Hong Kong hand-over dominates Midem Asia

Hong Kong — The music industry is still undecided whether the hand-over of the British colony of Hong Kong to China on July 1 will represent a major leap forward or a dramatic step backwards in trying to establish one of the strongest legitimate music markets in Southeast Asia.

The subject was very much on the minds of attendees at the Midem Asia trade fair, held in Hong Kong May 21-23. Despite some reservations, the general consensus among representatives of the local industry was that business would benefit from the hand-over.

Key industry figures expect Hong Kong-based companies to have easier access to the Chinese market than at present, and to be able to rely on a wider audience to which to market their artists.

Leslie Ching, general manager of Hong Kong's composers and authors rights society CASH, says the local industry will benefit from having to invest in new musical genres to better accommodate the tastes of consumers in mainland China.

Otto sells his stake in Viva

HAMBURG — Media entrepreneur Frank Otto has sold his 19.8 percent stake in German music TV station Viva to the remaining shareholders.



Before the deal, which took effect on April 30, Viva's capital was equally divided between EMI, PolyGram, Sony Music, Warner Music and Otto, with a 1 percent minority share held by Musik Im Fernsehen, the owner of the Viva name.

Shortly before the sale was finalised, Musik Im Fernsehen—whose main shareholders are Austrian video producers Hannes Rossacher and Rudi Dolezal—opted to take up its option to increase its stake in the station. As a



result, Viva's definite capital structure still has to be negotiated between the partners. A spokesperson for Viva MD Dieter Gorny says a resolution is expected in around one month's time.

According to Otto, the sale was motivated by "an attractive price and tax considerations." The exact value of the deal has not been disclosed, but Otto hints at, "A two-digit figure in million DM."

Cannes Accord ready 'soon'

London — Logistics rather than major disagreements are behind the latest delay in settling the most divisive issue in the history of European mechanical royalty collection.

The Cannes Accord, the document which ended the contentious issue of direct distribution, is five months late in being signed (Music & Media, May 24) but both sides in the direct distribution debate now say it is satisfactory in its current form.

Europe's music publishers and collecting societies had been set into entrenched and opposing camps over the issue of direct distribution, which threatens to deprive continental European authors bodies of traditional revenue schemes.

At MIDEM in January, the U.K.'s Mechanical Copyright Protection Soci-

ety (MCPS) and PolyGram International Music Publishing, the main proponents of direct distribution, agreed to drop the scheme in return for a system of lower commission rates from all of Europe's collecting societies (see Music & Media, February 1).

The agreement ending the dispute, the Cannes Accord, which was hammered out by leading collecting society executives and the world-wide heads of the international publishing companies, was due to have been signed before the end of last winter. However, it was delayed by a number of technical matters and interpretational disputes. A final version of the document was agreed on April 29, and should have been completed in the first week of May, but remains unsigned.

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German radio targets techno fans

COLOGNE/FRANKFURT — Fans of techno and current ambient sounds are being catered for as never before by German radio.

Two new German radio stations have begun broadcasting a wide spectrum of current electronic music—from ambient electronics to hard techno tracks—to listeners in most European territories via the Astra satellite.

Cologne-based Evosonic and Planet Radio in Frankfurt are targeting the German market, but their signal can be received in other parts of Europe without difficulty—and the absence of virtually all talk content makes it easy for listeners to avoid the language barrier.

Evosonic was launched on May 1 by founder/MD Frank Heitmeyer. It targets 12-39 year-olds with ambient music, trip-hop, techno and other forms of contemporary electronic music. By June 30, Heitmeyer plans to have the station included on all German cable nets, with the exception of Hamburg and Berlin.

Planet Radio is operated by Frankfurt-based commercial CHR broadcaster Hit Radio FFH, and targets 14-25 year-olds with a mixture of techno, hip-hop and rap. Originally launched in February as part of a digital audio broadcasting (DAB) pilot project in the state of Hessen, the station went terrestrial on April 21, after state media authority LPR Hessen awarded FFH three FM frequencies.

Evosonic broadcasts at present via Astra and cable networks in Nordrhein-Westfalen, Schleswig-Holstein and Baden-Württemberg. Based on faxes and phone calls from listeners, Heitmeyer estimates that Evosonic reaches a total of 40,000 listeners per average hour.

The station employs a staff of 12. Programme director Ingo Schnorrenberg can call on guest DJs like Chicago house legend Jesse Saunders to spice up the schedule. "We invite local or international DJs into our Cologne studios, or we ask them to send us DATs," says Heitmeyer.

The station's programming varies the intensity of the music and beats per minute according to the time of day, from ambient and trip-hop in the morning, through techno and house in the afternoon, back to more ambient music at night. Heitmeyer explains that the station aims to offer, "the right kind of sound at the right time."

FFH head of music Ralf Blasberg acts as a programming consultant for Planet Radio and influential in

determining that station's playlist. "Planet Radio has probably one of the youngest formats in Germany," claims Blasberg. He adds that its core artists include Daft Punk, Brooklyn Bounce, DJ Quicksilver and Red 5.

There are two basic rotations. A title on "power" rotation returns every two and a half hours; a title on current rotation is played every four hours on average. The station plays 14 titles per hour and keeps talk down to a bare minimum.

With an average age of 22, Planet Radio's staff is younger than that of par-

ent company FFH and close to that of the station's target audience. Programme director Andreas Schulz and music editor Kerstin Schwitalla are supported by a team of 10 employees.

Whether the new techno formats will prove commercially viable remains to be seen. Heitmeyer expects Evosonic to gross DM 3 million (\$1.8 million) in sales revenue by the end of the year, "based on 15 percent sold advertising time in the first six months and 20 percent after that."

At present, Evosonic offers only three minutes of advertising per hour for DM 13-25 (\$8.1-\$15.6) per second, a price on a par with satellite market leader Klassik FM. Younger German satellite broadcasters such as black music station Jam FM sell from around DM 3 (\$1.8) per second.

"On June 30, we will re-assess our situation," says Heitmeyer. "If we cannot communicate the concept of limited advertising at a premium rate, we will have to reconsider our prices and the percentage of advertising in our output." He adds, "The station might go through considerable changes after June 30."

Manchester, Merseyside to gain new FM licence

LONDON — Record producer Pete Waterman and former Virgin Radio programme director Mark Story are among the first contenders to emerge in the race for the new North West England regional commercial licence

advertised by U.K. regulator, the Radio Authority (RA).

The new regional service is intended to cover most parts of Greater Manchester, Merseyside, and south and

central Lancashire. The RA's application deadline is August 19.

Waterman is fronting a bid for a new music station, Virus Radio, backed by entertainment giant Apollo Leisure and broadcast group Emap Radio. Waterman, with a 10 percent share, is installed as chairman of the Virus consortium with Emap taking a stake of 20 percent and Apollo holding the majority interest with 70 percent. Virus also intends to apply for the North East regional commercial service, expected to be advertised by the RA in October.

Story is part of an as-yet-unnamed group of radio industry figures which is

putting together a bid for the North West licence, according to sources.

Meanwhile, the Chrysalis Group's radio division Chrysalis Radio has confirmed it is applying for the licence, which has the potential to reach about 4.3 million adults (aged 15-plus). Chrysalis has also indicated it will be competing with Virus again when the North East of England licence is offered in the autumn.

In January, Chrysalis staged a month-long Restricted Service Licence (RSL) broadcast in the area which the new North West licence is designed to cover, in order to conduct audience research and audience reaction to the

AC output. That information will be used to help formulate Chrysalis' application.

However, this does not necessarily imply that AC is the format the group will propose. "At this stage, it is too early for us to say what the format proposition is going to be," comments Richard Huntingford, Chrysalis Radio's chief executive. "We

are still researching the market, particularly since there have been recent changes to some stations' Promises of Performance [to the RA] in the area."

The region is not unfamiliar to Chrysalis. The group was an unsuccessful AC applicant for the first North West regional licence won by Jazz 100.4 FM, which went on-air in September 1994. Chrysalis also proposed an AC format for a commercial licence in Manchester—which was awarded to dance station Kiss 102 FM—in the same year.

