Inquiries about codes, size of device, use of Walkman, overnight results lead list

WPGC-AM & FM VP/GM Ben Hill said the new agreement is likely one of the largest talent contracts in DC broadcasting history. He said the new contract was worth at least "seven figures" annually and that ample bonuses were included, but he declined to reveal specific terms.

Simpson said WPGC "doubled my salary," and he did not dispute a Washington Post report that he was earning \$750,000 per year at WKYS. That would place his new contract at approximately \$1.5 million annually.

Arbitron's Pocket People Me- pletes user testing and engages with broadcast managers and engineers. R&R has researched some of the most-asked questions

Q: How does the People Meter work?

A: Survey participants will wear a device that picks up inaudible acoustic codes sent by a radio or TV station. An internal clock issues a time-stamp each time a station is tuned in or tuned out, and the People Meter stores the data until it is retrieved - either via modem or when the meter is returned to Arbitron

Q: How are these codes transmitted?

A: Codes will be sent in one of two ways: 1) If a "frequency addition" scheme is adopted, stations will transmit a combination of pure, continuous tones in very narrow notches over the broadcast spectrum. Arbitron officials promise the tones will be "many db below background level," making them inaudible during soft passages, talk shows, or even dead air. Each station will be identified by a unique combination of

Korn To Head Westinghouse

Paxson Challenge Delays Jacor Restructuring

Florida group rekindles sex harassment charges made on '20/20' TV appearance

Jacor Communications' titfor-tat FCC spat with Paxson Broadcasting has forced Jacor to delay a shareholders' vote on its \$127 million takeover by Zell/ Chilmark until January 8, 1993. In addition, Paxson has raised the stakes - charging that Jacor is unfit to be a licensee because of alleged "systemic sexual harassment and degradation of Jacor female employees.

"Jacor [and] its officers and directors do not possess the requisite character qualifications to remain FCC licensees," Paxson alleged, effectively arguing that the FCC should strip Jacor of its 11 radio licenses. Paxson's claim is based on sexual discrimination charges pending in Florida and a report last February on ABC-TV's "20/20" program.

Allegations Recounted Paxson recounted allegations from the TV program and a lawsuit by former WFLA/Tampa talk show host Liz Richards that Jacor Exec. VP/Co-COO Randy Michaels instigated or condoned:

Clinton Transition Team Puts FCC Under 'Scope

'Efficiency squad' includes congressional aide, possible new Commission Chairman

A transition team representing President-elect Bill Clinton has begun a comprehensive review of the FCC's organization, procedures, and budget.

The team includes many Democratic congressional staffers. Among those conducting the probe are David Leach, an influential aide to House Energy and Commerce Committee Chairman John Dingell (D-MI); House Telecommunications Subcommittee staffer Gerard Waldron; and Senate Communications Subcommittee aides John Windhausen and Antoinette "Toni" Cook.

Cook, the stepdaughter of Clinton transition chief Vernon Jordan, has been prominently mentioned as a candidate to succeed departing FCC Chairman Al Sikes.

The project is headed by communications attorney Ronald Plesser, who specializes in intellectual property issues at the law firm of Piper & Marbury. He will report to former astronaut Sally Ride, who heads up the Clinton transition team's Science/Space cluster group. At R&R's Tuesday (12/15)

bers had apparently met with all FCC commissioners and agency bureau chiefs.

Boosting Efficiency

Team members are tightlipped about their work, and have imposed vows of nearsilence on the FCC staffers with whom they have met. Transition officials will say only that their job is to provide an overview of the agency's current operations. They are attempting to identify ways of boosting the FCC's efficiency, and insist







Duopoly Touted At Media Conference

Now that FCC rules allow ownership of two FMs and two AMs in a single market, some of America's largest media conglomerates say they're on the prowl for radio acquisitions. They also told the 20th Annual PaineWebber Media Conference attendees they expect 1993 radio revenues to grow – but only modestly.

"We're looking for more duopoly situations," Viacom President/ CEO Frank Biondi noted. His bullish outlook on acquisitions came despite a 3% drop in third quarter revenues for Viacom's radio group. "There's still some softness at some major market stations, but we're seeing improvement."

Biondi told the New York gathering of investment analysts and institutional investors that Viacom's KYSR/Los Angeles was "performing quite strongly" after its September format switch to Hot AC.

Viacom Chairman Sumner Redstone also hailed the duopoly change, noting Viacom had been one of the first to take advantage of the new rules with its pending swap of KHOW-AM & FM/Denver for Noble Broadcast Group's KNDD/ Seattle (Viacom already owns KBSG-AM & FM/Seattle.) Redstone also claimed a bit of credit for Bill Clinton's successful run for the White House, citing Clinton's MTV appearance as a turning point in the campaign. "Through its 'Choose Or Lose' campaign, MTV galvanized a generation."

Gannett Growth

Gannett officials forecast revenue growth of 3% to 4% for its broadcast group in 1993, without separating TV and radio. Although he's hoping for even stronger growth, "we won't budget an economic recovery until we see it firsthand," said Chairman/CEO John Curley.

Regarding radio duopolies, Curley cited Cap Cities/ABC CEO Daniel Burke's comments (R&R 12/11), which stated companies had to get bigger or get out of their radio markets. "That's valid. I can't expand on that."

But at least one company's not going along with such thinking. "We're not going to get out of radio," Gaylord Entertainment Co. President/CEO Bud Wendell told R&R. But he said Gaylord isn't interested in expanding its three-

station group because "it's not part of our strategic plan."

Heritage Media Corp. may alter its strategy slightly because of the duopoly change. "We like to buy properties we can turn around," President David Walthall remarked. He noted that the company bought WOFX/Cincinnati and KCFX/Kansas City for \$7 million this year, but "they'll do \$2 million in cash flow next year."

But because of duopoly, Heritage Exec. VP Joseph Mahaffey told R&R the company might also be interested in looking at established properties. "If we could achieve format dominance in a market . . . yes, we'd be interested."

NAB Pressing EIA For In-Band Only DAB Tests

The NAB is trying to convince the Electronic Industries Association to team up for in-band, on-channel DAB testing before turning to other options. But EIA remains firmly opposed to the idea. specifies in-band, and designate

When the NAB's Radio Board meets next month in Naples, FL, it's expected to approve recommendations by its DAB Task Force that the NAB promote development of in-band, on-channel DAB systems (the current policy only specifies in-band) and designate the National Radio Standards Committee as the proper forum for testing potential systems. The NRSC is jointly administered by NAB and EIA.

"We see it as a better forum," said Task Force Chairman Alan

Box, who told R&R that EIA could continue its own efforts to test various DAB approaches, while the NAB would only approve NRSC testing of in-band, on-channel systems. To date, USA Digital Radio is the only developer known to be working on such a system. But Box said NRSC testing would be a way to "flush out any others."

The NAB proposal would slow down EIA's current efforts to pick a U.S. DAB standard by the end of 1993. Box said the NRSC process should be "reasonably quick, but not to the exclusion of other proponents." He suggested the tests should begin in about a year.


EIA Stays Course

"We've set a course and intend to stick to it," said EIA Group VP/-Consumer Electronics Division Gary Shapiro, who also rejected previous efforts by NAB officials to move DAB testing to the NRSC. Shapiro accused NAB of bias – first endorsing the Eureka-147 DAB system and now insisting on in-band, on-channel – and said restricting testing to one approach "would make the results less valuable to the FCC."

System descriptions for EIA's DAB tests are due this week, which is likely to pare the number of contenders from the most recent count of eight. (Digital Planet is the most recent to withdraw.)

Applications for satellite DAB licenses were also due this week at the FCC. American Mobile Satellite Corp., Primosphere L.P., and at least one other company were expected to file, joining the pending application by Satellite CD Radio. In its recent reply to NAB's petition to deny its application, SCDR insisted its subscription audio service "will complement, rather than compete directly with," existing radio stations.

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Saga Fights IRS Fines

he **IRS** stung **Saga Communications** with fines totaling nearly \$1.5 million after questioning the way the company allocated radio station purchase prices.

Details of the fines were disclosed last week as Saga successfully completed a \$23 million initial public stock offering. According to the prospectus, the IRS is demanding fines and penalties for violations that took place between 1987-90.

"Management disagrees with the claims made by the IRS and intends to defend its position vigorously. An adverse ruling could have a material adverse effect on the company's cash position and operations," Saga said.

The company reported net operating revenues totaling \$22.77 million for the first nine months of 1992, a 13% increase from last year. However, those gains were offset by a 16% increase in operating expenses for an overall net loss of \$409,000 for the period.

In connection with the offering, lenders **Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, First National Bank of Boston,** and **Bank of New York** have agreed to refinance existing bank debt. The banks will provide Saga with a \$37 million revolving credit line and an \$8 million senior secured credit line earmarked for acquisitions. Saga shares went public on the **American Stock Exchange** at \$11.50 per share under the symbol "SGA."

Venture Capital Flows For Broadcasters

B roadcasters bemoaning tight bank credit availability may be surprised to learn professional venture capital firms are very interested in the industry, according to **Online Publishing** CEO **Clarke Simmons.**

A former White House intelligence analyst, Simmons spent two years researching risk finance markets for a new publication, "The Venture Capital Directory." He identified 224 U.S. venture capital companies with \$16.9 billion of funds that are interested in bankrolling communications.

"It's hard for a start-up to get venture capital. For established firms, there's always money looking for opportunities if deals are offered in a professional manner," Simmons said.

The comprehensive volume lists more than 1000 investors, about 30% more than any other publication. Copies are available for \$145 each by calling (800) 257-2947.

Ewing/Sillerman Feud Renewed At FCC

ormer KRLD/Dallas GM Michael Ewing has asked the FCC to reconsider its dismissal of his petition to deny the reorganization of Command Communications and Capstar Media into C.F. Media.

