them should not exactly be classed as "DX," they will all be listed here together to avoid confusion. CO2FU on 8.31 meg. tests irregularly between 5 and 6 p. m.; CO9JO on 8.89 meg. follows a somewhat irregular schedule between 4 and 7 p. m.; and the latest and strongest addition, the call letters of which have not been definitely determined as yet, may be heard daily on 8.62 meg. near 6 p. m.

From Africa comes news that OPM of Leopoldsville, Belgian Congo, is employed mainly for phone work with the mother country, but broadcasts are effected on Saturday between noon and 1:30 p. m., P. S. T. OPM operates on 10.12 meg., and will make a real DX "catch" for some lucky fan.

An unconfirmed report from Venezuela states that YV7RMO, which now operates only on the broadcast band, will shortly install a shortwave transmitter for work on 5.81 meg. Possibly this is the weak station which several listeners have reported on that frequency near 7 p. m.