The Virus Radio application proposes a station which will champion new music "at the cutting edge," and which will be pro-active in pushing new talent, according to Waterman. He adds that artists will have the advantage of using his own Manchester studios to record live sessions for broadcast.

Waterman claims, "Only 10 percent of records released actually get airplay.

When you look at that figure, it tells you there must be good records that are being missed. Virus would be looking for new material, new music and new artists all the time. Our output would never have more than 20 percent Top 40 material."

He believes that it will be commercially viable to target 19-24 year-olds with this

format, because, "People have a very wide acceptance and tolerance of new music, far greater than [mainstream commercial radio] gives them credit for."

The Radio Authority expects to award the North-West licence by the end of this year.

Spanish net OCR sacks DG Alcalde

MADRID — Troubled news/talk radio group Onda Cero Radio (OCR) has undergone its second top level shakeup since the beginning of the year.

Director-general Eduardo Alcalde has been dismissed and replaced by managing director Antonio Martinez Henarejos. Meanwhile, commercial director Rafael Ordozgoiti and communication director Rafael Chávarri have resigned from the station. OCR marketing director Rául Domingo has temporarily taken charge of the network's communications department.

The shake-up is not, however, thought to be related to a much wider conflict which threatens to break-up OCR-Spain's third largest network—after a group of 60 stations announced plans to leave the network (see Music & Media, May 17).

A journalist by background, Alcalde actually presided over an increase in OCR's audience in the January-March period (from 2.3 million weekday listeners to 2.4 million), according to research institute EGM. But, compared to a daily audience of 2.8 million in the first quarter of 1996, OCR's "commercial expectations" were not being met, say sources inside blind people's organisation Once, which owns the network.

With the dismissal of Alcalde and the appointment of Henarejos, the corporate structure at the OCR network has returned to its pre-January model, i.e. before the tasks of director-general and managing director were split into two separate posts.

BMG ready to centralise its special marketing in Europe

MUNICH - BMG Entertainment International is to centralise the planning and implementation of special marketing activities for all European territories in a newly created division, with effect from July 1.

The BMG Special Marketing Europe division will be based in Munich, under the supervision of BMG Entertainment International G/S/A president Thomas M. Stein. The division is headed by former BMG G/S/A head of distribution, Peter-Alexander Rapp. He reports

directly to Stein. Rapp will be assisted by BMG Video/Universum Film commercial director Barbara Saring, who will take up the post of head of special marketing at the division.


Stein comments in a statement, "With the launch of BMG Special

Marketing Europe, we are reacting to the increasing convergence of the European markets." He says he sees BMG's new structure as a chance to, "develop new products and marketing

The newly created division will initially focus on the development of BMG's European catapan-European logue. licensing and exploitation, as well as the coordination of the Internet activities of BMG affili-

ates across Europe. BMG Special Marketing Europe will also be responsible for the co-operation with brand manufacturers who operate in more than one European country.



BELGIUM Hendrix fits all formats

Jimi Hendrix re-release fever (Music Media, May 24) has reached Belgium. Universal Music Belgium has serviced radio stations with an exclusive, not-for-sale vinyl set to promote the artist's four original back cat-alogue albums and the previously unreleased album, First Rays Of The New Rising Sun. Universal promoters not only visited rock format stations such as Flemish language Studio Brussels and French language Radio 21, but also ventured to ACE stations like Radio 1 and CHR networks such as BEL RTL. Radio 1 producer Jos Vandervelde decided to opt for Angel, from ... Rays, instead of other familiar Hendrix hits like Hey Joe or All Along The Watchtower. Vandervelde comments that, "A radio-friendly song like

Angel would be a better choice for a

single release than [Universal's] current pick, Dolly Dagger." BEL RTL head of programming Serge Jonckers says, "We picked a track from each reissued CD and focused on the new one [Rays]. We are also offering CDs on air." Jonckers is convinced that "Hendrix material will also appeal to our younger [CHR] audience.

GERMANY

Max Music inks BMG deal

Spanish independent dance label Max Music has signed a distribution and marketing agreement with BMG Ariola Munich's affiliate ARIS in Gütersloh, with effect from May 20. The Spanish label, which specialises in house, techno and hard-trance, has operated a German office since October 1995. Max Music remains responsible for DJ promotion and the distribution of vinyl 12-inch singles while ARIS will handle Max's CD output. ARIS handles the distribution of domestic and foreign independent labels for BMG

Ariola. First releases to fall under the new agreement will include singles by Object One, Supertrip and Polaris, among others.

Salü changes station ID

Saarbrücken-based regional commercial CHR broadcaster Radio Salü introduced a new jingles and station voice package this month. The jingles were composed and produced by Hamburg-based independent John Groves. All forego the 'classic' U.S.style chorus in favour of an contemporary house and techno sound. The new station voice used in jingles and trailers belongs to Berlin-based actor Wolfgang Kühne, who dubbed the Lion King in the German version of the Disney movie of the same title. The ID change follows the introduction of partially digital signal processing at the station. Salü recently installed digital equipment provided by French automation house Dalet Digital Media Systems.

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
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

The 320 commercial radio licences in the Belgian state of Flanders expire in 1999. The proposed frequency plan for the next licencing period allows for only 172 stations (see Music & Media, May 24). On the other hand, the authorities seem willing to approve national and regional networks,



illegal under present media law. The proposal will be finalised in June and parliament is expected to vote on the new law in October. In an exclusive interview with Music & Media, Flemish Media Minister Eric van Rompuy reveals his personal views on the future of private radio in Flanders.

Q: What made you decide to change the current legislation so drastically?

A: The decision to allow the current number of stations to broadcast on the FM band was made by me in 1990. Today, we've seen there are too many stations for our territory; that prevents [many] stations from covering an area of eight kilometres [without interference] as originally intended. Also, private radio on a certain quality level no longer seems viable.

We propose to allow networks, in order to guarantee the economical viability of private radio. Another measure to facilitate commercial programming is that local stations will be able share up to 80 percent of their programming, as opposed to 20 percent under the current law.

Q: So, Flanders is catching up with the rest of Europe?

A: Indeed, and we are partially taking the existing radio structure in the South of Belgium as an example. [In the French-speaking state of Wallonia] private networks like [gold/oldies broadcaster] Nostalgie and [CHR station] BEL RTL have been operating for quite some time now. We plan to licence national and regional networks as well as independent local outlets. The proposed frequency plan will allow for 172 stations, which can then freely decide whether or not to join a network. Existing local stations will continue to exist, provided their application is approved during the new licencing procedure, which is scheduled to start next spring.

Q: Will an unlimited number of networks be allowed?

A: There are no regulations included in the proposal except on the actual number of frequencies. I do expect [several] networks to emerge [after 1999] as anyone can start a network in future. But it will be up to individual stations to join a network or not. I do expect networks to go and 'fish around'—gathering affiliates in the process—but the private radio sector

asked for a more dynamic market [structure] and here it is.

Q: Do you see a solution to the problem of interference with signals, caused by other Belgian radio stations?

A: Existing legislation allows each of the three Belgian communities—Flemish, French and German-speaking territories—to draw up its own rules, and the power of radio transmitters is part of that package. The French community allows more powerful stations. In Flanders, we cannot defend ourselves against this, although a number of issues [in this respect] are being dealt with through judicial procedures at the moment.

Q: Can public broadcaster BRTN and the independent stations find a way to co-exist peacefully? A: There's no such thing as an ideal model. The new model [with its potentially stronger private sector] will have to prove its viability. The government had the opportunity to protect BRTN by reserving the range between 87.5MHz-102.1 MHz for its five channels. However, I think it is quite evident that BRTN will have to fight to maintain its combined market share of nearly 85 percent in Flanders, and the private stations will have to prove that they can attract a broader audience.

Solution found to French frequency crisis

PARIS — The conflict between the French commercial radio sector and broadcasting authority CSA over the availability of FM frequencies is about to be solved.