Ewing contends the Commission has "ignored" his allegations that New York entrepreneur **Robert F.X. Sillerman** exercised unauthorized control of the companies and misrepresented their financial status to the FCC. According to Ewing's petition, "the approach to licensee responsibilities evinced by Mr. Sillerman has had a serious deleterious impact on the broadcast services available to the public." The Commission tossed out his challenge last October after Command CEO Carl Brazell dubbed Ewing "a disgruntled former employee."

Meanwhile, Sillerman and legendary New York talent Bruce "Cousin Brucie" Morrow are expanding their ownership plans. The two currently own WCDX/Hyde Park (Poughkeepsie), NY. Now they've formed Multi-Market Radio Inc. to acquire WPKX/Enfield, CT (Springfield, MA) for \$5 million cash from Goldenberg Broadcasting. Other stations which may soon be added to the stew: Sillerman's WHMP-AM & FM/Northampton (Springfield), MA and Jones Eastern's WYAK-AM & FM/Myrtle Beach, SC.

Other market action:

• At presstime Tuesday (12/15), Reno's first duopoly deal was being struck. Dave Newman's New World Enterprises, operator of KZAK/Incline Village, NV, was buying KPLY & KKMR/Reno-Sparks from Jonsson Communications. Terms of the deal, brokered by Randy George of Media Venture Partners, were undisclosed.

• Radio broker Frank Boyle is suing Jacor Communications execs Terry Jacobs and Robert Lawrence for \$10 million. Boyle, who formerly headed Eastman Radio, claims he has not received \$600,000 owed him under a 1985 retirement agreement after Jacor sold the rep firm to Katz in 1990. Neither Jacobs nor Lawrence has yet responded to the suit.

• Coast Broadcasting has decided to liquidate KFRC-AM & FM/San Francisco, and Media Venture Partners broker Elliot Evers has been ordered to shop the stations for \$22 million. Coast paid \$26.5 million to assemble the combo from Emmis and RKO in 1990.

Murder Charge Mars KOLA Sale

rederick Cote, owner of KOLA/San Bernardino, should not be permitted to sell the station after being indicted on murder charges, according to a petition to deny filed by a Los Angeles man.

Cote is currently in Riverside County Jail awaiting trial on charges he hired a KOLA staffer to murder a man described in a newspaper report as the "roommate" of Cote's estranged wife. The victim was shot to death in the apartment he shared with the woman, who was bound and gagged in a closet at the time of the killing.

Cote is seeking approval to sell KOLA to SBR Broadcasting Corp., a subsidiary of Anahelm Broadcasting Corp., for \$5 million.

In his petition to deny, Joseph Jones said Cote's indictment, his alleged flight to avoid prosecution, and the charge that he recruited a station employee to commit the murder are grounds to block the sale


But in a response filed with the FCC, Cote lawyer David Tillotson said the charges against his client are simply "allegations" that didn't need to be reported to the agency es man. and cannot be weighed against Cote under current Commission policy.

"[The] presumption of innocence," stated the response, "is recognized and honored in the Commission's well-established policy that it will refrain from making licensing decisions based on mere allegations of non-FCC misconduct even where allegations have resulted in an indictment..."

The response also dismisses Jones's allegations that Cote forfeited control of the station during his alleged flight from justice and incarceration, engaged in an improper license transfer, and failed to file all pertinent sale documents.

In an affadavit attached to the response, Cote said Jones contacted him in prison earlier this year and inquired about buying KOLA. However, Jones never submitted the written offer requested by Cote. Jones could not be reached for

comment.

- "pornographic caricatures" of female employees, including one in which Richards was depicted "with a penis dripping semen aimed at her face"
- male employees grabbing Richards and trying to force her to "demonstrate a sexual act referred to as the 'Trenton Turtle.' ''

The filing also cited allegations that Michaels personally:

- "kissed Ms. Richards and bit her on the neck, against her will"
- "walked up and down the hallway with a long, flexible rubber penis wrapped around his neck"
- twice "mooned" a female employee.

"The charges aren't true," Michaels told **R&R**. He noted that the sexual harassment allegations were "charges by one dismissed employee" which are still in litigation. Michaels called the filings by Paxson Broadcasting "a clear abuse of process" and accused owner **Bud Paxson** of being "just personal and nasty" in his attacks on Jacor.

Vote Postponed

Jacor's shareholder vote, which had been scheduled for December 29, has been postponed to January 8 because the FCC has not yet approved an application to transfer control of its stations to a new board of directors as the first step of the Zell takeover. (The latest allegations pertain specifically to step two.) Jacor has urged the Commission to dismiss Paxson's challenge to the first transfer (R&R 11/20), which claimed that Zell is already in control of Jacor without FCC approval. In a recent filing, Jacor implored the FCC to act quickly because its agreements with Zell and its creditors have an "ultimate deadline" of January 15, 1993.

Jacor Chairman/CEO Terry Jacobs has warned shareholders that unless the Zell takeover is approved, "management can foresee no alternative but to commence a proceeding under the federal bankruptcy laws." Jacor's FCC filing charged that Paxson is "counting on FCC processing delays to defeat Jacor's vital refinancing, and thereby reduce competition in its markets."

Paxson and Jacor compete headto-head in both the Tampa and Jacksonville markets. Paxson's legal efforts to derail Jacor's financial reorganization came after Jacor made numerous FCC filings which have tied up Paxson acquisitions in Jacksonville.

Commission officials who have met with transition team members say the questions have indeed focused on the nuts-and-bolts aspects of FCC operations.

One veteran FCC observer believes the Clinton administration's options for reorganizing the agency are extremely limited. "They can't do anything that costs money," said Media Access Project Exec. Director Andrew Schwartzman. "They can only do things that save money. [The FCC] has already squeezed about everything they can [out of its budget]."


Meanwhile, another Democratic staffer has reportedly joined the transition team in a more policyoriented capacity. According to press reports and sources, House Telecommunications Subcommittee aide Larry Irving has been tapped to oversee communications infrastructure policy.

Irving, a strong advocate for minority positions in broadcasting issues, is rumored to be a contender for the post of Administrator of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA).

In that capacity, he would report to Commerce Secretary-designate **Ron Brown**, who owns a small portion of WKYS/Washington. Brown is currently Chairman of the Democratic National Committee.

R&R OVERVIEW

20,000 RESPONDENTS Frequent Flyers' Business Travel Surveyed

requent Flver magazine re cently polled nearly 20,000 readers on their business travel activities, and found that most of the respondents belonged to a frequent flyer program.

While 38% of the respondents said they'd joined one airline club, 26% belong to two. Ten percent are members of three such clubs, and 8% have enrolled in four or more.

Most Valuable Perk

When asked to name the most valuable perk of their frequent flyer programs, 68% listed "free travel." Another 25% enjoy free or low-cost upgrades, and 6% value the boarding and check-in privileges.

International Vs. Domestic Meanwhile, 40% of international business travelers prefer to sit in business class, but 42% of domestic flyers favor discounted, advancepurchase coach tickets (compared with 28% of international travelers). Furthermore, 36% of domestic business travelers buy unrestricted coach tickets, in con-

trast to 7% of international flyers.

Top 15 Cities For Business

harlotte ranks No. 38 in Arbitron's eyes, but when it comes to doing business, the Hornet City is considered top-notch.

Upgrades

Another 16% of domestic travelers use frequent flyer upgrades, while 10% and 9% of international flyers like to upgrade to business and first classes, respectively. Only 6% of both domestic and international flyers indulge in first-class seating

Time Vs. Money

When booking a flight, 63% of all frequent flyers say they're influ-enced by the flight's scheduled departure or arrival time, while 23% are affected by frequent flyer plans. Only 11% are swayed by ticket prices. Nevertheless, 30% of travelers said the rising cost of airfare has led them to drive to a destination instead of fly.

Who Chooses?

Nearly all business travelers (92%) choose their own airlines, hotels, and car-rental firms. Four percent ask their secretaries to choose, and 2% use their travel agents. Another 2% have their firms make the selections.

Baggage Check

Most flyers don't entrust their belongings to airline staff - 41% $\,$ "almost never" check their luggage, and 20% only do so on long-haul flights. Only 20% "almost always" check their baggage.

On-Board Activities

To pass the time on-board, 44% of travelers do work-related projects, while an equal amount like to read for pleasure. A mere 12% sleep, relax, or talk to other passengers

When asked to rate in-flight cuisine, 51% labeled the meals "edible," and 30% admitted they're "better than people say." Eighteen percent called the food "a joke."

tination, 45% of travelers are influenced by location when choosing a hotel. Another 17% look at the quality of the hotel's service and amenities. And 13% are affected by both the hotel's price and frequent stay program.

Extra Getaways

Incidentally, 45% of travelers add a weekend "getaway" vacation to the end of a business trip. Another 23% do so three or four times annually, and 12% say they do it five or six times. Twenty percent never mix a business trip with a personal vacation.

Promotion Test

ne way to test your company's organizational effectiveness is to check the progress of its employees. The Greenville, SC-based People & Profits newsletter suggests you draw up a list of everyone in your company who you feel is eligible for promotion.

ermination is usually a traumatic experience, but one that must be handled with a clear head. Otherwise you may jeopardize references and diminish your chances for future employment

If you find yourself on the receiving end of a pink slip, Sherry Benjamins, Sr. VP/GM at Irvine, CA-based outplacement consultants Lee Hecht Harrison, suggests the following course of action:

Don't let your emotions rule your behavior, it's easy to feel sorry for yourself, blame others, and dwell on the past. The trick is to evaluate your circumstances, values, and strengths, then plan for the future.

