



With its new transmitting equipment in operation, Radio Station WADC covers fourteen northern Ohio counties thoroly: Summit, Cuyahoga, Stark, Mahoning, Lorain, Trumbull, Portage, Tuscarawas, Medina, Wayne, Lake, Carroll, Columbiana and Geauga.

In this area live approximately two and one half million people including residents of the urban areas of four of the state of Ohio's eight largest cities, Akron, Cleveland, Youngstown and Canton.

Recent surveys by WADC and the Columbia Broadcasting System indicate that 96 per cent of homes in these urban areas are radio equipped. Consequently—in the territory covered by WADC there are 600,000 radio homes... a potential audience of more than one and a half million listeners.

These people depend upon WADC, a basic network station of the Columbia Broadcasting System, for the best in radio entertainment.

WITH the dedication of its new studios and transmitting facilities at Tallmadge, Ohio, Radio Station WADC celebrates its 10th anniversary on the air.


From April the eighth, 1925, when WADC took the air under ownership of Mr. Allen T. Simmons, until the present time, a decade later, WADC has seen constant growth.

During that span of service to northern Ohio radio listeners WADC has grown from a small station operating on 100 watts power and with limited studio facilities in a downtown Akron hotel to one of the finest radio stations in Ohio.

WADC now operates on a 2500 watt daytime and 1000 watt nighttime basis using the latest high fidelity speech and transmitting equipment including a 365 foot half wave vertical radiator—a new Summit County landmark—and maintains studios for broadcast activity from downtown Akron, Tallmadge and the neighboring city of Canton.

The Columbia Broadcasting System, at its inception, selected WADC Akron as one of its basic network stations, and WADC today carries all the better air shows of this outstanding network.

Radio Station WADC is proud of the new facilities which now enable it to serve its radio listeners even better . . . and trust that it will continue to merit the acceptance of those who welcome the best in radio entertainment.





Canton, Ohio and Beacon Journal

Canton, eighth city in population in Ohio is provided the same superior broadcast service by WADC as Akron. In the fall of 1933 Radio Station WADC installed studios and offices in the Courtland Hotel Canton. From these studios originate . . . daily . . . a number of commercial and sustaining programs.

WADC also maintains a downtown Akron studio in the Beacon Journal building. Programs are broadcast daily from the above mentioned studios, from the main studios in Tallmadge, an Akron suburb, and from numerous remote points.