The CSA has decided to re-distribute 300 frequencies. A total of 172 come from the fold of broadcasters NRJ, Europe 1, RMC and CLT, who are handing back frequencies which

they acquired in contravention of French regulations in the past. NRJ is handing back 74 frequencies, Europe 1 44, RMC 42 and CLT 12.

Of the remaining 128 frequencies, some have been handed over to the CSA by the French armed forces and others were confiscated from local stations who failed to use them.

NRJ deputy GM Marc Pallain says he welcomes

the CSA proposal for a new frequency plan, because it offers a fair chance for all parties and opens a new era of growth for national radio groups.

"We can only be satisfied [by the redistribution], because the whole radio sector was at a stand-still for so many years," says Pallain. "We now hope that the CSA will reallocate these 300 frequencies in a way which will allow a balance to be created between the different radio groups."

Pallain adds that the 74 frequencies NRJ ceded to the CSA are located mainly in small cities. "I don't know how many of them we will actually get back," he admits. "We find it highly unlikely that the CSA would [reduce the number of NRJ frequencies in order to] allocate more frequencies to our competitors."

Pallain claims that Europe 1, with the addition of CHR network Skyrock, already exceeds the statuto-

ry limit of 150 million inhabitants reached by its combined networks, while CLT reaches 115 million, RMC about 80 million and NRJ 77 million. "This plan offers the chance to reach a new balance between the different forces in the market," says Pallain.

Benoît Sillard, president of CLT affiliated CHR network Fun, says CLT agreed

to the deal because, "We have a verbal agreement with the CSA and we know that we will get [a similar number of] frequencies back." Sillard says the purpose behind the frequency redistribution is, "not to create new radio stations—there are already too many competitors—but to support existing broadcasters."

Sillard adds, "The problem for the CSA is to take into account the balance between the different national groups and the regional, local and non-profit radio stations."

The CSA is expected to reallocate the frequencies in the weeks to come. The first call for licences will start on June 3. According to sources, each of the four main radio groups could be allocated 40-60 frequencies out of the


total 300, with the remaining licences handed over to local stations.


Hopes are high among French broadcasters that another batch will be made available after the current audit of available frequencies, conducted by independent organisation Vive la Radio, is completed later this year.

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

FRANCE

WEA Music France has announced a spate of appointments, all made over the past two months. Former Epic product manager local & international, Franck Veron, has arrived at WEA as promotion director, and another Epic product manager, Stéphane Charbonnier, has joined Veron at WEA as head of marketing/sales. Alexandre Levy, former head of marketing for EMI's Odéon Label Group, has joined WEA as head of artist marketing. Finally, Alain Figari and Franck Tuil were appointed sales director and director of sales promotion, respectively, on May 5. Figari previously held the position of deputy sales director at Sony Music France and Tuil worked as head of the record department at FNAC's Orléans store.

George Levendis is leaving his post as marketing director at Arista U.K. to join BMG Greece as managing director. In his new role, Levendis will report to BMG Central Europe senior VP Arnold Bahlmann.

NETHERLANDS

Video-on-demand TV channel The Box has appointed René Boogard as its Dutch managing director, effective May 12. Boogaard replaces Marjan Kortekaas, who has left the station to work on a freelance basis. Kortekaas will, however, continue to lobby for the increased distribution of the station through the country's cable networks.

U.K.

Continuing its regionalisation efforts, MTV Europe has filled two key positions by appointing regional heads of programming and production for its Northern and U.K. services, effective from May 16. Former head of talent and artist relations, Christine Boar, is now responsible for the programming of MTV's U.K. service, while news editor Eric Kearley has taken up the head of programming position at MTV's Northern service. Boar worked as a producer for BBC Radio 1's Evening Session and Top 40 programmes before joining MTV Europe in 1996. Kearley previously held the job as senior programme editor at public broadcaster Radio Stockholm and joined MTV Europe in 1995.

Sony Music Europe international promotions manager Mitch Vannoni left the company on May 16 to set up her own business as an independent publicity consultant. Her first client is Michael Jackson, who contacted Vannoni over his upcoming European tour, which will commence on May 31 in Bremen, Germany. Vannoni has worked with a wide range of Sony artists including Jackson, Celine Dion, Pearl Jam and Lisa Minnelli. The position of international promotions manager at Sony Music Europe in its present form will be scrapped, as the company has decided to work with freelancers on a project-by-project basis.

NRJ prepares to launch chart show across Europe

PARIS - French CHR broadcaster NRJ is launching a new pan-European chart show based on the station's most played songs on all its CHR stations across Europe.

The Euro Hot 30 show premiered on May 3 on the six German Energy stations associated with the NRJ group. The programme is currently also being tested on NRJ's station in Stockholm. NRJ programme director Christophe Sabot says the Euro Hot 30 will be added to the regular schedule of NRJ's stations in France, Belgium, and Finland by September.

Energy 103.4 Berlin produces the German version of the two hour Euro Hot 30 programme—presented by Energy 103.4 DJ Rob Green-which is broadcast weekly in Berlin, Hamburg, Munich, Nuremberg and the states of Saxony and Rheinland-

Pfalz. The tracks for each show are selected by NRJ's head office in Paris after an analysis of the weekly playlists of all NRJ associated stations in Europe.

The Euro Hot 30 reflects the music programming of NRJ's stations throughout Europe," says Sabot. "It is a synthesis of what is played on our stations. We are currently fine-tuning the methodology and evaluating the best weighting system for this chart. It is obvious that two songs which both reach a weekly rotation rate of 40 plays on two stations with


different audience figures cannot be valued the same way." Sabot, who co-ordinates the programming and the musical research for all NRJ

stations in Europe, says that there is currently a 70 percent overlap of international material on the different

stations associated with the group.

According to Sabot, this shows the validity of NRJ's philosophy that stations targeting the same audience group with a similar format in different European territories can operate a very similar music program-

ming. "What makes the difference," he says, "is the local content" added to the



aximum fine for Radio 3FN

HILVERSUM — The Dutch Media Commissariat has fined public CHR station Radio 3FM with the expected maximum penalty of HFI 208,000 (\$109,600), following allegations that the station broke advertising rules and illegally sponsored an album by Dutch artist Marco Borsato.

The allegations were made by private competitor Radio 538, after subsidiary Polydor PolyGram Holland gave Radio 3FM the exclusive rights for the first airing of Borsato's latest album De Waarheid (M&M, April 26).

The May 15 verdict split the fine between Radio 3FM's eight programme providers, charging each broadcaster with Dfl 26,000 (\$13,700). The Commisariat explained that the fine includes a Dfl 10,000 (\$5,300) penalty for a TV spot which advertised the album during broadcasting time reserved for Radio 3FM programme announcements. According to the Commissariat, the ad not only promoted Radio 3FM's special programming during its Borsato Week from January 13-18 but also advertised the artist's new album by using its artwork.

Another Dfl 16,000 (\$8,400) fine was levied over the actual content of Radio 3FM's programmes during Borsato Week. "[The station's] programming during the week in question relied heavily on Borsato's album," stated the Commissariat in its verdict. "[Seen in] combination with the TV spot and a Radio 3FM advertisement in daily newspaper De Telegraaf, this constitutes a breach of Dutch media law."

At presstime a Radio 3FM spokesman commented that the sta-

tion's lawyers were considering a possible appeal against the judgement. In the meantime, public broadcasting umbrella organisation NOS is working out a new code of conduct with the Media Commisariat under which a series of guidelines will be set out defining the extent of future co-operation between artists, labels and public broadcasters.

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Russia beckons Western labels

LONDON — Record companies can make money from sales in Russia and profit from the potential of Russian talentprovided they are realistic about the

International Federation

Report On The Russian Record Industry, is one of the few authoritative analyses of a business which, though protected by copyright laws up to international standards, still has to cope with piracy rates running at around 70 percent.