Be honest about your termination. Figure out the best way to tell your story, and use that version consistently. But .

Don't badmouth former employers. Sour grapes are a tumoff to potential new employers. Maintain a diplomatic stance toward your old boss and company

Tell your friends and family you've been fired. Don't deny yourself the emotional support and networking opportunities they can offer

Don't lose control of finances. Avoid knee-jerk reactions to loss of income. Instead, come up with a revised budget strategy based on your financial condition, and out back where you can (e.g., no new loans, curb credit spending, etc.).

Joyner Says Eight Is Enough

egendary flyjock **Tom Joyner** — who's done mornings at **KKDA-FM (K104)** and afternoons at **WGCI-FM/Chicago** for the past eight years — says he definitely will *not* renew his contracts with *either* station when they expire next October.

"It's just time to stop," Joyner told the *Dallas Morning News.* "Working all the time is not what I'm all about."

"We've received no official word that he'll be saying goodbye," 'GCI PD **Elroy R.C. Smith** told ST. "But his decision, if it's certain, doesn't surprise us." No comment from K104 management.

The news about Joyner surfaced just after K104 paired him with former afternoon host **Guy Black.** Now there's speculation that Joyner may exit K104 prior to October, with Black either claiming the gig for himself or filling in until a permanent replacement can be found.

KAZY/Denver — which switched to *hard* rock last week after its LMA with **Jacor**'s **KRFX (The Fox)** — is continuing its caustic, **Power Pig**-like attack against **Great American** AOR **KBPI.** Among the latest liners:

- "We may suck, but 'BPI swallows."
- "KBPI where [GM] Tom Sly was sent to die."
- "If KBPI wants to play a lot of music, why don't [morning men] Dean & Rog just shut the f*ck up!"

Some KAZY liners use "Rocks the Rockies," which just happens to be KBPI's main slogan. On Monday (12/14), KBPI slapped KAZY with a C&D that KAZY has thus far ignored.

• Now that Motown Sr. VP/Promo Frank Turner has resigned over a contractual matter, are two East Coast offers firming up? If Motown is unable to keep Turner in the fold, will heir apparent VP/Promo Charley Lake be lookin' for Malibu digs come January?

• Is B.R. Marketing honcho Barry Richards about to buy a SoCal station?

• Will WWHT/Columbus, OH owner M. M. Group purchase crosstown Gold WCOL-FM?

NMF Sets Radio Promo

ebruary '93 has been declared "National Music Foundation Month." During that time, the nonprofit NMF will encourage radio listeners to

KBPI, meanwhile, has ignored KAZY's onair offers to pay its rival to go Country by Christmas. The initial \$100,000 proposal had increased to \$300,000 by the time ST went to press.

KAZY is still running jockless in the wake of last week's format adjustment. Among the KAZY staffers who'll survive the LMA: MD **Lois Todd**, Promotion Dir. **Mike DePriest** and assistant **Shauna Moran**, and Production Dir. **Mark Coulter.** Fox Production Dir. **Todd Little** becomes KAZY APD.

ST has learned that **Arista/Nashville** Southwest regional promo rep **Anne Weaver** will be named VP/Promo for **Mercury/Nashville**. Current Mercury VP/Promo **Bobby Young** will remain with the label in a different capacity. Dir./Nat'l Promo **Patti Olsen** exits.

Meanwhile, **Bobby Kraig** — PD for 12 years at Country **KPLX/Dallas** — will become Arista/Nashville's Dir./Nat'l Promo. That makes two primo Big D Country openings, as **KSCS**'s PD gig is still pending.

Rumors that former **RCA/Nashville** VP/ Promo **Eddie Mascolo** will head the new Nashville division for indie **Jeff McCluskey** continue to circulate. Mascolo simply says he's "weighing his options." Don't bet against this one.

After three years with the New Rockleaning CHR, **KWOD/Sacramento** Station Mgr. **Gerry Cagle** resigns to relocate to L.A. and pursue a fulltime writing career. (His first published effort, "Payola," was a modest success.) Cagle's next book, "Mulholland



frequencies. 2) In a "frequency subtraction" scheme, portions of the broadcast spectrum will be notched out in pulses, much like Morse code.

Q: Will the system be compromised on AM, where the frequency range is much narrower than on FM?

A: Arbitron says the system will use frequencies compatible with AM, FM, TV, cable, and digital audio, and that it should not interfere with any sound. However, it plans to gather engineers from all sectors to help decide which scheme to adopt and to insure that program audio will not be affected.

Q: What information will be transmitted over the codes?

A: Only the station's call letters. Arbitron says it may eventually allow TV syndicators to encode specific shows to track program clearance, but it has no plans to code specific commercials, songs, or other individual program elements.

Q: How far away can a person be from the source and still be picked up by the People Meter?

A: Engineers say the People Meter can pick up any signal that's within earshot of the person.

Q: Does that mean a station can increase ratings by blasting its program over street corners and other crowded locations?

A: Perhaps, assuming it doesn't affect community goodwill or violate noise ordinances.

Q: Is it true that listening on a personal stereo such as a Walkman can't be recognized by the People Meter?

A: Apparently so. Arbitron says the solution is to provide its participants with specially equipped headsets with a built-in people meter, or to attach a regular meter between the radio and headphones.

Q: How can Arbitron insure that users wear the device at all times? A: The company will track usage habits during user testing, which

begins next year. Although the prototype is the size of a pager, its developers are trying to shrink it down further so it can be built into a wristwatch or lapel pin.

Q: How long must a user be tuned to a station before it is registered by the People Meter?

A: Since the meter can almost instantly identify a station, it becomes an editing issue. Arbitron officials say they're willing to change the current five-minute minimum. Q: How long will users be asked to wear the device?

A: Arbitron officials have expressed the hope that users will wear the meter longer than one week, which is the current TV and radio diary period. Q: How will the information be

transmitted back to Arbitron?

A: In one scenario, Arbitron will supply users with a recharging stand, or similar device that doubles as a modem. The device can then transmit the stored information each time it is placed in the stand. Otherwise, Arbitron will supply users with a container for return via mail.

Q: What happens if a station chooses not to encode its signal?

A: The People Meter cannot recognize unencoded radio or TV signals, even as an "unidentified" entity.

Q: How much will the encoding equipment cost, and who will pay for it?

A: Arbitron doesn't know yet, but promises to make it "affordable for all broadcasters."

Q: How big will sample sizes be with the People Meter?

A: Almost certainly, TV and radio samples will be combined, effectively doubling sample sizes. In New York, 6530 were measured for radio in a recent 12-week survey. For TV, 5239 people filled out diaries during a four-week sweep, and an additional 529 households have longterm meters attached to their sets. Questions about sample sizes and survey periods between the two media will obviously have to be worked out.

Q: Is there the possibility that radio can be provided with overnight ratings? A: Yes, if radio wants them. As

WIL/St. Louis VP/GM and new Arbitron Advisory Council President Dick Williams said, "I'm not so sure I need overnights, but I could see it used by a station that runs sports or specials."

Q: Will the People Meter be more accurate than the diary?

A: Yes - assuming people wear them. Consultant Dwight Douglas said there was widespread agreement at Arbitron's recent Consultant Fly-In that a lot of incidental radio listening that's not recorded in diaries will be picked up by the meter. Arbitron Exec. VP/Sales & Marketing Ken Wollenberg agreed with that assessment.

Q: How many markets will use the People Meter?

A: It's not known, but Arbitron said it will continue to measure "smaller" markets with diaries.

Q: What markets will be the first to use the meter?

A: Arbitron will only say that two "medium" markets will fully convert to the people meter - it's hoped by the end of 1994.

Q: Can the signals harm dogs. affect remote controls, or open garage doors?

A: The People Meter uses frequencies in the human range of hearing (although at sub-audible levels), and won't affect dogs. The entire system is strictly acoustic and generates no RF or infrared signals of its own - which means it should not affect or be affected by other electronic devices.




Phil Collins: Rock 'N' Role Star



Reeling In The Talk Year: Lessons Of 1992

With 1993 right around the corner, let's take a moment for a month-by-month review of some of this year's notable Talk events and lessons.

In January, KABC/Los Angeles midday host Michael Jackson cele-

midday host Michael Jackson celebrated his 25th anniversary by sharing 25 tips for talk host success (1/17), including:

• Never worry if a guest cancels. Remember that it's your show. If you can't entertain your audience for an hour, you've got career trouble.

• Pose statements – instead of questions – to your guests. Talk radio is supposed to sound conversational, and very few conversations consist of one person asking questions and another answering them.

• Urge your PD to be straightforward and critical. You're never too experienced to take direction.

February (2/14) brought a discussion of how to hire the right PD for a Talk station. Among the tips offered by the panel of format veterans:

• Allow plenty of search time. A proper hunt can take up to three months.

• Look for that spark of craziness. Technical competence is important, but it isn't everything. You need someone who can generate new ideas and provide support and empathy for the talent.

• Broaden your search horizons to include programmers from other formats – or even from television.

• Press candidates for details about their programming philosophies and past successes.



Center Stage

WJFK/Washington's move to a hybrid Talk/AOR format took center stage in March (3/6). The Infinity station has since done extremely well in men 25-54 with a daytime lineup featuring Howard Stern, G. Gordon Liddy, and Don Geronimo & Mike O'Meara. Evenings and weekends were originally devoted to Classic Rock, but in September the station switched to an NAC sound.

Radio neophyte Liddy has proven particularly popular, drawing a large audience that seems to hang on his every word while forgiving his lack of formatic skill.

As PD Cerphe Colwell noted in March: "I like the fact [Liddy's] not smooth. Gordon's strength is his personality. We didn't want Ted Koppel and 'Nightline.' We want to entertain people."

