Book Reviews

"THE MARCONI SCAMDAL" by Frances Donaldson, 1962.

In March 1912, the Postmaster-General of England accepted the Marconi Company's bid to build the first six stations of a wireless chain to link the Pritish Empire. Negotiations had been conducted for the Marconi Company by its Managing Director, Godfrey Isaacs, brother of Sir Rufus Isaacs the Attorney-General. Immediately it became clear that opposition to the contract would be unexpectedly strong. Rumors began to spread charging Ministers, among them Lloyd George, with corruption in placing the contract and using their position to speculate in Marconi stock.

Although it has been discussed in many biographies of the period, this is the first objective and fulllength account of this dramatic and little-known event in English History of which Mr. Marconi was blameless.

1,000,000th Atwater Kent Receiver Is Turned Out

A duplicate of the millionth Atwater Kent receiver, which, according to word from the factory to Toin J. Molloy, sales representative for the Atwater Kent Manufacturing Company, is scheduled to be twrned out Friday afternoon, will be received by the H. T. Dictrictorompany, Indianapolis distributors. The set will bear a special gold plate with the number of the set certified over Mr. Kent's signature and will bear a serial number between 1,000,000 and 1,000,100. In addition to the millionth set Friday, more than 5,300 other rerelvers will be turned out. In 1922 the production was 5,528. Tremendous production gains are shown yearly, until this year the production will be 600,000.