IFPI director general Nic Garnett comments that, "Russia has tremendous potential as both a source and a market for great music." He adds, "Of course, one has to be attuned to the dangers and difficulties in a country undergoing a revolution in market structures. But that challenge is a function of the change that is occuring and which promises substantial developments in the months and years ahead.

Garnett also notes in the new report that, unlike China, there are no restrictions on access to the Russian market for Western companies and that censorship controls there are within acceptable parameters.

The IFPI analysis estimates the value of the Russian market at retail prices in 1996 as \$230 million, based on sales of 88 million cassettes, 7 million CDs, and 300,000 vinyl albums.

The pirate market in the country last year was worth \$300 million and consisted of 190 million cassettes and 8 million CDs.

While product from all the major labels is available in Russia through licensing and distribution deals, PolyGram was the first major to establish a joint venture with a Russian partner, BIZ Enterprises.

BMG opened a representative office in Moscow in 1995, and is considering opening a BMG Russia label as well as a distribution centre, according to the report. At present, around 20 companies who buy their product in Germany are licensed to distribute BMG repertoire in Russia.

IFPI estimates there are 160 dedicated music retailers in Russia along with 15,000 non-specialist retailers and around 3,000 supermarkets with music departments. However, the organization says, "There is still no nationwide distribution network, which means that it is still sometimes difficult, and expensive, to transport recorded music across Russia."


Piracy remains the main brake on the development of the Russian music market, however. New copyright laws passed in 1993 give adequate protections and IFPI has signed cooperation agreements with the Moscow Economic Crime Control Unit and the Interior Ministry, which controls the country's police force.

However, the IFPI report warns that, "Strong remedies and enforcement campaigns will only succeed once there is legitimate Western repertoire to satisfy growing consumer demand which at the moment is being filled by

No alternative to the new mainstream?

With the huge chart success already enjoyed in the '90s by U.S grunge acts, the U.K's Britpop pack and "indiedance" crossover acts such as the Prodigy and the Chemical Brothers, is "alternative rock" still a meaningful term in 1997? After all, many alternative rock artists are now more commercially successful than the Bon Jovi/Def Leppard school of "mainstream" rockers that they are supposed to be an alternative to. Here, Music & Media seeks the opinions of those working with alternative rock in the U.K. and the Netherlands.

he word "alternative" is defined Oxford English Dictionary as "available in place of another thing." In terms of alternative rock in 1997, it's now more available than ever.

The phrase "alternative rock" was minted in an earlier musical age to describe a breed of cutting-edge artists who neither sought nor found a welcome in the mainstream. Acts born of-or at least inspired by-the punk and new wave revolution of 20 years ago, who refused to package



their music in neat bundles with all the sharp edges smoothed away to win widespread acceptance.

But the last few years have seen such a sea-change in attitudes to modern rock music that many industry players feel the phrase has become, at best, ambiguous. Acts such as the Chemical Brothers and the Prodigy, who would once have been the epitome of left-field outsiders, now command such huge fan bases that they can cruise effortlessly to number one in the singles charts of their native U.K.

Acts from the other side of the Atlantic have felt a similarly warm embrace. When Beck won the Best International Newcomer award at the Brits in February, it only underlined the feeling held by many that the alternative has infiltrated, perhaps even become, the mainstream.

Smells like commercial spirit?

"Alternative to what? The word begs the question," reflects Scott Piering, managing director of London-based radio promotions company Appearing.

"It's a transitional word, like the way 'new wave' followed 'punk' in the late '70s," Piering suggests, "and came to describe a whole range of great music from the Cure to New Order to Talking Heads. That was the period of creativity we're trying to duplicate now."

However, Universal Music Holland product manager Rick Haaijen emphasises that alternative rock acts still have to make material that is "accessible" in order to be commercially successful. He mentions the U.S. act Live as a case study.

"Alternative rock is nothing but a term to label their kind of music in retail," Haaijen contends. "Live's Throwing Copper, which was their breakthrough album, was simply a collection of great pop songs with a sound that was somehow new.

"The bottom line," he adds, "is good repertoire. You will never see a band cross over to the mainstream with inaccessible material. Nirvana made it big because of Smells Like Teen Spirit and not because of Territorial Pissings."

Berry Evers, international promotions manager at independent label Epitaph Europe, a punk rock bastion, defines "real" alternative rock as music with a "raw guitar edge" in addition to "sing-along choruses."

It's the combination of those two elements, he argues, that has made Offspring such a successful act in both Europe and the U.S. However, "Losing the original fan base seems to be the unavoidable by-product of crossover success," he notes.

A tale of two trends

The 1990s have seen two universallyrecognised rock trends: the American grunge phenomenon of the early part of the decade, and the Britpop boom of the mid-'90s. While vastly different in sound-indeed, the accessible melodies and media-friendly faces of Britpop were seen as an antidote to the dour, impenetrable extremes of many grunge bands—the two trends between them broke down the doors of the musical middle ground.

As sales charts become more and more an index of individual fan bases, few consumers bat an eyelid at Cake rubbing shoulders with Peter Andre, or Future Sound Of London with

Collaborations between cuttingedge acts which have emerged from dance culture and modern rock stars are increasingly common, as witnessed by the Chemical Brothers' hit single featuring Noel Gallagher of Oasis (Setting Sun), or the Prodigy's creative liaison with Crispian Mills of Kula Shaker for their upcoming Fat Of The Land album. But Mike Champion of Midi Management, which manages the Prodigy, resists the increasingly popular view that his and other dance acts now represent the new "alternative" music.

"There is a groundbreaking element to the Prodigy, Leftfield, the

can merge the two together.

"We've come from an underground culture of music, built a following of people, and we've now taken it to street level," continues Champion. "We're not going to take it any further in order just to be commercial." Some would say, with sales of the Prodigy's last two singles, Firestarter and Breathe, totalling more than one million copies in the U.K. alone, that the need hardly arises.

State of independents

The punk era of the late '70s saw the birth and prosperous growth of many independent labels which became home to the first wave of alternative rock artists.

But "independent" (or "indie") is another word which, some say, has undergone a change of identity, as continuing arguments about indie chart qualification—particularly in the U.K.—have testified. Should those listings be restricted to genuinely independently-distributed records, or is "indie" now merely a genre term?

Andy Ross, managing director of Food Records—originally distributed by Rough Trade but associated with EMI since 1988 and marketed by Parlophone—says, "I've had no complaints in working with a major company, it's worked very well for us, but I do think for a genuine bona fide independent that's self-sufficient, it must be galling trying to get into a chart that's clogged up with major companies."

However, one only needs to look at any independent chart to see that, away from the predatory major labels, true indies are still highly active. "Independent labels will always be around," says Parlophone managing director Tony Wadsworth. "A lot of development can go on outside the range of the [U.K.] top 40 sin-

gles chart, and that's where indie labels come into their own."

Talent

All the same, companies which blossom without any promotion, distribution or bankrolling from the major sector have become rare. When a high-profile, indie-oriented label emerges, it is now likely to opt for major backing from day one, as in the case of Independiente, fronted by former Go! Discs managing director Andy Macdonald, who has the support of Sony Music in his new venture.

"Independence comes from the ability to run a company the way you want to run it," says Macdonald, "without interference from any corporation, and to pass on that flexibility to your bands. If you do believe very much in the bands you're working with, and you want to work them into the soundtrack of people's lives, then

major distribution is a big help."

Macdonald adds that he "looked at every alternative" when it came to a licensing deal for Independiente, including the option of eschewing the majors. "We decided to go with Sony because I think they have the free-est thinkers of all the people we spoke with," he says.

In addition to new bands Travis and Vitro, Independiente has signed long-standing artists Roddy Frame

and John Martyn, continuing a recent trend in which alternative-leaning labels are giving new homes to veteran acts. Alan McGee's Creation is just unveiling its first material by Nick Heyward, and also

has former Dexy's Midnight Runners frontman Kevin Rowland on its books. "There's nothing worse than when genuinely talented people are ghettoised by previous success or when ageism creeps in," says Macdonald. "If you're good, you're good."