In April, I detailed a Katz Radio Group study of Fall Arbitron data that indicated Talk radio's audience has grown slightly younger over the past seven years. According to Katz, the 25-54 demo accounted for 45.2% of the average News/Talk station's total audience in Fall '91. That was up from 41.9% in 1990 and 38% in 1984.

However, Katz noted, the 65+ cell made up 35% of the Fall '91 audience – just as it did in Fall '84. Even more worrisome, the study found evidence of a dip in overall 12+ Talk listenership in the Top 75 markets.

May (5/1) brought a focus on the Fairbanks Talk Network, a regional Talk web that was paying big dividends for WKOX/Framingham, MA.

When the story appeared, Fairbanks-owned WKOX was feeding eight of its daily and weekly specialty talk shows to five other stations in western Massachusetts. According to GM James Cande, the mini-network helped make 1991 WKOX's most profitable year since 1984.

"I just figured if Satellite Music Network can create [programming] and charge money or spots for it, so can we," said Cande.

Format Publicity

June brought a flood of format publicity as Vice President Dan Quayle and Democratic presidential candidate Bill Clinton made appearances at the fourth annual National Association of Radio Talk Show Hosts (NARTSH) convention in Washington.

But some of the media hype over Talk radio's supposed political influence was deflated by a November Roper Organization survey of 2000 Americans (11/6) that found just 21% of Talk radio listeners

considered the format a "primary" or "important" source of information about national political candidates. Fifty-three percent of the respondents called the format a "minor" source of such political dope.

Cox Enterprises' WSUN/Tampa drew attention in July (7/24) with its move from Country to a "patchwork" Talk format made up of a local morning news block, followed by simulcasts of programs that originate at sister Talk outlets WSB/ Atlanta and WIOD/Miami — including 'IOD's Neil Rogers midday show.

Cox Executive VP/Radio Bob Neil claimed to be pleased with the station's summer Arbitron performance – even though the station slipped 1.4.7 in 12+ and was flat in 25-54 with just under a one share (10/23). Neil's satisfaction stemmed from the relative success Rogers and WIOD PM drivers Rick and Suds had in luring men 25-44.

Luring Talent

WNCN/New York's last-minute failure to sign talker Jay Diamond to host AM drive prompted a late summer discussion of the art of luring and caring for top Talk talent (9/11).

Among the key points:

• Successful personalities are big on creative freedom. They don't want to work at a station that will attempt to rein them in or change their act.

• The best talents also want to know they will be fully supported by management. If they sense any hesitancy in that area, they won't sign on.

• That support includes providing an atmosphere in which hosts feel free to be themselves both on and off the air.

• The best talent maragers are quick to identify and play to each host's internal needs and motivations. WABC/New York PD John Mainelli rearranged his station to give Rush Limbaugh the isolated office he wanted. WJFK VP/GM Ken Stevens feeds the competitive Liddy a steady stream of ratings data about who he needs to beat to become No. 1.

October was highlighted by another Katz study indicating that Talk's audience is slightly younger (10/9). The rep firm's analysis of five years' worth of spring Arbitron data found that the 25-54 demo accounted for 43.7% of the average News/Talk station's audience in Spring '92, up from 40.8% last spring and 38.7% in Spring '86.

However, as with the fall survey, Katz found that the 65+ crowd still contributes a significant portion of the audience (35.2%).

In late November (11./20), programmers took a moment to reflect on their campaign and election coverage. Several expressed surprise at the depth of listener interest in the political fray. WRKO/ Boston PD David Bernstein found a new way to determine 'f his station was meeting its listeners' political needs.

"You can get an idea of how far to push the election topics by tracking the percentage of undecided voters," said Bernstein. "A large number of undecided voters will tell me to keep it coming – and that people need more information."

And so we come to December, which brings wishes for a happy holiday season. See you next year.



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
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


RECAPPING THE MAJOR ISSUES '92 In Hindsight: Are We Having Fun Yet?

So 1992 wasn't the great year CHR hoped it would be. Then again, unless you were Country, just about everyone took some hits in the ratings and revenue departments.

There was considerable debate about CHR's problems and how to correct them, and many great ideas and issues were exposed on these pages. Perhaps a look at 'CHR's '92 concerns will help us address and solve them in '93.

No Consensus

The philosophical schism regarding CHR's status and direction widened this year, with one of CHR's legendary stations, KIIS/ Los Angeles, typifying the conflict. In an early '92 look at L.A.'s CHR battle (R&R 1/17), KIIS PD Bill Richards said, "While adults are important to us, teens are too, and we don't want to lose them or be second in that demo." But Power 106 PD Rick Cummings observed, "KIIS is decidedly more adult" – a precursor of things to come.

In August, the unveiling of KIIS's "new sound" – decidedly adult and focused away from teens – shocked the industry. Richards defended KIIS's action, saying, "We felt – for the long term – this is where we needed to be. This is where CHR is headed" (R&R 10/2). Despite his convictions and execution of KIIS's new direction, Richards was soon replaced by Jeff Wyatt, who has since brightened KIIS's sound, making it less recurrent/gold-dependent.

While KIIS was convinced mass appeal meant avoiding rap or hard rock, others expressed different opinions. WAPE/Jacksonville PD Jeff McCartney said, "Look at how many CHRs aren't No. 1 18-34 because the audience listens to AOR and AC by default. CHR isn't fulfilling their needs. CHR's a song-bysong format, and I play what sells" (R&R 2/21).

And more PDs spoke of their stations being "CHR for our market," indicating a greater awareness of their communities' needs. "Musical tastes are growing more divergent every day. You can't be everything to everybody. In this market, rhythmic music has always been an important factor . . . a 'lily-white' CHR won't make it



here," remarked WPGC/Washington PD Jay Stevens (R&R 1/24).

Event Records

Meanwhile, KUBE/Seattle PD Bob Case proved a rhythmic CHR works in his market but noted, "You can't miss musical events like Nirvana or Kris Kross... the basis of CHR has always been to be 'in your face.' I got suckered into believing the opposite was true... in the search for 25-54 demos" (R&R 6/12).

KTXY/Columbia-Jefferson City, MO PD Mike Steele expressed similar sentiments, saying, "When an event record comes out – like Def Leppard or Bruce Springsteen – we make the audience aware of it. That's one area Country stations have covered much better than CHRs" (R&R 4/17). Steele's station – despite No. 1 12+ and No. 2 25-54 numbers – went AC later in the year.

Another angle came from WXXL (XL106.7)/Orlando PD Adam Cook: "Winning CHRs are playing the 'hit niche,' not just hits that fit a certain niche" (R&R 4/3).

Consultant Dan Vallie predicted, "New Rock's influence will grow. But it will infiltrate slowly and shouldn't be mistaken for the essence of CHR" (R&R 4/3). How-

he lack of advertising dollars got the better of some stations; increasingly, they turned to record labels in search of time buys and promotions as prerequisites for adds and airplay (**R&R** 2/7, 2/14).

The labels, also feeling the recession's effects, saw their patience with some stations boil over. Record execs charged these stations with:

- Demanding time buys/ promotions for airplay
- Passing on records without time buys/promotions
- Dictating when time buys must run
- Expecting labels to help fill sales quotas
- Accepting commissions on the spot schedule.

Motown Sr. VP/Promo Frank Turner said, "GMs and PDs should worry more about playing hit records than adding records for time buys and promotions. It's a quick fix that isn't working."

Epic Sr. VP/Promo Polly Anthony conceded, "I've lost adds on Tuesdays because I wasn't willing to plug in the time buy 10 minutes after the station added the record." One radio station exec who

played the time buy game to excess -- WILN/Panama City, FL



GM Jim Broaddus — admitted, "I might be swayed by a time buy to look more favorably at a record or add it over another." But while labels considered WJAD/Albany-Bainbridge, GA and PD John Dawson well-known players in the "let's make a deal" game, he didn't admit being the culprit. Instead, Dawson blamed his station's reputation on its independent rep. Both stations consistently added five to seven new titles each week.

Postscript: Both WILN and WJAD suffered bad spring ratings, proving promotions and time buys can't make up for good programming.

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Pressing Problems And Concerns


As we exit 1992 and welcome 1993, here are CHR's major priorities:

- Boost ratings and make CHR profitable
- Focus on the format's 12-34/18-34 core
- Program for listeners, not the sales department
 Deliver on audience expectations
- Make jocks/presentation localized, relatable
- Adapt to the marketplace's changing needs

ever, CHRs like WENZ (The End)/ Cleveland, KWOD/Sacramento, and most recently Power 99/Atlanta (now 99X) leaned heavily on New Rock, forsaking many AC and Urban crossovers. Results at KWOD and WENZ have been mixed, and the jury's still out on 99X's ratings potential.

As many PDs crossed into the 35+ demos, increased emphasis was placed on programming for the listener. WTIC-FM/Hartford MD Dana Lundon suggested, "If you don't understand the music anymore, then hire someone who can. You're not programming for yourself – listeners' tastes may not coincide with your own." (R&R 5/1).

Market fragmentation has fostered diversity, but inspired a lack of consensus about what hits really are. During **R&R** Convention '92, "When Are The Hits Not The Hits" panelist Columbia Sr. VP/Promo

Burt Baumgartner asked programmers, "If your audience, in this recessionary period, will spend millions [on the record], how can you not play it for them?" Panelist MTV VP/Programming Matt Farber chimed in, "[Hits] are active as opposed to passive. They inspire passion, people want to hear them, and they sell" (R&R 6/26).

Cyclical Hit Radio?