Andy Ross says that Food, originally distributed by Rough Trade but associated with EMI since 1988, has suffered at the hands of the U.K.'s weekly music press because of its corporate connections. "The [U.K. music weekly] NME thinks we're some corporate outlet, but they see Alan [McGee]'s lot at Creation as bona fide. Good luck to Alan, I have no problem with them, but we've got five employees and he's got 25."


Ross continues, "Like the word Britpop, the definition [of 'alternative'] goes with the flow. [U.K. heavy rock magazine] Kerrang! are writing about Ash and Symposium—bands from the indie area are making rockier sounds these days." Like Piering, he believes this is partly as a reaction to Britpop. "Have a listen to Song 2 by Blur—if that's not alternative rock I don't know what is."


Increasing radio activity


The repositioning of public CHR station BBC Radio 1 as a "new music station" has been an important factor in the mainstream acceptance of many alternative acts in the U.K

Scott Piering notes, "Radio 1 presents itself as an alternative to commercial radio and for the time being it will continue to lead the pack there," he says. "They can create a new mainstream of 15 to 25-year-old listeners."

With media exposure, an abrasive alternative sound can be tamed and then made attractive to a mass audience. Champion says this was what happened with *Firestarter*. "It was a leader, that record, and a lot of people didn't like it first time they heard it. The second time they were hooked; the third time it was their favourite record."

Think visual

For Universal Music Holland's Rick Haaijen, MTV's role has been a critical element in "breaking the unbreakable." And the arrival two years ago of a Dutch TV music channel—The Music Factory (TMF)—has also been more than helpful in developing alternative acts. For example, Haaijen says that TMF gave him the tools with which to break No Doubt.

"Before TMF picked up the video of Don't Speak, we even got copies of the album returned to us by the press," he recalls. "Now they are the best example of an alternative band growing into mainstream acceptance. Radio couldn't deny them any longer."

Marc Stakenburg, a leading presenter at Dutch public CHR station Radio 3FM, regrets, however, that musical pioneers often drop their favourite bands the moment they become big. "As long as they [the artists] remain relevant, like U2 for instance, I will keep on playing their new records," he promises. "Dutch bands like Bettie Serveert and De Dijk have been regulars on my show since their very first demos."

Later this year, London radio listeners will, literally, have a new alternative when Xfm goes on the air. Appearing's Scott Piering says that, for all Radio 1's advances in recent years, the advent of a full-time, commercially-funded alternative rock station will be an invaluable addition to the radio

commercial radio, which really needs to have some balls [about 'alternative' acts]," he says. "I want radio to support are a commercial venture, we're here to make as much money as possible.'"

As regards Xfm's music policy, Jacob

says that the chart success of alternative acts will not be a factor. "A record's pop chart position will have no bearing on Xfm's output. We don't care what label it's on, even to a certain degree what the band is. We won't really look any further than the record."

A new definition?

Perceptions of the alternative scene and its parameters traditionally differ between Europe and the U.S. When Nirvana broke through in the early '90s, some cynics commented that punk had finally arrived in the U.S., 15 years late. It may also be remembered that in the late '70s, the

U.S. establishment regarded The Knack's power-pop smash *My Sharona* as "new wave."


Now, with U.S. rock radio formats more splintered than ever, the meaning of "alternative" has become even more blurred. Dave Richards, programme director at "active rock" WRCX in Chicago, told Billboard recently: "If today's [U.S.] alternative station is playing everything from Offspring to Jamiroquai, there's certainly not a focused format, but a [mind-set of] 'whatever's a hit or whatever we can make a hit, we'll play it."

From the point of view of the humble artist, perceptions can be both baffling and irritating. Paddy McAloon of Prefab Sprout, long seen as an "establishment" act but, some might say, "alternative" in that their sound is not duplicated by anyone else, says with a wry smile: "It's a disaster area, categorisation.

"When we first started playing in clubs in Durham in 1979, people would still say 'You're kind of new wave,' simply because there wasn't a term 'college rock' or 'alternative.' Alternative has become a genre. That's the problem with categorisation, the word has lost all its power to describe what it was meant to be."

Independiente's Macdonald echoes the sentiment. "There's so much integrity about a Radiohead or a Weller or Oasis, and you can put too many labels on things. Alternative to what? There's good and bad."

Parlophone's Wadsworth puts it another way: "When the alternative becomes the mainstream," he says, "you've got to find another way of defining the alternative."





The Seahorses

The Seahorses didn't so much edge into the British singles chart in May as break the door down. The Geffen act's debut single, Love Is The Law, was an instant top three hit, reflecting the huge anticipation for John Squire's new band. Former lead guitarist with the Stone Roses, Squire brings his distinctive sound to the new group, which features vocalist Chris Helme, bassist Stuart Fletcher and drummer Andy Watt. The Seahorses' debut album Do It Yourself, recorded in Los Angeles with veteran producer Tony Visconti, is out on May 26 in the U.K. and Europe. Geffen market-ing manager Karen Simmonds says Squire "avoided getting caught up in the debacle of the end of the Stone Roses, which was a good career move. People are interested to see what he's doing."
The second single from the album will be Blinded By The Sun in July, around which they will play in the U.K. and support Neil Young in Europe.

High hopes and low culture

Spanish rock iconoclasts Siniestro Total are celebrating their signing to Virgin Records España with a homage to "low music" culture in the Iberian peninsula since the 1960s.

in the Iberian peninsula since the 1960s.
Siniestro Total, whose name means "total write-off" in Spanish, released Cultura Popular (Popular Culture) April 11.
The album is a carefully selected bunch of live versions of songs released since the 1960s which have various claims to be the worst record ever made.

The album launch was followed by concerts in Lisbon, Brussels, Paris, New York and Miami then by a May tour of Chile, Argentina and Mexico.

Julián Hernández, Siniestro's lead singer, explains that *Cultura Popular* started as an elaborate joke at a Santiago University concert last October. The material includes titles meant to be funny or in bad taste, and those that were unintentionally both. Hernandez says the true gem is Spain's 1977 entry to the OTI Song Contest, the Hispanic world's own version of the Eurovision Song Contest.

Called Rómpeme, Mátame (Break Me, Kill Me) by Trigo Limpio, it's "a hymn to sado-masochism," comments Hernandez. "The lyrics relish in objects such as bridles, chains and spurs, and although it wasn't a rock song, it's curious to think it was recorded in the year of the Sex Pistols."

It was of course Virgin who signed the Pistols way back then, after their adventures with EMI and A&M. Although Siniestro's former label Dro/EastWest had a more adventurous A&R policy before its 1993 acquisition by Warner Music, Virgin España is reckoned to have now taken something of a gamble in signing a group which has a cult following but is not a big seller.

Hernandez is critical of what he calls "high bourgeois culture. Maybe it's resentment at



my years in the Conservatory [music academy]. Those places were then lamentable institutions, that neither opened themselves to society or generated culture."

He adds that "Cultura Popular allows us to spread some arguments, perhaps in a pamphleteering way, of proletarian pride."

Asked about the Virgin deal, Hernandez jokes: "Well, actually we settled for little cash and a poster of Spice Girls. And who knows, one day we might have the grand honour of opening for them."

Rainey days in Sweden


Swedish singer Fatima Rainey spent many years as a background singer with some of Sweden's top dance acts before releasing her first single back in February.

Hip-hopper Slijngaard Marketplace is no longer '2 limited'

Hip-hop is probably not the musical genre you'd immediately associate with Slijngaard, formerly half of the now-defunct techno-pop outfit 2Unlimited.

Yet that's exactly what he unleashed on an unsuspecting audience at the National Music Awards presented by Dutch music channel The Music Factory in April.

Slijngaard's new single 3 XA Day on his own Rayvano Music label (distributed by Sony Music in the Benelux countries), grafts R&B vocals and his trademark raps on to a deep hip-hop groove. Last week, the single was at number 17 in the Tip Parade of the Mega Top 100 chart, having been released in the last week of April.

"I would never have done something like this with 2Unlimited, because we were a dance act," suggests Slijngaard. "But this is the music that's really close to me. I've been listening to hip-hop since I was eleven."

Dutch underground rappers may be a little wary of Slijngaard's musical credentials-not considering him hardcore enough-but the 25year old artist and label president shrugs off such comments. "When I hang out with Ice-T and Warren G in their L.A. homes, they respect me for my success with 2Unlimited. They don't care about whether I have enough street credibility.'

According to Sylvana Simons, VJ and pro-

grammer of Sylvana Soul, a show on Dutch music TV station The Music Factory (TMF), street cred is something Slijngaard doesn't have to worry about. "I think it's very brave, what he's done," she says. "It will bring him the credibility he deserves. It's a good single and it will certainly be supported by Sylvana Soul."

The 2Unlimited duo of Slijngaard and Anita Doth enjoyed their first world-wide hit, Get Ready For This (Byte Records), in 1991. The girlsinging/boy-rapping formula proved to be successful and often-imitated, and lasted six years.

The duo's split was acrimonious and, widely publicised. Looking back, Slijngaard says creative control was one of the reasons for the break-up. "At some point I wanted more musical variety, experiment with new producers. But obviously the Byte producers who invented our sound weren't too happy with that. They created the sound and all we had to do was come into the studio and do the vocal tracks."

On his debut album, slated for a Benelux release late August, Slijngaard has been working with different producers, such as Ricky Rainbow (Michelle Gayle, Jodeci) and Herbie Chrichlow (Backstreet Boys).

Although still being mixed, a listen to the unfinished album reveals a tight, focused blend of R&B and hip-hop. Some of the tracks have been written by Slijngaard himself with Dutch producers Jay van den Berg and Eddy Zoëy. "I don't start writing until I'm in the studio," says

Slijngaard, who has just completed the construction of his own X-Rayted studios. "I'm so excited about the process of starting with a bassline and ending up with an entire track. I'm trying to get a more mature sound across now.

One of the album tracks on which he's still working is One Voice, a slow rap track. "I dedicated this song to my girlfriend and our son. I think hiphop shouldn't be all negativity. If Tupac raps about shooting people and smoking weed, than some kids will think those things are cool. As an entertainer, you always have some sort of influence on young people. Besides, it doesn't make sense for me to rap about the ghetto when I'm living in Monaco."

One Voice features the sound of his newborn son, after whom he named his company, Rayvano Records. The company comprises three imprints: X-Ray for dance, Rayvano Music for Slijngaard's own productions, and Da Bridge, which has U. S. artists on its roster and is distributed

Among artists signed to the labels are Dutch R&B artist Little Brown and Dutch dance singer Lucky, underground dance act Seven Point, mainstream Dutch dance act T.O.F. former and Supreme Mary Wilson.



Tranman Entertainment/Mercury France/PolyGram Release dates: from May 26 Composer Eric Levi's choral/electronic studio-based project is approaching platinum status in France, with almost 300,000



copies sold since its March release. Based on the story of the Cathar Monks in the French Pyrenees, its religiousinfluenced, synth-orchestral tones place it in the same camp as Enigma and Deep Forest. As in France, Switzerland and Belgium, where it has been released, marketing will focus on the music and the story rather than artist-related press coverage. Listening posts at retail level and POS material gave an initial kick to sales in France, while a TV ad campaign on TF1 pushed the sales forward, and radio picked up on the single Ameno. PolyGram France is supplying remixes of that single for national releases between now and July. In Spain the project will be handled by PolyGram classics and Jazz, and a U.K. release is under discussion.

'N SYNC

BMG Ariola Munich/BMG European release date: May 26

The hard-working five-boy pop band from Florida broke big in GSA with their Denniz Pop-produced single I Want You Back. Their promotional schedule from mid-May to the end of the summer shows a gruelling set of appointments in Europe. After playing a BMG conference May 27-29, they play a charity gig in Oberhausen before spending five days in the U.K. pushing their first single from this album there, Tearin' Up My Heart. That single, which was their second in Europe, hit number 4 in Germany, and is still being played across the continent, while the third, Here We Go (produced by Germany's Toni Cottura), is now gaining play in Germany and went Top 10 there in the second week of release. Promotional work in Greece, Belgium, gigs in Poland, and appearances in Austria and at Finland's Ranterok in June are part of the early plot for the album. A tour in October with a full band is being assembled.

FAITH NO MORE ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Optimistically-titled sixth album from California's Bay Area rockers, with a new guitarist, John Hudson, reportedly having calmed some of their legendary madness. Lyricist Mike Patton



and bassist Billy Gould visited London during a marathon press and promo jaunt with European journalists in April. MTV filmed footage at their video shoot for use in various programmes, while Germany's Viva TV has picked up the slowed-up, grungy Ashes To Ashes, which is now at radio and was released May 19. BMG lifts another 'Veil' with Tavener and Isserlis

The combination of British new classical composer John Tavener and cellist Steven Isserlis is a potent one.

Tavener's 1987 work The Protecting Veil, performed by Isserlis and released on Virgin in 1992, was nominated for the 1993 Mercury Music Prize, and broke new ground in helping to make modern classical music accessible to new audiences.

Now BMG label RCA Victor Red Seal hopes to surpass that feat with a new work, Syvati, the subject of a radio and direct marketing

campaign which will start in the U.K. and move to France and Germany this summer.

Isserlis commissioned Tavener to write the piece, which is based on Russian and Greek Orthodox forms. The languid, mournful music features Isserlis's solo cello and the voices of the Kiev Chamber choir. At almost 14 minutes long, the title track of Syvati is too long for anything other than public classical broadcasters, yet an edit has been made of the first five minutes of the work, which has had exposure on crossover classical station Classic FM in the U.K.

It was featured by DJ Henry Kelly as record of the week around the time of its May

afterwards the label bought ad spots which featured the music some 30 times a week on Classic FM. In the third week of May, the same edit was sent to some 10,000plus names on the company's InterAct database. In addition, a promotional video clip has been made for servicing to European

and national broadcasters.

Richard Wenn, promotions and marketing manager for BMG Conifer in the U.K. will take up a new Munich-based post as European marketing director for RCA Victor Red Seal in June, and will be targeting Germany and then France with similar techniques for marketing

the new recording.

"With Isserlis and Tavener, there's even more of a cross-over potential than before," says Wenn. "They're offering something spiritual and not just musical."

Wenn suggests the audience for the record is potentially huge, if approached in the right way: "This will be about the exposure of the music. I don't think people want it shoved down their throat."

Depending on availablity of the artist and composer for promotional duties, the record will be introduced to French and German audiences this summer. "I've got time," says Wenn. "This isn't a time-sensitive record."

Belgian boys ready for France

It's rare for a Flemish-speaking band to cross even into the French-speaking part of Belgium, so when Virgin Records announces plans to launch boy band Get Ready! in France, it's even more remarkable.

Signed to former Belgian independent Play That Beat, now a division of Virgin Belgium, Get Ready! formed in 1996 and their debut-single Diep (Deep) went straight to the No.1 position in the Belgian charts that year.

One year on, Jimmy, Koen, Glenn and JM can look back to five consecutive No.1 hits and a double platinum debut album (60,000 units). Their first single was also translated into English and conquered the French-speaking part of Belgium while their Flemish rendition of Richard Marx's Here Waiting **Get Ready!**

(Wachten Op Jou) topped the charts in Flanders.

At press-time, Dromen was topping the Flemish singles charts for the seventh week, and a November 11 concert at the 9.000

seater Forest National is close to sold out; Get Ready!-mania now reigns in Flanders.

Theo Linder, co-founder and MD of Play That Beat, says: "The fact that Get Ready! is a bilingual quartet makes their crossover to France a logical step." In July last year, Linder and his co-MD Marc Debouvier sold Play That Beat to Virgin Belgium. "I strongly believe in the combination of an active independent production unit and a major's know-how," explains Linder, "and crossing to France was one of our prime objectives. Instead of competing with Boyzone or No Mercy in the English language, we think France is a much more open market.