Former KHMX/Houston and Nationwide Group PD-turned consultant Guy Zapoleon theorized that a recurring 10-year cycle is partly to blame for the format's recent poor ratings (R&R 10/9). "CHR fares worst during the doldrums, which is where we are currently. This period can be cut short if CHR gets back to basics: great talent, great marketing and promotion, great production values, and a balanced current mix of music." He also cautioned that CHR's current anti-teen stance could have long-range effects: "We'd better give teens something to listen to, or

this will be the first generation without the need to listen to radio for entertainment."

Along those lines, a number of PDs believe mainstream tastes are moving and CHR isn't keeping pace. WBBM-FM (B96)/Chicago PD Dave Shakes commented, "You can't do four auditorium tests a year, overload on safe gold titles, and expect to win. CHR's audience has fluid tastes and demands that have changed even from last year" (R&R 10/16).

Community Relations

With competitors playing many of the same titles, making your station special goes beyond the music – it means plugging into the community. "Develop passion in listeners by showing you're passionate about them and the things they care about," said WHYT/Detroit PD Rick Gillette (R&R 4/17).

Reaching out doesn't always cost a fortune, according to KMEL/San Francisco PD Keith Naftaly: "We can act responsibly and retain entertainment value. Your only budget is having a heart and a conscience" (R&R 3/20).

KZZU/Spokane PD Ken Hopkins suggested, "Stay alert to the shifting needs of the community. By reacting to those needs, your station becomes a catalyst for change" (R&R 3/20).

Personalities, Not Jocks

Making the station relatable requires on-air talent that can communicate, and developing air talent into something more than linercard readers became a priority. "It's amazing that in 1992, we have some of the best-sounding stations technically, yet the worst humansounding stations," criticized Nationwide WNCI/Columbus PD Dave Robbins (R&R 3/27).

KSND/Eugene PD Chris Ruh remarked, "The days of connect-thedots format structures are over. We've got to bring entertainment



back to radio and jocks have to learn how to do it" (R&R 4/24)

WABB/Mobile PD Dusty Hayes added, "Don't repress your DJs with too many rules. A human fac-. adds to [your] listenability' (R&R 7/17).

And WOVV/W. Palm Beach PD Dave Denver offered, "Create an environment where [the jock] feels comfortable enough to entertain on the air and bold enough to come into your office and say, 'I've got an idea' " (R&R 4/24).

Back To Basics

Many programmers decided 1992 was a time to get back to basics. WXKS (Kiss 108)/Boston PD Steve Rivers (recently named Pyramid VP/Programming) explained some fundamentals (R&R 11/13) : "Too many stations haven't delivered on expectations, hence lower ratings. Until we can convince advertisers and media buvers there's money to be made outside the 25-54 demo, we'll have to deal with today's buying mentality." He also urged PDs to program using listener input, rather than sales department input. "A hit is a record the audience likes, not a record we like. Winning CHRs have learned it's important to be - almost to a fault." local

In 1992, CHR became more aware of its problems with advertisers. Former Power 99/Atlanta VP/GM Bill Phippen recommended, "Present the fact that some

In the same article, KHFI/Austin PD Roger Allen advised, "PDs must get involved with sales departments, help educate clients, and even go out on sales calls. There's a lot of money to be made in the lower demos, but it takes sales and programming working together to make it happen."


Dawn Of Duopoly

Duopoly and LMA were this year's buzzwords. We saw LMAs form and disintegrate - both resulting in loss of jobs - and duopolies come together with as yet unproven results. WJMO-FM/Cleveland PD Keith Clark, whose station is currently in the middle of a duopoly sale to crosstown Urban WZAK, proved prophetic when he talked of stations whose "sales departments' sluggishness in rediscovering the value of demos other than 25-54 and the art of true salesmanship caused the ultimate ac-tion: 'for sale' " (R&R 9/25).

Consultant Garry Mitchell offered a solution to the sales dilemma: "We have to stop apologizing for the youth end of the format. Successful CHR will always have teens get used to it" (R&R 4/3)

WKSE/Buffalo PD Mike Ed-wards concurred, "If your GM supports the programming, it's easier to focus on goals, rather than worrying whether your hard work will go down the drain with format change" (R&R 5/1)

But 1992 is closing on a promising note. Consultant Garry Wall has proposed a coalition (or unwired network) of stations working to-

ward changing perceptions about younger demos and increasing CHR's share of the advertising pie (R&R 12/4). Wall said, "A lot of people wrongly believe CHR is already dead - but it's only from the wallet down. A little cash flow would revive this patient." Wall, who says he already has the support of a growing number of stations, has called for record labels' support and anticipates an early '93 announcement of formal plans to put the coalition into service.



New Rock Blossoms

'Is New Rock The Next Hot Format?" That was the question posed at the first-ever R&R convention panel devoted to the format. Six months later, the answer is still unclear - but there's no doubt New Rock experienced profound growth in the past year.

Several longtime New Rockers tallied their best ratings ever in 1992. And some of the format's newest converts realized the kind of immediate success New Rock needs to convince industry skeptics of its viability.

The most noteworthy newcomer was KEDG (The Edge)/Las Vegas, which achieved No. 1 status among persons 18-34 in its first full book. Then-PD Don Parker said musical balance was a key to the station's instant success, explaining, "We basically play New Rock hits. It's a delicate balance to make sure the station sounds familiar and comfortable enough for the mass appeal audience, yet still appeals to the core" (R&R 11/20).

WFNX/Boston is one of the heritage New Rockers that posted a historic book. "Maybe people are waking up to the fact that there's a choice beyond Classic Rock and AOR," noted OM/PD Max Tolkoff.



The first shots were fired on February 15, when Mike Summers, formerly PD at local New Rocker KJQN, flipped crosstown AC KZOL-FM to New Rock as KXRK (X-96), directly challenging his former employers. Most of KJQN's staff joined Summers at the new station.

"KJQN had just degenerated over the last six months through a couple of different GMs," he explained. "I didn't think another GM was going to make that much of a difference" (R&R 6/12).

The battle that ensued escalated when KJQN refused to do co-promotions with X-96, a decision that ultimately hurt the market's ability to attract bands. "I'm not about to facilitate my competition's credibility or moderate success through a record label," said then-KJQN PD Jon McGann (R&R 6/12).

McGann's decision proved to be somewhat moot, since he exited the station shortly thereafter along with his GM, MD, and other disgruntled staffers. Several more shakeups occurred before the station finally threw in the towel and switched to CHR October 6.

Format Converts

Luckily, New Rock sign-ons in other markets were not nearly as chaotic. Among the stations to join the format in '92:

- KRZQ/Reno: flipped from AOR (3/13)

- KKDJ/Fresno: changed from AOR (4/20) • KEDG: switched from Rock AC (5/22)
 - WZRH/New Orleans: flipped from Classic Rock (9/4)
 - KFMA/Phoenix: signed on (9/23)
 - WIBF/Jenkintown, PA (Philadelphia); switched from ethnic (11/9)
- WCHZ/Augusta, GA: signed on (11/23).

Sales Advice

Selling the format – always an important issue - became more crucial than ever as New Rock continued to struggle for credibility as a money-making option.

"The first thing you have to do is market the audience, using sales research, styles, and sales support," noted Jacobs Media consul-tant Paul Jacobs. "The beauty of selling this format is we can walk in and offer something no other station has" (R&R 1/17).

"If you pigeonhole this as an alternative format, you're going to get alternative dollars," remarked XTRA-FM (91X)/San Diego VP/ GM Mike Glickenhaus. "Our approach all along has been to deal not with costs per point, but with costs per qualified customer. This format delivers really strong customers – active and upscale. That's what advertisers want" (R&R 1/31).

The time-buy issue became hotter than ever as revenue-hungry New Rockers sought support from labels. "We're constantly told that we sell records," said WBRU/ Providence PD Mike Osborne. "Now we need the record companies' help" (R&R 7/24).

PLG Director/National Alternative Radio & Video Promotion Steve Leeds was sympathetic, but said radio's beef was actually with music retailers - not the labels themselves. "I totally buy into radio. I believe that's where we should put our dollars. But the retail stores are the ones that buy the time. Those are the people you have to sell" (R&R 7/24).

Tim Hyde pointed out, "The shows are good only if the station continues to support the band [afterward]" (R&R 10/30).

WOXY/Cincinnati Promotion Director Laura Kim stressed the importance of label support to help the station's admittedly thin promo budget. "It's essential that the promo ideas are current, ideally tying in with a record that's yet to be worked at radio. I call the record label with my proposal, prices, and what kind of items we're looking at" (R&R 3/27).

"People listening to stations outside the format are hearing some of the New Rock artists and finally realizing that there are a lot of good bands coming from this format" (R&R 9/4).

KITS (Live 105)/San Francisco OM/PD Richard Sands, who also enjoyed unprecedented ratings success, acknowledged the great strides New Rock has made. "Everybody thought the station was a joke and wouldn't last. They thought the only way to win in rock was by playing Led Zeppelin, Journey, and the Doors. They've finally realized that the No. 1 rock station in town is the station doing things differently" (R&R 9/11).

The Battle Of SLC

As a relatively small format, New Rock has yet to undergo the fragmentation that spawns multistation battles in a particular market. An exception that provided months of controversy and intrigue was the sometimes ugly war in Salt Lake City.

The Year AOR Turned 25

AOR's 25th anniversary year was certainly among the most challenging the format has ever faced. The FCC's relaxation of ownership rules dramatically changed the shape of the industry. Furthermore, ongoing fragmenta-tion forced so-called "mainstream" AORs to seriously reevaluate their music policies.

Demo Dilemma

For years, industry pundits had warned programmers that the days of "demo-hoggery" were over. No longer would a particular station succeed by being "all things to all people." Mass appeal radio was out; niche programming was in. The consensus advice: "Choose a narrow, easily definable target audience and superserve it."

The issue came to a head in 1992 when several major market stations adopted "low-end" AOR ap-proaches reminiscent of the for-mat's "modal" days of the late '70s/early '80s. Initial results of the new wave of hard rockers have been generally positive - predictably strong 18-24 numbers and decent 25-34 gains. The jury's still out on whether low-end AORs will prove successful in the long term particularly in light of how much tougher it is to sell that type of format.

Concurrent with the increase in low-end AORs, ongoing research indicated the gap between younger and older listeners was widening. Programmers found it increasingly difficult to find music that appealed to both younger and older demos.

Those developments compelled many mainstreamers - especially those stations that were already battling Classic Rock rivals - to take a long, hard look at their broad music mixes and decide



whether or not they could continue to play both sides of the fence.

"There's no doubt this is a time of tough decision-making," re-marked WEBN/Cincinnati PD Tom Owens, who also consults a handful of AORs throughout the country. "With the fragmentation that's going on, there are specific choices that have to be made in most markets" (R&R 4/10). Owens eventually narrowed WEBN's already conservative music mix even further.

"You can play the Beatles and Nirvana," claimed Marty Bender, PD at demohogging WFBQ/Indianapolis. "If you're careful you can still be very broad, as long as you find the right records and daypart them appropriately" (R&R 4/10).

As if to punctuate the issue, the Fall '92 Scoreboard revealed a dramatic downturn in the number of AORs topping their markets in key demos, particularly men 25-54.

KSHE's Big Birthday

nly WNEW-FM/New York has been rockin' as long as KSHE/St. Louis, which recently celebrated its 25th birthday with a concert at the city's fabulous Fox Theatre. Among the stars helping KSHE mark the occasion was Impact artist Sass Jordan, who's pictured among happy station staffers.

Pollack Media Group Sr. VP Dave Brewer exhorted mainstream AORs to rock hard or risk leaving themselves vulnerable to lower-end attacks. "AOR has to realize it's an 18-34 format and stop worrying about 35- and 40-year-Brewer explained. "We've olds. kidded ourselves about this for years. A lot of mainstream AORs would be in a lot less trouble today against these [low-end rockers] if they simply played the rock records people want to hear" (R&R 11/13).



Country Soars





country music this or country music that" (R&R 11/13).

WIYY/Baltimore PD Russ Mottla, who watched some of his audience defect to Country, said it's only a matter of time before Country radio begins to lose its luster. "As with any hot format, it's mainly a waiting game – waiting for the burnout," he said. "I don't think there are enough country superstars to sustain the popularity the format's enjoying right now" (B&R 11/13).

Programmers agreed the best strategy to minimize a hot Country station's impact is the same strategy you'd use to thwart *any* competitor: Make sure your own house is in order. The more compelling your station is, both musically and promotionally, the less likely your listeners are to look elsewhere.

Stern Rises

No single topic generated more publicity in the past year than the **Howard Stern** phenomenon. While I'm sure plenty of people are absolutely sick to death of reading about Howard — you may very well be one of them — it's difficult to overstate his impact on the industry in 1992.

Regardless of whether you think Howard is a brilliant communicator or a foul-mouthed bigot — or both — the fact remains that he's achieved a level of success and *influence* that's unparalleled in the annals of modern radio broadcasting.

He's currently the top-rated morning personality in New York, Los Angeles, and Philadelphia, and can be heard in seven other markets. And he's risen to the top by rewriting the radio rulebook. He's

trashed the notion that local radio always wins. And in doing so he's pushed the proverbial envelope further than any of his predecessors.

AOR

Whether they know it, or care to admit it, there are plenty of jocks who can say and do things on the radio today that they wouldn't or couldn't in the past — and a lot of that newfound freedom is due to Howard Stern.

Of course, if the FCC has its way, Stern will eventually be muzzled. Historians will note that Howard's triumphant rise in 1992 was accompanied by extraordinary fines levied by the Commission — fines that led many in the industry to believe he'd been singled out to make a point. Some went further, suggesting certain members of the FCC had a "vendetta" against Stern.

Regardless, the FCC's actions against Stern and Infinity ultimately affect *all* broadcasters – a fact too often overlooked by shortsighted owners and programmers. Will the change in administrations have an effect on the thorny question of indecency? Stay tuned.

Issues & Answers

Some of the other key issues of '92:

• Value-Added Hell: This holdover from 1991 isn't likely to disappear anytime soon. Beleaguered programmers acknowledged the financial necessity of "whoring their stations out," but it didn't make 'em feel any better.

"We almost all have begun to dread going to promotion meetings, because anybody who spends \$500 on a schedule wants a promotion," moaned WEGR/Memphis PD Drake Hall. "It's an impossible task, because we only have so many liner spots available" (R&R 5/1). PDs met the challenge by combining promotions, tying them in with regular station features, strictly enforcing liner availability, and injecting a healthy dose of creativity into the process.

• Job Safety: With duopolies and LMAs all the rage and the economy still plodding along, people had good reason to reevaluate their job security in '92. "We're in an era of consolidation, and some of the numbers I've heard are alarming," confirmed Talentmasters President Don Anthony (R&R 10/23).

Despite the tough times, Anthony offered reassuring words: "Job security is still directly related to one's overall contribution to the success of the station. The best people will, in all likelihood, survive."

Another Year Of Growing Pains

NAC struggled through another year of growing pains in 1992

Format Shifts

Several stations joined the NAC ranks this year, as others opted to switch out of the format. During the summer, KACE/Los Angeles jettisoned NAC in favor of a mainstream Urban approach under the "V103" moniker. A few weeks later, former KACE PD Lawrence Tanter resurfaced at the helm of KAJZ & KBJZ (Jazz-FM)/Los Angeles (former New Rocker MARS FM).

In November KOAI (The Oasis)/ Dallas flipped from NAC to CHR ... just one day later crosstown Granum Communication AC KCDU grabbed the KOAI calls and Oasis handle, programming a "smooth jazz" format under the guiding hand of PD Paul Goldstein, an originator of the Wave format at KTWV/Los Angeles. Bob Linden. another NAC veteran, returned to the format when he landed the PD post at WJZE/Washington. He moved the station away from traditional jazz toward an NAC/Contemporary Jazz/World Music mix.

Other key NAC developments: WNOX/Knoxville took the format fulltime in July, KYFX (Foxy 99)/ Little Rock joined the format ranks in August with a "Quiet Storm" lean, and a CHR-to-NAC switch was made by WXMX/Lansing. (Editor's note: Also see accompanying NAC ratings scoreboard).

Sales Challenge

Marketing and selling NAC remained a challenge in '92 because of the roadblocks presented by its non-mass appeal framework. KIFM/San Diego PD Bob O'Connor shared tips on combating the stereotypes: "People have preconceived notions about the New Age element. It conjures up images of crystals or channeling. We've been verv successful with medium-sized mailings in which we include a cassette sampler of the music. Then we follow up with telemarketing. You have to show that NAC isn't as passive as maybe it started out to he

KKSF/San Francisco GSM David Bramnick tackled this perception-versus-reality issue from a marketing standpoint. "The most important element is positioning the station as an AC - a different. kind of AC. We're not denying it's a unique format, but we're essentially AC. We appeal to 25-49-year-olds just like AC - and we have to get buyers to put us in the same league with the ACs. While NAC's special, you also have to play with the big guys. You have to bring the format out of the esoteric and into the mainstream.'

Future Ruminations

Not surprisingly, programmer discussions throughout the year often focused on the format's prospects for the future: "Unfortunately, there are fewer artists today for this format than there were several years ago," noted KBLX/San Francisco PD Kevin Brown. "It's also a different kind of business. Record companies concentrate on 12-24s, making NAC and other adult formats the stepchildren.'



KTWV/L.A. PD Chris Brodie remarked, "In the past 12-18 months, I'd like to have seen more highprofile stars come from the format. We've had our share of them, and we're confident about the future. But the maturation of the music is a vital part of this station's future."

Several stations maintained that owner commitment is one of the cornerstones for NAC success:

"When serious companies get involved, NAC can produce results: The three best are [Brown Broadcasting's] KKSF/San Francisco, [Group W's] KTWV/Los Angeles, and [Pyramid's] WNUA/Chi-cago," explained WNUA PD Lee Hansen. "NAC's future is in the hands of the big owners. When stations compete on every level - talent, marketing, and programming - they'll be successful."

CJ Recap

The close of the year saw longtime Contemporary Jazz outlet WNOP/Cincinnati placing veteran programmer Val Coleman on waivers when it was announced the station would be dropping its Jazz programming in favor of a CNN format in '93. The syndicated "David Sanborn Show" ceased production in June '92. Show producer Andy Denemark commented, "1992 was a terrible year for network and syndicated radio advertising sales. We were on 185 stations stations at the time of cancellation, but frankly the stations weren't necessarily the strongest in their respective markets. We didn't get the audience delivery for it to add up for the advertisers. So when the show wasn't paving for itself, we suspended production.

KJAZ/San Francisco PD Tim Hodges offered some perspective on the viability of Contemporary Jazz radio: "I think it [Jazz] will survive. Broadcasters will come back around - at least some of

them - and see the viability of Jazz as a commercial format. Owners get a little greedy sometimes.

"As someone who is operating a station on a corporate level, I definitely think the fact that Jazz tends to be a market-specific format is a hindrance to Jazz radio's growth. There's a lot of research and education you have to go through before you can figure out what the market is going to support in terms of jazz music. I don't think there are a lot of owners around right now who are willing to go through this process.'

The Musical Course

The amazing diversity of new product in NAC and Contemporary Jazz took center stage in 1992. This year saw 160 and 213 releases hit R&R's NAC and Contemporary Jazz charts, respectively.