Virgin France has allocated Get Ready! to its special marketing department. The label has just released C'est Toi Que Je Suis (written by Rednex's Pat Reiniz) as their French debut. Says Aurélie Haas, label manager with Virgin France, "The single was mailed to all youth-orientated CHR stations in France. In addition, we put out a special 12-inch version for club promotion and we are negotiating for the band as support to Backstreet Boys for their French tour."


Radio promotion is being handled by veteran French promotion manager Jacques Metges of Metges Music Man-agement (MMM). He enthuses about Get Ready!'s French market

potential. "With the quota regulation on French stations, we don't have room for another 36 boy groups," he says, but with French language [materi-

we have a place for Get Ready! alongside 2 BE 3 and others."

Metges says he will concentrate on the fullservice national stations during summer, shifting to TV in September to coinside with the band's album release there. "From what I've heard from their (Flemish) debut album, Get Ready! have quite some interesting tracks [suitable] for a French version and we get signals that the current single is extremely 'ear-friendly.'

Breakin' & Entering

A weekly Eurochart analysis by Bob Macdonald

Three tenors are scoring on the European Top 100 Albums chart this week-but Carreras, Domingo and Pavarotti are nowhere in sight.

The current charge is led by Andrea Bocelli, who holds at number 2 this week with Romanza

(Sugar/Polydor) and is also listed at 12 with his earlier album, Bocelli. Meanwhile, two of his superstar compatriots get a new lease of life on the Top 100 with long-running albums that are benefiting from a second wind on the Italian chart.

Eros Ramazzotti is back up to number 4 in his homeland and rebounds thirty-six places to number 20 on the European survey with Dove C'E Musica (DDD), already an IFPIcertified 4 million-seller across the continent. Lucio Dalla re-enters locally

at number 2 with Canzoni (Pressing) and returns to the Music & Media Top 100 at number 29, having peaked at 16 last November.

Also contributing to the strong Italian presence on this week's album chart, the new release by local rocker Ligabue goes straight in at No.1 at home and at 25 in Europe. Su E Giu' Da Un Palco (WEA) is the follow-up to 1995's Buon Compleanno Elvis, with reached number 22 on the Top 100 and clocked up 57 weeks on the chart.

Over on the Eurochart Hot 100 Singles, that seasoned Anglo-Italian collaboration, Time To Say Goodbye (East West), climbs three places to a new

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high of number 2 in its 25th chart week. Sarah Brightman and Andrea Bocelli's jump is fuelled by the fact that the single has finally been released in Brightman's native U.K., courtesy of the Coalition label (formerly PWL).

The song's U.K. number 2 placing gives Brightman the biggest British hit of her career,

topping her number 3 peaks in the mid-'80s with two previous male duet partners, Paul Miles-Kingston (Pie Jesu) and Cliff Richard (All I Ask Of You).

If B&B are finally to say hello to the top of the Eurochart, the record they have to dethrone is R. Kelly's resilient I Believe I Can Fly (Jive), which logs its sixth week at the summit. That tally ties the half-dozen weeks that Michael Jackson spent at No.1 in late 1995 with the Kellypenned You Are Not Alone. Kelly now

appears to have seen off the challenge of Jackson's current single Blood On The Dance Floor (Epic), which slips one place to number 3 after three weeks in the runner-up slot; as if that wasn't enough, Kelly wrote and produced the highest new entry at 23, I Don't Want To by Toni Braxton (LaFace/Arista).

There's another potential chart-topper looming large on the horizon, but you won't yet find it on the Eurochart. Look instead at the No.1 slot on the Billboard Hot 100 (see U.S. charts below) or the fastclimbing number 5 on the European Radio Top 50 (see page 29)—Hanson's MMMBop (Mercury) shows all the signs of being a global summer smash,

I do expect it to be a massive hit however, so we might keep it in rotation for a while." Hiller concludes "We generally rely heavily on research and—although it's early days-the future of the track here will be determined in the coming weeks.





Norwegian government targets pop exports

OSLO — The Norwegian government is taking action to help domestic artists and record companies sell more pop music abroad.

Norwegian culture minister Turid Birkeland has contacted industry representatives to offer assistance in promoting domestic contemporary music. A committee of government officials and music executives has now been established to work together on developing appropriate strategies.

Birkeland has said that she is not convinced that an emphasis on classical, jazz, and folk music—at the

expense of pop and rock—has been the best way to promote sales in the past. In contrast, she points to the success which Sweden has enjoyed in recent times with artists like Ace Of Base and The Cardigans.

Industry observers say Birkeland's efforts to establish close, practical involvement with the record industry is unique for a culture minister in Europe. Terje Håkonsen represents rock organisation Samlet Norsk Rock on the newly formed committee, which at present includes representatives from Virgin Records, Mega Records, EMI and Warner Music.

"It's too early to draw substantial

conclusions [on the outcome of the committee work]," says Håkonsen. "We are exploring the possibilities of cooperation between the music industry and politicians." He adds, "We don't expect to come up with any magic formula or set any goals, like reaching Sweden's standards by the year 2000. We only want to create a dialogue."

However, at this stage, Håkonsen sees established A&R policies as a major part of the problem. "Artists are traditionally not signed with the international market in mind. The domestic market comes first, and everything else is a bonus," he comments.

Birkeland's initiative has met with

criticism from some political opponents. Conservative Hallgrim Berg, a member of the parliamentary committee on cultural affairs, said in parliament that the plan had "sent shock waves through performers in classical, jazz, folk, and ethnic music."

He added that he considered it would be foolish to, "send even more cowboys to the U.S.A.," arguing that, "It's more important to promote our top performers in classical and folk."

The music industry committee is scheduled to present its report to Birkeland before the summer. A one-day seminar will then further address the issues in the report.

Now Heisel leaves Columbia Germany

Frankfurt — Sony Music Germany's Columbia division has announced it is losing its second top executive in a

matter of weeks.



Deputy managing director and marketing director Mike Heisel will leave the label to join Stuttgart-based EMI affiliate Intercord as deputy MD and VP A&R/mar-

keting, effective from July 1. The news of Heisel's move to Intercord comes only weeks after MD Hubert Wandjo left Columbia and took the helm at East West Records in Hamburg (see Music & Media, April 5). A replacement for either Heisel or Wandjo at Columbia has not yet been named.

The appointment frees present Intercord VP Jörg Hellwig to take up the post of Polydor MD in Hamburg, which he was offered by PolyGram president Wolf-D. Gramatke in January.

In his new role, Heisel will report directly to Intercord president and MD Herbert Kollisch. Heisel will leave Sony Music's Frankfurt headquarters after some 13 years, during which he founded the company's fast-growing Dancepool label, together with his marketing colleague Hubert Wandjo. In September 1996, Wandjo was appointed MD of Sony Music's then newly-created Columbia division, with Heisel as deputy.

and stiffer, as more companies are poised to set up [music industry related] businesses."

In respect to copyright protection, Ching added that independently-run copyright structures such as CASH will continue to operate independently from Chinese rights society MCSC, and Hong Kong's high level of rights protection would not be affected.

That belief is strengthened by the fact that Hong Kong's new legal system will remain valid after the hand-over. By June 30, the Hong Kong legislative body is expected to have passed a new copyright law which is poised to provide "the most up-to-date legislation" in the territory, according to Peter K.F. Cheung, deputy director of the intellectual property department of the Hong Kong government. Cheung says this Law will offer the highest degree of protection to rights owners, and that will continue to be the case after the hand-over.

Giouw believes that one of the first consequences of the hand-over in the

Hong Kong market will be a decrease in the share of international products, from a 35-65 percent split in favour of local productions, to a 30-70 percent share. But as the overall market is poised to grow, actual sales of international product will be growing too.

Many foreign observers at Midem Asia displayed a more reserved attitude towards the hand-over. "It is unreasonable to hope that the Hong Kong market will remain exactly as it is with such a powerful neighbour," suggests Henry Winter, from U.S. management consultancy firm Booz, Allen & Hamilton.