These were album releases not tracks or numerous singles by the same artist - and a relatively short 30-position chart. Of the 94 releases reaching the Top 15 on the NAC chart, only the Rippingtons scored more than one appearance with "Weekend in Monaco" and "Curves Ahead." Among the 134 releases reaching the Top 15 on the Contemporary Jazz chart, only five artists - Paquito D' Rivera, Eliane Elias, Steve Khan, Branford Marsalis, and Jack McDuff - landed two Top 15-charting albums.

No. 1 Club

Only 19 artists claimed number one on the NAC chart, with Pat Metheny's "Secret Story" enjoying the longest reign: seven weeks. It also finished as the No. 1 NAC album of '92 and No. 9 on the CJ year-end chart - the only release to score top 10 finishes on both charts. David Sanborn posted Top 20 finishes on both charts with "Upfront" (No. 14 NAC; No. 10 CJ).

Peter White had the second biggest NAC album of the year and the second longest run at No. 1 six weeks. Al Jarreau was next in line with five weeks, earning him honors for the year's fourth biggest release. While Enya spent only two weeks at No. 1, her third-place finish for the year can be attributed to "Shepherd the fact that her Moons" album had the longest chart life of '92: 22 weeks in the Top 30.

The Rippingtons earned the fifth place, marking the fifth consecu-tive year that the group has landed

an album in the NAC year-end Top 10, an unprecedented achievement. Veteran artists claiming first-time Top 20 appearances on the NAC year-end chart were: Bobby Caldwell (7), Grover Washinton Jr. (9), Randy Crawford (10), and Najee (11); newcomers to the club were Boney James (13) and Everett Harp (15).

Although NAC continued to be male-dominated, several female artists scored year-end Top 25 rankings: Enva. Randy Crawford. Julia Fordham, Nicky Holland, and Keiko Matsui. Last year, Candy Dulfer and Bonnie Raitt were the only solo female artists to finish in the Top 25.

CJ Countdown

Of the 24 artists claiming No. 1 CJ chart status, Joey Defrancesco enjoyed the longest stay (six

weeks) and copped fourth-place on the year-end chart, preceded by Ellis Marsalis (3), Charles Fambrough (2), and the GRP All-Star Big Band (1). The latter group spent 15 weeks in the Top 30, three weeks of which were at No. 1.

Other CJ Top 20 year-end firsttimers joining Fambrough were: Jimmy Scott, Gerald Albright, Vanessa Rubin, Kenny Garrett, Gerry Mulligan, Abbey Lincoln, Branford Marsalis, the Charlie Haden Quartet West, and the Clayton Brothers. Eddie Daniels, who never before finished in the Top 20 as a solo artist, did so this year with his No. 6 duo effort with Gary Burton (Burton had the number one album of '90). And Rubin and Lincoln were the only female artists to finish in the Top 20, compared to six last year.

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URBAN CONTEMPORARY

Fragmentation, Economy Can't Spoil Format's Success

Like its other format counterparts, UC radio was affected by the nation's sluggish economy. In fact, many of the same obstacles that have plagued the format during the past two years were present once again.

Programmers were still confused about the music, as well as the format's primary demographic target. Fragmentation increased at a massive rate: Stations in other formats leaned heavily on R&B, rap, and hip-hop, depending on their formatic needs. And as Urban stations continued to be rated No. 1 by Arbitron (but fourth or fifth in advertising billings), the ongoing need for economic parity became more evident.

Once again, UC stations attracted huge amounts of listeners and maintained their high AQH shares and TSL numbers. However, the cumes seemed to have reached their peak.

Winners' Circle

Many of this year's format winners staged repeat performances of a year ago. WRKS (Kiss FM)/ New York retained its No. 1 rating, with crosstown WBLS ranking in the Top Five. WGCI-FM/Chicago kept its winning streak alive, continuing to top the 18-34 and 25-54 demos.

WKYS/Washington turned things around this year and challenged CHR WPGC for market dominance. WVEE/Atlanta kept a firm grip on its market, while crosstown Urban/AC WALR showed some growth. Meanwhile, KJMZ/Dallas dethroned longtime heritage station KKDA-FM (K104). In fact, 'JMZ morning man Russ Parr defeated legendary K104 morning talent Tom Joyner for the first time.

WQUE/New Orleans seized the format crown from WYLD-FM,



which 'QUE owner Clear Channel is in the process of acquiring. The new addition should give Clear Channel a lock on the Crescent City's total Urban audience.

WEDR/Miami and WOWI/Norfolk not only won their respective Urban battles, but claimed No. 1 status overall in their cities. In fact, 'OWI has been the market's No. 1 station 12+ (Monday-Sunday, 6am-midnight) for 11 consecutive sweeps. And WBLX-FM/Mobile topped its market in 1992.

WWWZ (Z93)/Charleston, SC which endured major financial difficulties and nearly closed its doors earlier this year (R&R 7/24) — became Charleston's No. 1 station overall in late '92 with a 16 share 12+.

Other '92 news: The format gained KMJK/Phoenix, WQHH/Lansing, and WROU/Dayton; WCDX/ Richmond and WPLZ/Petersburg-Richmond became the first UC duopoly; and KHYS/Houston LMA'd with crosstown rival KYOK & KMJQ.

Calm After The Storm

UC radio played a major role during April '92's Los Angeles riots. Given its South Central L.A. location, **KJLH** became the community's radio station. When the riots broke out, the outlet ceased all music programming. Its staff took calls and allowed people to discuss the situation on-air.

Crosstown **KKBT** also did a good job: During the course of the disturbance, it played some music and talked to the public, celebrities, and city officials. And **KGFJ** opened its airwaves to news and conversation.

Incidentally, KGFJ celebrated 65 years of service this year by holding an on-air reunion of its former air personalities. It threw a reunion party in Hollywood for its listeners and advertisers, as well.

Meanwhile, WLIB/New York aided in relief efforts for Haitian refugees by initiating the "Operation Hope" fundraiser. Cash dona-

tions were used to buy clothing, shoes, soap, and other necessities for refugees who were rescued at sea and taken to the U.S. Naval Base in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Listeners also donated such items as food, books, tents, sleeping bags, games, sporting goods, coloring books, and crayons. Furthermore, 'LIB worked with the military to send several staffers on an airlift to Guantanamo Bay.

Furthermore, R&R saluted WAOK/Atlanta's Brother Esmond Patterson for his 35 years in broadcasting. Patterson has spent his entire career playing gospel on the station. For his achievements, his story has been included in the Smithsonian Institute's Black History exhibit.

Issues Recap

One of the issues confronted by PDs this year was UC's possible future as a 25-54 format. Their concerns included: the paradox of radio targeting 25-54, but not adding the music labels geared to that segment; how to narrow a station's focus but not ignore the younger end; whether or not to play more rap music; and finding and training qualified salespeople who believe in the format they're selling.

Programmers also re-examined how and why they make their weekly musical decisions. Most agreed they relied on callout, retail research, trade information, gut, and MD input. Industry pros addressed the need for improved UC programmer training and asked trade publications to do a better job of tabulating Black AC music information.

Let's hope for more success in '93!

Action -Packed Year

Several noted programmers shifted to major organizations during

Elroy R.C. Smith became WGCI-FM/Chicago's PD after James Alexander resigned to become KKDA-FM/Dallas-Ft. Worth's OM. Meanwhile, Michael Spears vacated KKDA's VP/Programming/Operations post to focus on his consulting service.

WKKV/Milwaukee's Tony Fields joined V103.9/Los Angeles as PD following Lawrence Tanter's exit and the station's return to mainstream Urban. Brian Anthony then filled WKKV's PD opening, and WQQK/Nashville's Vic Clemons assumed Anthony's former Asst. PD/MD duties at WGCI-FM.

Hector Hannibal left WMMJ/ Washington to become PD WHQT/ Miami. Concurrently, WMMJ's ownership hired Ray Boyd as the chain's National PD and the station's OM.

And when KKBT/L.A. programmer Mike Stradford shifted to the record industry as Qwest Records' VP/A&R, MD John Monds was elevated to the station's PD post.

Countering The Country Challenge

In addition to contending with recession-related problems, AC outlets closely monitored two significant developments in '92: Country's massive ratings growth and Hot AC's continuing progress.

KVIL/Dallas PD Bill Curtis finds himself caught between an increasingly interesting AC race and one of America's fiercest Country contests. "Country music reflects this nation's lifestyle. The music is in line with the return to basics our country is currently experiencing. Country is much more mass ap-

Comings And Goings

O nly three Top 50 markets stations joined the AC ranks in '92, a sharp decline from 22 in 1990 and eight last year.

Conversely, 12 stations left the format — up from seven in '91 and five two years ago. Gold and Country each lured three; two former FM ACs became News/Talk.

It's worth noting that several ACs, including Gold-based KXEZ/Los Angeles (now Hot AC KYSR) modified their programming within the format. These shifts, of course, are not counted here as format changes.

Here (in chronological order) are 1992's Top 50 market format flips. Nearly half of AC's defections occurred in January; 25% in July.

peal – the lyrics are both understandable and relatable.

"For many years, Country's main audience was upper-end males. But the 'Hollywood' approach that country music's taken with its artists is part [of the reason for] its success among younger and middle female demos. Women – especially younger women – are heavy radio users."

Fragmentation Problems

AC programmers facing Country competition should determine if they're sharing audience with a Country rival. "If you are, it's probably worth your time to test the big country hits that fit your station," Curtis advises.

Referring to KVIL's just-concluded music test, he continues, "Garth Brooks did OK, but not gangbusters. The biggest mistake AC PDs make is thinking Country should be played just because it's big. By doing that, you risk breaking promises to [the AC audience] of what you're about. ACs won't win Country listeners by playing five Garth Brooks records."