Winter says there will be changes in business practices (where he adds that building "relationships" with the right people is the key to dealing with China), in legal protection (there is little written commercial law in China) and with regard to the question of censorship. He concludes, "I strongly believe that by 1999, we will see a clear degradation of the rule of law vs. new business practices in Hong Kong."

number of the continental European societies. All societies within the EU are required to submit two commercial statements for inclusion in the document.

The so-called Exhibit One gives details of their current levels of commission, and Exhibit Two gives a schedule for future practice. Exhibit Two was agreed in Cannes and is fixed; all societies will reduce current average commission levels of 8.34 percent of mechanical revenues to 6.9 percent by July 1997, to 6.2 percent by the end of 1998, and to 6 percent by July 2000. Exhibit One documentation from a number of societies is still missing at present, delayed in part by the concentration of public holidays in continental Europe during May.

One man at the centre of the debate, PolyGram Publishing director of legal and business affairs Crispin Evans, says, "There are no matters of substance left to be resolved." Asked about the proximity of a final signing, he says, "We are closer than we were a week ago; I am eternally optimistic."

MCPS chief executive John Hutchinson and Jean-Loup Tournier, president of French society SACEM/SDRM, say they are both satisfied with the Accord in its current form, adding that they are merely awaiting all appropriate documentation to be delivered before appending their signatures.

Reinhold Kreile, president of German body GEMA, comments, "The wording of the Cannes Accord is now agreed and is ready to be signed."

Growth potential for Chrysalis

LONDON — The Chrysalis Group was upbeat about its short-term future as it reported a pre-tax profit of £1.47 million

(\$2.35 million) for the six months ending February 28, compared to a £2.9 million (\$4.64 million) loss for the same period last year.

The group's turnover during the period was £52.5 million (\$84 million), up 12 percent on the six-month period in 1996. Chrysalis' day-to-day operations ran at a loss of

£2.3 million (\$3.68 million), improving on last year's deficit of £3.2 million (\$5.12 million). The group's overall performance was boosted by the sale in January of 49.9 percent of its visual entertainment arm, CVI, to Dutch media giant VNU, which resulted in a windfall profit of £3.2 million (\$5.12 million).

Chrysalis' record operations contributed to the group's growth. Its Echo label enjoyed commercial success with Babybird's album, *Ugly Beautiful*, which was certified gold in the U.K. with sales

of over 200,000 copies.

During the period, Chrysalis' radio division (Chrysalis Radio) revenue rose 50 percent on the previous year. Its radio stable includes Heart 106.2 FM/London, Heart 100.7 FM/Birmingham and Galaxy 101 FM/ Bristol.

Chrysalis chairman Chris Wright, commenting on the

results in a statement, said, "We anticipate a further significant improvement in the radio division in the second half of the year. Investment in existing stations has peaked and we expect to move into overall profit during the next financial year, not withstanding our pursuit of new [radio] licences."



SHAKE (SPEARE) YOUR MONEY MAKER

The name of William Shakespeare doesn't often come up in the credits for hits, but that could soon change if Avex Records has its way. The British arm of the Japanese label releases To Be

Or Not To Be on June Richard E. Grant 2, featuring the voice of actor Richard E. Grant set to a melodic "Dream-European house" style production by Orpheus. The single features the famous soliloquy from Hamlet, and has been



given maximum exposure by Virgin Radio DJs Russ & Jono on their national breakfast show (broadcast on Virgin's AM and London FM frequencies). Avex is talking to European partners about a wider release.

SLOWHAND WITH STICKY FINGERS?

Eric Clapton is among the guests on the forthcoming album by former Rolling Stone Bill Wyman, who left the band in 1993 and now combines his musical career with running his Sticky Fingers restaurant business. Jeff Beck, Chris Rea, Procol Harum's Gary Brooker and Albert Lee have also contributed to the project, which is a collection of songs from the 30s, 40s and 50s. Wyman will sing on one or two tracks with Georgie Fame doing the rest of the male vocals and Beverly Skeete-one of the backing singers on this year's Eurovision Song Contest winner by Katrina & The Waves-contributing female vocals. "I think we're calling the album Struttin' Our Stuff, because that's what we're doing," volunteers the bassist, who is hoping for a September release date.

KRAFTWERK'S EXPRESS BACK ON RAILS

There will, at some point this year, be a new Kraftwerk album, says their label, EMI's Spin Records, and it will feature original members



Ralf Hütter and Florian Schneider. But, as Spin general manager Helmut Rücker points out: "with Kraftwerk as always, it's in the stars." In the meantime, EMI is re-releasing catalogue titles, including The Man Machine, Radioactivity and Trans-Europe Ex-

press, the latter two with extra tracks. This week, Kraftwerk were due to end a lengthy silence with their headlining appearance at U.K. festival Tribal Gathering, on May 24.

U2 WARM TO LARA'S THEME

When U2 kick off the European leg of their Pop-Mart tour in July, they will be followed by at least one groupie, although she's not likely to give them much real trouble. Lara Croft, the 3-D animated heroine of computer game Tomb Raider will feature on a mammoth video screen as the band play Where The Streets Have No Name. Bono and Co. are reportedly big Tomb Raider fans and are fully equipped with PlayStations in case they get withdrawal symptoms on their 14-month globe-straddling outing.

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Off the record

OTR hears that French music industry body SNEP plans to publish market shares by label from June onwards. The decision to make the market more "transparent" has been delayed out for some years by SNEP members Auvidis and Musidisc, who have objected to the publication of their market share figures. According to industry sources, the matter was finally settled after the SNEP board decided to switch from unanimous to majority voting.

The president of the U.K.'s Music Publishers' Association (MPA), Andy Heath (of Momentum Music/Beggars Banquet) has joined the board of the Performing Right Society (PRS), effective immediately. He replaces Jonathan Simon, who has resigned from the board. Heath has held the post of MPA president since 1993, and is also a director of the Mechanical Copyright Protection Society (MCPS); he is expected to further the evolving alliance between MCPS and PRS. Heath will step down as MPA president in July.

The expected rush for commercial radio licences in Austria has not started yet... OTR hears that the country's Regional Radio Authority has not received a single official application since May 1, the day the licencing procedure started. The authority has eight regional and 45 local licences to hand out, and the deadline for applications is June 12.



NRJ president and founder Jean-Paul Baudecroux will kick off the 1997 Radio Festival in Birmingham on July 7-9 by delivering the Radio Times lecture on the evening of July 7. The annual three-day event attracts delegates from the U.K.'s private and public radio sectors.

Emap Radio is to set up its own advertising sales and marketing company. Satellite and cable channel Eurosport's U.K. managing director, Tom Toumazis, has been appointed MD of the new concern. In the past, Emap used Capital Radio-owned sales house MSM for a large part of its advertising sales. After the recent acquisition of Virgin Radio by Capital—which still awaits approval from regulator the Radio Authority and the government Office of Fair Trading-MSM was put up for sale. Emap says its new company will "work alongside MSM."

OTR hears that Spanish publishing house Prensa Espanola and French communications group Hachette are to buy into 26-station radio group Uníon Ibérica de Radio, controlled by Mexican media giant Televisa. Hachette already has shares in Union Iberica's most important network, news/talk formatted Radio Espana. Televisa acquired 50 percent of Union Iberica for Pta 1.1 billion (\$7.7 million) at the end of last year, bringing its interest in the company up to 100 percent. Industry sources suggest that the shareholder changes are taking place in time for the government's plan to award 200 new FM licences.

With EMI having picked up worldwide rights to David Bowie's back catalogue for a reported £18 million (\$30 million), EMI Records U.K. is preparing for

the release of previously unissued material. Large quantities of tapes dating from 1969-1990 have already been carted into the EMI-owned Abbey Road studios. Apparently EMI has set itself a six month deadline to sift through the material and come up with a concept for a commercial

release. Bowie himself will be asked, "to provide some input," according to Tris Penna, director of EMI Premier, EMI Disc and associated labels, who is A&Ring the project, "but he will not be in the driving seat."

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
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