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While he doesn't expect the present Country craze to fizzle, Curtis comments, "We may see smaller shares for each Country station. Country's finally been able to fragment itself, [and that fragmentation] will probably cause some erosion.

"Instead of one version of Country, we now have – much like AC – several different types. 'Young Country' has a [CHR] presentation, with lots of energy and contesting. Country's at its pinnacle right now; I don't think it'll ever go away."

First Place Becomes Even More Elusive

combination of stunning Country gains and AC's ongoing fragmentation resulted in fewer AC 25-54 No. 1s in 1992.

Hot AC Commands Industry Attention

The year 1992 did provide some bright spots, including increased industry attention commanded by Hot ACs.

"There's plenty of evidence throughout the country that Hot AC's alive and doing well," asserts Vallie Consulting chief Dan Vallie. "Hot AC targets 25-44 adults, especially females; Adult CHR still targets 18-24s. Almost without exception, Hot ACs doing well with 25-44s also pull 18-24 females. We don't target them – they come along for the ride.

"Most Hot ACs are '80s-based, playing currents and recurrents. Some also play '70s gold because their competitive situations allow them to be that broad." Vallie cites

Michael Bolton, Elton John, Phil Collins, and Gloria Estefan as Hot AC's core artists, but indicates Hot AC is a song-driven – rather than artist-driven – format.

Hot Vs. Bright

Another format flavor with its share of followers – and is often compared to Hot AC – is Bright AC. But as Vallie explains, "Bright ACs are a little slower with currents than Hot ACs and go deeper into oldies. They have a brighter delivery than Soft and Gold-based ACs."

CHR, according to Vallie, contributed greatly to Hot AC's emergence. "Hot AC was created by market conditions and probably wouldn't have worked 10 years ago. But CHR kept getting narrower, creating the opening for Hot AC."

Vallie notes several traps that Hot ACs need to avoid: "Some make the mistake of being too current and aggressive with new music. Hot ACs play currents, but their playlists are shorter than [CHR's or Adult CHR's]. Hot ACs can be upbeat, entertaining, enthusiastic, and positive, but need to do so without the CHR hype. They should promote the product, rather than do contesting. Morning zoos should be avoided because of their perceptual association with CHR."

Gaining Acceptance

WODS/Boston, like other Gold outlets, enjoys format's renewed popularity

One of Gold's major accomplishments this year was a heightened degree of industry acceptance.

"When you're No. 1 25-54, you get a certain amount of acceptance within a market," comments WODS/Boston PD Steve Allan. "Record companies are coming out with product and support. [The] ad dollars aren't there yet, but there's definitely product."

Discussing the record industry's suddenly aggressive promotion



posture toward Oldies outlets, Allan notes, "There's everything from Motown's 'Hitsville, USA' and the Elvis '50s box, to great product from Rhino. The quality and packaging are getting better, and [the record companies] are coming through with promotions. Not long ago, we had to [plead] with them [for giveaways]. Now, they are approaching us. The same is true on the video side. CBS/Fox has come to us with music-related and era-related promotions.

Allan wasn't surprised to see several ACs jump on the Gold bandwagon this year. "You're much better off going to a niche format, rather than being the fourth or fifth AC in a market," he reasons. "It's taken time for broadcasters to realize they can dominate 35-54. Some are reluctant to target that old. But once they get into it, they have the arena to themselves.

Niching The Niche

Overall, Allan believes most markets can only support one Gold

focused format. There's not much difference between stations playing the best from the late '50s, '60s, and early '70s. It gets down to the marketing game.

"In cases where there are [two or more Gold stations], each does just okay - no one Gold station does extremely well. Losers in those battles haven't been doing the format right. A newcomer doing the format correctly can beat the established Gold station."

Allan cautions Gold PDs against relying heavily on '70s music. "You may pop a '70s song here and there, but the person you're playing the music for wants to hear '60s music. Gold stations hurt themselves when they attempt to broaden the format.'

Noting that Gold stations tend to perform well when the country experiences difficult economic times, Allan adds, "The songs we play are familiar, relaxing, safe, and require minimal listener effort. Listeners know the exact lyrics and what they're going to hear. After a stressful day, they can go into a zone.

More Stations, Higher Ratings

Country radio's phenomenal growth continued in 1992. Stations adopted the format at a furious pace, and ratings climbed to new heights. As '92 comes to an end, the Country Ratings Index is at record levels for the second consecutive year (see graph).

While LMAs and duopolies changed the face of radio this year, their impact on Country was substantial. Numerous stand-alones garnered eye-popping shares, prompting many of them to acquire a second signal to protect what they had. That moved others to purchase a market's Country outlet to further their hold on a particular demo or enhance their audience spectrum. This year, LMA/ duopoly deals were completed by companies with Country outlets in Albuquerque, Dallas, Denver, Greensboro-Winston Salem, Kansas City, Las Vegas, and Orlando.

Other markets which had been home to sole FM Country stations for years became battlegrounds, as

head-on competitors invaded their domains. Sacramento; El Paso; McAllen-Brownsville; Modesto, CA; Lansing; Saginaw, MI; and Savannah, GA were among the cities that gained new Country stations this year.

Perhaps the year's most talkedabout market was Dallas, which saw Alliance Broadcasting position its first acquisition, KYNG, as 18-34-targeted "Young Country" in January. Alliance LMA'd – and later purchased – crosstown Gold KODZ. In October, the company switched the outlet to KSNN ("Sunny Country"), targeting a 35+ crowd. Thus, 1992 ended with the "Big D" home to five Country outlets – KSCS & WBAP, KPLX, KYNG, and KSNN.

Record-Level Ratings

This marked the third consecutive year of CRI increases, which measures Country radio listening among 25-54 adults (using **Arbitron** figures) in the continuously measured markets. In fact, this surge follows three consecutive years of decline for the index, which was started in 1986.

Since it bottomed out at 870.3 at the end of '89, the CRI has climbed 31% from Summer '89 to Summer '92. This year, the CRI rose 11% from its record-high closing in 1991. Incidentally, the '90-'91 period produced the format's largest oneyear surge (16%). In other year-toyear comparisons, the CRI fell 3% '88-'89 and rose 1% '89-'90.

Let's hope Country radio is enjoying the beginning of along growth curve. Certainly, future gains may not be as dramatic as they've been the last two years. But the ever-growing fan base – along with today's fresh, lyricdriven music – should continue to provide Country radio with many more good years.



Welcome To The Boom Town

If the country music industry could make just one collective New Year's resolution, it would probably be *more* of the same incredible growth and popularity.

If Garth Brooks helped blow country's doors wide open, then literally dozens of new artists have filed through them during the past 12 months. Among the highlights of country's biggest year to date:

• The Garthman's first solo network TV special, "This Is Garth Brooks," ranked ninth for its broadcast week and attracted 15.9 million viewers. He also guested on "Saturday Night Live" in March.

• The CMA Awards benefited from country's popularity when the special's audience increased by seven million viewers over last year. CBS-TV signed on to air the CMA's 35th anniversary celebration special, which tapes next month. The Academy of Country Music also announced it will expand its awards show to three hours in 1993.

• Music City's success also spread to the big screen. Filming began last month in Nashville for "The Thing Called Love." The movie about an aspiring country singer stars River Phoenix. And George Strait showed he was more than a pretty face and voice when he made his acting debut in "Pure Country."

Year Of Change

The year certainly signalled change for many country artists. The Kentucky Headhunters' Ricky Lee and Doug Phelps unexpectedly announced their departure during a TV interview, without first alerting the other band members. The Phelpses opted to try it as a brother team; the group replaced them with Mark Orr and Anthony Kenney. A new Headhunters single will be out early next year.

• Restless Heart's Larry Stewart exited the act to go solo. The other members, who elected not to replace him, are enjoying crossover success with their latest single, "When She Cries."



• The Remingtons' Rick Yancey also embarked on a solo career. The group has added Denny Henson and is working on a new BNA Entertainment project.

• Highway 101's Jack Daniels left the group to pursue other interests and spend more time with his family. Highway band member Dave Flint temporarily stepped in for Daniels.

• Other changes: Patty Loveless from MCA to Epic; Kenny Rogers from Warner Bros. to Giant; Charlie Daniels from Epic to Liberty; Lorrie Morgan from RCA to BNA; Ronnie Milsap from RCA to Liberty; Matraca Berg and K.T. Oslin from RCA/Nashville to RCA/New York; Shelby Lynne to Morgan Creek.

I Fought The Law

Clint Black and ex-manager Bill Ham came out swinging this spring over contracts and endorsements. Both sides issued letters to the press concerning the disagreement, which will probably go to court in '93.

• Billy Ray Cyrus had his achy breaky heart broken when he found out that Del Reeves had filed suit against him for failure to honor terms of an alleged record production agreement between the two. Cyrus also made headlines when a

South Carolina woman had his son out of wedlock in April; similar allegations from a Kentucky woman surfaced this fall.

Memorable Moments

Johnny Cash's induction into the Rock 'N' Roll Hall Of Fame showed that country and rock occasionally meet in the middle. Other memorable moments:

• Tammy Wynette's successful collaboration with KLF – "Justi-fied And Ancient." The video and song were wildly popular, and the tune appears in Wynette's new box set.

• Dozens of country stars pitched in to help Hurricane Andrew victims by participating in the "Country Stars Shine For Hurricane Relief" concert in October. They raised thousands of dollars for the stricken areas.

• Reba McEntire became the first artist to broadcast an entire concert live to New York's Times Square via Sony's Video-One Jumbotron screen. WYNY simulcast the event. In the wake of losing her band in a plane crash last year, McEntire faced a similar scare last month when her Hawker 25 jet made an emergency landing at the Nashville airport. No one was injured.
